



# **NATIONAL SPORTING CLAYS**

Let me begin at the end and congratulate John Younger on some terrific shooting to become our National Sporting Clays Champion with a score of 191/200 after an almost unbelievable 99/100 on the 1st day. It was a pleasure to watch him shoot and he is a most deserving Champion.

Day one commenced on schedule with a temp of 10°C and a prediction of 17° - 18° C with a westerly wind averaging about 10 knots. After approx. 30 mm of rain over the

Shooting was finished for the day around 4.30pm in late afternoon sunshine with a final total of 88 shooters enjoying the conditions and a fantastic overall lead by John Younger with 99/100 and a smile to match.

There was a very light shower overnight but Day 2 kicked off clearer, with high broken cloud and just a hint of wind from the W or NW. The temperature was 10° C again at 8am and 16° or 17°C predicted, so on the face of it both days involved similar light and weather conditions, but Day 2 was a little dryer under foot. However the 2nd day saw streets of dark cumulous clouds streak through and this made many of the high targets an interesting challenge at various times.

The early rounds of Day 2 involved a tight tussle for overall between John and Sox, however by the end of the day, after the clouds once again rolled through in the afternoon we ended with the Day 2 scores showing that they were both overtaken by Marty Seymour with a Day 2 score of 93/100.

However Marty's win on Day 2 was not enough to overtake John for the overall title

## 27TH AUSTRALASIAN POLICE AND SERVICES CLAY TARGET CHAMPIONSHIPS

#### **Location Canberra ACT**

The 27th Australasian Police and Services Clay Target Championships will be held in Canberra, over four days, at Majura Park Gun Club between the 4th and 7th of October 2007. There will be practice available on Wednesday 3rd October.

This competition commenced in 1981 at Bendigo and has been held annually ever since. The 26th year was held in Bendigo, Victoria, and attracted about 80 competitors. In addition were competitors' families, support staff and spectators. Competitors travelled from all states in Australia and also New Zealand and all enjoyed great camaraderie. With positive feedback after that event it is expected competitor numbers will be up on last years event.

The competition is divided into two categories. The first is for serving or retired members of Police, Fire, Ambulance or Military personnel and the second is for civilians.



But will all campers please note that due to the boom in small generators, you will need to have some form of earth leakage protection fitted to ensure that you and your neighbours cannot be electrocuted, and to comply with relevant NSW legislation.

The 1st Board Meeting is now scheduled for end July, so by the time that you read this we will have the improved governance of the ACTA that will surely flow from more regular meetings of the Executive.

The recruiting of a new National Executive Officer is also well underway and initial indications are that a group of excellent candidates have put themselves forward. That recruiting process will be progressed through late June and early July and hopefully by the time you receive this issue of the CTSN, a new EO will have been selected or in place.

I believe that the working relationship between the National Office and our new President, John Mack, is an excellent one although I am equally certain that John has been a little surprised at the number of issues that need consideration on a daily basis. Finally I would like express the ACTA's appreciation to all of those members who responded to my note in the June CTSN asking for your suggestions. Let me assure you that all of the points that you all made in your emails and letters has been given detailed consideration and will be implemented to some degree if possible. I particularly want to thank Life Member Ernie Hawkins for his letter. I tried to call Ern to discuss some of his points but he has been ill and in hospital, so hopefully I will have spoken to you Ern, before you get this Magazine. To all who sent in submissions, thanks again and I hope that you will now block out March 29th to April 6th and come to see the result at the 2008 Trap Nationals.

All members may be interested in the fact that recent editions of this magazine are also available on our website and each new magazine will be added a week or 2 after it is in your hands. These are large PDF Files, so those of you with Broadband should only apply, however this will allow you to easily access those photos & articles about yourselves or your friends and all Clubs and advertisers will have their data both in the published magazine and on our website. We hope that you all find this to be of use.





Yet another scenario arises from this very recent incident which highlights a need for us all to be especially, careful when determining the results of incidents which occur from time to time.

A referee in a shoot off with 5 Shooters in the squad, the situation arose where the first four shooters shot their target. This was the start of the shoot off and was the first shot of the shoot off event. No 5 shooter failed to fire. When asked by the Referee what the problem was, be replied that he had the safety catch on. The Referee then ruled "Lost Target".

Was he correct?

