From the Executive Officer - Tony Turner

There has been a great deal of activity on the administration front over the past month. We have been busy with meetings with our insurers and also in planning promotions and awareness campaigns for the future as well as working on the implementation of the strategies set by the National executive at the meeting in June.

We have been invited to contribute to the Beretta Girl Action day as we have in the past and will attend the promotion on the 4th of October at the Melbourne Gun Club. We will unveil our new promotional material and assist Beretta in promoting the sport of Clay Target Shooting.

This edition contains the first of the Sub Committee reports from the National Executive. There will be a series of these reports to inform members of the direction the Association is taking. We are currently preparing a submission to host the Skeet World Championships in 2012. We are confident after the successful running of the 2007 World DTL Championships the Skeet Championships would also prove to be a winner for our sport.

The Bendigo CTC is conducting the National Sporting Clays Championships on the 8th of August with a large crowd expected to attend the picturesque ground and premier tourist region for the event. Further down the Road on the Great Ocean Road the Warrnambool Club will host the Commonwealth titles in September. Make sure you get your entries in to these events and support your sport as well as visiting some of the great sights along the southern

Following a revision of our Insurance with our insurer (and Sponsor) Pollards in relation to the number of members who have joined after the required date of the 1st of January in any Year. It is also a requirement under our constitution that members have until that date to join or become unfinancial which means they cannot be afforded membership status.

The advice below was received from our insurers regarding membership & Insurance:

Australian Clay Target Association Inc, provides state associations, executive, district associations, individual members, clubs, voluntary workers and authorised visitors with ten million (\$10,000,000) dollar Public Liability Insurance Coverage. The policy covers members against injury to individuals and coverage to third parties for property damage arising out of Clay Target Shooting. Cover provided under the ACTA policy is provided to all registered and fully paid up

registered club/association/ venue or taking part in an approved club activity or sanctioned event. The ACTA Public Liability also covers clubs conducting clay target

members of the ACTA or visitor

(Temporary Members) whilst

shooting on an approved and

shooting and/or activities on venue and away from the registered club venue.

Any activity away from the registered club venue must be conducted to ACTA regulations and Safety rules and the club should undertake a Risk Analysis of the venue and activity. The club must advise ACTA of the activity/events and the venue arrangements so this information can be kept on

file and noted with the insurers to ensure nothing falls through the cracks.

The policy does not cover members if they are shooting on a venue not recognised by the ACTA or club as an approved venue or engaged in an activity not approved by the club or the Association.

To ensure compliance and coverage by the Public Liability Policy clubs must ensure all Shooters' shooting or undertaking any activities on or on behalf of the Insured or on their venue are

current registered & paid up members of ACTA or a Temporary member.

Finance Chairman's Letter to Members

At our recent executive meeting held 26-28 June 2009, the finance committee put forward a number of recommendations to the Full Executive in relation to the financial position and requirements of the Association.

To date we have spent considerable amounts of money on the National grounds although much is not really visible as we have replaced the trap houses and the concrete tracks & pads to the trap and skeet fields, with the addition of four new trap layouts to the western end of the grounds. As stated previously, these improvements do not jump out at us as the old structures were in place. We have laid bitumen to the entrance road and the loop around the camping area. This has helped reduce dust from vehicles traffic.

Our next major expenditure is the power upgrade of \$160,000.00 and again this will not be visible but is extremely necessary if we are to develop our grounds. Currently we are at our limit, when holding our trap carnival and could see some layouts with the loss of power. Another substantial cost is the \$100,000.00 deposit to the Wagga Wagga City Council for the ground purchase. We have to meet the survey cost and fence the new boundary as part of the agreement, as well as make annual repayments and pay the rates. The committee has also approved the construction of a children's play area and the building of a BBQ for all shooters to use.

On other matters financial I would urge clubs to advise members that annual membership fees can be paid from the first of November 2009 and that all membership subscriptions must be paid before the end of January 2010.

