

From the Executive Officer - Tony Turner

An observation from my dealings with clubs, Zones & States along with the ACTA as an organisation. **We need to continue to promote our sport as a sport.** It appears the community still have a phobia or at the least misconceptions about shooting. Our sport is about sport, about being able to hit a moving target. The target is not alive, the target is under strict control, so are our participants. We have the strictest rules in Australia regarding the act of shooting and participating using a gun.

We do not have the incidence of injury as do other sports, why then do we not promote our clubs, zones, states and the ACTA as providing the opportunity to participate in the safest sport around. I would urge clubs from throughout Australia to provide for the Media in your town or area the results and stories about your sport. Provide them with not just results but with worthwhile stories about the club, their commitment to the community, their work with young people, disabled, disadvantaged, elderly, female. There are many angles

Our sport covers the full gambit of the community. We know that from within, it is time to let the community know. We all have facilities which can promote the sport. Have an open day, not only for shooting but for spectators to look at what your club provides in the community. Put on a sausage sizzle, contact the media, invite them out and donate something to a charity. I am sure you may already do some of these things, however let's do it more often to promote the sport. Now is the time to continue to build the profile of the sport, look at the positives it brings and be proud and passionate about the sport. If you have stories published or aired through television let us know.

An update on the National Ground, 1500 tree's planted, new barriers

set to be planted, the masterplan for the ground is being drafted by the grounds committee. The lights on layouts 5,6,7,8, are ready to be stood.

We have a dam on the ground which we will have de silted to allow us to store more water for use in the dryer periods of the year. The newly purchased area has a windmill which we will investigate to determine if we can still pump from there. The ground is a picture after more rain in the Region, we hope the rain continues and breaks the drought which has plagued the area for over 7 years.

Our National Junior camp is to be conducted from Monday the 28th September to Thursday the 1st October. The process of selection has changed with 26 nominations and only 18 positions available. The competition for positions is increasing which will ensure we gain the maximum benefit for participants and the program. National Director of Coaching Graeme Boyd has designed a program which will teach, instruct and identify areas which the participants can improve in and along with the coaching staff provide the feedback and guidance for this to occur. We have established one day for ISSF shooting at Griffith courtesy of Marcello Casella and the Griffith club. We hope shooting ISSF will be a major component of the program in the future. Our aim is to provide the opportunity available to reach the pinnacle of the sport, that is the Olympics and Commonwealth games. As with any peak organisation the opportunities at the National level are limited. I see the States role in this structure as vital to the success of the National plan, we need to have States providing camps feeding into the National system, with shooters coming from the clubs via Zones to ensure there is a structured pathway which is easily identifiable to parents and the shooters as well as coaches.

Promotions Committee Report

The ACTA is considering introducing a "Life member" category, not to be confused with life Registration which is awarded by the National Body. This form of membership would allow the member to join as a life member and not have to pay yearly subscription again. They would also receive a Badge and other benefits. Obviously there would be a substantial initial investment however this is a way of supporting the ACTA and getting the benefits in the long term. A detailed application form should be available very soon.

2010 will bring some "new" ideas including a slogan to promote the Sport. The promotions and development committee are investigating new and innovative options for membership. Does your club offer the opportunity for members to sign up for multiple years? Many registered clubs provide the opportunity to join for up to three years which attracts the same price however it saves time joining yearly.

What about signing to be a "member for life"? That is, sign an agreement to stay a member and authorise the club to take the yearly subscription from the members credit card or direct debit on the anniversary of the due date. One thing clubs find hard is to

Most members would appreciate the opportunity to have it deducted yearly therefore not having to worry about coming in at a particular time. Should the member for what ever reason decide to end their membership they can do so by resigning from the club and revoking the approval. These plans could be introduced effectively and immediately to help your members.

On the promotions side of things we will be attending the third Beretta Girl Action Day, a great initiative from Beretta Australia, if you are in Melbourne on the first week-end in October come along and enjoy a great day out. We will be represented there by John Mack and Robert Fox. Following the Beretta Girl Action day we will be meeting with Beretta Australia to further cement what is a very successful partnership. Looking further down the track it is our understanding that the next SSAA Shot Show is to be held in Sydney next May. We intend to again combine with AISL to present a joint stand but details regarding venue and other issues remain unclear at this stage.

