National President's Notes



At the time of writing the forthcoming Commonwealth Games in India are receiving some very bad publicity. Some countries are holding back their teams at the moment and we can only hope the Games proceed successfully and safely for our members competing. We wish them all the best for the event.

Recently I heard one of our younger Games competitors, Laetisha Scanlan, being interviewed on the ABC radio. Anyone who heard her speak would have been impressed with the answers she gave and the maturity she showed for one so young. Well done Laetisha, you represented us well.

The Association is currently hosting some disciplinary proceedings following the Australia Cup in Darwin. It is very disappointing that we are placed in this position following advice from AISL of two incidents involving alleged abuse of volunteer officials. Complaints of this nature can not and will not be ignored, and if upheld could see some disciplinary action against the members in question.

With organisations throughout Australia finding it harder to attract and keep volunteers, with few willing to help for little or no recompense anymore, this is a timely warning to all that we should both appreciate and respect our volunteer workers.

The Board at its September meeting has decided to adopt a generic Coat of Arms for all teams representing the ACTA. Currently the Australian Coat of Arms can only be used by arrangement, and for teams travelling overseas. Most National Sporting Bodies have adopted an emblem very similar to the actual Coat of Arms but with small changes so they can use it as they see fit.

The Board felt that a person representing Australia at a competition in the country is no less an ambassador than one sent overseas to represent and is therefore equally entitled to wear our Association Coat of Arms. The whole uniform policy is currently under review, and future decisions will be published as they are made.

Talks are currently underway with New Zealand to host an annual Glenn Cup type event, in the Olympic Trap discipline. Hopefully this will be in place for 2011 with the competition held in Australia in odd years and in New Zealand in even years.

Good shooting and safe travelling to all especially those competing overseas.

Executive Officer's Report

We are hopeful our Commonwealth Games Team are in Delhi to compete in the Commonwealth Games, we wish them all the best representing their Country and look forward to featuring them in our magazine in the coming months. The strong contingent lead by some very experienced shooters in Michael Diamond and Russell Mark will I am sure represent Australia with distinction. Having these experienced leaders will really help those younger members of the squad as they embark on what we hope is a stellar career.

Staying with the ISSF theme, AISL have agreed to having PQS scores recognised at the ACTA National ISSF Championships and State ISSF Championships. This will be dependent on the venue being certified and compliant with the rules and requirements including being able to provide ISSF International qualified judges and referees. The National ISSF Championships in Perth 2011 will now have both the National & Commonwealth events recognised.

Planning is well under way for the ISSF Championships with the

WACTA working closely with the W.A. Gun Club to ensure a successful carnival. With the Olympic games in 2012 I am sure ISSF shooters will be there in force.

Our insurers have now completed the task of updating our insurance policies, in the near future we will have all of the policies on the WEB site to assist clubs in knowing the level of coverage they have. The Brokers have worked with the insurers to further detail the inclusions and exclusion of coverage in relation to public liability. Rob LeBrasse will attend the November Board meeting in November to meet the members of the Board and answer any questions in relation to cover. We have had only minimal claims for such a large non-profit organisation which will keep our premiums to a respectable level in fact the cost of cover this year has decreased slightly. Congratulations to the Clubs for conducting such safe facilities.

The Secretary's pack will be in the mail very soon. There are a number of important changes relating to the role of the Secretary in dealing with the National Office and in relation to membership. Look out for it in the mail. The Board have approved a "Member Policy" which directly relates to the constitution and membership. This also relates to "Visitors" and "Reciprocal" rights for other Associations.

It is important each Club understand the Constitution and how it affects them and the Association. Should you have any questions after reading through the pack please contact the National Office for assistance. The staff at the National Office continue to progress the role of the website with payments soon to be taken through the web for National Championship events. Our data base is due for an upgrade and should be completed by March 2011. We are now increasingly receiving material via the web and email. This will assist the National Office staff as we head into the renewal of memberships starting the 1st of November. If your club is having difficulty in sending electronic results, photo's etc and CTSN advertisements and other material please contact me at the National Office.

I have had quite a deal of feedback in relation to the Harassment in sport article in the last CTSN. Harassment, swearing & bullying can bring down a club and a sport. Do not accept inappropriate behavior levelled at volunteer committees, shooters or visitors in your Club, or on the layouts. Not only is this demeaning it is against the Law. It is every ones role to ensure this does not happen. If it does, we will be the poorer for losing these people.

