





CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION Entry

Entry into the 2007 Australian Trap Championships is open to all shooters who are registered for 2007 with the Australian Clay Target Association. Temporary honorary membership will be offered to overseas visitors who can produce evidence that he or she is a current financial member of their home country's equivalent body to the Australian Clay Target Association. Australian competitors must produce their 2007 registered shooter record book before nominating.

Divisions

The competition will be divided into separate divisions for Womens, Juniors, Sub Juniors and Veterans, excepting the Grand Australian Handicap where places shall be awarded from 1 to 10.

Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Womens, Juniors, Sub Junior or Veterans section only. A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section before trophies are awarded.

When Mackintosh team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the Open team selection as well as section teams shall chose in which team they may be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams. To be eligible for selection or naming in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

Age Qualifications

Veterans - are those competitors who, will be over the age of 65 years at the time of competition.

Juniors - are those competitors who, will be under the age of 18 years at the time of competition.

Sub Juniors – are those who, will be under the age of 15 years at the time of competition.

Starting Time

Each day's event shall commence at 8.30am.

Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination and will be re-squadded towards the end of the event a \$5 re-squad fee shall apply. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event, he may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.

Cartridges

For all events, excluding the Grand Australian Handicap, load size for all National Title events is limited to 28gr struck measure shot size not larger than No.6. For the Grand Australian Handicap load size is limited to 32gr struck measure shot size not larger that No.6.

Cartridges of the competitor's choice, including re-loads, may be used in all National Championships. Cartridges will be available for purchase at the National Championships. Random checks may be carried out.

Target and Traps

Targets through the program are to be as determined by the Management Committee. All targets thrown remain the property of the organisers. All throwing equipment will be electronically operated.

Classification

It is the responsibility of the competitor to see that their entry is correctly classified - and indication can be obtained for the daily scoreboard. This applies to trap grades, Womens, Juniors, Sub-Junior and Veterans divisions.

Contestants are reminded that re-grading and re-handicapping will be carried out on a daily basis, where required by the rules.

Major Sponsors

The Association gratefully acknowledge the sponsorship received from sponsors.

Practice

Practice, subject to trap availability, will be available throughout the championships. Tickets may be purchased at the events office.

Shoot-offs, Continuation of Events

Where necessary, shootoffs will be conducted under lights until a winner has been determined or until such time as the Tournament Director decides. In such a case, the competition will recommence where it left off on the following day.

Nominations - All Events

All championship nominations (excluding Deauville Doubles) include a contribution to the discipline fund.

Note: Reduced Nominations shall apply to Juniors and partners only, they being wives or husbands, whose nomination must be lodged at the same time as family member paying full nomination fees.

Authority

This program shall control the 2007 Australian Trap Championships. The shooting rules of the Australian Clay Target Association will govern all points not otherwise provided for.



Location 45 minutes (70 kms) from South Australia's capital city, Adelaide and is the gateway to the picturesque Murraylands region



AISL TEAM SELECTION POLICY Effective September 1, 2006

AISL may select athletes to compete for ISSF World Cups, World Championship and other international competitions in accord with the following criteria. It is not a prerequisite to be a member of the AISL High Performance Program for selection to the above Teams; however, many of the benefits provided to members of the program are not applicable to non members.

- 1) To be eligible for consideration for selection into a team an athlete must be Performance Qualified (PQ) by score or High Performance Program standards and:
 - a) be a member of the relevant AISL Member body as defined by the constitution cl. 4.3
 - b) and be ranked in the top three (3) on the points table which is derived from the score ranking obtained from the events listed below. The score does not include the "Finals" score.

- c) And other suitable events as determined by the HPPMC and published within reasonable lead times.
- d) A list of open international events will be published as they come to hand for those athletes wishing to gain or further their international experience. *Performance Qualification Scores may only be attained at events identified as National Championships where there are more than 40 athletes in the event in which Performance Qualification is being sought and where the event is known to be at least equal to the Member body's Australian National Championship in standard.*
- 2) Performance Qualified Athletes will be ranked in each discipline by points, from the scores shot at the published events.
- 3) Vacant spots in a team may be filled by Performance Qualified athletes
- 4) The Selection Panel ("Panel") will select those athletes whom it considers in its sole discretion will have the best chance(s) of success at the relevant events.
- 5) Other scores from the competitions listed may also be taken into consideration by the "Panel" when considering athletes for selection to a team.
- 6) Where there is more than the required number of athletes, the "Panel" may also consider the athlete's international performance history.
- Where two athletes' points or international performances are tied then preference will be given to the one whose score trend is on the up.
- 8) The "Panel" may also consider identified athletes who meet the criteria of developmental (see; AISL Youth Group Program), who have;
 - a) attained high scores regularly, but who are not performance qualified.
 - b) failed to reach the top three
- 9) Any Junior Team (i.e. athletes not older than 20 years as per ISSF rule 3.3.6) will be selected from those who are performance qualified. A Junior Team may be selected by a decision of a Panel if the qualifying scores are not achieved.

