Our championship was indeed a memorable experience and as expected the Roma Clay Target Club provided first class amenities for our championships which attracted a record attendance of 3850 entries over the six days of competition.

\$2.00 from each championship entry was collected for the Victorian Bush Fire Appeal and the North Queensland Flood Appeal which totalled \$7,254.00 this amount will be matched dollar for dollar by your association, and a further \$2,838.05 was raised in a raffle organised by George Sckaf, monies will be forwarded to the relevant State associations who will distribute to these appeals in the next month.

During the ACTA Hall of Fame evening special awards were presented, Life Registration was awarded to our past President Mr. Bill Jones., Bill received resounding acclamation for his service to our association. Bill served on the National Executive from 1991 to 2007 and during this time was chairman of finance committee, National Vice President, and National President.

The 2008 Presidential Medal was awarded to two of our members being Mr. Jim Shepherd from Maryborough, Victoria and Mr. Rodney Woodrow from Wandoan, Queensland. Jim's nomination and achievements were presented by VCTA Vice President Mr. Glen Woodhatch who highlighted Jim's involvement in Victoria in coaching, (Advanced Coach formerly, level 3 accredited coach), and State rules supervisor. Rodney's achievements were presented by Mr. Daryl Stevens highlighting Rodney's involvement in his Zone administration and State coaching, (Advanced Coach formerly, level 2 accredited coach).

Congratulations to everyone involved in the presentation of the Trap Nationals in Roma, Queensland. What a fantastic week of shooting with new records set in shooting and attendances. The QCTA arranged all of the staff for the Office for the duration of the Championships and these people certainly made the event work like a well oiled machine.

The liaison between the QCTA, the office, the Championship committee, Tournament referee and shoot marshal Bill Allan and his assistants ensured a smooth Championship. It was a fascinating week for me to be involved in all of these aspects of the carnival. During the coming weeks we will look at all aspects of the Championship and decisions on any variation will be advertised.

The Roma Gun Club showed a fantastic willingness to deliver the hospitality they are renown for with functions on every night excepting the ACTA Presentation night. To the QCTA and the Roma Club congratulations and thank you for the effort you put in.

The Presentation evening which incorporated the Presidential medals, life membership and the induction of Vin Ryan, Russell Mark and Lynne Curtis into the ACTA Hall of Fame was an outstanding evening. The level of support was great with 280 people in attendance. Once again the Roma Club excelled in providing a great venue which itself houses the Queensland Hall of Fame. The Queensland hall of fame was officially opened on the Saturday evening during the Pre Nationals at a gala dinner which hosted 250 parochial Queenslanders. And I might add a great night, recognising some of the States most revered shooters.

We have also followed on from Roma with the National Junior Camp conducted at the National ground. 26 youngsters attended and were given a comprehensive report from coach Graeme Boyd. Well known shooter and Psychologist Michael Kruger-Davis also attended providing the group with further opportunities to develop the mental side of their sport. In addition local News editor with PRIME Television Doug Hogan provided an insight into what the media want from athletes, why we need the media and how to use the Media to assist your sponsors and the sport. The group was all sent back home armed with photo's and a requirement to contact their local media with a story on the camp.

The Junior program is under review with a great deal of input from Graeme Boyd and State Coaching Directors as well as interested parties and stakeholders. The Junior program needs to reflect the expectation and commitment of the ACTA, State Associations, Zones and clubs. This evaluation should be completed by the end of June for consideration by the National Executive at their Annual meeting.

There has already been significant change with the July camp cancelled. The next camp which will be conducted over 4 days in late September will see the proposed changes in place.

Some State directors of coaching and National coach Graeme Boyd will be attending the Australian Sports Commission on the 16th & 17th of May for a Presenter and Assessor Course arranged by Australian International Shooting Ltd.

This is a very hectic time of the year with all of the Major Championships, camps and meetings in the first half of the year. Following the National Executive meeting in June a comprehensive planning and implementation process will allow us to further develop the sport.

The Website, CTSN, Coaching, Championships, National Ground, Sponsorship, promotion and development, future membership initiatives are just some of the target area's we will develop.

10-18 October

SHOOTERS IN SEVENTH HEAVEN

Shooters can be in seventh heaven at the Sydney 2009 World Masters Games – for just \$275 they can shoot in all seven clay target events at the world's largest multi-sport festival.

For \$275 (the standard Games competitor registration fee of \$220 plus \$55 for the provision of clay targets), shooters aged 30 years and over can compete in seven events on seven consecutive days at the Sydney International Shooting Centre, where Michael Diamond won gold for Australia in the men's trap at the Sydney 2000 Olympics.

After two practice days (10-11 October), the seven Games clay target shooting events will commence on 12 October with the double barrel and conclude on 18 October with the second and final phases of the International Shooting Sport Federation trap. In between, there will also be single barrel, points double barrel, American skeet, ISSF skeet and ISSF double trap events at the Sydney 2000 Olympics site.



Running 10-18 October, the Games are open to everyone rather than just elite competitors. To enter the Games people need only meet their sport's minimum age, which in the case of shooting is just 30. There are ten age/gender categories in the non-ISSF clay target events (30-39, 40-49, 50-59, 60-69 and 70+ for both men and women) and four age/gender categories (30-49 and 50+ for both men and women) in the ISSF clay target events.

