2006 SKEET NATIONALS

Shooters from around Australia and New Zealand again came back to the refurbished National Shooting Ground in Wagga Wagga. General comment was that the ACTA had done a great job on the new look ground.

NATIONAL 20 GAUGE CHAMPIONSHIPS

The first National event for the carnival saw 72 competitors line up for the National 20 gauge Championship. At the end of qualification only one shooter stood alone with a perfect score of 100/100. Brian Thompson from New Zealand received the Royal Blue Sash, Silver Australia Badge and John Withers Memorial Trophy.

Section wins went to Kelly Norris in the Women's 99/100, Thomas Dent 98/100 the Juniors and Mick McGill 96/100 the Veterans.

An exciting part of the shoot-off was the setting of a new ACTA 20g long run record by Leigh Roberts. The new mark of 240 was certainly a fine effort by Leigh.

ACTA SKEET CHAMPIONSHIPS

The second event for the National carnival saw 109 competitors line up for the ACTA Skeet Championship. At the end of qualification seven shooters had shot the possible qualifying score.

After the shootoff David Dundon from the Gold Coast Club claimed the ACTA Skeet Championship with a score of 272/272. David was awarded the Bottle Green Sash for this event.

Section wins went to Lorraine Hughes in the Women's 98/100, Thomas Dent 100/100 the Juniors and Mick McGill 98/100 the Veterans.

The team of Adrian and Julian Lucchitti, Tong Shang, Dennis Savage and Thomas Dent shot a score of 246/250 to win from the Victorian team. Other placings were third, Queensland 244/250, forth South Australia 244/250, fifth Western Australia, sixth Tasmania and seventh Northern Territory 226/250.

Women's: The Victorian team of Kelly Norris, Jacqueline Durham and Linda Watson were successful this year with an excellent score of 74/75. Other placings were second Queensland 67/75, third New



South Wales 61/75 and forth Northern Territory on a score of 60/75. **Juniors:** The Victorian team of Alex Spurling, Gavin Barry and Robert Elder were successful this year with a score of 65/75.



Veterans: Three teams contested the veterans with the team of John Guberina, Hugh Fairfield-Smith and John Cunningham from New South Wales taking this event with a combined score of 70/75 from Victoria on 67/75. Third place went to Queensland with a score of 66/75.

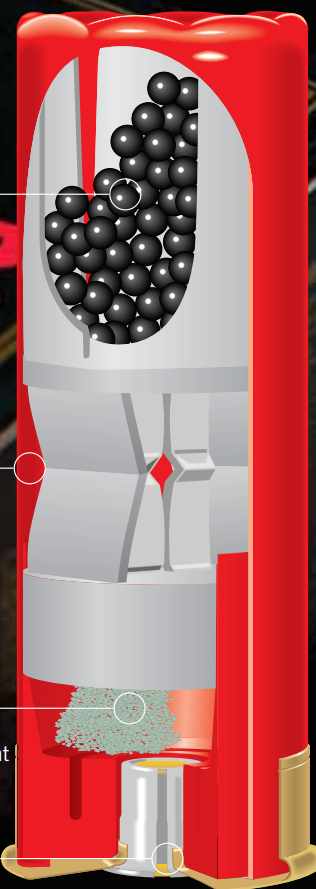

A good turn up saw 46 shooters compete on the weekend, with 5 competitors in attendance from the big island to the north. There was a small increase in numbers from last year, with many shooters who did not attend last year indicating there is a growing population of skeet shooters out there.

The third skeet layout made for a very pleasurable weekend, lots of shooting and no late nights and a lot less pressure.

The Tasmanian Gun Club are to be commended on their ground improvements over the past couple of years with the inclusion of a third skeet layout and two new trap layouts giving a total of seven trap layouts available.

Again some very good competition was seen, Graham Otley kept the pressure on all weekend, with wins in the heavy wind conditions in both the Don Taylor Memorial Championship and the 20 gauge Carnival Championship, 62/62 for Overall and B Grade in the Don Taylor and 48/50 for B Grade in the 20 gauge event. He had another creditable win in the A Grade section of the State Skeet Championship on Sunday winning, shooting a 97/100.

Chris Rockliff failed to dominate the carnival as in the past, but managed to win the Overall and AA Grade for the State Championship with a very good 99/100. However he was Overall High Gun Winner for the weekend with a 190/200, close on his heels were Graham Otley and Allan Spinks each with 189/200 winning the A and B Grade sections.

