Deniliquin Gun Club was formed in early 1946 with Fred Robertson president and Horace Mathews secretary.

The first shoots were held in the showgrounds.

In 1947 Garry Daly was elected president and the club secured 10 acres of leased land along the cemetery road (now Wirraway Drive). The club functioned at this site until the early 1980s. During this time the club held many State and Commonwealth titles and produced Australian and Commonwealth champions.

> In the 1970s cars were given as prizes at shoots and the club functioned with great success. With town development it was forced into recess in 1982.

With an upsurge of interest in clay target shooting in 1983 moves were made to revive the club at a new site on the racecourse reserve.

The new grounds were officially opened in November 1984 and consisted of two layouts, club house and amenities block.



### **THE END OF AN ERA** Sunshine Coast Clay Target Club

#### Location 1hr north of Brisbane

The Sunshine Coast Clay Target Club Inc at Caloundra, Queensland is being shut down in July 2007 by the Caloundra City Council. The club has been on its existing site for 34 years conducting the community sport of Clay Target Shooting, during this time the club has built a modern clay target complex where many Queensland and Australian shooter were proud to compete and bring their families to our City and Sunshine Coast Beaches for there holidays. In July this year the complex will be demolished.

Our club has fallen to the word "Progress" which many politicians use to extract land and dismantle sporting clubs this seems to be acceptable in their world and giving clubs no recourse to defend themselves. Sadly our grounds will be given to another sporting body (A Horse Equestrian Precinct).

Our club members would like to advise our fellow shooters of our circumstances and our efforts to save our club and sport and hope you have a more understanding local council if you experience the same.

#### HISTORY OF SUNSHINE COAST CLAY TARGET CLUB INC

The club was originally formed in 1973 and in 1977 the late Mr. Ian Arthur and Mr. Arthur Dean negotiated with the Lands Department a 30 year lease for the club.

A lease was drawn up with the Landsborough Shire Council for thirty years on the 5th July, 1977, under Lease of Reserves, under section 343 of the Queensland Land Act 1962/1975. The lease was originally given to the club by John L Beausang then Chairman of the Landsborough Shire Council

The Reserve for recreation covers an area of 14.76 ha with the entrance facing Pierce Avenue, Bell's Creek (Little Mountain).

The land when the club received it was a contaminated site previously used as a Sanitary Disposal Dump.

The club members filled all the disposal trenches with soil and regrassed the area with couch grass to a standard to be maintained and kept in mowed condition. The club stabilized the trenches in the water course to prevent erosion.

The club is conscious of the environment and has maintained the beautiful stand of Gum and Bloodwood Trees situated in the centre of the lease for future generations and wildlife. The club has always looked after the wild life. Especially the kangaroos and wallabies by supplying water for them in the dry times. The

Unfortunately the town dogs and development is taking toll on the wildlife.

The Sunshine Coast Clay Target Complex has been built by voluntary labour from the members for the community to enjoy the sport.

The sport allows men, women, Juniors, Veterans and people who are disabled/or in a wheelchair to participate in an Olympic Discipline Sport.

The clubs aim, namely, to promote and advance the interests, welfare and development of Clay Target Shooting to the community of the Sunshine Coast.

The Clay Target Complex consists of 4 down the Line Traps, one Ball Trap Layout and One Skeet layout.

The club has built a modern club house for its members and their spectators to enjoy the sport and social events. The club also has a secured playground area for the children and a car park area for 100 cars.

The Sunshine Coast Clay Target Club is affiliated with the Australian Clay Target Association and conducts the sport to the Australian Rules and Regulations.

The club conducts Commonwealth, Australia, Queensland, Zone and District Championship Events, and also runs two; 2 day Annual Carnivals during the year for its members and shooters from all over Australia. The Club makes its ground available for the Australian Army for social days, plus many community charity bodies.

The Sunshine Coast Clay Target Club has a good relationship with adjoining land holders. We allow the Corbould Park Race Club to use our grounds for parking for their major events.

Over the past 12 years the club has been trying to negotiate a new lease agreement with council without success. The club has lobbied Federal, State Politicians for assistance; they were all sympathetic to our cause and may be able to assist us in the future, no time frame given.