The committee is looking at ways of upgrading our CTSN Magazine but this may take some time so don't expect changes any time soon. The cost implications of an upgraded magazine are quite major so caution is the name of the game!

We have also had meetings with sponsors and potential sponsors to ensure next year is bigger and better than this year. We are already looking at ways we can improve the presentation of all of the 2010 National events.

Sponsorship proposals and different tiers of sponsorship are being developed to assist us in being consistent and accountable to our sponsors. Sponsors do not donate money, this is a business and we need to provide value. Mind you any donations are gratefully accepted.

We will be looking towards Sponsorship in the following area's: National Ground sponsorship, Overall Trap, Skeet, Sporting Clays sponsors. National teams and travel sponsors. Hall of Fame Evening's etc.

PROPOSED CHANGES TO THE CURRENT HANDICAP FORMULA

Below are the proposed changes to the current handicap formula. The proposed changes are for a number of reasons. Firstly our shooters are asking the rules committee to divorce handicaps from common mark. The new proposal has done this with the exception of AA grade which will have a minimum mark.

The next problem we have been asked to address is the current front mark of 15 metres. Currently C grade shooters cannot go forward of 15 metres, but are shooting less than 87% to remain in C Grade. This is the percentage we allow all other shooters to move forward of their handicap mark. Under the new proposal, shooting less than 90% would enable all non competitive shooters to move forward.

It is proposed that the introduction of the amended Handicap formula will make handicap shooting more competitive, enjoyable and will lead to an increase in handicap events at all levels.

If you would like to have an input into any of the proposed changes would you please direct these through your club and zone delegates to your State Association?

2.02 HANDICAPPING FORMULA

Rule 2.02 (b) Delete and replace with,

"Once having obtained a handicap of 17 metres or 20 metres no shooter will come forward of these marks except under rule 2.03(c) or 2.04(g). Any shooter who shoots a score of 49/50 or better from 15 metres will have a minimum handicap of 17 metres. On being graded AA a shooter will have a minimum handicap of 20 metres."

Rule 2.02 (e) Change ¹/₂ metre to 1 metre.

Rule 2.02(f) Add after "25 metres" "minimum 11 metres"

Rule 2.02(k) Delete and replace with,

"All shooters registering for the first time with the ACTA shall commence on 15 metres and will be assessed for handicap after shooting their first 50 targets double barrel in competition from this mark."

Rule 2.03(a) Change to read,

"A one metre inward movement may apply if a shooter's recorded percentage is less than 90% for 3 consecutive groups of 100 targets."

Rule 2.03(b) Delete and replace with,

"Inward movement is limited to one (1) metre per calendar year.

PRESIDENTIAL MEDALS

JAMES (JIM) SHEPHERD

This very time consuming task was undertaken by Jim.





Psychological Skills for Shooting

ATTENDING

Last month's article explored the notion of attending and how concentration is really being able to focus your attention on the job at hand and not be distracted by either internal or external variables. I concluded last month by describing the three main errors associated with attending as described by Abernethy. Using the metaphor of a searchlight, Abernethy, describes the concept of selective attention and explains the three common errors associated with selective attention: If the searchlight beam is too broad, then you are failing to focus all attention on the limited essential elements for success. If the searchlight beam is pointed in the wrong direction, then you are being distracted from relevant information by irrelevant information. Finally, if the searchlight beam is too narrow, then the athlete is unable to move from one stimulus to another rapidly enough.

In this article, I will explore these three errors more fully.

Imagine the shooter who after the possible, stands in front of the scoreboard and looks at the other scores, especially those in red, to see who he or she will be shooting off against. As the shooter is going through the list, he/she is making a mental note of their ability, what have been the results of previous shoot-offs, etc. The shooter may have also spent time looking at the trophy display, and sees him or herself with a particular trophy or sash. As the shooter moves out on to the layout, he/she notices the crowd, the flag that is now showing the wind has picked up and the people about half a kilometer away in front of the layout.

It is likely that this shooter will miss. This is because although he/she is concentrating on relevant clues there is also a lot of attention being given to irrelevant clues: especially the scoreboard, which will then cloud the task at hand, which is seeing and shooting the target. For this shooter, the searchlight is too broad. Being too broad allows the shooter to focus on either the past (making judgments about previous shooters and previous results) or the future (worrying about hitting the target so you can win that prize).

