This being my first report as President, it is with great sadness that I must report on the passing after a long illness of former National President and Life Member of the Association, Mr. Roy Holtfreter. Roy, from Northam Club in West Australia served the Association for many years and on behalf of the membership I extend our condolences to his family and close friends.

The ACTA Executive meetings were held over three days in June, and so including travel time, most members gave at least five days of their time towards managing your Association.

The Executive seems very stable at the moment with the main change being the office of President. Mr. John Mack, who has held the position for three years, did not stand for re-election and on behalf of all ACTA members I thank John for leaving the Association in such a great condition. John has brought integrity, honesty and commitment to the chair and I feel sure this has rubbed off on the Executive. John has dealt with difficult issues and personalities fairly and with openness and on behalf of our membership I thank John and his family for the time he has given us. Surely a job well done.

Both I and Ron Traill had made the board aware we were intending to stand for the position of President, some months ago. We felt this gave the National Delegates time to properly consider where they want to go and therefore who to support. Unfortunately there is only one President and I was elected to the position. I thank Ron for his openness in this matter and his continued support and firm commitment to the future.

Ron Traill was subsequently elected as Vice President as was Peter Haley. The only change to the board was I replacing John Mack as chair and Rob Fox taking my place as a board member. Sub Committee chairs remain with the exception of the Grounds Committee with Peter Haley taking the chairman's job. We welcome Gary Read from South Australia to the Executive and his first meetings. Gary replaces Gerald Hopgood as a National Delegate and I take this opportunity to thank Gerald for his contribution to the Association. Full committee details are shown in this edition of the CTSN.

The Association Historian Mark McInnes had resigned prior to the Executive meetings and our thanks go to Mark for the efforts he has made over many years to collate State and National records, the general history of the Association, and instigate the Hall of Fame Dinner and Presentation Nights. Without Mark's passion for history and our sport it is unlikely that the Hall of Fame as we know it would even exist. Thanks Mark. Expressions of Interest will be called via the CTSN for this honorary position.

Decisions made by the Executive will see more development on your National Grounds, continuing upgrade to the CTSN and adoption of Team Codes of Conduct and Uniform policies. Team members will wear the Coat of Arms with pride or not at all. Rules have been revised and will be reprinted for 2011 they are being frozen for three years and the Nationals programs will remain as set this year for three years except the skeet which has to be altered for the 2012 World Championships and expected numbers.

Insurance coverage is being reviewed to recognise the greater range of activities carried out by clubs to both promote our sport and to bring in that elusive extra dollar. Membership fees are not being raised this year. Decisions made last year in regard to the CTSN have been proven to be correct and we thank Jim at Ironbark Graphics for the new look magazine which is already attracting new sponsors and advertisers. Pre nomination at all National events is here to stay with some minor modifications, all to make it more member friendly.

I have probably taken more space than I should, but feel there is so much happening you need to know about. Until next month.

These State delegates have taken on further responsibilities in these important positions and will lead the National Executive and the Association through the next twelve months.

We will provide a report from subcommittee chair persons over the next few issues of the CTSN regarding their plans for this period of time.

In the May edition of the CTSN I congratulated the winners and various place getters of events at the World Trap Championships

in South Africa. Some results from the World Championships we received were incorrect. Mr. Ron Garth was indeed the third overall in the Veterans event. I apologise to Ron and the rest of the members for this incorrect information being published. Ron also had a great lead up placing in the South African Championships winning the Double and finishing 4th in the Single barrel Veterans events. Congratulations Ron.

The Promotions committee has provided me with a request for a promotional kit to use at exhibitions and open days which we have already started to compile. The first outing will be at the Beretta Girl action days later in the year. If your Club, State or Zone wish to have use of the kit you will need to book it through the National Office. We will be publishing a list of contents for the Kit once it is established at the end of July.

The programs have now been set for the National Championships in 2011. We are now producing the Nomination forms for all of those events. The terms and conditions will also be updated to reflect changes in these. There are many other initiatives from the meeting which we will implement over the next 12 months.



