



The system worked extremely well and should continue to be refined to ensure these results are continually repeated in the future. Adrian Cousens made the system flow throughout the Championships to a point we finished the Mackintosh event on Saturday.

Not only was the carnival a success the way in which the carnival was presented and the Media outlets of Wagga Wagga reported the Championships has enabled us to secure a another sponsor for 2011. We will confirm this and other sponsors for 2011 in the near future. I would like to thank all of the sponsors who contributed to the success of the Championships. We would encourage all ACTA members to support those who support you.

The results from the Nationals which are published on the WEB in their entirety shows each persons results for each event, something we are not able to do in the Magazine. Commencing on the 12th April 2010 the Australian Clay Target Association National Trap Championships were conducted at the National Shooting Ground in Wagga Wagga.

This is the first time that shooters were required to pre-nominate to compete and were pre-squaded for the entire carnival. Shooters from every State of Australia and a large New Zealand contingent assembled to compete. The National Championships were not conducted at the National Grounds in 2009 and shooters were delighted to see the improvements that had been made. The sealed trade area, children's playground, BBQ area, spectator seating, kitchen upgrade and other less visible infrastructure such as the new power supply were all very obvious. The number of on-ground campers increased considerably this year and hopefully the planned increase in powered sites will be available in 2011. 

Shooters nominated at the office and presented their entry cards to Janenne Kidd and Vivien Moore at the squadding table set up outside the club house who allocated squads and directed them to their shooting layout.

The event was shot over 20 pair from 24 metres with 106 teams of shooters competing. After qualifying there were 5 sets of possibles. Both shooters received a Royal Blue Sash and a Silver Australia Badge.

Second place went to Matthew Stokes (Port Augusta) and Michael Bryan (Shoalhaven) 64/65 who each received a Silver ACTA Medal and 3rd place was taken out by the pair from New Zealand, Colin Waghorn and Boston Walker with a score of 53/54. Both shooters took home a Bronze ACTA Medal to New Zealand. All three placings also received cash prizes and trophies.

Sixty-eight pair of shooters competed in this event which was shot from 20 metres and resulted in a very credible 16 possibles.

The eventual winners were Wayne Headon and John Duryea from Hay with a score of 66/66.

Wayne and John each received a Tri-coloured Sash, cash prize and trophy. Second place and taking home the ACTA Silver Medals went to the father/son pair of Arthur and Jarrod Turner from Cobar with a score of 65/66 and ACTA Bronze Medals went to Andrew and Michael Smith from Noorat, Victoria 37/38.

59th NATIONAL DOUBLE BARREL CHAMPIONSHIPSponsored by **BERETTA AUSTRALIA**

Day three, and we were again treated with great weather and conditions on what is traditionally the busiest day of the National Carnival. For all involved, particularly officials running the shoot, office staff and handicappers, the systems that had been developed coped with ease. There were no arguments, no yelling and Woody hadn't even gone into a quiet phase (generally a sign that he is not happy with someone or something). Maureen from the National office was again on hand to assist and also took control of the selling of practice tokens. With 15 traps operating Adrian Cousens was working tirelessly and seemed

to be in the office every 5 minutes with completed squad sheets, testimony to how well the shoot was running.

470 shooters competed including 58 Women, 22 Sub-juniors, 49 Juniors and 49 Veterans resulting in 158 possibles to shoot off in 27 squads over 10 traps. The Grades consisted of 244 in AA, 122 A, 78 B, 26 C.

The shoot-off started at around 12 noon and after the first bracket of 25 targets the number of squads had reduced from 27 to 17. By the end of the daylight shooting only 11 shooters remained. The shoot-off continued under lights and after another 90 targets Steve Atkins stood alone on the tracks as the overall winner with a final score of 465/465. This was yet again another back to back win as Steve also won at Roma in 2009. Steve's name will again appear on the lock M Wilson Perpetual Trophy. Steve also takes home the Beretta shotgun, Royal Blue Sash and the Silver Australia Badge.

Day four, and the 100 target National Single Barrel started on time at 8.30 am. 460 shooters competed including 59 Women, 22 Sub-juniors, 49 Juniors and 47 Veterans. The Grades consisted of 239 in AA, 122 A, 75 B, 24 C.