Games competitors will get a bang for their buck because the \$275 fee not only includes entry into all seven clay target shooting events but also a wide range of other benefits, including free public transport on Sydney's extensive network of trains, buses and ferries during the Games, a Games

backpack and an allocated seat at what will be a spectacular Games Opening Ceremony on the night of 11 October.

The Games are the world's largest multi-sport event because they attract more than double the number of competitors of the Olympics. Games organisers are expecting 25,000 people from more than 100 countries will compete in 28 sports across 72 Sydney venues, including many Olympic sites, over nine action-packed days.

"This October, thousands of everyday people will have extraordinary experiences at the Sydney 2009 World Masters Games. You can be one of them," Games Organising Committee Chief Executive Officer Shane O'Leary said.

"It doesn't matter how good or how old you are. Everyone's invited to take part in this great festival of sport. The Sydney 2009 World Masters Games are all about being fit, fun and forever young. Don't miss out on your opportunity of a lifetime."

Kevin Law Memorial Skeet Ch/Ship. and was won by AA Grade Gil Farish from Benalla using his 20 Gauge gun, shooting 49/50 with 2nd in AA by keen and expert shot Mal Briggs from Melbourne returning a score of 48/50, 1st place in A grade and overall was won by John Pope with a sterling result of 56/56. John and his wife Pam are travelling around Australia, seeing the country and taking in as many skeet shoots as possible. John's help here in coaching, refereeing and other helpful advice is much appreciated by our Club, 2nd place in A grade was won by local Champ David Jackel Snr shooting 55/56, 1st place in B grade was taken out by Shepparton shooter Peter Finn on 51/52, who probably won't stay in B grade much longer the way he is shooting, with 2nd place won by local gentleman and keen skeet competitor Harry Memery on 50/52, Bryce Robinson took out 1st in C grade with 48/50 with 2nd in C by Brian North shooting 46/50. It is great to see Brian taking a serious interest in Skeet, having been a long term member and contributor to the Wangaratta Club.

The second event was the Bill Attwood Skeet Ch/Ship which was won by Gil Farish shooting a perfect score of 54/54 with 2nd in AA grade by Mal Briggs shooting 53/54, 1st place in A grade was won by Lockie Irons from Melbourne with a score of 52/54, closely followed by

David Jackel on 49/50, our Melbourne friend Mario Marino shot very well to win 1st in B grade with a great score of 49/50, well done Mario, 2nd place in B was won by Peter Finn on 47/50 another good result, C grade was taken out by Brian North shooting 45/50 in front of Justin Hayden a relative newcomer to the sport returning a score of 47/54, well done Justin.

The overall Attwood –Law High Gun Cup was won by David Jackel snr with 103/104, Veterans High Gun by Harry Memery shooting 95/100 and Ladies High Gun by Lesley Wotyojez shooting a terrific result of 94/100. I believe Lesley went home a very satisfied competitor, you could tell by the smile on her face.

JUNIOR DEVELOPMENT CAMP

The National Junior development camp has been completed in April following the National Trap Championships in Roma. The camp was conducted at the National Ground in Wagga Wagga with seven girls and nineteen boys making up the squad.

The camp took many aspects of coaching into account with Graeme Boyd and Fred Rapley evaluating the shooters and their guns individually. The camp forms part of the National Development program which is currently the subject of some major changes. These changes will encompass evaluation of the timing and structure including the content of the camp.

The new structure will see two camps conducted over four days with a wider variety of activities and more one on one coaching. The specific requirements of this will be further enhanced and evaluated to ensure the athletes go away with more to work on and report back on. In this day of advanced technology the participants will be expected to retain greater communication with Coach Graeme Boyd.

ACTA COACHING STRUCTURE

The Coaching scheme, which has been under a review and changed through AISL and the Australian Sports Commission should be rolled out in the second half of 2009. A transition strategy for existing current coaches into the new ACTA Coaching Structure will operate as follows:

- Level 1 Coaches – will be automatically converted to “Club Coaches”.
- Level 2 and 3 Coaches – will be automatically converted to “Advanced Coaches”

The ACTA Coaching Committee implemented the following conditions for the implementation of the new Coaching Structure:

- All current coaches must complete the Club Coach Course within two years starting from the 1st of January 2009
- Re-accreditation is due every five years on the Coach's birthday to allow a steady process of managing the paperwork From the ACTA National Office
- This re-accreditation involves a proforma letter sent to coaches allowing them to reapply by proving they have been actively coaching. This must be signed off by a Club President or Secretary.
- All administration procedures (such as re-accreditation) will be centrally stored and completed by the ACTA National Office. This will ensure all data is kept up to date and easily accessible for the ACTA Coaching Committee. A copy of the database for Coaches will be sent to the Australian Sports Commission regularly

The new Club Coach (formerly Level one) will be conducted by Level two coaches under the guidance of the State organisation. The structure will be supported by Clubs, State and National criteria currently under development. The Club Coach courses will be conducted through zones with Clubs applying to conduct the courses. The State will approve these courses and the content prior to consent being given. The National Association will approve all Advanced Coaching courses applied for from States. There will be an opportunity for the courses to be run in conjunction with State and/or National Development camps.