This is very important as our insurance cover is not valid if we are not financial. This applies to all shooters. This could have major ramifications to those involved particularly the club officials should an accident occur. I would urge all shooters to pay their membership fees on time so that we all have insurance and enjoy our sport.

Insurance cover is a large component of the benefits offered to shooters through your membership. This included, Public Liability, cover for volunteers, Directors and Officers Insurance, Personal Accident Insurance, Loss of Income, Travel insurance for National teams etc. A full and detailed brochure is being arranged for distribution when the renewal of Insurance is due.

The National Executive approved the annual subscriptions to rise from \$90.00 to \$110.00 per full member with the percentage increase to be passed on to all other categories of membership.

This increase is to catch up with the general increases in the last five years and to provide all of the benefits detailed above for the benefit of all shooters.

2009 Skeet Nationals

A total of 168 shooters from all around Australia and New Zealand came to the National Shooting Ground in Wagga during the third week of May to renew old friendships and enjoy the annual National Skeet Carnival. The Skeet Carnival has traditionally been held at the end of November to obtain the advantages that daylight saving, warmer weather and almost fourteen hours of "shootable" light allows. This usually ensures daily shoot-off completions and often allows additional social activities such as outside BBOs and novelty events to be conducted while the office prepares presentations.

However it was felt that the trade-off of moving to May to join the National Sporting Clays Tournament might not only increase entrant numbers but that some shooters may prefer the cooler weather. Unfortunately after only one year together, the Sporting Clays event has moved away to other times and venues and a return to November for our Skeet Carnival seems unlikely as New Zealand immediately moved their National Skeet Championships to fill the hole we left in the shooting calendar.

Fortunately, all the changes made to daily procedures this year, necessitated by the shorter days, were well received by the shooters and the shoot ran smoothly, happily and on time all week. Earlier starting times, fixed squadding and rolling wave rotation all ensured both punctual starts and smoother squad changeovers. On Handicap day, where one third of the field usually makes the shoot-off, another innovation was borrowed from the World Skeet Shoot. The practice ground was converted to a Shoot-off venue and every shooter that qualified within their handicap allowance proceeded directly there, was squadded upon arrival and either completed their first shoot-off round or was eliminated.

Although almost a whole week of variable windy weather does not provide the most pleasant shooting conditions, it was probably a blessing in disguise as it ensured completion of each event on the scheduled day. Apart from the Handicap, of the other seven events contested, only one produced multiple possibles, due to a somewhat calmer day and thus a short but entertaining shoot-off. Of the other six events, three were won outright with the only possibles and the other three were won outright without needing a perfect score.

However if we continue to conduct the Carnival in May where we only have about ten hours of usable daylight, eventually a combination of favourable weather and good attendance will make the finalisation of shoot-offs in daylight extremely difficult and

require us to follow the example of the Trap Nationals and finish up at night under lights. Therefore, prior to next years Skeet Carnival we hope to have several grounds with adequate lighting available.

The departure of the Sporting Clays event allowed us to resume the Pre-National Small Gauge events that were so well received in past years. This year we conducted the two events on Sunday 17 May.

ACTA 28 GAUGE SKEET CHAMPIONSHIP

A total of 62 competitors lined up to shoot this delightful little gun and at the end of qualifying, one of our keenest exponents of small gauge shooting, Peter Vella of the Bathurst Gun Club, was the very happy winner with the only perfect 50/50. Several 49s then proceeded to shoot for the runner-up spot and determine the minor placings. A large crowd of spectators enjoyed a very entertaining shoot-off that changed from singles to doubles mid round by mutual agreement and was eventually won with some great shooting by Julian Lucchitti.

After 61 shooters had finished qualifying with the extremely daunting but much loved "Idiot Stick", it was one of the absolute stalwarts of small gauge shooting in this country, Peter Vosper of Peel & Districts Gun Club in WA, who emerged victorious with the only 49/50. Several AA graders just missed putting Peter to the test by recording 48s and when they proceeded out to determine the

Monday morning saw the start of the Main Events and the High Guns when 114 competitors lined up for the Champions of Champions. Unfortunately the manageable breezes encountered the previous day for the Small Gauge events stiffened considerably making the shooting conditions quite challenging. The nett result was that at the end of qualifying a very happy Thomas Dent from NSWGC found himself to be the overall winner with the only 100/100. A combined shoot-off of 99s later established Martin Perry as Runner up with 109/110.

