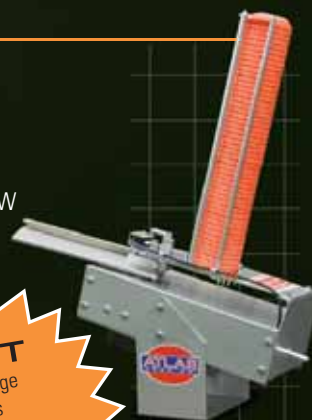

Every aspect of the 2008 National Trap Championships was so positive our planning throughout the year brought about new and improved changes for everyone. Our trade exhibitors and catering were more suitably located from the clubhouse, a large marquee with seating provided an area for relaxation and dining during the day, it proved to be a more suitable venue for the evening presentations.

The evening entertainment was exceptional, our thanks goes to Beretta Australia and Perazzi Australia for both of their special entertainment evenings. The Saturday Seafood meal was delicious and went down a treat with everyone, thanks to the great efforts of Arty Del-Ben and Mark McInnes for keeping the people on the ground for the High Gun presentations.

This year was our fifth Hall of Fame evening and it proved to be the best yet, with the Hall of Fame inductees receiving the well-deserved acclaim they deserve, with Leo Harrison III travelling from the U.S.A. to see his good friend Bill Iles inducted.

Despite the severe changes in the weather during the championships, it was beautiful one day and a dust storm the next (historically the worst dust storm in ten years to hit Wagga!) followed by a cooler day, but finishing with two cracker days!!!

Championship records were broken in both the single barrel and point score events, the handicap was won off 25 metres with a skinner 50/50, and an amazing 99/100 was shot by Steve Atkins to take out the double rise championship (the day the dust storm hit).

The combination of White Flyer targets thrown off Mattarelli traps was excellent, grandstands were full to the brim enjoying the shoot offs each day, the double barrel event continued under lights until 10:15pm – when there was two shooters left in the competition – the decision was made to continue the event the next morning.

The list of people that assisted to make these Trap Nationals so special is endless, my thanks to the trade exhibitors who provided advice and service to our members at considerable expense to their company. To all the shooters that showed faith in our new executive- with a 22% increase in numbers from the previous year, and with 60% pre-nominating – thank you everyone for your contributions!

FROM THE CEO

It was wonderful to be part of the recent 2008 Trap Nationals. Competitor numbers well exceeded expectations, with 320 pre nominations and substantial increases on last year's nominations in every event, with more than 600 shooters competing.

The event provided validation of ACTA's claim of substantial economic benefit to the city of Wagga, with people coming to the National Grounds from all over Australia, and from New Zealand, USA and Fiji. In fact one of our young visitors from across the ditch reported back home that he was treated so well he wants to move to Australia!

Although much of the infrastructure to cater for the event was temporary, the new layout seems to have been well received. A big effort was made to ensure a central 'community' was achieved allowing easy access to the Trade Show area, Events Office for nominations, and food and beer tents. There is still much to be done in the way of building permanent structures, and managing dust – but these items are very much on the agenda.

Wagga put on a pretty good show weather wise, with some nice showers in the week leading up to the event, and nice sunny days for the most part – the only real blot on the landscape was the massive dust storm that hit mid Nationals week. This phenomenon was however not limited to Wagga, but was experienced across the eastern states.

My thanks go to Neal Gay and his office volunteers who did a fantastic job, along with ACTA staff – Shoot Marshall Sue Pim, Rowena Spiranac, Dave Jocelyn and Fred Rapley. Roma Gun Club was prominent too, preparing for and promoting next year's event which looks like it will be bigger and better than ever. The support of sponsors and traders is also a vital element to a successful event, and is greatly appreciated.

Several hundred shooters returned evaluation surveys, the results of which will be in next month's CTSN, including what people liked and some good constructive advice on how to make even more improvements when the event returns to Wagga in 2010.

Congratulations to John Green, Jon Whittakers and Bill Iles on their induction to the Hall of Fame, and thanks to Mark McInnes and Kaz Butts for their assistance and commitment to putting on a wonderful event to honour the 2008 inductees.

The office is now focusing on the upcoming Sporting and Skeet Nationals, including the inaugural Skeet Hall of Fame dinner and Adrian Cousens Medal!

2008 NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

From the 29th March until the 6th April, the 2008 Australian Clay Target Association National Trap Championships were conducted at the National Shooting Ground in Wagga Wagga. Shooters from every corner of Australia as well as New Zealand, Fiji and the United States of America assembled to compete. The championships got underway with the Pre Nationals on the 29th & 30th March, followed by the National titles from 31st March to Sunday 6th April.