- 10) Funding of selected athletes for travel is set out in the AISL Team Travel Funding Policy
- 11) The Panel will comprise the;
 - a) Three AISL National Coaches
 - b) AISL Member Body Representative
 - c) High Performance Manager
- 12) Where there are additional places available, such as MQS only positions, those who meet the above team selection criteria (pg1) and are next in line may be offered the opportunity to enter on a self funded basis.
- 13) Self funded members will be required to sign and abide by the Team Agreement.
- 14) The above program is dependent on availability of funds and subject to change.

Note:

- That for Clay Target the 2006 Victoria and NSW State ISSF Titles will be Performance Qualification shoots as will the three events at the Olympic Discipline Nationals in January 2007 only. The program will then revert back to those competitions published on page 1 of this document.
- Performance Qualification to be valid for one year from the date of achievement.
- Performance Qualification does not mean a shooter will travel.
- Performance Qualification will be reviewed following the Olympic Games.
- All travel subject to funding availability
- This selection criteria does not apply to nomination to either the Commonwealth Games and the Olympic Games nor the Oceania or Commonwealth Shooting Federation Championships where separate policies will be issued.

POINTS TABLE

Achieving the PQS earns 100 points

Then every point over the PQS earns 10 additional points

i.e. PQS+1, +10

PQS+2, +20 and so on

e.g. a shooter attends 4 competitions and shoots PQS at 1st one he earns 100 points, then at second he shoots 2 points higher he earns 120 points, at the third he does not shoot a PQS he earns 0 points at the 4th he shoots 1 point over the PQS he earns 110 points giving him a points ranking of 330.

APPEALS PROCESS

Where a competitor reasonably considers in all the circumstances that his/her non selection or non nomination to a team has occurred because the Panel has failed to follow these Criteria, the appeal procedure is detailed in the document entitled Appeals Process; a copy of which may be downloaded from the website www.ausshooting.org or by request from the office.

Psychological Skills for Shooting by Michael Kruger-Davis

THE MIND AND THE MATTER

For the past few months (and for an unknown amount of time in the future) I have been thrust into a new role in life: that of carer for my mother who is suffering from lung cancer. Even though I have worked for many years with children and adults dealing with grief and loss, I did not realize the impact that it would have on me personally. I didn't realize that some days would be bad and others would be worse, some would be happy and others vacant, in that I would not feel much at all.

Part of caring for mum, has involved not going to work some days. On one day whilst waiting for visiting hours at the hospital, I was sitting at a coffee shop and having just picked up the mail was sitting and going through the collections of bills, junk mail and Christmas cards. In amongst the mail was letter and invitation from Dr John McDonald from Albury to the launching of his new book; *The Mind and the Matter: A Guide to Meditation in Cancer.*

John is a specialist physician from Albury who I met several years ago at Albury-Wodonga Clay Target Club. John used to attend most shoots and enjoyed the sport as well as the companionship. Following a stroke a couple of years ago, he gave up shooting for bowls and in the time convalescing, wrote this book.

Psychologists understand the importance of the mind and the value of relaxation, visualization, guided imagery and meditation, but (and at the risk of offending readers who happen to be medical practitioners) this is not usually what I have found to be the case with GP's and specialists, so it was exciting to read that John was advocating that meditation should be used as a companion therapy to the treatment being offered.

John's book, *The Mind and the Matter; A Guide to Meditation in Cancer*, is the quintessential self-help book, because it is written to allow the reader to understand the problem but at the same time teaching them what to do and suggesting ways to avoid the problem coming back. The book is divided into three parts. Part one: Meditation and Visualization. Part two: The Nature of Cancer, and Part Three: Changing your Lifestyle.

Part one begins by defining what meditation is and even going through the very fundamental steps of setting up the process: the room, whether you are sitting or lying, your clothes, your hair, your chair and your posture. This section may appear very basic but it helps the reader get set up without any ambiguity or misunderstanding. The next part deals with relaxation and again, John walks and talks the reader through some basic muscle relaxation and breathing techniques. Calming the mind is the next part and the final portion of Part one deals with learning how to visualize and the steps involved with achieving the best results: stimulating the sense, using a mentor, seeing the cancer, seeing your defenses working and using positive affirmations and visualization to boost your immune system.