11TH NATIONAL 20 GAUGE SKEET CHAMPIONSHIP

Tuesday provided more wind and quite tricky shooting conditions, somewhat similar to the previous day. So it was no surprise when, after 119 competitors finished qualifying for the 20 gauge event, a similar result was attained. Adrian Cousens from Bairnsdale found himself alone with the only perfect 100/100.

Another combined 99s shoot-off established Blake Slater as official runner up with a score

of 138/139. Interestingly our ACTA historian, Mark McInnes noted later that Adrian now joins the great Doug Smith as the only five

time winners of any ACTA individual Trap or Skeet event (Doug won the Double Barrel five times) and then added that this feat is even more significant as Adrian has only entered the event five times.

Following this the official opening ceremony was conducted. This included the march past of the State Teams and the speeches and awards by the various dignitaries in attendance, including the long serving local member, Kay Hull MP who worked so tirelessly with the ACTA on the National Ground project. After the Team results had been announced and the badges and awards were presented, the A&M Denton trophy for the best presented team was presented to NSW and the Wagga mayor, Mr Kerry Pascoe fired the opening shot, breaking the target on his first attempt and declared the Nationals officially open.

10TH NATIONAL SKEET HANDICAP

In theory a handicap event should give all contestants an equal chance of winning. This year's event was straight out of the text book and reads like a fairy tale. For a start the wind eased up and provided a fairly level playing field. From a total of 154 shooters, 56 appeared at the shoot-off arena. Of these, only 20 survived to enter the third round. At 100 only 9 remained. With the completion of the fifth round we were down to 4 and the last of the "scratch shooters" Nicky Aird, had finally succumbed at 114. During the sixth round it got very interesting. "Locky" Irons adjourned to the bar at 133, leaving just 3 shooters.

Now at this point Mike Voke from WA (A1 and 50/50) had been "on the wood" for several rounds, so he was very relieved when two targets later, Jeff Munro from New Zealand (B2 and 49/50) gave up his last "free one" and even more so three targets later when Corey Rutter from Melbourne (C5 and 48/50) decided to play fair and surrendered his last "get out of jail free card". Thus when they walked across to Station 6 it was anybody's game and you could almost feel the tension as all three shooters finished off the round without incident.

So when the 15 year old boy from Langwarren, who had never seen a clay target

National Coaching Director's Report

On Friday the 26th of June I attended the ACTA Executive meeting at Wagga.

Here I met with the Executive Coaching Committee and Mr Nick Sullivan from AISL. As I mentioned in the July Clay Target News, both the ACTA and AISL need to work much closer together to achieve our joint goals. I believe that both the ACTA and AISL recognise the urgency of setting up a coaching pathway for our shooters, with special attention to up-and-coming junior shooters. We must not only encourage these shooters to be members of training camps etc, but we must also give them the chance of having a rewarding future within our sport. From the positive response at the meeting, I believe we are all trying to achieve the same result. At least we know where each of us stands. For the future of our sport in international competition, hard decisions have to be made. Work has to start as quickly as possible to set up a larger and stronger system, that is Australia wide and that will benefit our athletes wherever they reside.

I realise a lot of ACTA members have no interest in the ISSF side of our sport but even from what little exposure we receive from the Olympic and Commonwealth Games, Clay Target Shooting is recognised by most of the general public as a legitimate sport. We should not feel like hiding from the public because we own a firearm. I remember very clearly coming home from overseas or after winning at a major shoot and deliberately steering clear of publicity. Shooters were not the flavour of the month, due mainly to a couple of very unfortunate incidents involving firearms. The more we expose our sport to the public the stronger we will grow. Without question, unless we encourage new and junior shooters into our sport with varied

and greater opportunities, ACTA clay target shooting will be made up of older and older shooters. And then what happens???