Shooting at Mathoura

Location 768 km south-west of Sydney in the Riverina
Region of NSW

Friday evening, on the 27th of March, saw an excellent roll up of six squads of shooters arrive at the Mathoura Gun Club, to compete in the four event program on offer for the night. And with the perfect shooting weather, a mild 20 degrees, clear skies, and almost no breeze, the competitors enjoyed excellent clay target shooting.

Members of Bendigo and Deniliquin stole the night with winning positions on every event, with virtually no locals able to claim a top place. A really good contingent of junior learner shooters were on hand once again, mixing in with the experienced members, and starting to record some fairly decent scores, showing their enjoyment with smiles on their faces at every busted target.

Bendigo member, Leigh Knight, took out the Overall Sash and 1st in A grade trophy in the main event, the 25 target Single Barrel Night Championship with a score of 22/25, well shot Leigh! John Berryman collected B grade 1st with his score of 19/25, and Bert Knight surprised himself, by nabbing the C grade 1st trophy with a score of 14/25. Some of these scores may seem low, but shooting single barrel under lights is not an easy task, and really the scores are quite reasonable.

Deniliquin member Tim Maher survived a six target shoot-off with local member John Berryman to collect 1st place in the final event, a 15 target Double Barrel. John took out 2nd place, and Deniliquin member, Bruce Cook, collected 3rd place with one target lost, on a 14/15 score.

Event One was a 10 target Single Barrel Cash Divide, and Bendigo member Peter Ackermans collected 1st place money with a credible 9/10 score, Tim Maher and John Berryman both shot an 8/10 and shared 2nd place cash.

Event Two was a 10 target Points Score Cash Divide, and one shooter, Deniliquin member, Rod Wharton, shot very well, losing only one point, taking out 1st place cash with a score of 29/30, T Maher and G Betts both shot a 26/30, and both got a share of 2nd place cash.

With a big roll up of shooters and four events on the program, it could have been a very late night, but, with only one shoot off needed, and the whole shoot running smoothly, all shooting, and even presentations were all over by the respectable time of 11.30pm. Harry (snow) O'Connor stood in for unavailable President, Roger Kerslake, making the presentations, and thanking everyone for not only travelling to the shoot, but for also helping the shoot to run so smoothly.

2009 TRAP CARNIVAL

Tasmanian Clay Target Association Inc

The TCTA held its annual Trap Carnival at the Tasmanian Gun Club at Nile Road Evandale over the period 23rd-26th January 2009. Conditions were excellent, however it was relatively windy on the first day, making the competition reasonably difficult. The Tasmanian Gun Club ran a 50 target points score sweepstakes on the Friday with 65 shooters taking part to get some experience of the local conditions prior to the carnival.

The four days were hot sunny days with moderate northerly winds on the first day and a half, falling to an almost breathless day on the Monday. This carnival was our most successful, the biggest field ever at a Tasmanian event with the exception of the three national titles held here in the past.

The excellent turnout saw 204 shooters compete over the four day period, an increase of 32 shooters over our previous largest number in 2007. This is testimonial to the tireless effort of the TCTA over the past several years in lifting the profile of the carnival.

The carnival was shot over six Canterbury automatic traps, with the addition of a seventh Canterbury trap this year to provide Double Rise and DTL practice. As always the grounds and equipment are a credit to the host club.

There were around 100 shooters from the mainland in attendance to keep the locals honest and all indications are that they would like to be back next year if possible. Winners were from all corners, 23 locals had wins in the various grades and sections.

The mainland shooters came from as far a field as Queensland and Western Australia. Despite increased target costs prize monies were still in line with other top carnivals around Australia, this is achieved by shooter participation.

Again it is obvious that this carnival is now a truly national event and still attracting more and more shooters annually from the northern states. With the airport and accommodation less than 10 minutes away from the Tasmanian Gun Club it is one of the better shooting destinations in Australia.

Some very good competition was experienced, 64 people shot the 50/50 in the Sate Double Barrel Championship culminating in a long shoot off between Mark Crevatin, Arty Del-Ben and Kevin Thompson.

Kevin Thompson falling by the wayside at 735 and Arty Del-Ben missing his 796th target to succumb to Mark Crevatin. Several shooters achieved personal best scores, one achieving a 900 break long run break and two others 800 plus. Local shooter Chris Rockliff proved how capable he is with a creditable 523/524 also in this event.

The State Single Barrel Championship saw only eight shooters shoot the 50/50 and a reasonable quick win to Mark McInnes 78/78, however the State Points Score Championship saw 32 shooters shoot 150/150, with a win to Glen Castellaro on 420/420 from Sox Pilipadisidis 419/420.

Six shooters managed 50/50 in the Handicap event, with Noel West of Adelaide the eventual winner on 88/88, second was Ayden Morse of Devonport and third Craig Bentley also from Adelaide. Craig's effort of 74/75 was very creditable as he is on 25 metres, his score eclipsed the previous best Tasmanian score from 25 metres held by Sperry Marshall.

The wind played a bit of a nuisance in the double rise event which was won by Glen Castellaro with a 58/60 after a shoot off with Phil Grainger.

This was the weekend for many new break badges, a total of 25 shooters applying for break badges, I suspect there will be more

applications to come when some shooters sit back and recall their efforts.

Glen Castellaro went on to take the Overall High Gun for the three days with 371/378 after a shoot off with Bill Iles.

State team eliminations were also extremely tight with 4 points down in 250 needed to get into the shoot off for the 15 man squad.