Peter Rockliff also kept the pressure on for the whole weekend with wins in Veterans in the Skeet Doubles (45/50), the State Skeet Championship (98/100) and the Veterans High Gun with a 188/200.

Up and coming Junior Isaac Tasker did a clean sweep of the Junior events winning in every event and coming home right behind the top shooters with an excellent 187/200 for the Junior High Gun sash.

The mainland shooters were not disappointed with Max Oakley getting a win in the Don Taylor Memorial Championship (A grade 50/50) and Fab Francione (B Grade 96/100) and N Cottee (C Grade 93/100) in the State Skeet Championship

that our team was ready to go into competition and make an unstoppable lead for the title.

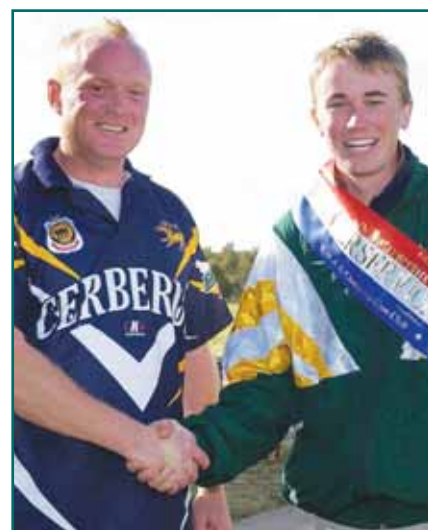

On 18th November the New South Wales Gun Club held its inaugural Gold Sovereign Side x Side Championship. With the weather the previous week being cold, wet and windy, there was some concerns about what to expect. However the day was perfect and the earlier rain made the Club Grounds look great. The theme for the competition was - "A day of fine old guns, great shooting and good fellowship." I feel sure that the 56 shooters and many spectators who attended would agree that all three aspects of the theme were met.

As with any inaugural event there was a little trepidation about how successful the day would be. When by an hour before the scheduled commencement time we had 11 squads we felt sure that there were a great many shooters who enjoyed the opportunity to pull out the old side x side from the back of the gun safe and blow some dust out.

Shooters travelled from many parts of the state to compete - Cooma, Dubbo, Goulburn, Hermitdale, Illawarra, Cecil Park, Kempsey, Leeton, Newcastle, Orange, Scone, Upper Hunter and Sydney G.C. The incentive of an overall prize of \$500.00, a genuine 1873 gold sovereign and a sash helped to fuel the enthusiasm. All of the other grade prizes were valued at considerably more than the nomination fees and were certainly enthusiastically shot for.

The idea for a major side x side event came from four Club members; Hugh McMaster, Neale Guy, Andrew Shacklock and John Newton, all of whom have a passion for shooting old shotguns. They thought that there must be a lot of others who would like the opportunity to use their old guns in a worthwhile competition. The Club directors agreed and the processes were put in place to get the shoot organised.

It was interesting to find that amongst the 56 shooters, there were 34 gun makers represented with guns ranging in value from a few hundred dollars up to very expensive Purdeys. When not shooting most competitors spent the time comparing guns and appreciating some of the incredible workmanship in the higher quality firearms. Some of the makers were - Webley & Scott, Cogswell & Harrison, Henry Clark, Buliag Suml, Beretta, Greener (4 Blue Rocks!) Winchester, Fabarm, G & S Holloway, Liege, Aya, Shaco Freres, Krupps, SKB, Dame, Jensen, Purdey, Westley Richards, Continental, Miroku, Dickson, Gazelle, Samuel Marson, Cashmore, Boswell, Holloway & Norton, Bonehill, William Leech, Frederick Baker, Fabarm, Eibah Mugica, Essex, Carswell. There was evidence of a lot of pride in owning some of these incredible old guns.

Before the competition commenced every gun was inspected by the Club armourer, Terry Dawson who verified that each gun was completely safe to use. It was interesting to note that some of the high quality older firearms which were not nitro proofed had been sleeved (at considerable expense) to ensure that they would handle modern

loads. The competition was over 4 x 25 tgt visits to the trap - but shot as one event with a possible of 120. 25 tgt D.T.L - 25 tgt Continental - 25 tgt Mixed (10 tgt S/B off 11m, 10 tgt P/S off 15m - 5 tgt D/B off 18m) and 25 tgt Five Stand. Prior to the event there had been some concern that it was unfair putting up old side x sides (double trigger, extractor, field chokes) against the modern side x sides which had one trigger, ejectors and choked for trap shooting. Psychological Skills for Shooting

by Michael Kruger-Davis

DON'T LET YOUR THINKING STOP YOUR GOALS

This month I want to take last month's article on goal setting a step further. The important aspect about last month's article is that as we go into a new year we should be re-evaluating what our goals will be for the following year. If your goal is to go from A grade to AA grade then you will need to increase your percentage; to do this you will have to shoot possibles in most events; to do this you will have to shoot each target. I have said previously it is easier to shoot 25 lots of 1 target than it is to shoot 1 lot of 25 targets. This is because you can control your concentration, focus your attention, deal with your distractions and limit self-doubt and anxiety.

