From the Executive Officer - Tony Turner

It is very busy time in the National Office at the moment with preparation for 2010 well under way. Thanks to our insurer Pollards we have taken delivery of pamphlets which will be sent to Clubs and their members giving an overview of the coverage, provided to the Clubs and individual members.

Membership is also open with 2010 renewals and new memberships being taken. It is important to note that the ACTA requires all renewing members to have their renewals to their club prior to the 31st of December 2009.

As we move forward the WEBSITE now hosts a form for submitting results to the National Office. This provides each club with the appropriate form in the correct format to assist us in providing it to the printer as well as up loading it to the website the same day. This form can also be saved to your computer for easy access to ensure the results are received in the correct format. As we head into 2010 it is important we continue to become more efficient, for that to happen we have produced this template to assist clubs in providing the correct format.

On the subject of printing we again need specific quality photo's to go into the magazine. If you are not getting some of your photos published there will be two reasons. The quality of the photo's are not up to an appropriate standard as determined and advertised in the magazine, or we have simply run out of room. It is easy to say add more pages however this comes at a huge cost as it takes us up to another category of postage, something which is not economically viable. We will continue to grow the Website and more and more of the "everyday" information will be up loaded through this medium. Our website continues to grow in popularity with over 6000 hits per week on average. This also provides our sponsors with another source of advertising. With over 300,000 potential customers per year this site will be developed to take us forward and be a leader in the Shooting industry.

RULE REMINDERS

Contrary to the opinion held by some of our members, the following rules do apply to ALL shooters when participating in competition events, from Club level to Nationals, and not just for A, B and C graders.

Rule 4.10 (d)—Each competitor shall carry and present his current handicap/registration card at all shoots before they are allowed to participate.

Rule 2.01(k)—If a competitor has lost his card he shall be allowed to compete providing he is registered with the ACTA. He shall be allowed to compete in his grade in common mark events and shall be allowed to compete in handicap events from the mark he claims to be his correct handicap mark. Should he win prize money or trophies they must be retained by the club until such time as the shooter presents his card for marking.

Rule 2.01(h)—It shall be the responsibility of a designated club official to enter individual event scores and progressively mark the shooter's card with his 15 metre results.

Rule 2.02(a)—Each club must appoint an official to handicap and grade shooters, check to see that all 15 meter scores are entered on cards and to check that handicap and grade changes are recorded on cards.

Following the National Executive meeting in July where CEO of AISL Nick Sullivan outlined the program and criteria for ISSF in 2010 the Championship committee have introduced a new program to assist ACTA shooters make the transition to ISSF shooting and representing Australia at various world cup meets in Europe. The program is advertised in the magazine with the criteria available on the Web Site. This program is for ACTA member who has not been funded via the AISL program in the past three years. The program is designed to give those members on the fringe the opportunity to gain experience they would otherwise not be able to readily access. We see this as additional opportunities to assist members pursue their goal of World Cup and ultimately Commonwealth and Olympic games selection.

The next addition will have photos of the progress at the National ground including the play area and the hedge plants as well as seating now being provided. The lighting upgrade is well under way with a consultant lighting specialist being engaged to determine the correct amount and dispersion of light as well as the directional settings to ensure this achieved. We would like to thank Nick Mullins for his assistance in this and the upgrade of the power to the National ground. Nick is a shooter locally when he has time, however at this stage his time spent at the ground is actually work time.

It was a typical Melbourne day with Sun, some wind and rain. Typically also was the enthusiasm of those ladies who attended the Beretta Girl Action day. The Melbourne Gun Club was decked out by the Beretta crew in Pink and Mauve with around 30 volunteers from the club assisting with the presentation of the Day.

The day attracted over 380 members of the fairer sex to the Club with Beretta providing the tuition, guns, targets and ammunition for the day. To say it was an outstanding success would be an understatement. The organisation of the day is a credit to Greg Chan and his Beretta staff. Russell Mark was the perfect MC and Lauren Mark was excellent support for the volunteer ladies who assisted the 20 ladies instructors on the layouts.

