

A perfectly sunny Friday afternoon saw 40 shooters turn out for the 50 Target State Handicap, the first event of the State Skeet Carnival at Tallawalla.

Errol Reeves shot the only possible of the event but was unseated for first place in the shoot off by Nigel Hughes who shot well under pressure, going in on wood. Results for the event: 1st Nigel Hughes 83/85, 2nd Errol Reeves 84/87, 3rd Frank Cooper 77/87.

Another squad was added to the competition on Saturday morning with 45 shooters arriving for the 100 Target Queensland State Skeet Championship. The vaguest afternoon breeze ensured that no possibles were shot, but Lorraine Hughes from Caboolture did the next best thing coming in with 99/100 to take out the trophy. Craig O'Neill, Mike Swale and Laurie Chelepy fought it out in AA grade, close behind on 98 apiece. Other shoot offs included Bevan Reibel and John Eckel in A grade, both shooting a healthy 96/100, with Pat Dury and Greg Mitchell shooting for second place in B grade. Final results for the Championship were: Overall Lorraine Hughes 99/100, 1st AA Craig O'Neill 136/138, 2nd AA Laurie Chelepy 135/138, 1st A Bevan Reibel 100/104, 2nd A John Eckel 99/104, 1st B James Laws 93/100, 2nd B Greg Mitchell 93/104, 1st C Brett Graving 87/100, 2nd C Frank Cooper 96/111. Vere Storch won the Ladies with 97/100 and Mick McGill took the Veterans also with 97/100.



Nigel Hughes and Wayne Reeves dropped the same target in their shoot off for second in A grade, then went on to shoot an entire round before Wavne came unstuck on the same station. Results for this event were: Overall John King 69/69, 1st AA Craig O'Neill 68/69, 2nd AA Mick McGill 63/64, 1st A Errol Reeves 59/60, 2nd A Nigel Hughes 87/89, 1st B Pat Dury 48/50, 2nd B Henry Haythorpe 47/50, 1st C Paul Maloney 45/50, 2nd C Don Berrie 44/50. Ladies Lorraine Hughes 61/63, Veterans Neal Dimmick 48/50.

The 50 Target State Skeet Doubles Championship kept shooters on their toes with no possibles shot for the event. Craig O'Neill from Brisbane let only one get away though, coming in with an impressive 49/50. Mike Swale gave way to Laurie Chelepy in a shoot off for AA grade, while Glen Reeves snuck past Pat Dury in a shoot off for second in B. Brett Graving from Callide Dawson club showed his talent for this event by shooting a 43/50, then taking out Paul Maloney in a shoot off to win C grade - not bad for a first time doubles shooter! 

Location on the Murray River which forms the border between Victoria and New South Wales



Psychological Skills for Shooting

SETTING GOALS FOR 2007

I am often asked how I come up with the subjects for these articles, and my response is that the subject matter is not hard because there are heaps of things that happen around the traps I visit so finding material is not difficult. It also helps when people contact me by phone or mail and ask me about specific problems they may be having.

This month's article was an easy choice, because as you read this you will be getting prepared for 2007 and you should setting your goals for what you want to achieve next year. There were three other reasons why I chose this topic. Firstly, I have a good friend in Adelaide who will be returning to shooting from an injury and operation and I want to help set out a plan for her to use. Secondly, I have been asked, as part of my role as consultant psychologist with the Southern Sports Academy to present workshops to the Hockey, Netball, Basketball and Tennis squads, in December, on goal setting and preparing for the 2007 season. Finally, for my own benefit because I bought a new gun and I need to re-visit these fundamentals so as to improve my own performance.

In everything we do as part of our lives; sport, career, finance, relationships, health, education, etc we will achieve more and possibly achieve better results if we have set goals for ourselves. Firstly, the goals give us a target to work towards and gives us a reward that can be realized when we have achieved our goals. Secondly, they provide a vehicle from which we can plan the course of action we need to take. By this I mean that if our goals are being met we can move on to the next goal, or we can revise the goal or break it down into smaller steps if we are unable to achieve the results we desire. Thirdly, our goals give us an outcome to measure our performance/learning against.