Shooting, and this can be any discipline: DTL. Trench, skeet or sporting, provides us with an excellent example of the second error. Because of grade or handicap, most of us know what our ideal performance level is so when we are shooting we often compare how we are going with how we usually perform. For example, a AA trap shooter should get 25/25, but if his/her skeet grade is B, then a score of 22 or 23/25 might be expected, or a B grader in trench, a score of 19/25 or 20/25 might expected. This is similar to the par in golf: "par" is the artificial score that each golfer is trying to achieve or get close to.

Focusing on the "expected" score, takes the shooters concentration way from shooting the target. The goal for every shooter should be to hit the target they have just called for. If, however the shooter is focusing on the whole round, he/she has increased the effort need because attention now has to be given to the target and the process of shooting it for the whole round. To maintain concentration for such a length of time will be tiring and risky. It is now that the shooter is making the second error. The searchlight is now focused in the wrong direction. The single target is the focus not the whole round. Focusing on the whole round also takes our attention away from the present. The one target is the present task, but is we think of twenty five targets we can drift back to thinking about the past (previous targets we missed or previous targets from this station, or we can project our thinking and attention to the future and start thinking about what our total score might be. Thinking about the future will lead to anxiety and will probably cause us to miss because our attention is now focused on the wrong target.

The final error involves being unable to divide your attention among stimuli that needs to be processed concurrently. This is a difficulty for novices, especially in complex ball sports such as rugby, where there is a need to have a high capacity for attention coupled with an ability to switch the focus of attention often. It is often thought that if you are under pressure then by narrowing your focus, you will perform better. This is not always the case and can lead to choking, because you become unaware of the other aspects that are important in the game. This narrowing of focus can also lead to fatigue and self-doubt, which in turn limit the body to move efficiently or the mind to consider taking risks.

There are several external and internal distractions that limit our ability to attend effectively. External distractions include noise or lack of it, gamesmanship, weather and playing conditions and visual distraction. There are ways to turn off these distractions, Perry states that before the 1988 Olympics in Seoul, the hockey teams practiced on fields that had loudspeakers around them playing Korean drums throughout the practice and announcements constantly in English and Korean. The internal distractions such as fears, worry, thoughts etc are much harder to have mastery over. According to Perry, in reality there is no distraction until we recognize it internally. Even though our perceptual field (vision, hearing, touch and smell) receives the information doesn't about the external environment doesn't mean that the information is perceived and processed. Shooters must distinguish distraction from valuable performance cues, then use this information to enhance self-efficacy, self-confidence and performance strategy. If you are unprepared for the competition: and this can involve physical, technical or mental skills, then you may become preoccupied with the distraction, rather than the task, and this will lead to choking.



THE YORKSHIRE TROPHY BACK TO THE FUTURE!

The highly successful Yorkshire Trophy, conducted by the NSW Gun Club in recent years, is to undergo an extensive change of format. The Trophy, which has been ostensibly a novelty competition in Australia in recent years, is to be expanded, not by the introduction of new disciplines but by returning to the original format for which The Yorkshire Trophy was intended at its conception at The NSW Gun Club in 1983.

The Trophy was originally commissioned in 1937 as a preliminary shoot prior to the opening of the English game shooting season each year. To maintain the history, and to be true to the original concept, the competition is again to be over those disciplines depicted in relief on each of the six sides of the magnificent silver trophy itself. The novelty disciplines will remain as a second event and continue to form an integral part of the overall competition.

To enable the Yorkshire Trophy to be successfully conducted in its new format, the competition will be held at both the Newcastle Lake Macquarie Clay Target Club and the NSW Gun Club. The new disciplines will be held at the NLMCT Club with the novelty section to continue at the NSW Gun Club.

The disciplines to be introduced, and to be contested at the NLMCTC, will be contested as a one day event based on 125 targets in the following configuration: 25 Targets Trench, 25 Targets Skeet, 25 Targets Trap (Continental Point Score), 50 Targets Double Rise Pairs

The conditions for this section of the competition are the one gun must be used for all disciplines and no choke changes are permitted

The competition will now be a bi-annual event. Competitors may elect to compete in either or both events and silver medallions and prizes will be awarded for both competitions at both venues.

Bob Ellison, who originally donated the Yorkshire Trophy for competition in Australia, will continue to sponsor the event. He will supply the sterling silver medallions which will be engraved and presented to all winners at the conclusion of

each shoot at both venues. He will also generously contribute \$500 to the overall prize pool.