As a psychologist, I have had some very successful results with clients using visualization to relieve and stop migraine headaches, improve sporting performance and stop smoking. The human mind cannot tell the difference between what is real and what is imagined – so if you imagine the treatment is working or that you will perform well in sport, etc then you can perform better or the treatment will work faster and more effectively. I am also aware of research that uses visualization in the treatment of cancer where the cancer is seen as a swarm of mice and the chemotherapy is visualized as a large tomcat that is stalking and killing all the mice. In conjunction with the chemotherapy the visualization has led to higher remission rates than just the chemotherapy alone. This technique also works for children; the children are shown the old computer game pac man

where the little mouth goes through a series of tunnels and gobbles up things. The children are taught to visualize the chemotherapy as "pac men" and the things that he is gobbling up are the cancer cells.

Part two of the book deals with the nature of cancer and this section provides the reader with an easy to read, and more importantly easily understood, description of what is cancer, how it is treated and what the effects of cancer might be. Even though I have been caring for my mother, I have been reluctant to do any research on cancer. This is probably a classic example of denial, but my rationale is that I wasn't sure if I could trust what I was reading to be accurate. So I was relieved to be able to read the information in this section knowing that it was written by an experienced and qualified practitioner; I then had the courage to explore other areas such as the Cancer Council of NSW website.

Part three of this book deals with changing your lifestyle. Firstly looking at what, how, why and who, should change. John then explores good habits such as diet, rules for eating, activity and the need to look after your own mental well-being. There is a delightful section in here about being selfish especially for those in the remission phase or those who are cured. I would suggest that the same advice should be given to carers as well. Next, John examines the bad habits which are no surprise; stress, smoking and lack of fitness. Finally, John finishes with looking at the long-term aims and setting the goals for the future.

The first time I read the book I thought the sections were in the wrong order but then I realised, that by dealing with the therapeutic technique first, readers would have them in their subconscious whilst they dealt with the rest of the information. To do it in any other order may have lead the reader to focus on the disease and stop before getting to the positive and necessary information about how to meditate and visualise, so that these techniques can be used as a treatment option along with the other therapies.


I know I originally said the book was divided into three parts; but there is a fourth section, which has a note from the author, acknowledgement of books which have impressed him and a very useful glossary of terms. *The Mind and the Matter* is a very easy to read book that has a wealth of information, as well as easy to follow processes that teaches the reader what they need to know about meditation and visualisation. I have already found the book useful because I know more about cancer and hopefully by following the directions in part three I might even be able to avoid it myself in the future.

As referees "qualified" or not we are often placed in unenviable and indeed unpleasant situations whilst doing our duty out on the tracks. We are all conscious, of situations which occur from time to time where we, as contemporaries of those we are judging, have to implement rules which may be distasteful to our brother competitors. Indeed, there is a very small minority of shooters who consider some rules to be minor or "pinpricking". It becomes increasingly difficult for us to apply these rules where some of our more temperamental shooters take offence. However, these rules have been well thought out and investigated thoroughly over many years by very experienced and knowledgeable shooters. They are there for our safety and our competitive equity

Let's face it not one of us likes to be placed in this position of embarrassment to the extent where we ignore the implementation of the rules to avoid conflict.

By far the most common situation (but OF THE MOST IMPORTANT) is in the area of safety. This is an area in which we should not make compromises. We as referees have a vicarious liability and responsibility to our fellow shooters, our sport, and to our public status in the community in regards to the retention of our firearms privileges and licences. Hence any accident, however small will bring us unfavourably to the notice of a multiplicity of government and non government organisations, the media and the general public. Moreover, we must be aware of our vulnerability in a situation where we failed as a person in charge, to ensure we have complied with the simple precautionary safety rules laid down by our Association.

Our most common exposure is at the start of each event where we as Referees are required under GRTS 1 to have shooters check their barrels to ensure there are no obstructions in them. So many referees seem reluctant to implement this rule. The reasons are doubtless many and varied but the referee who fails to apply this rule may be in some difficulty in the event of an accident. Your Rules Committee has put this rule there for this purpose.

So, as the Referee of a squad at the start of an event you ask the shooters to check their barrels to ensure they are not obstructed. One shooter has already placed cartridges in his gun: he doesn't remove them and says "I checked my barrels before I came on the tracks".

