National President's Notes

Currently our 2009 membership figures show a very slight increase over previous years, which in these tight economic times is a great achievement by our clubs in retaining members. With our 2010 membership fees now published I would like to stress to our members how important it is to pay your renewal on time as *vour membership provides vou as a member insurance* cover whilst enjoying your sport. Similar to your car registration which provides you with third party insurance I doubt any of us would consider driving our vehicles without paying our registration first. Insurance is a necessity of life be it house or health insurance and members coming to our clubs jeopardise our clubs insurance by exploiting our friendship and familiarisation with one another by not providing proof of their current membership.



Your executive have approved that all 2010 championship entries will be by pre-nominations only, allowing our championships to be run as a National Championship! This will minimise cash handling during the event, allow prize money to be calculated on each event etc. Nominations will close four weeks prior to the event allowing our National Office time to process entries and mail back notification of your squad number. For our 2009 National Trap Championships held in Roma this year 484 (75%) of the competitors pre-nominated when numbers grew on the day to 648 your executive made changes to the programme to accommodate these entries which in turn angered those who had pre-nominated. Numbers have been capped at 540 entries which will be conducted on 15 competition layouts, with three new layouts currently being built to provide practice. Four layouts will have permanent floodlighting to allow events to be finalised each day. Please show your support for these new changes by pre-nominating as early as possible.







National Coaching Director's Report

On the 10th of September I attended a Coaches Committee Meeting in Melbourne organised by AISL to finalise and approve the new coaching system which has been restructured by AISL members over the last couple of years.

The coaching system, approved by members and accepted by AISL and the Sports Commission, covers the Club Coach and Competition Coach. I will be meeting the ACTA coaching committee to put in place this new coaching accreditation system.

The ACTA in conjunction with the State Associations will be holding coaching seminars in each state to bring new and existing coaches up to date with this coaching system. We will also need to look at the re-accreditation of non-current coaches.

A number of changes have been made to the way our National Junior training camps will be conducted. The new selection system used to become a member of a National Camp will lead to a higher standard of junior shooters attending. Participants will be given the opportunity not only to experience specialised coaching but will also be instructed by a number of highly skilled guest speakers covering a wide range of topics This will be of great benefit to them not only for shooting clay targets but also in dealing with the media, sponsors, other competitors and everyday problems both on and off the shooting tracks.

From these camps we will select the juniors who show the desire, determination and discipline required to make champions. For these junior shooters we will develop an ISSF pathway through the ACTA and on to the AISL junior program.

I mentioned in an earlier CTSN article that each State has been sent a proposal for selecting a junior team to represent their State at the New Zealand Trap Nationals. This again will require clubs and individuals to become involved by finding sponsors and organising the team. With little acknowledgement your reward will be in knowing that you helped contribute to a shooter staying in and enjoying our sport. What could be more rewarding than one of your junior shooters winning a National Title or representing Australia.

The Cecil Park Clay Target Club has introduced a Junior Development Program and members of the club have been conducting coaching days for their junior shooters. They have also attracted great sponsorships to make these days possible. Graham Gosling and the NSW Northern Zone are preparing for another junior training camp over 3 days.

The Victorian Schools student State finals have again been a great success involving hundreds of competitors over the program. Wagga club has schools regularly attending the National ground and enjoying clay target shooting. These coaching clinics and the involvement with the school programs are so important in helping our sport survive. There are clubs and people trying very hard to encourage juniors into our sport and give them the opportunity to enjoy clay target shooting. I can report that more is starting to happen in this area than in the last few years. Every club needs to start a program for not only juniors but for all sections of the public.

I know there are many more clubs and members out there contributing, but we need to promote clay target shooting as a great sport and advertise this by inviting the media etc to competition and coaching days. Now, more than ever, we need to show the public the great sport we are involved in.



Psychological Skills for Shooting

by Michael Kruger-Davis

CHOKING AGAIN!

This article is a reprint of one that appeared several years ago. Choking is a question that is raised on a regular basis by shooters who contact me at shoots or at home. Because we all choke at some stage, it seemed a good idea to give this subject another run, with some additional points about performing under pressure that I have gleaned since originally writing this article.

Choker. It is an ugly label that we don't like to hearing. When we miss a target in a shoot off or miss the last target in qualifying then we are either labelled a choker by others or we call ourselves a choker. So, what is choking and how can we avoid it?