By now you should have completed the goal setting exercise and you should have given thought to the goals you want to achieve and how much effort you will need to put in to achieving them. Your goals should fit into the SMART category. The acronym SMART stands for specific, measurable, adjustable, realistic and time based. Talking to your coach, a sports psychologist, shooting buddy etc, is an easy way to draw up goals that fit into these categories. The hard part is being able to follow through with the goals and actually achieve them.

So what can get in the way of us meeting our goals we have set for ourselves?

Firstly, there is our health and level of fitness. This is probably stating the bleeding obvious. Making sure we are in good physical condition is important for any sport. An example of this is diabetes. As we get older and become less active, it is likely that our weight will increase. If you are a smoker and drinker, then this will increase your chances of type 2 diabetes, for example. Changes in blood sugar levels will affect your performance, your stamina and your eyesight.

Secondly, mechanical issues such as gun fit, ammunition, right gun for the task, etc.

Next are the psychological issues such as ability to concentrate, competition preparedness, visualization, etc.

Finally, there are psychological aspects that affect our thinking, that get in our way and produce self-doubt, anxiety and fear. Whilst these issues have been the subject in previous articles I would like to explore some of them again.

Often elite athletes strive for perfection in their given sport. There is nothing wrong with their approach although it can sometimes hold athletes back from reaching their potential.

According to Cohn, some of the advantages of perfectionism such as having a strong work ethic, commitment to your goals, and a willingness to learn and improve, are often outweighed by the many

disadvantages of trying to be too perfect with your performance. If not kept in check, this can stifle your talent, such as strict expectations, focusing on the wrong goals, fear of failure, anxiety, and worrying too much about results.

Athletes need to learn to (1) identify and discard strict expectations and (2) let go of frustration so they can stay composed after mistakes and perform in the present moment without dwelling on the past.

Another aspect that can affect our thinking is what Cohn refers to as self-intimidation. Rather than being intimidated by your opponent's ability and skills, you become intimidated by the way you think about your opponent's skills and abilities. This self-intimidation is a form of psyching yourself out. By focusing your thoughts on your opponents, then you move away from focusing on the important aspects such as being in the present and enjoying the process.

The final aspect is that we doubt our ability to perform and thereby lose confidence. By holding onto past internal judgements about our performance, we give ourselves negative self talk that increases our level of self-doubt. Self doubt leads to our muscles tensing up and we cannot perform the way we would like.

So once you have worked out your goals and are happy with what you want to achieve, you should try to let go of those thoughts that may interfere with the goals being achieved.

Recently I had to attend a Southern Sports Academy presentation evening in Wagga. Usually, if I have to stay overnight, I camp at the National Ground, but because this was a formal affair and as I had Barbara with me, we booked into The Lawson. As shooters we are very fortunate to have sponsors like Geoff and Janine Kidd. The facilities at the Lawson were better than I had experienced in Sydney or Melbourne and because of their generous sponsorship of our sport we should all make the effort to support them.

