

FROM THE NATIONAL EXECUTIVE OFFICER

Congratulations to the NSWCTA for a very successful Trap Carnival at the National Grounds. With nearly 300 shooters, plus their families, the event gave me a wonderful opportunity to see how the grounds work in the lead up to the Nationals next March. There was a great atmosphere and an opportunity for me to meet up with more ACTA members.

One of the key tasks to be completed when I came on board was the renewal of the ACTA insurances due at the end of September. Thanks to Geoff Kidd for getting the process well under way

Insurance is one of the single biggest expenditure items for the ACTA to ensure that its members, incorporated clubs, committees, visitors and volunteers are appropriately covered for activities that come within the ACTA's mission and charter.

In the lead up to renewing insurances in 2007, the ACTA sought tenders from a variety of insurance brokers in an effort to ensure the best coverage, services and premiums for its members. As a result of the competitive process the insurance broker appointed for 2007/2008 is AON – one of the world's leading providers of risk management services, insurance and reinsurance broking, financial planning and employee benefit and risk solutions.

The competitive process led to a substantial reduction in premium costs from all the tenderers, and has resulted in excellent coverage for the members of ACTA in their clay target shooting endeavours.

However, members should note that the recent extension to the policy by ACTA's previous insurer, for coverage while hunting, is currently NOT part of the insurance effective from 30 September while a review of the risk and premiums for this component is properly undertaken.

In the process of receiving submissions, advice was given that the risks associated with claims arising from activities outside of a controlled shooting range environment could have the potential to impact significantly on future premiums, which would in turn impact on all our members. This is something that the ACTA Board must view seriously.

Many members are covered for their hunting activities through membership of another organisation, such as SSAA, and some members do not hunt at all, but under the previous extension all were paying for the premium cost.

Following a proper risk assessment a decision can be made as to whether the benefit to members is greater than the risk, and whether a premium that reflects the real number of ACTA members who would like this additional coverage can be achieved. Information will be posted on the website for your information.

Why aren't there more women shooters?

I promise I won't get on the feminist bandwagon, but as a woman one of the questions I've been asking myself over the past weeks is why is it that the ratio of male to female is so out of balance in Clay Target Shooting compared with Australia's population.

Are women staying away because of misinformation - about the sport, about firearms, and about safety? How have other sports, once the dominion of men, gone about attracting women?

Do women see shooting as a male domain? Certainly, in the past that has been true, just like golf and tennis. And, if you visit just about any gun club and look around there is still a predominance of men.

Many women shooters become involved because their partners bring them along to the range. So, are women faint-hearted about becoming involved in the sport unless their husbands or boyfriends are already participating?

So far I've found there doesn't seem to be any male prejudice against women in clay target shooting, there is no resistance to their participation from the men – and men and women can compete as equals. So why the low participation rate?

I think one problem is that we do too much preaching to the converted and not enough promoting to people who are not yet involved in the shooting sports. We have to find new ways to engage people and get our messages out in ways that reach each target group—women, young people, the communities we live in, and to overcome the misperceptions about our sport.

Congratulations to Beretta for thinking outside the square with their extraordinarily successful event – the Beretta Girl Action Day held at the Melbourne Gun Club on Sunday 14th October. There were more than 850 visitors on the day. 350 women tried clay target shooting for the first time with lots of support from their families – children and grandparents – and of course the husbands and boyfriends (holding all the handbags). Beretta provided a comfortable, enjoyable and non-threatening environment to introduce the women to shooting. And, if you give a woman the right introduction, she's likely to love the sport!

Russell and Lauryn Mark worked tirelessly alongside Greg Chan and the Beretta team. Adam Vella and Suzy Balogh were fine Ambassadors for the sport, and were the all-female instructors. Fashion parades and a celebrity shoot out with some of our most famous women athletes provided great entertainment. See a full story and pictures of all the Girl Action in next month's magazine.

If you have any suggestions about how we can grow our sport and association, I'd love to hear from you.

