Southern Cross Skeet Carnival

Canberra International Clay Target Club

CANBERRA INTERNATIONAL held their annual two day skeet carnival over the weekend of the 8th and 9th of May 2010. The shoot was given the name "The Southern Cross Skeet Carnival" by the clubs skeet coordinator John Pethybridge. The name "Southern Cross" was chosen for two reasons. The first was because we shoot under the Southern Cross. The second and most interesting, was because John's uncle, Tommy Pethybridge, was lost and killed in the Lady Southern Cross aeroplane in company with Sir Charles Kingsford Smith in 1935. John bought along an original propeller from the plane as a display item. As a side note, a person believes he has found the Lady Southern Cross and it planning to raise it from the ocean bed on the 8th of November this year, the 75th anniversary of when it disappeared.

Two days of superb weather provided shooters with no excuses when it came to the scores, and four layouts were utilised on the Saturday. The first event to get the carnival underway was a 50 target graded cash divide. The winner of AA was Colin Sim who shot 49/50, second and third were tied between Laurie Chelepy and Paul Johnston on 48/50. The A grade winner was shared between Wayne Petersen and David Douglas on 47/50 with Mark Kolstad coming third on 41/50. B grade also saw first place shared between Michael Maloney and Steve Balogh on 48/50 with Robert Thorne taking third with 47/50. Don Badewitz and Kelly Dalton shared the C grade spoils on 43/50 with Nancy Badewitz grabbing third with a 39/50.

Now the shooters had their eye in the 50 target Handicap event got underway. After two and a bit boxes into the shootoff Steve Balogh took the spoils with 103/108 with Matt Dwyer second on 99/108. Mark Corbett took third place on 66/74 and Don Badewitz snared 4th spot on 52/60. This event was generously sponsored by Fyshwick Firearms who supplied the Falcon shotshell prizes.

Saturday's final event was 25 pair skeet doubles. Laurie Chelepy was the overall winner with 49/50 leaving Paul Johnston the AA winner on

47/50 and Frank Cooper second in AA on 44/50. Wayne Peterson won A grade on 43/50 and second was David Douglas on 41/50. B grade was won by Rodney Kniepp on 45/50 with Mark Corbett second on 44/50. After a brief shootoff Matt Dwyer won C grade with 41/52 and Don Badewitz took second on 43/50 after beating his wife Nancy who still managed first in the ladies on 39/50. Veterans went to Steve Balogh with 40/50.

A barbeque dinner was held in the very comfortable clubhouse and the barman was kept busy as a few cold beers were thoroughly enjoyed. Dessert was supplied by Christine Pethybridge and Laurie Chelepy stood guard over a full Pavlova which he claimed had his name on it. It got the better of him in the end and unable to eat it all he eventually shared it with others.

When Sunday dawned there was one event scheduled, consisting of 100 targets, which was the Southern Cross Championship in conjunction with the NSWCTA Southern Zone Championship. When the last shot had been fired it was David Douglas who took the spoils on 98/100. AA went to Paul Johnston 96/100 and in second place Colin Sim shot 95/100. The A grade winner was Wayne Peterson on 92/100 and second place went to Mark Kostad 91/100. The B grade victor was Mark Corbett on 94/100 and second place was filled by Michael Maloney 101/108. C grade was won by Matt Dwyer after a very brief shootoff on 90/101 and Don Badewitz was second on 89/101. Robert Thorne won the Veterans on 94/100 and Nancy Badewitz was the ladies winner with 77/100.

When the scores were calculated Paul Johnston was the overall High Gun for the weekend with a score of 240/250. AA grade went to Laurie Chelepy with 239, A grade was David Douglas on 229, B grade Mark Corbett on 228, C grade Don Badewitz with 217, Ladies Nancy Badewitz on 193 and Veterans was Robert Thorne with 225/250. The NSWCTA Southern Zone Skeet Team selected was Colin Sim, Mark Corbett and Michael Maloney with the reserves being Rodney Kniepp and Wayne Peterson.

