

FROM THE CEO

With our Championships season now being over for the year, I thought things might calm down a little at ACTA HQ – but I've found that's not the case! Within two weeks of the Sporting and Skeet Nationals, we've held the National Executive meeting in Wagga. Arranging such annual symposiums includes coordinating travel, agendas, papers and a range of sundry activities, along with four very intensive days of meetings – an exhausting process for all concerned! Then, of course, when the meeting is over, we are straight into the minutes and actions.

One of the areas identified for my action on taking on the job of ACTA CEO late last year was the need for a more contemporary branding and professional presentation for the ACTA. This arose from deliberations prior to my arrival that led to the development of the

Bill Iles Appointed National Coaching Director

At the recent National Executive Committee meeting held over the 12th–15th of June at the ACTA head office in Wagga Wagga, Mr William J Iles (Bill) was appointed to the position of National Coaching Director. He will be assisted by Mr Graeme Boyd in the implementation of the new Coaching Courses.

The Coaching Committee has worked intently on a re-designed and simplified Coaching Accredi-

tation Pathway for experienced Clay Target Shooters to become Coaches and recognises those Coaches who are already accredited by transferring their level of accreditation to the new structure. The major focus of the Courses is to bring uniformity to the Coaching system across Australia.

Level 1 Coaches will become Club Coaches.

Level 2 and 3 Coaches will become Advanced Coaches

Several key people worked with the Committee to provide input to the new Course structure. Many different aspects of Coaching and Shooting were explored and debated at length, incorporating a variety of points of view. The experience and knowledge of this Committee and its advisors will ensure that this new structure is the way of the future for Coaching Clay Target Shooting in Australia.

The new Course has been endorsed by the National Executive and a process is now under way to have the Course accredited by the Australian Sports Commission (ASC), through the Australian International Shooting Ltd (AISL)

As soon as the accreditation has been approved, more information will be sent out to all State secretaries and Coaching Directors/Co-ordinators.

The National Coaching Committee of Geoff Faulkes (Chairperson), Lynne Curtis and Allan Kenny, wish to express their thanks to Mr William (Bill)Iles, Mr Russell Mark OAM, Mr Graeme Boyd, Mr Glenn O'Brien and Miss Chris Brown for their valuable input and knowledge into the re-structuring of the Coaching Courses. 2007-2011 Strategic Plan, and from last year's Executive meeting. I agree the Association does need to present itself in a more consistent, contemporary and professional way in the 21st century – but without loosing its history and traditions. And, it also needs to consider ways to market outside of itself, to new groups and demographics.

This premise led me to research ways we could do both – keep the tradition and become more contemporary. Its been done successfully by others before us. For instance, many government departments or statutory authorities use the 'official' commonwealth or state 'coat of arms', while also presenting a contemporary logo for their department's business.

My recommendation to the Board of ACTA was that we should maintain our existing logo in the same way as governments do – as our official 'coat of arms' logo, to be used on our medals, sashes, and formal collateral including representative uniforms.

But in the same way as they do, we should have a 'marketing' brand that would have an application not only for the ACTA, but could also be adapted and used in a similar way by the states if they so wished. Currently we all have logos that we, who already belong to ACTA, identify with but that to the uninitiated don't immediately say 'Clay Target Shooting'. So by retaining our 'official' individual logos, and having a consistent marketing brand, we could maximise our messages and impact to new audiences including politicians, media and potential new members, and stand out from the crowd.

We have been provided with a number of options, including the use of a 'spinning clay target'.

