

The camp had a duel role, the first was to introduce juniors from all over the country to a structured training camp regime with all the resources of the AISL made available and the second was to hold a selection match for those eligible to compete for a spot on the Australian Youth Olympic Festival team. The AYOF tournament will be held in January 2007 at the Sydney Olympic Shooting Range.

With 37 athletes involved from every state and territory the logistics from, arrival and departure, meals and general coaching were always going to prove challenging. Thus on the Thursday it proved to be so. With athletes arriving all day through till 7:45pm Gleniss spent eight hours at the airport to ensure that each group was met on arrival and that the under age athletes had no problems with clearing their firearms from the airlines. The camp was held at the Frankston Clay Target Club who very generously made their range and club house available for the duration of the event. All meals were served at the club including breakfast which solved the problem of how to feed 37 hungry kids in a motel type situation on a small budget. Mandy Kirley assisted by Anne Skinner came to the rescue and did an absolutely wonderful job of keeping up the food to what seemed like a bottomless pit.

Day one started with an opening motivational talk by Peter Spence the VIS Programs Manager. Then followed a sports science presentation by Nick Sanders who gave an overview of the resources and facilities available and the benefits of them and the distribution of training manuals.

The athletes were then divided into two groups, one of which went to a session on psychology with VIS sports psychologist Sean Richards. Sean's presentation included mental skills and preparation and the often asked question of motivation and concentration.

The other group went with VIS sports scientist Bianca Share who put them through a warm up and physical preparation session. The importance of warm up and stretching to get the heart rate up before each round was stressed as a vital part of a shooters pre competition routine.

Practical shooting and coaching with video being utilised was next on the agenda with Greg and Adam taking the trap, Russell the double trap and Valeriy the skeet.

Now to the man that stayed cool all day Dan Johnson with scores of 23-22-24-23 without handicap blew them away with a total of 92/100 as pictured with event winners.







The main difficulty for most especially the lightest framed students was holding the heavy guns in the aiming position. All that aside almost to a student everyone managed to score at least

one target shot and there were numerous 9's and 8's and 7's scored of which pleased the coaches tremendously, and certainly pleased the students more.

Once again the members of the Echuca Clay Target Club wish to con-

vey their thanks to the Echuca College and the teachers involved, for giving the students, who conducted themselves in a fine manner, the opportunity to embrace this sport and get to know what it is all about. As all members know that unless future generations get involved, and some actually continue on, this like any other sport, will wane. Certainly at this time the opposite is the trend, with large numbers of competitors attending State carnivals, and high numbers of students attending the School persons preliminary finals.

2006 ISSF Wrap-up

Well to say that it was disappointing World Champs for 2006 is an understatement. I am positive all our competitors gave it their best, one bronze medal from Emma Eagles in the Junior Ladies Trap was awesome for her, but overall just not good enough for Australian Shooting. Especially considering the results we are used to getting! 2006 NO SENIOR MEDALS FROM A WORLD CUP or WORLD CHAM-PIONSHIP. It's been quite a few years since this has happened, so something we are doing is WRONG.

WHAT ARE WE DOING WRONG?

This is the eternal question, because the rest of the World is leaving us for dead. Other World Teams are pulling away, and have depth in their team. China has 6 or 7 shooters tucked away that could win World Cups. Russia is dominating; the USA has an abundance of depth, India, the UK and of course Italy.

We seem to be relying on the same faces to get results, this has worked in the past, but now we are falling behind everyone else, and we just don't have the depth in shooters coming through. Are we spending money in areas that we shouldn't be? Team Masseur, Sports Science, is it necessary? Is it making our shooters shoot better? I admit it has helped with hydration and diet etc, but ultimately the name of the game is to shoot at, and break targets, not stare at shot strings to highlight where we missed or to wear an ice vest or urinate in a bottle to be told we are dehydrated. Our shooters need training camps throughout the year, competing against each other, making all of us hungry to win. We need "SKILLED" coaches to teach our shooters the correct way to shoot and fix problems that our competitors may have. If that means seeking an overseas coach then maybe that's where we should be looking, just like Australian Soccer did, and look at the results they got. And one skeet coach doesn't count.

Shooters are constantly being told that we need results/medals in order to secure funding for the future; this is putting undue pressure on our shooters. Pressure to achieve Travelling Scores, rather than winning at an elite level, and when the target score is met we are breeding a mentality that the job is done, we can relax. We are told that the bulk of the funding is now being spent on the top 2 or 3 in each discipline, and not on the development of the shooters coming up. The new policy is about to reward approximately 5 shotgun shooters over 3 disciplines for really what can be said is a mediocre year. As always we know that to get to the top you need to train and shoot at your own expense. So why do you need the development funding when you get to the top? Surely we have it back to front, shouldn't we be spending money on the development of the up and comers? Internationally other countries are leaving us in their wake!

