

During the 8th World DTL championships held in Ireland last year the International Clay Target Shooting Federation (ICTSF) was formed. This organisation will be officially responsible for the World DTL, World Skeet, and World Sporting championships.

The founding countries are: Australia, England, France, Ireland, New Zealand, Northern Ireland, Scotland, South Africa, Sweden and Wales. The federations first president is Ewen Pirie, past president of New Zealand CTA, Ewen was elected unopposed with

The 1st World Skeet Championships will be held at Doveridge Clay Shooting Club, in Derbyshire, England during early August 2009. The event will be conducted as per the rules of the host country (English Skeet). Australia will be fielding teams in all sections, 5 x Open, 3 x Veteran (Over 60 yoa), 3 x Ladies, and 3 x Juniors (Under 21yoa). Teams will be selected over our National Skeet Championships held at our National Grounds 18th - 23rd May 2009. Full details will be provided as they come to hand and will be published in CTSN and our website.

South Africa will be hosting the 9th World DTL Championships in Cape Town in March 2010; teams will be selected at the National Trap Championships being held at Roma Queensland March 2009.

New Zealand won the vote to hold the 1st World Sporting Championships which will be held sometime during 2011, again the ACTA will be fielding teams for this event.

Our final membership figures for 2008 shows marginal growth with a total number of 12,586.

RULE CHANGE

During the past two years downgrading has been compulsory for those shooters who have shot three brackets of 200 targets at a lower grade percentage During this time the Rules Committee received many requests from individuals, State Associations and Rules Supervisors that we revert to the previous rule. All States and their Rules Supervisors were then asked to vote on this request. The result of this vote was to return to the previous rule. This in turn was put to the ACTA Executive Committee who endorsed this vote.

The new rule 2.01 (m) will now read:

"A shooter must not shoot in a grade higher than his best performance. Once having attained a grade he may elect to remain in that higher grade when due for regrading. If he so elects he must remain in that grade for the next three groups of 200 targets. If the shooter so elects his card must be marked to indicate such. Eg: Prefer A grade."

This rule takes effect as from November 10th 2008.

2009 NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS Important Notice

The National Executive have approved that all Pre-Nominations received for the 2009 National Trap championships will be Pre-Squadded.

Any person wishing to compete at these championships is urged to pre-nominate as numbers will be limited and that shooters nominating on the day cannot be guaranteed entry into the event. Any person who has pre-nominated and is unable to attend will be given a full refund if notice is given prior to the day's competition.

It should also be noted that payment of the nomination fee only entitles the nominee to enter the event. Changes by management to the program including the number of targets shot will not incur any refund.

An exciting opportunity to lead a growing not for profit organisation.



Our trip to the USA started about a year before they called our flight for boarding. The paperwork can be daunting with so much to organise; car hire, hotels, flights, nominations, forms to get the guns out of Australia, forms to get them into USA and more forms to get them back into Australia again. However, don't let this put anyone off, there are so many shooters that make this trip an annual pilgrimage (and I can now see why) and they are willing to help. We tapped into this knowledge and soon found out the best hotels, the cheapest way to upgrade your car, how to avoid the queues.

The morning of the flight dawned and we duly reported to customs at Brisbane airport to be told "you can't fly today, you're paperwork is wrong." We duly showed Mr Grumpy, the customs officer our emailed instructions from his colleague in the city. Gradually Mr Grumpy transformed into Mr Not Quite So Grumpy before finally settling on being Mr If Only Everyone Else At Customs Was As Efficient As Me, there would be no problem'

Thirty minutes later and we are sitting toasting the start of our

American adventure in the departure lounge. Several hours, meals, spilt food and films later we land at LAX where everybody apart from us seemed to be an armed policeman

I have never seen so many firearms in an airport in my life before perhaps that is why our shotguns casually appeared on the luggage carousal along with the suitcases!

We got to about the third one before settling in for the afternoon.

By this stage we had not been to bed for about 32 hours and were feeling jaded. A little urban myth had developed in that a pilot friend said that the best way to avoid jet lag was to drink through it. It was a unanimous decision to give it a go.



Later that evening as I watched two of our female entourage dancing on the bar in Coyote Ugly I realised

that as soon as the room stopped spinning that we would call it a day, wake Craig up (again) and stagger back to the hotel.