Choking, according to Mack and Casstevens, in Mind Gym, is a normal human reaction, a physiological response to a perceived psychological threat. I have previously written that "fear is a mental response to a perceived danger or threat. It's a primitive response that allows us to fight or flee from a threat. The fight/flight response was necessary when as cavemen we wandered the jungle and had the threat of sabre-toothed tigers lurking behind every bush. We had to develop a system that allowed us to either stay and fight or get the hell out of there. The threats have now gone but as modern man we have retained the fight/flight response when the majority of our fears are not life threatening at all.

So what are we scared of when we are competing. As I have written previously, we are scared of our ability to carry out tasks that we have practised. This fear is manifested as self doubt and produces anxiety. This anxiety then tenses up our muscles and we are unable to carry out the tasks we need to do in order to be successful.

There is a third element to the fight/flight response and that is to freeze. Sometimes we are better of to just stop, and try and look inconspicuous, rather than to take flight or fight. For shooters freezing can have devastating effects. The obvious is that when we are in a fearful situation and we freeze, we are unable to pull the trigger. However, freezing on the trigger is only a symptom of a bigger problem, which is losing fluidity in our muscles. Because we are scared, we develop self-doubt, this leads to our muscles tensing up and we lose the ability to move the way we should. The result is a poorly executed shot and in most cases a missed target. It must be remembered that all of this happens from our subconscious mind, so we are not actually thinking of it at the time. Being scared, tense, doubtful all lead to a state of anxiety.

Anxiety makes us feel uncomfortable and when we feel this way we become stressed. With stress there is a change in the way we are breathing and under this stress we become internally self-conscious instead of being externally task-conscious. So what do we need to do to perform under pressure? We need to breathe and focus. When we become anxious our breathing patterns change and without realising it we may even hold our breath. This has the effect of taking the focus away from what we are doing in the here and now - we lose sight of the present.

So if we are anxious, stressed and tense, how do we relax the muscles and clear the mind? By breathing; oxygen is energy. Oxygen also allows us to focus the process of what we are doing; which keeps us focused in the present. Staying in the present keeps our orientation of time in the right place: we can avoid thinking about the past (making judgments about past performances, other competitors, etc), and about the future (worrying about what might or might not happen). When we hold our breath, we are creating pressure and a nervous feeling. Athletes then choke because they become nervous about being nervous; worrying about being anxious.

Because the pattern of breathing affects the pattern of your performance, then when you are under stress, deep breathing will help bring your mind and body back to the present. This simple technique of focusing on your breathing and taking a couple of deep breaths will help learn to be comfortable with the uncomfortable.

Throughout our lives as competition shooters there are going to be times when we will feel uncomfortable, anxious, stressed, fearful and scared. To be able to help reduce these feelings and refocus on the task at hand we need to learn to breathe properly and learn to use breathing as part of the desensitisation process. In providing therapy for people suffering from anxiety and panic attacks, one successful method is systematic desensitisation. Basically this means teaching the client how to breathe and relax when they are in their normal life so that they can focus on their breathing and relaxation skills when they are stressed. Athletes should be doing the same thing. We should all be practising our breathing and relaxation when we are in the queue at the bank, post office or shopping centre. Rather than get angry or frustrated, we should use this valuable time to practise those skills that we will need when we are out on the tracks and we start to feel anxious or uncomfortable. When we can effectively focus on our breathing outside the competition we will be able to draw on the skill when needed in the competition when we are already starting to feel nervous.

Recently at a shoot, I was approached by a shooter, who thanked me for the articles, that explored hypnosis. He stated that he found the the scripts useful in helping him relax and stay focused outside the competition. When he became tense during the competition he could concentrate on his breathing and redirect his focus back to the task at hand. By focusing on the process (breathing & shooting), he was able to let the product (his score) look after itself. He was surprised and pleased that his scores had improved greatly.

According to Mack & Casstevens, choking is nothing more than paying attention to your own physiology when you should be focusing on the target. At those times when we all get anxious and nervous, we need to learn to be comfortable with being uncomfortable. Use your breathing to focus your energy and let your breathing centre your mind and body in the present where it needs to be.







CONDITIONS OF ENTRY NATIONAL OLYMPIC DISCIPLINE CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.

