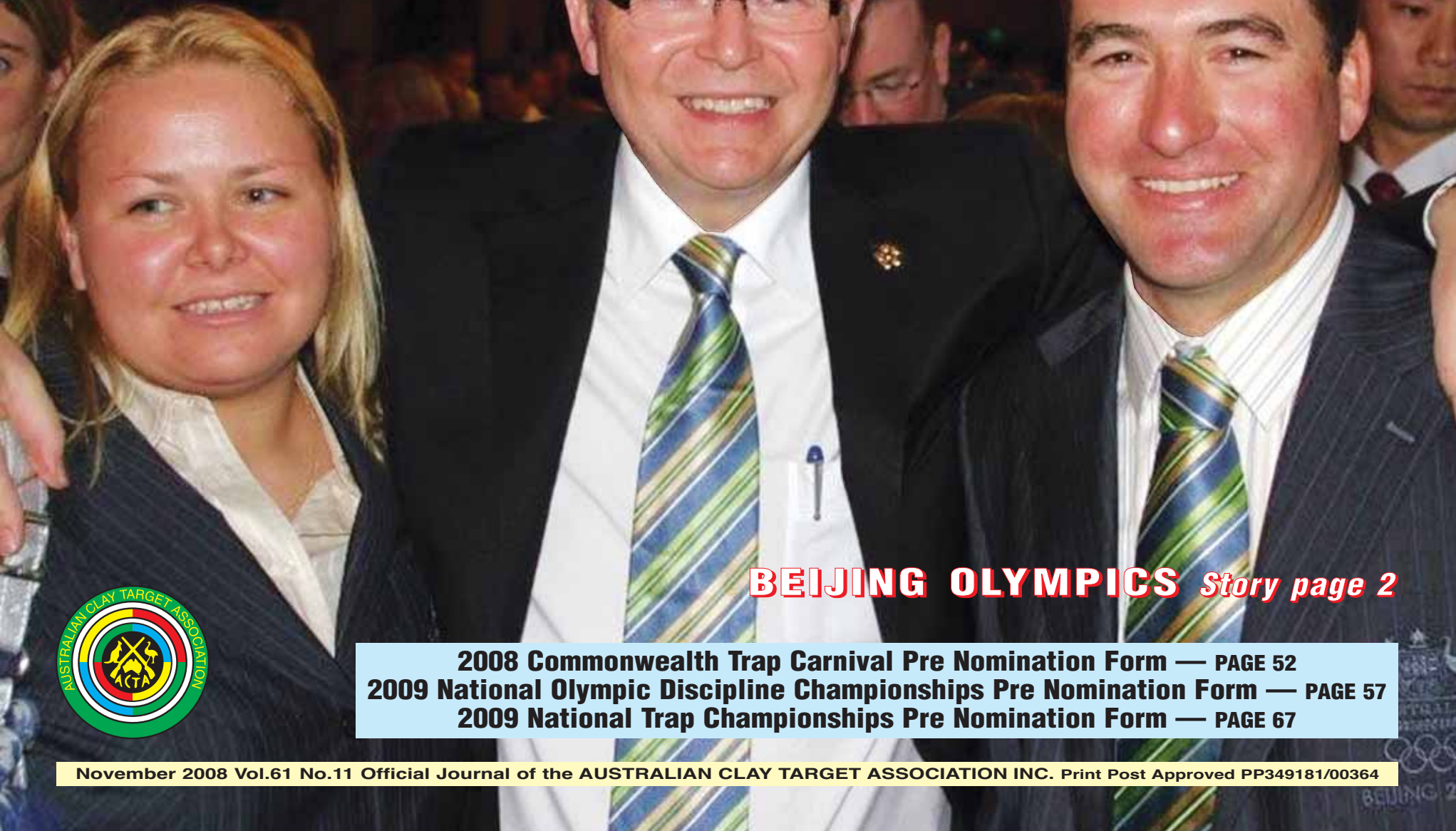

BEIJING 2008 - THE OLYMPICS

One World One Dream



Australian Team - missing Paul Rahman & Bruce Quick

For most the journey started many years ago, culminating in a chance to match skills with the world's best on what is surely the best Olympic shooting venue to date. With the shooting events over, it would become time to reflect on preparation and execution of the plans for competitors, officials and administrators alike.

The Australian Olympic team comprised a total of 435 athletes and 318 support staff, most of who were based in the village, with the shooting section of 17 athletes and 5 support staff occupying all but three of the beds of the four apartments on the top floor, of what was to become home for the duration, Tower 1 of Block D8. The other three beds were home to the weightlifting section of Deborah Lovely, Damon Kelly and Section manager Luke Borregine. Among those of the team that had been to previous Olympics consensus was that this was the best village since Barcelona, with the Australian Olympic

Committee having selected blocks D8 and D4 (six and nine story buildings respectively) because of their proximity to services such as the food hall and transport mall.

