




Mathoura shooters defy the rain


Xmas at Mathoura Gun Club



Psychological Skills for Shooting

ARROW LASER SHOT REVISITED

You will notice in this issue of the CTSN an advertisement for Arrow Laser Shot, and you may remember that I wrote about this product in the June edition. I have reprinted some of the previous article because I feel this product is a worthwhile tool for a coach, stock maker or anyone who wants to practice their gun mount.

Back when I was started high school, I remember learning about "scientific method". Basically scientific method meant that you worked out a question you want to answer (hypothesis), and develop an experiment to find out if your answer was right or wrong. At the time it didn't mean much, but over the years it has stayed with me, primarily because of my work, and I now find that I often use this principle where possible when confronted with a problem. The main benefit is that I do not have to waste time and effort with the more traditional trial and error approach.

I recently bought a new gun and I decided that in order to get it set up right I would use the "scientific method". I am a regular reader of "Clay Shooting" so when I saw an ad for "Laser Arrow Shot" I thought that this was what I need to help set the gun up right. The ad stated that the Arrow Laser Shot can smooth and perfect your gun mount, improve your gun swing, check your point of impact and gun fit.

The product sounded perfect; just what I needed. I checked the website www.arrowlasershot.com and filled in an order. I personally haven't had much experience with purchasing over the internet, but I was suitably impressed when after a few hours there were emails notifying me that my order had been received, then dispatched. Within a week I was the proud owner of the Arrow Laser Shot.

So when my new gun arrived, I was able to use the Arrow Laser Shot to help me set up the new gun. First I put together my old 682 and checked the point of impact of both barrels using the Arrow Laser Shot, knowing that this was what I was after. I then used the Arrow Laser Shot to check the point of impact on my new gun. (What was interesting was that I didn't need to make any adjustments at all: both were pointing in the exact same place) Just to make sure I wasn't getting a false positive reading and therefore making an assumption that everything was correct even though it was wrong (a type 1 error), I tried it with a gun that I knew didn't fit me, and it was clearly pointing in a different place. I then patterned each gun on just to substantiate the results from the Arrow Laser Shot. I was surprised and fortunate in that I didn't have to make any adjustments to my gun and I have shot very well with it since, but even if I did need to make some adjustments the instructions that came with the Arrow Laser Shot were very explicit and easy to follow. The other use for the Arrow Laser Shot is that I can use it every day for ten minutes to dry mount my gun. It shows me instantly if the gun is mounted correctly and I can put it down and start again.

When the *Arrow Laser Shot* arrived I ran into a shooting friend at the post office and showed him what I had bought. He had problems hitting anything with the top barrel, so he came out home and we looked at were the gun was pointing. What it showed was that the first barrel was flat and that the top barrel was actually lower: not what you want for a gun to shoot DTL targets. Naturally, out first thought was to raise the comb but this didn't help, so we changed the pitch of the gun and got it to a point where it was pointing above the mark for the first barrel and flat for the second barrel. The following weekend you could see dramatic changes in his scores and the way the targets were hit.

I have been using the *Arrow Laser Shot* during coaching sessions and take it with me to shoots because I am often get asked by shooters if they can check the point of impact of their guns. I'm sure I could have set up my gun by trying and changing, trying and changing, but the *Arrow Laser Shot* took most of the guesswork out of the process. Because I have confidence in the process that I adopted, I now have confidence in the gun, which is more important. Most of us are competent shooters; where we fall down in competitions is that we are not as confident in our ability, guns, shells, etc as we should be, or we are not as composed in the competition as we should be.

I don't want to sound too gushy about the *Arrow Laser Shot*, but it lived up to all promises and made the task of fitting my gun so much easier. It would be an invaluable tool for a stock fitter, coach or gun retailer because it can let the customer know instantly if the gun they are interested in is at all close to fitting, and if not what they need to do to make it fit. For me I will use to perfect my gun mount, and use it in coaching to help others feel they can use their gun confidently.

Since writing that article several things have happened. Firstly, My experience with ordering and receiving my *Arrow Laser Shot* gave me the courage to order a new digital camera over the internet; however, four weeks later and all I have received is couple of emails telling me that the I have ordered the camera. Secondly, I have had to put the *Arrow Laser Shot* into my shoot bag (with plenty of batteries) because I am often asked at shoots if I have it with me and "can I use it to see if my guns pointing where it should be". Next, I have been able to use the *Arrow Laser Shot* on a regular basis to perfect gun mount. Because of the laser you get immediate feedback showing you are either on target or have to make adjustments. Finally, I have used the *Arrow Laser Shot* on those days after I have not shot well, to reassure myself that it wasn't the gun but some other factor such as the wind, the light, etc.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY – NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