Note: A fee of \$20 will be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.

- 2. Targets to be shot in brackets of 25 for Olympic Trap and ISSF Skeet with squads of 6 shooters. In Double Trap targets to be shot in brackets of 25 Pair (50 targets) with squads of 6 shooters.
- 3. Nominations to be received by 3pm the day prior to the beginning of an Event or such time as determined by the Tournament Director.
- 4. Shooter will be squadded as per ISSF rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director. Once squadding for an event has been completed, a shooter shall not be entitled to a refund if they withdraw.
- 5. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot the applicable event.
- 6. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may be penalised by the LOSS OF THREE TARGETS.
- 7. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 8. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each round. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest recorded.
- 9. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons designated to referee/score or line referee must fulfil their obligation to do so or have obtained the service of a suitable replacement that must be ready to take his place at the required time. In the event of the designated persons or their replacement not being ready to take their place at the required time, the person initially designated to fill the specific role may **INCUR A PENALTY AS PERSCRIBED UNDER INTERNATIONAL RULES.**
- 10. Setting and adjusting of traps is the sole responsibility of Shoot Management. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap may will be penalised up to **FIVE (5) TARGETS.**
- 11. All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- 12. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 13. When team selection is involved, shooters are eligible for section nominated. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.
- 14. High Gun awards are determined for each section. To be eligible for the High Gun recognition, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events for each respective High Gun.
- 15. Women shooters are eligible for their section only. Junior shooters are eligible for OA or their section and grade.
- 16. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behaviour of card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 17. The ISSF Rules will be used to determine the OA placing in all events.
- 18. Juniors to be under the age of 21 in the year of competition.
- 19. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.
- 20. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors Tournament Director to adjudicate.

The recently completed facility upgrade at the Richmond River Gun Club's Wyrallah Road range was officially opened on Sunday 30th August by the Honorable Thomas George MP, State Member for Lismore in conjunction with Ms. Carmel Cook representing Janelle Saffin, Member for Page who was unable to be present. After cutting the obligatory ribbon. Mr George was then escorted to the layout by Club President Mike Sullivan and fired an opening shot.

The opening was also attended by representatives of the four local government areas in the Richmond River area- Mayor Jenny Dowell of Lismore, Mayor Colin Sullivan of Richmond Valley, Mayor Phil Silver of Ballina Shire Council and Councilor Ernie Bennett of Kyogle Shire.

Work commenced on the upgrade in August 2008 after the club was successful in obtaining a grant of \$9000.00 through the NSW Department of Sport and Recreation under the capital assistance program, and a further \$14,960.00 from the Australian Government through the Department of Infrastructure, Transport, Regional Development and Local Government. The amount of the grants was matched by the club from its own financial resources and in addition, there were donations from the CMCA (Casino Village) and other persons of cash, materials and professional services to the value of \$7807.00.

Twenty one members and one non member performed a total of 1262 hours of voluntary labour over ninety different days. Some may have only provided an hour or two but it all helped. That labour was allowed at \$20.00 per hour for the purposes of "in kind" contribution and at that rate amounted to \$25,124.00, making the total value or cost of the upgrade \$85,930.80.

One Traphouse was demolished and replaced to accommodate a new Canterbury trapmaster. Concrete paths were constructed to improve access to the shooting layouts, particularly wheelchair access. In all 27 cubic metres of concrete were poured.

Toilet facilities were improved to provide better disabled access and a skeet layout was constructed, integrated with an existing Trap layout. A second new Canterbury Trapmaster was installed in that existing layout.

The trap in the skeet high house is mounted on a moveable carriage



for 2009, and also taking out 1st place in AA grade, 2nd in AA grade was L Knight on a 66/72 score.




KUDRI DEMAJ ON TARGET AT WANGARATTA'S SPORTING CLAYS

He was also involved in developments of the Canterbury trap machines and was very proud of the latest development from this stable - the Auto Trench. To date, Canterbury voice release products have been sold into at least 20 countries, so Graham's contribution was of some significance to the New Zealand economy overall – not just shooting.

Graham will be remembered as an unique individual with an extraordinarily high intellect and a wide range of interests. He will be missed by his many friends in shooting circles, from all around the world and our condolences go out to his family.



(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."