Also close was one of the Super Resident's Centres, which hosted an internet cafe fitted out with 50 computers all with Skype and an adjacent Wi-Fi lounge, all at no cost so you can imagine how busy these became as the village filled.

An overview of the numbers and other bits of information shows there were 28 sports breaking down to 302 events with some Athletes 10,708, Volunteers 70,000, Media 20,000. Beijing Comp Venues: 31, Outside Comp Venues 6.

The Logo Dancing Beijing is a Chinese seal, the Slogan One World One Dream, Mascots Beibei (blue Fish), Jingjing (black Panda), Huanhuan (red Flame), Yingying (yellow Antelope) and Nini (green Swallow). Their five names together Bei Jing Huan Ying Ni say welcome to Beijing.

I had, along with a number of other managers, gone in ahead of their sections to ensure that we had supplied the correct paperwork and to arrange final accommodation layouts, leaving the coaches to travel with the section. The information from the AOC and Beijing newsletters we had compiled via the office all helped ensure a relatively smooth arrival, with of course the shooting section being the last to clear customs. There were no problems encountered with firearms or ammunition, thanks to a well prepared procedure; it just remains a slow process but then patience is a virtue and a must in our sport.

For all but two of our section the arrival at the shooting venue was no surprise, having seen and shot at the test event in April this year so there were no surprises here and everyone quickly settled into the routine.

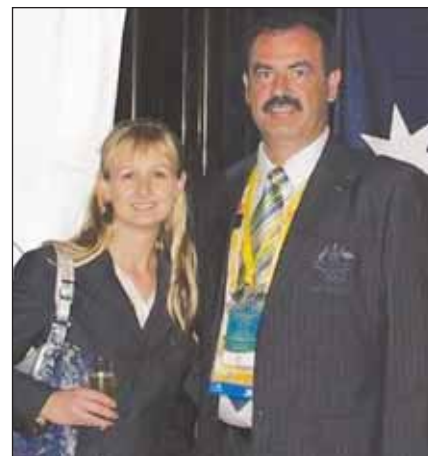
Security was tight but not restrictive with

several visible levels ranging from security guards to SWAT teams at every entrance to the village and venues providing a level of comfort to all. Initially these people maintained a steadfast glare if you said hello to them but over the week this was relaxed to a smile with some actually taking the opportunity to return the acknowledgement as they learnt to feel their way around the Australian's warmth.

The food hall at the village catered for most palates and supplied a variety of foods 24hours, 7 days a week. Seating some 5000 people at once with virtually no queues at any of the counters, other than the McDonalds coffee counter. Yes that's right, Maccas was there with up to 30 staff operating shifts over the 24 hours and without doubt the world agrees on one thing Maccas coffee was the best in the village. The chicken salad (from Maccas) was taken to the range for lunch and again proved to be popular amongst most teams. In all, the food was good and for those seeking a nutritional delight there was plenty.

The opening ceremony saw a handful of the section march as most stayed away to avoid a long drawn out night prior to competition and whilst the magic of the march and opening ceremony cannot be denied it is a draining time standing around for hours (about 7 in all) on end waiting to march and particularly in the Beijing heat. If you missed the lighting of the cauldron then you missed an experience. The fireworks display looked good on the replays but it was almost out of view from our standing area in the centre of the Birdsnest.

Competition saw a mixed result for the Aussies with only one of the favoured three finishing in the medals. Congratulations go to Warren Potent on his bronze medal in the 50m Rifle Prone event a well deserved finish to a brilliant two years of shooting better than an average of 596. Michael Diamond finished in fourth position after a cliff hangar of a finals shoot off for the bronze and Lalita Yauhleuskaya finished one point away from the finals back in 14th. Russell Mark fought back to also finish 5th in the finals. The results are available on the web site so I will not elaborate further.

However overall Australia finished 6th overall on the medal tally with a total of 46 medals comprised of 14 Gold, 15 Silver and 17 Bronze. 81 countries won medals with the first five being China, USA, Russia, Great Britain and Germany.

The popularity of the shopping in Beijing along with safe streets proved to be a great attraction for many of the section with some buying enough to open their own store, well at least by looking at someone's bags you would think so, eh Nat? for some though,

the attraction was simply the opportunity to haggle for a great bargain. I feel sure many will remember the words "I your friend", and "you my first customer" with much amusement.

Obviously in a city with the population of Australia there are restaurants, theatres, bars, nightclubs and much history to see. Taxis were cheap and although none of the drivers spoke or understood English the guides produced by the Australian Olympic Committee with the addresses of most attractions printed in Chinese, eased the pain. By the 17th August, half the team had departed for home, enabling our section to reduce down to three units along with the two weight lifters.

