From the Executive Officer Tony Turner

The National Ground purchase is progressing with a number of items already in place. The Survey should be completed within the next few weeks along with the planting of 1500 trees. A new fence bordering the Southern Boundary will also be completed by the end of the month.

Power to the ground is in urgent need of repair with tenders now out for the supply and installation of a new transformer which will take the ground through its development over the next twenty years. The power and the master plan for the ground will be developed following recommendations from the National Executive meeting at the end of June.

The overall Strategic plan will be reviewed as will each of the sub committees. The next twelve months will be one of consolidation as the economic climate is still in the doldrums, the ACTA have made some significant changes to ensure the viability of the organisation into the future through innovative change to the way we conduct business. These changes will also impact positively on members and give them more services and flexibility.

We welcome two new faces to the Board with Brian Bailey (Tasmania) and Terry Marsden (Western Australia) being elected by their States to the National Executive. We welcome both representative and look forward to their contribution on behalf of their respective States to the overall progress of the ACTA.

At this stage I would like to remind all members if they have specific issue they wish to have addressed the correct method is to contact your Club or Zone with your request for clarification. Should the Zone not be able to provide the clarification then it needs to be forwarded to the State. The State body in most cases will be able to provide the information required. Failing a resolution through this means the State will forward the case through to the ACTA Office where we will delegate it to the appropriate Sub Committee for resolution.

For all concerned this is the appropriate system for the speedy resolution of matters requiring decisions or adjudication.

For those who have specific issues involving changes to rules or constitutional issues these need to be directed through your State to the State delegate to the ACTA for them to raise through the appropriate committee and the National Executive.

National Coaching Director's Report

On the 16th and 17th of May I was joined at the Australian Institute of Sport by 5 other coaches and administrators representing the ACTA for a training and assessor course conducted by the Australian Sports Commission for AISL. This course was presented to 5 other shooting disciplines with a total of 21 people attending. The course provided valuable information regarding the requirements of a trainer and assessor including the steps in organising, presenting and evaluating all components of a coaching course.

Through AISL we will be pursuing the next levels of coaching. The old Level 3 and Advanced Coaching will be updated and introduced or reintroduced to assist those at the top level of coaching to continue their education to ensure we have the best knowledge available to pass on to our shooters. These next steps are also vital if we are to promote our next wave of identified intermediate coaches who wish to progress through further education and experience.

Following further analysis by the ACTA attendees and the ACTA we are confident we can further assist the development of the course to ensure it is as user friendly as possible. We have to encourage more coaches to our sport. To achieve this I hope to be able to introduce a coaching training and assessment course that all our present and future coaches are more than happy to use. We need a uniform coaching system across Australia.

I know we have a lot of coaches saying to shooters what they believe to be the one and only way to break clay targets, but we should have a common base to start from in our coaching system. I have had meetings with Glenn Woodhatch and Jim Shepherd to update and reintroduce the "Introduction to Clay Target Shooting" booklet, a basic coaching guideline that coaches, shooters and new members will find very easy to understand and follow. With this booklet I am sure we will make it much easier for all involved to introduce people to our sport and I would like to take this opportunity to thank Glenn and Jim for their assistance. This booklet, will not only help coaches and shooters but can be displayed in information centers etc. as it presents our sport exceptionally well to the public.

Australian International Shooting Limited CEO, Nick Sullivan, will attend the ACTA National Executive meeting in June to further our knowledge of the role AISL plays in relation to coaching, junior development and the elite pathway. I have a number of issues that need to be closely looked at on this level.

Anyone who has had any involvement in the ISSF shooting scene would know that we seriously need a much clearer and defined direction from the ACTA and AISL in quite a number of areas. We urgently need to give all shooters who compete in these events a clear and open system, not set to benefit a select few. The selection system also needs to be set out well in advance, giving every athlete an equal and cost effective system without any hidden surprise. For shooters who want to work hard to achieve their goals, we need a system that simply means if you are good enough we will give you the opportunity.

We need to quickly set up talented junior and youth programs from our State and National training programs in Trap/Skeet to the ISSF pathway so that the shooters will want to become members.