Attention all Clubs The closing date for February CTSN will be 15th December 2006. It's funny when you look at the New Selection Policy and see that you needed to shoot well Overseas this year & 2005 to make it into NEXT YEARS High Performance Squad, yet the AISL neglected to send any team to the Cairo World Cup this year!! So an opportunity missed for some competitors!! Doesn't Australia need QUOTA places for the Olympic games?? As I understand it we have only won one place for Beijing that coming from Adam Vella's win at the Rome World Cup in 2005, so wouldn't it make perfect sense to send a full team to Cairo to try and win a Quota? Or send our next tier of shooter for some valuable experience? Obviously not, I must be strange! If I hear that there was no money from the Sports Commission, AISL or wherever, I then want to know what the AISL are doing about seeking alternative funding? What are they doing about gaining sponsorship, we can't keep relying on one source of funding, I would have thought this was blatantly obvious. But everything seems to be TOP SECRET with them, why communicate with the shooters, what would we know? Maybe an open forum is required at the 2007 National Titles in Brisbane, where every shooter can have their say constructively, and let the AISL know what they really think.

Australian ISSF needs a massive overhaul, starting with a Selection Criteria Set for the AISL Administration. We as competitors are constantly told we must reach a certain standard, but what standard does the AISL board have to meet?? We have a particular Western Australian AISL Board Member that has absolutely nothing to do with any ISSF shooting, haven't seen him at a State Title let alone a National Title? A matter of fact I wouldn't know this guy even if I fell over him. So the question begs, why the hell is he part of the decision making process with regards to the future of our sport, especially when he has absolutely NO IDEA what is going on at grass roots level or even National/State level. Oh and by the way, this is the same guy that was in charge of coaching at ACTA level, which has been left behind in a shambles...



LADIES COACHING DAY Newcastle/Lake Macquarie Clay Target Club

Location: 1hr north of Sydney

There's a time to laugh and a time to cry - there are times we shoot badly and there's a time to ask why. Saturday 12th August at Newcastle Lake Macquarie Clay Target Club (NLMCTC) was the day to ask all these questions that needed to be answered! Yes this was a coaching session for the Ladies, hosted by Olympian Tom Turner Jnr.

No, I (the author) am not a lady, but as a visitor for the day, invited along by good friend and Vice President of the club Jason Jenkins, I chose to sit in on most of the info sessions. As I am not big on the shotgun discipline I wanted to see what all the fuss was about!

Tom first got everyone together and spoke about what was needed to shoot better and shoot competitively - being comfortable, concentration, where to look, where to aim etc. Then one by one he checked each person's line of sight over their gun barrel and discussed what (if needed) could assist. We can all tend to slip into bad habits, and these needed to be addressed.

Then it was out to the range where each and every one was given the opportunity to fire off a number of rounds under the careful eye of Tom. From lane to lane with clays exiting the bunker in a number of directions their skills and ability were being exposed. Bit by bit Tom got to see and know where improvements could be made and it became evident that some things had to be changed so they could improve their skills.

It was already obvious to me I would not be competitive against them!

When I saw young 12 year old Rebecca shoulder her gun for the first time I thought for sure we would be picking her up off the ground. How wrong I was – this young lady has a lot of potential and with the correct guidance and, in time with practice she will be a force to be reckoned with, time is her greatest asset.

With the help of Tom's wife Sarah, videoing each and every shot, they then returned to the clubhouse to analyse their efforts and see where they were going wrong. Here they could look at their stance, their combination of gun / shoulder / cheek set up, and as some found out, what not to do. One bad habit noticed was pulling the head away from the line of sight over the barrel, to see if the clay had been hit, therefore reducing your ability and time to resight for a comfortable, clean second shot.

It was in this talk session that Tom spoke about the ability to anticipate what was going to happen, using peripheral vision, reflexes and focus.

By now he had a good understanding of what everyone was doing, so it was back out to the range to change a few things.

After this session and a short talk it was time for lunch. A barbecue lunch provided by the club was a welcome break and a chance to chat amongst each other and compare notes.

A 25 shot round was run through after lunch with all the women getting a chance to put their new found skills to work, then finally, a friendly shoot off with Renae coming out on top. Well done Renae - a few less unbroken clays to pick up at the end of the day.

Well done to all the ladies, as by the end of the day a number of them were following through and shattering chips with their second shots!

To sum up for the day Tom spoke to the ladies individually about each one's efforts throughout the day and their improvements. Finally he encouraged them to continue with the changes they had made which produced good results, and said with practice and using everything they had learnt, these ladies grades are sure to improve.

Finally, from all of our club members we would like to congratulate Tom Turner in competing in this years World Cup. Tom was the only Australian competitor to qualify for the finals, an outstanding result from a genuine competitor.



As referees we are frequently called upon to adjudicate situations where a shooter fails to fire at a perfectly normal (legal) target on either the first or second barrel. The instructions for the procedure the referee is to adopt is set out in GRTS 14. Among other things, it requires the referee to visually check the safety catch is not in the on position and also check that the action is closed. The referee will then ask the shooter to test fire the gun once only.

You as the referee have had this situation arise. The shooter then fires the gun, which discharges the cartridge. You quite correctly rule "lost target" (Rule 1.10).