Next day was a relaxing chill-out and recover day that saw us meeting up in Hooters for lunch (Well it was centrally located and easy to find). What a great place Hooters is, very entertaining and I learnt afterwards that they also serve food. How novel!

One thing that we had already noticed about San Antonio was just how friendly everybody was and how very much they seemed to like the visiting Australians. Wherever we went people were friendly, helpful and keen to engage you in interesting conversation.

Every bar we visited seemed to be occupied by ex-navy who had all visited Melbourne (pronounced Mel - born) at least once during their service and insisted on buying us a drink or two, and who were we to turn down that good ole fashioned Southern hospitality?


We also discovered that clothing was extremely cheap in America and so arranged a Jeans and T-shirts trip. In one particular shop Glenn Walker had selected a pair of jeans which he left on the counter while he went to try on some other clothes in the changing room. Whilst out of sight his so called mates thought it was hilarious to swap the jeans on the counter for an identical but much smaller pair... Apparently later that evening while preparing to go out for dinner, Glenn grunted, groaned and grimaced his way into his new jeans and

was heard to mutter something about "didn't think I had put that much bloody weight on." His wife Paulette couldn't contain herself any longer and erupted into laughter and confessed to being witness to the swap. It turned out to be a long fortnight for the perpetrators of the crime as time after time Glenn sought revenge in many a varied and interesting way, but those are not for publication.

We still had some free time before the shoot began and so we visited a couple of local gun clubs for a practice round or two.

Trainer Hale is just a small local club where we shot a couple of







rounds. It was interesting to watch the local sheriff cruise by and call in to the club's gun shop to buy some more buckshot for his pump action. He politely refused our invitation to join our squad for a round

We also visited San Antonio Gun Club whose score-board still displayed the results from the weekend shoot where a certain Mr Mal Briggs had shown them how well the Aussies can shoot.

The clubhouse here was spectacular with some fabulous examples of taxidermy on display including a huge brown bear and a leaping lion, leather armchairs and polished wood are the norm here. Interestingly a Mexican theme influenced the building of the trap houses and each one displays a different style of Mexican architecture. No brick and tin roof here more terracotta tiles and white-washed plaster - very Alamo.

Talking of which, a handful of us enjoyed a very interesting tour of the Alamo. Well worth the \$5 if you ever get the chance.

The next day we went to the World Shooting Complex itself, situated about 20 minutes out of town it really is quite something the first time you go there.

Turning off the main road and stopping briefly for the obligatory photo at the granite entrance sign and flags, you then drive along the entrance road to the complex. Climbing gently up hill along a tree-lined avenue you come to a cross- roads where you stop to take in the 671 acres of space that has just opened up in front of you!

Glenn Walker acted as our unofficial tour guide and gave us a detailed description of the layout from our high vantage point. These words can never do it justice as it really is massive. There are countries in Africa smaller than this place!

There are 45 separate skeet layouts including a separate range for the 5 practise layouts including one layout specifically for doubles (they only have pads on stations 3, 4 and 5). Down the hill past the enormous Beretta stadium, are the administration offices which are situated just behind the hall of fame museum. To the right sits the grandstand stadium which seats 1,000 people and further around are the first row of layouts and a seemingly endless array of permanent gun shops and associated retailers which had my wife reaching for the credit card. The camping area holds about 200 powered sites. There were armed police patrolling the grounds on quad bikes. There is a fully manned and secure gun storage facility, on site ammunition dealer selling nearly every brand you can think of (sub gauge ammo seemed to be about ½ the price that it is here in Australia). The Yanks threw their hulls away unlike the thrifty Aussies who eagerly gathered up any spares to bring back and re-load!

The layouts themselves are arranged in 3 rows of approximately 15 layouts per row. These rows run left to right along the side of a gently sloping tree lined hill which provides adequate cover for fall-out. Such is the size of the place that you drive to your layout.

There were nearly 1000 shooters taking part this year from all over the world which was evidenced by the many national flags fluttering in the hot Texan air outside of the clubhouse and thanks to some good work from Paul Johnstone we had the Australian flag flying proudly for the first time ever this year.

There were 19 Australians who made the trip including several first timers who were easy to spot as they were the ones walking around with their mouths gaping open and pointing at things in awe.

As first timers you are entitled to a free lesson with one of skeets great shooters and coaches Mr John Shima. This took place the day before the competition started and is conducted in the main grand-stand arena. Out of the 100 or so first time shooters there were only about 12 or so people who turned up which was surprising.