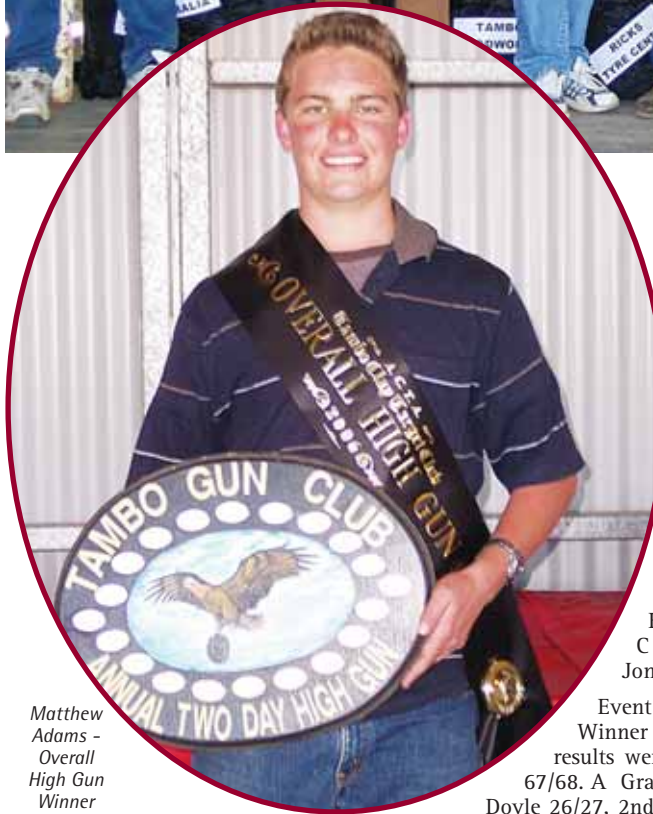

Lach Cameron (Tamworth) recorded 67/100 to win C Grade. He was closely followed by Ian Carter from Quirindi with 66/100.

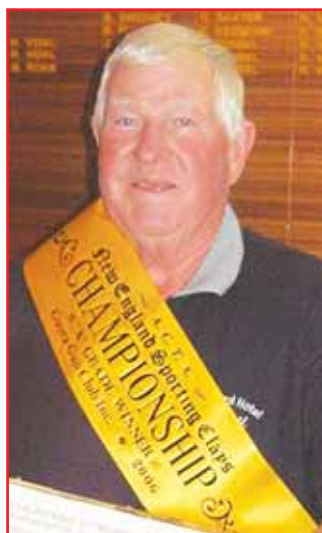

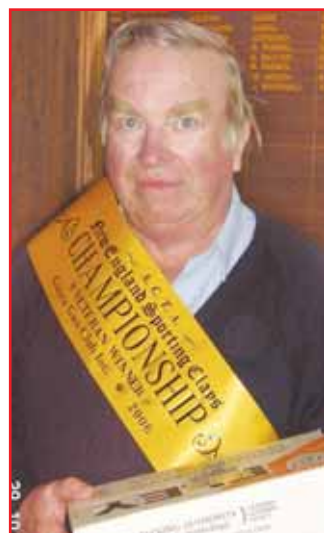

Canterbury Trapmaster

Ian Campbell

In 1964 I joined the ACTA which I have enjoyed to this day. I have seen many changes during this time, in particular to the types of machines used to throw clay targets and the methods used to release them. In the early 1960's most of Australia's provincial gun clubs used two styles of traps. The first was the ELEY PLUS trap. It was manually cocked and loaded by a trapper in a secure trap house and also released by him on the shooter's call. A referee would judge the outcome. The trapper needed good hearing and reflexes, especially when handicap shooting and also when shooting into a strong wind. The second type of trap was the ELEY SNIPE trap. The machine was cocked by means of a thirty yard rod with a handle positioned behind the 27 yard handicap yard on lane 3 and released by the puller on the shooter's call. It also required a trapper in the trap house to load the clay target and a referee.

The clubs in the cities used DAMO electric oscillating traps made in Australia by Dan Mott and they threw acceptable targets. However, astute shooters could predict what angle the target would be thrown, because the oscillation was not interrupted.

In the late 1960's, after Winchester

Australia began manufacturing ammunition in Victoria, they imported the famous Winchester White Flyer trap that had a well deserved reputation. This electric operated trap incorporated an interrupter that made predicting angles far more difficult. Targets were released on the shooter's call by an electric release button held by the referee but a trapper was still needed to load the machine.

Over the last 20 odd years I have shot over many different makes of hopper fed traps, I have listened to the shooters and the club trap mechanics and I had to come to the conclusion that if only somebody could just sit down and take all of the good qualities of the best DTL traps available and put it all together, the only thing we shooters would have to worry about is hitting the target that it throws.

I have now seen that trap. I have watched it being made and assembled. I have spoken at length to its designers and manufacturer, and also those responsible for the electronics that run it. I have watched it working in the trap house and I have shot over it. It is called the "CANTERBURY TRAPMASTER" and it is the best machine I have seen to date.

I was invited to NZ by Canterbury Trap International Limited, to spend a day in their factory to observe the different stages of manufacturing and assembly of their Trapmaster DTL and Continental machines.