The 100 target points score High Roller event conducted on Friday was again very popular, this year there were 27 competitors.

The winner was Glen Castellaro with a score of 374/375, second Mark Crimmins with 448/450, third James Vardenaga 447/450, fourth Geoff Faulkes 372/375 and Fifth B Powell 371/375.

Geoff Faulkes again donated a prestigious Belt buckle this year to the winner and the TCTA provided a sash.

The targets for the event were sponsored by White Flyer clay targets, the TCTA and shooters are very appreciative of White Flyer's contribution to the event in this regard.

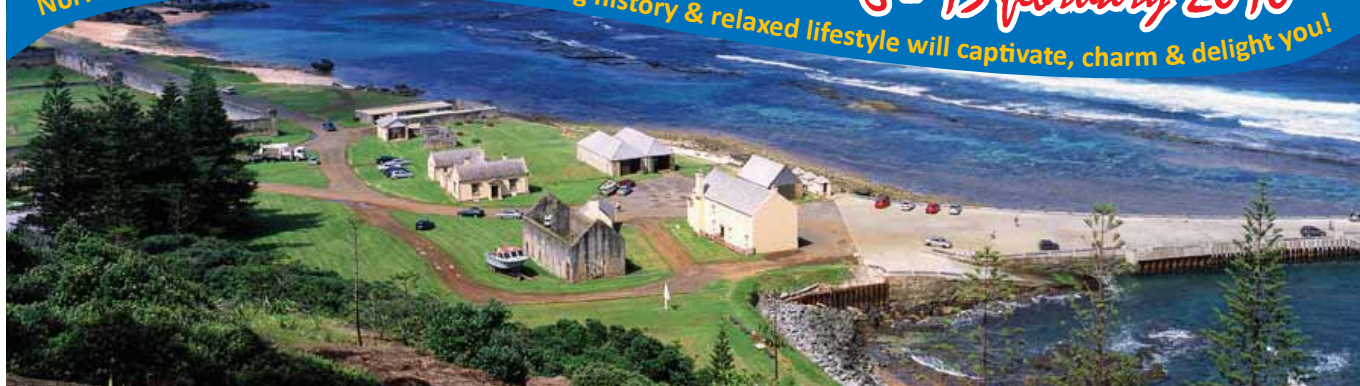
All in all a very successful carnival with lots of happy, but probably tired shooters.

2009 AUSTRALASIAN-PACIFIC "GRAND PRIX" AUSTRALIA CUP

Brisbane Gun Club – 26th February to 2nd March

Encouraging messages of congratulations received from numerous people following the conducting of the 15th annual Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix" competition at Brisbane recently have once again served to confirm the popularity of what is still readily accepted as one of the highlights of the Olympic Discipline calendar in Australia each year.

This year, a total of over 120 Olympic Trap, Skeet and Double Trap competitors lined up for the holding of the 2009 competition which for the first time included the conducting of an Australia Cup event in conjunction with the weekend Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix" competition.

Shooters from throughout Queensland, Northern Territory, New South Wales and Victoria were in attendance to again compete alongside the large contingent of Japanese shooters once more organised by Winchester Australia and their Japanese associate Japan Shotshell.

In all this year 35 shooters from Japan competed in the competition this year – 30 in the Olympic Trap events and 3 in the ISSF Skeet competitions. As usual, this was the first visit to Brisbane by the majority of the Japanese shooters, however, there were the odd few familiar faces who had been to the Brisbane competition in the past.

In order to cater for the conducting of the Australia Cup events for Australian International Shooting Limited, this year's program saw a reduction in the number of targets for the Australian-Pacific "Grand Prix" trap and skeet events from the 150 target format used in recent years to 125 targets. This brought the weekend's events into line with the procedures required by AISL to have a uniform competition for all Australia Cup events throughout the year.

Even with the reduction of the number of targets over the weekend, the 5 day carnival still offered the great competitions that the carnival has become so well accepted for. As usual, the first 2 days of competition was the conducting of the 200 target Australian Open events in both Olympic Trap and ISSF Skeet which this year was sponsored by Riddell Real Estate at Woombye on the Sunshine Coast. These events were shot 100 targets each day with the second day being the 100 targets Skins / Badge Match which is held in conjunction with the 200 target event. The weekend's event saw the holding of the annual Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix" events with the Australia Cup competitions being conducted in conjunction. Finals for the top 6 shooters were held in each event after the completion of the qualifying competition.

The first events on the program got underway on time on Thursday morning with six squads of Olympic Trap shooters and 2

squads of skeeties starting the proceedings. With 100 targets being shot on the first day, 2 Olympic Trap ranges were used and one skeet layout. The third trap range was already set up and ready for the early arrival of our Japanese visitors who were almost putting their guns together as they got off the bus. They wasted no time heading to the practice range, ready to shoot at as many targets as possible after their 9 hour flight from Tokyo. Early indications were that the weekends scores would be good with Steve Trembath recording their intentions by shooting clean 25s in the first round, while Adam Vella, Ben Kelly, Dan Johnson and last year's winner Marcello Cassella, all put 24s on the scoreboard. Nino Pedulla, Nidal Asmar, Kevin Perkins and Greg Newey were also amongst the top 10 as were father and daughter duo Pat and Kelly Coogan of Cairns.