The first round of 50 targets was completed by 11.30. Shoot Marshal Adrian and his trusty assistant Ron Traill kept the squads on the go and the final squads of the second round were back in the office by 3.50 pm. With the office system still running smoothly the shootoff squads were quickly delivered to the Shoot Marshal. Only 4 shooters had managed to put together a perfect score and after only another 20 targets Boston Walker from Gorge Road Gun Club in New Zealand, was duly declared the winner. Boston received the W Rainbird Perpetual Trophy. the Silver Australia Badge, Royal Blue Sash, cash and a under-over shotgun supplied by Highland Sports. 


Everyday proved challenging with day one very bleak covered in a thick layer of fog that you couldn't even see the clays.

National Coaching Director's Report

Jack Collicoat - 2010 World Junior Trap Champion

Jack, on behalf of everyone involved with the National ACTA Junior Training Camps over the last three years, I want to congratulate you on winning the World Junior Championship in South Africa.

It has been our pleasure to be a part of Jack's shooting career. Every minute of every day and every clay Jack shot at during the camps he applied himself 100%. He always strived to improve his skill and gain as much knowledge as possible from those around him. Knowing Jack and watching his achievements winning State and National titles through his shooting career to become a junior world champion is no surprise to me, and a just reward to a great sportsman. This win will inspire those who know you to work towards their goals that bit harder and who knows the ACTA may give more funding towards junior training camps. Again well done Jack, young athletes like you make the time and effort people put into junior shooters across Australia worth every second.

Our ISSF and Trap National Championships have just finished and the standard of shooting from our younger shooters is on a definite rise. The coaching weekends being carried out are working. Many of the junior shooters I have met in different States are in shoot offs and are winning. We have a very strong group of young athletes coming up in our sport. What we need is a direction for them to go. We must put in place the next level of coaching and support for those who wish to achieve their goals. Sounds easy? Well I thought so until the ACTA gave me the job of putting together a selection system to send a men's and ladies' team in Olympic Trap to compete overseas this year. The system had to work in with the existing shooting schedule and be cost effective for the shooters. What I am very aware of now is how a very small number of people can make it so difficult to try

and make a start towards setting up a system that is affordable, with equal opportunity and the goal posts are in concrete. I spent hours looking into the corner of my office thinking is this worth the trouble. It would be easier to say to the ACTA forget it but then I would receive a phone call from a shooter saying thank you for giving us the opportunity. Now there is the key word, opportunity. We must give this to those who wish to try their best at our sport. To win an Olympic medal it takes a number of things. First you have to be there; to be there you need the experience, to have the experience you needed plenty of opportunities to gain the experience. Yes a circle, without the circle you are not at the Olympics to start with. This I know from experience, I shot the first 100 straight in a 200 target selection event for an Olympic Team in ISSF Skeet, only to be told that even if I shot the next 100 my name would not be given to the Olympic selection committee as I did not have any overseas experience.

All our medal winners were given the opportunity to have years of overseas experience before they won a medal. We are trying to give athletes the opportunity to gain this experience in international competition, you cannot buy this or read it in a book they must go and learn about it themselves, what effect the competition has on them and work out how to achieve their best under pressure. Experience takes time.

The second and final elimination has been held and the ACTA have selected the ISSF Trap teams to compete overseas in July this year. I know they will learn a lot about themself and gain that E word. Let's hope the other shooters support these athletes and this program. We MUST create a pathway for our future champions. Some of you should stop thinking what suits you and look at what is best for our sport, you all started at the bottom and people gave you the opportunity!!





IT'S YOUR CALL by Bill McCarthy

You are refereeing a squad where a predictable and possibly a normal number of targets are thrown broken. You normally rule "**No Target**" in each instance and proceed with the shoot.

A squad member calls for a target which is released broken. You call No Target. The shooter then calls for another target but has not put his gun to his shoulder or made any attempt to prepare to shoot a target. A legal target is released. He obviously has called for a target to "have a look at one".

What do you rule?

