





The World Championships this year was programmed with the Women competing on separate days from the men and with official training days added in meant the whole tournament was extraordinarily long. Consequently the departures for the different disciplines were staggered to avoid lengthy stays before and after competition. The Juniors however departed as a group from Sydney with Gleniss to meet up in Singapore with the senior trap men. From day one when Brendan's gun went missing between Canberra and Sydney and the Juniors barely making their flight due to the drama of chasing up the gun, you would not have

After meeting up in Singapore the two groups finally landed in Zagreb some 32 hours later via Amsterdam. One gun missing in Sydney was nothing compared to nine guns lost in Zagreb. Two days later, numerous trips to the airport phone calls back to Australia, Singapore and Amsterdam the official trap training day arrived and we still had no guns for the Juniors or Russell. We

borrowed guns from some locals and other competitors but it was very much a case of trying to make do with adjustments made as much as could be. Finally mid afternoon on the official training day Gleniss and Nick Sullivan received the call that the guns had turned up. We managed only one round with our own guns but the important thing was they had arrived in time for the competition. The issue of travelling overseas with firearms is becoming more difficult and at one stage rumour has it that there were 300

firearms (pistol, rifle and shotgun) missing on one particular day of this combined World Championships.

Our hotel was the Westin, a highly rated establishment that was conveniently located a short walk from the main city square. It was well appointed with a gym and pool for Nick Sanders our Sports Scientist to conduct his recovery sessions every day. The only problem was that for the first 4 days the airconditioning was not working making it difficult with the 30-deg temperatures.

The shooting complex consisted of five superimposed trap and skeet ranges and a background that was bare dirt out to about 20m then green grass to 100m where a corn field was planted. For most of the tournament the weather was great with temperatures in the low 30's, bright sunshine and very little wind.





Psychological Skills for Shooting

DO I REALLY NEED HELP FROM MY LEFT HAND?

(Author's note: this article is written from the right hand perspective; left handers reverse.)

One of the bonuses of writing these articles, has been the feedback from fellow shooters. Over the past couple of months I have had several phone calls and letters, following the article on freezing on the trigger. That subject seemed to generate the greatest discussion for some time. One shooter sent me a copy of the American Journal "Trap & Field" and copies of previous articles from that journal. As I read through the magazine, I came across an article by Phil Kiner called: "Does your right hand know what your left hand is doing." After a quick read of the article, I thought that was interesting and proceeded to forget about what I had read (or at least I thought I did).

Several weeks later I was asked to run a mental skills segment at a coach's accreditation clinic being run by the NSWCTA. During the clinic, I was able to go out onto the tracks and observe some shooters and the coaches in action. One of the participants decided to shoot in the hope that I could watch what was happening, and if possible, correct the problem. The problem that the shooter perceived was that as he swung the gun and pulled the trigger, the end of the barrel would 'jump or flick' to the right. This was a new gun and the shooter was worried that there was something wrong with the gun. I watched and watched for several shots and then noticed what he was talking about; as the gun was fired, it gave a little lurch. I watched some more and saw it happen again. Trying to think what might have caused this, I remembered the Phil Kiner article I had read some weeks before.

Kiner argues that the left (front or forend hand) is directly responsible for missed targets, mistaken perception of what is really happening, and misleading optical illusions that confuse us. Why is the front hand problematic? The answer, according to Kiner, has to do with total lock time. By this he means the time it takes from when your brain sends the command to your finger to pull the trigger until the trigger actually trips, together with the time it takes for the shot to leave the barrel after the trigger has been pulled.

What happens is that your brain has figured out that there is time to "correct" the shot after the command to pull the trigger has been sent. By this he means that subconsciously the shooter has figured out that a quick flip of the front hand and the barrel can be moved from the position it was in when the fire command was given, to somewhere else by the time the shot leaves the barrel.

The logic behind this behaviour is due to a mistaken belief that if the barrel is slung very quickly it will cause the shot string to spray like water from a hose. This myth has been busted by the use of frameadvancing high speed cameras. The shot appears to be contained as a very small clump when it leaves the barrel regardless of whether the barrels are moving or motionless. Once out of the barrel the shot starts spreading. Having the left hand give a quick push or pull of the barrels wont help spray the shot.

Geometry also causes the illusion that the shot can be sprayed. Geometry causes centimetres at the muzzle to be converted to metres at the target. Because this is an easily understood concept, it is logical to think that a small push will effect a greater change out at the target where it is needed.

Lock time creates an illusion because we cannot actually tell when the shot is leaving the barrel. As a result we do not actually know where the barrel was pointing when the command to pull the trigger was given. Here the left hand tries to help and pushes or pulls the gun to where we think it should be.

Finally, the left hand can get in the road because it causes us to hit the panic button. Anytime you do not see the target "normally"; such as if you are not visually aware when you call pull and the target gets the jump on you. In this situation the target appears smaller and faster, so it is logical that you have to shoot fast or the target will be missed. This need to shoot fast is panic stations and all this does it destroy your natural timing and makes you jab at the target.

Whilst the subject matter of Kiner's article seemed logical and commonsensical, it wasn't until a visit to Kevin Wright, that I realised, that what I was reading was so important for shooting. I had gone to Ballarat to have Kevin "fit" my new gun to me. Whilst he did some minor adjustments to the stock, what he did was make a major adjustment to way I hold my gun. By moving my right hand down, I was able to now have greater control of the gun; in fact I was able to pick it up and mount it with one hand. What this does is put the control back to where it should be; with the right hand, which is in line with your dominant eye and the barrels. Holding the gun this way, means that the left hand didn't have to "help", because I could drive the gun properly.

