No matter where you travel, it is so apparent how proud we are of our own clubs, having just returned from the Victorian State Trap Carnival held at Echuca is a prime example. The grounds were picture perfect, a new veranda on the clubhouse gave a large area of covered seating, trade displays on hand showing new products, and friendly volunteers bring about a great atmosphere on the grounds.

With 354 nominations for the carnival, which saw 76 junior shooters compete, itself a fantastic achievement, with a school contingent travelling from New Zealand to challenge the Victorian schools team. Credit must go to V.C.T.A. president Ron Traill and fellow executive member Lynne Curtis for making this carnival a must on your shoot calendar.

The ACTA board held its second meeting early in November with plenty of items on the agenda it was a full day, and I am happy to report full consensus was met on our grounds upgrade. Likewise, our strategic plan and state based ISSF pathway were endorsed. Our new CEO Carrie Elton presented papers on her meetings with Wagga Wagga council showing far better communications between our respective bodies, during these meetings Carrie was informed by the deputy mayor Jan Hay how appreciative council are to the amount of business our members bring into town each year.

Our membership continues to grow, final figures for 2007 show an increase by 284 from last year bring our membership up to 12,537, being our highest membership since 1998 with the new membership categories now in place for 2008, and we hope to see a larger increase this time next year.

As a result, the branding and promotion, and the event itself was designed to capture the imagination of women. It was smart, it was engaging and it was pink - but it still managed to keep the essence of Beretta.

It had fun, a great venue, a fashion parade, and an opportunity to raise funds for a great cause the McGrath Foundation, who received a \$2000 donation from the sale of the popular "BGA" caps.

The all woman team of instructors assisted 350 girls, mums, mums-to-be and grand mums to try shooting for the first time. Feedback from participants has been wonderful. Merren from Gisborne said "Many, many thanks to all concerned for putting on such a wonderful day. We had 4 generations there and we all thoroughly enjoyed it".

And the positive feedback wasn't only from the girls. There were a lot of supportive fellows around as well, including the volunteers from the Melbourne Gun Club, and lots of husbands, boyfriends and fathers who had to be content to watch from the sidelines this time.

From a husband who had tried to introduce his wife to the sport several times in the past, but received only disinterest in return, was the following: "Seeing so many women involved and the professional female coaches she has decided that she would like to take up the sport." He further says "this is a great result for me and shooting sports, and of course Beretta....I hope there will be another in the future as I believe that this type of event will help our sport thrive in the future".

Olympic Gold Medalist Suzy Balogh gave new CEO Carrie Elton her first formal instruction in the sport. Elton said it appears there are a lot of women who would like to learn how to shoot but would like to find a friendly, non-threatening environment, where they can learn and have fun for their first experience. Beretta Girl Action certainly provided that.

The Australian Clay Target Association was pleased to be a supporter of the event and congratulates Beretta, and the team who put together this event. It truly has put a milestone in the Australian shooting calendar.

We will continue to progress our Junior Development from school programs through to ISSF talent pathway initiatives.

In 2008 you will be able to see the vision for our national grounds 2020, with a master plan being developed for display and comment at the national events. The plan will also be available to view on www.claytarget.com.au. The Boggabri Gunnedah Gun Club is all geared up for the Last Gum tree to be held at Kibah Carroll on the 29/30th September. The Gum Tree is a tradition, friendship along with strong competition has been developed during the 41 years of this event.

In 1966 Vic Eather and Stan McMaster traveled to Western Australia to compete in the Cherry Tree Competition and were so impressed with the event they worked to create an event along the same lines on the eastern side. The event at that time was held one day in Gunnedah at the club with the second day on the river.

PORT MACQUARIE CLAY TARGET CLUB ANNUAL 2 DAY CARNIVAL

Located: 400 K's North of Sydney on the Mid North Coast

The Port Macquarie Clay Target Club held their annual two day carnival on the weekend of the 4th and 5th of August. The club had over \$4,500 worth of prizes spread over five events and at the close of nominations there were thirty six registered.

ACTA clubs represented were Boggabri- Gunnedah, Cecil Park, Cessnock, Coffs Harbour, Grafton, Kempsey, Illawarra, New South Wales, Orange, Singleton, Tamworth, Taree-Wingham and of course Port Macquarie.