The Executive has agreed to go ahead and print the "Introduction to Clay Target Shooting" booklet. This will be of great benefit to club coaches and new shooters. We hope to have this off the printing press in the next few months.

On the 10th, 11th and 12th of July, I went to the Warren Clay Target Club in the Western Zone of NSW and conducted a coaching clinic for junior shooters. We worked with the Far West Academy of Sport. This camp was very successful; we not only involved junior shooters and zone coaches, but also had the opportunity to work with Academy personnel and to use their excellent facilities. Junior shooters and all others involved in this camp left with a greater understanding of our sport. With the input and resources from the Far West Academy I know that the junior shooters in the Western Zone of NSW will grow stronger each year. We have a great opportunity to help junior shooters through working with these types of organisations. I know of clubs and zones that have been for many years, working with Sports Academy's with similar great success. There are a lot of opportunities out there that we need to find and use to help our sport grow.

In the next month we will have a coaching system that can be introduced to bring our existing and new coaches up to date. We need to ensure our coaching process not only satisfies our coaches and the ACTA, but also the Sports Commission.





Minsk and San Marino ISSF World Cups

The ISSF National Shotgun team left for the Minsk World Cup in Belarus on June 1st, it was a long flight as usual.

Arrival, customs and visa issue went seamlessly upon arrival in Minsk, assisted by the organizing committee. As we travelled from the airport to the hotel we were all very impressed with how clean the place was.

The next day we were up early and ready to hit the range for our short term training camp, upon arrival we were amazed, it is one of the nicest ranges that we have ever been to with a beautiful back ground and a lovely indoor/outdoor restaurant. We headed for the practice range. We managed one round before Valeriy pulled us all off the range and broke the bad news to us that we had to move hotels; the organizing committeee had misquoted the hotel price by almost a hundred Euros a room a night. The conditions were not too bad at the San Marino Skeet World Cup unlike the cold of Minsk. All shooters found that the shooting range in San Marino is not an easy range and it was expected that overall result would not be so high. In the final were two shooters with 118 targets.

Our skeet shooters couldn't perform well enough to reach the final with perhaps Keith Ferguson having the extra pressure of his first trip. The Skeet houses were interesting . . .

Adding to Russell's problems was the imminent death of his father and friend, Brian; arrangements were made to fly him home urgently but as we know the tyranny of the distance was against him being there with Brian during those final moments, however there is no doubt Brian would have been happy and proud his son was doing what they both loved

Double Trap junior shooter Nick Kirley shot 136 targets with a last round of 44. He finished 15th and we know that in the not too distant future he will demonstrate that he is one to challenge.

Next turn was for the Trap shooters. Again the weather was not so good for shooting, especially on the second day of competition - windy, overcast and targets were not really correctly setup. They were fast on the first day and little bit slow on day two which is why the overall results were not so high in the trap men's event.

But of course it is not excuse, conditions were the same for all shooters.

Our trap girls had average results, Stacy Roiall 65 targets (16th place) and Suzy Balogh 64 targets (17th place), which was not good enough to be in the final with a chance to fight for the medals.

Adam Vella showed more self-confidence in shooting and as a result with his 116 targets he became 10th which augers well for the World Championship.

Michael Diamond again shot a good result of 121 targets (one more PQS, his 5th PQS since Olympic Games), but finished 5th after the final. We look forward to the next challenge and thank the Australian Sports Commission and Australian International Shooting Limited for their support.

2009 WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS: The title defender's challenge

August sees a number of Australians traipse back across the globe, this time to Maribor, Slovenia for the World Championships in the ISSF Shotgun events. We wish them well. Follow their stories on the ISSF website and in the ACTA magazine.

The Title Defenders of the 2007 World Championships of Nicosia are running for a second title. It's not going to be easy: they will face Olympic Champions, World Cup winners and new, young, strong shooters.