Using our goals to evaluate our coaching program is a necessary part of making sure we are moving forward.

There are eight basic rules for goal setting:

- 1. You must like your goals. Your goal must be something you want to achieve
- 2. Your goals must bring to life some aspect of your vision. This is vital; Businesses and government departments have vision statements and they are usually on display when you walk in the foyer of the company. It is an expression of what the organization wants to achieve and it is displayed so the consumers can see what the company is striving to achieve. Athletes also need to have a vision to work towards.
- 3. There needs to be a connection between this goal and other goals. Goals need to work together to achieve the vision. Goals that are unconnected do not provide continuity or consistency and may not be working towards the common good; your vision.
- 4. Your goal should express your potential. Your goal, which is focused towards your vision, should express what you are able to achieve. You should be striving for a personal best or improvement on what you can already do.
- 5. Your goals need to be unique, innovative and creative so that life is just more than hard work. This is really important for sport. Because you are doing something to improve a leisure activity, keeping it different from what we perceive as work will keep us focused.
- The goal should help you gain recognition. Goals are designed to improve and maximize your potential, so meeting your goals and achieving personal best performances, should help you get noticed by others, selectors, coaches, etc.
- 7. You must be committed to make it happen. Commitment is necessary for achievement. Some goals may be met by chance error or by accident but usually they require effort and commitment.

8. It must be fun. If you are having fun you'll learn and achieve better results and the task will not just seem like work.

Goal setting is easy: take four pieces of paper and on top of the first page write Lifetime. Now under subject headings such as sport, education, health, finance, career, relationships, etc write down three things you want to have achieved throughout your life. Where do want to be when you retire from your career or sport. Be as ambitious as you want, they are your goals. When you have written these goals turn over the page and do not look at it again.

On the next piece of paper write Five year. Under the same headings write down where you want to be, what you want to have achieved in five years. When you have done this turn over the page and do not look at it again.

On the next piece of paper write This year. Under the same headings write down where you want to be, what you want to have achieved at the end of this next year. When you have done this turn over the page and do not look at it again.

On the next piece of paper write monthly. Under the same headings write down what you are doing now. When you have done this turn over the page and do not look at it again.

Leave your goals for twenty four hours and then review them and put them into some priority. When reviewing them it is important to make sure that there is a link; that is, is what you are doing this month, helping you achieve what you want to achieve this year. Is what you are doing this year helping you achieve what you want to achieve in five years and is what you are doing to achieve your five year goals going to help you achieve your lifetime goals. Remember you can do this exercise as often as you want, because your circumstances may change and there may be a need to review your goals regularly.

Dear Your Say

I enjoy reading the differing opinions on the comparison of nomination fees versus trophies/cash prizes, but the last letter sent in by Adrian Lloyd (October 2006) really got my hackles up, so here and now I decided to have my say as well.

Let's deal with the promotion of Clay Target shooting first.

What a way to present OUR sport, quote "AA Winner has to work a bit harder than the C Grader". One could take the meaning that the C Graders don't sweat the big time trying to win or improve their grade. Mate, I have been to shoots where in some events only the C Graders had a shoot off. I know from experience, being a C Grader at the time.

I have to admit it has taken me some 18 years of being a member, (enjoying the sport, being disappointed even though I tried, gave up for a while, made some sincere friendships along the way) to finally crack into B Grade and now I have to try a lot harder if I want to win in my new grade. So I figure I work every bit as hard as an AA shooter.

Perhaps it might be advisable to mix with the lower grade shooters and source their feedback before you make bold statements that may just make the lower grades feel like we are a necessary evil to the future benefit of the sport and to subsidise AA Shooters' trophies.

As for the perspective of "get back what you put in" - I agree with the Graded Cash Divide basis. If one tosses the figures Adrian quoted, I don't quite figure how C grade has a pool value of \$27.90 per shooter and the other grades have \$20.40 per shooter thus having a pool value of \$565.80 (versus \$550.80)

All things being equal, if the each shooter has the same value of \$20.00 (example only) and the number of shooters are reversed i.e. AA 2, B 3, etc using Adrian's example then the C Graders have a fair chance of winning a decent prize pool, simply because of the number of shooters, not because of their skill base.

