



NEW HASSLE FREE TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

THIS YEAR'S NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS will be a relaxed and enjoyable experience for those who attend. The establishment of pre nomination and pre squadding will ensure all of the hassle is taken out of the Championships.

Once nominated each person will receive a letter containing confirmation of the entry. Upon arriving for the Championships the registered shooter can "check in" by providing their handicap card and shooter License plus any changes to their handicap status to the Events Office staff.

The staff will provide you with your Shooters card for the week with all of your details of squadding, wave and approximate time.

All shooters will be retained in that squad for the duration of the competition except for the Handicap. Squads will be rotated.

For the National handicap shooters will be re-squadded according to handicap marks. This will be available the day prior to the handicap event.

The handicap event on Saturday will provide a fitting climax to the event with 80% of the Nominations returned to the Place getters followed by the Mackintosh and teams events to on Sunday to complete the program.

The ACTA through the Hall of Fame committee is organizing a Mackintosh reunion, being planned for 2011. The reunion will be held to celebrate the selection of members of the Mackintosh team since its inception. The year long promotion will feature a Mackintosh story in each edition of the CTSN leading into the reunion. Further details will be forthcoming in the next CTSN.

Commonwealth Games Selection

The ACTA ISSF Championships will be conducted from Tuesday the 19th of January to Sunday the 24th January at the Brisbane Gun Club.

The event as well as being the ACTA National Championship is a part of the selection process for the 2010 Commonwealth Games.

The Commonwealth Games is to be conducted in New Delhi India from the 3rd to the 14th of October. The Shotgun shooting component will be conducted at the Dr Karni Singh Shooting Range from the 6th to 13th of October.

The selection events will be open to those listed in the top ten of the AISL Ranking List in the event they are contesting, at the close of entries to the first selection event and up to two wild cards in each event which will be issued by the AISL High Performance Management Committee in all disciplines except Men's Trap. Men's Trap will be open to the top twenty in consideration of the numbers competing.

QCTA State Skeet Carnival

ROMA CLAY TARGET CLUB



S USUAL IT WAS WORTH TRAVELLING the distance to the Roma Clay Target Club for the Queensland State Skeet Carnival in September. Club members had worked hard to have the grounds and layouts in A1 condition for the thirteen squads of skeet shooters who arrived to contest the championships under perfect conditions.

The Multigauge events began on the Thursday with popular interstate regular Gil Farish winning overall in the 20 gauge event with a perfect 50/50, one target ahead of Nigel Hughes who took AA grade with 49/50. The second event was the 28 gauge won by young champ Paul Adams from Brisbane, also with a 50/50. Good shooting also by Jim Storch from Blackwater who took A grade in this event with 48/50, and Thomas Rhue from Caboolture winning C Grade with 42/50. The final event for the day was the 410 and Gold Coast's Dave Dundon took overall in this event with just one target down on 49/50. Other standouts were Paulette Walker, who won B grade in all three Multigauge events, shooting 45/50 in the 410, and local Roma President and trap shooter Michael Keegan who won C Grade with 36/50.

Friday morning saw the final event in the Multigauge championships, with Glenn Walker taking overall in the 12 gauge with 50/50. Other grade winners were Paul Adams in AA and Neal Dimmick in A grade who also shot 50/50, Tracey Ashton in B grade with 48/50 and Chris Bourne in C grade also with 48/50. Multigauge champion over the 200 targets and four gauges was Dave Dundon with an excellent score of 197/200.

The State Skeet Championships began on Friday afternoon, kicking off with the 50T State Handicap event. This event has been generously sponsored for the past couple of years by Laurie and Candy Chelepy who have more than \$1100 in cash prizes up for grabs on this event. The cash this year was taken by Ashley Mason from Toowoomba who shot a brilliant 100/100 after an exhaustive shoot off. Ashley's eloquent speeches at the presentation table make him a crowd favourite so we were all behind him in the shoot off – well done Ash. Other place getters in the Handicap

were Dave Dundon 2nd 111/112, Michael Keegan 3rd 102/112, Allan Denton 4th 90/93 and Veronika Forsythe 5th 82/91.

Saturday's 100T State Championship was the major event on the card with a silver State badge, sash, perpetual trophy and cash award going to the winner. Dave Dundon blitzed the competition with 99/100 to take overall, while Nigel Hughes and Paul Adams fought it out for 1st and 2nd in AA grade with 127/129 and 126/129 respectively. The Pioneer club featured strongly in this event with Laurie Rodden shooting well to take 1st in A grade with 98/100, Alan Adams 1st in B grade with 96/100 and John Rodden 2nd in B grade close behind with 94/100. Lorraine Hughes won the



Ladies title with 104/107, Paul Adams won the Juniors with 98/100 and Mount Isa's Mick McGill won best Vet with 96/100.