Now to the exciting part, the 380 plus ladies had a fantastic time, they lined up eagerly for their first 5 targets and 95% of those ladies hit targets at the first time on the layout, a credit to them and their instructors. I witnessed ladies continually return with some shooting more than 30 targets for the day and each time they left the layout there were grins from ear to ear.

The concept is fantastic, something we could all learn from.

The organisation and support on the day was excellent. The promotion was fantastic for Beretta, the ACTA and shotgun shooting. Whilst this may not equate to a high percentage of the ladies taking up the sport the flow on is enormous. The ladies will talk about their positive experience with a shotgun and the sport. They will tell people about the safety aspect of the sport. They will also relay to others the fun they had hitting targets. They will further promote our sport to the uninitiated.

CECIL PARK JUNIOR DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

Coaching Clinic held Saturday 26th September & Sunday 27th September



The Cecil Park Clay Target Club Junior Development Program was formed in June 2009 by parents and a coach who recognised the need for Junior Development. The Cecil Park Clay Target Club (CPCTC) has over 800 members. Fifty of these are junior members.

Supported by our Club President Vince Gatt and Office Secretary Shelly Barber, a subcommittee was formed to run the program. Our head coach is Leo Pezzano, Manager Elton Chetcuti and Secretary/Treasurer Kathy Chetcuti. Members of the subcommittee include Ben Bartolo, Mark Dunn and Neil Annan. The program is open for junior members of Cecil Park aged between 12 to 18 years. The CPCTC Junior Development Program has engaged in talks with the South Western Sydney Academy of Sport about having Clay Target Shooting as one of their sports, which has never been run in the South Western Sydney Academy before. This would give us the opportunity to have inter-academy competitions thereby giving our juniors the great experience of team travel.

The Junior Development Program has a code of behaviour, safety rules and emphasises shooting etiquette. Sportsman like behaviour is expected of the shooters at all times. In return for the support of the club and subcommittee, the juniors are asked to help out on competition days by doing trapping, running squad sheets and

helping with the nominations and scoring. These jobs are a vital way of encouraging respect for running a club and the juniors learn to be pro active in all areas of their sport.

Our major funding comes from sponsors such as Orangeville Plant Hire, Bilpin Fruit Bowl, ZZ Sydney Australia, R & L Bricklaying, Irigot Concrete, Austral Butchery, Camilleri Custom Stocks, Chetcuti Plant Hire, Clay Target Co and Horsley Park Gun Shop. We would like to warmly thank our sponsors who make it all happen. Horsley Park Gun Shop supplies the shells for the CPCTC Junior Development Coaching

Clinics and the clays are supplied by Cecil Park Clay Target Club. Other funds come from weekend raffles, run primarily by our honorary member Louis Galea with the junior members helping to sell the tickets. In June, as our first fundraiser, the members of the CPCTC Junior Program sold chocolates. Other upcoming fundraisers include a car wash at Cecil Park and a Poker night being coordinated by keen poker playing parents, Margaret & Simon Tadrosse.

On the 3rd Wednesday of the month we hold a "Wednesday Night Shoot" with all profits going to the Junior Development Program. It's a fun social night combined with a BBQ and is open for anyone who wishes to come along. Coach Leo Pezzano is always available to the juniors to give advice and tips. We have been having Novelty 5 Stand which everyone enjoys.

The CPCTC Junior Development Programs has a newsletter which is emailed every month and includes upcoming events, a coach's report, reminders and of course results with photos.

On the weekend of September 26th and 27th 10 junior shooters (1 girl and 9 boys) attended our first weekend CPCTC Junior Development Clinic. The juniors, coaches and parents were well fed with parents cooking the BBQ and bringing in baked goods. Weather conditions were very unkind with extremely gusty winds and temperatures reaching a maximum of only 19 degrees all weekend.