#### IT'S YOUR CALL:

If you answered that the Referee was wrong you would be quite correct. Rule 1.07(viii) is quite explicit. It says: "No target shall be allowed for the first target of any visit to a trap if the safety catch is engaged. This was the first target, therefore the ruling was incorrect. However there is a happy ending to this situation. A very senior member of the ACTA fortunately observed the incident and interceded on behalf of the young shooter who was penalised and explained the correct ruling to the Referee. The Referee simply was unaware of the correct ruling.

A number of issues come from this incident. It appears that of the 8 people at the tracks on that occasion not one seemed to be aware of the rule. Hence the necessity for the official to intercede.

As a Referee, "badged" or not we should always seek advice if there is any doubt, especially where major decisions are to be made. It is a courtesy we owe to our shooters, our club and our sport. There is never any indictment on a Referee who seeks help, it is far better to ask than to make a major mistake. In this case the Referee said he wasn't aware of the rule and like the gentleman he was, he accepted the intervention with very good grace and is to be commended for it.

The intervention of other shooters to Refereeing decisions where there is uncertainty can be helpful. However, it should be borne in mind that unless you as a shooter are fully cognizant of the particular rule under dispute, you should merely encourage the Referee to seek assistance with its interpretation. In this can though, the person who intervened was a highly qualified rules executive of the ACTA. His reluctant but necessary intervention was done very nicely and indeed very professionally.

No reference has been made in this case to the absence of the Shoot Marshal, who, under Rule 4.23(b) should have been present at the shoot off. One can guess that he was busy elsewhere which is quite understandable these days. Similarly, a Referee Examiner, (if available) could have been involved under Rule 4.24(c). Among other things, he is required to do under that rule to observe the actions of existing Referees on the shooting grounds.

# **Psychological Skills for Shooting**

## ARE YOU A FEARFUL ATHLETE?

This article explores fear and anxiety in relation to sport. Some parts of this article appeared some time ago in another article entitled Fear and Anxiety.

In past articles I have explored the elements of mental toughness which is defined as a set of beliefs about yourself, your work, your sport and how they interact. Those behaviours and beliefs; competitiveness, confidence, control, commitment, composure, courage and consistency are all skills that we can learn and adopt easily. Why then don't we all have them? Why aren't we all mentally tough all the time? What gets in the road of us being mentally tough? Before answering these questions, I asked what shooters would be scared of.

The simple answer is that we get in our own way. Our own self defeating thoughts and behaviours are the roadblocks that undermine our ability to perform: fear, anger, anxiety, self-consciousness, and perfectionism, and stubbornness, lack of motivation, competitiveness, distractions and persistence.

Fear is a mental response to a perceived danger or threat. It's a primitive response that allows us to fight or flee from a threat. The fight/flight response was necessary when as cavemen we wandered the jungle and had the threat of sabre-toothed tigers lurking behind every bush. We had to develop a system that allowed us to either stay and fight or get the hell out of there. The threats have now gone but as modern man we have retained the fight/flight response when the majority of our fears are not life threatening at all.

Recently, I did a workshop with the cycling squad for the Southern Sports Academy. Not knowing much about cycling, I did a bit of research before the presentation and realized that fear was an integral part of the sport because of the dangerous nature of cycling. Crashing your bike during a competition is one risk but so too is the danger of training on roads and being at the mercy of car and truck drivers.

So what is so fearful about clay target shooting? Most readers will probably have answered this question with "missing". But is it? Maybe the thought of missing and the fear of failure presents itself as our greatest fear.

Look at the following statements:

1. I am OK at practice but cannot follow through in competition.

- 2. I am more confident about my shooting when I practice than I am in competition.
- My performance is cautious because I want to win and afraid of making mistakes.
- 4. I focus on the outcomes (score/results) and not the process.
- 5. I am impatient in competition and want the improvements that happen in practice to happen faster.
- 6. I feel bad about myself when I do not perform up to my expectations.
- 7. I worry about what others will think about my performance.
- 8. I worry about letting others down if I perform poorly.
- 9. I tense up in competition.
- 10. I get too tensed up when I shoot and have trouble shooting in a relaxed way.
- 11. I do not trust my ability and end up doubting myself.
- 12. I try to be perfect.

If you were able to tick 5 of these questions then it is possible that fear of failure hinders your focus in competition and cause you to doubt and trust your ability.

Whilst missing a target may seem bad at the time and may deny you the opportunity of winning, your world as you know it will not come to a screaming halt just because you missed a target. There won't be lightning bolts or terrible troubles that will beset you.