John is very entertaining and a terrific coach, graced with that rare ability to see almost instantly the subtle changes required to help you to improve your game. We spent the best part of the morning with him trying to learn as much as possible from this true wizard of skeet coaching and it was a morning well spent as all who attended were feeling confident.

And so to the practiCe layout...Buy a token from the office or

ammo store and drive up to the practice layouts at the very top of the hill overlooking the complex, hand your token in and have your name added to the list. As soon as one of the five layouts is free you will squadded and sent to your layout.

My personal observation was how quick some of the Americans tend to shoot (making Laurie Chelepy look slow). In that I mean there seemed to me to be very little set-up for the shot, they almost seemed to be in a hurry to get the shot over with and get off the pad. I observed this to be the case throughout the competition except for the likes of Todd Bender and Wayne Mayes etc the top shots who were all working on their pre-loads about two shooters ahead, maybe this is a component that separates the good from the great?

My very first ever shot at the world grounds was when I found myself in a practice squad with 5 very serious, high fiving, exuberant Americans. They were all very friendly but also very serious. The one shooter in particular was very focused indeed and had obviously come to win. Now I consider myself to be capable of shooting the targets quickly when the need arises. I can see the targets very early and I am graced with quick reflexes (often to the detriment of my scores). However this guy shooting in front of me was amazing, he was so quick that he was hitting the targets at my hold point and yet he looked like he had all the time in the world. I later found out that leading up to the competition he was shooting 500 targets a day! Talk about training hard to fight easy. No wonder he was a regular visitor to the shoot-off arena over the week.

Several members of our party had new guns with them and they took the opportunity to have their guns professionally fitted by Todd Nielsen who is a man who travels the country with his mobile workshop offering top quality gun fitting. For those people who tell you not to bother with this I would say that everyone that had their gun fitted shot better scores afterwards. I personally had developed a habit of mounting my gun incorrectly something which was quickly cured by Todd and I went on to shoot better than I ever have.

However this made me realise that the training we receive from John Shima, the facility to shoot 500 targets a day in practice, with the confidence of having a gun expertly fitted is not something we have widely available in Australia – yet.

Todd Bender is in Australia again now currently for the second year in a row with his coaching clinics and I think it is only a matter of time before other coaches realise how much potential and enthusiasm there is here in Australia.

The World Shoot is divided into two events held over the 8 days, being a Mini World and Main World. When you receive your paperwork you will know your squad number, shooter position, layout number and time of shooting for each and every event throughout the competition. I have to say that it all ran like clockwork. Very impressive.

All events are shot as 100 targets in one visit (except 12 gauge which is 2 x 125 targets in the Main World). All of the referees are paid professionals so you simply turned up on time, shot and left. It was not uncommon for shooters to shoot then leave the grounds to go shopping or go back to their hotel. It was very simple to just check the internet to see if you were required to go back for an evening shoot off.

Shoot-offs: Every afternoon prior to the shoot-offs commencing everyone is asked to stand silently to attention and face the stars and stripes while the American national anthem is played and it is a most inspirational thing to witness and makes you realise how very patriotic the Americans are.

A few people had told us how the targets were different and we didn't fully understand it until we saw it for ourselves.

Shooting White Flyer targets which have a high dome design. They require more initial energy to launch them yet their increased wind resistance causes them to decelerate quicker than what we are used to. The end result being that they are initially harder to pick up in your vision and slow down at a different rate. They were also very, very consistent.

These characteristics needed adapting to, some people struggled more than others and some good excuses were heard(and duly recorded) but this is part of the experience of travelling to these events to experience the differences and learn to adapt and improve.

It was a real eye-opener to see how well the top shooters can shoot especially doubles and even with a .410. If you tried to guess the calibre of the event simply by watching the targets break you would be hard pushed to tell the difference between a 12g hit and a .410 hit!

Again I think it brings us back to practice, if we had the ability and facility to shoot the sub-gauges as often and as cheaply as the Americans can then we would definitely be up there with them. I spoke on several occasions to the referees, when asked about the standard of Australian shooting they all remarked not only on how good we are but that how good we could be if we had access to world class training on a regular basis.

