The Australian Clay Target Association has presented the Wagga Wagga City Council with a proposal for the purchase of the land known to all as the National Ground. ACTA President John Mack and National Ground Chairman Robert Nugent attended a meeting with Council on Monday the 16th March where acting Executive Officer Drew Maywald delivered a powerpoint presentation to the Standing committee of the Council. The committee will make its recommendation to the Full Council for the next Council meeting before the end of March.

The purchase of the National Ground and additional land to the South will secure the safety template required for the sport. Wagga City Council have been very supportive in our quest for the purchase of the land, we look forward to further developing the relationship with the Council and the ground.

Many thanks to Drew Maywald who has acted in the position for the past three months. Drew has done a great deal of work particularly compiling the Annual report and the National Trap Championships in Roma. Naturally the staff of the ACTA office were of great assistance to him in his time.

We have lost Sue Pim from the team in mid March, her loss is significant in terms of shooting knowledge however I am sure Sue will still be involved in the sport at some level in the future. Sue has introduced a financial system which will ensure we continue to move in a positive direction satisfying all corporate governance requirements.

We are currently in a position of evaluating positions and roles in the National office to ensure the structure in the future will compliment the direction of the organization.

We welcome Ally Taylor and Belinda Potts to the team, I am sure you will get to know them when in contact with the Office. Maureen Ryan will continue to provide membership services and collate the CTSN publication whilst Sue Vesperman will step up to the administration/events role. Dave Jocelyn will continue to be the groundsman and with the imminent purchase of the land his role will continue to evolve. We have assembled a team of staff who we know will take us through the next phase of development of the organisation.

We are introducing CLUB CORNER to the magazine where we will update useful information for Clubs.

A very brief overview of my sports administration roles over the past 20 years. Roles have varied from Development manager/ Coaching Director, Coach, Executive Director, Registered Club Manager and Administrator.

Club Corner

SHOOTERS HANDICAP BOOKS

There have been some enquiries regarding the issuing and reissuing of Handicap Books.

The ACTA office sends a "Secretary Pack" to all club Secretaries each year containing relevant information for shooters and Clubs to ensure members have the appropriate requirements for the year. This includes order forms for various situations.

Shooters are required to return their full book to the Club secretary, the secretary will send an order form to the ACTA office.

On receipt of the form a new book will be returned to the Club Secretary for distribution. Please check with your Club secretary if you have any concerns.

INSURANCE: HIRING OUT CLUB FACILITIES

We all look to raise funds by letting out facilities when possible. When a club is hiring out their club rooms it is recommended to advise the insurer.

Ensure cover is extended to cover the event with details of the hirer, time of use, approximate numbers. If a caterer is being used seek a copy of the caterer's Public Liability Insurance for your file. It is the Clubs responsibility the insurer is made aware that the rooms are being let out otherwise they could deny any liability as it wouldn't have been disclosed by the Insured.

Our insurer is aware of circumstances where a client let their Club Room/House out to a Third Party for a Wedding. An individual at the wedding fell over (whilst intoxicated) and caused herself injury. A solicitor was employed and lodged a claim for negligence by the Owner of the Property advising that adequate safety measures, procedures weren't in place. Although the client wasn't negligent nor involved in the function at all their insurer had to defend the claim and settled third party damages for over \$100,000 odd dollars. Therefore, for all parties concerned I would say it would be best to advise of any events, hiring out and functions which may take place.

BACKING OUR YOUNG SPORTING CHAMPIONS

Over 1800 individual young sportspeople and over 200 teams across Australia will be awarded grants each year under the Government's new Local Sporting Champions program.

The grants are available through Australian Sports Commission. The application process is rolling until December of this year.

The Local Sporting Champions Program is designed to help people aged 12 to 18 years to help cover the cost of attending and competing in major sporting events.

Grants of \$500 per individual and \$3,000 per team are available to help meet costs such as travel, equipment, uniforms, and accommodation.

This will particularly help young athletes and junior sports teams as they often have to travel interstate to compete in major events.

A total of \$12,500 will be available in each electorate each year in grants to help young sports people achieve their sporting goals.