Following last years wet weather the committee was happy to see sunny skies but with a strong south east wind it would make the possibles even harder to get.

On Saturday there was only one event which was the Hastings 100 a 100 target double barrel competition shot off the common mark of 15 metres with four walks of 25 targets. This event was sponsored by D C Pearson Chartered Accountants and Clay Target Australia.

One target down at the end was Cessnock AA grader Robert Clarke. With a score of 99/100 Robert won the overall Championship medal and prize.

Following closely was John Sleightholme from Tamworth who won AA grade on 98/100. Five competitors had to face a shoot off for second in AA with Port Macquarie shooter Steve Wallis taking the honours with 110/115.

In A grade Kempsey's Paul Pritchard held on to take first with

94/ 100 and a shoot off was needed to decide second with another Kempsey member Steve Saul taking the prize with 94/100.

In B grade Port Macquarie member Steve Bailey was first on 97/100 from Kempsey member Andrew McWhirter second with 95/100. The C grade winner was Coffs Harbour shooter Doug Young with 85/100 from Port's Michael Carter 71/100.

In conjunction with this event was the inaugural Team Challenge between New South Wales Gun Club and Port Macquarie Clay Target Club. Both clubs nominated a five member team and their scores were added with Port being victorious on 465 targets shot from NSW on 453. A special thanks to Dennis and Rosalie Pearson for sponsoring the Cup presented to the winners of the Team Challenge.

On Sunday the weather remained the same with sunshine and strong winds. The club had set down four events for the day, with the first starting at 9.00 sharp.

Event 1 was the SJ and CM Wallis Plumbing 25 target points score shot off 15 metres. As there were no possibles shot local member and A grader Ken McWhirter and AA grader R Clarke had to face a shoot off to get a result with McWhirter taking the overall Championship medal and prize with a score of 88/90.

First in AA grade was Clarke on 85/90 from John Sleightholme second on 75/81. The A grade was won by NSW member Bob Ellison 69/75 from Kempsey's Ken Samules 89/99. The B grade winner was NSW member Denis Pearson 69/75 from A. McWhirter 65/75 and the C grade was taken out by Cessnock shooter Michael Bailey 55/75 from D.Young 51/75.

The second event for the day was the Ray White Real Estate Port Macquarie 25 target single barrel once again shot from the common mark.

Local member and sponsor Steve Wallis smiled when no possibles were posted had the next best with 24/25 to take the Championship Medal and the first prize on offer.

In AA grade J. Sleightholme once again took the win with 26/28 after a shoot off with Taree-Wingham member John Webster who was second on 25/28. The A grade prize was won by S Bailey with 23/25 from P. Pritchard second on 22/25. Orange member Bob Allston won B grade 23/29 following a shoot off with Grafton shooter Russ Weslink 22/29 and the C grade winner was Port's Bob Bennett who finished on 16/25 narrowly edging out M Bailey 15/25.

The one event every shooter likes to win is the handicap which was next. This was a 25 target event and was jointly sponsored by Wauchope Frames and Trusses and Bob Ellison and had prizes back to fifth place.

After the smoke had settled there was a three way shoot off needed for the first three places and another three way shoot off to decide the last two places. First place was taken out D Pearson 27/29 with P Pritchard second 26/29 and third place went to Boggabri Gunnedah president Noel Edlington 23/26, Fourth place went to Cessnock

Junior Tom Clarke 24/27 from M Bailey 23/27.

The last event for the day was the Port Batteries 15pr double rise. As we all know the

results in this event can and would effect the outcome of the High Gun awards at the end of competition.

Overall winner was J Sleightholme who took the Championship Medal and first prize after a shoot off. First in AA grade was Cecil Park member Barry Kable 33/40 with Cessnock visitor Paul Turner second in AA grade 25/30. The A grade was won by Port shooter Hank MacInnes 24/30 from P Pritchard 23/30. The B grade winner was R Wesslink with 26/40 after a shoot off with C Edlington who took second with 25/40 and in C grade M. Carter took the win 17/30 from D Young 14/30.