The only thing that will happen is that you may be too hard on yourself: and the more you punish yourself the poorer you will perform and the fear of missing will be greater next time. This will happen because fear will lead to failure and the failure will lead to the fear of failing again and this will manifest itself as anxiety.

So what are the common types of fears that athletes experience? According to Patrick Cohn, The Fearless Athlete, there are several types of fears that we all experience from time to time.

- Fear of losing a match or competition: you want to win so badly but you are afraid you will lose.
- Fear of negative social evaluation: the fear others will view you as a failure.
- Fear of embarrassment: the fear you will feel embarrassed in front of others.
- · Fear of letting others down.
- Fear of putting in the effort and not getting the rewards or shooting to your potential.
- Fear of not meeting others expectations.
- Fear of being rejected, losing respect or not gaining approval.
- · Fear of not performing perfectly and making mistakes.

These fears usually manifest themselves as anxiety. Anxiety and fear are not the same; anxiety is your response to fear – apprehension, heightened vigilance, and hyperventilating, dilated pupils, sweating, racing pulse and running faster than a speeding bear. (Farnbach, 2001) Farnbach defines anxiety as a state of heightened arousal of the mind and body, associated with a belief that the individual is at risk and that he/she has a diminished capacity to control what is happening, or what might happen, to him or her. Anxiety can range from mild to severe.

The effects of anxiety can be on the mind and/or the body and can involve;

- The emotions or feelings effects can be irritability, apprehension, uneasiness, fear, panic and terror.
- Mental or cognitive functioning; the mind can be racing, frozen, disorganised, inability to attend, concentrate and remember.
- Physiological or body reactions can be either increased muscle tension and can be shaking, jerky movements and poor co-ordination, or overactivity of the sympathic nervous system – can be sweating, shaking, palpitations, etc.
- Behavioural patterns including restlessness, talking excessively, irritable behaviour and self medicating with alcohol or drugs.

The problem with fear and anxiety is that they have the ability to interfere with what we like to do. Because humans do not like being in an anxious state we often subconsciously do things to avoid it. If we are shooting well and are starting to get nervous about shooting so many straight, then when we miss a target we subconsciously feel relieved because now we do not have to worry any more about missing a target. The same thing happens when we freeze on the trigger; the fear of missing a target creates anxiety that stops our ability to move our muscles and therefore we can't even pull the trigger. This then makes us more anxious and so on and so on.

Anxiety, self-doubt cannot exist if you are able to trust in your ability, feel confident in what you are doing and are competent in doing it.

Crickey there is even a West Australian team member who is obviously sexually challenged by the look of his shooting iron. He sounded a lot like a Black Duck when calling for the clays and was shooting some monster crackers. The boy could shoot a bit, I am sure Pee Wee and he would have been soul mates. In fact all the W.A Team had a clue how to set about this caper. Then I noticed one of the boys shooting in the W.A squad who had a high grade Beretta 686 sporting gun and immediately thought these people can't be all bad.

I gotta have a crack at this.

16, SIXTEEN OUT OF TWENTY FIVE, I should have gone to Narrandera. At least I know the people laughing at me over there. Barry Hall says "How did Ya go mate" I mumble "16". "Geez" goes Hally "that's pretty good first time at bat". "Is it" thinks I. That the first lesson, no one shoots 100% of these targets. The absolute guns appear to shoot 95% (that is probably 2, maybe 3 people in the nation) and the good shots shoot about 80%. 20,21 out of 25 would have put you at the top of A grade I reckon. Mick Elms pointed out some of the top shots and they are poetry in motion, absolute economy of movement and as smooth as a silk stocking. It is also obvious that they have done a lot of this. This is David Colemans baby and I always reckoned that He was a tricky bloke and the setting of these traps is obviously and art form. When you shoot DTL everything is rising, even our low continental targets rise from the trap house. Not so in 5 stand, they have Crows (these are even harder than the real ones), Springing Teal (I have shot hundreds of feathered ones and I am yet to see one of those that can rise vertically 100 feet in the air at what looks like 160kph). Loopers, these give you the choice, you can try and shoot it with a relatively flat trajectory but at about 80 meters or you wait till is gets closer but by then is falling at about 20 feet/sec which means you have to "lead it" by shooting 5 meters under it as well as 3 meters in front. Easy isn't it ?