- 1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.
 - Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
- 2. Squads of 6 to shoot 50 targets/75 targets in brackets of 25, one visit only to the traps. Squads of 6 to shoot 100 targets in brackets of 50, two visits to the traps. National Handicap event to be 5 (five) person squads, 5 (five) targets per lane.
- Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
- 4. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/75 targets. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET may be incurred.
- 5. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination and will be re-squadded towards the end of the event.
- 6. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 7. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
- 8. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score may incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET may be incurred in the event concerned.
- 9. Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first round of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility may be penalised one target. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for they're failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.
- Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised FIVE (5)
 TARGETS.
- 11. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- 12. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 13. Optional sweep/purse nominations shall be noted on a separate form from shooting nominations and are not refundable.
- 14. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
- 15. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall chose in which team they may be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
- 16. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade and section prize.
- 17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
- 18. Nominations will close daily at 11.00am or at the discretion of the Tournament Director.
- 19. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behaviour of the card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 20. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
- 21. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 22. Reduced Nominations shall apply to Juniors and Sub-Juniors. Also partners' entering into the same event whose nomination is lodged at the same time as a member paying full nomination fees. Shooters paying reduced Noms are eligible for Overall, Grade and section prizes.
- 23. All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Trap Championships.
- 24. Payment of the nomination fee only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not be eligible to any refund.



- (b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

- (a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

YOUR RULES

ATTENTION CLUB SECRETARIES AND HANDICAPPERS

CLARICATION OF RULE 2.04(h) and RULE2.01(h) 2008 Rule Book

Just to clarify Rule 2.04(h), "... an official may disregard ANY score OBVIOUSLY NOT indicative of the shooter's ability". This may indeed include more than one score, and the key words in applying this rule are "OBVIOUSLY NOT".

There also seems to be some confusion with the 200 targets rule-off and the substitution of bad double barrel scores. For the information of our members, Rule 2.01(h) states "After 200 targets regrade the shooter if necessary. ANY BAD scores entered on the DB column will be wiped off & transposed for any GOOD scores from the other events column (of equal target amounts IF POSSIBLE) i.e., Continental & single barrel".

To explain the application of this rule, after 200 DB targets has been ruled off by the shoot secretary or handicapper, he/she will then check for BAD DB scores (which can be multiple) that can be substituted for GOOD scores from the Cont/SB column. Also, per Rule 2.04(h), disregard any score obviously not indicative of the shooter's ability. Wherever possible, substitute BAD FOR GOOD scores of equal amounts "IF POSSIBLE", but e.g., a bad 25 target DB score can be substituted for a good 50 target score, or conversely, a bad 50 target DB score can be transposed for a good 25 target score from the other events column.

Now having carried out the substitutions and/or deletions, there

may indeed be a different total from the original 200, e.g. 170/175, e.g. 219/250. The percentage is then calculated at this point and not before, to obtain the "200 target percentage" for the purpose of calculating the ongoing rolling percentage and subsequent grading.

I hope this will help our members with any problems they have had in the past with these two rules. Please do not hesitate to contact me with any other issues or clarifications you are concerned with so that I can address them with you personally or through this medium.

CLARIFICATION RULE 2.03

It has become apparent, given the significant number of enquiries I have received, that applying the rules for inward movement relating to handicap marks, in some cases, is not being applied correctly. For your information.

Rule 2.03 INWARD MOVEMENT, states;

- (a) A one (1) metre inward movement may apply if a shooter's recorded percentage is less than 87% for 5 consecutive groups of 100 targets.
- (b) When downgrading occurs (e.g. A to B) a shooters handicap will return to the minimum meterage for that grade providing no earned meterage above the minimum has applied under the handicapping formula.
- (c) A competitor may apply through the State Handicapper for Inward movement due to proven physical disability.

Rule 2.03 (b) is causing the most confusion. Therefore to assist, I have prepared 3 examples of how it is to be interpreted.

EXAMPLE 1: a AA 21 metre shooter, NOT having earned meterage whilst on this mark, is downgraded to A grade, will return to A19 metres, provided the shooter had not earned meterage when on 19 metres previously. This principle applies to an A 19 shooter returning to B 17, or a B17 shooter returning to C15.

EXAMPLE 2: a AA 23 metre shooter downgraded to A grade, will remain A 23 metres, due to having earned meterage beyond the 21 metre mark. An inward 1 metre movement would only apply pursuant to Rule 2.03 (a), (c) where applicable

EXAMPLE 3: a A19 metre shooter is downgraded to B grade. However, this shooter had earned meterage previously as a B Grader to 18 1/2 metres. This shooter would be downgraded B 18 1/2 metres.

It should also be noted, a shooter earns meterage not withstanding a Handicap win did not apply, through Rules 2.02 (c), (d) & (e).

I trust this information may clarify and be of assistance to those unsure of the rule application activity.