25s were still a little scarce in the second round with only Adam Vella and Nino Pedulla getting the red writing on the board.

Daniel Allam, Frank Minici made up some lost ground with 24s while Nidal Asmar, Steve Trembath, Ben Kelly and Kevin Perkins were hanging in after rounds of 23/25.

As the first day rolled on, the scores dropped off a little. Adam Vella finished the day on top with 95/100, one target clear of Nino Pedulla while Steve Trembath, Ben Kelly and Kevin Perkins all finished on 91/100 for the day. As many would now be aware, Kevin Perkins has finally seen the light and recently moved to Hervey Bay, renouncing his honorary Queenslander title to become the 'real thing'.

On the skeet field, the locals contesting the first 200 target event were joined by shooters from NSW and Victoria as well as the 3 Japanese competitors who jumped into

the field as soon as they got off the bus. Cecil Park shooter Matt Maloney and Anthony Sottosanti from Frankston Australia lead the field after the first day's proceeding with 91/100 – only 1 target clear of Miyoshi Hiroyasu of Japan. Michael Ignuanti and Justin Ehrenreich were amongst the next best while the remainder of the field looked to have plenty of work to do to catch up on the second day.

The second day of competition was day of the 200 target Australian Open event in both trap and skeet which included the 100 target Skins Badge match in conjunction. All of our Japanese visitors now entered the competition 30 trap shooters and the 3 skeeties.

Over the years, the Skins competition has been very popular and as many shooters have commented, "there are no friends when you get into this competition". The trap competition once again looked like being a lucrative day for the winners with the AA/A section being worth \$180 per round and the B/C section having a pool of \$130 for each 25 targets.

The scores in the first round of trap on day 2 were down a little with 23/25 being the best recorded. There were five 23s meaning the first round pool jackpot round 2 now being worth \$360. Japanese shooter Mikio Hattori returned a 22/25 in the B/C section to collect \$130.

Adam Vella's 23 at his first appearance on day 2 increased his overall lead slightly to be 2 targets ahead of Nino Pedulla with Steve Trembath still hanging in on 114/125. Adam's second round was another 23/25 which had him retain the lead still 2 targets up on Nino with Steve recording yet another 23 to keep in touch. The jackpot of \$360 was shared jointly by Daniel Allam and Danny Di Pietro who both carded 24s. The B/C prize money of \$130 this time went to Travis Gull of Sebastapol with 22/25.

From here on, it was all Adam Vella. Adam recorded clean 25s in both the 3rd and 4th rounds to finish the day on 191/200, six targets clear of Nino Pedulla with Steve Trembath on 180, Daniel Allam on 179, Nidal Asmar on 178 and Ben Kelly on 175 making up the field for the 6 man final.

Adam's final rounds saw him share the skins in round 3 with Daniel Allam and Craig Henwood and take the 4th round money on his own. A good day for Adam receiving \$240 from the skins while Japan's Kazuya Fujikawa picked up the \$130 spoils in round 3 of the B/C section and Anna Shadrina received the \$130 in the final round.

At the conclusion of the single-barrel final the positions remained unchanged. Adam finished on 191 + 22 to increase his overall lead slightly and take out the Australian Open Championship which was sponsored by Riddell Real Estate from the Sunshine Coast.

In the ISSF Skeet Championship, Matt Maloney continued his consistent shooting 22, 23, 22, 22 on the second day to finish 5 targets ahead of Anthony Sottosanti. Michael Ignuanti, Mark Kempnich, Eddy Elder and Andrew Knox filled the balance of the positions for the final.

competition and it goes without saying that their continued support has contributed to the long running success of the Australasian-Pacific “Grand Prix” carnival. In all, 90 Olympic Trap shooters and 16 ISSF Skeet shooters competed in the two days of competition, followed on Monday by the Australia Cup Double Trap event.

The 125 target events in both trap and skeet were to cater for all competitors; however, to allow for the women to record their 75 target scores, a final was scheduled for the women’s trap and skeet events after the completion of the first day’s proceedings.

With a great mix of quality competitors in the large field, the Olympic Trap program got under way at 9.30 a.m. with the event wide open and ‘up for grabs’ for the best shooters. A very poor start for a number of shooters including Adam Vella (19/25), Danial Cauchi (19/25) and Suzy Balogh (18/25) amongst others, was an early indication that this event was anyone’s event. Danny Di Pietro started well carding the only clean 25 of the first round but was closely followed by Taree junior Russell McCloy, Tony Cantali (Cecil Park), Kevin Perkins (Maryborough Qld), Catherine Skinner (Mansfield), Toshio Yasuda (Japan) and promising Cairns junior Kelly Coogan who all recorded 24/25. Another 9 shooters were all within striking distance being one target further back on 23/25.

At the completion of the second 25 targets, Russell McCloy had taken the early lead with a clean 25/25 to add to his early 24. Adam Vella also lifted his game to also record 25/25, while Nino Pedulla, Danial Cauchi, Kevin Perkins and Newcastle junior Nathan Wilkinson all came in one target down on 24/25. At this point in the proceedings, Russell McCloy had the early lead on 49/50, one target clear of Kevin Perkins and Danny Di Pietro and a further six shooters 2 more back on 46/50.