Are yes, then there are the crossers from the high and low skeet houses. Someone forgot to tell Mr Coleman about the speed and height at which these targets are normally thrown. Yep, here you can get a high house thrown at ISSF speed which lands about even with the low house, (at least they land when I am shooting at them) and a low house that takes off like a low orbit satellite booster. There are also some angled targets thrown from behind fences and from the DTL Trap houses and these were understood by the DTL guys and dispatched accordingly. Did I mention Rabbits, Not our introduced English variety, oh no, but American Jack Rabbits, I watched one get shot at over a meter from the ground, probably the best shot of the day truth be known.

Battues, No idea, never shot one for the day. In fact Michael Elms showed me the ground where they were landing. "That's the factory there," said my guide, Sales and Operations Manager for the US, Inigo Rodriguez, gesturing in the direction of a tall, heavily forested mountain. Seeing nothing but 1000 feet of rock and trees, I must have looked puzzled. "You can't see much from here", he admitted.

We were in the village of Galdacano, close to the city of Bilbao in Northern Spain to visit the production facility of the UEE group's explosives division. It is here that the propellants for the company's Rio cartridges are made and I was to be given a crash course in gunpowder production, the first call in a tour to see the whole cartridge making process from start to finish. UEE is one of the very few companies in the world that can do this, for only a handful of RICHARD RAWLINGSON VISITS UEE OF SPAIN AND FINDS THINGS ON A MUCH LARGER SCALE THAN ANTICIPATED



businesses have all the production processes under their control. Most cartridge manufacturers should more properly be called loaders, because they merely assemble components bought from a variety of suppliers; at UEE they make it all.

First a brief history. The group was formed in 1896 as an amalgamation of Spanish businesses involved in the production of explosives, including one founded by Alfred Nobel to produce his invention – dynamite. The initials stand for Union Espanola de Explosivos (Spanish Explosives Union). Galdacano was chosen as the site for production because of the region's iron ore industry and it has remained one of the key sites in what has now become a major international group.

But why a mountain? Well, explosives are dangerous things – very dangerous. Every part of the production process is risky and safety is of paramount concern. "Most businesses are concerned with quality, safety and profitability", Javier Jimenez, manager of the powder production plant told me. "Here our priorities are first safety, safety, and safety, then quality and hopefully, after all that, profitability.

"And a key principle in safety is separation, keeping the processes as far apart as possible. The bigger the risk, the smaller the quantity of material and the greater the distance. This site covers over four million square yards and we have over 25 miles of roads, all hidden by the forest."

The forest element of the site is only lightly managed. Deer and wild boar flourish among an abundance of wildlife, while to keep the undergrowth under control a herd of over 100 wild horses grazes the land. This is truly unlike no other factory I have ever seen. The safety element is visible at every turn. Massive concrete walls – many with sand infills – enclose each operation. All are designed to keep people one side and product the other. Each building has one weak wall, designed to blow out first, usually towards the sheer rock face of the mountain.

Today 500-600 people are employed, according to season, and from the mountain top you can see the sprawling city of Bilbao, just a short drive away. 100 years ago that was a far more difficult journey and the factory and village were one and the same, the company providing homes, a school and hospital and even building the church which carries the date 1912 above its main entrance.




Galdacano produces not just the powders and primers for sporting cartridges – my main interest – but also bulk explosives for civil uses such as mining and construction. "We like road construction", said Jimenez. "To build roads in a mountainous country like Spain you need lots of explosive!" As if on cue, there was the muffled thump of an explosion in the distance. "Just testing," said my guide. "If we go white – then you should worry!"

By now we had driven several miles up the hill to the start of the powder production line – a line that itself is almost two miles from start to finish. Here UEE's famous PSB and CSB powders are made, used not only in the company's own Rio brand, but a favorite of many loaders around the world.

It starts with containers of nitrocellulose, produced by another UEE division. This is the raw material of all modern gunpowder and deceptively harmless in appearance, looking just like fluffy cotton wool. In fact it is very unstable in this state, made manageable only by being mixed

with water, 30% by weight. "Nitrocellulose burns at the surface," explained Jimenez, "and in this state it is virtually all surface. The production process is all about making it stable and controlling the surface area and hence the burn rate. Predictable and consistent burning is essential for each type of powder we produce because that is the key element in the formula for each different load."

Around 20 different powders are produced, covering the needs of all the different shotgun gauges and the range of loads from light to heavy. The market drives the product development and production process; for example, the Type 5 powders were specifically developed for use in 28 gram (1 ounce) competition loads. When the Olympic shooting disciplines changed to 24 gram maximum this presented loaders with fresh ballistic challenges and the Type 6 powders were developed by the Galdacano R&D department to meet this need.