Following some good rain in the week preceding the Nationals, chilly nights and warm sunny days greeted the shooters over the first few days of the event, leading to expectations of some good scores being posted. However, by mid week not only Wagga – but the whole of eastern Australia was engulfed in a dust storm of mammoth proportions. The National Grounds withstood the sort of damage suffered by buildings in other parts of Wagga, where walls fell down and roofs were blown off, with only some of the lighter shade tents at the Western end of the grounds losing the battle. The dusty aftermath, however, was with us for a few days afterwards.

The venue looked a little different this year – with a big effort being made to encourage more of a gala atmosphere and centralise the activities around the Events Office, Scoreboard, Traders Expo and Food & Beer Tent. We secured two grandstands to provide seating for spectators during shoot offs, and other night shooting events.

During the week there were lots of activities at the Grounds including the fabulous Perazzi Joker Poker Night enjoyed by more than 300 guests, a BBQ hosted by next year's Nationals host Roma Gun Club, a Bush Dance with the Tin Shed Rattlers, that also raised over \$600 for a local charity, Country Hope. The weeks finale was a sensational seafood buffet. And, for this first time we were able to offer childcare facilities and activities, which were well received.

The Opening Ceremony also had a new twist with the Kapooka Army Band leading the state teams in the traditional march past.

Official Guests, Kay Hull, Member for Riverina and Mayor Kerry Pascoe in welcoming shooters and spectators to the 2008 National Championship and the city of Wagga Wagga, noted the importance to the city of hosting such a prestigious competition, and the economic benefits ACTA brings to the city. Kay and Kerry got the event officially under way assisted by Leo Harrison III and Russell Mark. Targets were broken and this was warmly noted with much clapping and cheering from the crowd.



ACTA President John Mack, in thanking the dignitaries in attendance, also noted that the event had special significance as the selection for the teams to represent Australia in the upcoming World DTL Championships in Ireland would be made from performances during the week.

Prior to the Opening Ceremony on Monday 31 March, teams from all states and territories competed for the Australian Clay Target Association Cup presented to the winning state team in Open, Women's, Juniors and Veterans divisions.

NSW, represented by Greg Coleman, Glen Castellaro, Robert Thompson, Brian Kniepp and Rodney Wright, won the Open team event with a score of 149/443.

2nd Western Australia 149/441; 3rd Victoria 125/369; 4th Northern Territory 124/360; 5th Tasmania 123/364; 6th South Australia 123/362; 7th Queensland 122/357.



The Ladies from Victoria were successful in winning the Women's Team event. The team was lead by Renae Borgan with Sarah Holt and Michelle Parks scoring 125/219. 2nd Queensland 74/219; 3rd New South Wales 73/213; 4th Tasmania 71/211; 5th Western Australian 71/207; 6th South Australian team 67/193; 7th Northern Territory 67/196.



In the Junior division the team from Victoria comprising of Jack Collicoat, Michael Harbor, Brad Harbor were the winners on a score of 75/221. 2nd Western Australia 74/214; 3rd New South Wales 74/212, 4th Queensland 73/215; 5th Tasmania 72/209; 6th South Australia 69/203.

Six Veterans teams competed for their shoulder to shoulder badges with the New South Wales team of Gary Rootes, Ray Jenkins and Tony Alvaro shooting 74/217 to take the event from Western Australia. 2nd Western Australia 73/216; 3rd Victoria 73/215; 4th Queensland 73/212; 5th South Australia 70/209; 6th Tasmania 69/200.

Members of the Official party judged the best presented teams and awarded the SACTA Perpetual Trophy to a very well presented Northern Territory Team.

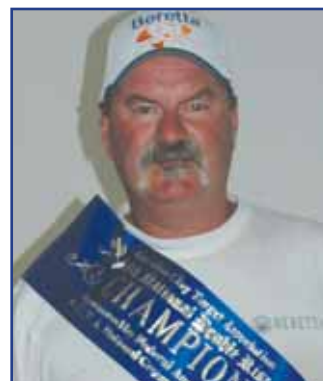

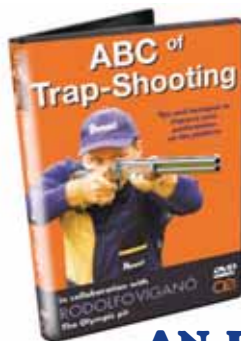

Psychological Skills for Shooting

by Michael Kruger-Davis

ARROW LASER SHOT

Back when I was started high school, I remember learning about "scientific method". Basically scientific method meant that you worked out a question you want to answer (hypothesis), and develop an experiment to find out if your answer was right or wrong. At the time it didn't mean much, but over the years it has stayed with me, primarily because of my work, and I now find that I often use this principle where possible when confronted with a problem. The main benefit is that I do not have to waste time and effort with the more traditional trial and error approach.