And yes I have heard all the arguments about the prize pools. I would like to add another perspective and you tell me how fair this one is in your opinion.

I am a Lady Shooter. Yes, we do get reduced noms in most shoots. But how about the Ladies High Gun?? I have won an odd one or two, but only because there were no AA Lady Shooters. Why don't I just give a donation to the AA Lady Shooter if one shows up at a shoot? But hey, I can work hard, pay my noms, have a go and see if I can shoot better and maybe just one day.

I could take this discussion even further to the point of being ridiculous, from a lower grade shooters perspective - when nominations for a shoot are calculated by the Club the cost of the Overall High Gun, (usually of considerable value) is obviously incorporated. Why should the lower grades (who know they have Buckleys' chance of winning an Overall High Gun) subsidize the

A and AA shooters for that trophy? (Unless there is a silver fox in the camp).

It is nice to go to a club where the value of the trophies is secondary to the actual satisfaction of winning an event. Strange how the profile of shooters is very different compared to those shoots that have expensive trophies.

However I must say, all this debate does not reflect on material trophies presented those shooters winning in their grades. I have yet to attend a shoot where lower grade winners are given a trophy of lesser value than the higher grades and hope I never see that scenario change.

It's all about money and sportsmanship and "Ne'er the twain shall meet".

Still, that's like paying Registration Fees and starting another hot debate about what we are really paying for - fiddlers of the rules?

That's Clay Target Shooting - You win some, You loose some.

After having discussion with many shooters that attended Wagga National ground, since Mattarelli traps were installed, I am convinced that they are not being adjusted in a way that gives a shooter consistent regulation targets. The problem is that because the traps are fixed at different levels they cannot be accurately set at 10 metres. They should be set at 18 metres so that they become more accurate. At the moment they vary from left to right in height and could also be varying in speed. Our rules say that targets can be set at 18 metres so it is not a problem to change. I request that this problem be attended to immediately as scores have suffered, and shooter numbers have been reduced. You may not agree with that comment, however, I can assure you that this is happening.

Due to my interest and participation in our great sport of clay target and I am disappointed that this problem has been with us for almost a year and has not been addressed.

Dear Your Say

S.O.S (Save Our Sport)

I am writing in support of Dustin Clay's "In the Trenches" article in the November magazine.

This new Australian International Shooting Limited (AISL) selection criteria will do nothing but turn any new ISSF shooters away from our sport. To receive any funding to compete overseas for 2007 you must have performed in 2005 &t 2006 plus shoot an unrealistic qualifying score at either the National Titles, Australia Cup or the NSW &t Victorian State Titles.

The qualifying scores are as follow. Men's Trap and Skeet 121/125, Ladies Skeet 70/75, Ladies Trap 69/75 & Men's Double Trap 140/150.

At the past SIX National Titles the 121/125 in Men's Trap has only ever been achieved by 3 shooters. Adam Vella has done it once from 15 events competed in, Michael Diamond twice from 9 events and Jeff Tonna twice from 17 events. Remember Adam and Michael have both been ranked #1 in the world during this time, yet have only shot 121 or higher 3 times out of a possible 26 events between them respectively. Ladies Trap score has only been achieved twice in 6 years, once by Deserie Baynes and once by Susie Trindall. In Men's Double Trap the only shooter to have shot 140 is Russell Mark who has done it 3 times from 17 events.

The above clearly shows how unrealistic the qualifying scores are. To shoot a high score in ISSF is one thing, to be told you must shoot a high score is another thing altogether. Setting higher qualifying scores to make the team is not the magical answer to improving our shooters and is not good for the future of our sport!!!

The number of ISSF shooters in this country aged 21-27 who consistently compete at ISSF events you could count on one hand. Isn't this the age group we want to encourage shooting our disciplines, as they should be the next contenders to come through the ranks and be pushing for selection in Olympics, World Champs and Commonwealth Games teams?