The first "shooters to beat" at the 2009 ISSF Shotgun World Championships of Maribor will be the title defenders, those who won on the ranges of the 2007 World Championships of Cyprus. All of them all still shooting, and they will almost certainly try to defend their titles in Nicosia. Maribor's challenge is coming closer; let's meet the title defenders!

Trap Men Michael Diamond AUS, Double Trap Men Francesco D'Aniello ITA, Skeet Men Georgios Achielleos CYP, Trap Women Yingzi Liu CHN, Skeet Women Christine Brinker GER.

TRAP MEN: DIAMOND, KOSTELECKY AND PELLIELO ARE IN THE GAME

Michael Diamond of Australia, the winner of the 2007 World Championship in the Trap Men event, has been one of the protagonists of the 2009 ISSF World Cup season, and he has shot his last finals at the San Marino World Cup this year. He will probably face the 2008 Olympic Silver medallist Giovanni Pellielo, who is said to be ready for this year's World Championships. "I just changed my shotgun, but I got used to it quickly. Now I am looking forward, positively to the next competitions..." Said Pellielo, right after winning the World Cup Stage in Minsk. Meeting them in Maribor, the 2008 Olympic Champion David Kostelecky of Czech Republic, Silver medallist at this year's ISSF World Cup in San Marino, will look for his first World Championship title. The Czech Champion said to be ready, and will probably be one of the strongest shooters to beat on the ranges of Maribor.

DOUBLE TRAP MEN: D'ANIELLO FACES MANY OPPONENTS The 2007 Double Trap winner and Beijing Olympic Silver medallist, Francesco D'Aniello of Italy, has shot well during this year's World Cup Series, and he will try to peak in time for the World Championships "The World Championships is my next goal!" he said in Minsk, this year. He will have to face strong competitors. First of all Beijing's Olympic Champion, Walton Eller of the USA, and then the record setter Hu Binyuan of China (who established a new 196-target records in Minsk) and the keen Indian shooter Ronjan Sodhi, second at this year's World Cup in Minsk with a consistent score of 194 hits.

TRAP WOMEN: IS LIU YINGZI PEAKING FOR THE CHAMPIONSHIPS?

The 28-year old Chinese shooter Liu Yingzi, the 2007 World Champion, showed to be ready to run for a second title at this year's ISSF World Cup in Minsk, where she won her first World Cup Gold medal shooting under the rain. Is she peaking for the World Championship? What is sure is that strong competitors are in front of her. The Olympic Champion of Beijing, Satu Makela-Nummela of Finland, did not reach her best results through this year's World Cup Series, but she has proven more than once to be able to shoot great performances. At the same time, the young Olympic Silver and Bronze medallists of Beijing, the Slovakian shooters Zuzana Stefecekova and the American Corey Cogdell could peak in time for the World Championships of Maribor, trying to gain a spot on the most important podium of the year.

SKEET WOMEN: OLYMPIC MEDALLISTS FACE TO FACE

The Skeet Women title defender is the German shooter Christine Brinker, Olympic Bronze medallist of the 2008 Olympic Games of Beijing. On the road to the 2009 ISSF World Championships of Maribor, she is facing strong opponents. First of all, Beijing's Olympic Champion Chiara Cainero of Italy, who won the last World Cup in San Marino overtaking Brinker. The American shooter Kimberly Rodhe, Silver medallist of the last Olympic Games, will also be a difficult opponent to beat for Brinker. Rodhe finished on ISSF World Cup podiums more than once, this year, and she will surely look for a spot on Maribor's medal standings. Coming in next, three different shooters, Wei Ning of China, Danka Bartekova of Slovakia and Svetlana Demina of Russia, won an ISSF World Cup Gold medal this year, presenting themselves as three of the strongest 2009 shooters.

SKEET MEN: GEORGIOS ACHILLEOS IS BACK IN THE LEAD Reigning Skeet Men Champion, the Cypriot shooter Georgios Achilleos, is back in the lead. Following the disappointment of the Olympic Games, where he walked into the match as the number one in the world then missing the podium, he seems now to be back in his best shape. The Cypriot shooter came back on the highest step of an ISSF podium at the World Cup in San Marino "It's great to be back on top. But now I am looking forward, we have a busy year with the Mediterranean Games, the Europeans and the World Championships... I will try my best!" He said in San Marino.