I recently bought a new gun and I decided that in order to get it set up right I would use the "scientific method". I am a regular reader of "Clay Shooting" so when I saw an ad for "Laser Arrow Shot" I thought that this was what I need to help set the gun up right. The ad stated that the Arrow Laser Shot can sooth and perfect your gun mount, improve your gunswing, check your point of impact and gunfit.

The product sounded perfect; just what I needed. I checked the web-site www.arrowlasershot.com and filled in an order. I personally haven't had much experience with purchasing over the internet, but I was suitably impressed when after a few hours there were emails notifying me that my order had been received, then dispatched. Within a week I was the proud owner of the Arrow Laser Shot.

So when my new gun arrived, I was able to use the Arrow Laser Shot to help me set up the new gun. First I put together my old 682 and checked the point of impact of both barrels using the Arrow Laser Shot, knowing that this was what I was after. I then used the Arrow Laser Shot to check the point of impact on my new gun. (What was interesting was that I didn't need to make any adjustments at all: both were pointing in the exact same place) Just to make sure I wasn't getting a false positive reading and therefore making an assumption that everything was correct even though it was wrong (a type 1 error), I tried it with a gun that I knew didn't fit me, and it was clearly pointing in a different place. I then patterned each gun on just to substantiate the results from the Arrow Laser Shot. I was surprised and fortunate in that I didn't have to make any adjustments to my gun and I have shot very well with it since, but even if I did need to make some adjustments the instructions that came with the Arrow Laser Shot were very explicit and easy to follow. The other use for the Arrow Laser Shot is that I can use it every day for ten minutes to dry mount my gun. It shows me instantly if the gun is mounted correctly and I can put it down and start again.

When the Arrow Laser Shot arrived I ran into a shooting friend at the post office and showed him what I had bought. He had problems hitting anything with the top barrel, so he came out home and we looked at were the gun was pointing. What it showed was that the first barrel was flat and that the top barrel was actually lower: not what you want for a gun to shoot DTL targets. Naturally, out first thought was to raise the comb but this didn't help, so we changed the pitch of the gun and got it to a point where it was pointing above the mark for the first barrel and flat for the second barrel. The following weekend you could see dramatic changes in his scores and the way the targets were hit.

I have been using the Arrow Laser Shot during coaching sessions and take it with me to shoots because I am often get asked by shooters if they can check the point of impact of their guns. I'm sure I could have set up my gun by trying and changing, trying and changing, but the Arrow Laser Shot took most of the guesswork out of the process. Because I have confidence in the process that I adopted, I now have

confidence in the gun, which is more important. Most of us are competent shooters; where we fall down in competitions is that we are not as confident in our ability, guns, shells, etc as we should be, or we are not as composed in the competition as we should be.

I don't want to sound too gushy about the Arrow Laser Shot, but it lived up to all promises and made the task of fitting my gun so much easier. It would be an invaluable tool for a stock fitter, coach or gun retailer because it can let the customer know instantly if the gun they are interested in is at all close to fitting, and if not what they need to do to make it fit. For me I will use to perfect my gun mount, and use it in coaching to help others feel they can use their gun confidently.

With the Nationals now over for another year it will be necessary for most of us to reflect on our performance, evaluate our goals and possibly come up with new goals before we head off to Roma next year. For me the Nationals were a great opportunity to catch up with old friends, make some new friends, and enjoy several days of shooting uninterrupted by work. Because both my gun and I performed well (achieved personal bests) I left the Nationals feeling confident and competent in my ability.

Again, an unintended outcome of the Nationals was the opportunity to meet up with Jim Shepherd and Bryan Rafferty, and enjoy a bottle of "The Balvenie" single malt whiskey again. From it's humble beginnings four years ago at the Perth Nationals, this has now become a tradition, and this year we took shelter in Ray Mack's tent during the dust storm to enjoy some great whiskey, good fellowship, and some great stories, all of which I was told were true!

