

The Australian Sports Anti-Doping Authority (ASADA) is a government statutory authority that is Australia's driving force for pure performance in sport. It is the organisation with prime responsibility for implementation of the World Anti-Doping Code (the Code) in Australia. ASADA can attend any event to take samples from shooters. Those on medication can check their medication is not on the banned list on the website www.asada.gov.au or contact 1300 27232. If you are taking medications you can apply for a therapeutic Use Exemption by contacting the above number. **Do not stop taking any medication without consulting your Doctor**.

Any information you require can be found on this website or by ringing the toll free number. It is the responsibility of the athlete to be aware of the substances that may be found in their body.

There are a number of projects being worked on currently including the updating of the ACTA Data base, something well overdue. In this restructure of the data base we will be building in a plastic card facility which will enable all handicap card information to be retained on our data base and on the card.

There will be a great deal of other useful information which needs to be collated to enable the Association to prepare funding submissions. There will need to be administrative changes over the next few years to enable this Association to be recognised as a legitimate National Organisation and as such attract funding. Our Sport caters for, male and female participation, competing against each other in many disciplines. A strong Junior (and growing) membership, not only at club level but through the work of many clubs and States in Schools.

Our sport caters for an aging population and remains one of few sports you can participate in from a young age to a mature age. Our sport contains many people from a diverse background including those from non English speaking backgrounds. We have numerous people competing who have a disability (and that is not just missing targets). In fact the Wangaratta Club is providing a great service for the disabled including those with Acquired Brain Injury.

Our members do a great deal of special things in the community and deserve to be recognised for their work. By capturing this information we hope to be able to further support their efforts to grow the sport by focusing on the positive contribution we have to the community.

October long weekend. Shooters from the zone were able to take home a number of State Titles and Grade prizes, this was an enormous achievement considering the Central Zone has the least members of all the NSW Zones.

Matt Patmore (West Wyalong Clay Target Club) shot impressively over the weekend and featured in a number of shootoffs throughout the Carnival. In the 50 Target Double Barrel event, Matt was involved in a lengthy shoot-off which commenced on Saturday afternoon and did not finalise till the following Sunday afternoon. Matt shot an extraordinary 642/643 to take out 1st in AA Grade. Matt and Michael Mitton (Grenfell Gun Club) were

Matt Schiller (Grenfell Gun Club) gained two Junior State Titles over the weekend. He was the Junior section winner of the Champion of Champions title and also the Double Rise.

The Central Zones Open Team, consisting of Matt Schiller, Matt Patmore, Michael Mitton, Steve Schiller (Grenfell Gun Club) and Clive Foster (West Wyalong Clay Target Club) had a strong performance and were Runners up in the Teams Shoot.

> Matt Patmore and Michael Mitton qualified into the NSW State Open Team. This is a 15 man squad which is made up of those shooters who shot the highest total scores over the Double Barrel, Single Barrel and Points Score events. This squad then shoot a further 50 targets Points Score event to determine NSW State Representative Team of 5 shooters for the Australian Clay Target Assoc Trap Nationals (to be held in Wagga in April 2011). Matt Patmore continued his good form to qualify as number 2 shooter for this NSW State Open Team.

Kate Schiller qualified into the 6 member NSW Ladies Team. These ladies shoot a 25 target Points Score event to determine the 3 member squad which will represent NSW at the National Carnival. Kate performed very strongly in this event and earned the title of Ladies Team High Gun and will also go on the represent NSW in the State Ladies Team.

The Central Zone consists of clubs in Bathurst, Boorowa, Canowindra, Condobolin, Cowra, Grenfell, Orange, Parkes and West Wyalong.



YOUR RULES ATTENTION CLUB SECRETARIES AND HANDICAPPERS

Clarification of Rule 2.04(h) and Rule 2.01(h) 2008 Rule Book

Just to clarify Rule 2.04(h), "... an official may disregard **ANY** score **OBVIOUSLY NOT** indicative of the shooter's ability". This may indeed include more than one score, and the key words in applying this rule are "**OBVIOUSLY NOT**".

There also seems to be some confusion with the 200 targets rule-off and the substitution of bad double barrel scores. For the information of our members, Rule 2.01(h) states "After 200 targets regrade the shooter if necessary. **ANY BAD** scores entered on the **DB** column will be wiped off & transposed for any **GOOD** scores from the other events column (of equal target amounts **IF POSSIBLE**) i.e., Continental & single barrel".

To explain the application of this rule, after 200 **DB** targets has been ruled off by the shoot secretary or handicapper, he/she will then check for **BAD DB** scores (which can be multiple) that can be substituted for **GOOD** scores from the Cont/SB column. Also, per Rule 2.04(h), disregard any score obviously not indicative of the shooter's ability. Wherever possible, substitute **BAD FOR GOOD** scores of equal amounts **"IF POSSIBLE"**, but e.g., a bad 25 target DB score can be substituted for a good 50 target score, or conversely, a bad 50 target DB score can be transposed for a good 25 target score from the other events column.

Now having carried out the substitutions and/or deletions, there may indeed be a different total from the original 200, e.g. 170/175, e.g. 219/250. The percentage is then calculated at this point and not before, to obtain the "200 target percentage" for the purpose of calculating the ongoing rolling percentage and subsequent grading.

I hope this will help our members with any problems they have had in the past with these two rules. Please do not hesitate to contact me with any other issues or clarifications you are concerned with so that I can address them with you personally or through this medium.