Applications for grants can be made at any time throughout the year, either through the Australian Sports Commission or through your local Federal electorate office.

Who can apply for the Local Sporting Champions program grant?

Applicants must meet the following criteria:

Be between 12 and 18 years of age (inclusive) at the time of the nominated sporting competition;

Be participating in an official National Sporting Organisation endorsed state or national sporting competition or national school sport competition; and

Be required to travel greater than 250km, return.

Individuals and teams that receive funding from other government sources will not be eligible to receive funding from the Local Sporting Champions program.

Some Tips for Applying from the Selection Committee

- Make clear the representation level of the event that you or your team are attending, for example; is it a state championship?
- Include your pathway to the event.
- Include an explanation of why you believe you or your team should receive the funding.
- What support and resources are generally available to you to compete at this event.

Camping at the National Shooting Grounds

The ACTA has established 16 powered camping sites for members only at the National Shooting Grounds in Wagga Wagga. These sites can be booked for any shoots held at the grounds by phoning the ACTA office during office hours on 02 6931 0122. All bookings must be made with the ACTA office. Bookings for future competitions at the National shooting Grounds can be made 12 months in advance of the day the site is required.

Cost of sites is \$15 a night for powered sites and \$7 a night for unpowered sites. Toilet and showers facilities are available at the grounds.

Members passing through Wagga who want to camp on the grounds at any other time can do so by contacting the ACTA office to reserve a site. On arrival at Wagga a key to the grounds can be picked up from the ACTA office at 308 Copland Street. A refundable deposit of \$30 is payable for the key. Site fees are as above.

SA TRAP CARNIVAL



The weekend of February 6 – 8 saw some of the most extreme shooting conditions that have ever been encountered at a South Australian State Carnival. With temperatures peaking at 46 degrees and a 40 knot “breeze”, gusting at times to 80 knots, with associated dust storm, shooters are to be congratulated for their fantastic effort in competing, backing up and assisting where possible.

Any person who won an overall, grade or section prize at any time during the weekend can take with them the fact that they truly earned the award.

And awards they were. Sponsors including Sports Shooters Shop, Adelaide Gun Shop, Beretta Australia, Fisher Firearms, Winchester, Phil Mules, Corsivia Targets, Coopers Brewery and Marsh Insurance ensured that all trophies were hotly contested. Over \$20,000 in guns, ammunition, cash and prizes were given as trophies over the three days.

156 shooters from all states and territories attended the carnival

and it is with their dedication in attending that makes the effort in running the event worthwhile.

Day one being Friday the 6th of February opened the shooting with the “Sports Shooters Shop” 75 Target Champion of Champions event. There was only a slight breeze, but temperatures hovering around 45 degrees all day made it hot, tiring and trying. The overall winner was Marc Crimmins from Victoria with 149/150. Eric Parletta took out AA Grade, Steve Edmonds A Grade, Michael Raper B Grade and Andrew Carrigan C Grade.

After a tight shootoff the “Adelaide Gun Shop” State Handicap was won by Dylan Bone taking the \$1000 cash for the event (91/91). Dylan is fast becoming a recognised shooter in South Australia and a dominant competitor of distinction. South Australia is proud to have a shooter of Dylan’s calibre performing at a State level. Dylan outshot Robert Yeo who took out second prize from Lee Orval third. The South Australian State Handicap provides prizes to 10th place, as well as a junior award, this year won by Zac McGuirk.

Day two opened to the 46 degrees, a 40 knot northerly with 80 knot bursts and a dust storm thrown in to test the best. Shooters were lucky that the northerly changed to a southerly later in the day. Same temperatures and wind strength, just not so much grit in your mouth when trying to talk.

The South Australian Zone shoots started competition with the Western Zone being the winning Open Team, Eastern Zone the Ladies and Veterans team and Western Zone the juniors. The zone shoot showcases some of the best shooters in the state and gives us all the opportunity to view the shooters of the future in junior competition.