At the end of the day the last item was to work out the High Gun winners from the two days. The overall High Gun was John Sleightholme with 234/255 with this award sponsored by Winchester Olin Australia.

The graded High Guns were sponsored by Watson Caravans Port

Macquarie and the AA grade winner was Robert Clarke 233/255, the A grade went to Paul Pritchard 224/255, the B grade was taken out by Steve Bailey 220/225 and the C grade went to Doug Young 183/225.

There was a presentation of cartridges to all junior shooters attending the carnival and these were sponsored by Tony Lipscombe.

A two day carnival can only run effectively with good office organisation. Special thanks to our secretary Megan Wilkins, to our scorer Wendy Minter and our treasurer Alana Stevens.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY – NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships.
Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
2. Squads of 5 or 6 to shoot 50 targets/75 targets/100 targets in brackets of 25, one visit only to the traps.
3. Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
4. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/75 targets/100 targets. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** may be incurred.
5. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination and will be re-squadded at the end of the event. A re-squad fee of \$5 will apply.
6. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
7. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
8. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfill their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score may incur a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** may be incurred in the event concerned.
9. Where necessary, shootoffs will be conducted under lights until a winner has been determined or until such time as the Tournament Director decides.
10. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised **FIVE (5) TARGETS**.
11. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
12. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
13. Optional sweep/purse nominations shall be noted on a separate form from shooting nominations and are not refundable.
14. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
15. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall chose in which team they may be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
16. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors, Sub Junior or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any section prize.
17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
18. Nominations will close daily at the discretion of the Tournament Director.
19. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behavior of the card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.
20. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
21. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
22. Reduced Nominations: These shall apply to Juniors and second family members only, they being wives or husbands. Shooters paying reduced noms are eligible for Open as well as section prizes.
23. ***All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Trap Championships.***

Dear Your Say

ACTA Handicap Shooting – A proposal

The following proposal is based in part upon the current rules (effective 1st January 2006) and is submitted to all ACTA shooters to read, give thought to and make your own judgements on a situation that is causing more and more clubs/shooters to shy away from handicap shooting, which in turn is partially the cause of our declining membership.

2.02 Handicapping Formula

- Each club must appoint an official to handicap and grade shooters, check to see that all appropriate 15 metre common mark and double barrel handicap scores, including shoot off targets, are entered on cards, and to check that handicap, running percentage and grade changes (if and where applicable) are recorded on shooters' cards.
- Initial handicap marks for new shooters who have just shoot their first 200 targets from 15m common mark are as follows: AA grade 18 metres, A grade 17 metres, B grade 14 metres and C grade 11 metres. Once established, these initial handicap marks can only be varied by results from Handicap events, and NOT 15m common mark events.
- Handicap events shot double barrel only are to be recorded for handicap purposes. Scores from single barrel or points score events shot from handicap marks are not to be entered on the cards, along with single barrel continental, double barrel continental, double barrel continental points score, double rise or double rise continental shot from handicap marks, as these are deemed to be novelty events.
- In handicap events, competitors must shoot from their approved handicaps. If the competitor shoots from any other mark, the target is lost.
- Backward movement is to apply on high scores according to the following table:

Earned Meterage Table (High Scores)

Number of Shooters	1st	2nd	3rd	4th
30 – 49	1/2			
50 – 79	1			
80 – 119	1	1/2		
120 – 249	1 1/2	1	1/2	
250+	2	1 1/2	1	1/2

- Handicapping on percentage will apply after every 100 targets shot, and shooters who record 96% or more will be rehandicapped 1/2 metre, unless they have already been rehandicapped this much or more during the course of the 100 targets.
- Any score of 50/50 will earn 1/2 metre provided it does not earn at least that much under the above tables.
- Any competitor winning overall in any championship event from behind their ACTA handicap mark will be rehandicapped to that championship mark.
- The shooter's card is to be ruled off at any handicap change (minimum of 1 metre), and the 100 targets will then restart. Note with earned 1/2 metres no backward movement is

necessary until the shooter has earned a total of at least 1 metre.

