GROUNDS COMMITTEE REPORT

This is the first of what will be regular reports to the membership from the committee now responsible for the development of your National Ground. I want to say from the outset that although many are negative towards the grounds as they exist and some to the idea of a National Ground in total, as long as it is ACTA policy to have the grounds we will give 100% to ensure its development and success.

The committee consists of Robert Nugent Chairman, Ron Traill, Peter Haley, Daryl Pasfield, David Howe, Dennis Harwood. Others may be seconded as required.

The committee members were elected in June of this year. The first task has been to review the safety templates in place. A shortfall had previously been found on our southern boundary and the previous executive had already began negotiations with council to extend our lease over the required area. This negotiation is ongoing but in the interim council has provided an overfiring rights agreement over the property.

We found a shortfall in the templates on traps 14 & 15 and immediately made arrangements to meet with the neighbour Mr. Rod Brown. A very cordial and enlightening meeting was held at the National Office between Nat Pres John Mack, Mr Brown, his son and myself. An overfiring right was agreed to and has since been signed by Mr. Brown.

We also found a shortfall on the eastern boundary. Overfiring rights have now been granted by the Wagga Pistol Club. Whilst as far as we can ascertain we are now totally legal as far as templates go, it is to be remembered that firing rights are granted at the leisure of the grantee and can be removed at any time. Therefore we will be continually looking at options to further secure the safety template area.

The committee has now moved to reviewing existing infrastructure on the grounds. We believe the most critical area that needs immediate improvement is the power supply. To this end we have budgeted \$40,000 to upgrade the existing 63amp supply to 200amp upgrade requires new transformer, switchboard and the installation of CT metering, as well as some further distribution work on the grounds. We have two of three quotes requested and hopefully the upgrade will be completed this year.

Power on the Gaza Strip may need to be supplied with a generator long term as distance is a problem, and it is only used twice a year. I would like to get landscaping to the stage where over the gully is affectionately known as the Gaza strip because it is exactly the opposite, like calling a redhead blue.

We were approached by Wagga Club with an offer to contribute towards the installation

of lighting on three layouts, and upgrade the kitchen in the old clubhouse. The committee felt these were worthy projects, especially the lights, and have agreed to contribute half the cost of both projects with Wagga to complete installation.

The committee has instigated a new working relationship with the Wagga club which we hope will give them more ownership as the "Host Club" and intend to work closely with them in the future to better progress development. We commend them on their offer to contribute to the cost of assets at the National ground.

Wagga club can apply for State govt funding towards ground development whereas the ACTA can not (as far as we know at the moment). We will be working closely with the Wagga club to source any available funding, and agreed that if it is available on a 50% basis we will contribute the half to match the govt funding.

Changes made to the relationship between the host club and the ACTA will now free up the grounds staff to put more effort into ground development and landscaping.

None of the committee members are in the Wagga area, and we believe the National Office is exactly that and shouldn't have daily input at the grounds, so we felt it necessary to have someone on the ground. To this end we have seconded Arthur Turner who will oversee day to day work at the grounds by ACTA staff. We thank Arthur for his kind offer to assist. This year's budget also includes an amount for new landscaping. This work may not be too obvious in the short term as much is needed in the way of underground water reticulation before we start planting madly.

Comparison is being arranged between cost of our own bore water and that of town water supply. Water restrictions have hampered progress on landscaping to date, and it appears from information supplied by Wagga Club that the bore may be able to sustain 6 fully grassed layouts.

I have heard many reports of offers made to the association to assist the progress at the grounds, which were never taken up. I don't know whether there is substance in these reports or not. If anybody can help in any way, let me know.

I would like to ask any members wishing to have any input, advice or offers of assistance, to contact me, preferably by email. bakaroma@hwy54.com.au

I am especially keen to co-opt someone willing to chase funding and sponsorship for the grounds eg backs of scorers chairs, layouts, BBQ areas, shade covers, tree plantings, earthworks, tradesite buildings, gardens etc the list is never-ending.



Psychological Skills for Shooting

HYPNOSIS FOR SPORT

Last month I examined the use of hypnosis in sport. This month I want to take a more detailed look at what happens when we are hypnotized. As a psychologist, I see hypnosis as a valuable tool for helping athletes enhance performance, deal with injury, and stay mentally tough.

Basically, for the athlete, hypnosis can be divided into two areas: self-hypnosis and hypnosis induced by a professional (psychologist, doctor or dentist). Both follow a four-phase approach for using hypnosis in sport.

The preparation phase involves preparing a person by finding out about their attitudes to hypnosis and what they expect of the process. This phase is very important because the misconceptions, doubts and myths regarding hypnosis have to be dispelled, so that athlete will feel comfortable and trusting because they understand the true nature of hypnosis. If the athlete has fears, anxieties or apprehensions about the process, then this will negatively affect the outcomes and limit the benefits of the process. It is in the preparatory phase that the hypnotherapist will do some suggestibility tests and exercises. These exercises are designed to see how suggestible the athlete will be and train the athlete to listen and follow the instructions of the hypnotherapist.