Paul Johnston received the inaugural "Southern Cross Skeet" trophy which was a beautiful glass trophy laser etched with an image of the "Lady Southern Cross". It is a special trophy, one with history and

POPULAR NEZ TRAP CARNIVAL HELD AT BENDIGO

BENDIGO CLAY TARGET CLUB was the venue for yet another very successful Victorian, North East Zone Trap Carnival. Attracting fourteen squads of shooters, and with a full five event program, some were pessimistic that it could not be completed in time, but with good planning and execution by the committee, and much appreciated response from the shooters, the final shoot off in the last event was over before the daylight grew too dim.

Held in virtually perfect shooting conditions, almost no wind, clear skies, and a reasonably mild temperature, Bendigo put on its best day for the Carnival, and the good scores recorded on the day showed the competitors really appreciated that. Another attraction for the shooters to try their best was the excellent trophies and cash prizes on offer, thankfully organised by Zone secretary, Mrs Chris Beard.

A fifteen pair, Double Rise Championship was the first event, and although no one could shoot all 30 targets, A grade Ron Traill an Echuca member, and AA grade Anthony Rohrlach registered at Euroa, both managed to come in with only two targets lost. In a five pair shoot off, Ron lost four targets and Anthony managed to hit all except one, making him the Overall Winner and 1st in AA grade on a score of 37/40. Ron Traill taking out 1st in A grade, with his score of 34/40. Marc Crimmins, a Little River member, collected 2nd in AA grade after a shoot off ending in his score of 56/60.

A 25 target, Points Score Championship was the 2nd event for the day, and once again two competitors for a shoot off to decide a winner, Peter Mills and Phillip Desmond both having shot a clean score of 75/75 continued on until Phillip used a second barrel on his fifth target, when Peter hit his fifth with the first shot he became the Overall Winner and 1st in AA grade, ending on a clean score of 90/90, well shot Peter, Phillip taking out 2nd in AA grade with his score of 89/90. A Bendigo member, Darren Hansford, using only one second barrel collected 1st in A grade with a very good score of 74/75.

Single barrel shooting was next on the agenda with a 25 target Single Barrel Championship on offer, this time five competitors managed a full score of 25, Ricky McKinnon, Marc Crimmins, Steve Haberman, Ward Wende, and Mark Bravin. Mark and Ricky dropped out in the first two targets, with Ward dropping his 6th. Steve Haberman an Echuca

member dropped his 12th target giving him 2nd place in AA grade with an end score of 36/37, Marc Crimmins a Little River shooter, made absolutely sure of his 12th target, and that gave him the Overall Winners Sash, and 1st place in AA grade with a total score of 37/37.

Event Four, a 25 target Handicap, with four places on offer, and Sebastopol member Wayne Calaby was unbeatable, shaking off all opposition in the shoot off on his 13th target, taking out First place with his 38/38 score, Maryborough shooter Ashley McKnight was the person pushing Wayne, and although he dropped his 13th target he collected 2nd placing on a score of 37/38, Bendigo member Brad Wooley dropped his 11th target scoring 35/36 giving him 3rd place, and Malcom Smith a Wandoan member although missing his first shoot off target collected 4th place in the Handicap with a score of 25/26.

Event Five, a 25 target Double Barrel Championship, and by now everyone had their eye in, resulting in 26 shooters shooting the full score, luckily for the committee a large number dropped out early, leaving two squads of serious shooters still participating, and soon it was down to two shooters doing battle, Steve Haberman and Anthony Rohrlach, unfortunately Anthony dropped his 90th target and when Steve made

Perazzi Quest 2010

The Perazzi Quest started off as the Olympic Endeavour Trophy in 2005. This trophy and financial support of \$400 was as an incentive to encourage a young Australian female shooter to attend the Australian Olympic Discipline Nationals and to be given the opportunity to potentially experience the pride and enjoyment that I have, from being an Australian Olympian.

The concept was for the Quest to encourage and provide financial support for the top junior female shooter under 18 years of age to take the step from DTL into the Olympic Disciplines. Choosing a female shooter under 18 years would allow them at least three years of Olympic Discipline shooting whilst in the junior ranks and hopefully make at least one World Championship Team during this time, as well as attend Youth Olympics and other junior events before they turn 21 and start competing against more seasoned shooters. The incentive money was provided to the shooter when they attended the ACTA Olympic Discipline Nationals.