However the shooter concerned indicates that he has "frozen on the trigger" and claims a "no target".

IT'S YOUR CALL

If you rule "lost target" you are quite correct. Freezing on the trigger does not constitute entitlement to a shooter receiving another target.

It is interesting to note that despite the fact that a referee cannot call a 'no target' to deny a shooter from shooting at any target, there are in fact 13 occasions where "no target" can be called. These occasions are clearly listed in Rule 1.07. Freezing on the trigger is not one of those. Moreover it is also not covered in the Refusal Rule.

INSURANCE INFO

Dear Sir

Can a member of the Sporting Shooter's Assoc shoot in a club competition? I ask this in view of the fact that a Sporting Shooter's have their own insurance policy for members.

I was asked this question by a Sporting Shooter who had been refused permission to shoot in a club competition.

Here is an excerpt from the Rulebook regarding this matter.

4.14 (f) All competitors must be registered through an affiliated club with the ACTA before taking part in competition. Unregistered competitors are not permitted to compete at any time.

However in Sporting Clays the ACTA has reciprocal rights with Field & Game and SSAA for competition Sporting Clays only.



Psychological Skills for Shooting

FORE-END

In last month's article, I looked at how the mind can force the fore-end hand to interfere with our shooting, by trying to make "adjustments" after we have pulled the trigger. This is an example of our minds 'fearing that we will miss' and tries to help out. Because we doubt our ability to hit the target we subconsciously let our mind tell our muscles how they should behave. This can effect both our trigger finger and the hand on the fore-end.

The Moment of Inertia (or MOI), of a shotgun, according to Chris Batha, is the combination of its component parts and the distribution of its weight through its length. Chris Batha is a senior coach with the CPSA in England. Put simply, MOI means the balance of the shotgun. According to Batha, the correct MOI or balance point for a shotgun is on or very slightly in front of the hinge pin. With the MOI in this position, the gun's weight is evenly distributed between the hands and correct and precise control can be maintained. Having the MOI in the correct place allows the adjustment of the fore-end grip on the gun to better match certain target presentations. Batha argues that the core skill of consistent shooting is to match the muzzle speed with the speed of the target. The right hand can help here because is can be used to control muzzle speed through the extension of the fore-end grip.

It is logical to accept that the closer the hand is to the action the faster the gun will swing and the further the hand extends towards the muzzle the slower and steadier the swing will be. The fore-end hand also influences how much swing the body is capable of. With the fore-end hand fully extended, there is a limit to how far the gun can be swung, especially for right hand swinging targets.

So if the MOI is correct and the trigger hand is gripping the gun correctly, then the gun can be driven by the shooters body and not just their arms. This has the advantage of integrating head, body and arms so that the gun becomes an extension of the shooters eyes and hands. It also helps reduce fatigue, which is essential for long marathon type shoot offs.

A recent article on freezing on the trigger generated considerable discussion. I had telephone calls and letters from readers who wished to either thank me for the article or take issue with what I had written. So working on the principle, 'that if you walk on thin ice, you may as well dance', I'm going to revisit flinching and freezing on the trigger. The following information comes from the American magazine Trap & Field and was the article by Phil Kiner in October and November, 2003. Kiner argues that flinching/freezing occurs because premature discharge causes us to miss the target. To explain what he means it is necessary to look at the whole shot-firing process. Firstly, you mount the gun and address the trap, getting ready, similar to addressing the ball in golf. Secondly, as you call for the target and the target is released, you start tracking the target with your eye/hand/gun. Now you should have a proper visual picture. Next, the brain sends a message to the brain to pull the trigger and when the message is relayed to the finger it pulls the trigger. Fourthly, in a split second the mechanical process occurs in the gun and whilst the barrels are still moving the shot leaves the barrels. The gun should continue moving because we have locked on to the target. With triggers that are very light, the gun goes off somewhat faster than normal. This shortens the follow through.

This is a complex case of precision timing and when done correctly the target is smoked. When this is repeated and repeated your brain works out exactly what it needs to do to smoke the targets. Kiner argues that when you change the trigger weight or the lock time, you change the amount of actual follow through and instead of smoking the targets you are just chipping targets or missing them completely. This sets up a conflict between your eyes, your brain and your trigger finger. Your brain knows what it needs to do to smoke the target and it's not working like normal. Because we like to have things perfect we will change things and you will start to pull the trigger, but because of the confusion and the need for perfection your brain tells you to stop because it is not perfect; this means you start to pull the trigger and then stop.

Kiner offers a solution. Because the gun is going off faster than normal there is a need to slow the process down somewhat. This requires heavier trigger pressures. What this does is prevent the gun going off unexpectedly or prematurely. The brain then realizes that it has to make a concerted and be decisive in actually pulling the trigger. Now it is important to realize that if you have light triggers and things are OK then leave them alone until or if becomes a problem.

NSW Members and Dealers

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless: (a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.


Before the presentations started a 'Life Membership' was awarded to Club Secretary