Finally, planning is underway for Trap Nationals next March – it will be an event not to be missed. We'll have lots more information in the next magazine!



GRADING CARD HOW TO CALCULATE THE NEW RUNNING PERCENTAGE

Below is an extract from the 2008 Secretary's Handbook which sets out the way percentages will be calculated from January 1 2008.

It is important for club secretaries, handicappers and members to be aware of these changes and how to apply the new running percentage.

As new cards will not be issued for the 2008 year you will be required to attach the new 2008 label supplied on re-registration to your 2007 grading card.

We suggest that you start a new page in your grading card for the 2008 year. This is indicated in the sample below.

- Note 2 * The 200 target percentage will be calculated on this bracket of 200 targets and recorded in the percentage column above the line (example 199 / 203 = 98.03%)
- * This 200 target percentage shall be added to the previously recorded grading percentage and halved.
 This shall determine and be known as the grading percentage and shall be recorded in the percentage column below the ruled off line.
- Note 4 * From this point on, the previous grading % is added to the next 200 point percentage and halved to continue calculating the grading percentage.

The Geoff Kable Memorial State 3 Man Team Shoot Trophy was introduced this year. This has been contributed by Arty Del Ben & Rod Van Beek. Geoff started shooting in the 60's and with his brother Barry of Hall of Fame legend proceeded to demolish most of the competition around Sydney and in NSW. In 1967 Geoff And Barry won the Metro Deauville Doubles in Sydney with a score of 133/133. Geoff won the first ever South Pacific Double Barrel Championship with a score of 107/107. He won the New Zealand Sparrows And Double Rise on the same day in 1972 a feat which has not been achieved since. In 1975 he won the NSWGC Champion Of Champions thus stopping the great Warren Charlton from performing a hat trick of wins. He won numerous State and Commonwealth titles before he stopped shooting in 1980. He will always be remembered as a good bloke and a wheeler and dealer, He used to win events with one gun and there was always someone who wanted to buy the gun offf him so he obliged of course then had to get another gun for the next shoot. This happened numerous times only to re-instate that he was a natural talent in the sport. He also had the second thumb hole stock in Australia behind Warren Charlton. Unfortunately Geoff passed away in 1999, he was a very nice and respected man in the shooting circles and has been sadly missed by family and friends. Thus the introduction of this trophy by his wife Margaret will keep his memory with us for a while longer.

For this months recipe Steve and Vince bring to you a simple but delightful appetiser one that you can prepare with little fuss or preparation, but will entertain your family and friends.



Psychological Skills for Shooting

by Michael Kruger-Davis

COMPOSURE

Last month I wrote about the myths that get in the way of athletes developing appropriate mental skills programs in an effort to remain mentally tough. One of the features of mental toughness that I touched on was "composure".

What is composure? Patrick Cohn of Peak Performance Sports, argues that composure in athletes includes the following elements.

- 1. The ability to think calmly and rationally when under stress.
- The ability to react calmly and rationally to errors during competition.
- The ability to rise to the challenge with confidence when called upon or as needed.
- The ability to identify and quickly extinguish mental barriers that undermine composure and cheat you from peak performance.
- 5. The ability to believe that there is no better person to win than you.

So, to develop these elements, what internal characteristics do we need to possess? We need to be calm, patient and poised. We need to have a relaxed but confident disposition, and we need to be able to give ourselves positive self talk and reassuring affirmations. We also need to be able to stay focused on the present, enjoy the performance or process, have a desire to compete and perform well, be a consistent performer, play to win and be a strong finisher.

Well, if these are the elements for composure, and we know what the internal characteristics are, then why can't we be winners all the time. The short answer is; because we are human. Being human means we think too much about what we are doing or why we are doing it. The long answer is that there are several roadblocks that get in our way.

Cohn believes that the following things can get in the way to us being composed?

- a. Perfectionism. It is an irrational belief to think that you can be perfect or that your world should be perfect. Being human, means that we make mistakes, misread the situation or make faulty assumptions that get in the way of our achieving our best.
- b. Worry too much about what others think. If we judge our performance by what we think others believe, then we will always fall short.
- c. Irrational beliefs. The following irrational beliefs are unhealthy and will stifle your effort and limit your potential. "I must be perfect all the time".