A fiercely contested event is the "Pat and Ray Mack Trophy". Overall winners of a South Australian State Title during the previous year are eligible to compete – this ensuring the "best of the best" is the final winner. Not only do you have to win an overall State Title to get a berth in the event, you then have to go on to beat all of those eligible over double barrel, single barrel, pointscore, handicap and double rise targets. Ross Walsh (arguably a South Australian) impressed everyone at the carnival by taking away the trophy and title.

Event 3, sponsored by "Beretta Australia" being the 50 Target State Single Barrel saw Chris Jorgensen take out the overall from Marc Crimmins AA Grade (50/50), Allan Vilcins A Grade, Greg Kessegian B Grade and Ian Watkins C Grade. The overall winner of this event was presented with an "U/O shotgun" by Dick Ayres on behalf of Beretta. This fine sponsorship and equally great trophies were greatly appreciated by all of the shooters.

Event 4, the "Winchester" 50 Target State Double Barrel shootoff only went 107 targets but after a day of 46 degree temperature, enduring hot winds and blustery conditions, local shooter Dino Olivero was the overall winner from Max Medhurst AA Grade, Bryon Bone A Grade, Kevin Burzacott B Grade and Andrew Carrigan C Grade. Winchester Australia and the sponsor, Tim Steer donated both a .17 calibre Brno Rifle and 12 gauge ammunition as prizes for

This evening provides a free catered barbeque for all those that attend to see the presentation for the first four events and State Awards.

During the evening, two new "Life Members" were recognised for their valuable contribution to the sport. Mr Robert Andrews and Mrs Linda Andrews who have each donated over 40 years of administration and time to the sport were presented "life Membership" certificates by the SACTA Patron, Judge Kelvyn Prescott. Congratulations to both Linda and Bob, two well deserving people for one of the highest awards that can be bestowed.

Another award that is gaining notoriety is the "SACTA Junior Scholarship", the recipient being selected by a committee of four, representing the three zones of the State, Chaired by the Patron. This award includes a certificate of recognition and \$1000 cash to be used to assist the recipient further in the sport. This year saw Dylan Bone be presented the SACTA Scholarship by the Patron, Judge Kelvyn Prescott. A worthy winner who will take the sport to a new level and is a fine representative of South Australia.

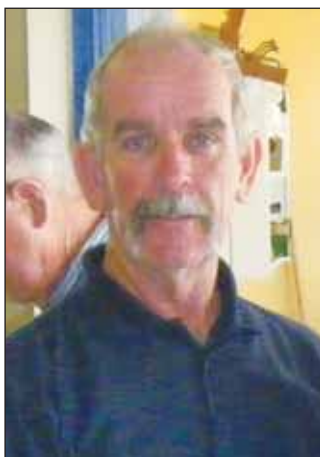

Psychological Skills for Shooting

LASERFIRE

You will have noticed that for the past few months there has been an advertisement in this magazine for the Arrow Laser Shot and the Arrow Laser Fire. Regular readers will know that bought an Arrow Laser Shot in 2007 and this remarkable little gadget has become a popular companion that I need to take to with me whenever I go to a shoot. I am now regularly asked if I have brought it with me and "can I use it to see where my gun is pointing." At most shoots when I get it set up, it's not long before there are several shooters waiting patiently to see what it can do and us to check their gun.

The main purpose of the Arrow Laser Shot is to practice and refine gun-mount technique. How often have we heard shooters say "...well I put the gun up and even though it didn't feel right, I thought it would be OK." And we all know the result: at best you just crack the target, but it's likely that you'll miss. Pat Parelli, the Natural Horsemanship guru claims that "practice doesn't make perfect, perfect practice makes perfect." What the Arrow Laser Shot does is that it makes you practice perfectly.

The Arrow Laser Shot has been a big success at the coaching clinics I have attended and recently at Newcastle-Lake Macquarie CTC it was interesting to watch junior shooters try the Arrow Laser Shot and for them to see how hard it was to hold their gun still and steady and how difficult it was to keep the gun aligned when tracking the cornice across the room.

I recently received a LaserFire, and even though I had seen the ads for the LaserFire in magazines I was unsure of what it actually was and what it could do. The LaserFire is a target simulator that projects either one or two laser dots, that represent targets, on a wall, roof, etc. It is very easy to set up and fun to use.