We had a fabulous time in America. Made so because of the help of our fellow Australians and we learnt such a lot, nothing new particularly but more about how much we had forgotten, I personally went there shooting terribly, had some coaching, had my gun fitted, worked hard and came home with a world title. Will we be going next year? Most definitely yes!

2009 ACTA Trap Titles

Subject- Reciprocal rights for interstate visitors

• Requirements for visiting interstate licensed adult shooters

Queensland has reciprocal rights with interstate licensed shooters, thus allowing them to compete in sports target shooting. The persons licence is taken to authorise possession and use of the weapon in accordance with this Act for the purpose of participating in the competition.

For any further information please refer to Section 32 of the *Weapons Act* 1990.

Requirements for visiting interstate unlicensed adult shooters

An unlicensed person who is not an excluded person by reasons nominated on the Form 33 may attend an approved range and on completion of the Form 33 shoot under the supervision of the range officer of the day.

For any further information please refer to Section 53 of the *Weapons Act* 1990

• Requirements for visiting interstate junior shooters

Queensland has reciprocal rights with interstate licensed minors, thus allowing them to compete in sports target shooting. The persons licence is taken to authorise possession and use of the weapon in accordance with this Act for the purpose of participating in the competition.

For any further information please refer to Section 32 of the *Weapons Act 1990*.

Requirements for visiting interstate unlicensed junior shooters

This means that a minor from the age of 11 years and who has not attained 18 years of age is able to possess category A & B weapons

while under direct supervision of a range officer whiles on the range. For any further information please refer to Section 52 of the *Weapons Act 1990*

Requirements for storage of weapons in Queensland when travelling in vehicles

A person in control of a weapon (whether or not the person has custody of it) must ensure the weapon is not placed in or on a vehicle unless– if the vehicle has a lockable boot–the weapon is locked in the boot; or otherwise– the weapon is locked in a metal container fixed to the vehicle; or the weapon is in a securely closed container that is out of sight in a vehicle.

The metal container and anything on or attached to it, must not suggest a weapon is inside.

A person in control of a weapon (whether or not the person has custody of it) must ensure the weapon is not left in an unlocked vehicle if the vehicle is not being attended by someone licensed to possess the weapon.

For any further information please refer to Section 61 of the *Weapons Regulations* 1996.

• Requirements for storage of weapons in Queensland in

A person who possesses a weapon, when the weapon is not in the person's physical possession must store it unloaded in– a securely closed container with the bolt removed or with a trigger lock fitted; or a locked container.

The container must be- out of sight in a locked room of a permanent building.

Psychological Skills for Shooting

by Michael Kruger-Davis

HYPNOSIS FOR SPORT

This month's article is the final in a series on hypnosis in sport. The previous articles have looked at what hypnosis is, what it feels like and some basic relaxation and basic scripts for deeper relaxation through breathing and guided imagery.

I want to take the exercise one step further and reprint the ego-strengthening and goal rehearsal scripts from Gordon Milne's *Hypnosis and the Art of Self-Therapy*.

After doing basic scripts A and B (C is replaced by the egostrengthening script below).

Ego-strengthening script

- 1. Now listen carefully to what I say... While you're in this calm, comfortable, relaxed state... your mind is so sensitive and receptive to suggestions I give you... that each will flow straight into your unconscious mind... where, as you repeat it daily, it will be indelibly implanted...
- 2. For a long time you have been giving yourself negative self-statements...and negative self-images...while you are tense and anxious...and these have become implanted in your subconscious mind...
- 3. Now, because you are relaxed and calm...these positive suggestions I give you will cancel out the negative self-statements from the past...which have caused you such halm...
- 4. Tell yourself... 'Everyday I can feel physically strong and fit...
- 5. 'I can enjoy being alert...wide awake...and energetic ... and find myself calm...composed...and tranquil...
- 6. Every day I will become more and more completely relaxed and less tense . . .
- 7. 'I will accept myself as self confident and self assured . . .
- 8. Everyday I will play the Inner Game... with goal rehearsal ... the obstacles will diminish...
- 9. 'As I feel closer and closer to my important goal . . . enjoying the winning feeling the obstacles will melt away . . .
- 10. 'As I activate my full potential in the Inner Game... my unconscious mind tells me that I can soon achieve it somewhere...
- 11. 'For before long I will be fully equipped to overcome physical and technical difficulties in the outer game . . .'