NATIONAL SPORTING CLAYS CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. Proof of association membership must be shown. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded. Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
2. Squads of 5 shooters to shoot 100 targets in four rounds of 25.
3. The Organising Committee will decide the order of shooting.
4. Skeet or Trap targets will be thrown, as well as mini, midi battue, rockett rabbit or flash or any other sporting clay target approved by the Association. Target type for any stand will be at the discretion of the shoot official, but shall number five (5) in total.
5. Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
6. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 25 targets
7. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may be re-squadded towards the end of the event, but this is not guaranteed and non-participation is a possibility.
8. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
9. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
10. Any competitor will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfill their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score may incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET.
11. Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first round of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility may be penalised one target. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for they're failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.
12. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap may be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.
13. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
14. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
15. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any section prize.
16. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
17. Nominations will be by pre-nomination, and only if nominations do not reach the maximum entry of 120 will nominations be taken on the day. Nomination if taken on the day of the event will incur a extra fee of \$25.00. Nominations will close daily at 10 .00am.
18. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
19. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
20. Reduced Nominations: These shall apply to juniors and the second family members entering into the same event, they being wives and husbands. Shooters paying reduced noms are eligible for Open as well as section prizes.
21. All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Trap Championships.
22. Competitors to be eligible for A.C.T.A. team selection must be fully paid up members of the A.C.T.A. and Australian citizens prior to the competition.
23. Full refunds will be available for any withdrawals from the competition if a minimum of 48 hours notice has been received by our National Office. Refunds will not be available for competitors not complying with this condition of entry.





- (b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

- (a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

Psychological Skills for Shooting

IRRATIONAL BELIEFS

Over the past three months the focus of these articles has been to look at self-talk, positive and negative thought patterns. In this article I intend to explore irrational beliefs: these occur when negative thought patterns become internalised and believed to be true.

Irrational thinking as a problem, forms the basis of Rational Emotive Therapy, which is a therapeutic intervention model developed in the late seventies by Albert Ellis. Ellis maintained that human problems stem, not from external events or situations, but result from the views and beliefs that people adopt about the events or situations around them. Ellis argues "humans have a powerful instinctual tendency towards habits, inertia, excitement-seeking, moodiness and negativism that interfere with productive thinking and planning." He goes on to suggest that "humans are born with an exceptionally strong tendency to want and to insist that everything happens for the best in their life and to roundly condemn themselves, others and the world when they do not immediately get what they want."

For most people, according to the rational-Emotive model, emotional disturbance can be traced to one or more of a number of irrational beliefs.

- The idea that you must have approval of all the people you find significant.
- The idea that you must prove thoroughly competent, adequate and achieving.
- The idea that when people act obnoxiously and unfairly, you should blame and damn them, and see them as bad wicked or rotten individuals.
- The idea that you have to view things as awful, terrible, horrible, and catastrophic when you get seriously frustrated, treated unfairly, or rejected.
- The idea that emotional misery comes from external pressures and you have little ability to control or change your feelings.
- The idea that if something seems dangerous or fearsome, you must preoccupy yourself with and make yourself anxious about it.
- The idea that you can more easily avoid facing many of life's difficulties and self-responsibilities than undertake more rewarding forms of self-discipline.
- The idea that your past remains all important and that because something once strongly influenced your life, it has to keep determining your feelings today.
- The idea that people and things should turn out better than they do and that you must view life as awful and horrible if you do not find a good solution to life's realities.
- The idea that to achieve maximum human happiness by inertia or inaction or by passively or uncommittedly "enjoying yourself."

Irrational thinking therefore comes from *demanding* that the universe *should, ought to and must* be different.

So how does this affect the athlete? The ten basic tenets listed above can fit into five general categories:

Perfectionism. "I should be thoroughly competent all the time." "I should be able to hit every target." "I shouldn't miss." No-one is

perfect, and to believe that you are or should be, is flawed thinking. We need to understand that mistakes are a normal part of learning and that only people who are not content to improve can avoid making mistakes. Mistakes are often stepping stones to success and it is important to keep your self-talk focused on improvement or excellence rather than perfectionism.

Fear of failure. "I'm afraid I might miss." I am scared that I might not make the team." Statements like these indicate that you are scared of failing. Some fear of failing is normal but when your concern about failing overwhelms your enthusiasm to succeed then it is irrational. It must be realised that failing at sport is not the worst thing that can happen to you in life. If you shoot poorly, it will not leave you without friends, give you a life-threatening disease or ruin your life. Poor performance needs to be put into some perspective.

Social approval. "I must win the approval of others and impress everyone who sees me perform." This thinking will lead to you developing self-doubt and therefore you will tense up and not be able to perform anyway. You cannot control what other people think or how they behave. You need to have a credo that says "What other people think about me is none of my business."

Equity. "Life should be fair and if I work hard then I should improve, play well and get the rewards that I deserve." If only life was that simple. I often ask my clients: "Where is it written that life will be fair?" The answer is: it isn't, and to believe that it should be is distorted thinking. In shooting, things can change quickly: the squad before you may have had less wind, better light, fewer distractions, etc. To accept that everything has to be fair or equal would mean that we may not be able to compete, because we give everyone the same conditions. To deal with this irrational belief, you need to concentrate on those things that you can control, give your attention to the process and stay focused on the here and now.