Most nights were taken up with visits to watch other Australian sections competing and for those who remained they will well remember the famous Laurie Lawrence visit to the Australia vs USA men's basketball game, a new record for Laurie two busloads.

And before you knew it the closing ceremony had rolled around, less formal than the opening but still much standing around; back to the village where an all night celebration was in full swing in front of the Australian HQ, then onto the buses and back to the airport and the usual paperwork for the firearms. The flight back was uneventful with the lead plane having no entertainment system working which coupled with the no alcohol on the plane policy saw a relatively quiet time (thankfully) for all to rest prior to the arrival in Sydney.

Highlights for me in no particular order were, The roar of the crowd whilst marching into the opening ceremony and the visual effect as you entered, Warren Potent's Bronze medal and in particular his final. The final of Men's trap where 4 of the 6 finalists had either shot or equalled a world or

Olympic record with David Kostelecky of Czech republic setting a new Finals Olympic record 121+25=146 coupled with Michael's shoot off for the bronze so close.

Katerina Eamons (formerly Kurkova) World and Olympic record in the Women's 10m Air Rifle, an opportunity to meet the Chinese people and understand their culture, being able to work with some dedicated athletes, the logistics involved, the trip home (only to return four days later with the Paralympic Team).

The low points were obviously the lack of medals, but more so the scores achieved by some, the retirement from active competition of Dina Aspandiyarova, who in her words had failed to conquer her fear of winning and subsequently her belief she had let everyone down by not medalling. Uncompromising.

PROPOSED RULE CHANGES TO STATE ASSOCIATIONS AND STATE RULES SUPERVISORS

RULE 2.02 Handicapping Formula – Amend (B) to read: 'Minimum handicap marks for graded shooters, other than AA Grade, shall be 15 metres. The minimum handicap mark for AA grade shooters, shall be 21 metres.'

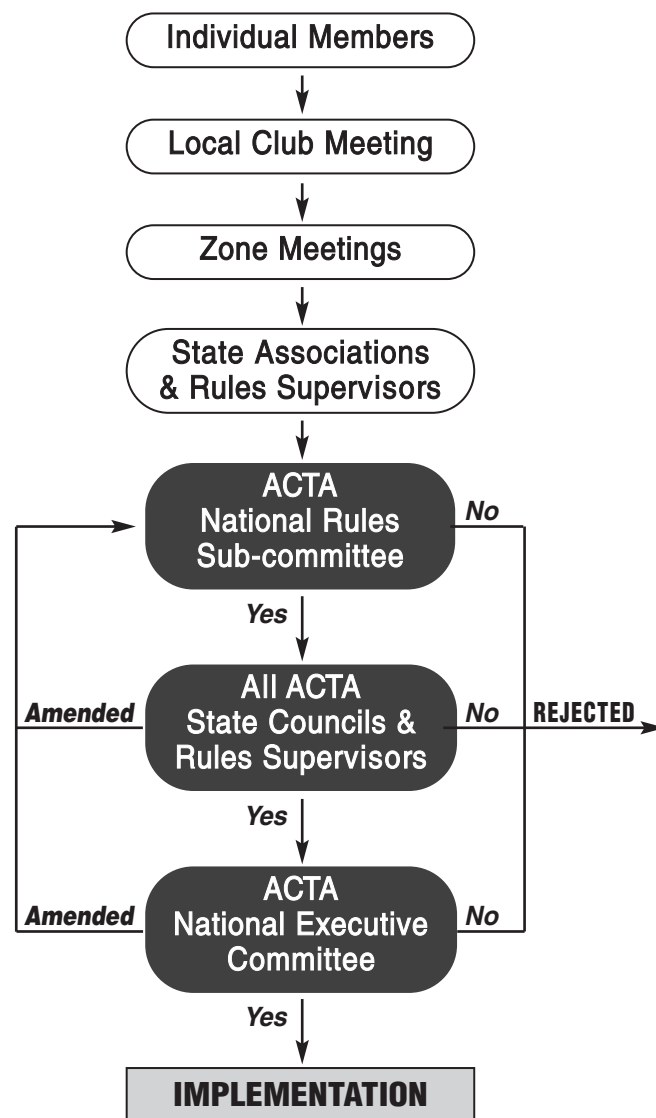
RULE 2.03 Inward Movement (a) be amended to read 'A one (1) metre inward movement may apply if a shooters recorded percentage is less than 90% for 3 consecutive groups of 100 targets. An inward one (1) metre movement can only once occur in any twelve month period. (b) Delete sentence totally (c) Item (c) then becomes (b)'

YOUR RULES RULE CHANGES—HOW THE PROCESS WORKS

Each individual member of our association has the opportunity to have a say into rules and rule changes. You will need to discuss these with your club and if they agree their delegates will take that request to your zone where they will be accepted or rejected. If accepted the zone delegates would take the request to the state executive and state rules supervisors where they may be rejected or recommended to the national rules sub-committee. The rules sub-committee will then send the request to the rules supervisors in all states for their recommendation or rejection. At this point the rule may be accepted by the sub-committee and put to a vote of the national executive committee where it can be accepted, rejected or amended. If amended the rule would then go through the rule process again.