With only 3 rounds due to be completed for the day, it was now a race to see who would assume the role of overnight leader. Danny Di Pietro remained focused to lead the field at the end of day one on 72/75 with Russell McCloy and Kevin Perkins retaining their consistency coming in on 71/75, two targets ahead of Nidal Asmar and Nino Pedulla. Craig Henwood was hanging in on 68/75 while Adam Vella and Tony Cantali were still in with a chance on 67/75.

The women’s event was also very tight with Laetisha Scanlan taking first place into the Australia Cup final with a score of 66/75 followed by Suzy Balogh and Catherine Skinner both on 65, Michelle Beecham 64, Kelly Coogan 63 and Stacy Roiall rounding off the top six women competitors on 62/75.

The women’s final was a see-sawing affair which finally saw Suzy Balogh the winner by 2 targets.

In the ISSF Skeet event, the competition was also quite good despite the small attendance. Keith Ferguson from Sale, Victoria set the early pace carding a clean 25/25 at his first visit to the field, one target clear of George Barton of Tamworth who was closely followed by James Bolding (Frankston) and Japanese visitor Masaaki Tomokuni. Zita Dettori was the sole women amongst the skeeties but was proving no ‘easy beat’ carding 21, 21 & 23 to finish the day on 65/75.

At the conclusion of the first day’s competition in the skeet, Keith Ferguson still had a one target lead on George Barton finishing on 71/75 to George’s 70/75.

After 50 more targets on days two, George Barton had grabbed a one target lead to go into the final as top qualifier on 117/125. Keith Ferguson had a 116/125 and was followed by James Bolding 113, Miyoshi Hiroyasu 111, Anthony Sottosanti 109 and Masaaki Tomokuni 106.

Day two of the Olympic Trap competition was again heading towards a close finish. Youngster Russell McCloy showed he hadn’t lost any sleep overnight coming in clean after his first round to take yet a further target lead over most of the field. Danial Cauchi also carded a clean 25/25 while Adam Vella, Nino Pedulla, Stephen Zadro and Suzy Balogh all came in with 24s in round 4.

The final round of the 125 target event and Russell McCloy showed he was the one to beat dropping only one target in his final round to finish on 49/50 for the day and 120/125 for the event. Nino Pedulla also came in with 49/50 to take second place into the final alongside Danny Di Pietro with 118/125. Nidal Asmar (116), Adam Vella (114) and Danial Cauchi (114) made up the numbers for the six man final.

The final proved to be an exciting finale to the trap competition with last year’s champion Nidal Asmar recording a very good 23/25 to finish tied for first place with the front runner Russell McCloy on 139/150. A very short single barrel shoot-off saw Russell McCloy claim the overall winner’s spoils with Nidal Asmar having to settle for the second placing.

The final event on the 5 day program was the Australia Cup Double Trap competition. This was conducted over 150 targets on Monday after the conclusion of the trap and skeet events.

A small but enthusiastic field of 2 squads of shooters lined for the Double Trap event with Australian team members Craig Trembath and Tom Turner looking to be the ones to beat. Craig started extremely well recording 47/50 which was to be the best round for the entire event. Olympic Trap winner Russell McCloy started with a handy 38/50 while Tom Turner was in 3rd spot early with 36/50.

Rounds 2 and 3 saw Craig add 42/50 and 43/50 to his early score to take the top qualifying position in the final while Tom also cared 42 and 43 for second position and Russell McCloy 34 and 41 to be the third qualifier. Josh Collard, Michael Harris and Joe Raisarda filled the remaining 3 positions on the final.

Psychological Skills for Shooting

IDEAL PERFORMANCE STATE

Over the past months, I've been doing a considerable amount of work adolescent athletes with the Southern Sports Academy cycling squad, the netball squad, lawn Bowls and shooting squads from the Hunter Sports Academy and the Junior Development camp. The main issue with younger athletes, (and this is not dissimilar to adults) is that they are often still in the 'concrete' model of thinking: meaning they would rather just be on their bikes or out on the tracks shooting, rather than at 'formal operations thinking', where they can conceptualise and think about abstract construct, such as developing strategies to improve their performances over time.

I am often asked by these young athletes, and their coaches, how we can get them into the 'zone'. The concept of being in the 'zone' or 'the flow', is widely discussed in the literature is a state that many athletes strive to achieve but cannot achieve it over and over again.

The research and literature tells us there are eight mental and physical conditions that have been identified by athletes as being characteristics of the feelings they have at those moments when they are doing something extraordinarily well;

1. Being mentally relaxed or in a state of inner calm. Sometimes this can be described as the sense of time being slowed down and having a high degree of concentration.
2. Being physically relaxed so that muscles feel loose and fluid.
3. Confident /optimistic; feelings of self-confidence, being optimistic and positive about our own performance. This is very important during challenging times within the competition.
4. Focused on the present. Shooting is a here and now sport and we feel a sense of harmony when the body and mind is able to work as one unit. So in order for the body to perform here and now, our minds must also be in the here and now. This means shooting this target and not the one missed (in the past) or not the ones in the shoot off (in the future). By controlling the thoughts about the future and the past the body can perform automatically without conscious or deliberate mental effort.
5. Highly energised. A high energy state is frequently described as feelings of joy, ecstasy, intensity or being 'hot'.
6. Extraordinary awareness: A state of mind that allows the athlete to be acutely aware of their own bodies and of those around them.
7. In control. The body and mind seem to do automatically what is right without the need to exert or impose control.
8. In the cocoon. This involves feelings of detachment from the external environment and any potential distractions, where the athlete has complete access to one's powers and skills.