Bruce Rickard, CTT's Marketing Director met me at the airport and we drove to the manufacturing facilities in Christchurch. I was introduced to Mike Owens and John East, partners of Prometal Industries. This company specialises in laser cutting, turret punching, fabrication, welding and powder coating. In fact, just about everything you need to produce the mechanical side of this new generation fully automatic trap machine. John is a competitive shot gunner and has a mechanical design background. Attending the "GRAND AMERICAN" in Vandalia, USA, he saw a prototype trap that showed a lot of promise. This trap incorporated the time proven Western 1524 arm

and the reliable Western flat-coiled spring, but John could foresee a few inherent problems with the machines design.

Canterbury Trap Int entered into an agreement with the machines American designer and then set about remodelling it incorporating some of the best features from their well proven singles machine, the Canterbury Crusader. One of the features incorporated was a single cam system that times all of the operation so that fully automatic singles and doubles can be thrown from this machine with great precision. Another feature is the patented

mechanism used for delivering targets onto the Western 1524 throwing arm. This is currently the only known trap capable of loading two targets onto a floating arm. The Trapmaster was born!

The only way you can describe this target delivery system is gentle. The targets are actually placed and not dropped onto the arm. What was also very apparent to me was how quiet and smooth the operation is compared to other hopper fed machines that I have observed in the past. The Trapmaster's hopper holds 600 targets, a substantial number, but with hardly any rattling, clacking or vibration.

The hopper is also very easy to load. After observing safety procedures by using the safety remote switch to isolate the voice

release equipment and manually release the arm, you can rotate the turret to any position that makes the target loading easier.

Watching the different manufacturing stages of the Trapmaster was very interesting and for me two stages stood out. The first was seeing the hopper platforms being laser cut this is a computer controlled process that is incredibly accurate and fast. The laser is capable of cutting up to 20mm thick sheets of mild or stainless steel.

The second was watching the electronic circuitry being made. The whiz who designed the Canterbury Voice Release electronics is Graham Callander he also designed the electronics for the Trapmaster and Crusader traps. Seeing the computer controlled machine that produces the control boards for the first time was breath taking. The speed that it operated at was quite incredible and I think my hosts were amused by my amazement

Among the many features of the control box is the unreadable interrupt on the oscillation motor that makes it impossible to predict which angle the target will come out. To conserve power and unnecessary wear of the moving parts of the trap, it will switch itself off and go into a sleep mode after two minutes of inactivity.

What will also appeal to gun club management is the display on the control box for both target counting and machine cycles. This is a good way to keep a check on the club's clay targets.

From electronics we went to the last department and perhaps the most important one, assembly, testing and packaging. This is the domain of Russell Smart, a man who truly loves trap and skeet shooting. Here among stacks of powder coated trap parts, he assembles Trapmasters with painstaking care. He then tests each trap to ensure that it is operating correctly before packing it into an impact resistant crate ready for despatch.

There are a couple of new products recently released and I will touch upon them. At the South Island Championships, CVR's new wireless voice release system was used on all layouts for the two days and there was not one malfunction. They have also produced a coin/token system for practise traps. This connects to CVR voice release systems and eliminates the need to have club personnel at hand to collect money, thus ensuring that every clay target gets paid for.

As we fulfil our duties as Referees we often come across very simple occurrences which are seemingly innocuous but are nevertheless important in our day to day running of events. Let's look at two very simple rules, which have in the past caused confusion with referees and shooters alike.

During an event you notice that number 2 shooter accidentally shoots out of turn. He breaks the target and is naturally quite surprised when you stop the shoot to allow for the correct shooter to call for and shoot his target.

As is frequently the case, number 2 shooter now waits for

number 3 shooter to shoot, claiming that he has already shot his target.

What is your ruling?

IT'S YOUR CALL.

If you ruled "No Target" in respect of number 2 shooter who shot out of turn you would be quite correct. Despite having shot and hit his target there is no provision in our rules for that shooter to claim a target if he or she shot out of turn. Moreover, if he had missed the target the No Target call is still relevant. See Rule 1.07 (b) (iii). However, in Skeet shooting there are occasions when permission to shoot out of turn is given in the interest of saving time.

We now have a similar situation where a shooter shoots from the wrong lane. He shoots and misses the target. After sorting out a bit of the confusion, the Referee now makes his decision of the shooter who shot from the wrong lane.

IT'S YOUR CALL

Here again we must rule "No Target" under Rule 1.07 (b)(iii). "If a shooter shoots out of turn or from the wrong lane it is a NO Target" It is important to note that No Target applies irrespective of whether the target was hit or missed.

NSW Members and Dealers

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

(a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or
(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.