Three local clay shooters, Clive Foster, Narelle Ambrose and Mitch Brown have gained selection in the Central Zone Trap Team to shoot at the NSW State Clay Target Trap Championship to be held in Wagga Wagga during October.

The Central Zone Trap Carnival was hosted by the West Wyalong Clay Target Club on the last Sunday in August and there were in excess of sixty shooters in attendance, including some of Australia's top guns. AA grade High Gun winner Stephen Guest has only recently returned from the World Championship in Ireland where he had placed seventh overall.

Practice and cash divide events were organised for Saturday afternoon and four squads of shooters were marshalled under overcast conditions.

Scores were good during the afternoon and there was a lot of discussion about who would turn up on Sunday and who would be likely winners.

Shooting on Sunday began promptly at 9.00am in the Central Zone 50 Target Points Score under windy conditions with the threat of rain and this affected the scores as no one was able to shoot a 150/150 possible in the event.

Stephen Guest won a short shoot off against Condo shooter Dave Cooney to take overall.

Local shooters, Clive Foster was second in AA grade 148/150 and Nick Connors second in C grade 142/150.

As the second wave of shooters were called for the Central Zone 25 Target Single Barrel Championship the rain came down and again conditions played a part in the final scores as targets dipped and dived in the wind.

Champion lady shooter, Kathy Gault won the overall sash after a short shoot off with Allan Drogemuller 25/25 + 4/4.

Clive Foster was the only local shooter to feature in the single barrel results winning AA grade 24/25 + 11/11.

Scuds of rain and the wind continued throughout the morning but scores improved in the Central Zone 50 Target Double Barrel Championship and there were three squads of shooters who had scored 50/50 and called to shoot off to decide the event.

Local hopes were on Len Lord, Dozer Collins, Clive Foster and Condo shooter Pico Fyfe. Pico was the only one to kick on but was no match for the eventual winner Allan Drogemuller 50/50 + 46/46. Pico ended up first in A grade with 50/50 + 32/33.

Len Lord was second in B grade 50/50 and Narelle Ambrose gained second in C grade 47/50 behind Michael Fyfe 48/50.

The shooting finished in good time for the travellers and Zone President, John Finn had plenty of time in which to make comments and present the handsome green and gold sashes to the various winners.

John commented on the enormous amount of work that had gone into making the day a success and described the West Wyalong Clay Target Club as a hard working club. He also commented on the great organisation in the office by Zone Secretary, Joy Dwight who was ably assisted by a tireless Bruce Dent.

The afternoon tea was a huge spread and the ladies did a wonderful job with the catering.

John went on to make the presentation of sashes and trophies and announce the Central Zone Team.

Stephen Guest won the AA grade High Gun 222/225 and Pico Fyfe, in fine form, finished with the A grade High Gun sash 220/225.

Clive Foster was named in the Open Central Zone Team along with Condo members Dave Cooney and Pico Fyfe. Narelle Ambrose

was selected in the Ladies Team and Mitch Brown in the Junior Team.

Clive was also Open Team High Gun winner and Narelle won the Ladies Team High Gun.

6.30pm Friday evening and shooting commenced with 97 shooters contesting the 30 Target Far Western District Cobar Bowling and Golf Club Night Point Score Championship. 6 possibles were shot with Sam Clifford being the eventual overall winner with 165/165. 1st in AA Grade Jack Colliccoat 161/162, 1st A Grade Rhys Eeles 164/165, 1st B Grade John Polack 86/90 and 1st C Grade Rex Tynan 85/90.

Saturday dawned cloudy and cold, not your usual Cobar weather but at least it did not rain. 155 shooters nominated Saturday for the 3rd event the 30 target Western Zone Beretta Australia Point Score Championship. There were 9 possibles shot. Cobar Club President, Bryan Manns won the shoot off with a score of 186/186, Sox Pilipasidis 1st AA Grade 185/186 and Neville Owen 2nd AA Grade 116/117. Event 4 was the 45 target Harvey Norman Medley. 3 possibles were shot and Ross Walsh was the winner with 125/125, Rob Thompson 1st in AA Grade with 124/125. Event 5 was the

England, Scotland, Ireland, Wales and Australia have competed each year since 1939.

New Zealand entered the competition in 1952, Canada entered the competition in 1957 and Northern Ireland and South Africa have been included since. Zimbabwe has also competed at times.

The match has been conducted each year since 1939 excepting the war years of 1940 – 1947.