The junior development pathway through ACTA is undergoing change with a stronger emphasis on recommendations from

Clubs through to the Zone and then the State, when recommending shooters to development programs. There is an application and written evaluation process in place when selecting shooters to attend. This includes the TIPS selection method. Talent, Intelligence (about the sport), P (ability to handle the physical demands), and Skill (in relation to the technique of the sport). All of these and other selection tools are available on the ACTA web site. The aim of these changes is to add prestige to the National program and provide the necessary incentive to the shooter, parents and those supporting the next generation of shooters.

When you are asked as a club or zone Secretary to endorse an application please consider the questions you will be asked to answer in relation to the applicant. And if you support the application, perhaps some financial assistance would also be warranted.

Whilst we are endorsing this program for juniors it could be expanded nationally by States to involve other "segments" of the membership including New Members, Ladies, School Programs etc.

I know the Victorian Schools Challenge is something Glenn Woodhatch has nurtured for many years, so not only are Victorian Schools competing against each other, they are also competing against New Zealand schools. Glenn is happy to assist any State wishing to follow suit with guidelines on setting up the program.

Also along with the ACTA Junior Development Pathway I have put together a junior incentive proposal for a State selection system over the Zone, State and National Trap events. I hope this will increase the numbers of shooters attending these competitions. The system offers the top young shooters who compete in all three events a place in their State team to shoot the New Zealand Trap Nationals. This idea has been sent to each State for their consideration. At this stage NSW and Victoria look like adopting this proposal and hopefully by the next report most States will have followed suit.

By the time you read this the ACTA Executive meeting at Wagga will have been held. I hope that it will be the start of bigger and better things in our shooting world.

We have a number of people, clubs and states doing a lot to help our shooters and improve our sport. It is time to have a good look at what direction we are headed. If it is the right way, great, let's keep going. If you have some new ideas, try them.

What are you doing to promote and develop the sport in your club? Does it work? What other ideas do you have?

Neil's single barrel effort is, according to those in the know, a New State Single Barrel Record and James 184 was a significant achievement and personal best. The Grade winners A Ashley Chester 25/25, B Vince Oliveri 29/31 and C David Levingston 23/25.

QCTA HALL OF FAME

OUR HISTORY AND THE OPENING

The idea of a Queensland Hall of Fame (HOF) came about after some passionate Queenslanders witnessed the great job NSW had done with their Hall but no amount of "thinking fluid" assisted with the question of where to site it. When Roma decided to throw their hat in the ring for the 2009 Nationals they came up with the idea to include the hall in their proposed building extensions.

This idea was not universally accepted at first; however it was common sense to place the hall at our largest venue in the State and the scene of many shooting achievements. Plans were drawn, ideas expressed and the final approval offered access to their new auditorium via the Queensland Hall of Fame. The dream had materialised on paper, let the building begin.

As we know the building of the Main Hall extensions to the Roma facility was barely finished prior to the 09 Nationals but the HOF was complete and just waiting for its content. We had rotating bases for our Cups, enclosed glass display cabinets, free standing displays and 48 hours before the opening not one item actually in the Hall. Through some great work by a small band of helpers it was apparent there was much to display as Cups, Traps, Shotguns, Badges, Medals, and Shields and a host of photos came out of the woodwork (so to speak.) The Hall was ready to be put on display for the Grand Opening.

The HOF also provides us access to the wonderful Championship Cups that surround our sport and an instant view of events surrounding many of the winners of the cups.

Some examples:

We have captured information on our ACTA Presidential Medal recipients these awards presented to worthy Queenslanders – Ron Porter, Chub Smith and Tom Meadows are recorded and we have copies of two of their letters bestowing their awards.

We have memorabilia, those "different things" that happen in our sport – did you know there was a Shooting Colour Supplement in the southern papers in 1973 – Doug Smith was one of the Australian team at the World Cup and we have the insert.

And the HOF gives us the ability to capture special events – the hall is situated on the ground where John Porter (a Queensland) shot the first ever 50/50 in the 1985 State DR Championship at Roma.

The HOF gives us a home for old photos – our oldest photo to date was taken in 1949 at a club that no longer exists near Morven, it shows us a 12 year old Doug Smith sitting behind the fence watching the shoot off. He would have never known at that time that he would provide us with many such spectacles throughout his shooting career.

To assist this development the QCTA offered Platinum, Gold and Silver sponsorship opportunity and this contributed some much needed funding to the creation of the Hall. All those who contributed to the HOF were recognised on the night and were presented with a specially struck badge to signify their assistance.