"I'm only as good as the quality of my performance", "Others are watching and judging me", "I think past events dictate how I perform in the present", "I label myself with ineffective names", "I must either succeed or fail: there is no middle ground, such as achieving a personal best."



Believing that you must be the one who wins, that your world will only be perfect if you're on top, that people will only like and admire you if you are the champion; beliefs such as these will prevent you from having the necessary level of composure to win consistently.

- d. Fear of failure. This is the main fear that confronts any athlete and can be extended to "fear of losing the match", "fear of being embarrassed by a poor score or performance", "fear of letting others down", "fear of not performing to one's potential", "fear of not meeting the expectations of others", "fear of not achieving anything for all the hard work involved", "fear of negative social evaluation" and "fear of not gaining approval".
- e. Self-doubt. This is probably the most important aspect of poor performance. It is probably what cause us to miss targets more than anything else. Self-doubt come from a number of causes but what it does is to allow our muscles to tighten and tense up. This stops us from being able to move in a fluid and easy manner and as a result we can't execute the swing and follow through as we would like and we miss. The same thing happens to golfers but instead of missing, they miss-hit the ball.
- f. Comfort zones. This means that when you are playing with a lead you play safe. This prevents you from taking necessary risks to maintain or even widen your lead. Trying to play safe will lead to you tensing up and starting to doubt your ability.
- g. Dwelling on errors. Because you focus on past mistakes, you are not able to stay in the present or stay focused on the process. Thinking about the past draws your attention to previously, lost targets, trophies, glory, etc. Unless you are in the present you can't shoot the target that is about to appear when you call "pull".
- h. Feeling intimidated or inferior because of the beliefs I have constructed around the ability of others.

Cohn has an eight-step plan for maximising composure; Firstly, discard your expectations. Enjoy the game. Remember it is a sport and there are lost of benefits to be achieved even if you don't win. By this I do not mean disregard your goals. Your goals and expectations are two different things. Secondly, Stop mind reading. Don't think about what others think about you. Focus on your goals rather than other people's expectations. Remember your competitors want you to fail so they can win. Thirdly, strive for success. Have a success-driven mindset that allows you to set positive, growth orientated goals. Next, reinforce a positive self-image. View yourself as a composed athlete and visualise yourself performing with composure. Fifthly, disregard your preconceived ideas about your abilities. Next, do not compare your skills with others. Achieve by focusing on the strategy for the competition, focus on the process and let the product look after itself. Seventh, let go of judgements. Trust and let go. Finally, prepare coping strategies for dealing with mistakes and errors. One strategy is to look at how you think about your performance. Remember that it is a sport and that there will always be another competition.

You are refereeing a squad wherein a shooter fails to fire at a target. You move towards the shooter and two of the other squad members raise their hands and loudly announce "I heard a click!" (Quite a common occurrence).

The shooter opens his gun. What do you rule?

IT'S YOUR CALL

If you ruled "Lost Target" you would be quite correct.

GRTS 14 is quite explicit in outlining the procedure to be adopted for an apparent misfire. Moreover, Rule 1.10 (c) does not give a Referee an option if a competitor's gun is opened before the Referee examines it. In nearly every incident of this nature where a "click" is heard it will be an allowable malfunction. However, this may not be the case and on no account is the shooter to open his gun under any circumstances until and unless the Referee has gone through proper procedure. The well intentioned other shooters should play no part in determining the cause of the apparent misfire.

Here again, it can be a matter of equity and of maintaining a standard. If a Referee restores a target incorrectly for a shooter, he must be mindful that a different referee (who is abiding by the rules) may treat another shooter in the same grade differently in another squad.

Rules are not made to penalise. They are there merely and simply to create equity of the competition. Every shooter has a right to be treated the same as his contemporaries and by abiding by the rules without "shortcuts" we are fulfilling that right.