Our neighboring club, the Caboolture Clay Target Club has offered our club the use of there grounds for our monthly shoots, so our club can retain its identity until we can find new grounds, we thank them immensely.

The Sunshine Coast Clay Target Club will be holding a Three Day Carnival on the 29 – 30th June and 1st July 2007 as a Final Farewell to our Caloundra Grounds, which will be advertised in the CTSN. We ask you to join us to celebrate the good times experienced over the years and the many fine people and shooters who supported our club as a final tribute to our clay target complex.

#### Oh No!!

Picture the scene. Big event - Northern Zone 50 Target Single Barrel Championship held at Guyra in February. A squad of six AA Graders all from the Guyra club, all good shots. There's an atmosphere of concentration and confidence on the lanes. The event is underway! Jamie Poole puts the gun to his shoulder for his third target. "Puulll ..... Click !!!" The referee correctly walks to Jamie who has his gun pointing over the trap house. The ref opens it. The cartridge is in the top barrel and only fresh air in the bottom barrel! Jamie's concentration is so intense the shell is dropped in the wrong barrel! Only two words are spoken, "Lost target!" Where is the camera when I need it!

Jamie's misfortune reminded me of a story my father, Vince Mackson tells. Vince is an 82 year old member of the Guyra club who still has a shot.

Vince lives in Glen Innes on the Northern Tablelands. To the north of Glen Innes is the small town of Deepwater. Driving through today, one can see architectural evidence of busier days of rural prosperity from past years. One particular store in the town occasionally faced the derision of the locals because of the shortage of stock on the shelves.

Some 30 odd years ago Vince was shooting at the old Glen Innes club when the shooter along side him put his gun to his shoulder. "Puuull ..... Click ... Click !" The ref opened the gun – not a cartridge to be seen. The shooter in the squad, who lived on a nearby property and frequented Deepwater often for his retail needs, was heard to remark, "It's just like our local store, there's nothing in it !!"

A Grade was won by Ross MacLean (Newcastle Lake Macquarie) with 77/78 and second place went to Matt Duncan (98/99). Guyra's Brian Campion shot 74/75 to win B Grade and the B Grade runner-up was Tania Marshall also from the Guyra club, (70/75). Clinton Harrison won C Grade with a score of 68/75. He beat Graham Armour on 57/75.

The 25 Target Double Barrel Northern Zone Handicap was won by Glen Innes shooter Monty Klinger with a strong 28/28. Second place went to Jamie Poole (Guyra, 27/28). Third was Tim Bourke on 26/27. Bob Aitchinson (25/26) took fourth place and Matt Duncan (38/39) collected the fifth place spoils.

Event Three was the 50 Target Northern Zone Double Barrel Championship in conjunction with the Guyra Super Trap, 2007. Event Four, contested on Sunday morning, was the 50 Target Northern Zone Single Barrel Championship. Tamworth's John Sleightholme shot a perfect 53/53 to win overall. #### BRIAN CORMACK 1932 2006 Deniliquin Gun Club

Brian grew up as an only child at the sheep station Merungle near Booligal After completing the Leaving Certificate at Hay Memorial High School he took up a carpentry apprenticeship in Sydney. After 9 months in the city the "call of the bush" was too great and he returned to Merungle and then on to Deniliquin in 1950 to set up as a Station Contractor. In 1953 he married a local girl, Betty Petersen and lived his whole life in the area.

Brian loved working for himself in the outdoors. He had great pride in his work, whether that was the straightness of a fence, the quality of his concrete race or loading ramp, how well his timber rails meshed and so on. The General Manager of Boonoke station was very impressed with the quality of Brian's work giving him the nickname the "Chainsaw Carpenter". Brian also prided himself on being a thinker. Probably his best idea was the fire proof gateways with underground railway iron in response to bad bush fires in the late 1980s. The design meant non movement of the gate posts and bushfire resistance.