National Coaching Director's Report

On the 7th and 8th August I conducted a coach the coaches weekend at the Hobart Gun Club. This weekend was very successful; there were 18 in attendance ranging from current and expired coaches wishing to renew their accreditation to those interested in becoming a coach. With very positive and encouraging feedback from those who attended. The State President Mr. Brian Bailey has arranged to hold a second weekend later in the year. From these weekends the interest to conduct coaching days grows. With the high quality of coaches and people prepared to arrange coaching, clay target shooters will grow in numbers and reach higher levels in Tasmania.

But we need a lot more experienced coaches to run these days. So we have been looking at how we can involve those people who are interested in becoming a better coach and are prepared to put back into our sport their knowledge and experience. As of the next National Junior training camp in September we will invite a select number of active coaches from across Australia to come to Wagga. During the four days of the camp these coaches will fine tune their coaching skills and gain a better understanding into why the ACTA is trying to put into place a standard coaching system. This is an excellent idea as it helps with the coaching of the juniors and we have interaction with other current coaches in a working environment with time to benefit both the shooters and the staff. We have invited Graham Gosling and Fred Schmetzer to attend our next camp and I look forward to working with them. Both Graham and Fred are very active in our sport and their contribution to the camp will be a benefit to all involved.

Also we will have the first high performance training camp for the 18 to 23 year old shooters. I am very pleased that the ACTA have approved these camps for this group of athletes. I always felt we did not finish the coaching pathway in the past due to the fact that when the shooter turned 18 we had nothing to offer them to further their shooting skills. We have invited a select number of athletes from previous Junior camps to attend. With the additional experienced coaches on hand we will be able to give more time to each athlete. I expect the four days to be a very rewarding time for everyone.

I attended the ACTA National 5 Stand Championships last month, the numbers were a lot less than I expected. From talking to a number of shooters we have a couple of areas that we can work on for next year in regard to the Field and Game shooters. I believe the fact we selected from these Nationals an Australian Five Stand Team to compete in New Zealand next year a greater interest will come from the ACTA and the F&G shooters. With a closer relationship with the Field and Game Association the 5 stand will become a much stronger event as most shooters would love the opportunity to represent Australia. And we would also gain access to a large number of junior shooters.

On Thursday 9 September I attended a try day for handicapped people at the Wangaratta Clay Target Club. The club set up a straight away trap target, opened the skeet ground and had two crossing targets off sporting traps to give plenty of variety. This was a very successful afternoon, the young athletes all joined in with incredible enthusiasm and every one hit targets and by that I mean 7 and 8 out of 10. The fact that not one of these people or their carers left the ground even when it rained was proof of the great time they were having. This was one of the most satisfying days I have spent at a gun club. There would be groups like this near every club. If the target's presentation is set the right way we could help a lot of these people enjoy another activity and have a lot of personal satisfaction from our sport.

NTCTA Refereeing and Coaching Seminar

ARNHEM GUN CLUB AUGUST 2010

Thursday morning, five am, I'm waiting for a taxi to take me to Darwin airport, for the one hour flight to Nhulunbuy or Gove. I've been asked by Arnhem Gun Club to give Refereeing examinations for four shooters, to check out credentials for an aspiring Coach, and to 'take a look at a few of our 'C' grade shooters'.

At the check-in, I've been hit with a \$70 excess baggage charge, courtesy of the K80, and a stack of paperwork, magazines, gun add-ons and books. The bloke before me weighs at least 120 kilos (compared to my 70-and-a-bit kilos), he's got a bag bigger than mine, and he doesn't cop any excess!! Typical airline justice!!

After an uneventful flight, I'm met at Gove and whisked off to El Presidente's house. Everyone's at work, so I spend the waiting time wisely, organising the presentation format and the inevitable paperwork.

The evening arrives, and there are only two refereeing candidates to examine one shooter's in Darwin Hospital with kidney stone problems (ouch!), and another's very new shooter reckons he's not quite ready yet.

I use a written Theory Trial Exam of 40 questions on 'No Targets, Lost Targets, and Malfunctions and Interruptions', and ask intending Referees to use the Rule Book to check answers. This tends to sort the 'doers' from the 'dreamers', and I don't have to waste time with unprepared candidates. The final exam uses the same format, similar to the ISSF exams (where I pinched the idea). All results have written records of competence in refereeing theory, although, if a candidate for some reason prefers an oral exam, that may also be easily arranged.