The opening of Roma's new main hall was performed by Robert Loughnan, the mayor of Roma and our HOF was officially opened the same evening by our State President Mr Bill Allen. The evening also recognised our first official inductee's to the Hall of Fame. Pam Moloney (nee Coxon) was present to receive her commemorative jacket and memento in recognition of her wonderful achievements in the late 50's and early 60ies. She was the first lady to ever make the Mackintosh Team in 1960 and she also made the Open Queensland Team the same year. Gary Redmond was the second inductee and it was fantastic to see Gary and his wife make the journey to Roma so we could recognise his exceptional shooting prowess and we will never know what he may have done if health issues had not intervened. It was also great to see Bill Stevens and Doug Smith up on stage ensuring all went well during these presentations.

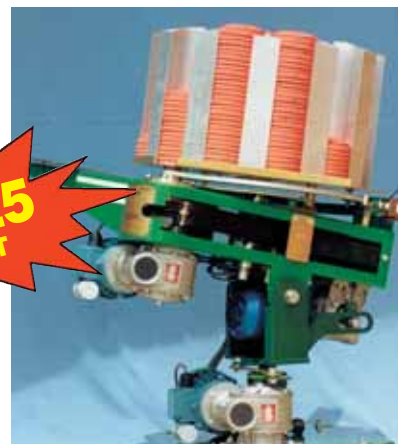

Psychological Skills for Shooting

STILL ANGRY

In last month's article I concluded by saying that anger is a normal emotion that can easily lead to aggression or violence. Anger needs to be dealt with and not allowed to develop into aggressive behaviour patterns.

What is the relationship between anger and optimal performance? According to Abrams & Hale (2005) sport psychology research shows that anger does not enhance performance; nor is participation in sport a convenient outlet for anger. The research reviews indicate that high levels of anger can have negative effects on focus and concentration.

If you cast your mind back to the June CTSN you will remember a list of conditions that indicate an 'Ideal Performance State'. To experience the Ideal Performance State the shooter must be;

1. Focused in the present: in the moment.
2. Breathing properly and relaxed, with the right level of muscle tension.
3. Energised and alert: being in a sense of calm-alertness or serene intensity.
4. Free of self-consciousness and ego: not worrying about others.
5. Confident: that they must feel mental and physically prepared to perform well.
6. Directing concentration and awareness only to what is needed to perform well.
7. Always using positive and instructive self talk.

If we explore these characteristics, it becomes apparent that it is impossible to meet all or any of these characteristics if you are angry. As an emotion, anger just gets in the way of you staying focused in the present. Remaining in the here and now is impossible if you are absorbed by feelings that have been generated, by judgments you are making about the past or anxieties that are due to thinking about the future. The other characteristics, such as staying calm and relaxed, not worrying about others, etc, are just as difficult for an athlete to achieve if they are angry, because you are not focusing on the process which is what you should be concentrating on.

For some team sports there is a belief, especially by coaches, that a relationship exists between anger and performance. They believe that some anger is necessary to facilitate arousal or enhance an aggressive attitude. This belief has not been supported by experimental data, according to Abrams & Hale (2005), but data does exist that in general anger and performance literature that suggests that anger does not improve performance.

As I stated last month, for athletes, two types of anger have been identified: Anger-in or anger out. Psychological literature would describe these as internalizing and externalizing. Anger-in involves directing the anger-in towards themselves or trying to suppress it. For shooters an example of this would be swearing when missing a target, throwing shells into the bin or on the ground, or kicking the dirt. Anger-out is typically a physical or verbal affront to others or officials. Fortunately, target sports have few examples of anger-out.

Anger out is an important aspect of team sports; rugby, football, netball, etc and often involves the athlete manifesting their anger towards other players or officials, or engaging in retaliatory behaviour, where they become so focused on getting back at another player they lose track of the team's game plan.

With respect to anger-in, how can we tell if anger is affecting us. According to Abrams & Hale (2005), there is a range of non-verbal cues such as a stiff neck, body rigidity, growls, withdrawal from the anger object, shaking, twitching muscles, pacing and fidgeting, and

showing aggression towards others or objects. Verbal and other clues may include foul language directed at the object or themselves, loud, impatient quick responses to others, and postural changes that may indicate readiness for the fight or flight response. Once you can recognize that you are stressed or distressed, then you can take action to reduce the impact that will occur.