Social comparison. "Fred's here today, that will make it harder to win." Social comparisons place too much importance on the uncontrollable outcomes, such as winning and outperforming others, rather than concentrating on controllable factors such as playing your best. It must be remembered that winning is ability-limited and that the real goal in sport and life is to pursue excellence by making the most of your own talents.

Over the past four months the theme has been self-talk: that steady internal dialogue that goes on in our head all the time. We have learnt that the self-talk can be either positive and or negative and if the thought patterns are allowed to be absorbed it is possible then the thoughts may lead to beliefs. When this happens make sure that the beliefs about yourself and your ability are rational because the irrational beliefs will only get in the way of you achieving better results, learning and having fun.

After he recovered he took up the sport of Croquet which he once again practiced and practiced until he succeeded in being very competitive and successful at his new sport. During this time he still continued on as our Secretary and attended our Club events. Harry was a Life Member of our Club.

RAY PARKER

29th October, 1935 – 16th February, 2010

It is with great sadness that we announce that Ray passed away on 16 February, aged 74, after a battle with cancer.

Ray was born in Colac and from a young age went on many rabbit and duck shooting trips with his father Walter. He went to his first duck opening when he was 12 years old with his brother Les, and said that this was when he first fell in love with guns. Ray started competition trap shooting, as a left hander, when he was 16. He joined the Colac Gun Club in 1955 and was also a long time member of the Colac Field & Game Association.



Ray lived for shooting and every weekend he would travel throughout Victoria competing in shoots where he was an extremely strong competitor. Weekdays after work he would rush home to grab his gun and go out for a shot.

By 1960, aged 24, he was shooting from the long handicap of 24 yards, and by 1969 was off the back mark of 27 yards. Ray was the first member of the Colac Gun Club to achieve this and was one of only a few shooters Australia wide to be off this mark.

In January 1960 Ray won the Victorian Double Barrel State Championship at Alexandra. It was reported in the local paper: *"Parker shot magnificently to win the State Double Barrel Championship. He had to compete against some of the best shooters in Australia to win the event and was forced to shoot 100 straight from his long handicap of 24 yards, which was a brilliant performance for so young a shooter"*.



In March, 1960 Ray won first prize in the Kanyana Handicap at the Colac Gun Club on a wet and windy night. The following comments were made in the ACTA magazine: *"By his consistent good form and his ability to concentrate and to adapt himself to changing conditions, Ray has proved to be the best trapshot in Western Victoria. Indeed, in the whole of Australia only a handful of clay target shots are longer handicapped than he. With forty years of shooting before him, he could easily finish right at the top"*.

In May 1961 Ray won the Victorian Single Barrel State Championship at Colac, being the only competitor to return the possible, 30/30.

Also in 1961 Ray qualified into the ACTA's shooting team representing Australia in Melbourne where the team did very well. He was again selected to represent Australia in 1975 at the World Trench Shooting Championships in Munich, Germany, where he was team leader. Fifty-seven countries competed and Australia was placed 19th.

In 1965 Ray went on a two month pigeon trap shooting tour of Italy and Spain, which was to be the first of many overseas shooting trips he undertook. In Bologna, Ray won two gold medals, and was also placed equal 3rd out of 275 shooters in one event. In a letter home to his wife Annette he said that conditions and birds were different in Europe and he was surprised he could adapt himself to the conditions so quickly. He said that the shoots were held seven days a week and that the entry fees were very high and cartridges expensive as they were nickel plated. It cost him an average of 250 pounds per week for living and shooting expenses. The prize money could reach up to about 3,000 pounds for each day's shooting and a good living could be made from the sport, but you needed to finish in the top 20 to make any money, with approximately 300 shooters entering each event.

In 1965 ICI, cartridge manufacturers, offered Ray a two year contract for him to compete professionally in Europe under their sponsorship. They offered to relocate him and his young family to Rome, Italy, all expenses paid, but Ray declined this offer saying although he liked the challenge of competing overseas he wouldn't enjoy the travelling involved or staying in hotels, and he liked to be home every night.

Ray travelled again to Spain in 1969 where he competed successfully, winning three trophies – the "Campeonato Europa", the "Premio Manzanaras of the Sociedad Tiro Pichon de Madrid" and the "Cup of Madrid".

In 1970 he competed in the World Pigeon Shooting Championships in San Marino, Italy and also in shoots in Spain and Yugoslavia where he won eight gold medals for seven wins and a 6th place. On a day off in Milan he went sightseeing to the La Scala Opera House and was caught up in deadly riots with the police. Next day he read five people had been killed.

In 1985 Ray competed in trap shooting at the World Championships

Shooters assembled from Bermagui, Singleton, Dubbo and members of the NSW Gun Club for the Annual Side by Side Championship Shoot under what was threatening weather conditions. After what NSW coast line and Sydney in particular had experienced preceding our shoot numbers were down on expectation but never the less the decision was made to go ahead and to our surprise we all experienced a good day without the predicted rain and storms.