Fishing and Camping were some of Brian and Betty's favourite past times, especially in the retirement years. Brian spent a lifetime improving his fishing skills, his freezer rarely without some local Murray cod. One of his pet hates was bragging, so he always kept quiet about any success and anyway, if you found a good fishing spot, why would you tell anyone? But he only ever caught enough

fish for his family and an elderly friend or two over the town. There was no better time in his life, camped on "The Bong", a few springers set, camp fire going, a can of beer and telling stories (snake ones to his granddaughters was his favourite).

Shooting was another favourite pastime for Brian and he was an outstanding shot. During his fox shooting days, he shot 127 in a row with a .17. He was also a very keen duck hunter and shot 11 wood ducks with one shot when he was a teenager.

He more than held his own in the local competitions, winning many grade events before illness prevented him from continuing in 2005. What impressed Brian so much about the "shoots" was the hospitality and warmth shown by the shooting fraternity to himself and Betty. This was not only at clubs that he knew people to start with like Deniliquin and Hay but also at others where he initially knew nobody such as Numurkah, Echuca, Finley and Moulamein.





Place yourself in the position of this Referee in a shoot off. There are only two shooters remaining trading shot for shot. However, the second shooter was having trouble with malfunctions. In fact, he eventually had three malfunctions. He was warned by the Referee that any further malfunctions would result in a lost target. He elected to take his chances but then experienced his fourth malfunction.

Being the sportsman that he was (and still is), the first shooter said that he did not want to win the event under those circumstances and requested that the Referee allow the shoot off to continue. The Referee allowed the shoot off to continue and it finally ended with no 2 shooter winning the event.

Placed in this position as a Referee, what would you have done?

#### IT'S YOUR CALL.

The correct ruling for the Referee was "Lost Target" end of shoot off.

Although this is a true case, history has not perhaps recorded all the facts but as a Referee it is not your prerogative to make this ruling. Nevertheless, it was a fine sporting gesture and thus deserves our further examination. It brings to light so many issues.

Firstly, as there were only two shooters left in the shoot off, they chose to continue and there is nothing wrong with that. However, it would seem that the decision to continue would more appropriately have been that of the Management. The Referee has contracted outside the written rule and thus it can be seen as a precedent. The subsequent ratification by the Management in condoning his actions also creates a precedent. Others may well argue this case in the future, albeit that it is extremely unlikely. The difficulty is not so much this scenario but the effect it has on other rules and other rulings.

Secondly, we are all aware that shooters are permitted to toss a coin to determine the outcome of an event where all parties agree. However, this incident involved a departure from the rules unilaterally made by a person not empowered so to do.

Some smaller clubs would be most reluctant to have long shoot offs where, a rules were broken to allow shooters to continue seemingly until they sated their appetites for free targets. Moreover, there are time constraints which have to be considered where long shoot offs delay the finalisation of programs.

Both shooters involved in this incident are two of the finest sportsmen in our shooting fraternity. They are both excellent shots and they are to be applauded for the manner in which they conduct themselves at all times. They are not the issue here. It is merely to highlight the necessity to understand that simple (albeit worthy) gestures may have ramifications which we have not thought of.

### It's Your Call - Bill McCarthy Replies

I refer to a letter from Mr Hank Theunissen from Coonamble who has written for a further explanation on "It's Your Call" published in the March issue of CTSN. You will recall that this issue dealt with the failure of a shooter to take sufficient cartridges to complete a programmed shoot off event. Hank has asked that "if it was possible to borrow a few cartridges from another shooter in the squad if you were running short?"

Firstly, Hank, thank you for the very intelligent inquiry and thank you for taking the time to write to us on this subject. It is letters of this nature that allow us to publicly address concerns of shooters about some of our rules.

Well, the answer is Yes. There is nothing in our rules which precludes you from borrowing cartridges from another shooter, provided of course that he agrees with your request. However, you should be mindful of interruption to the squad and the possibility of breaking the concentration of one or more of the squad members. In the interest of equity it would have to be done as quietly and unobtrusively as possible. One would suggest that it certainly not become a habit but it is recognised that these situation may arise from time to time. Naturally, we would all be aware that the Referee is required to ensure that the equity of the competition is not disturbed and may find it necessary to intervene if he considers it necessary. As we understand it, the rule was designed to prevent major disruptions in shoot offs where shooters leave the tracks to get cartridges and thus destroy in some cases the concentration and rhythm of the participating parties.