The first strategy for cooling down the boiling point is to be able to recognize what is happening to you. Get to know what your normal relaxed state is and what happens to you when you become angry. Being able to accurately label your emotions will give you the opportunity to write them down in a hassle log: so that you can monitor the patterns of anger and responses and track your progress in dealing with anger-related problems.

The second strategy should come as no surprise: relaxation. Progressive muscle relaxation trains the athlete to improve control by tightening and then relaxing muscles systematically.

The third strategy involves using visualization to reduce the level of anger. Visualisation of a peaceful place, where you can focus your attention on relaxing sensations will help athletes to learn how they can quickly deactivate the arousal response to anger.

Another strategy involves modifying your mood by listening to music. This can work both ways: fast, loud, head-banging type music can be used to increase arousal, whilst calm, soft, sounds of nature or classical music can reduce arousal and create a peaceful mind-set.

Cognitive-behavioural approaches, that is, approaches designed to change your behaviour by changing your thinking include using self-talk or talking with your coach or teammates. Changing negative thoughts with positive ones by reframing can also be useful. Some-times taking some time out can also help. Time-out can give you the opportunity to calm down and view the problem from a different perspective.

Finally, exercise can be very useful in as an anger-management strategy. It is successful because of a phenomenon called reciprocal inhibition: which means that two opposite states cannot exist at the same time inhibit each other. Using exercise to limit anger is very worthwhile because you can be aggressive and angry if you are exhausted because of exercise.

In conclusion, anger is an emotion like any other. It is natural and normal to be angry sometimes. Anger however limits your ability to perform at your Ideal Performance State, because the characteristics of anger and the IPS are mutually exclusive. Anger can be dealt with by a range of relaxation, visualization and cognitive-behavioural strategies.

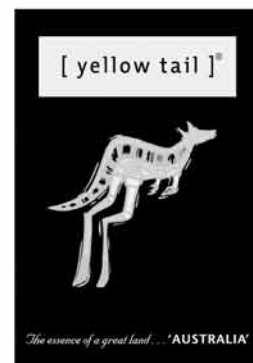

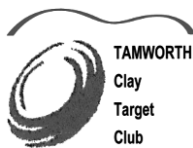

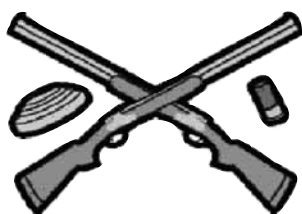

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

- (a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or
- (b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

- (a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

BRIAN RICHARD HANNAH

Rick (Pop) Hannah departed for the big duck shoot in the sky on the 5th May 2009, aged 94 years. He was farwelled by a large gathering of clay target and duck shooters, family and friends, at a cremation service at Boyne Island, and afterwards at a wake at the Gladstone Clay Target Club.

Rick started clay target shooting at Barcaldine in the 1950's and a measure of the longevity of his skill is that, in conjunction with his long time shooting mate, Russell Tibbits, he won the Commonwealth Deauville Doubles Championship twice, 25 years apart. Shooters at many venues recognised Rick as a serious threat to their championship aspirations, especially on those days when he complained of a "bad back", "sore knee", "aching elbow" or any other of the myriad ailments that he could dream up. At such times he was amiable, but very competent shooter.

He was the driving force behind the formation of the Gladstone Gun Club in the 1970's and personally set up the first trap on the original Calliope grounds and organized the first shoots on that ground, which rapidly grew to be some of the largest clay target events held anywhere in the country at that time.

Rick championed the cause of the novice and lower grade shooters and often could be heard remonstrating with shooters and officials whom he considered were favouring the "hot shots" and not giving a "fair go" to the lower grades. He initiated the Gladstone Clay Target Club's policy of promoting their sport to juniors and community groups, a policy which continues to be strongly supported today.

Although it is now many years since Rick fired his last shot, his legacy will live on at the Gladstone and Rockhampton Gun Clubs.

The Richmond River Gun Club's Wyrallah Road Lismore range has received a major facility upgrade. The club was fortunate to obtain a grant of \$14960.00 from the Australian Government in 2008 as well as a Capital Assistance Grant of \$9000.00 by the NSW Department of Sport and Recreation. There were also cash contributions from the CMCA (Casino Village) and a number of members.