The LaserFire allows shooters to practice their gun-swing for a variety of targets, angles, speeds and directions. Even though I mainly shoot trap, it became immediately apparent the benefit that this machine would have for coaching skeet and sporting. A few days after it arrived in the mail, I took it across to a sporting clays shoot and set it up in the clubhouse. I had the Arrow Laser Shot set up as well so shooters could put the Arrow Laser Shot in their gun and could practice tracking and leading a variety of targets. Initially, we had it set for a high house skeet target and it was easy to show those gathered around what 'sustained lead' really is. With this machine and the Arrow Laser Shot it is very easy to practice. Once the shooters seemed to get the sight picture established it was easy to increase the speed of the laser being projected across the wall, thereby increasing the difficulty. The LaserFire come with its own little tripod, but by putting it on a full size camera tripod it became easier to adjust the

angle. Very soon the shooters who were gathered around had targets going across the floor (rabbits), going up walls (springing teals), high and low house skeet targets. By repositioning themselves they could get the LaserFire to project targets coming at them or have target going over their shoulders in a variety of angles. The types of targets that could be simulated by this machine was limited only by your imagination.

What can the LaserFire do? It can provide a single target at varying speed and directions. It can be voice activated or it can be on a continuous loop. It can be

used to practice and refine your gun mount, gun swing and follow through. Combined with the Arrow laser Shot it can show where the point of impact is in relation to the target and because the target is always moving it the user can see if they are behind, in front, below, above etc.

The two products work extremely well in tandem and are able to show in a concrete way the sight picture, especially for a skeet target. For a long time (until I had some professional coaching) I had no idea about leading a high or low house target from stations 3,4 or 5. I thought what I was doing was OK. The LaserFire and the Arrow laser Shot show exactly what is happening and where your gun should be. It is useful demonstrating sustained lead, swinging through and following through.

The advertisements claim that both the LaserFire and the Arrow laser Shot are specifically designed to help the shooter and that is exactly what they do. Combined and incorporated with qualified coach these products will be a valuable tool for getting novice shooters to understand the fundamentals and mechanics of hitting moving targets, and assisting the more experienced shooter improve.

Improvements will happen because the Arrow Laser Shot will show the shooter where his or her gun is pointing. This will lead to enhanced confidence and competence in the gun. Regular use will enable the shooter to practice and perfect gun mount, so that it becomes automatic and correct every time, time and time again. And when the shooter combines the Arrow laser Shot with the LaserFire, several other things will happen. There will be an opportunity to dry practice and over practice which should lead to the muscles and the brain thinking that this is easy. There will be a greater understanding of the mechanics of the process of shooting a moving target. This understanding will again lead to greater confidence and mental toughness, because the shooter knows how his gun, eyes, arms, brain, etc are all able to work together. By focusing on the process during these dry training sessions shooters are able to put this into practice on the layout by focusing on the process again. This will keep you in the here and now and will reduce self doubt. Staying focused on the process will mean that the product (the score) will look after itself.

One could argue that a simple computer game could provide the same hand-eye co-ordination practice, but what these tools do is that put your gun in your hands and provide hours of fun within serious practice.

Apologies aside, the shoot did go on, and started with a 25 target Trench Graded Cash Divide, being a cash divide there was no Overall prize, just three grades of 1st and 2nd cash dividends. Steve Atkins collected 1st in A with a 22/25, Craig Fitzgerald 2nd in A 21/25, B 1st was Geoff Viney 24/25, B 2nd Amanda Holt 22/25, C 1st Steve Traill 23/25, C 2nd Laurie Gee 18/25.

A 25 target Continental Double Barrel Championship was the 2nd event and after a very short shoot off, Club President, Ron Traill, held all comers off and picked up the Overall Sash, and 1st in A grade, with an excellent 28/28 score. Colac member Amanda Holt came 2nd in A grade with a 24/25 score, AA 1st was S Traill 27/28, AA 2nd S Atkins 26/27, B 1st Ian Gebhardt 23/25, B 2nd David Cox 25/28, C 1st Kurt Northausen 20/25, and 2nd in C grade was Barry Rogers on 19/25.