This has big implications for coaches, especially Juniors, because if they are taught correctly the first time then the left hand may never have to do any more than what it should be doing: supporting the gun.

Dear Your Say

I refer to Mike Swale's response (July 2006) to Ron Russell's letter (April 2006) "lower grade shooters, paying the same nomination fee as AA grade shooters, are entitled to the same cash / trophy as the AA grade shooter. It's called equality."

If the shooter numbers in each grade were equal, he would be right. In reality, the numbers in each grade are not equal, certainly at the clubs and shoots that I attend. Here we have a serious imbalance, with 70 - 80% of the shooters being in A and AA grade. Last weekend, I went to a shoot of 100 targets, noms \$51, with only 27 shooters due to a clashing event. The shooter figures for this were:

Grade	Nos	%age	Average (over 6 Shoots)
AA	12	44.5	42
A	10	37	31

C	2	7.5	9

Please don't tell me that it is fair and equitable to pay equal prizes to each grade in this example. You have to agree that A and AA grade subsidise the other grades.

If we say that shooters are divided into grades in order to make the competition fairer, then it must follow that the prize money contributed by each grade should be shared by the shooters of that grade, who are deemed to be of equal standing.

With a prize pool at this event of \$550.80 (assuming no concessions for Veterans or Juniors), Mike Swale would have us pay \$137.70 to each grade, with \$82.62 for First and \$55.08 for Second, based on the usual 60 / 40 split.

If this prize pool was split on a Graded Cash Divide basis, this is how the figures work out:



We often hear of confusion from both shooters and in some cases, Referees regarding No Targets and Lost Targets in double rise events. Some interesting scenarios are worth looking at:

As the Referee in a double rise event, you observe that a shooter fails to shoot at a legal pair of targets. He raises his hand to indicate a malfunction. You ask him to test fire the gun (once only) Rule GRTS14.

On inspection of the gun you observe that the shooter has failed to load a cartridge in either chamber. What do you rule?

ITS YOUR CALL

If you rule Lost Target on the first barrel only, you would be quite correct. Your next call is for the shooter to shoot a second pair to determine the result of the second barrel only. It is important that you inform the shooter that he is required to fire in the direction of the first target with his first barrel.

Some would argue that both targets should be lost. However, if we look at Rule1.10 (b)

The Association covers all members for Personal Accident Insurance whilst acting for or on behalf of the club and/or association, this includes trappers, voluntary workers and range staff. However, in some states Workers Compensation Laws define some of the work carried out by people who receive a nominal amount of money as workers under the act. Our recommendation is that all clubs should take out a minimum cover policy with their local Work Cover office in case an injured member is defined as a worker under their State Workers Compensation Act.

We note a principle is established regarding oversight or neglect on the first barrel. While there is no specific instruction about the second barrel, the shooter in this case cannot be judged on his lack of a cartridge in the second barrel. If this was the intention of the rule then it would have been clearly stated.

I am grateful to the assistance of our Rules Chairman and his committee for their ongoing advice and encouragement with this project.

It's Your Call Reply

Attn: Mr. Bill McCarthy

I cannot accept the premise that because a competitor has fired at the first target of a pair that he or she has accepted the pair. My main objection is because the competitor has only looked at the first target and fired at it he or she then has to look for the second target, decide if it is legal or not and then fire at it. I feel that the result of the first shot should count and, because of the problem with the refusal rule being vague to say the least, my call would be result of the first shot to count and shoot a proof pair for the result of the second. I would agree with your lost and lost call if several second targets were refused and I thought that the second targets were legal. Under your ruling in "Your Call" if the second target was a complete target but not a legal target in relation to flight and distance, he or she would have to shoot at it. Rule 17.A. states a shooter may refuse to shoot at any target he considers to be illegal.

My thanks go to Peter and Carmel for their inquiry regarding the acceptance of a pair of targets in double rise shooting. See It's Your Call August 2006.

To take this situation one step at a time, let us look at Rule 1.09(g) as it is written: clearly, if you shoot at an illegal target as the first target in a Double Rise event and the second target is legal you are deemed to have accepted the pair. The judgement as to the second target is not necessarily one you have made in this case. The rule clearly states that this is the situation if the second target is legal, not thought to be or perhaps legal but is in fact legal. There are other circumstances where you may not have to accept the second target and an example is given in the article.

If the second target is not legal then a different situation has arisen.

Under the Refusal Rule we have a different set of circumstances. If you refuse a target which is deemed to be perfectly legal, then the same result would apply. ie lost target. There is no automatic right under GRTS 17 given to any shooter to refuse a legal target unless there are other circumstances. In this case we are talking simply about a single double rise circumstance.

In your inquiry, you state that the article says in part "that if the second target was a complete target but not a legal target in relation to flight and distance, he or she would have to shoot at it" ... I cannot find that statement in the article. We refer only to legal target in all instances.

Your argument, which has merit, seems to be about whether or not the rule should exist rather that what the rule states. I can only commend you further for writing your concerns so that further explanation can be given in the limited space available.




Sunday's "Presidents Cup Shoot" was contested by 17 shooters, the weather was excellent and the shooting conditions were very favourable.