NEIL "FROSTY" SINGLETON 1930-2007

It is with profound sadness that the Committee and members of Cobar Clay Target Club informs our friends in the ACTA of the loss of one of the great identities of clay target shooting, Neil "Frosty" Singleton.

Neil was born in Cobar in 1930. He was educated at All Saints Boarding School in Bathurst, and grew up on the family property "Mareesh" fifty kilometres south of Cobar.

It was on "Mafeesh" that Cobar Gun Club originated. Neil's parents, Frank and Gladys Singleton hosted a famous annual event, where shooters from far and wide would stay at the property, enjoy the Singleton's hospitality, and compete for the Mafeesh Cup. Now over fifty years later, the Mareesh Cup is one of Australia's premier Trap

Handicap Events and is keenly contested each year in August at the Cobar Golden Clay Shoot.

Neil was at the forefront of his community of Cobar. He was actively involved in the Cobar Rural Lands Protection Board and, as its Chairman made great contributions to the local grazing community.

From the beginning, Neil was a member, and often President, of the Cobar Gun Club, but more than that; he was the person first thought of when anyone in the shooting world mentioned "Cobar". His personality was synonymous with the sense of fun, fairness, practicality and subtle mischief that has always been associated with Cobar Gun Club.

Neil was an accomplished shooter. He was a member of the Mackintosh International Tray Team in 1962. He won several State Titles, and many District and Club Championships. Sadly, much of Neil's shooting memorabilia was lost when the original "Mafeesh" homestead was destroyed by fire in 1970.

Neil possessed a razor sharp wit, a delightful sense of humour and mischief, and the ability to sum up a situation to perfection with a few short words.

A local radio station recently asked its listeners to ring in with their methods of predicting the weather. Neil rang in to say that, after many years of study and observation, he could predict it would be a wet season ahead when the emus started building their nests in higher tree branches than usual! The interviewer discusses this seriously and had no idea his leg was being pulled.

One of Neil's old friends described him as having "Lapped up life like a cat lapping milk". He enjoyed fine foods, fine drinks, beer, and homemade pickles, enjoyed making spicy and hot preserves and was an expert at the home brew.

Neil was one of life's great characters, who left a lasting impression on anyone fortunate enough to have met him.

It is interesting, just how often the subject of Cobar comes up, even when talking to strangers. When asked "Do you know Frosty Singleton?" those who did would always smile and nod, probably reflecting on the memory of something he said or did.

Neil leaves behind his wife, Joan, who lives in Cobar town, his son, Frank who now runs the family property, daughter Kerry from Melbourne, their partners, and six grandchildren. The family is looking forward to the arrival, in March, of Neil and Joan's first Great Grandchild, the Grandchild of their Late Son, Christopher.

Neil had the support and love of his family and friends, and the esteem of all whom knew him. He will be remembered with great affection. These few paragraphs are inadequate to fully convey the uniqueness and presence of Frosty's life and personality. Those lucky enough to know him will understand.

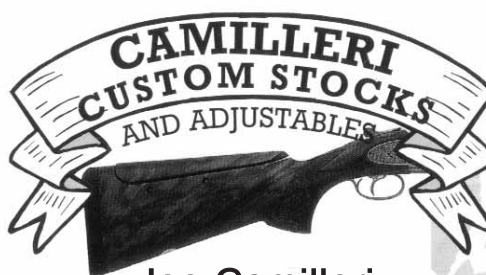

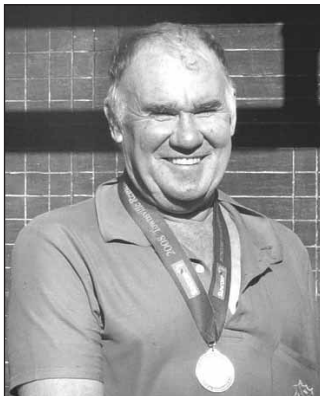

It's Your Call

No. 30

While refereeing a squad you notice the behaviour of one or more of the shooters in the squad while they are waiting their turn to shoot. One seems to talk, another keeps moving his gun sideways while another follows the next shooter's target with his arm. What action do you take?

IT'S YOUR CALL

Yes! You stop the squad and caution the offender or offenders.

Although some would argue that safety has not been prejudiced, it is nevertheless very obvious that there is disturbance to other shooters. GRTS 15 requires that the Referee is to be mindful of the rule regarding squad members disturbing the competitor shooting. It is far too late at the end of the squad to make any adjustments for any shooter who has been disturbed by thoughtless behaviour of any other squad members. The incidences described are certainly of a major nature and in the interest of equity they must be addressed positively. In fact, in some cases they may constitute a Baulk (Rule 1.11) or even be considered as an ungentlemanly act under Rule 1.01(l).