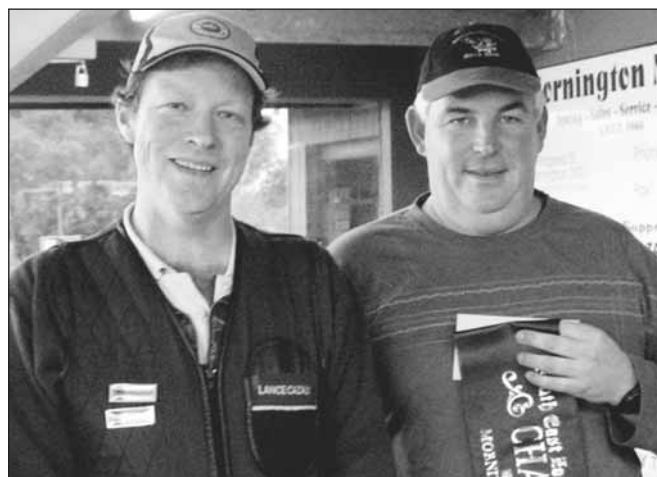

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

Psychological Skills for Shooting

by Michael Kruger-Davis

HYPNOSIS FOR SPORT

Over the past two months I have examined the use of hypnosis in sport and it's usefulness for keeping athletes focused in the here and now. At the end of the last issue I finished with a simple relaxation exercise that I would ask clients and athletes to do as homework before we begin our sessions.

This month I want to take the exercise on step further and reprint a basic relaxation script from Gordon Milne's *Hypnosis and the Art of Self-Therapy*.

This script can be put onto a tape (but remember do not play it in a car whilst driving). The idea of hypno-relaxation is to remember the script so that you can practise whenever you need to. Remember to breathe deeply because shallow or rapid breathing must be avoided as this sort of breathing is associated with anxiety.

This is a basic script for relaxation: the . . . mean to wait two or three seconds. (5) means to wait five seconds and a comma means to pause for one second. Find a quiet place where you can relax for approximately 45 minutes. The chair should be comfortable or you can lie on the floor. You should avoid your bed unless you are using this technique to treat insomnia.

1. Gently close your eyes . . . settle back comfortably . . . feet together, hands resting on the sides of the chair or on your thighs (5).
2. Take a deep breath and hold it (5). Let go the breath and feel yourself letting go the tension as you breathe out.
3. Again . . . deep breath and hold it(5). Let go the breath and feel yourself letting go the tension as you breathe out.
4. In a moment I am going to say five relaxing phases . . . as I say each phase slowly . . . breathe in deeply . . . then as you breathe out repeat the phrase slowly . . . not aloud, just think it in your mind as you breathe out . . .
5. Letting go the tension now (5). Unwinding now, as I breathe out (5). Feeling the calm and the relaxation (5), flowing all through my mind and body (5). Relaxing all over (5)
6. Once more (repeat).
7. And I want you to notice that each time you breathe out, you become more and more completely relaxed over your whole body . . .
8. Just take a minute taking deep breaths and saying "letting go of the tension" as you breathe out. Start now (60)
9. Good now focus your whole attention on your body where it is lying (5) Feel how comfortable it is, from your toes . . . to your scalp.
10. Just think of nothing else but how your body feels at this moment (5) If your attention wanders bring it straight back to your body's feelings (5)
11. And once more I want you to notice each time you breathe out, you become more and more completely relaxed over your whole body . . .
12. Deep breath now, and hold it (5) say to yourself as you breathe out "letting go of the tension" (5) And now repeat this over and over for one minute, until I stop you (60)
13. Now focus your attention on your legs . . . from your toes to your thighs . . . just let it happen on its own . . . first your toes . . . and a nice, calm, soothing relaxed feeling is beginning in your toes . . . and moving into your feet (5)
14. From your feet, past your ankles . . . into your legs (5) past your knees . . . into your thighs(10)
15. A numb, heavy wooden like feeling is moving up from your toes . . . into your feet (5), past your ankles and into your legs . . . and into your thighs (5)
16. Just let all those muscles in your legs go completely limp, relaxed and numb(5) – the same sort of feeling you get if you sit cross legged for very long(5) a numb heavy wooden like feeling . . . your legs are so heavy they are sinking right down where you are resting (10)