Thank you to our efficient Zone Secretaries for submitting their postal team scores. The South East Zone proved too strong winning both the Open and Ladies team prizes this year, with the Northern Zone boasting the winning Veterans team. Winning teams were: South East Zone Open – Dave Dundon, Mike Morgan, Lorraine Hughes, Marg Denton, Glenn Walker and Neal Dimmick 145/150. The Handicap and 100T Championship also decided the State teams and Queensland will be proud to field strong teams again at the 2010 Skeet Nationals in Wagga. Open team members: Glenn Walker, Nigel Hughes, Mike Swale, Laurie Chelepy and Pat Dury. Five shooters contested the final place in the open team so competition was certainly tough for





this selection. Ladies team members: Lorraine Hughes, Margaret Denton and Debbie Young. Great to see another Junior team for Queensland again with Paul Adams, Luke Mason and Thomas Rhue. Veterans team: Mick McGill, Neal Dimmick and Allan Denton. Congratulations to team members and good luck in 2010.

The 50T Pacific Coast Championship on Sunday morning delivered more good scores for Dave Dundon who shot 77/77 to win overall in this event, Nigel Hughes again hot on his heels with 76/77 to win 1st in AA grade. Other good scores were achieved by George Petrou shooting 50/50 to win 1st in A grade, another 50/50 by Geoff Bryant for 1st in C grade and a very impressive 48/50 by Nancy Badewitz from Cooma to take 2nd in C grade. Section prizes went to Debbie Young, Ladies with 49/50, Paul Adams, Junior with 49/50 and George Petrou, Veterans with 50/50.

Rounding off the carnival was the 50T State Doubles Championship, fought out in a shoot off between Dave Dundon and George Sckaf, with Dave taking the overall sash and badge with a very fine 59/60. George was well satisfied with 1st in AA grade also shooting a very respectable 58/60 with Frank Cooper from Brisbane close behind in 2nd place with 56/58. Alan Adams won B grade with 47/50 and C grade went to Veronika Forsythe on 44/52. Ladies went to Katie Light from Toowoomba with a great score of 48/50, Paul Adams took Juniors also with 48/50 and Neal Dimmick showed fine form to take Veterans with 49/50.

At the presentations Dave Dundon was aptly provided with a trolley to take home his swag of prizes. These included 2009 Skeet Champion 199/202, and Overall High Gun for the carnival with just two targets down for the entire weekend, 248/250. Great shooting Dave. 



Psychological Skills for Shooting

HOW DO YOU KNOW WHEN THE PROBLEM IS PSYCHOLOGICAL?

In Last months article, I wrote that part of any evaluation of your performance in the previous year should include a skills audit and three levels of skills should be addressed: technical, physical and mental skills.

Technical skills involve the fundamentals of shooting: for example, stance, lead, target acquisition and follow through. If you need help with any of the technical skills then some time with a coach maybe worthwhile.

Physical skills, for example, involve those aspects such as strength, agility, stamina, muscle memory, dealing with fatigue, hydration and nutrition. Sessions with a dietician, strength and fitness coach or masseur may be appropriate.

Mental skills involve concentration and attention, visualization, mental rehearsal, relaxation and goal setting.

So as a shooter you have identified that you want to correct a problem or improve your performance. To do this you must first identify the source of the problem. Unfortunately, once you have insight into why you are not performing well or know what the problem is, then you are likely to become anxious about the decisions that you now have to make to correct the problem. Just knowing the problem doesn't help: you need to have a solution. However, when we are not performing well, we are likely to get unsolicited advice from everyone and we can end up with too many choices. Having choices can lead to anxiety because we do not know which option we should take. This anxiety is due to being overloaded with options and choices.

Having too many choices can lead to self-doubt. So what can be done? Firstly, you have to identify what the problem is. If the problem is psychological, then according to Nideffer (1992), it is most likely one of concentration or arousal control. If the problem is technical, then the solution involves technical and or tactical changes. Secondly, you must

the responsibility for choosing and following through on the course of action. This means you must make a commitment to follow a specific course of action. Once you have faith in your choice then you can quiet the doubt and conflict in your mind.

According to Nideffer, how do you know that your problem stems from the loss of control over your physiological arousal or the ability to concentrate, and isn't simply a technical or tactical mistake? Nideffer describes four questions which can be used to test if the problem is psychological or technical aspects of your performance.