- All double barrel handicap events, including sweepstakes, must be shot to finality- broken targets to count, and NOT points or single barrel to determine the outcome.
- There shall be no group handicaps.
- Minimum handicap 11 metres.
- Maximum handicap 25 metres.
- Maximum load for handicap shooting is 28 grams, shot size not larger than number 6.
- All shooters registering for the first time with the ACTA shall commence on 11 metres.
- Members from other clay target associations will commence from the following handicap marks unless their current handicap is greater than that stated:
AA grade 19 metres, A grade 17 metres, B grade 15 metres and C grade 13 metres.

2.03 Inward Movement

- A one (1) metre inward movement will apply if a shooter's recorded percentage is less than 92% for a minimum of three (3) consecutive groups of 100 targets and no penalty has been imposed.
Note: Winning the BBM's trophy is not deemed to be the same performance wise, and therefore does not count for this rule.
- Maximum inward movement in one (1) calendar year of one (1) metre.
- A competitor may apply through the State Handicapper for inward movement due to proven physical disability.

2.04 Adjustments

- Retain as currently worded.

- Errors and/or amendments may be corrected by the club secretary, club handicapper or assistant handicapper, a member of the ACTA executive committee, rules supervisor or the State Handicapper.
- Retain as currently worded.

- Club managements are informed that a result sheet must be forwarded to the ACTA office within fourteen (14) days of each shoot being held. Where there is a grade and/or handicap change for a shooter, or shooters a handicap return must accompany the result sheet.
- Retain as currently worded.



You are the Referee of a squad wherein a shooter fails to shoot at a target. He raises his gun to call for another target. You switch off with the button and ask the shooter why he did not fire at what you determined was a legal target. The shooter said that "I didn't see the target come out".

IT'S YOUR CALL:

If you ruled "Lost Target" You would be quite correct.

Not seeing a target is not considered a reason to refuse a target. Remember that in this case you had judged that the target was for intents and purposes to be Legal. There is no provision anywhere in our rules for any legal target to be refused.

Refusal of targets by shooters who claim not to have seen them come out of the trap seem to be more common in continental events where a dislike of certain low targets may lead to shooters refusing targets on these grounds. Certainly, there are occasions that a shooter does not see a low target come out of the trap because it did not conform to a legal target. Therefore he is entitled to refuse that target on the grounds that it was not legal (provided of course that he did not shoot at it). However, the grounds for refusal would not be that he didn't see it, but merely and simply that the target was illegal.....Nevertheless, Referees should always be mindful that they have to make a judgement on the legality of any target which is refused on any grounds and make a judgement accordingly.

A QUESTION FOR BILL MCCARTHY

In a recent 30 target Single Barrel event (ruling would also apply in double barrel) a shooter ran out of cartridges after 25 targets. The shooter informed the referee on the 26th target and he correctly called "lost target". The shooter after disrupting the squad by calling to someone for more cartridges left and the remaining squad members resumed shooting.

After shooting at my next target I was surprised to see the shooter reclaiming position in the squad and resume shooting. This caused disruption to the squad.

The offending shooter was clean for the next round.

The referee apologised and said he used the malfunction rule in allowing the shooter to continue after leaving to obtain more ammunition.

However this was not a malfunction and it is the shooters responsibility to have sufficient ammunition for the event.

In my opinion the shooter should not have been allowed to rejoin the squad and the remaining targets should have been lost targets.

What would have been your call?

I have a feeling this has been answered before but I couldn't find the article.

Denis Pearson

The attached letter from Denis Pearson has raised an interesting question regarding a number of issues which can arise from time to time in our sport. Denis your letter is appreciated. If we received more letters of this nature regarding rule interpretations it helps in highlighting events and clarifying rules which apply in unusual circumstances.

Before we get to the correct ruling to apply in these circumstances, we can assume that:

- the Referee clearly announced the event as a 30 target under rule GRTS 3*
- the shooter did not hear the announcement. (One would think he has a clear duty to do so)*
- the shooter did not check the board where the event was displayed.*

While this sort of situation can be annoying, it is also discourteous. We would have little doubt though, that it was a thoughtless act rather than a deliberate one.