The eight qualities listed above are those that are evident when athletes reach peak performance. But there is a difference between being a very good club competitor and being a national champion. Williams (1993) continues and describes a psychological construct referred to as flow. Flow was defined by Csikszentmihalyi when the challenge equals skill level, when one knows what to do, one has clear goals, deep concentration, a sense of being in control, and a sense of loss of time; and the activity becomes automatic.

So, what its listed above is what we would all like to achieve, all the time, and if I knew the secret of how to continually achieve it, I wouldn't have to work again. Being in the 'zone' is just a by-product of reaching your Ideal Performance State. Mark Brownlee uses the term, Ideal Performance State, because it is less ambiguous than the 'zone'.

Brownlee argues that focusing on being in the 'zone' is fraught with problems. Firstly, that even though trying to do several things at once is desirable, it actually creates distractions and disrupts performance. Secondly, we should always be aiming for peak or perfect performances. Because peak performances are rare, expecting perfection leads to worry and frustration that deprives us of the enjoyment and motivation that is required to overcome difficulties and improve our skills. Finally, Brownlee talks about mindfulness. Mindfulness is the opposite to multitasking and means focusing your attention so that you are absorbed in the activity to the exclusion of everything else.

Now, armed with the information that Csikszentmihalyi believes is apparent for peak performances, Brownlee has put together the mental and physical attributes that result in consistently high performance in sport. To experience the Ideal Performance State the shooter must be;

1. Focused in the present: in the moment.
2. Breathing properly and relaxed, with the right level of muscle tension.
3. Energised and alert: being in a sense of calm-alertness or serene intensity.
4. Free of self consciousness and ego: not worrying about others.
5. Confident: that they must feel mental and physically prepared to perform well.
6. Directing concentration and awareness only to what is needed to perform well.
7. Always using positive and instructive self talk.

As you can see Csikszentmihalyi's conditions and Brownlee's attributes are basically the same. What is different is that Brownlee sees them as mental skills that can be planned for, practiced and achieved more regularly, that make up our own "ideal performance state".

NSW Members and Dealers

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

- (a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or
- (b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

- (a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

GENERAL

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded. Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
2. Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
3. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 25 targets.
4. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination or be re-squadded towards the end of the that round.
5. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
6. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each round. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
7. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score may incur a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** in the next round. Should a following round not be programmed then the penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** may be incurred in the round concerned.
8. Shooters may be drawn from the first day's last round squads to referee and score the first round of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility may be penalised one target. Whilst replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.
9. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with a trap will be penalised **FIVE (5) TARGETS**.
10. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
11. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
12. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade or section prize.
13. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals, trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
14. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behaviour of the card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.
15. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of the Jury, whose decision shall be final.
16. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
17. Reduced Nominations shall apply to Juniors. Juniors paying reduced Noms are eligible for Overall, Grade and section prizes.
18. ***All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Championships.***
19. Squads of 5 shooters to shoot 100 targets in four rounds of 25.
20. Regulation Skeet or Trap targets will be thrown, as well as mini, midi battue, rocket, rabbit or flash or any other sporting clay target approved by the Association. Target type for any stand will be at the discretion of the shoot committee, but shall number five (5) in total.
21. Squads will be rotated daily, shooters will be rotated within their squad every 25 targets.
22. Grading – ACTA members who do not already have a Sporting Grade and Shooters from other organisations will be graded on the first 50 targets shot at. As per Rule 10.01a(iv)
23. Viewing of targets will take place 8.30am on both days.

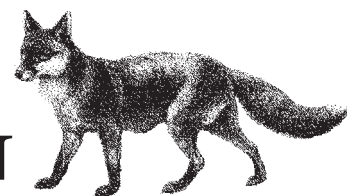

Dear Your Say

Warning to all gun clubs

Its great to pack up on Thursday all ready to set off on Friday morning to drive 400/ 500 ks for the two day shoot at a gun club.

You arrive at the ground on Friday afternoon to have a practice and feel great and look forward to Saturday,

During the days events the talk around the club house and groups of shooters sitting about is not good, the main topic is the way the targets have been set.

Targets going past the pegs left and right and are thrown too fast, all the joy in coming here to shoot has started to fade, your standard of shooting is well below par. And you are asking your self why are you here. There is a set of rules and it is not rocket science to have the targets set correctly, if weather conditions change during the day re set the targets to the new conditions. If bad targets are thrown what this will do to any club is drive shooters away and you will find that your numbers will decrease in future shoots, and you will find it hard to get them back. It takes only a bad weekend to spread the bad news about your club, the shooter is at your club to shoot targets, it doesn't matter if he or she hasn't won a trophy but has shot well they will go away and say how good the shoot was and how well he or she has shot.

If the time had been taken to set the targets correctly in the first instance you would have fewer complaints.

Take the time to insure that your pegs are set out correctly on each layout this is the starting point for a good target. I have shot at clubs with no pegs at all how they set the target is beyond me, guessing is not good enough, she'll be right mate, this attitude is long gone.