Guest coach Graeme Boyd was invited to Cecil Park, to not only coach the juniors, but to look at our program and provide his esteemed input and ideas. His coaching knowledge was invaluable to those on the program as well as the coaches and parents who reinforce what Graeme teaches. Graeme has a very calm, placid way of communicating with the junior shooters and is considerate of their individual needs when learning the sport. Graeme videoed each individual shooter and then reviewed their style on the TV with an open discussion on stance, style, patterns and habits. Those who attended were taught mental skills, how to handle the pressure of competition and building confidence in your self. These are all important attributes particularly as the CPCTC Junior Development Program encourages its members to go into competitions including State and National events.

The CPCTC Junior Development Program has kicked off to a good start in 2009 and will be bigger and better in 2010. For more information about the program look up our website www.cecilparkctc.com.au



National Coaching Director's Report

It was pleasing to see in the last magazine where Tamworth held an open "Come and Try Day" that attracted over 155 people. Organising a time specifically for ladies to introduce them to shooting, I believe, was a fantastic idea. This type of event encourages women to attend an otherwise male dominated sport without feeling intimidated and has proven to be a successful way to introduce women to our sport. The Beretta Girls Action days are a perfect example. These "Come and Try Days", conducted annually, and with more clubs participating, will enable our sport to grow and gain better public understanding.

The National Junior Training Camp was conducted at Wagga from the 28th September to the 1st of October and a full report on the event can be found in this issue. Quite a few juniors from this camp have reached the age that makes them ineligible to continue participating in these camps. In the near future we will need to establish a training system for 18 to 24 year olds to carry on from the existing junior camps and ensure that talent is not lost.

Of interest to ISSF shooters will be the selection of an ACTA team to compete Internationally in 2010. The 2010 ISSF Discipline Championships will be the first qualifying event for selection to the men's and ladies teams. There will be one or two other qualifying events and the dates along with the selection criteria will be finalised shortly.

On the 17th October I attended the 90th anniversary of the Wangaratta Gun Club. A selection of the club's memorabilia was

on display and was of great interest to all who attended. I believe it is very important for clubs to keep photos, trophies, records and maintain honour boards as part of the historical significance of a club. This memorabilia not only establishes the club's longevity but also conveys to new members and visitors that shooting isn't something that started yesterday. As with football, tennis and other sporting clubs, it is important to preserve all shooting clubs' history to help ensure its future.

I will be travelling to the Whiteman Park Gun Club in Western Australia from the 7th to the 8th November to conduct a Coach the Coaches course. The course covers club and competition coach accreditation which was previously the Level 1, 2 and 3 courses. During next year the ACTA plans to have this course conducted in every State and Territory.

I attended the NSW Trap Carnival which was held at Wagga in October. It was encouraging to see so many junior shooters in attendance. As I have mentioned before we have a serious lack of juniors competing in the skeet discipline. This problem needs to be addressed swiftly to ensure the continuation of skeet shooting in Australia. In the not too distant future we will be sending Australian teams to compete in sporting events worldwide and the foundation for this discipline is developed on the skeet ground. It is also an excellent discipline for new shooters to experience as they develop an understanding of the importance of different shooting techniques, gun hold and stance.

NATIONAL JUNIOR DEVELOPMENT CAMP

From the 28th September to the 1st of October the ACTA held the second National Junior training camp for 2009 at the National ground in Wagga. From the juniors that applied, 17 were chosen. All were of a high standard and it was a difficult task selecting the members for this camp.

We have reduced the number of juniors for the National camps to allow each shooter more coaching time and to involve the members of the squad in learning the required skills to shoot the different disciplines our sport has to offer.

During this camp we travelled to Griffith Gun Club and spent a day shooting ISSF Trap. For some of our juniors this was their first opportunity to test their skill at this challenging discipline. At the start of the day I spoke to the squad about the high level of skill required to be competitive in this discipline and the various shooting styles that they could use. We also considered the advantages and disadvantages that some of these styles can create in shooting ISSF Trap. We spoke about the high standards that have been reached around the world in this discipline, and how any flaw in their trap shooting technique or their mental strength could result in a missed ISSF Trap target. The body language of some members within the group indicated that they thought they would be able to hit anything thrown from a clay target trap. This attitude changed after the first few missed targets and these shooters also started to listen and work hard to shoot a reasonable score.