17. Now I want you to notice the same feeling moving from your thighs into your body . . . into your abdomen(5), into your chest v, your back (5). Just let all those muscles in your chest, your back, and your abdomen go completely limp and relaxed (10)
18. It may be a very heavy, numb feeling . . . or a floating feeling . . . or it may be a heavy and a floating feeling (5) Your subconsciousness mind will decide which feeling you should have (10). Good.
19. Now think of your face and forehead (5), and feel your face and forehead smooth out with relaxation (5) as the tension flows out . . . and the relaxation flows in to take its place. (10)
20. The muscles around your eyes(5) and around your mouth (5) – let them relax(10)And let the muscles in your jaw feel limp and loose as your lips part slightly as the tension lets go. (10)
21. The relaxation spreads from your forehead(5), through your scalp(5), to the back of your neck, where so much tension gathers . . . and feel the back of your neck go limp and soft and loose as the muscles let go and the tension flows out. (10)
22. The shoulder muscles too . . . let them go limp(5)That numb wooden like feeling spreading down your arms from your shoulders to your fingers . . . your arms feel like dead weights where they are resting (5), so much you doubt whether you could move them . . . but you don't want to move them (5), A heavy detached feeling is in your arms . . . as if you've been sleeping on them (10).
23. Now I'm going to count from 1 to 20 . . . and as I count . . . each time I count . . . I want you to let yourself sink more and more deeply into this nice relaxed state . . .
24. 1 . . . deeper and deeper . . . 2 . . . more and more calmly relaxed . . . 3 . . . nicely, deeply now . . . 4 . . . 5 . . . sinking deeper and deeper . . . 6 . . . 7 . . . 8 . . . 9 . . . 10 . . . half way there . . . so relaxed that nothing can disturb you . . . 11 . . . 12 . . . 13 . . . 14 . . . 15 . . . going down to a deeper, tranquil state of mind . . . 16 . . . 17 . . . 18 . . . 19 . . . 20 . . .
25. Completely relaxed now . . . eyes so heavy you don't think you can open them . . . just feel your whole body thoroughly and completely relaxed, its so calm, so peaceful to remain in this nice, relaxed state.
26. Just remain in this nice, quiet state until I speak to you again. (60)

Dehypnotising script: In a few moments I'm going to count backwards from 20 to 1. As I do you will gradually return to your normal state feeling . . . losing numbness, heaviness, or any other unusual feeling . . . your mind will return to it's normal alert contact with the outside world . . . On the count of 3 your eyes will begin to open . . . on the count of 1 your eyes will be wide open and you will feel GOOD . . . calm, relaxed, and confident. Ready now . . . 20, 19, 18, etc . . . 3, 2, 1. Feel good now calm and alert.

This is the basic script and what would follow would be a guided imagery script and an ego-strengthening script. Together the three make a complete hypnosis or self-hypnosis package. Next month I will conclude the look at hypnosis in sport by describing the guided imagery and ego-strengthening scripts.

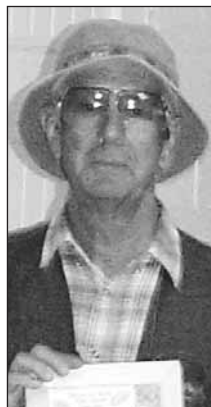

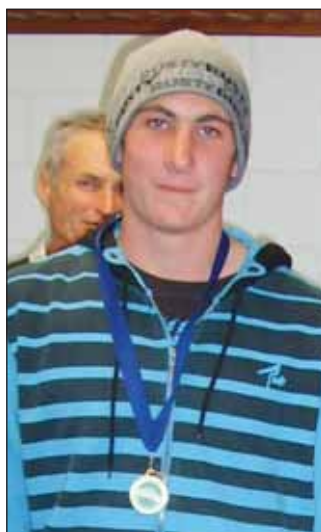

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY – NATIONAL OLYMPIC DISCIPLINE CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.
Note: A fee of \$20 will be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.
2. Targets to be shot in brackets of 25 for Olympic Trap and ISSF Skeet with squads of 6 shooters. In Double Trap targets to be shot in brackets of 25 Pair (50 targets) with squads of 6 shooters.
3. Nominations to be received by 3pm the day prior to the beginning of an Event or such time as determined by the Tournament Director.
4. Shooter will be squadded as per ISSF rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director. Once squadding for an event has been completed, a shooter shall not be entitled to a refund if they withdraw.
5. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot the applicable event.
6. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may be penalised by the **LOSS OF THREE TARGETS**.
7. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
8. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each round. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest recorded.
9. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons designated to referee/score or line referee must fulfil their obligation to do so or have obtained the service of a suitable replacement that must be ready to take his place at the required time. In the event of the designated persons or their replacement not being ready to take their place at the required time, the person initially designated to fill the specific role may **INCUR A PENALTY AS PERSCRIBED UNDER INTERNATIONAL RULES**.
10. Setting and adjusting of traps is the sole responsibility of Shoot Management. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap may will be penalised up to **FIVE (5) TARGETS**.
11. All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
12. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
13. When team selection is involved, shooters are eligible for section nominated. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.
14. High Gun awards are determined for each section. To be eligible for the High Gun recognition, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events for each respective High Gun.
15. Women shooters are eligible for their section only. Junior shooters are eligible for their section and grade only.
16. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behaviour of card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.
17. The ISSF Rules will be used to determine the OA placing in all events.
18. Juniors to be under the age of 21 in the year of competition.
19. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.
20. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors - Tournament Director to adjudicate.