In 2007 Perazzi Australia (Steve Haberman and Fil Petriella) came on board and not only bolstered the money awarded but also increased the categories to include junior males and women. Fil and Steve have both represented Australia in Olympic Disciplines and identify the step from DTL shooting to Olympic Disciplines as a daunting but also rewarding step for young shooters.

In 2010 the Perazzi Quest comprises the following rewards:

Female Junior – Perazzi Quest Sash, Olympic Endeavour Trophy, 50% of their DTL Nationals nominations refunded and \$800 on participation at the 2011 ACTA Olympic Discipline Nationals

Male Junior – Perazzi Quest Sash, Olympic Endeavour Trophy, 50% of their DTL Nationals nominations refunded and \$800 on participation at the 2011 ACTA Olympic Discipline Nationals

Female – Perazzi Quest Sash, \$800 on participation at the 2011 ACTA Olympic Discipline Nationals.

The 2010 DTL National Championships saw Emma Cox win not only the Ladies and A grade High Guns but also the Junior Ladies Perazzi Quest. Fil, Steve and myself are very much looking forward to seeing how far this very talented young lady will go. Will she follow in the footsteps of previous winners such as Tracey Barton (who was an ISSF Trap Australia Cup winner in 2009) and Catherine Skinner (the first recipient of this incentive who has since gone on to represent Australia in several ISSF Trap events internationally and in 2009 was the Oceania Ladies ISSF Trap Champion beating both myself and the 2008 Beijing Olympian Stacy Roiall).

Renaë Birgan is no stranger to international sporting clays competition, yet she still has not really given the Olympic Disciplines a go – so even though Emma Cox won the Women's High Gun, Perazzi Australia and myself decided that

she is exactly the type of person the Women's Perazzi Quest is aimed at. Amanda Holt was a previous winner of this and soon after went on to be a finalist at the World University Shooting Championships in Thailand in 2007.

Geoff Aston and Matthew Stokes were both tied for the Junior Males Perazzi Quest. Geoff has been awarded as the winner and Perazzi Australia and myself decided that we would award the incentive to both shooters as then the aim of the Quest is being achieved two fold in 2010. Geoff not only won the Junior High Gun but also qualified for the All Australian Open DTL Team. He has a promising future and we will watch his progress with anticipation.

All four of this year's Perazzi Quest recipients shot the 100 in the McIntosh Teams shoot, which demonstrates the capability of these young shooters to achieve great results in ISSF.

Good luck Emma, Renaë, Geoff and Matthew I'm sure not only myself, Fil and Steve but all CTSN readers look forward to seeing how your shooting careers develop. Perazzi Australia and myself would like to thank the ACTA for their support of the Quest.

Who will be the 2011 Perazzi Quest Recipients? And how will the 2010 recipients go at the 2011 ACTA Olympic Discipline Nationals?

Our President Arthur Welsh presented the sashes and prizes to 1st and 2nd placing of each grade.



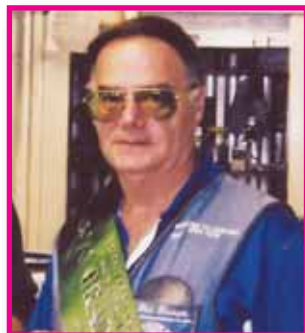

Psychological Skills for Shooting

NEGATIVE SELF TALK

This is the third article in the series on self talk. Self talk is that steady stream of thoughts and dialogues that go on in our minds. Last month I looked at positive thought patterns and this article will look at negative thought patterns.

According to Burton & Raedeke, positive thought patterns help create a “flow” mindset by boosting confidence, maintaining an optimistic attitude, promoting concentration at crucial moments, enhancing motivation to push you to your limits, creating an optimal level of arousal and ensuring poise and mental toughness when confronting failure or adversity. Negative thought patterns, on the other hand, interfere with the athlete’s flow mindset and create a failure mentality by deflating confidence, promoting pessimism, reducing concentration and motivation, disrupting optimal arousal, and weakening the mental toughness needed to deal with failure or adversity.

The purpose of this article is to examine the five types of distorted thinking that make up negative thought patterns. Knowing what they are and being able to recognise when they are occurring will give you insight so that you will be able to change these negative patterns for the positive patterns discussed last month. It is important that once you are able to recognise these negative thought patterns in your own thinking, you reread the article on positive thought patterns and make these the dominant way of thinking.