This was a great learning experience for many of the juniors and by the end of the day they were beginning to understand the concentration, technique and respect required to consistently achieve high scores.

I would like to thank the Griffith Gun Club and Marcello Casella for their help and the use of the facilities. Marcello gave us the opportunity to allow our junior shooters to experience just how much hard work it takes to become a world class shooter. All training squad members came away from Griffith with a taste of shooting ISSF Trap and I am certain that members of this group, in the future, will represent Australia in an Olympic shooting discipline.

Over the next two days the squad shot 15m, 18m, Handicap and

Double Rise. We concentrated on problem targets, gun fit, shooting style and timing. We also discussed various training techniques and conducted practice events to strengthen their competition and shoot off skills.

Michael Kruger-Davis again gave the juniors his time and went through the various psychological skills required to become stronger athletes. Michael is a very important part of our training camps. These young shooters are at a stage in their shooting careers where many well meaning people are giving advice and trying to help them and I often see how confused a new shooter can become with the brain overload they are subjected to. Sometimes this can be the make or break point for a new shooter. Michael gives the juniors only the information they require now and how to keep it simple.

Doug Hogan the News Editor for Prime Television Wagga, again gave his time to talk to the squad about the importance of being available to the media, both for themselves in regard to raising awareness for potential sponsors and also to promote and project our sport to the public. Doug related how athletes from other sports present themselves and approach sponsors for the sport they represent. Doug is a very interesting man to listen to and his knowledge in this field can be extremely valuable to our shooters. We must encourage all our members to put clay target shooting into the public eye as being a respectful and responsible sport. Doug emphasised the importance of appearance when it comes to presenting yourself to the public, for example, smart casual clothing and how to conduct yourself in a way that shows respect.

The NSW State Carnival started the day after the camp finished and all but one of the juniors stayed on to compete. Squad members should be commended for their conduct and commitment over the course of the training camp and carnival, taking away a major share of the prizes on offer.

I would like to thank the ACTA and staff, my assistant coaches Fred Rapley and Garth Hosking, and Mrs Jo Jamieson for their assistance in running this very successful training camp.

BUSH FIRE APPEAL

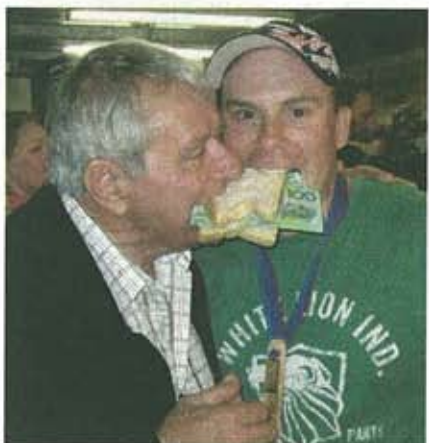

Interview with Keith and Janice Morgan, Cessnock CTC, sponsors of the Mark Morgan Memorial

Cessnock Clay Target Club has been hosting the Mark Morgan Memorial Competition for over 10 years now, in memory of the son of one of its founding members, who died tragically young, leaving a wife and 3 small children, and family and friends that thought the world of him. Elena Clark interviewed Mark's parents, Keith and Janice Morgan, a couple days after this year's event.

How many years has this competition been going?

The memorial was started in 1996, the year Mark died. The 3 of us [Keith and his sons Brett and Mark] all worked at Ellalong Colliery - Mark had been there since he was 18, and they asked if they could hold a benefit night for Mark's wife, Diane, and their 3 children. That first year, despite pouring rain, people came from everywhere to attend; the car park was filled with buses, and a lot of money was raised for the young family. Mark's mates, the management at the colliery, and the union were wonderful in helping us support Mark's memory. Following that, several competitions were held between the Colliery and Cessnock Clay Target Club, with cash prizes, most of which were handed back to the family.