Dear Your Say

Sign-In Technology at Your Club

Many of us use computerised scoring systems for running shoots, be it the commercially available Clay2000 or one of many spreadsheet-based scoring systems developed by enterprising individuals. The use of computers need not only relate to scoring systems though, and this letter introduces a system that has been implemented at the Gold Coast CTC for streamlining statutory range sign-in procedures.

I'll be the first to admit that computerised systems aren't suitable for many clubs, and may not be suitable for yours. Larger clubs or clubs hosting large shoots may find this interesting though, and I'd encourage you to read on.

During the early part of 2007 the Gold Coast CTC decided to implement a computerised range sign-in register. The system was developed and eventually approved for use (at the Gold Coast Club) by Queensland Police later that year, and first used at the Christmas shoot on the 9th of December.

Members of the club are issued with a membership card that has a magnetic stripe (like your bank card), and as a backup a printed barcode (like everything you buy at the supermarket). Both these are computer-readable, and contain your ACTA membership number.

Did you know: Your ACTA membership book actually has this same barcode on the front cover!

The sign-in process for any ACTA member (be they from the Gold Coast club or otherwise) has been reduced to this:

The shooter presents their license to the range officer. This is a statutory requirement, and cannot be avoided.

While the range officer is checking the validity and expiry date of the license, the shooter swipes their membership card or barcodes their ACTA book. All their known details including the firearms licence number, categories of weapons, name and home club are retrieved and displayed. The range officer validates the details are still current. For first-timers the license number and weapons categories are not known and are entered into the system by the range officer. Data from the ACTA membership database is used to automatically lookup the shooters name and home club. The time and date are automatically recorded.

The shooter signs a digital tablet with a special pen (similar to signing for credit card payments at many supermarket checkouts). Signing a register is also a statutory requirement and cannot be avoided.

The whole process takes about 10 seconds per shooter. That's right only 10 seconds. Of course first-time visitors need a little longer while the license number and weapons categories are entered into the system, but this is a minor one-time cost. Most of our shooters are repeat customers and are now in the system, so the majority of sign-ins is very quick.

Like anything new there was some patience and education required,

however almost a year later I am pleased to say that all our regular members and visitors are not only using the system but prefer it over having to enter all of their details on the paper register every visit. This preference has nothing to do with the fact that it uses a computer – it's simply because it's much quicker and more convenient for everyone involved.

The system operates in parallel with the familiar paper range register, and shooters who are not from the ACTA, or people who just prefer to, still use the paper system. At the end of the day a printout is generated from the computer system which looks much like the paper register anyway, and is stapled together with any paper entries for the clubs records.

There are several things to consider for clubs wishing to implement this or a similar system:

Approval – this was the most time-consuming element. Weapons Licensing was very thorough in ensuring that the system met all of the statutory requirements. The system is currently approved for via a special condition in the Gold Coast Range License, so individual approval would be needed for each club.

Computer Hardware Costs – The system uses a barcode reader and/or magnetic stripe reader to read the ACTA number. This can also be entered manually, but that's slow. The system also uses a printer (required), two screens so that the range officer can stand on one side of the kiosk and the shooter on the other, and a digital tablet for signing. The club spent approximately \$800 on hardware to setup the system on a very simple computer that was donated.

Membership cards / barcodes. Cards cost about \$3 each from a local supplier. These are not strictly required since shooters can use their ACTA membership books and the barcode on them. The club decided to implement membership cards as the magnetic stripe reader is easier and more familiar to use than the barcode, and it's more convenient to keep a credit-card sized membership card in your wallet than your ACTA book. This is particularly the case on practice days when shooters rarely bring their ACTA books. Extra barcode labels can also be printed onto a special label printer by the system, and these can be stuck to anything you might carry in your wallet for even more convenience.

Alternatively, contact me if you have any questions or are interested in trying it out. I have developed this software myself, and am happy to give it away (without warranty) to any interested clubs and provide advice and assistance with setting it up.

The War was reaching their doorstep when he was twelve years old, which brought about the reality of what he was about to face. In 1945 during the war Steve's dad was one of the many businessmen forced to work on repairing of the damaged railway bridges. Steve was expected to do the same when he finished school, but his mother had other plans for him. He escaped to Germany, where he worked in a refugee camp as an electrician for a short time. After this ordeal he boarded the S.S. Roma in 1950 bound for Australia. After arriving in Australia his first job was at the Mount Cootha Quarry where he worked for approximately 18 months. He then moved to Stanthorpe where he got work at Wallangarra repairing army vehicles. Being Steve he decided he'd like a change. He worked for a couple of other people, before buying the church ground in Railway Street Stanthorpe, where he built his engineering business, specialising in repairing diesel engines, motors of all types, and building cold stores.