He will face the three Olympic medallists of Beijing, three shooters he has being meeting many times in finals within the last four years. The Olympic Champion, USA's Vincent Hancock, Beijing's Silver, Norway's Tore Brovold, and the Olympic Bronze, France's Anthony Terras. All three strong are competitors who finished on several ISSF podiums since the 2008 ISSF World Cup Final of Minsk. They all will try to grab Achilleo's title in Maribor, where we are probably going to witness a breathtaking Skeet Men Final.





Psychological Skills for Shooting

ARE YOU PAYING ATTENTION?

I am often asked by shooters, "How can I learn to concentrate better?" This is an interesting question because it implies that we can learn how to concentrate, and assumes that concentration is something tangible and concrete. Herein lies the problem: concentration is part of a process: it is something that you must do in order to achieve some goal or product. It is not a product in itself.

So what is the process that involves concentration?

Jeffrey Bond, Sport Psychologist with the Australian Institute of Sport states that concentration is a term often used by coaches and athletes but appears to be little understood. Bond continues by explaining that Nideffer (a renowned US sports Psychologist) has developed an applied theory of concentration, which should be considered by all athletes and coaches. To understand this theory it is necessary to realise that for each of us an optimal level of arousal will coincide with efficient use of attentional capacities; this is referred to as our ideal performing state (IPS). At this IPS, we efficiently match the attentional demands of the situation with use of appropriate type of concentration. When we are not at our ideal performing state it is because the types of attentional focus becomes inefficient and mismatched with the situational demands. Nideffer believes that we all have an individual concentration style, which means that we have characteristic ways of using our attentional capabilities. Nideffer describes concentration as being either broard or narrow. An analogy here is like a torch with a variable beam: broad type of concentration is when the beam is broad and wide and narrow type, is when the beam is focused on a small point. Bond continues by saying that Nideffer also sees influences on concentration as either external or internal. We can now measure our concentration style in each of these types of concentration:

- Broad External: awareness of everything that is going on around - seeing, hearing, feeling. Necessary for good court/field vision. Probably more critical in team sports than individual
- Narrow External: Abiltiy to concentrate in a focused way, to focus on the one thing, to narrow onto the relevent aspects of a task. Very useful in target skills and as a way of blocking distractions.
- Broad Internal: Need to analyse, organise and plan. The ability to mix it with what is going on and draw some logical conclusions. Being able to deal with a large number of ideas at the one time.
- 4. Narrow Internal: Ability to focus on a single thought or idea and stay with it. Needed to enhance awareness of aspects of body reactions to stress (tight muscles, too high heart rate, etc) Usually indicates extreme dedication and capacity to follow instructions, to stick to a performance plan.

Effective concentration allows athletes to apply appropriate attention to the internal and external cues. According to Perry, an athlete that who can focus, or pay attention, on the task at hand and avoid distractions enjoys the greatest possibility of success.

In doing some research for this article it became difficult to differentiate concentration from "focus" or "attention", and it appears that psychologists have struggled for hundreds of years to come up with a common understanding and definition. Bruce Abernethy, from the University of Queensland, has identified three major uses of the term attention:

Firstly, attention as alertness, including concerns with the development and both short- and long-term maintenance of optimal sensitivity and readiness to respond. As an athlete your alertness and readiness depends upon your emotional state: basically being either too relaxed or too anxious. Anxiety tends to restrict your attentional span, that is, narrowing the focus, which may lead to missing important cues that would have contributed to a successful performance. Anxiety also has the effect of shifting you from the automatic and subconscious, to the controlled and conscious processing, which would lead to the phenomenon called choking. Also the anxious state makes the task involve more effort which will increase fatigue and increase the likelihood of developing self doubt because you will be over analyzing every shot and movement, and in the process tighten up your muscles, so that you are unable to perform to your ideal state.