Burton & Raedeke claim that distorted thinking involves drawing incorrect inferences based on inadequate or incorrect information or failing to separate fantasy from reality. The five common types of distorted thinking are: catastrophising, overgeneralisation, blaming, “mustification”, and polarising thinking.

- **Catastrophising** means expecting the worst and exaggerating the consequences of real or imagined negative events. Missing at target or losing an event may be disappointing but in the scheme of things it’s not the worst thing that can happen. Given that we have all missed targets at sometime or another, it is something that we have lived through and we will survive when it happens again.
- **Overgeneralisation** is the process of mistakenly forming conclusions based on an isolated incident while ignoring the broader facts. Missing a right hand swinger from lane five, or high house two or a battue, and believing that you just can’t shoot that target and that you will miss it every time. The overgeneralisation will lead to an irrational belief that you will have problem with this target and you miss

it over and over again. To overcome overgeneralisation, examine the statistics and just trust that you can shoot the target that is thrown.

- **Blaming** involves holding others responsible for the negative events in your life. Blamers will always find some else to be responsible for their failures: referee, target makers, trap makers, the shooter next to them. Blaming other lessens the threat of failure but it also limits the possibility of success. The way to counter this distortion is to help athletes accept responsibility for their own actions whether they be success or failures.
- **Mustification:** every thing must be the way I want them to be. Mustification (or “mustabation” as Albert Ellis, the psychologist who developed the theory of rational emotive therapy) involves one of two irrational beliefs. The first irrational belief involves that life should be lived according to a rigid set of rules that everyone must follow. The second irrational belief involves the belief that things in your life have to be the way you want them to be. These irrational beliefs usually lead to frustration, anger or indignity if things don’t go the way you want them to. To counter “must thinking” or mustabation, athletes need to recognise that life is often unfair and that we have to accept that fact and make the most of what we’ve got. Rather than “mustabating”, athletes need to become resilient when confronted by failure. Resilience is the ability to be able to bounce back when things go wrong.
- **Polarised thinking** is what happens when we put things in all-or-nothing terms: that is, black or white, good or bad. Athletes who are polarised thinkers give themselves little latitude to be human or to make mistakes. They see them selves as either stars or flops and this self labelling in absolute terms can directly affect performance. To counter this thinking, athletes need to understand that there is a lot of grey in the world and it is OK to accept the middle ground rather than just the extremes.

All of these distorted thinking models keep our focus on either the past or the future and not in the present where we need to focus to maintain the flow. The past makes our thinking focus on past poor performances and these judgements lead to the distorted thinking. Focusing on the future encourages anxiety and fear of failure which will in turn lead to frustration and anger when things do not go our own way.

The other aspect of negative thought patterns involves an inner voice that attacks and judges you. According to Burton & Raedeke “The Critic,” blames you when things go wrong and negatively compares you to others, sets impossible standards of perfection, then punishes you for missing the mark and maintains an album of your failures while disregarding your successes. According to “the critic” your life is planned out in detail and when you break any of the unwritten rules your supposed to live by “the critic” will call you names such as slacker, loser, stupid, weak, etc. “The Critic” is the most negative part of our thinking: the continued negative statements about our performance and ourselves works away at our self esteem. The above distorted thinking examples are “the critics” main weapons. The other main weapons are irrational beliefs and these will be the topic for the next article. To destroy “the critic” you must replace the distorted thinking habits with positive thought patterns that will help create a “flow” mindset by boosting confidence, maintaining an optimistic attitude, promoting concentration at crucial moments, enhancing motivation to push you to your limits, creating an optimal level of arousal and ensuring poise and mental toughness when confronting failure or adversity.

New Zealand Clay Target Association President visits Maryborough Clay Target Club

(and opens our eyes to initiatives in developing our sport)

KEITH LIVINGSTONE – President of the New Zealand Clay Target Association – visited the Maryborough Clay Target Club for some practice on 7 April 2010. He was in town for the wedding of one of our members and couldn't resist the opportunity to come and shoot some practice at our club.