A total of \$53000.00 was spent on upgrading two traps, improving access for the disabled (particularly wheelchair access) to toilet facilities and various parts of the range and the establishment of a skeet layout.

Donations of other items such as two second hand skeet traps by Anthony J Pirlo of Casino, various items of building material and 1260 hours of voluntary labour by club members has resulted in a clay target shooting facility that President Mike Sullivan and his team have a right to be proud of.

Recent flooding caused the cancellation of the club's annual two day shoot which was to be held on 23rd and 24th May, a significant set back considering that this is the club's major event of the year. The event will now be staged in November and hopefully all those that had intended to take part will still be able to do so.

A handful of disappointed members were able to access the range facilities on Sunday after flood waters had receded to a degree. Three squads took part in practice with a 75 target medley, and also gave the new skeet layout its first serious test.

The three squads shot (at) 25 skeet targets under the watchful eye of experienced and accredited coach Ted Schneider. While most of the novice skeeters found the incoming targets difficult to catch up with, particularly at Station 8 and when attempting doubles, top shots Wayne Hawkins, Scott Smith, Peter Brown and Terry Preston had little trouble turning clays into dust. 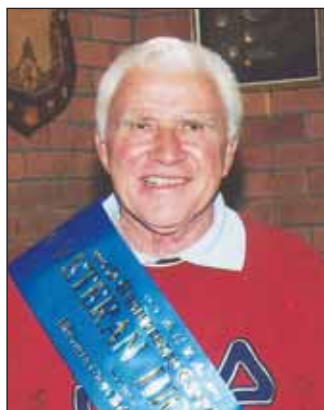

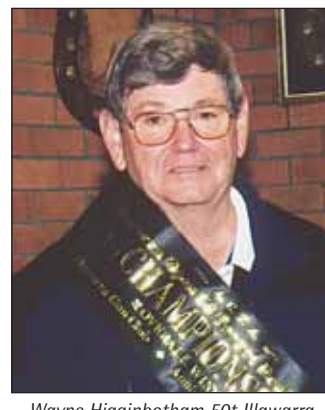

Finally we finished the day with the 50t Gnarara Pine Classic, which saw G Barton 48/50 finally step up and win from S Saunders 40/50 & G Coles 39/50, 1st B L Coles 38/50 and 1st C S Coghlan 34/50, who is another new shooter to ISSF Skeet.

That was then followed with the second part of the 100t State elimination with the 50t Banksia Classic. This saw A Snooke 47/50 overall winner, 1st A A Burnard 46/50, P Melvin & S West 44/50, 1st B J Baker 46/50, W Lau 45/50 & E Harris 44/50. Once again C grade was hotly contested with 1st C C Smith 45/50, S Sharp 38/50 & F Periera 35/50. It was suggested that a drug test should be taken of Chris Smith due to the considerable jump in score from the first event.

Meanwhile over on the Skeet range, the shooters were settling in and George realizing he had to start pushing the scores. The last event was the 50t Paperbark Cup with George 47/50 once again the winner, but Steve pushed him with a 45/50 and the perfect 25 to take out B grade with L Coles 45/50, C Alexander kept consistent over the weekend with another 37/50 from Steve Coghlan 36/50.

High Guns for the weekend were George Barton 185/200 in Skeet and Anthony Snooke 13/150 in the Trap. Well done to both of you.

Throughout the weekend there were highs and lows, but the new and least experienced shooters did well, walking away with many trophies and in some cases being regarded for their performances over the weekend. Inaugural DTL Trap Championships

Australian Defence Clay Target Association

The Australian Defence Clay Target Association (ADCTA) held its inaugural Down The Line (DTL) Trap Championships from Tuesday 28 Apr to Thursday 30 Apr.

This had been in planning for the past sixteen months and everything was set to go. The competitors had turned up on Monday and proceeded straight to the venue, the Shoalhaven Clay Target Club on the South Coast of NSW in Nowra for a practice. A majority of competitors had more than one round to ensure they had their eye in ready for what was set to be a tough competition.