The cost involved to go to a two day shoot is not cheap, fuel, accommodation, noms and food, and remember if you don't have the travellers you are going to have a bad result financial, and this leads to the trophy value decreasing for the following year. as the committee feels that owing to last year numbers being down they should reduce the trophy value. And when this happens you lose more shooters.

So come on clubs take that extra time and look after your club and the shooters after all they are the ones paying to shoot at your club.

It is also pleasing to read in our magazine about various other activities held across Australia by various clubs in regard to school boy/girl days, exposing their young minds to what is a great sport that due to a lack of exposure, may not have been of interest to them beforehand. Further, I believe on an individual basis all active members of the ACTA can play a very important role in introducing new shooters/novices from amongst our friends, family or others to our unique sport. I am sure, as in my own case that many members are already doing their bit in this role with some success in recruiting new people to take on clay target shooting as a new active interest. Probably, in the last couple of years I have personally introduced about 20 or more people by inviting them out to my club (Wangaratta, Victoria) to have a go at a sport that in most cases is somewhat alien to them. In other words, they mostly have never even thought about shooting as an avenue for enjoyment. Often, after asking somebody I may get the 'raised eyebrow' look, usually because this person has never been asked before, although I could nearly guarantee that they would have been asked to try out a game of golf before. I ask (usually at social gatherings), men, women and juniors (having spoken to their mum or dad first) and it is surprising how many positive responses that I receive. I suppose in a way, I am fulfilling the role as an ambassador for clay target shooting and it then becomes important for me to make certain that the experience for my new comer is both pleasant and rewarding when the day comes that they actually get to have a try. My purpose for the invite is basically twofold here, firstly to introduce an individual to our great sport with the hope they may take on a new activity with the added bonus that it will grow our club membership. Also from a political point, lets face it, there are some people in the community that hold an anti firearm sentiment, regardless of whether the gun is used for field shooting or target use. I am also of the opinion that much of this negative sentiment stems from ignorance about what we actually do and the responsibilities that come with gun ownership and our very high standards of safety in all instances. The term of 'red neck' does not fit with any of the hundreds of shooters I have had the pleasure of knowing over 40 years of my exposure to shooting, in fact, the opposite is true, safety and responsibility is not only expected, it is required. I know that the same applies across our country, evidenced by our exemplary safety record which is something of which we can be very proud. It is very satisfying that after a few hours of practice under direct supervision at our club, how newcomers come away extremely impressed by not only the skill and sportsmanship required, but also by the safety levels that are present during our activities. In some instances, I have witnessed an attitude shift from slightly negative beforehand to an enthusiastic response after our session is over. Even if your new starter never pulls a trigger again in their life, they will have been exposed and educated about how we engage with our sport and be left for all time with a positive attitude. Further, if this same person is ever in the situation where someone else is 'bagging' the rights of legal firearm owners, our friend who has been exposed to shooting can speak up on our behalf and negate this attitude by saying "hang on a second, I have been introduced to organised target shooting and my experience was a very positive one". Finally, I would like to encourage all members to take a friend for a relaxed couple of hours of practice shooting under your supervision, give them some easier targets (DTL Straight aways or Stations 1 and 7 Skeet targets) so that they can hit a few. It's our sport and our future. Good Luck.

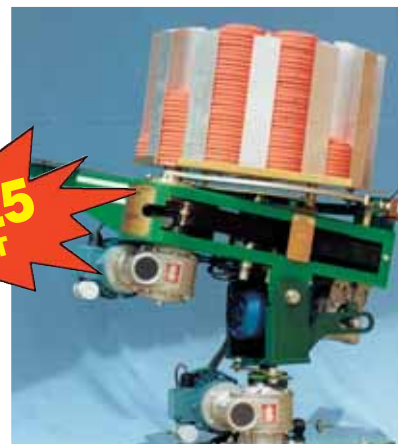

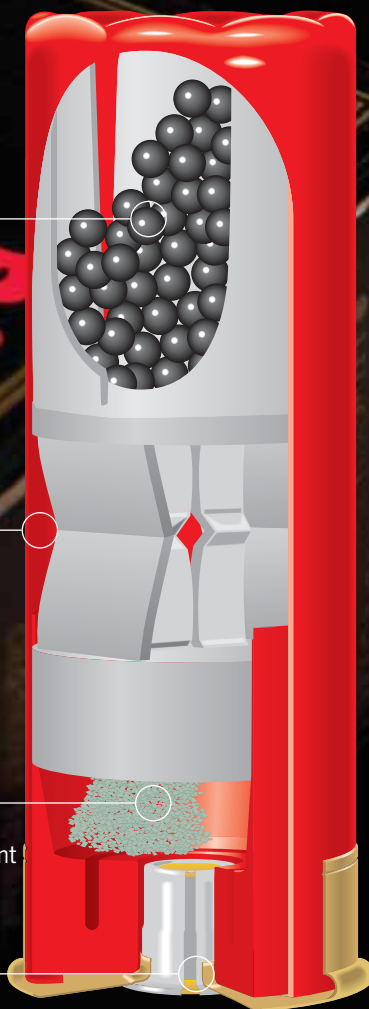

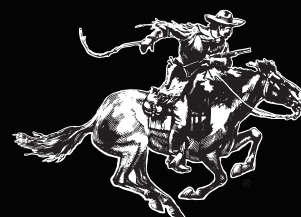