Shooting with a borrowed gun Keith still managed to hit 75 out of 75 targets, with only two second barrels required. After watching such an exemplary demonstration of shooting skill, we would hate to see how well he can shoot with his own gun.

Talking after shooting was completed, he said that we have a wonderful facility for our community, but suggests that we should be promoting it further by running some high profile events such as corporate challenges and school programs. While we have run school programs in the past, we haven't done so for a few years. I know that Victoria has a very strong schools program, but is this something we should be looking at on a national basis to ensure the future of our sport?

Keith explained that in New Zealand, school programs are seen as a vital aspect of the sport. Through their Association's efforts, the majority of schools in New Zealand have clay target shooting as part of their curriculum (as a sports option, along with the more traditional sports such as netball, soccer and rugby). This year alone they have approximately 600 school students taking part in regular practice and competition.

Apart from generally getting young people involved in an interesting and challenging sport, they see the schools program as a means of identifying kids with the talent to go on to represent their country in the various disciplines of clay target shooting. They run training camps for Down the Line and Skeet, plus regular competition among participating schools and weekly practice. They identify those with the talent to participate in special training for the international shooting disciplines of Olympic Trap and Skeet.

The schools program has done a great deal to improve their results in international competition. For the first time ever, New Zealand holds both the Glenn Trophy (DTL) and Glenn Cup (Skeet). Keith sees the schools program and their Association's work in developing young talent as key to their success in these Trans Tasman events. In addition, he was happy to point out that New Zealand's Open Team beat Australia's at the recent World DTL Championships held in South Africa.

By coincidence, Keith's visit came just before Maryborough Clay Target Club's annual Trans Tasman competition against our sister club in New Zealand, the Marlborough Clay Target Club. They hold the trophy at the moment and with all the good work the New Zealanders are putting into talent development in their sport, it seems that we will have to work very hard to get it back.

As an aside, in the latest CTSN (May 2010), there is an article from Tony Turner of the Canberra International Clay Target Club about "Growing your club and growing our sport". It makes some salient points about the age profile of our sport and outlines some of the ways they have been working to gain more shooters, including 'come and try days' and corporate shoots. I would suggest that we all need to take notice of the success of the New Zealand Clay Target Association, the Canberra International Clay Target Club and Victoria's schools program and get out there promoting our sport and getting as many new shooters involved as we can.

A national program to involve schools in the sport is possibly the very thing we should be looking at to bring young shooters into the sport. Even if we only get one or two new shooters out of each batch of students who come to the sport through this avenue, it is worth the effort. I know that many individuals and clubs are doing good work in promoting and growing our sport, but some coordination and initiative at State and National level might be just the thing to get the attention of our target groups.

**JOHN HAROLD (JACK) LUDBROOK
PASSED AWAY 6TH MARCH 2010 IN HIS 97TH YEAR**



Jack was born on the 26th August 1913 at Ballarat. He lived all his life in Ballarat and died there on 6th March 2010.

Jack's involvement in shooting began when he was about 10 years old. He supplied sparrows and starlings, which he had trapped, to the Brown Hill Gun Club for the live bird shoots. Jack's father, Harold, was a pigeon breeder, racing and show birds. Jack would sell the culled pigeons

to the Ballarat Gun Club for a better price than sparrows and starlings would bring. In this period, Ballarat had 4 gun clubs and within a 60 mile radius there was at least another 16 gun clubs. Ballarat's first gun club was formed in 1861. Jack shot at most of these gun clubs from the early 1930s to the late 1950s when live bird shooting was banned.

Jack joined the Ballarat Gun Club in 1932, and was Secretary from 1948 until it closed in 1954. He was President of the Clunes Gun Club, from 1954 until 1958. He held a bookmakers licence up until the end of the live bird era. Most clubs had up to five bookmakers fielding bets. Jack also ran two up rings after the shooting had finished.