In May 2008, only 6 months since the last Skeet National Championships, the 2008 Skeet Nationals were conducted at the National Shooting ground. The attendance and atmosphere were excellent, numbers hit 147 shooters, with increases in participation in every event. And what a contrast - the weather gave us a marked change from the 40 degree plus, fly plagued November shoot! After a wet, cold and windy weekend for the Sporting Nationals which preceded the event Wagga finally put on some glorious days and chilly nights. Shoot Marshall Paul Johnston did a great job in keeping things moving - especially as there is no daylight saving in May! Once again we had shooters from all over Australia and a great contingent from across the ditch. This year we were lucky to have a world champion from the United States of America join us too. Thank you to Colin Sim who made it possible for Todd Bender to attend the shoot. Todd certainly was amazing to watch and a gracious visitor to our shores. Our Aussie shooters did us proud and made Todd work very hard for the High Gun, which Todd pointed out in his victory speech, noting that the competition and grounds were top class. In addition to the High Gun, Todd took out the Champion of Champions, Handicap and Skeet Championship. Gil Farish broke the National break record to win the 20 Gauge, Laurie Scerescini won the Commonwealth Skeet and Mal Briggs won the Skeet Doubles.

Special thanks to our Sponsors and supporters: Casella Wines, Beretta Australia & The Uranquinty Hotel. Jo & Dave from the Uranquinty Hotel provided the catering and bar services for the Nationals. They sponsored the food for the shooters barbeque and all gold coin donations from it went to support the charity Country Hope. Along with the raffle, over \$650 was raised for this hard working volunteer run charity that looks after families and kids suffering from cancer.

Thank you also to the traders that supported the event including Glenn Walker from 650StraightSkeet and Ray & Pat Mack from Earmold, along with Graham Callander from Canterbury Voice Release and Rodd Flower from Perazzi. A special thank you to Janenne Kidd who volunteered to assist in the office throughout the Sporting and Skeet Nationals, from the crack of dawn until well after dark every day.

It was very encouraging to see an increase in Junior participation this year the maximum numbers with 5 Juniors and 3 Sub Juniors. Todd Bender commented on the talent he saw among these young shooters. The Opening Ceremony on Wednesday 21 May was a very smart affair, with the Deputy Mayor Jan Hay officially declaring the shoot open, ably assisted by Todd Bender. Wagga Councillors Kevin Wales and Ken Klempke took on the judging of the Best Presented Team, which was tightly contested. A beautifully kitted Northern Territory team took out the honours.

Some works were able to be undertaken on the Grounds in the intervening six months, including the construction of the skeet safety fences.

An important new initiative, a dinner for the Skeet Hall of Fame and Adrian Cousens Medal was a great success, with 90 guests attending the Wagga RSL to see Reg Clarke inducted into the Hall of Fame, and Leigh Roberts take out the Adrian Cousens medal. The process of percentage calculation as shown in Rule 2.01 (h) (i) (ii) (iii) (iv) is to be used for determining grades in all graded disciplines, i.e. Trap, Skeet, Ball Trap, Sporting, Tower, ISSF Trap, ISSF Skeet, ISSF Double Trap. Temora visitor, Peter Rae, and Mick Connors shared C grade 23/25.

This top shooting set the scene for the Champion of Champions event comprising 25 targets Single Barrel, 25 Points Score and 25 Double Barrel.























A warm and still morning greeted the 30 or so shooters as they assembled in the clubhouse for the first day of the inaugural 2 day Caboolture Clay Target competition.

The early morning dew glistened on the freshly mown grass as welcoming music provided a background to the good natured ribbing as the shooters greeted each other and said their G'days during sign on.

With the 'eye opener' out of the way it was time to start the days 100 target event and the office staff were hunting for the red marker pen as a number of perfect 50's were handed in and by the lunchtime break it was obvious that things had settled down and people had got their skeet heads on!

However the excellent lunch provided was too much for some as the early high scores slipped away in a blaze of fluorescent disbelief. With shooters falling by the wayside it was a close run to the finish between Nick Aird and Laurie Sceresini for overall and as they began

The beauty of the handicap is of course that theoretically anybody can win it regardless of grade or experience and after the initial fifty targets there were some 13 shooters from across the grades lining up nervously in two squads for the shoot off.