- **1.** Are you satisfied with your skill level when you are shooting well? If the answer is no then you probably do not have the skill level necessary to perform to your potential. If the problem is strength, or speed, stamina, etc then any amount of mental rehearsal will not help. Physical practice with expert technical coaching will help.
- 2. Do mistakes occur at random or do they increase in pressure situations? A purely technical or skill problem will occur in a wide variety of settings. You will be unable to see any pattern. When the problem is psychological, the mistakes will tend to occur more frequently under pressure and will have a predictable pattern. Such as, missing the last target, or the first target in the shoot off.
- **3. When you are having a problem, how do you feel?** According to Nideffer, if you feel confident, and in control of your thoughts and feelings, then, the problem may involve nothing more than a simple technical issue. If, on the other hand, you feel a sense of panic, if you feel pressured, rushed, confused or overloaded, then the problem is psychological.
- 4. Is the problem affecting only one aspect of your performance or are several things going wrong at the same time? Nideffer states that when stress is a factor, the increase in muscle tension interferes with your vision and concentration. Under these stressful conditions, you are not likely to be dealing with a single problem: instead you will find that everything is going wrong. As you try to make up for each subsequent mistake you will keep making more because you will be trying make up for each mistake. This is what happens when you see three missed targets in a row.

The biggest issue with working out what the cause of the problem, is often denial. This is the reluctance to admit that a psychological problem exists. And this will be the topic next month.

Our juniors, are very fortunate in that: they have some excellent role models, who for example: at the age of 83 still compete in events like the 'World Masters Games', recently held in Sydney & bring back medals & like another member; Karl Pieper, who has because of arthritis, cleverly designed a trailer & modified a mobility scooter, to enable him to stay & participate, in the sport he loves, for a lot longer.

Karl has been kind enough to let us publish photos of his scooter & to share his passion for the sport, in our local paper & has also agreed to share his story to the broader shooting community, with this article.

Karl says "That Clay Target Shooting is a great recreational & social sport. It's a lot of fun & is not just for competition shooters." He travels from Lithgow to compete in the Bathurst Gun Club's Trap & Skeet events & the dedicated enthusiast, is an inspiration to all members. He also feels that "Shooting continues to develop beneficial life skills for shooters, at any age; such as mental toughness, concentration, goal setting, focus, self-confidence & resilience" & Karl certainly exhibits all these skills.

Karl has had many interests. These include bird- breeding & showing; horses- show jumping, water jumping, buck-jump riding & driving trotters; as well as water skiing & speed boat racing.

Karl has been a butcher, a mechanical engineer, a fireman, a pilot & member of Bathurst Flying Club, a crop-duster & a builder over the years. When fifteen he joined a motorcycle club & rode old time bikes

Veloettes, Aerials & Nortons. In 1975 he started to race superbikes; he rose to A Grade & won several trophies & raced at Bathurst, quite a few times. In 1977, when motor cycle racing, he broke 'a few bones' & as a result now suffers from arthritis.

Karl first went shooting with his father, when he was eight years old. They shot rabbits. He recalls that he was only allowed to carry a gun if it was unloaded, prior to that. When he was around twelve to fourteen years of age; he was allowed to go shooting

on his own, but no friends were ever allowed to accompany him, on these occasions.

On joining a muzzle-loading club, at fourteen; Karl was then allowed to go shooting with other adults. He won some ribbons & when twenty five, he joined the Lithgow Rifle Range, where he also won several events over the years. Two years on, Karl joined the Sunny Corner Gun Clay Target Club & was their President for a short time. When the Club folded, he joined the Bathurst Gun Club.

Arthritis, makes walking around the range & standing during the entire competition difficult. So Karl, put his mechanical skills to good use, after buying a scooter & a trailer & adapted & modified them, to his shooting requirements & to transport the scooter to the range. He adapted the trailer by adding tool boxes, to carry his shooting equipment & added an outrigger to the scooter, to transport the gun, while moving from stand to stand whilst competing. The gun sits in a broken position as Karl moves across the tracks & he can stop, pick up the gun & get ready for the next target, each time. The outrigger can be taken off, when not needed. The seat swivels to aid mobility & the tool boxes are lined. The trailer has been designed to make the loading & unloading of the scooter easy for Karl.

Over the last few years Karl has designed & built two side cars, so he can continue to ride his motorbikes as he can no longer hold them up.

The club applauds Karl's spirit, his wit and his ingenuity and hopes that he continues to enjoy his shooting, for many more years to come at Bathurst Gun Club.