The second phase is the induction phase. There are a variety of induction techniques: eye-fixation or focused concentration, for example. There is a similarity between the methods used for inducing hypnosis and those used for relaxation.

In the third phase, according to Winter & Martin, is the performance phase. In this phase the person is sufficiently relaxed that he or she is in a state of hypnosis. The person will still be aware of the sounds and noises outside the room: actually their concentration is much more focused, so the nouses will sound clearer and louder. For the athlete, he or she is now in a stage of mind that the person is more likely to respond to suggestions such as "You can see your goals more and more clearly". The suggestions for athletes usually involve ego strengthening which focus on them feeling more confident, competent, composed and fearless. (Regular readers of this column will remember that these are the qualities of mental toughness). Where possible the suggestions should be positive and personally relevant to the athlete. For those people who use hypnosis for weight loss, or to quit smoking, for example; the suggestions involve getting the person to experience some change in feelings, attitudes, thoughts and reactions. It is essential that the suggestions in hypnosis are positive and ego-strengthening and not aversive and negative. Several years ago, I had a client who went to a hypnotherapist for treatment to give up smoking. The hypnotherapist (who was not a registered psychologist) gave the client suggestions that "he would feel bad about himself every time he had a cigarette." These suggestions meant that every time my client had a cigarette he would feel angry, depressed and guilty. After several months, his parents contacted me because the client, a young man in his twenties, was depressed and suicidal. It was necessary to re-induce a hypnotic state and to alter the suggestions so that the client did not feel bad about

himself, each time he had a cigarette. Coupled with strengthening his ego, I gave him suggestions that reduced his need to smoke. After only two sessions he was back to normal with respect to his attitude to life and after several months he gave up smoking because he no longer had a need to smoke.

The final phase is the re-alerting phase. This is the debriefing phase where the client is asked how the felt about the experience. It is usual that most people are surprised that they did not fall asleep and that they could still hear things. This is the time that questions can be answered.

According to Winter & Martin, the value of hypnosis, over many other techniques used in sport psychology is that it ca be used to change stored ideas, memories or felling more quickly and effectively than just talking about them.

Usually before I commence hypnosis with any of my clients, I give them a relaxation exercise to do as home work for a week or so before the hypnotherapy sessions begin.

The following technique is derived from hatha yoga and consists of allowing one muscle group to rest after another from the head down to the feet if sitting and the feet up to the head if lying down – whilst allying the process to an awareness of ones breath.

Begin by taking three deep breathes as you make yourself comfortable by placing your feet flat on the floor and your hands easily in your lap.

Gently let your eyes close and continue to take deep slow breathes. Listen for a moment to the sounds you can hear outside the room, then further inside to awareness of your physical position and the contact you make with the chair. Take a deeper breath, hold it for the count of four, then let it go very slowly, maybe to the count of eight. Then as you continue to breathe normally, pay attention to the muscles around your face: your forehead, your eyes, the muscles around your eyes, your cheeks, your mouth, your jaw, your neck and imagine any tension draining away through your shoulders, your arms, wrists, hands, thumbs and fingers.

Notice that your chest is relaxed, your back, your stomach, waist and pelvis. Pay attention to your thighs, stay with any tension you may find and then over the next out breath, imagine it draining away through your knees, through your calves, through your ankles, through you feet and into the floor; leaving you calm, relaxed and alert. Remain in this state for a few minutes before stretching and opening your eyes.

If you include mental rehearsal in your mental training program, doing it immediately after a relaxation session will make it more effective. The benefit of this relaxation exercise is to be mindful of your body in the here and now: if you can do that at rest then you will also be able to do it out on the tracks. And by staying in the present you will be able to focus on the target more successfully.