But it was a deceptive low 6 that saw Nick leave the way open for Nigel who cleared the station and went on alone to complete the round unaware that upon clearing station 8 he took the handicap.

After another relaxing lunch it was onto the 'love it or hate it' doubles event and it went to a shoot off with Laurie Sceresini and his trusty Krieghoff shooting a commendable 65/68 against Nick Aird who dropped his 65th target of the event and allowed Laurie to claim the top spot.

With shooting over for the day it was time for the bar to open and the stories to begin while the office staff hastily prepared the results. With all the results in, bribes offered and threats made the results for the high gun prizes were as follows:

Overall Nick Aird with a tightly shot 221/225.

Loveable Laurie Sceresini won AA high gun with a superb 220/225.

Nigel Hughes will be finding room in his wife's trophy cabinet for his A grade trophy while the ever jovial Roy Shelvey shot well to win B grade high gun. C grade was awarded amidst a round of encouraging applause to young Josh Teague who showed many of the more seasoned shooters how to do it and looks like he could well become a force to be reckoned with.

Caboolture is rare. It is one of the few clubs where there is no snobbery between the disciplines and it is a testament to the members love for the sport of Clay target shooting in general and their desire to develop the Caboolture club itself that this shoot ran so smoothly.

Many people from the other disciplines gave up their own time in the days leading up to the weekend to help out with the preparation. There are not many clubs where you will see the DTL members helping prepare for a skeet shoot, a sporting member cutting the grass on the layouts or trap shooters helping out with the catering. Long may this spirit continue and grow within our sport and well done and thank you to all those who helped. Of course none of this would have been possible without the generous help of the sponsors and thanks go once again to John Reynolds for his continued and very generous sponsorship of the event and thanks also to the additional sponsorship from Nigel and Lorraine Hughes who sponsored some additional prizes and also supplied the 'Hughes high gun skeet trophy' for the overall high gun.

It was felt in hindsight that the shoot was held too close to Mothers day and that this was reflected in the number of shooters able to attend and so it has been suggested that next year it will move to the latter part of the year where there will be more opportunity for people to attend, perhaps as a pre-runner the State carnival – once a date has been confirmed it will be advertised on the website – www.cctc.com.au.





Due to the generosity and foresight of Sydney shooter, Colin Sim, Todd Bender was able to attend the ACTA Skeet Nationals held in May. I was fortunate to be able to attend the competition on one day for the purpose of interviewing Todd Bender.

Whilst I enjoyed shooting the odd round of skeet, having the opportunity to meet with Todd was certainly the highlight of the day. The interesting thing was, that before I had met with him, I felt that I already knew him. I have read all the articles that he has written for the English Clay Shooting Magazine. I have listened to CD's in the car which was a discussion between Todd Bender and Lanny Basham, I have watched his DVD's and I have visited his website www.bendershirma.com, so when I met him, I already had a picture in my mind what he would be like and for most parts I was right. What I didn't expect was that the man you see in the video's, in print, and on CD is exactly how he is in real life; with exception that in real life he projects what psychologist would refer to as "unconditional positive regard". Unconditional positive regard is what most of us get from our mothers: it the understanding that people are nice to you just because you are you. Unconditional positive regard is the main ingredient for effective teaching, coaching and therapy. Todd makes you feel good just by being in his presence. Bender described himself as a teacher and makes his living primarily from teaching.

Todd made some interesting observations about competing in Australia, and for someone who has not experienced shooting overseas I found his comments interesting. Firstly, he felt that here in Australia you are part of the competition all day: in the States the 100 targets would be shot in one visit and because they employ professional referees there is no requirement to stay on the ground. Todd said that he would have normally gone back to his motel room and had a rest before the shoot-off. He stated that what he saw as the problem with staying on the ground was the continual opportunity to interact with others, and talk about scores, missed targets, problem microphones, guns, etc. He understood that in Australia, because of the population, the carnival could not run any other way and in his own style he gave this a positive reframe by saying that "well I'll use the problems with the microphones to my advantage and let the problem bother the other shooters. I'll stay focused on the target."