CONDITIONS OF ENTRY – NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

- In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded. Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
- 2. Squads of 6 to shoot 50 targets/75 targets in brackets of 25, one visit only to the traps. Squads of 6 to shoot 100 targets in brackets of 50, two visits to the traps. National Handicap event to be 5 (five) person squads, 5 (five) targets per lane.
- 3. Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
- 4. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/75 targets. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET will be incurred.
- 5. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at the practice trap at a time suitable to management
- 6. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 7. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
- 8. Any competitor will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET will be incurred in the event concerned.
- 9. Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first round of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility will be penalised one target. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for they're failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.
- 10. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.
- 11. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- 12. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 13. Optional sweep/purse nominations shall be noted on a separate form from shooting nominations and are not refundable.
- 14. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
- 15. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall chose in which team they will be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
- 16. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade and section prize.
- 17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
- 18. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behaviour of the card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 19. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
- 20. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 21. Reduced Nominations shall apply to Juniors and Sub-Juniors. Also partners' entering into the same event whose nomination is lodged at the same time as a member paying full nomination fees. Shooters paying reduced Noms are eligible for Overall, Grade and section prizes.
- 22. All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Trap Championships.

NORMAN DUDLEY LIPPLE 1927 - 2009

I first met Norm when I arrived at Moulmein in 1981 to take up a teaching appointment in a one teacher school. After introductions, Norm's first question was "Do you shoot? Would you like to come out to the Gun Club." And, like many others, I went to the gun club with Norm and caught his passion for the sport.

Norm was a champion of our sport. He may not have won a national or state title, and he isn't a member of the Hall of Fame, but his love of shooting, his tireless dedication as secretary of Moulamein Gun Club and his active promotion of all forms of shooting, allowed others to enjoy the sport knowing that the competition would be well organised and well run. Walking into the church and seeing the sashes draped over the pews, the shotgun salute by club members at the graveside and seeing old shooting friends from Hay, Moulamein, Deniliquin, Boort, Swan Hill and Kerang Gun Clubs was a fitting testimony of the importance of shooting in Norm's life.

Norm was born in Western Australia and after military service, mechanics training, and other jobs, he eventually moved to Moulamein, where he lived with his wife, Anne and their children, Greg and Ros. Norm's family was his first and major love. I remember fondly, the way he talked, with obvious pride, about the achievements of his children and grandchildren, and the way he worked with Anne to make Moulamein a friendly and welcoming town. Norm received several awards from the local community for his paid and volunteer work for the Wakool Shire and Moulamein in particular. He was deputy engineer of Wakool Shire and his common sense, professional knowledge and ability to see the larger picture for the community: a sewerage system that put the effluent into an irrigation system rather than the river, a man made lake so locals could water-ski, a safe pool complex where children could swim safely, helped make Moulamein a great community.

His other love was flying. He had a Victa Air Tourer and he combined his love of flying and shooting: we would either fly to shoots or we would put the guns, ammo, and dogs in the plane and fly over the plains north of Moulamein looking for pigs, land on the claypans and head off in search of the pigs. If he could have fitted guns to the plane, we may not have ever landed.

In these short sentences it is hard to do justice to Norm's life. His passion for life, shooting, family and community action should serve as a model for the rest of us.

Personally, I am grateful for having had the privilege to have known Norm.

To Anne, Greg and Ros, and his many grandchildren, on behalf of the clay target shooting community, our sincerest condolences.

AUSTRALIA WINS GLENN TROPHY


THE GLENN TROPHY was shot over 50 targets and was held following the conclusion of the days 100 target event.

Rule Reminders

Contrary to the opinion held by some of our members, the following rules do apply to ALL shooters when participating in competition events, from Club level to Nationals, and not just for A, B and C graders.

Rule 4.10 (d) – Each competitor shall carry and present his/her current handicap/registration card at all shoots before they are allowed to participate.

Rule 2.01 (k) – If a competitor has lost his card he shall be allowed to compete providing he/she is registered with the ACTA. He/she shall be allowed to compete in his grade in common mark events and shall be allowed to compete in handicap events from the mark he claims to be his correct handicap mark. Should he win prize money or trophies they must be retained by the club until such time as the shooter presents his card for marking.

Rule 2.01 (h) – It shall be the responsibility of a designated club official to enter individual event scores and progressively mark the shooters card with his/her 15 metre results.

Rule 2.02 (a) – Each club must appoint an official to handicap and grade shooters, check to see that all 15 metre scores are entered on cards and to check that handicap and grade changes are recorded on cards.