When the colliery closed a few years later, my wife, Janice, and I accepted the beautiful shield that had been donated by the colliery, and used it to inaugurate the Mark Morgan Memorial, which has been held on a yearly basis ever since.

Tell us about your son, Mark, and how this memorial comp relates to his life.

Mark was involved with shooting from the time he was a small lad, and he and his brother, Brett, both joined the Cessnock Clay Target Club as soon as they were old enough. The family participated in many competitions over the years.

Mark's death at 29 is something Janice and I are still quite emotional about.

Tell us a bit about yourselves and your connection to CCTC.

I was a foundation member of the club, which began in the '60s, and have held every position there except Treasurer. Janice, too, has supported the club from the start in any way possible, but mostly with good food and good friendship.

Probably the worst time we ever went through was when 3 of us were in hospital at the one time; Mark with the rare form of cancer that eventually took him, me in another hospital with another form of cancer, and our son, Brett, in a 3rd hospital after having had a motor-bike accident. I reckon we wouldn't have gotten through without the tireless help of our friends, particularly Tom Turner Sr, & his wife, Gwen, and Dennis and Mary Goodwin.

In what way is the memorial important to you both?

Janice and I find it very humbling to be a part of this day, and see the support and respect that is shown to Mark's memory by the shooters who participate. As you know, shooting is as much about friendship

as competition, and we always feel that we are surrounded by our extended family, in a sense.

How does one go about setting up a memorial competition like this one?

I would suggest approaching your club's committee, who would probably be more than willing to help.

What prizes/trophies did you select for the event, and how are they relevant?

This year our son, Brett, worked with Tom and Sarah-Jane Turner at Arms & Ammo in Cessnock to pick some prizes that we felt would appeal to the competitors: a Winchester Centenary numbered knife, a Winchester watch, and mounted Winchester wall print.

You set up an unusual way of calculating each competitor's handicap score for high-gun in the competition. Tell us why you instituted this, and how it works.

It was important to us to ensure that everyone had a chance at High Gun in this event, as there are so many competitions where it is expected that a AA shooter will take out the award. Dave Porteus, who works in the club office at Cessnock, is very good with figures, and prepared a formula that levelled the field across the grades, making High Gun more accessible to all. In essence, a handicap of +2 is added to A Grade, +5 is added to B Grade, and +12 is added to C Grade. It's simple, but it seems to work. I think everyone is happy to see some new faces occasionally receiving recognition.

What changes have you seen happening in the sport recently?

There seem to be more shooters now than when we first came together, and certainly there are more women involved, which is fantastic to see, as this is such a family-oriented sport. There have definitely been some handicap changes! Also, the angles of the targets used to be much wider, and the distance they were thrown was longer then than today. Another change that comes to mind is that 32 gram & 34 gram cartridges used to be the norm; those days are gone, and shoulders have benefitted accordingly. Other than that, one thing I can say hasn't changed is the camaraderie; you seldom see anyone bagging anyone else out, or having a go at someone. CONDITIONS OF ENTRY – NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.
Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
2. Squads of 6 to shoot 50 targets/75 targets in brackets of 25, one visit only to the traps. Squads of 6 to shoot 100 targets in brackets of 50, two visits to the traps. National Handicap event to be 5 (five) person squads, 5 (five) targets per lane.
3. Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
4. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/75 targets. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** will be incurred.
5. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at the practice trap at a time suitable to management.
6. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
7. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
8. Any competitor will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** will be incurred in the event concerned.
9. Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first round of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility will be penalised one target. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for they're failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.
10. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised **FIVE (5) TARGETS**.
11. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
12. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
13. Optional sweep/purse nominations shall be noted on a separate form from shooting nominations and are not refundable.
14. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
15. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall chose in which team they will be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
16. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade and section prize.
17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
18. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behaviour of the card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.
19. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
20. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
21. Reduced Nominations shall apply to Juniors and Sub-Juniors. Also partners' entering into the same event whose nomination is lodged at the same time as a member paying full nomination fees. Shooters paying reduced Noms are eligible for Overall, Grade and section prizes.
22. ***All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Trap Championships.***

