Our first Skeet Hall of Fame was a fantastic sell out and thoroughly enjoyed by our members, their families and friends who attended the night. The Master of Ceremony for the night was our historian Mr Mark McInnes. Our inaugural inductee was Mr Reg Clarke, who received a well deserved accolade from the audience.

Todd Bender (visiting overseas shooter from the USA) had a successful Skeet Carnival taking out several championships as well as Overall Champion. Todd expressed that he had enjoyed his visit to Australia enormously and as a consequence he has promised to return soon.

ISSF WORLD CUP 2008

"Good Luck Beijing"

The Beijing Shooting Complex is located northwest of Beijing, 50km from Beijing airport. The Clay Target area of the massive, impressive shooting complex has 6 layouts. As this World Cup was a test event for the Olympic Games, the event was run as the program will be for the Games. This being the case and for the first time at these Olympics, flash targets were used in the qualification rounds as well as the final.

In the qualification rounds Chinese manufactured Norinco Orange coloured targets filled with Green powder were used. Whilst in the Final, Orange coloured targets filled with Red powder was used. The Layouts were equipped with Laporte machines.

As you would have heard the air in Beijing is quite different to ours. Most days at the Range were also unusual with something similar to a snow storm of cotton balls like pollen with tiny seeds attached blowing around at times quite heavy, making breathing and visibility even more difficult. Most of the Team suffered with some form of throat, head and eye problems.

The accommodation was good and about 40 minutes by bus to the Shooting Complex and 30 minutes to Tiananmen Square. Some of the Team were able to visit the Great Wall of China and all that went found it amazing. No rabbits or Roaches were seen.

This World Cup was a full World Cup, meaning it was not only for Shotgun but for Rifle and Pistol as well. All the Australian Team were together. The indoor Rifle and Pistol buildings are a sight to see to be believed. It is a very impressive huge complex. Warren Potent of Australia won gold and equalled World Record again in the Mens 50m Rifle Prone event. Warren is Australia's number one medal prospect at the Olympics as he has medalled at every World Cup in the last 12 months. Lalita Yauhleusyaya was Australia's next best shooter at Beijing, finishing 4th in the Womens

10m Air Pistol. Clay Target shooters may know Lalita's husband Sergei, who is the gunsmith for Beretta.

George Barton was our most successful Clay Target Shooter at this event, reaching the Final in a mixture of conditions in the Skeet Men event. George had to shoot off with 2 others for the 5th and 6th position in the final. George was successful in qualifying for the final after shooting a further 4 targets. This was a great effort with a big field of big name shooters contesting this event. The weather for Skeet was wet, raining constantly on Day 2 qualification rounds and for the Final. The Chinese Olympic shooter Qu was 1st with $120 + 24 = 144$, Tsuranov of Russia 2nd $120 + 23 = 143+6$. 3rd was the Italian shooter Filippetti $120 + 23 = 143+5$. The well known young USA shooter Vincent Hancock shot off with George after the final to decide 4th position with Vincent shooting $121 + 21 = 142+3$ and George $24 + 23 + 25 + 22 + 25 = 119+4 +23 = 142+2$ to give Vincent 4th and George 5th. Paul Rahman (AUS) shot $23 + 21 + 23 + 23 + 23 = 113$.

Natalia Rahman shot $21 + 19 + 23 = 63$ in the Skeet Women event. Chinas Olympic shooter for 2008 Wei won gold with $25 + 24 + 23 = 72 + 25 = 97$. Silver to Bacosi (ITA) $70 + 24 = 94+4$ and bronze to Dunn (USA) $70 + 24 = 94+3+2$. Shan Zhang (Barnes) China 5th $71 + 21 = 92$.

Mosin of Russia won gold in the Double Trap event with a great score of $47 + 50 + 48 = 145 + 46 = 191$. Eller (USA) was 2nd $48 + 47 + 45 = 140 + 48 = 188$. Alshamsy Saif (UAE) $44 + 49 + 47 = 140 + 45 = 185+2$. Russell Mark (AUS) $44 + 46 + 46 = 136$.

China won gold again in the Trap Women event. Long time competitor Gao shot $24 + 24 + 23 = 71 + 22 = 93$ to win. It was great to meet Gao's proud son who was a volunteer at the clay target. Pak (PRK) was placed 2nd after shooting $24 + 24 + 24 = 69 + 21 = 90$. Laricheva (RUS) 3rd, $22 + 22 + 24 = 68+3 + 21 = 89$. Stacy Roiall (AUS) $23 + 21 + 23 = 67$.