The goal rehearsal for the inner game continues with the goa rehearsal script below. The object of the goal rehearsal and the ego-strengthening scripts is to develop a level of mental toughness necessary to perform at a maximum level. Mental toughness components, such as confidence, composure, competence, competitiveness, etc can be improved and maintained through these processes.

Goal Rehearsal Script

- 1. There is a large TV screen in your room, and as you focus your attention on it, it lights up. Then you have a clear three dimensional image of yourself...
- 2. As you continue to watch, you will be able to view yourself

demonstrating a peak performance (10) (Watch yourself shoot 25 straight, clear round of skeet, etc)

- 3. In your imagination each of your sensory and motor systems is activated as you watch...so that you will actually feel that you are performing (5) Feel the weight of the gun, the recoil, the smell of the shell, the sight of the smoked target.)
- 4. It maybe that you have caught yourself in a past peak performance...such as you have been striving to achieve again for a longtime (10)
- 5. You mayor may not be engaged in a contest...but you are completely involved with that winning feeling (10).
- 6. Repeat over and over again, as necessary. Let the TV screen fade away, focus on your breathing (10) then move on to the dehypnotizing script.

Dehypnotising Script

In a few moments I'm going to count backwards from 20 to 1. As I do you will gradually return to your normal state feeling... losing numbness, heaviness, or any other unusual feeling... your mind will return to it's normal alert contact with the outside world... On the count of 3 your eyes will begin to open... on the count of 1 your eyes will be wide open and you will feel GOOD... calm, relaxed, and confident. Ready now... 20, 19, 18, etc... 3, 2, 1. Feel good now calm and alert.

Whilst it is best to practice this process in full several times per week, elements of the process, especially some of the breathing components can be practiced whenever you have time. This might be when you are in a queue at the bank or post office, for example. By practicing it in these settings you will be able to use these skills to help you focus before a competition or refocus during a competition. You can also use these techniques to go over your performance: to reinforce those things that went right and to restructure those things that need changing.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY – NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

- 1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.
 - Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
- 2. Squads of 6 to shoot 50 targets/75 targets in brackets of 25, one visit only to the traps. Squads of 6 to shoot 100 targets in brackets of 50, two visits to the traps. National Handicap event to be 5 (five) person squads, 5 (five) targets per lane.
- Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
- 4. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/75 targets. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET may be incurred.
- 5. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination and will be re-squadded towards the end of the event.
- 6. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 7. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
- 8. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score may incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET may be incurred in the event concerned.
- 9. Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first round of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility may be penalised one target. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for they're failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.
- Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised FIVE (5)
 TARGETS.
- 11. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- 12. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 13. Optional sweep/purse nominations shall be noted on a separate form from shooting nominations and are not refundable.
- 14. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
- 15. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall chose in which team they may be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
- 16. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade and section prize.
- 17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
- 18. Nominations will close daily at 11.00am or at the discretion of the Tournament Director.
- 19. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behaviour of the card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 20. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
- 21. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 22. Reduced Nominations shall apply to Juniors and Sub-Juniors. Also partners' entering into the same event whose nomination is lodged at the same time as a member paying full nomination fees. Shooters paying reduced Noms are eligible for Overall, Grade and section prizes.
- 23. All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Trap Championships.
- 24. Payment of the nomination fee only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not be eligible to any refund.



As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless: (a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

- (a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

Location At the junction of major highways from Brisbane, Sydney, Melbourne and Darwin and is just 90 minutes drive from the state's capital, Brisbane





ACTA Handicap Shooting - A proposal

The following proposal is based in part upon the current rules (effective 1st January 2006) and is submitted for ALL ACTA shooters to read, give thought to and make your own judgements on a situation that is causing more and more clubs/shooters to shy away from handicap shooting, which in turn is partially the cause of our declining membership.