Ray and Tom have done their 'homework' and we discuss 'technical points' in the Rules for a couple of hours the injustice of slipping safety catches, differences in rules for doubles targets in Skeet and DTL (and ISSF), Safety and Etiquette breaches, and so on – all the usual Gun Club arguments.

They are well prepared and eager to go on, so we decide to do the final exams straight away. Midnight comes and goes and we finally have two more NT qualified Referees in DTL and Skeet. Bedtime at last!!

Friday morning, and Steve and I go to the Gun Club to prepare for the coaching session. During the afternoon, a continuous stream of shooters arrives, and I am busily engaged in checking out the shooters, initially for their shooting stance. I correct a few cases of 'Give the Hun Cold

Steel (Legs wide apart, death grip on the pistol grip and forend, and a backward 'bayonet thrusting stance). Almost all of these newer shooters are members of the 'Put the stock in the shoulder, and drop the head down to the comb (thus ensuring angled eyes and an almost certain smack in the cheekbone on recoil). We practice more appropriate methods to ensure a forward balanced stance, with leveled, horizontal eyes by fitting the comb into the cheek socket before pressing it into the shoulder (and not out onto the biceps). During the gun fit, I also check out the guns for suitability, and almost everyone's gun needs little attention. Stock length, comb height, and pitch are OK, although the comb on Jim's Browning is so high that his eye is a full inch over the rib! Recoil pads are soft, and some are equipped with adjustable pad plates, and 'uppy-downy' combs. El Presidente is a firm believer in both, and Tom's an excellent fitter-machinist, so all members' guns are in really good order. Of course, I've come away with comb height adjusters, soft pads from 6mm to 30 mm, and plenty of tape and cardboard as well. (I finally get to use a bit of 'pitch-adjusting' cardboard and a soft pad at the Sunday shoot when Phil arrives with his Double Classic shotgun, with cruelly pointed toe and hard pad).

After the stance corrections, we go to the pattern plate to fire three rounds from 16 yards. According to the formula in Robert Churchill's Game Shooting and other books, a one inch difference in aiming point on the pattern plate requires a one sixteenth adjustment in stock fit. This is sound theory, but perhaps not quite so easy to administer practically. The biggest problem I've found is that shooters hold the gun to their shoulder for far too long, and try to 'rifle sight' the target by concentrating on the beads. We overcome these problems by using the 'lift the gun to the face, come up, or down to the target on the pattern plate', and do this at least three times, or until the gun movements are fluid and natural. Only then is the gun fired, three shots from each barrel.

Three shots are usually enough to see if the shooter has a consistent grip and trigger pull, and if the barrels shoot to the required point of aim. Paul's Browning has a 50/50 pattern on the bottom barrel (a little bit too flat shooting for my liking) and a 65/35 pattern in the top. He's happy with that.

Tom has a Beretta 682 Gold E trap gun, to which he's added a very high US customized high rib, in order to get a 100 percent high pattern. The uppy-downy stock juts high into the stratosphere to accommodate the very high rib, and the Arnhemites call the gun 'The Sydney Harbour Bridge'. However, the gun shoots exactly to the required spot, and that's what counts.

Megan's first shots were a bit wayward, but this was down to Megan holding very high up on the trigger. With her finger more comfortably located at the bottom of the trigger, Megan's grouping became consistent.

Phil was the most inconsistent shooter at the pattern plate his first shot was wide left, the second was high right (subconscious adjustment, probably), and the next few went 'high, wide and handsome'. He was super-tense, and the front hand almost made claw marks in the forend. I placed a couple of spent hulls in the front hand, loosened him up, and the gun's patterning improved markedly. I advised him to go to the

Graham's gun came away with yet another 60/40 pattern. His stance was very upright, wide and flat, and that was worked on prior to patterning. Young Spencer's Miroku shot well to pattern, and Sam, who could not come to the session, did not bother with patterning, saying that he'd worry about that after the shoot which isn't a bad idea at all.

The pattern board picked up a number of inconsistencies, nothing too daunting or unrepairable, so it was out on the walks for a practice round of Skeet, followed by a DTL session. Steve's Winchester Diamond grade Skeet gun was used by four shooters, Steve bagging a fine 25/25. Tom confessed to being an 'A' grade DTL shot, but only a 'C' grader in Skeet. The Sydney Harbour Bridge, aka Beretta 682, was Optima choked, so I suggested that he put in the open chokes and have a go with it, forgetting the 100 percent high pattern, and just looking at the birds. Onto walks three and four he went, and blew away six targets into dust! He used the 682 to great effect in Saturday's shoot, with a 47/50, and a 46/50 in the doubles event, missing the final low house target from Station one!! And he's still 'C' grade but not for long!