This was a good event for the Olympic competitors and Officials to have a look and feel for the ground before the Olympics. It was different for the competitors shooting at flash targets in the qualification rounds. The same rule applied to hit or loss as it would in the final using flash targets.

Lets hope for bigger and better things on our return visit.

QCTA CENTRAL ZONE INC ANNUAL TRAP CARNIVAL 2008

Location: On the Tropic of Capricorn Qld

Very hot and humid conditions met shooters at the QCTA Central Zone Carnival which was held in Rockhampton on the weekend of the 23rd and 24th February 2008. The shoot initially was to have been held at the Pioneer Clay Target Club in Mackay, however over 700mm of rain in the previous two weeks put a bit of a dampner on proceedings. With the grounds virtually inaccessible a last minute decision was made to hold the carnival at Rockhampton.

With only six days notice and the grounds almost a jungle from recent rains Rockhampton members swung into action and bought the grounds up to shooting standard. By Friday afternoon the message had got about, the job had been done and the Zone Carnival was ready to proceed. One other problem loomed, the Fitzroy River was in flood again for the second time in three weeks and the Mackay water was making its way down. The river was to peak at 7.8m over the weekend and the bridge to the grounds was going under at around 7.5m, some were worried but eventually 80 shooters made the journey.

The first event on Saturday morning was a 25 Target Cash Divide. The results were as follows: AA Grade S Ryan, J Maxwell, G Wright, J McIntyre, L Bunker, B Zimpel 25/25. A Grade A Powell, T Harker, J Riggs, M Venter, T Meaney 25/25. B Grade C Barletta, J Wiseman 25/25. C Grade 1st D Easterman, 2nd P Hearn.

Event Two was the 25 Target QCTA Central Zone Double Barrel Championship. Overall was won by Andrew Adams from Barcaldine CTC with a score of 72/72. Other results were AA Grade 1st Shawn Ryan 69/70, 2nd John Maxwell 46/47; A Grade 1st Jim Riggs 71/72, 2nd Grant McPherson 33/34. B Grade 1st Jeff Fittler 25/25, 2nd Brian

Muirson 30/31 and C Grade 1st Darryl Easterman 25/25, 2nd Stephen Millar 24/25.

Event Three was the 25T QCTA Central Zone Single Barrel Championship. Overall went to John Maxwell of the Rockhampton CTC with the only possible 25/25. AA Grade 1st Malcolm Bell 35/36, 2nd Garry Wright 34/36; A Grade 1st Jim Riggs 26/28, 2nd Alex Dallas 28/31; B Grade 1st Zach Grimshaw 24/25, 2nd Raymond Mitchell 24/26, C Grade 1st Stephen Millar 22/25, 2nd Barbara Cox 22/26.

Event Four was the 15 Pair QCTA Central Zone Double Rise Championship. Overall went to Shawn Ryan Normanton CTC with 35/40. Grade results were AA Grade 1st John Maxwell 36/40, 2nd Rex Kirk 35/40; A Grade 1st Craig Polsen 27/30, 2nd Peter Brandt 25/30; B Grade 1st Andrew Olive 24/30, 2nd Chris Bourne 28/40, C Grade 1st Wendy Bell 23/30, 2nd Geoff Beck 26/40.

With Saturday out of the way, air conditioned comfort was the best option. A drop of rain during the evening kept the humidity up and Sunday was no different, hot and humid.

The first event of the day was the 25T QCTA Central Zone Continental Championship. Overall was once again won by local Rockhampton member John Maxwell with a score of 161/161. Grade results were AA 1st Bruce Powell 160/161, 2nd Shawn Ryan 95/96. A Grade 1st Alan Powell 95/96, 2nd Peter Brandt 43/44; B Grade 1st Jim Wiseman 26/26, 2nd Brian Muirson 25/26; C grade 1st Phil Hearn 25/25, 2nd Stephen Millar 22/25.

Event Six was the 25T QCTA Central Zone Points Score Championship. Overall went to Shawn Ryan with a score of 96/96. Grade results were AA Grade 1st Leam Bunker 74/75, 2nd Garry Wright 76/78; A Grade 1st Barry Harker 75/75, 2nd Grant McPherson 74/75; B Grade 1st Carlo Barletta 73/75, 2nd Andrew Olive 71/75 and C Grade 1st Phil Hearn 74/75, 2nd Karlene Kelly 65/75.