It's Your Call

If you ruled "Lost Target" you would be quite correct. Sounds a bit tough doesn't it.

Under Rule **GRTS 5** (b) (vi) a shooter is not entitled to see a target unless he has received **two broken targets in a row**. (Commonsense would dictate this Rule would also include 2 "No Targets" in a row).

Anyway, this shooter has received only **one broken target**, has ignored the Referee and taken it upon himself to view a target he is not entitled to view. This seems to be a frequent occurrence

with our voice release systems and there have been instances of shooters calling for 2 or even 3 targets without reference to the Referee. If the shooter had been particularly concerned about the targets he could have asked the Referee if he could see another. Whether the Referee would grant his request is another matter. In view of the requirements of GRTS 5 (b) (vi) it does not give the Referee or the shooter a choice in the matter unless other extraneous conditions are obvious. Therefore, and in any case, the shooter is not entitled to take it upon himself and call for a target without the authority of the Referee.

GRTS 5 sets out quite clearly when and where targets are to be shown by Referees. Most shooters are very familiar with the common ones. It seems that lack of knowledge of the section on broken targets under GRTS 17. However where a shooter has not closed his gun or mounted it to his shoulder he is certainly not in a position to claim a refusal under GRTS 17.

The rules regarding entitlements to be shown a target are quite specific. It is up to all shooters to familiarize themselves with these rules to avoid unnecessary conflict and embarrassment to both himself or his fellow shooter who happens to be the Referee at the time.

(a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

- (a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.



Regular Albury visitor, Bogong member Dave Harley also shot a 55/60 to win his grade, Greg Canning just one target behind to keep Dave honest in B Grade. There was another close result in C Grade with Brian Beach, 50/60, one target clear of Albury junior Jacob Matthews with 49/60.

Event 2 was set to be less testing with a 30 target Double Barrel Championship. Mother

Psychological Skills for Shooting

POSITIVE THOUGHT PATTERNS

Last month I presented a summary of self talk: that steady stream of thoughts and dialogues that go on in our minds. I mentioned that self-talk can be either positive or negative and it can, if repeated enough go on to form

beliefs by which we think, act and live. This month I want to explore positive thought patterns.

According to Burton & Raedeke, positive thought patterns help create a "flow" mindset by boosting confidence, maintaining an optimistic attitude, promoting concentration at crucial moments, enhancing motivation to push you to your limits, creating an optimal level of arousal and ensuring poise and mental toughness when confronting failure or adversity. Wow, what a sentence: and it's not just the words and wondrous phrases. This is it. If we could consistently develop this flow mindset, we would rarely miss, fail or lose, and if we did we could handle it.

Burton & Raedeke outline eight strategies that we can use to help us use self-talk productively and effectively. They refer to these strategies as "smart talk commandments."

- 1. Be an optimist not a pessimist. Self-talk is always a choice; it can either be positive or negative or it can be a combination of either. As an athlete we should focus on our strengths, and push for personal bests that can help us reach our middle and long term goals. Coaches can play a vital role here: be a positive role model and concentrate on what you're your athlete can do rather than what they cannot do.
- 2. Remain realistic and objective. Positive self-talk must be just more than thinking positively, in a way that can confuse reality with day dreams. Dreams and visions are important but they must be translated into specific goals and action plans. Smart talk will keep our thoughts well grounded and realistic: this is important because it will help us bounce back from a defeat if the goals we have set ourselves are realistic and achievable.
- 3. Focus on the present, not the past or the future. Regular readers will have heard this before, and it needs to have the status of a mantra.

ACTA Five Stand

Nineteen Shooters tried their hand at the ACTA Five Stand on the 4th Sunday of March.

Due to other events scheduled at the club and uncertainty regarding numbers, the program was limited to 50 Targets Comp plus BO. Travellers attended from Wagga and Bega (currently in the process of installing Five Stand and looking for ideas).