Event three was a 15 pair Double Rise Championship, and Overall winner and 1st in AA grade was S Atkins only two targets down on 28/30. A grade 1st was R Traill one target further back on 27/30, B 1st, after a five pair shoot off, was D Cox 30/40, and C grade 1st was a junior shooter having a good day out, Kurt Northausen, on a score of 19/30.

John Gemmill, a Yarrawonga member, and Amanda Holt, from Colac, teamed up to prove to be an unbeatable pair in event four, a 20 pair Deauville Doubles Championship, Amanda and John the only team able to shoot all 20 pair of targets off the handicap mark of 20 metres. With a gusty wind moving targets both up and down, and shooting from the 20 metre mark, this event proved to

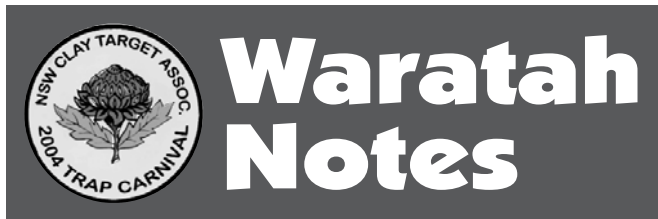

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

GENERAL

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.
Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
2. Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
3. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** may be incurred.
4. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination and will be re-squadded towards the end of the event.
5. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
6. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
7. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfill their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score may incur a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** may be incurred in the event concerned.
8. Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first round of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility may be penalised one target. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for they're failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.
9. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised **FIVE (5) TARGETS**.
10. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
11. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
12. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall choose in which team they may be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
13. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any section prize.
14. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
15. Nominations will close daily at 11.00am or at the discretion of the Tournament Director.
16. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behaviour of the card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.
17. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
18. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
19. Reduced Nominations shall apply to Juniors and Sub-Juniors. Also partners' entering into the same event whose nomination is lodged at the same time as a member paying full nomination fees. Shooters paying reduced Noms are eligible for Overall, Grade and section prizes.
20. ***All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Championships.***
21. Squads of 5 to shoot 50 targets in brackets of 25, one visit only to the traps. Squads of 5 to shoot 100 targets in brackets of 50, two visits to the traps.
22. Optional sweep/purse nominations shall be noted on a separate form from shooting nominations and are not refundable.
23. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.