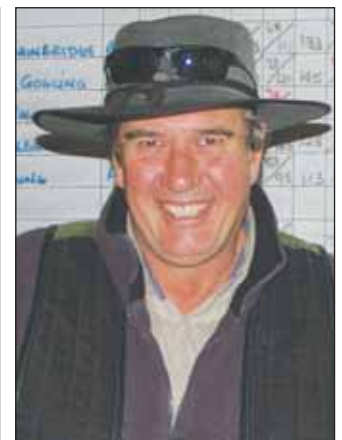

dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

Psychological Skills for Shooting

VISUAL MOTOR BEHAVIOURAL REHEARSAL

Earlier this year I wrote two articles that look at mental rehearsal, which uses guided imagery or visualization, to help improve performance. Another type of mental rehearsal is Visual Motor Behavioural Rehearsal (VMBR), which was developed at the 1994 Winter Olympics at Lillehammer by downhill racer and gold medalist, Tommy Moe, to analyse and correct his performance whilst preparing for his second run.

The VMBR technique combines relaxation and imagery in a format that allows individuals to desensitise themselves to a stressful situation. Desensitisation is a common and useful format that is used to deal with anxiety and fears such as fear of heights, snakes, etc.

The mental practice of VMBR is aimed at removing unwanted and undesirable movements that affect athletic performance. VMBR can be used for a variety of purposes: once an athlete masters the general sense of relaxation and confidence, for example, VMBR can be used to control tension, rehearse for an upcoming competition, reduce fear and remove stress in parts of the body and enhance the winning feeling.

According to Steven Ungerleider, Mental Training for Peak Performance, you can use VMBR to enhance your ability by imagining yourself performing well and confidently whilst you compete. VMBR has four goals:

- Technique enhancement
- Error analysis and correction
- Competition preparation, and
- Skill enhancement

Research regarding VMBR has shown dramatic results, in 1983 research at the University of North Carolina demonstrated that basketball shooting could improve by 7 percent after practicing mental rehearsal. Tim Gallwey, author of *The Inner Game of Golf* showed that VMBR techniques focusing on correct technique could improve performance, whilst VMBR focusing on incorrect technique showed a decline in ability and performance. This focus is taken further by Pat Parelli of Natural Horsemanship fame, who claims that "practice doesn't make perfect, perfect practice makes perfect."

According to Ungerleider, VMBR allows you to experience sensory-motor sensations of an athletic skill that mimic real life experiences. So how do you VMBR.

Find a quiet, tranquil and comfortable place to sit: take three deep breaths and get comfortable and focused.

Go to a scene in your mind that is familiar and calm: perhaps the beach, floating on a lake, etc. Make sure that the scene is vivid, clear and detailed. Feel the scene and allow your senses to participate in the scene. Stay completely comfortable as you experience the sensory images of the scene. Take several minutes developing the scene: the smell, the touch, the feelings and sound of this visual place.

Now that you have this picture in your mind: freeze frame it, lock it in and switch it off. Now go back to your breathing and the totally relaxed feeling in your chair. Over the next two minutes just breathe in and out with a blank screen in your mind.

Next "flip the switch" and go back to your wonderful scene. As you return to that relaxed place, pay attention to all the feelings and emotions associated with the scene. Spend two of three minutes at the scene and then return to your breathing and the blank visual screen.

This switching procedure is an integral part of VMBR and is quite simple to learn and can become automatic with some practice. When you switch back and forth you gain control of your imagery screen,

taking command of the imagery and visualisation process. Over time there fore you will be able to do it at will. Just like practicing golf swing, or shooting a particular target, practicing your imagery you will get better pictures.

Once you have mastered the above process, it can be taken to the next level. Start with step 1 again, get comfortable and relaxed. Switch on the relaxation scene described above and get tuned in to your wonderful and peaceful place, working the rest of the four steps mentioned above.

Now turn your attention to an a shoot scene. Picture yourself as a participant (not an observer). See yourself on the track or in a skeet squad. Picture yourself shooting well, see yourself winning, turning in a new personal best. Feel the emotions that engulfs you as you see the final target being broken in a cloud of dust. Hear the onlookers and feel the handshakes and pats on the back. Allow these images to be real and vivid. Now that you have this image in your mind: freeze frame those winning emotions.