2.02 Handicapping Formula

- (a) Each club must appoint an official to handicap and grade shooters, check to see that all appropriate 15 metre common mark and double barrel handicap scores, including shootoff targets, are entered on cards, and to check that handicap, running percentage and grade changes (if and where applicable) are recorded on shooters' cards.
- (b) Initial handicap marks for new shooters who have just shoot their first 200 targets from 15m common mark are as follows: AA grade 19 metres, A grade 17 metres, B grade 14 metres and C grade 11 metres.
 - Once established, these initial handicap marks can only be varied by results from Handicap events, and <u>NOT</u> 15m common mark events.
- (c) Handicap events shot <u>double barrel only</u> are to be recorded for handicap purposes.
 - Scores from single barrel or points score events shot from handicap marks are not to be entered on the cards, along with single barrel continental, double barrel continental, double barrel continental points score, double rise or double rise continental shot from handicap marks, as these are deemed to be novelty events.
- (d) In handicap events, competitors must shoot from their approved handicaps. If the competitor shoots from any other mark, the target is lost.
- (e) Backward movement is to apply on high scores according to the following table:

Earned Meterage Table (High Scores)

| 50 - 79 | 1 | | | |

| 250+ | 2 | 1 1/2 | 1 | 1/2 |

- (f) Any competitor winning overall in any Championship event from behind their ACTA handicap mark will be rehandicapped to that Championship mark
- (g) The shooter's card is to be ruled off at any handicap change (minimum of 1 metre), and the 100 targets will then restart Note With earned ½ metres, no backward movement is necessary until the shooter has earned a total of at least 1 metre.

- (h) All double barrel handicap events, including Sweepstakes, must be shot to finality- broken targets to count, and <u>NOT</u> points or single barrel to determine the outcome.
- (i) There shall be no Group Handicaps.
- (j) Minimum handicap 11 metres
- (k) Maximum handicap 25 metres.
- (l) Maximum load for Handicap shooting is 28 grams, shot size not larger than Number 6
- (m) All shooters registering for the first time with the ACTA shall commence on 11 metres
- (n) Members from other Clay Target Associations will commence from the following handicap marks unless their current handicap is greater than that stated: AA grade 19 metres, A grade 17 metres, B grade 15 metres and C grade 13 metres.

2.03 Inward Movement

- (a) A one (1) metre inward movement will apply if a shooter's recorded percentage is less than 90% for a minimum of three (3) consecutive groups of 100 targets and no penalty has been imposed.
 - Note: Winning the BBM's trophy is not deemed to be the same performance wise, and therefore does not count for this rule.
- (b) Maximum inward movement in one (1) calendar year of one (1) metre.
- (c) A competitor may apply through the State Handicapper for inward movement due to <u>proven</u> physical disability.

2.04 Adjustments

- (a) Retain as currently worded.
- (b) Retain as currently worded.
- (c) Errors and/or amendments may be corrected by the Club Secretary, Club Handicapper or Assistant Handicapper, a member of the ACTA Executive Committee, Rules Supervisor or the State Handicapper.
- (d) Retain as currently worded.
- (e) Retain as currently worded.
- (f) Club managements are informed that a Result Sheet must be forwarded to the ACTA office within fourteen (14) days of each shoot being held. Where there is a grade and/or Handicap change for a shooter, or shooters a Handicap Return must accompany the Result Sheet.
- (g) Retain as currently worded.
- (h) In determining a shooter's grade, running percentage or handicap, as official may disregard any score or scores obviously not indicative of the shooter's ability.
- (i) Retain as currently worded.
- (j) Retain as currently worded.

4.02 Firing Points for Handicaps

(a) Amend the word from 15 to 25 metres to read from 11 to 25 metres.

After a major rethink, fairer and above all a major incentive for shooters to return to handicap shooting. After all, handicap is the ONLY event in the book where shooters of all abilities can compete against each other on an equal footing



Trapshooting Champions - Past and Present

THE GREATS

About every 20 years a truly great trapshooter appears. In the past 100 years our sport has been blessed with 6 of them and we have a couple of others appearing at present.

The greats of the past 100 years pick themselves:

Donald Mackintosh

Jack Sutherland - "Calrossie"

Fred Burns

Newton Thomas

Doug Smith

Bill Iles

Each one of these shooters dominated trapshooting in the era in which they lived. They thrived under the pressure of the big competitions in which they competed and each had a massive influence on the sport they loved. In the following months I plan to write an article on each of them but following is a glimpse of what they achieved.

DONALD MACKINTOSH

Donald Mackintosh was the most successful of the pre 1900 trapshooters, he lived in Europe for most of the period from 1895 – 1905 and competed in all the major pigeon shoots of the time. It was the golden era of pigeon shooting and the prize money was huge; the major events often had prize money exceeding \$100,000 in today's terms.