Part of my role as consultant to the Southern Sports Academy, is to help coaches understand the adolescents that they are coaching, and given the push for junior development within our sport, it seemed timely that shooting coaches also have a better understanding of the adolescent brain.

Before the industrial revolution, there was no real concept of adolescents that we have now. Once children were big enough to work, they worked and once they were ready to have children they had children. So there was no real transition between childhood and adulthood. However in the twentieth century there began a transition stage between puberty and the early twenties; adolescents, these individuals, neither children nor adults, had to grow and develop and make sense of a range of new experiences, as they moved towards adulthood.

Michael Carr-Gregg an Australian Psychologist cites the following recent research findings regarding the adolescent brain:

- Only 17% of brain cells are connected at birth.
- Brain cell connections within the human brain have two major growth spurts –in utero 3-6months and at puberty.
- The brain has more capacity to regrow cells than was once thought.
- As brain fibres become myelinated, (myelin is a fatty substance that insulates the nerve fibres) messages travel hundreds of times faster.
- The brain develops from back to front and connections are only fully formed by the time girls are about 23 and boys 24.

Gender differences in brain development.

- In girls language part develops faster.
- In males, spatial part develops faster.
- Girls can express emotions better because emotion is processed in the same part of the brain that processes language.
- Girls hear 7% better than males.
- Peripheral vision is 65% better in females.
- Colour vision in girls is 3 times better.
- · Females are twice as sensitive to touch.
- Females can read body language better.
- The corpus callosum (the thick bundle of nerves that join the two sides of the brain) in females is 30% better developed in girls and both sides of their brains work at the same time so they can multitask.

Hungry brains can't learn.

- Glucose is the main brain food. Adolescents without breakfast perform like 70 year old men, 25% less alert.
- Some of the best foods for adolescent brains are eggs, sardines and anchovies, yoghurt, almonds and blueberries.
- Chewing gum is good for study because it increases oxygen and insulin to brain and therefore increases brain activity by 35%.
- The brain is 78% water. Dehydration can lead to headaches and lack of motivation. We need to sip water every 22 minutes.

Tired brains can't learn.

• Studies have shown 90% of 15 year olds are not getting enough sleep. Most need 8.25-9.25 hours per night.

Helping kids sleep better:-

- Routine, even at weekend. Set the alarm for going to bed as well as getting up.
- Ritual to prepare for bed. Turn lights down one and a half hours before bed.
- Expose eyes to light immediately on waking.
- Sleep in a dark room without digital displays and electronic equipment. (Carr-Gregg would not have a computer in a kid's room in the first three years of high school.)
- Temperature needs to be 18-30degrees.

As soon as young people sleep better their mental health improves.

This research has implications for junior development squads and the importance of nutrition, sleep and hydration.

The normal adolescent has to deal with 11 development tasks as they progress towards becoming an adult.

The adolescent must adjust to a new physical sense of self. During this time both males and females will go through a wide range of changes: larger and stronger bodies, secondary sex characteristics, and a change in shape and appearance, eg, breasts, body hair, etc. It is not unusual for adolescents to appear awkward, gangly and uncoordinated (unco as teenagers refer to it).

The adolescent must adjust to new intellectual abilities. Up until the age of about twelve or thirteen, children think in concrete terms. Concrete thinking relates to being able to understand those things that the child can see or touch. Things that are literal or defined are easy to understand whereas things that are inferred are more difficult. During adolescents, concrete thinking gives way to abstract thinking, where the child moves on from concrete items and on to things that are abstract. Abstract thinking, or formal operations, allows the adolescent to understand concepts such as freedom, liberty, justice, love, etc, things that can be thought of but not touched like concrete things.

The adolescent must adjust to increased cognitive demands at school. As adolescents move to high school the work becomes more abstract and inferential and the individual must adjust to this new way of thinking. Rather than thinking about what is there (concrete items), but thinking about what was (past), or what can be (future).