The Five Stand event was shot over the Double Trap area and involved a wide variety of targets which included Batu and Rabbit. As anticipated there was a bit of figure trouble at times with shooters taking their turn at refereeing and working the release box. However, people exercised patience and in general the shoot ran well. As people become familiar with the system this problem should be minimized. Our thanks go to Neal Goodwin, Rodney Kneipp and John Sankey who came early and helped set the course. Also our thanks go to those who filled the traps and generally helped to make the shoot enjoyable.

Results: High Gun Rick Mathers 41/50 (Wagga Wagga); Division 1 Rodney Kneipp 46/60 (Shoot Off), Division 2 Norm Simms 34/50.

If we focus on the past we are likely to relive old failures and misses and make judgements about our performance based on these skewed thoughts from the past. The same is true for focusing on the future: because we cannot be guaranteed of victories, we become anxious about the outcome and this anxiety leads to self-doubt. Self-doubt leads to our muscles tensing up and we miss. The present is the only time any of us can act. If we stay focused on the present we can concentrate on the process (shooting), and the product (score) will look after itself. Burton & Raedeke, state that smart-talk forgets the "if only's (past) and the "what if's" (future) and concentrates on staying in the moment and enjoying the here and now.

- 4. Appraise problems as challenges rather than threats. Athletes who view problems as challenges bring out the best in themselves by remaining motivated and performing up to their capabilities. If you perceive problems as threats you will become consumed with avoiding failure, become stressed and perform poorly.
- 5. View successes at replicable and failures as surmountable. You will success as something you can do again and again if you believe that the success is due to effort and ability rather than just good luck. Coaches and the athletes themselves need to attribute failure to something they can control: for example, the failure may be due to fitness (physical skills), poor shot (technical skills) or poor concentration (mental skills). Skill development in any of areas may assist in solving the problem. Smart talk helps the athletes see that the causes of their failures can be fixed and that success is achievable.
- 6. Focus on the process so that the product can look after itself. Burton & Raedeke believe that self-talk focus should be on the process goals (eg, hard work, mental preparation, skill and strategy development) that help us achieve the desired product goals. For shooters the process is the actual act of shooting: pre-shot routine, mounting the gun, acquiring the target, swing, pulling the trigger and following through. The product is the score.
- 7. Concentrate on the things you can control. This according to Burton & Raedeke is the most important aspect of self-talk. If we try and change people and events beyond our control, then all we do is create stress for ourselves. If however, we focus self-talk on the things we can control, our emotions and behaviours remain positive and constructive. We cannot control our opponents behaviour but we can control our own: smart talk would tell us to "Act not React".
- 8. Separate your performance from your self worth. Your worth as a human being has nothing to do with how you shoot. Sporting ability, is only one aspect of who you are: your work, your ability to develop and maintain relationships, your ability to provide something for the sport or other who compete are more important than your ability to perform well. Everytime you compete you must remember that "you" are not your score (your score was how you performed on the day).

It is important that by following the eight strategies listed above you should be able to construct positive thought patterns which will help support your ability and should lead to further success. It must be remembered that it is impossible to stay positively focused all the time. Because we are human, it is very easy to slip into a negative mindset that will work against the good work that the positive thought patterns are trying to achieve. The plan is to have a positive thought patterns that significantly outweigh the negative thought patterns. Next month I will explore what negative thought patterns are and how we can best avoid them.

Australasian-Pacific Grand Prix

OVER 20 INCHES OF RAIN in many areas; the worst floods in 120 years; and 80% of the shires in Queensland declared disaster areas could not dampen the enthusiasm of the regular ISSF enthusiasts who attended the 16th annual Australasian-Pacific Grand Prix at Brisbane Gun Club during early March.

The regular band of Olympic Trap and ISSF skeet shooters from the south eastern corner of Queensland together with many keen shooters from throughout Queensland plus a sprinkling of visitors from New South Wales and Victoria once again cemented the reputation of Brisbane's annual Grand Prix carnival as amongst the best Olympic discipline competitions on the Australasian calendar.

Once again the competition was also attended by a large contingent of shooters from the Japanese Top Gun Club which is organised by Japan Shotshell together with the support and sponsorship of Winchester in Australia. This year we welcomed approximately 40 Top Gun Club trap and skeet shooters many of whom had been to our competition on many occasions in previous years.