Northern Zone Coaching

Shooters Make Annual Pilgrimage for "Boydie's Secret Tips"

Location Approx. 1500 km north of Brisbane

Picturesque Townsville Gun Club played host to this year's Northern Zone Coaching Weekend on the 15th and 16th November. "Super Coach" Graeme Boyd (Assistant National Coaching Director) from Albury, New South Wales made his annual trek northwards to impart some of his knowledge, teach new techniques and introduce shooters to disciplines that they have never tried. 28 shooters (including 7 juniors) attended from Northern and Central Zone clubs and had the opportunity to shoot Down the Line, Skeet and ISSF Trap under the watchful eye of Graeme.

Saturday morning began with registration and an introduction from Graeme. Focussing on DTL first, the participants were then split into two groups; AA and A grade shooters and B and C grade shooters. While the AA and A graders took to the tracks with Boydie for a shot that was captured on video, the B and C graders patterned their guns and had them checked for correct fit with The Gulf Grey, Northern Zone President Wayne Reeves. The groups swapped over, and then we had the opportunity to watch ourselves shoot and see and understand the things Graeme had identified as faults in our technique, such as gun hold (and focal point), foot position, hand placement on the fore-end, the level of your elbow to allow or restrict rotation, the timing of your shot and how long you give yourself to focus before beginning your routine.

Graeme distributed very comprehensive handouts to everyone which included information about concentration, visual skills, visualisation, timing the shot, the sight picture, shooting methods, some tips about Double Rise, patterns and chokes, the timing of the squad, physical warm-up suggestions, pre-competition routines, nutrition and hydration and using your centre bead. General discussion and a question and answer session took place before lunch, in which Graeme illustrated some of the points he had been making with diagrams.

The Lefties went out to the tracks with Wayne and everyone else had an opportunity to make some changes and put into practice what they had learnt with Graeme looking on. Local shooter Errol Reeves and Mount Isa visitor Mick McGill took to the Skeet layout with a few interested shooters and imparted some technical advice for the first-timers, and the Trench was opened up for those looking for a bit more of a challenge. That evening time was made for a more informal discussion and question and answer session with Graeme.

Sunday morning belonged solely to the seven Juniors while the Townsville club ran their monthly competition. The Juniors shot some Trench and DTL and other shooters had an opportunity to grab Graeme before he left that afternoon. Everyone who attended the weekend took something of value away with them, whether it was something new, or something that they were reminded of it was definitely a worthwhile learning experience.

Because Graeme had to teach himself and learn from the mistakes that he made he is in a position to pass on what he has learnt, and it definitely saves us a lot of time. A couple of the key points from the weekend were to ensure that you have a natural and comfortable (and uncomplicated) shooting style (so that you can easily do the same thing each time in your routine) and to pay attention to the target – don't just watch it until it breaks, take note of how it breaks because even though you have hit it, it might be a warning signal that an old habit is creeping in and the next one might not break at all.

Next year's Northern Zone Coaching Weekend will be held in Bosworth Country at the Herbert River Gun Club on the 29th and 30th of August 2009. Mark your diary for this annual pilgrimage.

Trapshooting Champions - Past and Present

The Best of the Century

Trapshooting has a heritage of more than 100 years in Australia, in fact we have been able to trace trapshooting back to 1850 in Sydney. Although very little is known of the period prior to 1900, there is quite a lot of information from 1900 onwards.

Prior to 1900 trapshooting was organised by individual clubs and hotels. From 1900 onwards the sport also had associations to assist. First of all there was the Gun Clubs Association that was involved in live bird shooting and then there was the ACPTSA which later evolved into the ACTA that organised clay target shooting.

The two Associations co existed for a period of approximately 20 years from the mid 1930's to the late 1950's when live bird shooting was banned and the GCA ceased to exist.

Prior to 1930 there was very few clay target competitions held, although clays were being imported into Australia as early as 1905 and the GCA was organising clay events as early as 1910.

Live bird shooting was banned in Australia progressively with Victoria being the last state to ban live bird events in 1958.

So to identify the best trap shooters of the last century we need to

look at shooters from both associations. The following is the list of the 5 best in each 20 year period throughout the century.



A proud moment for Australia and the Australian Shooting Association. For the first time ever in individual matches in World Championships, the Australian flag was raised during the presentations at Seoul Korea recently. The occasion was the Olympic Trench match, in which top Australian Trench competitor Jim Ellis won a bronze medal. The match was won by Valduvi of Spain with Besangi of Italy 2nd.

Ellis scored 195 to tie for 3rd place with R Voss of U.S.A. and former World Champion M Carrega of



Terry Rumbel finished one target behind Ellis on 194 and filled sixth place. Rumbel had only six weeks earlier, won a bronze medal in the Commonwealth Games in Canada.

Clay target shooters are now ranked at the top of competitive shooting in Australia a great effort when one considers that it all started as recently as 1973 when the World Moving Target Championships were held in Melbourne.