The positive psychology movement is very big in America and is starting to gain momentum here. Being confident, composed and feeling competent in your ability are essential aspects to remaining positive. Regular readers will also remember that these are also essential characteristics for mental toughness. After talking with Todd, I was wondering is there a difference to being positive and being mentally tough? There is and it is very important: if you are just positive because you believe it is a good thing to be, then you will find failure difficult to deal with. However if being positive is a component of a wider mental state of being mentally tough then you will be able to bounce back when you have failures or setbacks. A good example of this was a comment Todd made about missing a target (actually it was the first target he had missed since the previous July). Todd's comment was that he was continually asked about this target, when in his mind the 100 targets that he shot in qualifying and the further hundred or so in the shoot off were more important. He saw the missed target as nothing more than a lapse of concentration and that it shouldn't be given any more importance than that.

What we were able to talk at length about was the use of mental skills as a necessary tool for being a good shot. Bender epitomized appropriate use of mental skills both in and out of competition. Regular readers of his columns in Clay Shooting will have a good understanding of the importance that he places on mental skills development. Having adequate technical skills, physical skills and mental skills are a necessary for success in any sport. His association with Lanny Basham, and the importance he places on mental skills was a very welcome testimony and an acknowledgment of the importance of mental skills training in sport.

One of the topics we covered was the use of visualization and mental rehearsal. Earlier this year I wrote an account of a tape I listened to by Bender and Basham: Bender talked about his use of imagery and mental rehearsal when shooting; he explained that before he walked onto the station, he relived the shot that he has done thousands of times before. When he steps onto the pad and settles himself, he then shoots the target(s) in his mind. Using visualization he hits the targets and therefore, his mind is already believing that he has done it. Leaving no time to develop self- doubt, he calls pull and shoots the target just as he did in his mind's eye seconds before.

Now the above is a good example of using mental rehearsal in shooting but Bender didn't stop there. He then explained that before he walks off the pad, he sees himself shoot the target again (just as he did in real life) to reinforce what he needs to do next time. This evaluation of his performance reinforces success and best practise and primes him up for further success. So armed with this knowledge and having watched him shoot a round, I asked him about the triggers that I had noticed as he was waiting to shoot, about to shoot and after he had shot. He looked surprised and asked, "What triggers?" What was interesting was that as I listed the things that I had noticed he would respond by saying; "no that was subconscious or that was conscious" There were clearly some things he was not sure that he was doing. What he did say was that these triggers were his way of bringing his confidence up to a level that would ensure success. This was necessary because to see the target (and thereby shoot it) everything else had to shut down. For Bender, getting control over that mental process, was essential for success.

When I asked about his visualization process, he directed me back to the work of Basham, whom through his mental management skills program, and stated that the before, during and after visualization/ mental rehearsal components helped stay in control, because it compartmentalized the sequence into a pre-load, action and post-load/ reinforcement phases. This reinforcement phase was essential in developing confidence and keeping him focused on the here and now. When asked, "How did you go from being a good club shot to being the current world leader?", he looked a bit taken surprised but after some thought felt that it was a combination of desire, dedication and sacrifice.

When I left Todd to go back out to shoot, I felt warm and satisfied and shoot two rounds of 24/25, quite content in the knowledge that I was able to concentrate for 48/50 targets, in a discipline I rarely shoot. I still read Bender's articles and from time to time visit his website: www.bendershirma.com , and with his permission will bring you some of his valuable insights from time to time, but now when I read his articles I feel that he is talking to me personally.

Again, I would like to thank Colin Sim for organising this opportunity for me as well as acknowledge Todd Bender's sponsors; Krieghoff and Briley.



The chart includes the presently known wins for each of the listed shooters, but is by no means complete. We need your help to complete our data base and will be calling for assistance over the next few months.