This is a key part of the operation, with its own pilot plant able to replicate the main production processes in miniature to deliver batches of trial product. Within the same complex is a test range that allows velocity and pressure testing to be carried out immediately. It is the link between the commercial operation and production, able to respond swiftly to requests for new or amended products.

All UEE's powders are single base (nitrocellulose only) rather than double base (a laminate of nitrocellulose and nitroglycerine based components). "Double base powders can be dangerous to make and many production plants around the world are closing." I was told. "We also think single base is superior because it is cleaner burning and easier to make a homogeneous product. With double base powders the thickness of the flakes is critical and very difficult to control throughout the production process."

## THE GUNPOWDER PLOT STEP BY STEP

• The water content of the nitrocellulose is replaced by alcohol, pressing the mixture together to expel the liquid and produce what looks like a large cheese

• The active solvents and soluble salts (potassium nitrate) are added along with colorants in what looks like a large food mixer. The solvents determine the porosity of the finished product and hence the burning characteristics.

• The resulting paste is then extruded into long strands like spaghetti which are air dried and then cut into flakes (square for PSB powders, round for CSB)

• The powder now goes to the laundry! Hot water is added to remove the potassium nitrate, which has now done its job.



Transferring to giant drum dryers, the powder is given clean water washes and then dried under vacuum at 35 degrees Celsius.

• Graphite powder is then added. This is a key ingredient which not only improves the flow characteristics in loading machines but also gives the powder conductivity and prevents the build up of static electricity. Static and gunpowder is never a good combination!

• The output from up to eight dryings is blended together for a

more consistent

end product before final quality control checks, sieving to remove surplus graphite dust and packing. Job done!

The whole process takes at least a week from start to finish before the drums of end product are ready to be shipped. Around 30% of the production takes a short journey south to the UEE loading plant near Vitoria, our next destination

## THE ROAD TO RIO

Leaving Galdacano, we set off to the cartridge factory at Nanclares de la Oca, with just a brief pause for a splendid lunch at a typical Basque restaurant in Vitoria.

I have been to several loading plants in Europe but the UEE

facility is without doubt the most impressive. It even has its own access road from the highway.

The Rio brand is relatively new to American sportsmen – although the recruitment of Jon Kruger, Scott Robertson and a host of other top shots to the Rio Star Team is sure to raise the brand's profile in the coming months – so some idea of scale would be useful.

The factory produces around 400 million shotshells a year, a figure that puts them firmly in the world major league. Laid end to end, I calculate that they would stretch for over 17,000 miles – or more than enough to take you around the globe from UEE's Madrid headquarters via Beijing in China and New York and back to Spain!





- 1. Squads of 5 or 6 to shoot 50 targets/75 targets in brackets of 25, one visit only to the traps. Handicap event qualifying will be shot 5 targets per lane. Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
- 2. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/75 targets. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET may be incurred.
- 3. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination and will be re-squadded towards the end of the event.
- 4. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest recorded.
- 5. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee, check referee and score must fulfill their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score may incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET may be incurred in the event concerned.
- 6. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.

All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.

- 7. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 8. When team selection is involved, Veteran, Junior and Sub Junior men are eligible for selection in Mens, but can only compete in Mens team or Section team not both. Veteran, Junior and Sub Junior Women are eligible for selection in Womens, but can only compete in Womens team or Section team not both.
- 9. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals, trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
- 10. Nominations will close daily at 11.00am. or at the discretion of the Tournament Director.
- 11. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the NSWCTA Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.
- 12. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 13. Reduced Nominations: These shall apply to Juniors & Sub Juniors only.
- 14. All High Gun Shoot Offs will be conducted Points Score from 18m squad rotating, Miss and Out.
- 15. All competitors must comply with Firearm Licensing Laws in their state of residence. LICENCES/PER-MITS (DUPLICATES NOT ALLOWED) MUST BE SHOWN AT TIME OF NOMINATING TO BE ELIGIBLE TO SHOOT.
- 16. Club Teams Event 5 competitors affiliated through same club entry fee \$15 per team all monies returned to prize pool split if tied.
- 17. State Team Selection 15 men, 6ea Ladies Junior & Veteran Selected over events DB SB PS. Shoulder to shoulder team then selected from aggregate including DB SB PS & Team Score



NSW Members and Dealers

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless: (a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.



Overall High Gun went to Roger Lehmann of Warracknabeal with a score of 197/200.