If you started the event you would be quite correct. There is nothing contained in our rules that requires us not to proceed. Once having warned the shooters we appear to have shifted the responsibility back to the shooter concerned. Current firearms' rules state that firearms safety is the responsibility of everyone at the Shoot and not specifically the Referee/Range Officer/Shoot Marshal etc. There is however, a very clear responsibility on behalf of the Referee to make sure guns are unloaded at the appearance of a red flag at the trap house and when someone is going forward of the firing marks and tracks. In these cases the rule is specific in its requirement of the Referee. The Referee is also required to instruct shooters to "unload their guns and check their scores" at the end of each visit to a trap. It is absolutely unnecessary for you to accept a responsibility for someone else's indiscretions or accidents. Your Association has done its best to give you the facilities to monitor and regulate safety issues to prevent potentially dangerous incidents from occurring. By bringing GRTS 1 to the attention of shooters you are creating the first step in safety awareness.


It is incumbent on all shooters to know this rule and abide by it. It is there for our protection both in the sense of our own liability and safety and the safety of our contemporaries. We should not take offence when asked by a Referee to perform this task.

PETER McGUIRE Grafton Clay Target Club

It is with sadness that Grafton Clay Target Club informs readers of the death of Peter McGuire who was one of its most respected and cherished members of the Grafton Clay Target Club.

Peter was first and foremost a family man but he had also been an integral part of the Grafton Clay Target Club for over 30 years.

He held many critical committee positions within the Club and was its President for 16 years. He spent literally hundreds of hours of his time at the Club keeping the surrounds neat and tidy by mowing and maintaining the grounds and completing many of those odd jobs that always seem to accumulate around a Club. He was the familiar face who ran the Office on shoot days.

His tireless work was recognised when he was made a Life Member of the Club in 2005.

Peter was a crack shot too. In his formidable years he travelled extensively around NSW and Southern Queensland winning many prestigious events and literally had a room full of sashes and medals as testimony to his shooting proficiency. He was also a great advocate in encouraging junior shooters.

Perhaps the greatest accolade that could be said about Peter is to quote from the song which he himself had requested be played at his funeral "So long... it's been good to know yuh"

ARTHUR NORMAN ROWE 1919 - 2006 Gold Coast Clay Target Club

The youngest of eleven children Arch grew up mainly in the Proserpine area of Queensland, cutting cane and getting involved in road cycling, football and later archery. He joined the Army at the start of WWII and served mainly in New Guinea and Bougainville.

A very quiet man, Arch did not talk much about his war experiences but I believe his prowess with a bow and arrow was made known to the enemy. During this time he "acquired" two personally inscribed Japanese flags, one of which was returned to Japan through the Japanese Embassy some 40 years after the war. Always a keen photographer Arch was granted permission by the Army to set up a makeshift studio in the jungle where he produced numerous images of wartime experiences around him.

About 1960 Arch took up clay target shooting at Bathurst NSW where he later became club president. He was a member of Australia Macintosh Team in 1962.

While at Bathurst he formed the Bathurst Archery Club and was their President and Club Champion for four years.

Arch and his wife Alice moved to Yamba on the NSW north coast where he found a location and formed the Yamba Clay Target Club and became its President until moving back to several locations in Queensland, enjoying prawning and reef fishing and finally settling with Alice in Mackay.

Arch was a member of the ACTA Executive Committee from 1970 to 1980 and devoted much of his efforts to referee training, rules improvements, safety on the shooting ground and to upholding gentlemanly conduct with in our sport. He was the ACTA's honorary ambassador to clubs in New Guinea where he did much to promote the sport.

Arch was granted Life Registration with the ACTA in 1980.

Another good mate lost.

JOHN TIPLER Gold Coast Clay Target Club

It is with deep regret I advise the passing of well known and respected Gold Coast Club member, John Tipler, on the 21st of October 2006.

John fought an intermittent battle with cancer in recent years and had been unwell for a time.

Sincere condolences go to Johns' wife Carol (nee Ogden), also a well known Gold Coast member and national Skeet identity, and to the Tipler family.

It was shooting that brought John and Carol together and following their marriage in 2000, they travelled extensively to Skeet shoots all around the country.

John served his Club as a Committeeman and Skeet Captain, and will be long remembered for his mild manner, his attention to detail, his immaculate attire and generally well-concealed wicked sense of humour.

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless: (a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

Once again the members of the Echuca Clay Target Club wish to thank the Echuca College and the teacher's for taking an active interest in the sport of clay target shooting.