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.
Note: A fee of \$20 will be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.
2. Targets to be shot in brackets of 25 for Olympic Trap and ISSF Skeet with squads of 6 shooters. In Double Trap targets to be shot in brackets of 25 Pair (50 targets) with squads of 6 shooters.
3. All events are pre nomination only. Nominations to be received by close of business Friday 18th December 2009.
4. Shooter will be squadded as per ISSF rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director. Once squadding for an event has been completed, a shooter shall not be entitled to a refund if they withdraw.
5. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot the applicable event.
6. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may be penalised by the **LOSS OF THREE TARGETS**.
7. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
8. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each round. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest recorded.
9. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons designated to referee/score or line referee must fulfil their obligation to do so or have obtained the service of a suitable replacement that must be ready to take his place at the required time. 14. High Gun awards are determined for each section. To be eligible for the High Gun recognition, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events for each respective High Gun.
15. Women shooters are eligible for their section only. Junior shooters are eligible for OA or their section and grade. Except in Double Trap.
16. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behaviour of card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.

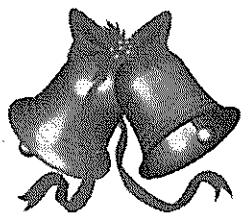

Psychological Skills for Shooting

COMMITMENT

A man from town asked an old farmer to be on the citizen's committee that would work on improving the town.

The farmer asked, "Do you want me to be involved or committed?"

Puzzled, the man asked, "What's the difference?"

The farmer answered, "It's like a bacon and eggs breakfast. The chicken is involved, but the pig is committed."

I have written before that commitment is an integral part of being mentally tough. Mental toughness is defined as the set of behaviours and beliefs about yourself, your work, your sport, and how you interact. Just to recap, mental toughness is made up of the following seven factors: being competitive, being confident, being in control of you emotions and thoughts, being committed, being composed and having courage to make decisions and consistency.

Commitment involves being without doubt. Doubt is the "the lack of certainty of the truth or the reliability of something." The problem with doubt is not that questions your ability to do something that is difficult or even impossible, say for example shooting 750 targets straight or 100 points score targets but it is lack of trust to perform actions required to shoot one target; the one that will appear when you call pull. According to Gallwey in the Inner Game of Golf, self-doubt is a uniquely human quality of negative thinking that needlessly questions ones ability.

Doubt is easily confused with anxiety and fear. Whilst doubt and fear are close they are not related. We experience fear when we are faced with real or imagined danger; that is when we are vulnerable to harm. Self doubt relates neither to our vulnerability or to external danger but to our competence to avoid or deal with the danger. No matter how much pressure is riding on hitting this target, we do not feel anxiety if we do not first doubt our ability to hit the target. Anxiety increases as our competence decreases and therefore if we can lessen self doubt we can reduce anxiety.

How does doubt manifest itself? The first physical symptom of doubt is weakness. In that shoot off a shooter may feel weakness in his knees, light headedness and a general loss of feel and muscle memory. Faced with these symptoms the shooter may react in two ways; either to give in to it or to resist it. Giving in to the challenge or avoiding it, according to Gallwey, decreases effort, reduces motivation and effects attention. The other reaction to self doubt is to resist it by trying harder. What happens here is that trying fails because we increase mistrust of our ability.

Commitment, according to Parent (2005), involves believing that the plan you have made, the image you have, your choice of gun or cartridge, is the best one. To be able to commit to a plan or a round of targets, you will need to feel that you can handle whatever the outcome is; you need to be willing to pre-accept whatever the results might be. Once you are committed then all you need to do is trust and let go: trust you ability to hit the target and let go of the judgments that often cloud our ability. When you trust and let go, the outcome will look after itself. A good example of this is when you mount your gun and it just doesn't feel right. Rather than put the gun down and start again, you commit yourself and call for the target anyway and more often than not you will miss the target. Commitment doesn't always guarantee results, but it will give you the best chance of achieving the outcomes you want.