The adolescent must develop expanded verbal skills. Together with this new type of thinking there is a need for new language to accommodate abstract thoughts.

The adolescent must develop a personal sense of identity. With new body shape, size, language and thinking skills the adolescent must develop a sense of identity that is unique for the individual. This is easier if the adolescent is a member of a particular reference group such as a sporting team, class group, church group, etc.

The adolescent must establish adult vocational goals. Setting goals for the future and developing interests that will lead to future employment are essential for the adolescent. Having a part-time job will help teach skills such as time management, how to get on with supervisors and workmates, how to deal with customers and consumers.

The adolescent must establish emotional and psychological independence from his or her parents. Having teenage children is often a time of turmoil in many households. Differing views on what should be allowed, with respect to staying out, alcohol, driving, drugs, smoking, etc means that adolescents often make decisions that adults see as risk taking or lacking in self-regulation. Adolescents and adults see things differently, because according to Michael Carr-Greg, the brain develops from back to front and connections are only fully formed by the time girls are about 23 and boys 24. Therefore, Adolescents use a different part of the brain from adults to read body language and do not necessarily do it well, eg They might read surprise as anger, "she doesn't like me." Don't leave kids to self regulate their behaviour because prefrontal cortex (area for reasoning and judgement) develops last. Experiments have shown that while adolescents will behave with good judgement while monitored by adults, they become much more risk-taking when only in company of peers. This has been evident over the debate with P plate drivers.

Adolescents must develop stable and productive peer relationships. At this time in an adolescent's life the emphasis moves from the parent to their friends. It is at this time that adolescents practise and develop strategies that they will use in future interactions with others. Their peers become their second family and the links between parents and adolescent's breakdown. Recent changes in technology; internet, SMS, mobile phones, MSN, etc have given this latest generation greater opportunities to be closer to each other.

Adolescents must learn to manage his or her sexuality. Most adolescents get their sexual knowledge from the media or their peers. This is not a problem if parents and adolescents are able to openly communicate about issues affecting the adolescent. Issues such as privacy, trust, intimacy, should be talked about when the opportunity arises, for example, during a television episode, so that the adolescent feels able to communicate with future partners about his or her needs. The important message to get across is that the adolescent is in control of their sexuality and that no one has the right to make them feel uncomfortable.

The adolescent must adopt a personal value system. According to Carr-Gregg, parents provide their children with a structured set of rules about what is right or wrong, what is acceptable and unacceptable in their early years. Their parent's values will inevitably come into conflict with their peers and other segments of society on issues such as sex, drugs, etc. To reconcile these differences, the adolescent restructures his/her beliefs into a personal ideology. The pressure to rebel can be overwhelming, making this a time of inner turmoil and it can end up a total reconstruction.

The adolescent must develop increased impulse control and behavioural maturity.

The brain's centre of reasoning and problem solving; the prefrontal cortex, is the last part of the brain to mature, and that the brain is not fully developed until the early twenties. To compensate for the short fall, the adolescent relies heavily on another area of the brain, the amygdala, a more primitive and instinctive part, which creates a tendency to react automatically. Therefore, not having the same ability to as adults to make sound decisions or control impulses, it seams unfair and unhelpful and will lead to disappointment, if their actions are judged from an adult perspective.

Most coaches are adults and therefore it is important that they are aware of recent research and of the developmental changes that occur as children move through adolescence and on to adulthood. Knowing what happens

Labour Day weekend and Echuca Clay Target Club hosted three full days of competition shooting. A grade 1st was Ian Gebhardt 75/75, A 2nd was Ward Wende 72/75, B 1st P Tate 64/81, B 2nd B Paspt 63/81, C 1st Lauren Harbor 66/75, and C 2nd was D Hannigan on a score of 59/75.

Event two, was a 25 target Double Barrel Championship, and once again, a Hay NSW shooter, Brian Doyle, was, after a reasonable shoot off, successful in taking out an Overall

The final event was a 25 target Single Barrel graded cash divide, and the results were AA grade, R Anderson 24/25, A grade, W Wende and Ken Bruns, both on 24/25, B grade P Tate 23/25, and C grade was S Everett on a 19/25 score.



(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.