Next, switch gears and get back to the relaxed frame. Remove the picture from your minds eye and go back to your relaxed and controlled breathing. Breathe deeply for two or three minutes. Now hit the switch and go back to that winning scene: see the target break and feel the emotions again. Picture yourself as vividly as possible. Do this several times each day spending more time with the image each time.

This VMBR technique can be used as often as you like. A survey of Olympians before the 1988 Seoul Olympics showed that athletes used this techniques regularly and more frequently as the competition approached to deal with the stress of competition and to reduce their anxiety levels.

According to Ungerleider, the applications of the process are limitless. What is essential is that the process is practiced so that it can become automatic. Being able to use it at will, will provide you with valuable tool in dealing with stress and anxiety.

30th Anniversary at Downside

Downside Clay Target Club Inc held their 30th anniversary shoot on December 22 2007 at the National Shooting Ground Tasman Road Wagga Wagga.

A big welcome was extended to members, past members and visitors by Vice President Chris Levitzke. We hope you had an enjoyable day. Apologies were received from Stuart Inglis, Noel and Sandra Hackett Bill and Thelma Birkin, Rita and Harold Wilson, Peter Englebrecht and Merv Holden.

A brief history about the club over the last 30 years. Downside was formed at a meeting attended by 30 shooters on 9 August 1977. Solicitor Charles Houen chaired the meeting and elected the inaugural committee as follows; President John Stewart, Secretary Leila Parr, Treasurer Tom Atkinson, Committee Peter

Wheeler, Bob Blake, Alex McKenzie, Cliff Post, John Wilson and Jim Parr.

The Downside club was situated 16k's from Wagga Wagga on the Coolamon Road, then left onto The Gap Hall road and situated on the property belonging to John and Dianne Francis. The clubhouse was transported from the RAAF base after being sown in half with a long chainsaw belonging to Bob Blake. The front and both of the end concrete steps came from the Uranquinty aerodrome. The club was very fortunate that the majority of the prospective members were very talented or qualified trade people who gave their time freely so that layouts and clubhouse would be ready for the first shoot in November 1977.

Later a verandah and BBQ area were added which made more space for seating and socialising. A lot of fundraising and working bees were held to get the clubhouse and layouts ready for shooting.

The range consisted of 4 DTL layouts, 2 Skeet layouts, 1 Trench layout, 1 Ball Trap layout (located in the Trench layout), 1 Sporting Clays layout. The club purchased a new Daymo Trap plus 15 traps with 2 spares for the Trench and hired 2 Winchester traps from the Ganmain Gun Club.

Finally all was in readiness for the first shoot which was held on the 26th November 1977 with 60 shooters from around the area attending to shoot in fine and hot conditions.

Next was the official opening conducted on Saturday 22nd April 1978 by the then member for Wagga Mr Joe Schipp. The programme consisted of DTL and Olympic Trap events with 67 shooters attending.

A major highlight for the Club was when we were awarded the

National Olympic Trap and ISU Skeet Championships. The Minister for Business and Consumer Affairs and member for Farrer, Mr Wal Fife, opened the championships held on 3rd, 4th and 5th November 1979. Every state except Northern Territory were represented with a party of 15 shooters from New Zealand. There were 79 shooters shooting the trench while 27 shooters shot skeet. These numbers exceeded 1978 figures.

As years went by and the club became more financial, we were able to purchase more traps and erect lighting behind the DTL layouts for night shooting. Sporting Clays was another discipline we decided to try. This meant club engineer, Bob Tye, was once again in action making the stands and tower. Downside entered the Sporting Clays event for the first time in the Wagga Wagga Veteran Games in March 1996 and 1998.

In early 2001 Downside club was approached by the ACTA to consider relocating to the National Ground in Tasman Road, Wagga Wagga. After much thought and discussion, it was decided to make the move and the last shoot at the Downside Range was conducted on 24th August 2002 with a little sadness.

Downside's first shoot at the National Complex was the Chris Mason Memorial Champion of Champions held on 28th September 2002.

After 2 successful years at the National Complex, it was decided it was time to remove and tidy up the old Downside Range. This was completed in September 2004, and again after many working bees by our dedicated members. Over the years the club has registered close to 200 shooters.

There was some socialising that went on too. It was always a tradition to supply a meal after the Xmas shoot as we are doing tonight. On one occasion Santa Claus paid a visit to the delight of the children. Another couple of years we were entertained by Peter Englebrecht singing and playing his guitar.