Parent continues by stating that commitment is part of our nature. He believes we have an inherent capacity for it: it is an aspect of basic goodness, an expression of unconditional confidence in action. A definition of commitment, according to Parent, is "the extent to which every part of our body is directed towards the same target".

Because commitment is innate, it is therefore something that we are born with and is not able to be learned. Commitment is a natural part of any action: with no interference, our bodies and minds are committed to the same target. However, there are a variety of factors that interfere with commitment, and therefore what needs to be taught is how to remove the interferences, so that our bodies and minds can work towards the same goals.

The greatest interference is the fear of unwanted results and failure. This is exactly what we get when we are not committed. Acceptance is the key. Once you are committed then you will need to trust in your ability and accept the outcome. Commitment therefore is an essential component of keeping our beliefs and thoughts in the here and now. To be totally committed: abandon past judgments about your ability, have confidence that you can do the task at hand and ignore the fears and worries about the future. You need to adopt a big mind perspective here: that is, even the worst result will not be the end of the world. You need to remind yourself that a shot played with trust will get better results than a shot played with doubt. Doubt remember, leads to confusion, fear and anxiety. Trust on the other hand brings comfort and ease, meaning you will move more freely.

According to Parent a metaphor for this view is one often used in Buddhist tradition. On a cloudy day, the sun is not absent: it is merely obscured by the clouds. To experience the sun, we do not need to manufacture a new sun in front of the clouds. When the clouds part the sun will be there, shining brightly.

It is the same for us: commitment is not something we need to make or learn how to do. All we need to do is clear away the clouds of fear, doubt and hesitation, and our natural commitment will shine through.