We have had so many juniors come through that as soon as they turn 21 give the sport up. Why??? Because for a number of years now the AISL (ASA as it was back then) have only been interested in the top 3-4 competitors in each discipline, anyone else they didn't want to know about. Next year they have finally put in place a Youth Group Development team aged between 21-25, but have set the qualifying score higher then last years OPEN qualifying scoreÖPRICELESS. It gets worse the poor juniors (under 21 years) have not been told their qualifying score yet for next year, they will be told AFTER they have shot.

I know of at least a squad of shooters who would regularly feature in finals at National Titles have cashed in their airfares to the Australia Cup in Canberra and some even for the National Titles in Brisbane. I believe this will become a common theme at our big ISSF events. It is inevitable numbers will drop off at ACTA run ISSF events such as State and National titles because of the AISL's stupidity. Again I ask how can this be good for our sport???

Our sports main object is about breaking targets, whoever breaks the most wins. Let's go back to first past the post, whoever breaks the most targets makes the team. The same people will still make the team but it gives everyone an equal chance and that's all we are asking. If a new shooter makes the team then good, they deserve their spot. It has worked for years in DTL for the Macintosh and State teams and you never hear any arguments as it is simple, if you missed out on the team you didn't hit enough targets!!! Events such as swimming and running are selected in this fashion, why should shooting be any different??

The following excerpt of quotes was taken from an ISSF newsletter "24 Grams" that was recently published in New Zealand, who up until recently had an unrealistic selection criteria similar to ours that almost destroyed ISSF shooting in New Zealand. "Australia produced more consistent international competitors and had more depth when they had a very open selection policy that encouraged more people to have a go. When Russell, Michael & Adam retire, Australia is going to become an easy beat. Let's hope someone over there wakes up quick."

Let's hope indeed!!!



You are refereeing a squad where a predictable and possibly normal number of targets are thrown broken. You naturally rule "No Target" in each instance and proceed with the shoot.

A squad member calls for a target which is released broken. You call No Target.

The shooter then calls for another target but has not put his gun to his shoulder or made any attempt to prepare to shoot at the target. A legal target is released. He obviously has called for the target just to "have a look at one".

What do you rule?

IT'S YOUR CALL

If you ruled "Lost Target" you would be quite correct. Sounds a bit tough doesn't it.

Under Rule GRTS 5 (b) (vi) a shooter is not entitled to see a target unless he has received two broken targets in a row. This shooter has received only one broken target has ignored the Referee and taken it upon himself to view a target that he is not entitled to view. This seems to be a frequent occurrence with our voice release systems and there have been instances of shooters calling for 3 and even 4 targets without reference to the Referee. If the shooter had been particularly concerned about the targets he could have asked the Referee if he could see another. Whether the Referee would grant his request is another matter. In view of the requirements of GRTS 5 (b) (vi) it does not give the Referee a choice in the matter unless other extraneous conditions are obvious. Therefore, in any case, the shooter is not entitled to take it upon himself and call for a target without the authority of the Referee. However, good refereeing practice would dictate that the Referee warn the shooter that the next incidence of this nature will be called a "Lost Target". He would also ensure that the squad was fully aware that provisions of GRTS 5 (b) (vi) would be applied henceforth.

GRTS 5 sets out quite clearly when and where targets are to be shown by Referees. Most shooters are very familiar with the common ones. It seems that lack of knowledge of the section on broken targets can cause this misunderstanding.

We have had instances where shooters have claimed that they were refusing the targets under GRTS 17. However where a shooter has not closed his gun or mounted it to his shoulder he is certainly not in a position to claim a refusal under GRTS 17.

The rules regarding entitlements to be shown a target are quite specific. It is up to all shooters to familiarise themselves with these rules to avoid unnecessary conflict and embarrassment.



The Tasmanian Clay Target association's annual State Trap Carnival has grown in attendance over the last few years to well over 150 competitors with over 60 interstate competitors attending each year to make up the numbers provide welcome competition and increasing overall shooting scores. The event was a huge attraction with enormous interest for shooters and other visitors to the ground. Geoff Faulkes led from the outset, becoming the eventual winner after shooting the 25 target final shoot off without dropping a point, winning with a score of 373/375.