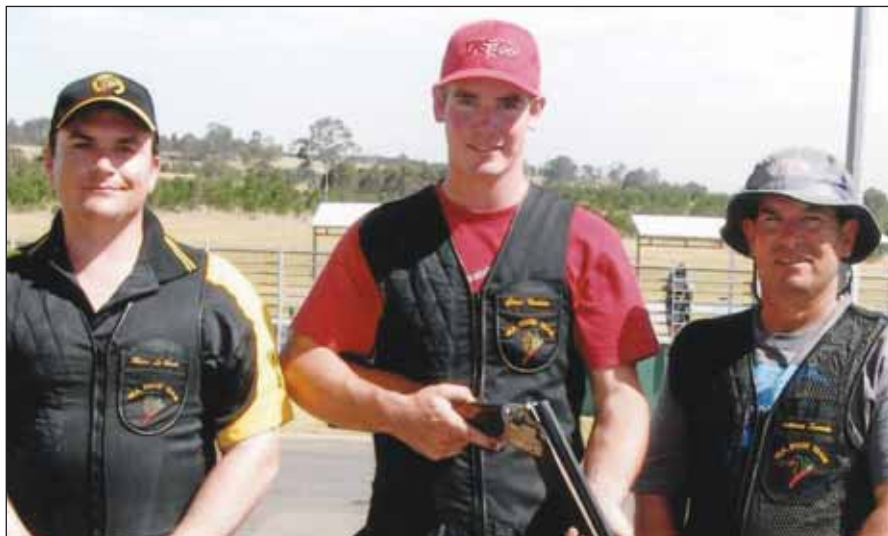

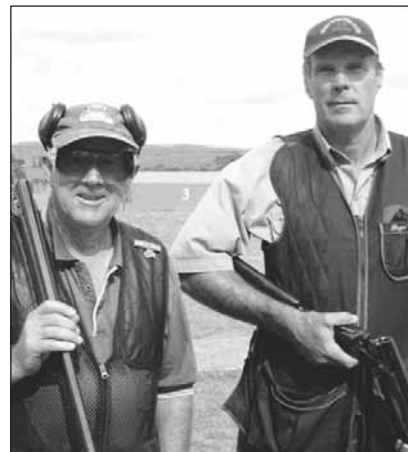

The 1st World Skeet Championships will be held at Doveridge Clay Sports Centre, Eaton Hall Farm, Upwoods Road, Ashbourne, Derbyshire, DE6 5LN

Located just off the main A50 Derby to Stoke road, approximately 1.5 miles from Uttoxeter town centre.

The M6 (Junction 14 ~ Stafford) is only 19.7 miles away, with East Midlands Airport 27.6 miles away.

COMPETITION: International Clay Target Shooting Federation World Skeet Championship

EVENT OPENING DATE: Monday 3rd August PM

COMPETITION DATES: Wednesday 5th August Sunday 9th August

INDIVIDUAL ENTRY FEE: £115 pounds sterling

TARGETS: No Steel shots permitted on ground.

Will be shot over six layouts, with all competitors [510] shooting at 150 targets, [75 targets each day over two non consecutive days] with the top 30% [150] of class and category then going forward to shoot at another 50 targets on Sunday morning. Following the completion of the 200 target stage, any ties down to third position in both class and category will then be shot off for.

TIE BREAK FOR INDIVIDUALS IN MEDAL POSITIONS:

Will be decided by shooting a further round of 25 targets, if a tie still exists another round of 25 targets will be shot. If a tie still exists, pairs will be shot from station four as laid out in the technical rules until a winner is decided.

TARGET SEQUENCE:

4.02 25 Targets will be shot at in the following sequence:-

- Station 1 Two singles and a double
- Station 2 Two singles and a double

Station 3 Two singles

Station 4 Two singles and a double (the shooter must nominate the first target of the double to be shot at)

Station 5 Two singles

Station 6 Two singles and a double

Station 7 Two singles and a double

4.03 The first target to be shot at in singles on stations 1 through 6 will be the target from the High House but, on station 7, it must be the Low House target.

4.04 The first target to be shot at in Doubles on stations 1 and 2 will be the High House, and on stations 6 and 7 will be the Low House.

4.05 Each Competitor must complete their shooting on each stand before leaving that stand, and not move to the next stand before the remainder of the squad has completed the sequence on that stand.

OPTION

4.06 To complete the round of 25 targets, the first missed target will be repeated and the result will be recorded as the twenty-fifth shot. However, should the Competitor hit twenty-four targets in the required sequence on stations one through seven, they shall have the "option" to shoot the twenty-fifth as either a High or Low House target from station seven.

LOADING OF CARTRIDGES

4.07 During the shooting of singles it is compulsory to load two cartridges. Refer to rule 4.63 also on this point.

REPEAT TARGET

4.08 The Referee will call for a "Repeat Target" to be taken after the Competitor has either missed their first target during a round, or after a "No Target". The Competitor must reload the gun with another cartridge before taking the repeat target.

VIEWING TARGETS

4.09 At the beginning of each round when the squad is assembled at station 1, they shall be entitled to observe one regular target from each trap house. A Competitor may also ask to have one regular target thrown after each irregular target or trap breakdown.

TEAM COMPETITION:

Teams will be made up of five seniors, three ladies, three juniors [under 21 [twenty one] on 9th August 2009]] and three veterans [60 [sixty] or over on 5th August 2009]] A maximum of two teams in each category is permitted.

Results for all team competitions will be determined at the completion of the 150 target stage.

TEAM ENTRY FEE: (in addition to Individual entry fee)

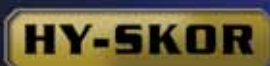