Jim's and Paul's feet positioning on most walks were adjusted, and second target doubles became simpler to hit. More difficult to adjust was the 'hold in the hole, and swing past the target' style. If a target didn't appear, no matter!! The gun was already halfway along the flight path. When the target did emerge, it was chased and tracked almost to the other skeet house before a shot was taken. 'Wait until you see the target, hold out one third, hit it over the trap house, don't ride the target, be confident in your pattern' finally started to get through. I explained that most regular Skeet shooters used the sustained lead method of shooting, and demonstrated explaining that it was the most effective

pattern plate regularly, especially before a competition shoot, to make sure he was relaxing as he shot.

I was sure that Jim's gun (with Jim's eye so high over the rib) would shoot a very high pattern, but it produced a very normal 60/40 pattern. How flat it must have shot with a normal comb!! Jim had adjusted to the gun, a recent purchase, with the statement that 'it's a left-handed gun and doesn't kick me like my old one'.

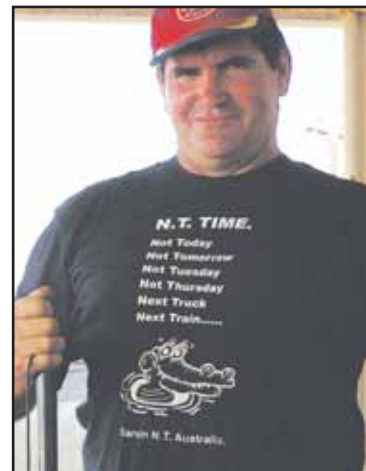
method in doubles shooting. A few shooters had seen Todd Bender's videos and asked about his 'knees bent, wide-open stance, gun butt on the chest almost' preparation, and I stated that the style definitely worked for Todd, but how would it work for a Sporting Clays shooter, or a field shooter? I also said that it was perhaps better to start with an ordinary, relaxed style, shooting with a swing-through method, and progressing to sustained lead shooting as an upgrading, and altering stance only if advantages were to be gained in a new stance. Good advice was, 'Check out everything, and see what works for you. There is no "one correct method" of shooting anything'.

DTL practice followed, Tom retiring after inkballing ten targets single barrel, and Steve grabbing another 25 straight. Spencer made up for some indifferent hold points by being super-flexible, and having the keen eyesight of youth. He was a little self-conscious, and shot much better when he was 'observed from afar'. Perhaps a few too many Coaches plant themselves in a newer shooter's back pocket, to the shooter's disadvantage.

Megan started out with a heavily back-footed stance. When shown the 'feet close together, weight on front foot, vertical line from foot to hip to eye', she said that it was much like what she had learned in ballet, without the foot pointing. She also operated with the disadvantage of being heavily right handed, but with a left master eye. She had tried shooting left handed, and right handed with both eyes open, but neither worked. The left glass was patched, and she shot one-eyed. The major problem was 'riding the target', and right swingers seemed to get away due to her 'running out of room'. A more side-on stance on stations three to five helped overcome that problem.

Paul's problem target was a left quarterer, which he regularly shot over the top of. Better gun placement helped; shooting when he saw it clearly; not riding the target due to 'oh no! Not another leftie!', and a more relaxed call and movement to the target seemed to help him become more consistent. In the Handicap event on Sunday, Paul shot off for second with a 22/25.

lean from the Skeet practice helped him on DTL, and he started to shoot in a much more relaxed, consistent style. He also shot well in competition, winning 'C' grade in the Single Barrel with a fine 25/30 in windy conditions, and putting some 'A' graders to shame. Sam was another left hander with a very strange parallel, pointing-forward

foot placement. However, he shot the targets as soon as he saw them clearly, blowing them away in fine early fashion. Using the 'If it ain't broke, don't fix it' routine, I showed him the more conventional method, but said that he was shooting well as he was, and perhaps to experiment at his leisure.

The coaching session

wound up at 6.30 pm, and I was very pleased that the Refereeing course would not continue for a second night. Early to bed!!