The shoot as advertised was the First Southern Zone Skeet, Point Score and Double Championships to be held. It was also the first interclub competition between Cecil Park and NSW Gun Club which generated considerable interest and was keenly contested with Neale Guy being the record keeper and Captain of the NSWGC team.

For all events substantial Prize money was paid to the first seven place getters off the gun and the winner receiving the Championship Sash plus a medal and the second placed shooter also receiving a medal. Overall High Gun winner also received the Sash plus a case of ammunition.

Our thanks go to our team of volunteers who squared, refereed as well as attended to scoreboard duties for the day. To Col O'Brien, Louis Gallea, Warren Chalmers, Jess Sheather Paul Micallef and our Junior Development Squad for all their help to run a smooth competition

in Mexico and also competitions in California. After having competed internationally for more than 20 years he achieved his best result ever, at Guadalajara, Mexico. He won one of the three major events at the World Championships, the "Cup of Spain". At the age of 49 he won in a field of more than 630 international shooters from leading shooting nations such as Italy, Spain, France, America and Mexico, in front of 2,000 spectators. In a "one miss and out" situation, Ray and one other competitor were left after 28 targets and, in a protracted showdown, his opponent missed his 50th. Ray's next shot, his 50th straight, won him the cup. During this trip Ray also won on both days of a weekend shoot in Los Angeles. These good results in both Mexico and America saw him receive many invitations to shoot again overseas.

That year Ray also took out the Colac Gun Club's 50 Target Championship 60/60 and, due to his successful year, was chosen at the Colac Sportsmens' Club "Sports Star of the Year" for 1985, and was later inducted into their Hall of Fame in 2004.

Some of Ray's many other wins over his long career include Victorian Western District DB Championships in 1956, 1958, 1960 (record score of 85/85) and 1967, the 1969 Geelong Trophy Meeting (Ray best effort ever seen 63/63 off 27 yards), Warrnambool Gun Club's DB Championship in 1978 and the DB Championship and Trench Championship Overall Winner at Melbourne Gun Club in 1980.

Ray was a great lover of the outdoors and, besides shooting, also enjoyed working on his farm near Colac where he ran beef cattle until he retired in 2001. Another lifelong passion was fishing and he liked to take his boat off the coast of Lorne or fish off the rocks around the south west coast of Victoria. Golf was also a pastime and he was a long time member of the Colac Golf Club, playing right up until his illness prevented him from continuing.

Ray really was content with just the simple things in life and if he could go shooting or fishing whenever he wanted then he was happy. He was a great storyteller, a gentleman, extremely honest and a quiet achiever who was well respected and highly regarded by everyone who knew him and he is missed by his many friends.

The last shoot Ray competed in was in October last year when he won the Veterans event for the Ernie Osborne Memorial Shield at the Colac Field & Game. Although he didn't know it then, this would be the last time he would ever have a shot. He was 73 and unwell, and still came home with a sash.

Ray married Annette in 1959 and their 50th wedding anniversary was last November. Annette, their three children and four grandchildren miss him very much and will love him always.



IT'S YOUR CALL by Bill McCarthy

Doubtless you have been aware that "Deauville Doubles" is quite a sudden death event as far as normal trap shooting rules are concerned. Acceptance and non acceptance of targets coupled with no allowable malfunctions can be quite confusing. So let's look at a typical scenario.

You as the referee have correctly placed your two teams on their appropriate lanes and tracks. You have established who each team has nominated as the caller and you have informed the shooters about malfunctions for the event.

Two legal targets are released without any call being made. The non caller shoots and breaks a target with his first barrel. He then fires at the next target and has a malfunction. His now bemused and frustrated mate who is the elected caller has not fired at all and turns to you for a decision.

What' your ruling

Those of you who said "No target" are quite correct.

Under Rule 1.15 it clearly states that there are no allowable malfunctions of either cartridge or gun. Moreover, you have a firm belief that once a whole target is accepted you must abide by the result. Hence you feel quite comfortable with your call of "Lost Target".

However, if you look further at Rule 1.15 you will find that the designated caller is the only person who can accept the targets. In this case he has not called, nor has he fired at either target. So, notwithstanding the malfunction and acceptance by the non caller, the targets are to be treated as No Target and are restored.

Here again you must exercise caution though. Even if there was no call and the Caller fires at the targets they are deemed to have been accepted and the shooters must abide by the result.

NB: You may notice that we do not class the targets as a pair and the correct call for breaking both targets is "One"; Naturally if one or both of the targets are missed then the call is "Lost".