In 1937 he won the Victorian Single Barrel clay bird title with a score of 18/20, at the Noble Gun Club, Tottenham, Melbourne. Jack beat Horrie James, "Duxbac", to win this title. In 1949 he won one thousand pounds, in a handicap event at Melbourne Gun Club, Tottenham, with a score of 16 out of 16 pigeons. This was held during the Melbourne Cup Carnival, where shooters came from all over Australia for this event. Shooters such as Lawson, McDonald (Brisbane), Bush (Sydney), Calrossi, Elenora, Snipe, Turkesberry,

Downey, McCraith, Caronne, Stanhope (Melbourne), G Kent, T Sands, W B Wilkinson, H Bibby, R Craig, J Ludbrook (Ballarat), F Buckley (Geelong), the Grant brothers from Meredith, just to name a few.

Jack married Dora Mann in 1940, during the war, he worked for the Civil Construction Corps, as a plumber. He worked on bomber bases at Mt Gambier, the Catalina flying boat base at Lake Boga, Sellheim Base at Charters Towers, Jacky Jacky air base in Cape York, and others.

After the war Jack and Dora built a house at Brown Hill where they both lived until just before their deaths.

When live pigeon ceased, Jack replaced the live bird traps with clay target machines at Clunes Gun Club. He also took the clay target machines around country shows and ran small clay target events.

Jack also set up the first sporting simulated field ground in Australia for the Ballarat Field and Game, of which he was a foundation member and President. He continued shooting Field and Game competition until he was 90. Good friend and shooting companion Frank Doblle took Jack to the shoots and was a great help in his latter years.

He enjoyed clay target shooting in the 1960s period of the big Handicap shoots on monetary value. He had many friends in the shooting game, Brian Mark, Keith Veal, Ron Jones and Charlie Squires, just to name a few.

Jack also shot the holiday circuit over Xmas. Port Arlington G.C. (Nargoondy Park ran by the Jorgensen family), St Leonard's G.C., Queenscliff G.C., Barwon Heads G.C. and Geelong G.C. The family got to have a holiday down at the beach, but hardly saw Jack!

Jack was a brilliant field shooter on duck, quail, snipe and rabbits and always had a Labrador by his side. He enjoyed his shooting and fishing trips up to the Murray and Darling Rivers with his mates. He also enjoyed a beer (or two, three . . .).

This is only a snap shot of the life and times of Jack Ludbrook.

IT'S YOUR CALL by Bill McCarthy

As referees we are frequently called upon to adjudicate situations where a shooter fails to fire at a perfectly normal (legal) target in a Double Barrel event.

The instructions for the procedure the referee is to adopt are set out in GRTS 14. Among other things, it requires the referee to visually check the safety catch is not in the on position and also check that the action is closed. The referee will then ask the shooter to test fire the gun once only. The Referee should make sure that the gun is fired from the orthodox position (from the shoulder.). See **Rule 1.01(d)**.

You. As the referee have had this situation arise. In this case the gun has inertia cocking of the trigger mechanism and the shooter fires the gun which discharges the cartridge in the first barrel,

It's Your Call

If you Rule "Lost Target" (Rule 1.08) you are quite correct.

This is by far the most common event encountered by Referees. Yet, we see frequently that those procedures are not carried out properly.

Remember: A referee must NOT take the gun from the shooter and fire it.

A referee MUST not assume that (because he and others "heard a click") there is an allowable malfunction.

The shooter MUST mount the gun to his shoulder and test fire it "once only".

NSW Members and Dealers

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

- (a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or
- (b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

- (a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

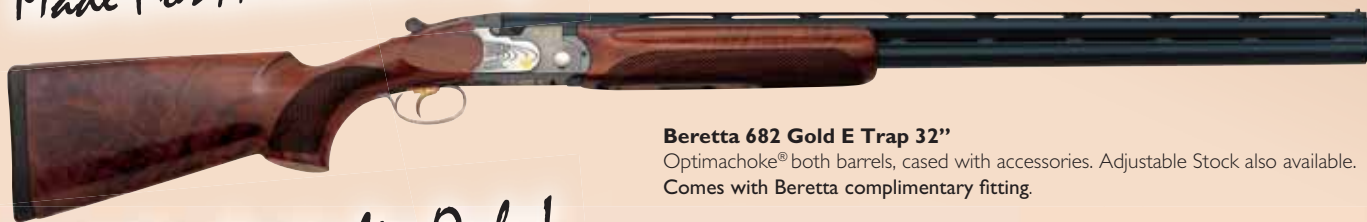