I was very impressed with Ray's approach to gun fitting, and he advised me that he had completed the ausport.com.au website's Level 1 Coaching questions. He was also active in coaching the local High School students, and was particularly keen on getting more ideas and strategies to continue to upgrade their shooting program. Teacher movements were a cause of concern, as the most committed teacher was leaving, and a replacement was needed. I advised him to complete detailed lesson plans for each day's coaching, and for the complete program, and go along and see the Principal, and show him/her what was what. Usually in a small town, teachers become involved in community activities, and perhaps the Principal could 'swing it with a new teacher' to take the class. I watched Ray's coaching style, finding little to criticize and much to commend, and had no difficulty in recommending that he become a registered ACTA Club Coach.

Competition started at 8.00 am on Saturday, and I checked out the refereeing techniques. Skeet operated with Canterbury cordless voice releases, a fine system, with only minor problems involving line of sight placement of controls. An iron wall alongside station six made for some refereeing position adjustments, and overall all referees went well. Calls were clear, and decisions were called correctly. DTL refereeing was hindered by a super-sensitive set of microphones. Guns opening, shell extraction, and referees calls set off targets. Placement further away helped to a limited extent. Most refereeing decisions were easy ones; Ray in the Points Score putting only one shell in the gun, and being unable to fire a second barrel causing some good-natured rubbishing after the event.

Competition was tight. Conditions were what you would expect from a trap set up on a high ridge overlooking the sea, but the targets weren't bad, considering. One of the problems that confronts mining towns is that, however carefully you plan the timing of the event, some competitors will be working. This resulted in a complete lack of 'B' graders. This problem will not last for long. Some fine shooting was displayed by all 'C' graders, and I can see some tight competition in the months to come.

Monday was a much-needed rest day for me, and I flew out at 7.10 pm with only a \$20 excess luggage charge, and not a fat passenger to be seen!

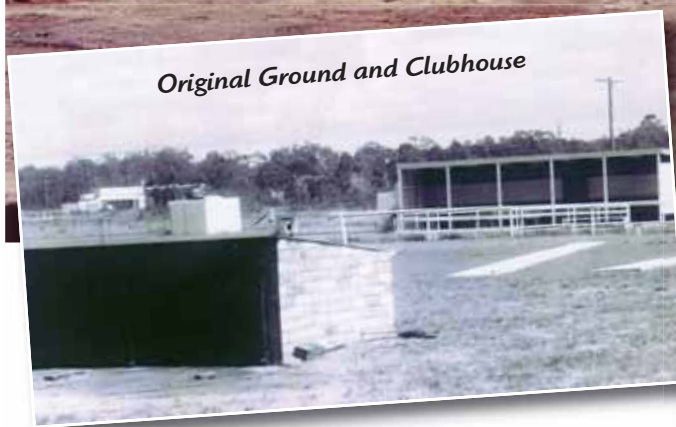

New Trap Layout No.2 with Skeet Field overlay

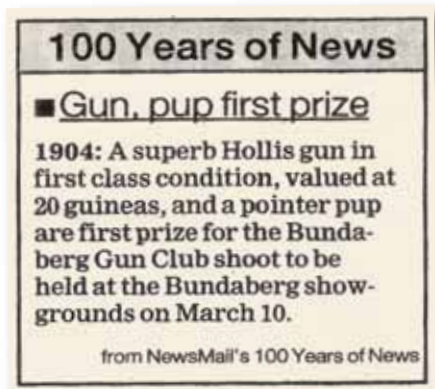

THE BUNDABERG GUN CLUB was formed around the 1900's (not quite sure of the exact date) but this extract from the paper of that time, 1904, shows where they shot at the local showgrounds on the 10th March 1904 for a Hollis Gun and a pointer pup.

option on our lease which still had 3-1/2 years to run plus the option because of the new security arrangements pertaining to operations of airports, no guns on airports. So we were going to have to look at alternative sites for re-establishment of club premises. Lots of worry at this time.

After all these years as a club, we could see that we could be shut down and as a small club we knew we couldn't build another club on our own in today's climate with all the necessary things to have to conform to in building a gun club. So Rob Rehbein approached the Bundaberg City Council to see if they could help and after a couple of meetings with them, we had a verbal indication that they were going to relocate us, like for like, at no cost to the club. This was brilliant news.