All the meals, large and small, plus afternoon teas have been catered for very capably by the ladies Auxiliary over the 30 years.

Lastly this is the first time the club has held a reunion type gathering. We hope everyone has enjoyed chatting and reminiscing about the years gone by, oh where has the last 30 years gone.

Leila Parr cut the anniversary cake which was made and beautifully decorated by Bev Tye.

A Question of Rule Changes

Those of us in the front line at our local clubs are often the first contact prospective new shooters will have with the sport. And the first three rules we emphasise to them are SAFETY, SAFETY and SAFETY.

At a club skeet shoot I was therefore surprised to see a young shooter on station 7 load two shells and proceed to shoot the high house, followed by the low. I indicated to the young shooter's mentor that perhaps he should be told to load one cartridge only to shoot the high house target, only to be told that since January 2008 shooters on station 7 are allowed to load two cartridges to shoot the high and then the low house target.

The reason the station 7 shooting procedure was altered in the last rule change was due to a safety issue. The original station 7 procedure for shooting single targets was to load two cartridges and shoot the low house target followed by the high house. When the powers that be decided we should change to shooting the high house target first, the rule was that we could only load one cartridge at a time. It was deemed that whether you are a novice shooter or a seasoned competitor, if a piece of the high house target is heading in your direction, you are going to react by turning to get out of its way. This reaction could endanger the rest of the squad, the referee, or any bystanders when by turning to avoid the incoming projectile, the shooter turns his or her loaded gun in their direction.

The solution to this problem was to impose a rule instructing the shooter to load one cartridge and shoot the high house target, reload and shoot the low. We complained at first but if we were to shoot at the high house first, this was the safest way to go. Now since 1st January we continue to shoot in the same order but 'may' load two cartridges.

My first question is 'What happened to the safety issue?' If we have the option of loading two cartridges for the station 7 singles, surely the safest and most sensible order would be to shoot the low house first. Woops - - and that takes us back to where we started. The logical second question would be 'Why was it changed in the first place?'

Imposing a rule change is a lengthy procedure for all concerned and it also takes time for shooters, referees and instructors to adapt. More forethought, common sense and a consideration for consequences is required before changes are made so that we don't have to go through the frustration of finding ourselves better off back where we started.

This is not the first time that we have undergone seemingly unnecessary changes to skeet rules, with the explanation from the ACTA being that we were complying with NSSA rules. Australia should not be governed by American rules, and we should never compromise safety under any circumstances. It is also not necessary to underestimate the small percentage of Australian skeet shooters who

choose to compete in America. I'm sure they will have the intelligence to adapt to that country's system when competing there.

One of the most questionable rules that I believe has recently been imposed on shooters is that of Compulsory Downgrading and I still fail to see how this has been of benefit to anyone. On the contrary it has taken much of the fun out of casual events, night competitions and social club shoots as we now have to compete seriously at every shoot to try to maintain our grade.

Many shooters would prefer to compete in a higher grade and never take anything from the trophy table, and if this doesn't disadvantage anyone but themselves it should be their choice. This will deter many shooters from shooting in less than perfect conditions. Let's not forget that shooting is our recreation and we don't want the enjoyment to be regulated out of it.

Lastly I believe the calculation of Rolling Percentages has imposed an extra work load on our already over-stretched office workers. It is increasingly difficult to find reliable volunteers to do this thankless task and it seems that no sooner is one set of rules implemented for handicap card entries than another set takes its place. If a shooter performs well enough to be ruled off at 97% after 200 targets, surely he will expect to be in AA grade. Does it really matter what he did 200, 600 or 1,000 targets ago if this is his current level of ability? NO.

If the executive of the ACTA are serious about increasing the membership of the Association and not have existing members becoming disillusioned and leaving then they need to look deeply into some of the questionable rules that are being imposed upon us.

To those making the rules that we all must follow, don't make them to cater for the small percentage of 'cheats' (we all know who they are and they will always find a way around them anyway) while penalising the honest majority. Please spare a thought for those volunteering their own time to help out in shoot offices, for those that want to relax, catch up with friends and have a fun day shooting, and for those that rely on the rules of our sport to maintain the safest environment at all times.

You may or may not agree with my views, either way I look forward to seeing your comments in this column. Make your voice count.

Editors Note:

From the Chairperson of Rules & Safety Committee.

Rule changes and safety not taken lightly.