He was acknowledged as the world champion as he won all the major pigeon shoots at the time including the gold medal in trapshooting at the Paris Olympics of 1900.

Throughout this period he earned enough money to move back to Melbourne and establish a gun shop of his own. He developed this business into the most successful gun shop of the time and was involved in the business until his retirement.

When he returned to Australia he worked tirelessly promoting trapshooting and was instrumental in birth of clay shooting in Australia.

JACK SUTHERLAND: "CALROSSIE" 1878 - 1968

Probably the most influential of the six was Jack Sutherland; he worked for ICI for most of his life and was instrumental in the change from live targets to clay targets.

He was the dominant trapshooter of the period 1920 – 1940, and held the world records for both pigeon and starling shooting. He won over 100 major live bird championships and was described as the "Bradman" of trapshooting.

But probably his greatest legacy was his shooting style, the method he used to prepare himself, mount his gun and shoot the target. His was what we now call the "classic" style.

When Fred Burns joined ICI, he came under Calrossie's influence and subsequently went on to dominate trapshooting as well as coaching what he had learnt, but it didn't stop there. When Newton Thomas was developing as a trapshooter, he too modelled himself on the style of Calrossie

Newton then in turn influenced hundreds of shooters of his generation and those shooters have influenced thousands of today's shooters whether they know it or not.

The great Bill Iles was one of the next generation that followed to be influenced by Newtons style and he has subsequently influenced the style of the next generation.

So today, if you know what to look for you can see Calrossies influence on the thousands of trapshooters.

FRED BURNS: 1910 - 1984

Fred Burns was probably Australia's greatest all round shooter. He had a phenomenal record in live bird shooting and was the first of the greats to switch to clays and dominate as well. He also worked

with ICI for some time before opening his own gun shop and finally a shooting school.

He was Australia's best trapshooter of the 1940 - 1960 era but also excelled at skeet shooting and field shooting. He won more than 250 championships and coached extensively.

Fred Burns should have represented Australia in the 1956 Olympics but was deemed to be a professional and subsequently not allowed to compete. Indeed the ACTA did not adopt the Olympic disciplines until the early 1970's as a result of the amateur restrictions of the time.

NEWTON THOMAS

Newton came to our sport as clays were taking over from live targets and although he loved live bird shooting he embraced clay targets as his preferred competition. He was Australia's best trapshooter in the period 1950 – 1970 and like Fred Burns he was also a champion skeet and field shooter.

Newton joined ICI after the war and travelled all over Australia and New Zealand working and competing. He influenced our sport by elevating the importance of sportsmanship. He went on to win an incredible 20 National titles and make the Mackintosh team 24 times, but he did it in a way that left his competitors happy and proud to have spent time with him.

Towards the end of his life he coached extensively and was probably our greatest ambassador. He was awarded an OAM in recognition of his unique contribution.

DOUG SMITH: 1937 -

Doug started shooting very young and perfected his craft throughout 1950's. He was probably trapshooting's greatest competitor; he loved to shoot and loved to compete. He was the first of the greats to be truly amateur; he earned his living as a farmer and didn't compete as regularly as the others.

We will never know how many championships he would have won if he had competed more often but maybe it was his less frequent participation that kept him at the top of the game for more than 30 years.

Although not of the classic style, his sheer determination led him to the top of our sport. He won his first national title in 1960 and his last in 1994 and dominated our sport in the period 1970 – 1990.

Doug has won 21 national titles and has represented us in more Mackintosh team events (29) than any other shooter. His records are unlikely to be beaten and stand testament to the shear determination of the man.

BILL ILES: 1945 -

As the sun was setting on Doug Smith then along came Bill, no one has ever won more championships than Bill Iles. He won so many that the old practice of counting them was suddenly out of fashion. At one time 100 championships in a lifetime was an enviable record, when Billy got serious he won that many in a year.

He was our best trapshooter of the period 1980 – 2000 and set records that are unlikely to be beaten. He won 28 National titles and made 19 Mackintosh teams as well as achieving some phenomenal breaks. His best break being 1727.

Although long runs are not officially recognised in Australia, at one stage he had a long run of nearly 4,000 targets without a miss.

Bill was the next great all-rounder to follow Newton Thomas, here was a trapshooter that could shoot skeet and field as well. He is probably the odd one out in this list of greats in that he thrived on confrontation and seemed to excel when it was a dog eat dog scenario.