Secondly, attention as a limited capacity or resource. For the shooter, this means the ability to have a broad focus whilst you are waiting to shoot and being able to shift your attention to a narrow focus when it is your turn to shoot. It would be impossible to maintain a narrow focus throughout a whole round of 25 targets. There is no need as this would be very ineffective and would lead to a severe headache among other things.

Finally, attention as selectivity. By this I mean that that some information is selected as important and some stimuli are ignored because they are irrelevant. Effective selective attention begins with an understanding of how to differentiate between distractions and the relevant cues.

Abernethy describes the concept of selective attention by using the metaphor of a searchlight and describes three common errors: If the searchlight beam is too broad, then you are failing to focus all attention on the limited essential elements for success. If the searchlight beam is pointed in the wrong direction, then you are being distracted from relevant information by irrelevant information. Finally, if the searchlight beam is too narrow, then the athlete is unable to move from one stimulus to another rapidly enough.

So if we look at attention, focus or concentration, what should we know and what should we do to use it to maximize success. Be aware that attention involves being alert, being able to shift and being selective. You need to know when to have a narrow focus or a broad focus and when to focus on external stimuli or internal stimuli. You should be attending to the process of what you are doing and not the product you wish to achieve. And finally, you should stay focus ed and attend to the present. The past will only allow judgments to cloud your thinking and focusing on the future will lead to anxiety.

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

- (a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

Brian Mark was amongst the legends of the clay target shooting fraternity. He traveled widely around Victorian and Australian shooting grounds, often shooting, but always entertaining! He passed away on 19th June, 2009 at Werribee after a battle with cancer, aged 78 years.

He was always happy to tell a joke or two and was preferred MC at Calcutta Nights and Awards ceremonies. The father of Geoff, David and Russell, he left a legacy within the clay target community that will take a long time to eclipse. He was Foundation Life Member of Werribee International Shooting Complex Incorporated and was coach and mentor to a number of current shooters. A member of a number of Gun Clubs over his lifetime including Geelong, Sebastopol, Victorian and Werribee, and was always willing to help referee and score the squads. He was a frequent visitor to the famous Mildura Easter Shoots and enjoyed entertaining the large crowds, often well into the night. He began shooting in his teens and competed until late last year when illness prevented him from being competitive. He won over one thousand Championships in his lifetime and was regarded as a true sportsman within the shooting circles of Australia. His ashes will be spread at his campsite near Pooncarie by his family.

Shooters all over Australia will be saddened to read of the recent passing of one of it's best known and most respected members.

Brian Mark died in Melbourne on Friday June 19 after a long but courageous battle with a tumour

At his well-attended funeral the always jovial Brian was remembered as the greatest story teller and MC of all time, always with a friendly smile and "did you hear the one about"?

Even if you had heard it before it was twice as funny when Brian told it.

Brian must also be remembered in the upper echelon of brilliant shooters like Olympians Terry Rumbel, Peter Wray and ICI pro Don Scowcroft who did not win an open Australian national down-the-line title but Brian was close on many occasions.

Who could forget the joy on Brian's face when his youngest son Russell won the national barrel title in 1980 and then Geoff winning national single barrel in 1983 or the proud TV interviews when Russell won gold at the Atlanta Olympics, classic and memorable moments in the history of competitive shooting in this nation.

Brian Mark started his shooting career in Melbourne in the 1950's, first at live pigeons,

progressing to clay targets, competing every week against the nucleus of the ACTA Hall of Fame members like Newton Thomas, Fred Burns and Jack McCraith and 1956 Olympians Clem Mudford and John Bryant.

Brian worked for Winchester in the glory days of the 1970's and 1980's in the tough battle against IMI-Eley for domestic market supremacy and his magnificent contribution and innovative programs as head of advertising and promotion was second to none in the Australian sporting goods industry.

His personal contribution to coaching, particularly in Victoria at inter-school competitions in the Wimmera and Western Districts must also be commended.