As some of these incidents have become far too prevalent, we should again visit the laid down standards for Shooter Responsibilities and Conduct which are:

It is your duty to ascertain your squad and shooting layout and to be on time for your squad. (Penalties may apply for those who are late).

Do not walk, talk, fidget or otherwise distract other shooters in your squad.

Do not walk, move from your track until the next shooter has fired.

You must remain on your track until the last shooter has finished shooting.

You must check your score before leaving the tracks as the score recorded against your name is final once the squad sheet is returned to the office.

Do not obstruct the Referee's view.

Always check your Handicap card before leaving the grounds as it is your responsibility to ensure that it has been filled in correctly.

Remember that Referees are honorary and human. You are expected to abide by their decisions.

Your President and committee are honorary. You are expected to respect them and co-operate with them at all times.

Dress in a clean, neat and tidy manner. Wear appropriate footwear.

Remember that shooting is a sport and you are expected to conduct yourself as a sportsperson at all times.

NSW Members and Dealers

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

(a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

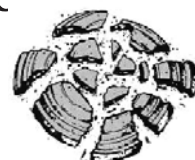

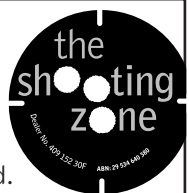

2008 SOUTH AUSTRALIAN STATE SKEET CHAMPIONSHIPS



March 8th, 9th & 10th saw the SA skeet calendar realign itself as a lead up to the May timeslot of the National Skeet Championships. We had to scratch our heads following the loss of the May long weekend when the Adelaide Cup Carnival was rescheduled to the 2nd weekend of March to take advantage of a warmer part of the year. Ironically, that same event has come to our rescue by providing a 3 day weekend some 9 weeks ahead of the new Skeet Nationals date. Perfect!

The Weather Bureau had warned us it was going to be hot, and whilst we often laugh about their predictions, sadly they were right this time, temperatures of 38, 39 & 38 were experienced respectively for the 3 days. Thankfully wind speeds were relatively mild so the target quality was pretty consistent over the weekend, and the enthusiasm of those in attendance was not tested on either level. But the heat was on in the competitive sense, we had a good program ahead and a fantastic array of prizes courtesy of the new sponsors, Coles Gun Supplies, March Insurance and Marksman Indoor Firing Range.

Numbers in attendance were down slightly this year, we'll put that down to the first time in the new time slot and the weather, never the less, the quality of shooters was again excellent with current National Champions lining up and even the 1984 National Skeet Champion Gordon Wakefield taking part in the Veterans section. A contingent from the South East region of South Australia was again present with serious intentions on winning.

Shooting commenced with the inaugural running of the 20G SA State Skeet title, and it looked to be going to consistent local Adam Goodall on 49/50 but he had to settle for 2nd in AA when two possibles, which came from the last squad in the event, shot off for overall. Victorian shooters Mal Briggs and Brendan Pearson took

only 11 more targets to sort it out when Brendan obtained his 1st State Championship win and Mal took 1st in AA. Lawrence Irons took A Grade with 50/51 from Colin Jacobs on 49/51. Ken Carey won B Grade with 45/50, Brian Thomas on 49/55 was second and Anthony Demaria won C Grade. The ever youthful Ray Kimber being the best of the Veterans on 46/50.

Event two was the 25 Pairs SA State Doubles Championship and John Pope, who had flown back to SA from Brisbane two days prior, shot a commanding 49/50 to take the title outright. The shoot offs which followed left Mal Briggs as winner in AA again with 54/56 from Bob Dower 2nd on 53/56. Dougal Simson was 1st in A Grade on 48/50 from Sim-Hee Neoh with 55/62. State President Allan Vilcins won B Grade with 43/50 from Ken Atkin on 46/54. Anthony Demaria with 46/50 again took C Grade from Anthony Lock on 38/50. Veterans went to John Holder on 44/50 and Ben Lock took juniors with 46/50.

Day Two commenced with the three zone teams of six shooters completing a round each in the early light (and the mildest part of another hot day). Central and Eastern Zones tied on the score sheets, with Eastern Zone taking the Zone Teams title by combining the reserve shooters score.