Now had the event been a shootoff event we would have some definite and clear guidelines under 3.22(a) where competitors in shootoffs are required to carry sufficient cartridges to complete the event. Our rules do not specifically indicate that this is the case in normal events, although one would wonder why when we go to great pains to announce the event under rule GRTS 3.

Rule 1.10[®] allows us a discretion in terms of gun replacement in event of a breakdown. Implicit in this rule and by common practice we extend to cartridge malfunctions also. Nowhere do we specifically preclude a shooter from replenishing cartridges except in the shootoff scenario. You may remember also that even in a shootoff a shooter can borrow cartridges from one of his contemporaries without penalty.

The Referee in interpreting this situation as a malfunction is incorrect. However he may have been in his rights to stop the squad momentarily to allow for a shooter to replenish his cartridges instead of having him rejoin as the event progressed. He should NOT have penalised the shooter a target.

MY CALL IS:

- Stop the event to allow the shooter his additional cartridges.*
- Caution the shooter regarding the disturbance caused.*
- Inform the shooter of his(the shooter's) obligation to ensure he has sufficient cartridges for the event and listen carefully to the announcement made by the Referee prior to the start of each event.*

Your frustration and discomfort with the occurrence is very understandable

New Australian Record at NSW ISSF Carnival

What is believed to be a new Australian ISSF Skeet record was the highlight of the weekend at the NSW ISSF Carnival at Newcastle Lake Macquarie Clay Target Club in August. George Barton shot the first 100 straight, dropping only one target in the fifth round for an incredible 124/125. George went on to shoot the next three rounds for a 199/200 then missed just one more target in the final to easily clinch the State title for the eighth time. For those not familiar with ISSF Skeet Georges feat is even more incredible when you realise that the event is shot "gun down" and with a random time delay of zero to three seconds.



Psychological Skills for Shooting

NEW YEAR'S RESOLUTIONS

Last New Year's day I was invited to talk on ABC Statewide Radio about new years resolutions; or more importantly why, they are so hard to keep. Whilst researching what I might say, it became apparent that new years resolutions are nothing more than goals we are setting for ourselves, in the hope that we will perform better or improve at something.

Why are new year's resolutions so hard to keep? Basically, it's because of following reasons.

Firstly, new year's resolutions are made without giving thought to the importance of goal setting. I will explore goals and goal setting later in this article.

Secondly, new years resolutions usually focus on giving something up. Because people see their resolution as having a loss, they will be less inclined to make it happen, and they will be less concerned about relapsing. For example, if you have a resolution that states: I will give up cakes and chocolates, then you will feel resentful when you go to the next shoot and everyone else is enjoying a great afternoon tea. If on the other hand, you reframe your resolution to read; I will lose some weight and be healthier, you will be more likely to succeed because the resolution has a built in 'gain', and therefore you might limit what cakes and chocolates you eat or do a bit more exercise.

Thirdly, there are rarely any inbuilt rewards. If you want your resolutions to succeed then you should earn something for your achievements.

Because most people are reading this January, it seemed a good opportunity to revisit goal setting; just to make sure those who wish to, are on track.

The basic rules for goal setting are:

1. You must like your goals.
2. Your goals must bring to life some aspect of your vision. Your vision is the picture of yourself that you are striving for what you want to be. Your goals need to make your vision real.
3. There needs to be a connection between this goal and other goals. If goals are too widespread then they will be too difficult to achieve.
4. You should be able to express your personal potential through achieving your goal. Goals should be more than just winning; they should connect you with some particular quality within yourself.
5. The goal should help you gain recognition.
6. The goal is unique, innovative and creative so that life is more than just hard work.
7. You need to be committed to making it happen.
8. It must be fun.

The next most important aspect of goal setting is to keep them SMART: specific, measurable, achievable, realistic and in a time frame. These five features will ensure that the goals you set are appropriate and have the best opportunity for success.

How do you go about setting goals? This is the goal setting exercise that I use when teaching others about goals:

Take 4 sheets of paper.

On the top of the first page write LIFETIME and under the following headings: career, sport, finance, relationships, health, education, etc. Make the goals long term, make them big and be adventurous. Write three or four for each heading.

Turn over the page and do not look at it again.