As has been the procedure in recent years, the four day carnival was divided into two separate events in both Olympic Trap and ISSF Skeet with the 200 target Australian Open events conducted on Thursday and Friday and the 150 target events in both disciplines conducted on Saturday and Sunday. All 4 events included a final for the top 6 shooters at the end of the event.

Despite the weeks of inclement weather leading up to the commencement of the first day's proceedings, the weather held out to give us the opportunity to get the Australian Open competitions in both Trap and Skeet underway on time without any delay. The Olympic Trap event was conducted over two of our three Olympic Trap ranges and the skeet competition was held on one of Brisbane Gun Club's newly completed skeet fields, which many would have had the opportunity to admire during the very successful Olympic Discipline national titles which were held on our grounds during January.

Although the number of competitors in the early skeet event was down on usual numbers, the competition was good and it was great to see such an enthusiastic display of shooting recorded over the two days by one of our promising younger shooters, Paul Adams. Paul shot a number of good rounds to record a very good win in the competition from local stalwarts Mark Kempnich and Justin Ehrenreich. Paul recorded a good overall score of 191/225

to become the 2010 Australian Open ISSF Skeet Champion.

The trap section of the Australian Open which was also held over two days was set to become a hotly contested event with a number of previous winners in the field – namely Greg Newey, Kevin Perkins and Marcello Casella together with quite a few other shooters who had the credentials to become the Australian Open winner for 2010.

Day one saw a mixed bag of scores with very little red writing on the board, however it was to be the consistency of shooters like Dan Johnson (Warwick), Kevin Perkins (Mary-borough), Tony Cantali (Cecil Park), Marcello Casella (Griffith) and others who made their intentions clear that they were keen to be there at final time. After 100 targets, Dan Johnson was in on 86, followed by Marcello Casella, Greg Newey, Tony Cantali, Mahipal Shekhawat and Kevin Perkins. The best placed shooter amongst the small contingent of ladies in the event was Anna Shedrina who led from Betty Fawcett and Rohanna Abberton.

Again day two of the event saw us blessed with a day without rain which was quite unusual considering the weather during the past few weeks. Once again Dan Johnson continued his consistent form to record a further 4 good rounds to finish with 87/100 – an overall

total of 173/200 and the honour of being top qualifier and first into the final. As is usual with 'single barrel' finals, there were a few ups-and-downs in the final but at the conclusion of proceedings, Dan Johnson was the overall winner after recording a creditable 22/25 to add to his consistency over the preceding two days.

with the Australian Open competition was once again held on the second day and saw some good winnings picked up by a number of competitors. Round 1 AA/A Marcello Casella, B/C Reno Cangiano, Round 2 AA/A Tony Cantali, B/C Randolph Rossi, Round 3 AA/A Kevin Perkins, B/C Fernando Cilli, Round 4 AA/A Tony Cantali, B/C Klinton Hope, Scott Dobeli & Mahipal Shekhawat.

Saturday morning arrived and the weather forecasters had predicted that the weather might not be as kind over the weekend as it had been on the previous two days. Unfortunately, this was to be the case and we saw a number of heavy downpours during the next two days of competition. However the rain that was experienced did not dampen the enthusiasm of the competitors whose numbers had now increased dramatically with the inclusion of the shooters from the Japan Top Gun Club. For the 150 target Australasian-Pacific Grand Prix in skeet, there were now two squads of shooters while around 10 full squads of Olympic Trap shooters would make up the field in that discipline. Quite a few regular attendees of the Grand Prix who had not been able to make it for the first events arrived for



After the first day of competition, the field was evenly spread with only a few targets separating the top four shooters and it was eventually Eizo Aoto who finished day two on 121/150, one target ahead of Kota Tabei while Paul Adams was hanging in on 118/150 and Ken Okozumi on 117/150.

With only four targets separating the top four shooters in the final, it was still anyone's championship. Kota Tabei withstood the pressure the best, carding a very good 23/25 to finish on 143/175, five targets ahead of Eizo Aoto with Paul Adams taking his grade and third overall after surviving a shoot-off with Ken Okozumi after they were tied on 137/175.