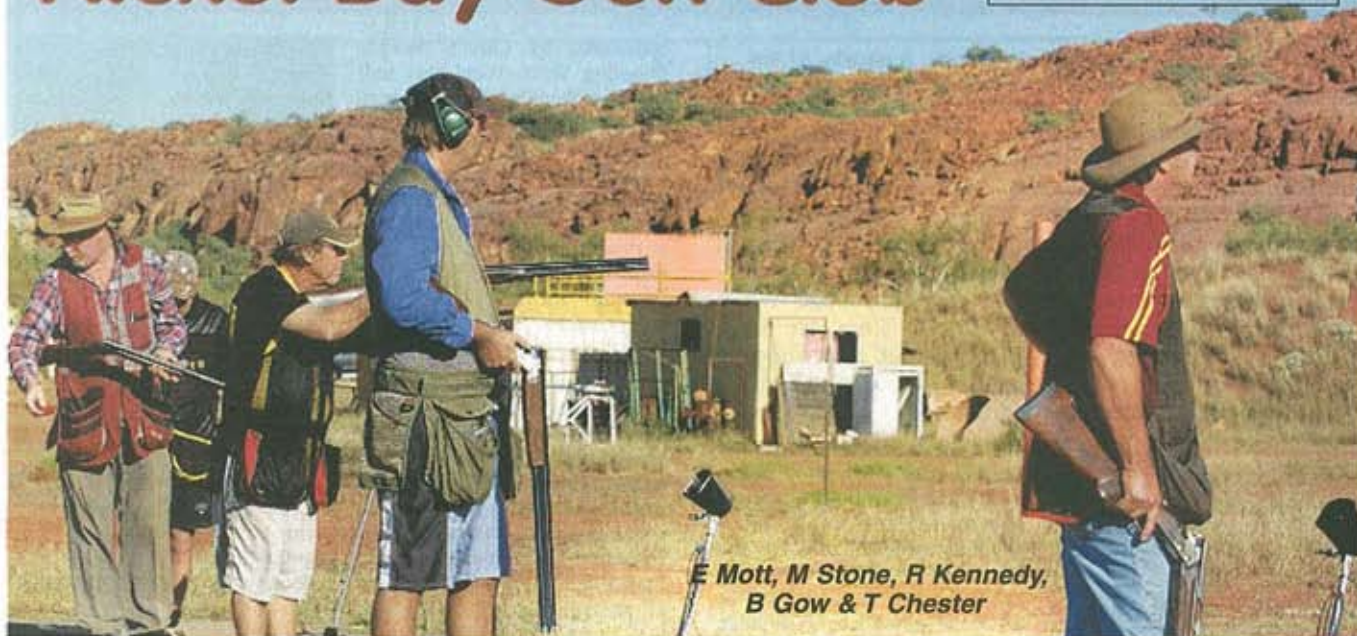

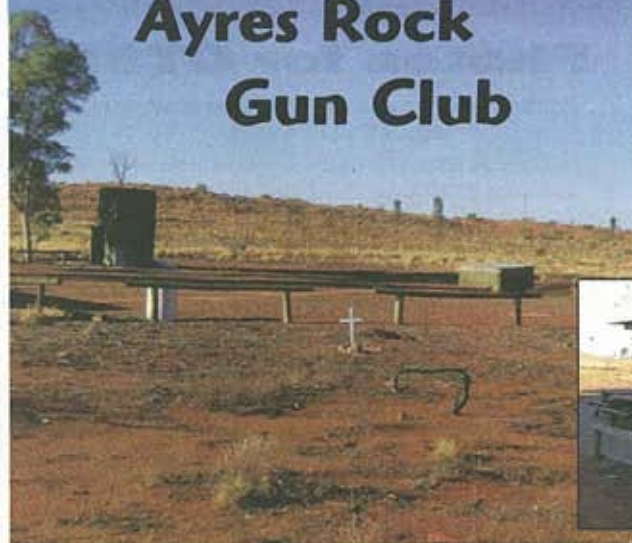

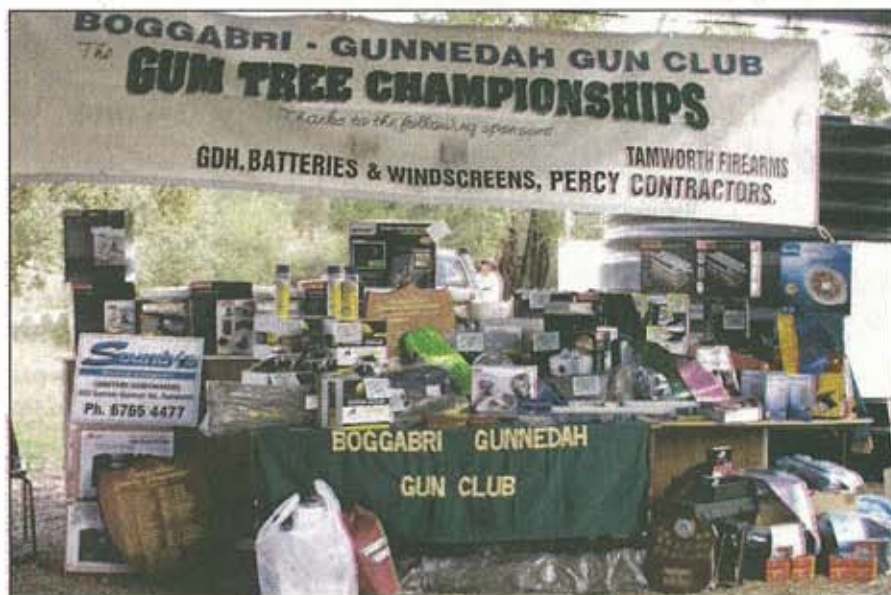

(a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

STATE NIGHT TITLES AT ECHUCA

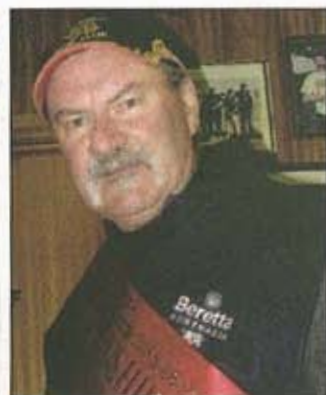