The Rule changes introduced on January 1 2008 were only implemented after a full process where changes can only take place after being proposed by a State or National Executive, they are then sent to all states and state Rules Supervisors for approval.

If accepted by a majority of states and the Rules sub committee, they then have to be passed by the full Executive Committee.

If the Rule changes are not passed and are amended they go through this due process again.

This process usually takes up to two years before rules are accepted or rejected.

These rule changes were proposed to have Australia and New Zealand (our closest shooting neighbours) shooting the same skeet rules and are not believed by either country to compromise safety.

By the way, the same perceived safety issue can be argued, when shooting doubles on station seven, when shooting low house first, pieces of low seven or the shot at low seven accidentally breaks high seven and these pieces of the high house target are heading in the shooters direction

It's Your Call

No. 31

Despite a veiled warning at the introduction to "It's your call No 28" (CTSN April 2008), some confusion has arisen because we do not include that there is provision for a warning to be given by the Referee to a shooter under the Refusal Rule for first refusal of a target. After that warning, the ruling we have given applies absolutely.

The case in point relates to a shooter refusing a target after having received only one broken target. In this case the shooter does not raise the gun to the shoulder and makes a unilateral decision to call for a target. GRTS 5 (b) is specific in that it denies the shooter an automatic entitlement to see a target after receiving only one broken target or one "No target call".

To emphasise the situation we ignored an entitlement of a shooter to refuse a target under GRTS 17. In GRTS 17 we provide for a shooter to be questioned by the Referee (after the first refusal) as to why he (the shooter) refused a certain target. Should the Referee disagree with the reason given by the shooter, the Referee is to warn the shooter that future refusals will be scored "Lost" if he (the Referee) disagrees with the reason for the refusal. Hence in this case we should allow the shooter first refusal. However, shooters who have been warned after their first refusal and then unilaterally call for targets in this manner without reference to the Referee on any other occasion can expect, and should get, a ruling of "Lost Target".

No particular mention is made regarding the position of the shooter's gun being mounted to the shoulder etc. So in the first instance of the refusal we must err on the side of the shooter and allow for the refusal as our rules do not cover this situation. This was his first refusal and no warning had been given previously even though the shooter's actions did not indicate his attention to actually shoot at the target. Therefore, it would seem that in this case GRTS 17 will take precedence but only in the case of the "first refusal".

A shooter's entitlement to refuse a target or targets is generally well explained in GRTS 17. However, the most optimistic of us will not believe that a shooter with his gun open and on his "foot" will have too many intentions of firing at a target. His entitlement to refusal embodies the legality of the target presented after he has called for it.

We trust this explanation further clarifies the matter.

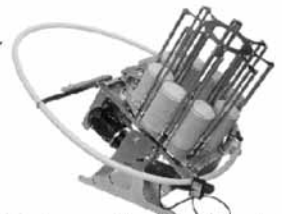

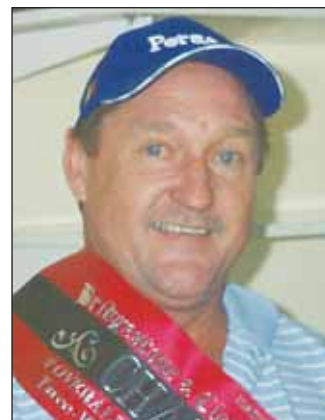
Despite the fact that numbers were down on last year, everyone that attended enjoyed good weather, good company, good food and good competition.