The Yorkshire Trophy, having been re-invented, will without doubt return this competition to it's rightful position on the Australian Shooting calendar. The competition will restore the history originally intended as well as to guarantee not only two most enjoyable events, but also injecting the Yorkshire Trophy in Australia with the prestige it rightfully deserves.

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.

Note: A fee of \$20 will be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.

- 2. Targets to be shot in brackets of 25 for Olympic Trap and ISSF Skeet with squads of 6 shooters. In Double Trap targets to be shot in brackets of 25 Pair (50 targets) with squads of 6 shooters.
- 3. Nominations to be received by 3pm the day prior to the beginning of an Event or such time as determined by the Tournament Director.
- 4. Shooter will be squadded as per ISSF rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director. Once squadding for an event has been completed, a shooter shall not be entitled to a refund if they withdraw.
- 5. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot the applicable event.
- 6. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may be penalised by the LOSS OF THREE TARGETS.
- 7. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- All shooters must sign the score sheet after each round. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest recorded.
- 9. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons designated to referee/score or line referee must fulfil their obligation to do so or have obtained the service of a suitable replacement that must be ready to take his place at the required time. In the event of the designated persons or their replacement not being ready to take their place at the required time, the person initially designated to fill the specific role may INCUR A PENALTY AS PERSCRIBED UNDER INTERNATIONAL RULES.
- 10. Setting and adjusting of traps is the sole responsibility of Shoot Management. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap may will be penalised up to **FIVE (5) TARGETS.**
- 11. All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- 12. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 13. When team selection is involved, shooters are eligible for section nominated. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.
- 14. High Gun awards are determined for each section. To be eligible for the High Gun recognition, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events for each respective High Gun.
- 15. Women shooters are eligible for their section only. Junior shooters are eligible for OA or their section and grade.
- 16. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behaviour of card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 17. The ISSF Rules will be used to determine the OA placing in all events.
- 18. Juniors to be under the age of 21 in the year of competition.
- 19. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.
- 20. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors Tournament Director to adjudicate.



Dear your say,

In response to the executive officer's column in the May journal asking for ideas to increase participation. I once again put forward the proposal that to encourage lower grade shooters to remain and participate in the sport. There should be a Rule regarding the distribution of prize money funded by nominations at all levels National, state, zone, district and club.

It is a very simple system that would have each grade with it's own prize pool according to the number of nominations in each grade by which they are competing at their own level.

At this point in time it seems that Rafferty's rules are being used starting with National and state titles where there is to my knowledge no published formula to distribute prize money. Clubs are also making up their own rules to distribute prize money.

The main revenue stream for all clubs is the amount of targets used, the more targets thrown by the club the more revenue.

The bulk of the A.C.T.A membership revenue cones from the rank and file members A, B and C grades not from the top 200 members who pick up most of the prize money.

To encourage members to stay with our sport there must be equity and incentives that was why the graded system was introduced but it is now being abused.

Tragic Fire Destroys Clubhouse at Korumburra Gun Club

Victorian South Eastern Zone Club Korumburra lost its clubhouse on Saturday 25th July in a fire deliberately lit in a destructive spree which saw a young local man allegedly try to start a number of fires in the area around the club. The young man was arrested and charged and bailed pending further action. The fire was started in the early evening and quickly took hold of the forty year old club house. The fire brigade arrived on the scene quickly but too late to save anything. A number of trophies, shields and a lot of club memorabilia as well as equipment were destroyed in the blaze.

Club President, Arthur Bird said that while the clubhouse was



completely destroyed the blaze did not reach the trap houses or a couple of store sheds that housed a large supply of targets and microphones etc. Arthur said that the heat of the fire melted a plastic water tank and wheelie bins near the clubhouse. He also said that the clubhouse was insured and the com-



mittee would be working with the insurance company to rebuild the clubhouse as soon as possible but it is feared that the insurance money will not cover all costs in the rebuilding. Some fundraising activities may be planned in the future.

At an emergency club meeting last week it was decided to take up the kind offer from Morwell club to allow Korumburra to use their grounds for the next shoot and maybe more depending on the progress of the rebuilding program. It was ironic that the club had conducted a successful shoot earlier in the day and shooters had left the scenic club thinking that they would all be back in a month's time.

In a final word, Arthur said that Korumburra was a small but strong club and would rebuild from the ashes bigger and stronger than ever.