Two Major Carnivals at the West Australian Gun Club DTL & SKEET





Location: 151 kilometres north of Sydney





CONDITIONS OF ENTRY - NATIONAL OLYMPIC DISCIPLINE CHAMPIONSHIPS

- 1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.
 - **Note:** A fee of \$20 will be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.
- 2. Targets to be shot in brackets of 25 for Olympic Trap and ISSF Skeet with squads of 6 shooters. In Double Trap targets to be shot in brackets of 25 Pair (50 targets) with squads of 6 shooters.
- 3. Nominations to be received by 3pm the day prior to the beginning of an Event or such time as determined by the Tournament Director.
- 4. Shooter will be squadded as per ISSF rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director. Once squadding for an event has been completed, a shooter shall not be entitled to a refund if they withdraw.
- 5. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot the applicable event.
- 6. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may be penalised by the LOSS OF THREE TARGETS.
- 7. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 8. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each round. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest recorded.
- 9. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons designated to referee/score or line referee must fulfil their obligation to do so or have obtained the service of a suitable replacement that must be ready to take his place at the required time. In the event of the designated persons or their replacement not being ready to take their place at the required time, the person initially designated to fill the specific role may INCUR A PENALTY AS PERSCRIBED UNDER INTERNATIONAL RULES.
- 10. Setting and adjusting of traps is the sole responsibility of Shoot Management. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap may will be penalised up to **FIVE (5) TARGETS**.
- 11. All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- 12. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 13. When team selection is involved, shooters are eligible for section nominated. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.
- 14. High Gun awards are determined for each section. To be eligible for the High Gun recognition, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events for each respective High Gun.
- 15. Women shooters are eligible for their section only. Junior shooters are eligible for their section and grade only.
- 16. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behaviour of card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 17. The ISSF Rules will be used to determine the OA placing in all events.
- 18. Juniors to be under the age of 21 in the year of competition.
- 19. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.
- 20. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors Tournament Director to adjudicate.

NSW Members and Dealers

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless: (a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

- (a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

Dear Your Say

My articles published in our magazine over the past years (It's your Call by Bill McCarthy) are coming to a close. I am most appreciative of the many telephone calls I received for rules interpretations over that period and for information provided on unusual situations experienced by shooters over the period. Each week I received many calls on a variety of subjects. However, the most prevalent question and or complaint was in relation to compulsory downgrading.

There is a formal process established by our executive committee through which rule changes are made. Compulsory downgrading has just been formally discussed in accordance with these procedures and your Executive has had no alternative other than accept the verdict of your state Rules Supervisors who attended the meeting. Because of the number of concerns expressed to me, I have wondered if you, the shooter, have taken the time to address your concerns on the matter through your respective Rules Supervisors. In fact, I am aware that 2 states (there may be others) are in favour of returning to the previous system.

Because of the inordinate number of concerns expressed to me, I believe that the direct opinion of the shooters should be sought through some sort of pole or plebiscite. This could be done with a simple yes/no segment on the annual registration form. Then and only then, will we be able to determine the correct feelings of shooters on this matter. I believe the concerns being expressed are serious enough to justify these measures.

Similarly, I have noted great concern expressed by shooters in relation to the rule changes effective on 1 August, especially in regard to Rule 2.01(i) which now allows AA Grade shooters to be downgraded to B and C grades. Is this really what the shooters have indicated?

An explanation given to me was that the existing Rule 2.01(i) was at variance with existing Rules. Ok, but what about other Rules which relate to safety etc. eg It is no longer a requirement for a shooter to notify the Referee if and when he is using a trigger release gun, Who took this rule out and on what authority? Yet again we seem to have modified our malfunctions rule to exclude (by omission) cartridges. These rules, plus many others that have been notified to the Executive, have not been addressed in the same manner as our latest effort.

One can only assume that we, the shooters have not made our feelings felt through the proper channels and that we have shown a very obvious disinterest in communicating our real thoughts to the Executive bodies concerned.

Dear Your Say Optimistic Member

Before expressing my view and asking a couple of questions that incidentally I believe a number of members would have been asking themselves recently. Initially I must say that I am optimistic about the future our sport being still available for us to enjoy in the next five to ten years. My main reasons for this

will be determined by three possible scenarios in no particular order.

- 1. The case of not if but when a major injury is sustained to a participant through poor safety standards through the lack of precautionary measures being taken.
- 2. The withdrawal of government support and this not isolated to their financial support.
- Self destruction of our own association from within the membership base from the top level to the grassroots level of our sport.

Now for my view:

My view as to why our clubs and sport nationally will always be restricted from achieving their optimum goals is a personal one and my prime reasons are, I myself have never become involved in clubs other than a fully paid up member is, there is always far too much politics and personality conflict. I enjoy my shooting far too much to become involved in this conflict and not only see it as a wasted emotion but have very little patience with all of the above and until I see a change in this behavior, it would be best that I maintained my current status. I do hope that I could become more actively involved in the future not just particularly at club level with our sport.

Now for my questions:

My questions are for the National Executive:-

Is it true as stated previously in the July magazine that Skeet rules are sometimes changed to comply with NSSA Rules when it comes to safety and the reputation of our sport in Australia? Should these rules not take into account firstly what is reflective and best for our own backyard in the first instance with regards to safety?


What is the process outside the national executive that is followed prior to making changes to the rules? For example are State Associations and or delegates communicated with seeking their advice or views prior to changes being implemented?

From a membership point of view what is process that is in place at an association level that dictates whether a member's letter is published or not other than as a result of the volume the national office may receive?

In conclusion I wish to advise that this is my first ever letter written to the Association and in no way should it be taken personally by any individual, club or our national association as my reasons for writing is that instead on continuing to wonder about what the answers might be or assume or listen to innuendo I thought it best to have my say by expressing my views and seek the correct answers to my questions from the national body elected in charge.