But alas the forced amalgamations of the councils, and a new council, the Bundaberg Regional Council, with new Councillors, caused more worry for the club members. We thought this may change our good news for the relocation of, but true to their word the Bundaberg Regional Council commenced our relocation. They found us a piece of land in the middle of an industrial area overlooking a retention basin very close to town. This was a perfect area for us, looking south, and the club could in future years implement six trap layouts and two skeet layouts.

This now takes us to 2010 and we are up and

running with the three trap layouts and one skeet layout as we had at the airport site. We as a club would not have been able to be here in our new facility without the generosity and support of our Regional Council, Mayor Lorraine Pyefish and her councillors and Regional Council CEO Peter Byrne and his co-workers, along with our President Rob Rehbein in his tireless effort of liaising with the council all the way to get what we have today with little or no cost to our club.

I feel that this may be a first for any club to have such support from their local council

Psychological Skills for Shooting

LOOKING BACK AT OUR PAST YEAR

As this article goes to print it is a good time to look back at the year that has been and evaluate your performance, evaluate your goals and set new ones for the coming year.

Unfortunately, our sport does not have an off season so after a few Christmas shoots it will be straight back into training and preparation for the years events, which may include state and national championships in addition to the zone and district championships shot at club level. Even though most of us do not stop shooting it is still important to take some time to evaluate our past performance and look towards what we want to achieve in the year(s) ahead.

Faced with the daunting experience of evaluating your performance: where do you start?

Firstly, you should review how well you did over the past year. This can be done via a journal or diary. I have often advocated the use of a journal to keep track of your performance against other variables such as weather, place, competitors, etc. Your shooting book can be used at it will give you the running percentages you have scored over the previous year.

For those shooters who do not use some form of a diary or log, I have included a page that was developed by Jim Shepherd from Maryborough when he was doing his Level 3 Coach accreditation. This page offers shooters all they need to keep track of the external variables such as the weather, light, wind speed, quality and size of the competition that may affect their ability. It also looks at internal variable such as your physical condition.

Secondly, we should look at our goals and evaluate if we met them. We need to ask ourselves; "Were these goals specific?" Were they measurable?" and against what criteria. "Were they achievable and were they realistic?" "Did I meet them in the time frame that I allowed?"

I am often asked about goals. Goals do not have to only be about the results of the competition. If you set goals that focus on winning the shoot, a national or state title, then you are limiting your options in relation to goals. Goals can also be used to help you improve and learn: for example you may set a goal that when you shoot next you will try to quieten the mind and limit the negative self-talk. You may wish to set

goals that assist with the process of shooting: such as keeping yourself in the here and now or focusing on your breathing. For example, at a small country club shoot recently (where they still press the button), I found myself in a squad that was being refereed by a twelve year old boy who had no concept of a 'slow pull'. One of the adults thought it would be good to teach this boy the fundamentals of releasing targets. After the first very slow pull, I thought, rather than get angry or annoyed here, I can use it to my advantage. So, I thought I will mount the gun, call pull but practise keeping the gun absolutely still until I see the target. So in effect, I set a new process goal for that shoot. It worked, I shot the possible while everyone else got annoyed and failed to concentrate on the targets.

Goal setting is about more than achieving something at the end of the season. It is about setting your self up for success and limiting your failures and disappointments.

2. All funding will be subject to written application with supporting documentation, such as Council backing, landholder agreement etc.

NSW Members and Dealers

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

- (a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or
- (b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

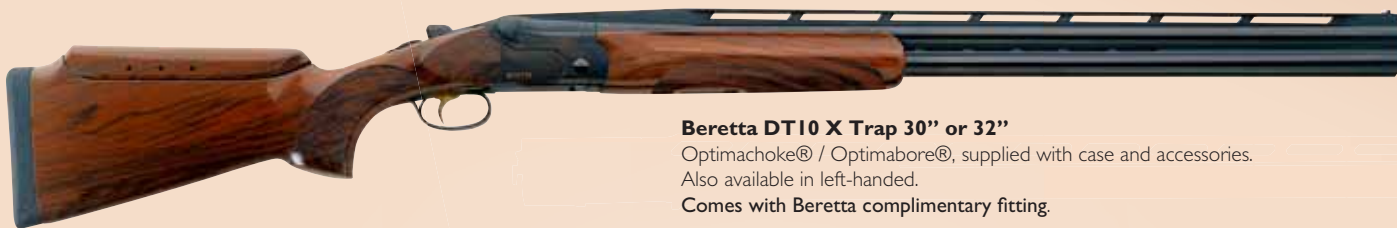