On the top of the second page write FIVE YEAR GOALS and set specific, intermediate goals under the same headings. What do you want to achieve within the next five years.

Turn over the page and do not look at it again.

On the top of the third page write YEARLY GOALS and set specific, intermediate goals under the same headings. What do you want to achieve this year.

Turn over the page and do not look at it again.

On the top of the page write MONTHLY GOALS and set things to achieve now, under the same headings.

The secret is; is what you're doing this month, at your local club shoot helping you achieve your lifetime goals? Will it help you achieve your yearly goals? Will your yearly goals help you achieve your lifetime goals?

Next day, revisit the lists of goals on the pages (starting with monthly and going to lifetime) and pick three goals for each heading and prioritise them, A, B and C. For each of the A's workout what action steps are needed to happen to achieve your goals. For the B's choose one thing you need to do to achieve the next step and for the C's look at what you are doing and what you need to change, if anything.

The other important aspect of goal setting is to look at what your base skills are and what you need to do to improve. In shooting there are a range of physical, technical and mental skills that need to be applied and developed if you are to perform well. Physical skills might involve weight loss, muscle development, stamina building, perseverance, hydration, etc. Technical skills might

involve feet placement, gun hold, seeing the target before you move, etc, and mental skills involve the relaxation, concentration, goal setting, visualization, arousal control, etc.

So, as we go into the new year, it may be timely to do a skills audit: what physical, technical and mental skills do I already have? What skills do I need to improve on? What strategies do I need to learn to establish these skills? Once you know what you need to improve on or learn: set some goals to achieve the results.

to set a realistic course as close to simulated field shooting as possible, resulting in a lot of good scores. I am always grateful to Max Barton and Toowoomba CTC for assisting us with the loan of extra traps, and the numbers of fairly new shooters who came along to see what the sport is all about went home happy, impressed and will come again. Creating a balance which encourages new shooters and challenges the elite is always difficult, however the results achieved by the mix of relatively new shooters, mid to high scoring participants and a few elite suggest that we got the balance right.

Over the weekend, 5 scores of 25 were achieved:- Noel Lillis Jnr scored 2 rounds of 25, once on Saturday and once on Sunday: Damien Birgan also achieved 25 on each day although in different rounds from Noel, and Jim Johnson shot a round of 25 on Saturday.

It was encouraging to see many shooters from other local and Brisbane clubs who we are always pleased to see, along with a good contingent from Toowoomba CTC as ever, and indeed some interstate shooters, including the intrepid Tom Harris and his lovely wife Robyn, without whom no shoot would be complete or enjoyable and we'd think we'd failed!!

As with all major shoots, none of them happen without the myriad of helpers in the background. All too many to mention here, but I hope I thanked them at the time of the presentations on each day. 

Rabbit Fricassee

Steve and Vince both avid hunters bring to you this recipe which can be enjoyed with either wild or farmed rabbits, wild rabbit has a better flavour than farmed if you can get it.

Bon appetite.

1 Whole white rabbit or
2 wild rabbits
200g mushrooms mixed
(field, button, oyster,
shitake, etc) cut into quarters.
100g diced leek
1 finger ginger peeled and sliced
1 large onion diced
3 cloves garlic sliced
500ml good chicken stock
(can be obtained from any good
supermarket these days)
200ml white wine
500ml cream
Salt and pepper to taste
100ml seasoned flour
Basil leaves for garnish
80ml Olive oil

Cut rabbit into nice pieces leaving the bone in, then dip into seasoned flour. In a hot thick bottom pan heat the oil, then place rabbit pieces neatly and brown all over until golden brown.

In the same pan add garlic and ginger stir then add vegetables and mushrooms, cook for a few minutes then add chicken stock and wine and simmer until liquid has reduced by one third, then add the cream and bring to the boil. Remove, cover with loose foil and place in pre heated oven at 180 degrees



and cook for approx 35 minutes for the farmed rabbit, if using wild rabbit it will take approx 1 hour and you will need to add an extra 200ml of chicken stock after 30 minutes otherwise the sauce will curdle.

Remove from oven and place on serving dish, garnish with basil, serve with crusty fresh bread and boiled new potatoes in their skins.