Brian is survived by his three sons David, Geoff and Russell and faithful partner of the past decade Pauline.

One of a kind, the mould is broken, sadly there will never be another personality in our sport like Marksie.

LUKE MITCHELL 16/1/1980-24/5/2009



It is with great regret that Majura Park Gun Club reports that one of our newer members, Luke Mitchell, passed away early in the morning on 24 May 2009.

Luke went to the assistance of a stranger being assaulted outside a nightclub in Melbourne, and was later tracked down by three assailants who stabbed him several times and he died some time later in the operating theatre. His death made headlines across Australia.

Luke was born 16 January 1980, in Ulladulla, where he lived with his family until he was about 13, after which the family moved to the Canberra region, and established a garden nursery in Queanbeyan. He went to St Edmund's College where he is described as a student with moral integrity who was a friend to everyone who was lucky enough to know him. At 17 he became a chef apprentice at The Park Royal and more recently, Luke and his brother Shane ran a successful building business, Ultra Seal Construction, operating both in Canberra and in Melbourne. As can be expected, he was a treasured member of his extended family, and was the godfather to many of his nieces and nephews. He has family throughout NSW, ACT and VIC, including Griffith and Canberra.

Luke's competitive shooting career unfortunately only spanned a couple of years, but during that time he showed that he had the skill and tenacity to become a great shot. In the 2008 Australia Day shoot at Canberra International, he won several events in C grade, and placed second in another. As a result, he was progressed to B grade, and in April 2008 he joined some 100 shooters

contesting Canberra Inter's Golden Trout. When the dust settled after the two day event, Luke was left standing as the B grade high gun – an excellent achievement from someone with only a couple of months in the grade. He also attended many club shoots around NSW and VIC, and on one memorable occasion, bought raffle tickets in Illawarra for both himself and his inseparable companion, Bella, the brindle staffy. Naturally, Bella won, and when Fred Rapley read out the results, he commented that if he had a dog he wanted it to be like Bella. Bella's good nature reflected that of her owner, and Luke donated Bella's prize to be raffled again.

However, as good a shot as Luke was, he is more likely to be remembered for being a good mate to many shooters, both at Majura Park, Canberra Inter and across NSW. He was one of those people who were everyone's best mate, and people were attracted to his good nature and openness. Although difficult, don't remember Luke for how he died, but rather as the man he was. On that night he demonstrated to the rest of Australia what his family and friends already knew – that he was too good a man to stand by to see someone suffer without giving a hand. That is how he should be remembered, not as a victim of cowards.

Our thoughts are with his family, especially his parents John and Carol, his stepmother Wendy and his partner, Zarli Kew. Majura Park is planning a memorial event for Luke, in consultation with his family, and further details will be provided through the CTSN when the event is finalised. We hope you will join us and remember Luke.

BEN MARJORAM 2/12/1937-6/7/2009

Ben Marjoram was a well known clay target shooters throughout the Northern Rivers and Northern Tablelands of New South Wales. He began shooting clay targets about 15 years ago and although he never reached above B grade his passion for shooting clays was enthusiastic each and every time he attended a shoot. In his early years he shot black powder.

Ben had little or no formal education having to leave school at the age of 12. He put up his age to work in the Lithgow Small Arms Factory where he worked in the steel hardening section and this is obviously where he gained his love of guns and steel.

He joined the NSW Railways where he first worked as a Porter. He then became a fireman on the Steam Locos, later to become a Driver on the Diesel locomotives driving goods trains around Cootamundra, Lithgow and Moree. He drove the XPT and he occasionally drove the Indian Pacific into and out of Sydney.

With his limited education he turned to books for his thirst of knowledge and was extremely well-informed on almost any subject through this reading.

Ben was an avid 're-loader' and spent much of

his days in his den reloading cartridges. He also loved working with steel and some of his special projects can be seen at any of the Northern Rivers Gun Clubs.

Ben did not enjoy the best of health for the past number of years but he tried never to let his ill health interfere with his love of clay target shooting. His death although sudden was still unexpected.