Tuesday 28 April all the competitors started rolling in around the 07.30 mark ready for a 08:30 start, the grounds were all prepared and set to go with the local club providing volunteers to assist in the setting up of the grounds, and general working of the traps. Someone must have made a sacrifice to the weather god for the competition, because the 50 Km Per hour winds that had given the sporting shooters curry over ANZAC Day had disappeared altogether.

Once again the competitors jumped at a chance to practice before the first event kicked off. On completion of the practice all the competitors were rounded up and asked to listen to the local dignitary invited along to say some words, he had his say and he kicked the competition off by scaring the bejesus out of a target when he attempted to shoot it for the first time. Once all competitors were arranged into squads the first event of 25 Pair Double rise was kicked off. The first wave of competitors seen the only Australian Public Servant (APS), Chris Carrol, place a score of 34/50. Although not good considering the targets not bad either. A new young shooter from the Army placed his good foot forward first by seeing a reasonable 32/50 placed on the board, he was unfortunately outdone by a fellow Army competitor with a score of 35/50.

The next wave saw young Matthew Stokes attempt to stamp his dominance on the competition with a very nice 39/50. At the end of the first event, Matthew Stokes (RAAF) had taken out the overall for the Double Rise 2nd in RAAF was Robert Binstead with 25/50 1st Army was Tim Braybon 35/50, 2nd Army was James Pearse 32/50 and Navy 1st Mick Bryan 35/50 with Chris Carrol bring up 2nd spot for Navy with his 34/50.

Event 2 50 Target Handicap with all competitors now fully aware of what was at stake everyone was looking to put red on the board. All three services were competing fiercely and the Army though they had bragging rights on this event while Tim Braybon was only 4 down off of 19 metres, the final wave seen Mick Bryan and Matthew Stokes hit the layouts in order to correct the Army's delusions. The end results was Navy 1st and Overall winner off of 21 metres was Mick Bryan with only 3 targets down (47/50), right on his tail was the Army with Tim Braybon down 4 targets (46/50), in third spot overall was another Army boy James Pearse with seven targets down (43/50), then RAAF's hopeful Matthew Stokes and Navy's Steve Atkins both down eight targets (42/50). A marathon shoot off lasting one target resolved the positioning placing the Navy over the RAAF.

Day 2 and the weather once again was looking promising, the first event was the 50 target Single Barrel sponsored by DEFCREDIT. RAAF's Matthew Stokes was out to make amends and was only two down after the first wave of competitors had shot and leading the race comfortably. The Army had made an attempt but fell well short. The last wave of competitors had Navy also fall short in taking this away from the RAAF. The final scores were Overall winner and 1st RAAF was Matthew Stokes with 48/50, 2nd RAAF was Robert Binstead with a hard fought 38/50. Army 1st was Timothy Braybon on 41/50 with James Pearse nipping at his heels on 40/50. Navy 1st was Mick Bryan on 46/50 with Steve Atkins on a 39/50, Chris Carrol took out the APS place with 40/50.

After Lunch break and the dust had settled from the single barrel,

event 2 was the Double Barrel event, personnel were rubbing their hands together with glee after some punishing scores fielded from their Single Barrel events. This was the event people knew they could mark the board with some red, after two waves not one red score had been tallied, with the closest being 47/50. The last Squad had Mick Bryan show the others that a possible score wasn't impossible by completing a perfect 50/50. The end results were 1st in Navy and overall winner Mick Bryan 50/50, 2nd Navy Chris Carrol 47/50, 1st Army Darren Parsons 46/50, 2nd Army James Pearse 45/50 and both Matthew Stokes and Robert Binstead from the RAAF scored 47/50. Another marathon effort by the shoot off seen 4 targets shot at each with Matthew Stokes coming out on top with 51/54 and Robert Binstead taking 2nd for the RAAF with 50/54.

Dawn of another day and day three was showing that it could turn ugly at any moment the clouds were coming in with what appeared to be a lot of rain following them. The wind was picking up and the chill was cutting through everyone. The cold had everyone reaching for their cold weather gear and one shooter when he had finished was referred to as Clancy from the Overflow due to his long oil skin coat he was wearing. The first event for the day was Points Score Championship. For those that don't know this is scored with three points for a hit on the first barrel, two points for a hit on the second barrel and no score if no hit after these two. Everyone was digging deep to place a good score on the board, this event was the event that also decided the winning service team. The end of the first wave, seen some less than impressive scores on the board, this was partially corrected by Matthew Stokes from the RAAF who pulled the only score in the 140's. Once the dust had settled and while everyone was have a well earned lunch break the results were as follows, 1st RAAF and Overall Points Score champion Matthew Stokes 142/150, 2nd RAAF Robert Binstead 117/150, 1st Navy Mick Bryan 139/150, 2nd Navy Steve Atkins 133/150 and Army 1st James Pearse 137/150 followed closely by Tim Braybon 136/150.