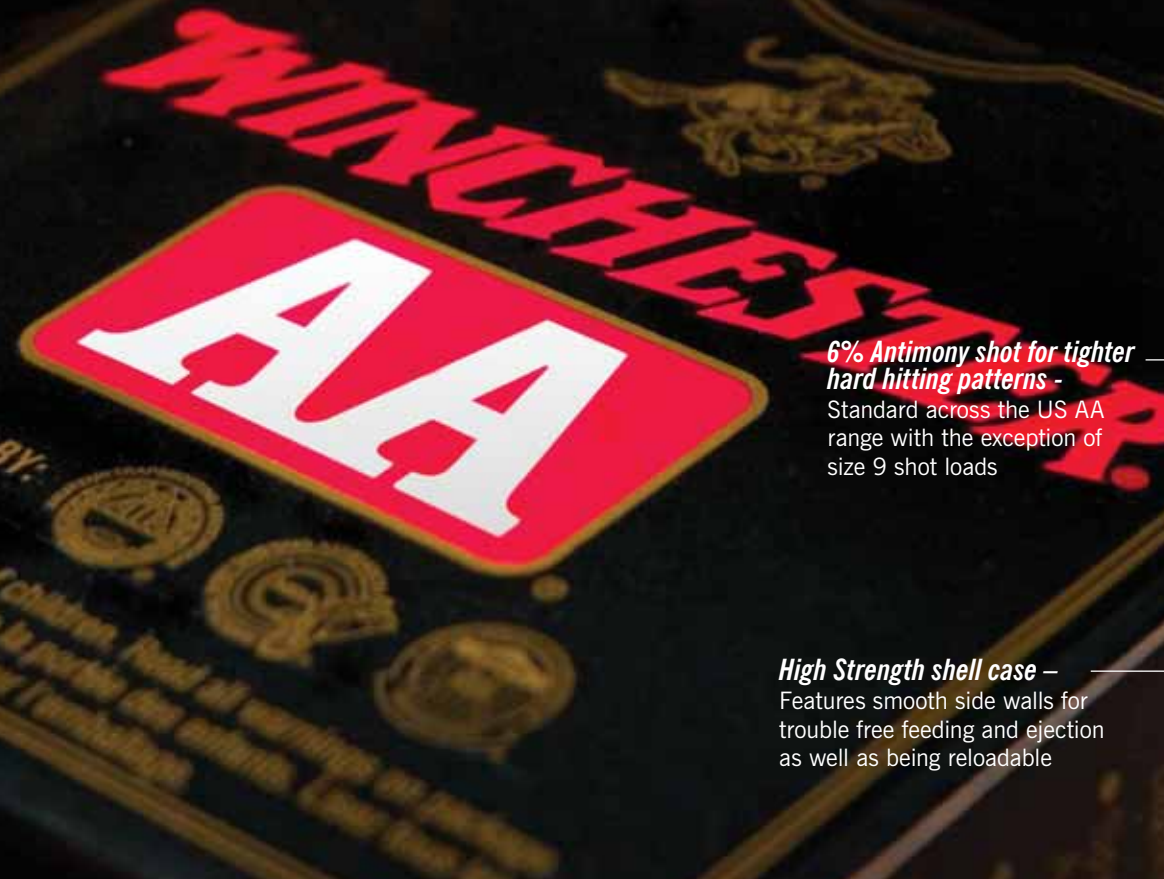

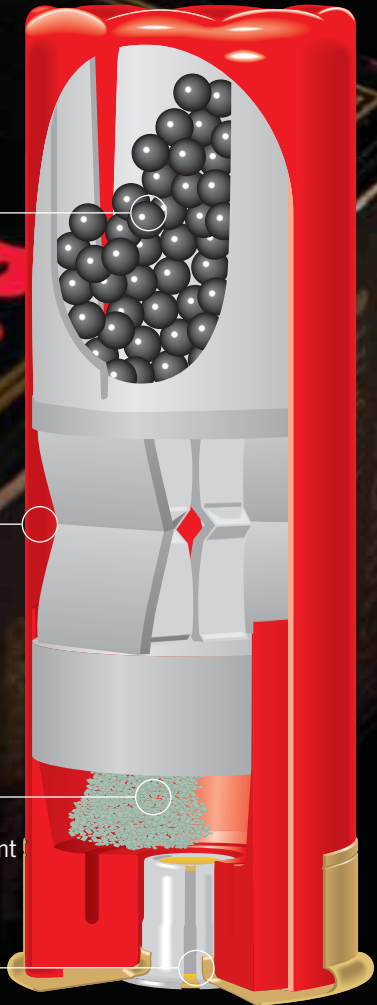

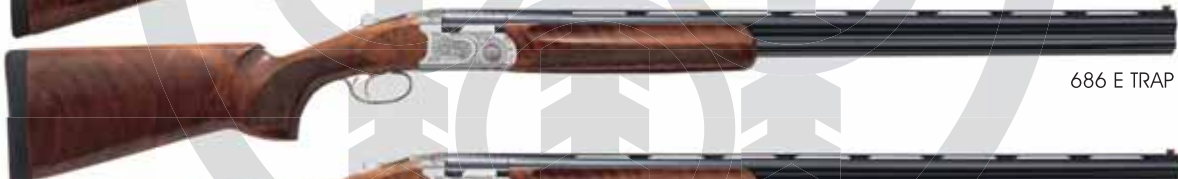