The 100 target SA State Skeet Championship followed, this included the commencement of eliminations for the State Team Postal Match. At the end of the minor rounds Bob Dower and Lawrence Irons, who both finished on 99, shot off for o/all with the result coming after only 5 targets, Lawrence being the victor. Bob took 1st in AA ahead of Adam Goodall on 111/114. Dougal Simson continued his good form and won A Grade with 98/100, the ever jovial Daniel Burton being 2nd with 95/101. Relatively new shooter Jeya Sivendra won C Grade with 94/100 and consistent Anthony Demaria took second with 92/100. Veterans again went to Ray Kimber with 102/112 and Ben Lock on 90/100 again took juniors. Thankfully each of the shoot offs was over fairly quickly so all present had minimal exposure to the heat.

Day 3, and more of the same (heat), only the 50Tgt State Handicap to go and we would see who had made the Postal Team for 2008. As usual the handicap formula proved effective with a swag of competitors qualifying to shoot off. At the end of it all we had Mount Gambier Gun Club shooter Dougal Simpson (surely he is AA by now?) hold on to win with 111/113 from Ken Carey in 2nd on 105/112, Anthony Demaria 3rd on 87/98, Dino Oliviero (who really should shoot more skeet) 4th on 86/93 and Anthony Lock 5th on 85/92. Ben Lock again took the juniors prize after shooting 47/50.

High Guns shoot offs were then completed and Ben Lock took Juniors with 183/200, Ray Kimber in Veterans with 180/200, Anthony Demaria in C Grade with 178/200, Brian Thomas in B Grade with 184/200, Lawrence Irons in A Grade with 193/200, Bob Dower in AA with 196/200.

One more shoot off for the final 3 positions and the Postal Team was ready to put up their score. Sadly, one of the best long runs in SA skeet had come to an end, Ray Kimber was not in the team even though he had shot an elimination score which would have earned him a spot in recent years! This year qualifying was that bit closer, despite the smaller group involved. The record which Ray holds is 38 consecutive years in the State Skeet Postal Team, a glorious effort which would be hard to see being bettered by any shooter in any discipline across all Australian States. Congratulations Ray, for an effort which we all respect.

After the Postal Team had shot their score we found up and coming shooter Ben Baker earned the Postal Team High Gun and a place in the SA Shoulder to Shoulder Team along with Bob Dower, Dougal Simson, Adam Goodall and John Pope. Good luck at the Nationals, we trust you will return to SA as back to back champions!

One more prize to present, The Champion South Australian Skeet

Shooter, and this year a new name must be engraved onto the distinctive cannon shell trophy, that of the worthy winner, Dougal Simpson. It takes an extraordinary effort to win this title as Bob Dower appears to hold a mortgage on it, and will certainly be out to regain it in 2009.

Whilst the 3 day carnival was not without hiccups (relatively minor but all part of the learning curve!) we must extend our thanks to the SACTA committee for their support of skeet shooting, their efforts in securing excellent sponsorship for this discipline, and their fresh approach to clay target shooting in SA. Similarly, our thanks go to the SAGC committee for again providing the facilities and to Jan Renney and her helpers in the canteen for their ability to keep the inner shooter happy too.

QLD POLICE CTC MAJOR SUPPORTER OF JUNIOR DEVELOPMENT

The Queensland Police Clay Target club was reformed in 2005, after previously known as the Queensland Police Gun Club which was formed in 1981.

The club has a goal of bringing Police officers together, both retired and current for mate ship, whilst enjoying the sport of clay target shooting.

Every year since 1981, there has also been the Australasian Police and Services Clay Target Championships, which brings together Police, Services and other Emergency organizations together for the National Championships. Qld Police have been represented at these Nationals in a large majority of these shoots.

Since being reformed the club, has run a two day shoot at the Kingaroy Clay Target club grounds, in 2006 and 2007. Donations have been made to Angel Flight and the Kingaroy Clay Target Club.

At the conclusion of the 2007 shoot in Kingaroy a meeting was held in relation to the future direction of the club. Junior development was identified as a very worthwhile cause and the club now is a major supporter of junior trap shooting development in Queensland.

In conjunction with the QCTA the Qld Police CTC is proud to provide the following support:

- Provide a perpetual trophy to be presented to the junior team at the State Trap Carnival.
- Provide financial support for any Qld junior who is selected in an Australian representative team.

The QPCTC recognizes the requirement to support Junior shooting, and it anticipates that the donated money may assist parents/ juniors in continuing in the sport.

As stated this arrangement will commence in 2008.