The Teams Events were decided concurrently with this event, with the Navy taking out the Interservice Shield with combined scores of Mick Bryan, Steve Atkins and Chris Carrol giving a total score of 398/450 Second place was the Army Team of James Pearse, Timothy Braybon and Andrew Smith giving a total of 359/450 and coming in at third spot was the RAAF Team of Matthew Stokes, Robert Binstead and Toby Bearman on a total 342/450.

The final event for the competition was the Champion of Champions event which was done over 60 targets, with 20 Single Barrel, 20 Double Barrel and 20 Points Score. After the first wave of competitors, Mick Bryan dropped four targets. The rest of the field seen that this slip had allowed Matthew Stokes in for not only this event but the overall high gun champion for the shoot as he was only one point in front at the start of the day. As it happened the Army was trying to make a charge through Tim Braybon but he fell short as well and at the end of the final wave all was revealed. Overall and 1st in the Navy was Mick Bryan with a score of 96/100, 2nd in the Navy was Steve Atkins 82/100, 1st in the Army was Tim Braybon 89/100, 2nd in the Army was James Pearse 78/100, 1st in the RAAF was Matthew Stokes with 88/100, 2nd in the RAAF was Robert Binstead 76/100.

The ADF Squad of five personnel was selected over the 50 target Handicap, Single Barrel, Double Barrel and Points Score events. The personnel in qualifying order were Mick Bryan (Navy) 282/300, Matthew Stokes (RAAF) 279/300, Tim Braybon (Army) 267/300, James Pearse (Army) 265/300 and Steve Atkins (Navy) 256/300.

Mick Bryan took out the Overall High Gun champion for the competition with a 413/450. He was expecting Matthew Stokes to pip him at the post due to Matthew just finishing in the top six for Australia during the Australian DTL Nationals held at Roma QLD in April 09. All competitors enjoyed the competition and are looking forward to next year's event which is hoped to be held at HMAS CERBERUS Victoria.

The last item before the presentation was the overall High Gun winner for the day and as two shooters had tied they being Hank MacInnes and Robert Clarke on 121/125, a shoot off was required with Clarke taking the monthly medal.

The shoot the programme has now jackpotted to \$300.00 for the June competition and all visiting shooters should note that to be in the running for this you must become an associate club member of Port Macquarie.

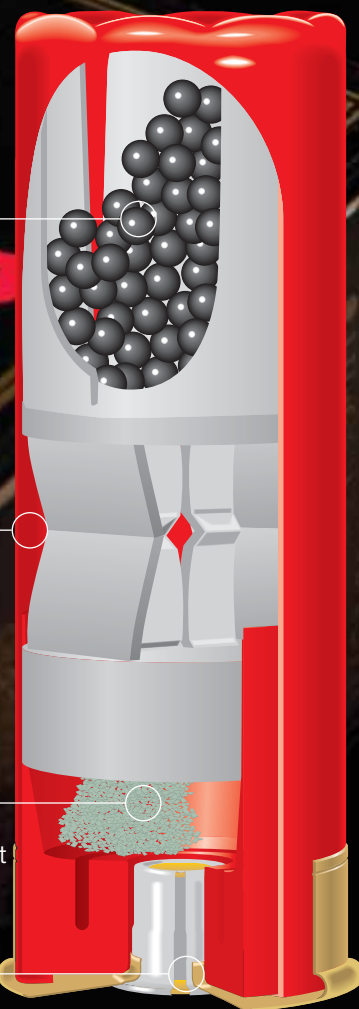

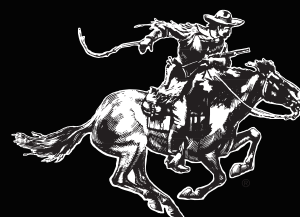