Steve was not a person to let the grass grow under his feet, consequently he was one of the first to become a member of the Pistol Shooting and Clay Target Clubs in Stanthorpe, where he remained a dedicated member for many years. He was to win many first, second and third prize placings in both sports. He also enjoyed racing motor-bikes, and speed boats. He dreamed of putting a jet engine into his boat one day, and had actually purchased one, but unfortunately never got around to installing it. Water skiing at Coolumunda Dam was another of his favourite past times. From time to time he loved to go fishing, especially with his family in tow.

On September 9 1984 he suffered a severe stroke, which nearly cost him his life, leaving him paralysed down one side, and unable to talk. Through sheer determination he learnt to walk and talk again and was able to get back to work, where he continued on his business as before.

Steve and Alison, were married in December 1984. Their first child, Vivien, was born the following June, and Andrew followed two years later. After living in Mackenzie Street for six years, the family decided to move closer to town, to make everything more accessible.

Shortly after settling in, Steve started making changes to the house. Due to his everyday work commitments, many of his house restoration projects, either took a long time or were never completed. Steve had many passions in life, one of which was wine making, which he perfected over time. He would often get Vivien and Andrew to help crush and press the grapes. It became a family affair. Due to the vast amount of wine on the premises he regularly invited friends over for a drink, and enjoyed telling them his so called "True Stories". He would take people down to see his cellar to show them his latest gadgets to assist in his wine making process.

After fifty years of working, Steve decided to call it a day, selling his workshop. He was then able to contemplate retirement, but not before having the daunting task of clearing the shed, that he had many years before, set up for his engineering business. He was especially grateful to his friends who helped him with this onerous task. It should be mentioned here that Steve never really got around to retiring. If anything ever needed some skilful manipulation, so far as engineering works were concerned, they knew they could rely on Steve to come up with a solution.

In 2005, Steve had a knee replacement, which ultimately forced him to move from the high set house in Railway Street, to a more convenient and accessible one in Lock Street. Even though he was retired, he still enjoyed tinkering with bits and pieces to keep him occupied.

He was a man of many talents, beliefs and capabilities. He was a devoted husband, loving father, and loyal friend, however he was a stubborn, yet understanding person, who stood firmly for what he believed in. He was an inventor, creator, wine connoisseur, and a friend to anyone who needed help.

We will be sadly missed by all those near and dear to him. May he rest in peace.

ROBERT NOEL (NOEL) SMITH

About once a month in the off season, a dozen or so shooters would meet at Cooralyn Station, west of Ballandean, owned by a family friend Jan Elliott. The trap which releases the clay targets was set up behind large granite slabs.

From this humble beginning the Ballandean Gun Club was formed in August 1960 for the next fifteen years the Club used the grounds owned by Les Day at Lyra and later moved to its present position at Ballandean. Noel was the founding Secretary of the club, a position he held for the next 21 years. His brother Chub was President and their good friend Jack Lynam was Treasurer.

Under the leadership of these three men the Ballandean Gun Club was one of the most progressive clubs in Australia.

In 1979 Noel was made a life member of the Ballandean Gun Club for services rendered, and was truly proud to receive this honour and very proud of the achievements of the club.

Noel continued his shooting until the mid 1980's until his eyesight deteriorated. Noel won various Club and District shooting championships as well as State Walk-up Championship in 1966.

Clay target shooters honoured Noel by providing a guard of honour at his funeral.

Noel died at his home in Stanthorpe. He leaves his widow Marjorie, their three children Geoffrey, Noela and Gary, six grandchildren and two great-grandchildren.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY – NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.
Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
2. Squads of 6 to shoot 50 targets/75 targets in brackets of 25, one visit only to the traps. Squads of 6 to shoot 100 targets in brackets of 50, two visits to the traps. National Handicap event to be 5 (five) person squads, 5 (five) targets per lane.
3. Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
4. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/75 targets. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** may be incurred.
5. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination and will be re-squadded towards the end of the event.
6. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
7. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
8. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score may incur a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** may be incurred in the event concerned.
9. Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first round of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility may be penalised one target. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for they're failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.
10. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised **FIVE (5) TARGETS**.
11. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
12. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
13. Optional sweep/purse nominations shall be noted on a separate form from shooting nominations and are not refundable.
14. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
15. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall chose in which team they may be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
16. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade and section prize.
17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
18. Nominations will close daily at 11.00am or at the discretion of the Tournament Director.
19. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behaviour of the card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.
20. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
21. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
22. Reduced Nominations shall apply to Juniors and Sub-Juniors. Also partners' entering into the same event whose nomination is lodged at the same time as a member paying full nomination fees. Shooters paying reduced Noms are eligible for Overall, Grade and section prizes.
23. ***All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Trap Championships.***
24. Payment of the nomination fee only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not be eligible to any refund.