Coaching Updates for 2011

As of the 1st January 2011 all new and current coaches will be required to pay a fee for their coaching cards issued by AISL.

For current coaches please check the Sports Accreditation online website (https://sao.ausport.gov.au) to ensure your details are up to date.

All States, Zones or Clubs conducting courses will need to add the new coach ID card fee of \$25.00 to the total cost of the course. This will need to be posted to the ACTA upon completion of each course along with all necessary papers for processing.

Those coaches who are renewing their coaching accreditation, must return their coaching record card signed by an authorised person with their \$10.00 fee to the ACTA National Office for renewal.

The pricing will be as follows:

Renewal of Expired Card	\$10.00
New Coach Card	\$25.00
Reissue lost or incorrect name	\$10.00

The National Coach is a member of the AISL Committee charged with the responsibility of developing the elite course which will take the place of the Level 3. Further details on progress in the near future.



Round 4 was shot at Werribee, without the usual helpful "Werribee Breeze". One hundred and eight shooters contested this round, providing 19 teams and 4 Junior teams. After a slightly late start thanks to the traffic problem that is the Monash Freeway.

Event one the Handicap saw a shoot off between Jack Wallace, Ryan Ball and Chris Brown, this went a dozen targets before Ryan stood alone 37/37 from Jack 36/37 and Chris 33/34 third. The Back Marker was Tony Psalia 39/40 and Bill Norling 23/25 collected the Junior Front Marker.

After the Handicap the teams section had two teams on 114 the home club's team One and Melbourne Red, these two well





ahead of the rest of the pack. In the Juniors it was Melbourne Gold three targets up on Mornington.

Event two the Double Barrel had 19 possibles posted and after a quick fifty there were only four. By the time they reached the 115 mark, there were only two, Lynne Curtis and Mark Crimins. Another hundred down the track saw Mark take overall with 215/215 leaving Lynne first in AA 214/215, second in AA was Wayne Parks; A grade: M Mifsud 55/56, Wally K 46/47; B: B McMillan 43/44, R Ball 44/47; C E Treadwell 25/25, C Mitchell 24/25. The OA HG went to Ryan Ball 50/50, the Ladies HG went to Sharon Lenanne 46/50; the graded Junior HG A: J Lenanne 47/50; B: R Ball 50/50; C: B Norling 45/50.



The winning team was Melbourne Red 231/250; G Aston, Wally K, J Wallace, T White and R Ball. The winning Junior team was Melbourne Gold 92/100; G Aston and J Wallace. The next round is the final at the Carnival.

From the National Coaching Director

From the 27th to the 30th of September the ACTA held the National Junior Development Camp at the National Grounds in Wagga. As I said in the last CTSN we intended to invite active coaches to the National Junior Development Camps. Along with the 18 successful young athletes we invited Graham Gosling and Fred Schmetzer to attend. The idea behind including experienced and active coaches in the training camp was to allow them to experience firsthand not only the coaching technique we use and the first class guest speakers we invite along but to also understand the standard we require the States to reach in their coaching programs before they recommend athletes for selection to the National Camps.

During the four days both Graham and Fred spoke about the direction they need to go to bring NSW State Juniors up in a selection system from Zone through to State coaching camps. They have presented a proposal already in regard to a system which the next State meeting will address and hopefully adopt. The result of inviting these men along has already made progress for the future for young shooters in NSW. I want to personally thank them along with Fred Rapley for all their help and input during the camp. Congratulations to Eddie Elder, a skeetie who shot his first 100 straight in trap and who now likes trap better than skeet? Again we invited Rob Anderson along to run through a training session in regard to the fitness required to perform at the elite level of our sport. The members of the camp always look forward to Rob's sessions with great enthusiasm. Without any question the qualifications Rob holds as a fitness instructor with a diploma in sport, level 1 coach in gymnastics, specialist in sports injury, Australian representative and coach in martial arts and a very accomplished clay target shooter in his spare time. Coupled together Rob understands the required fitness levels, training routine and technique for athletes who are clay target shooters to achieve their goals. I recommend any shooter looking to improve their shooting strength to have a word with Rob. Michael Kruger Davis again gave his time to come along and speak to the group about the psychology side of shooting and the self discipline required to become an elite athlete.

Also at the Junior Development Camp we held the first ever 18 to 23 year old high performance squad. The forming of this squad by the ACTA gives the juniors a pathway from 14 years old through to 23 year olds, this is an incredible opportunity for any young shooter who is determined and works hard. They can spend 9 years involved with the ACTA squad and gain a strong foundation for their shooting career. To our invited guests and to all the members of the squad thank you for contributing to one of the most successful camps we have held.




On the program first was the 25 target Northern Zone Double Barrel Championship. There was 7 possibles shot. The overall winner was Ray Collinson from



NSW Members and Dealers

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

(a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

GOALS FOR THE NEW YEAR

As I write this article the Murrumbidgee River has broken it's banks at my place and it is possible that by tomorrow evening I will either have to evacuate or stay put until the

floodwaters recede. If I evacuate, I'll make sure I take my gun so I can go to some shoots somewhere and if I stay, now that the flood waters are flowing through my red gum forest country, I intend to try a new sporting target: set the trap practically horizontal, load the target upside down and skip it across the water. It should make for an interesting presentation of the target and should look great when hit.

Because it is the start of the new-year and to follow on from last month's article, I have repeated an article about goals and new-year's resolutions.

Last New Year's day I was invited to talk on ABC Statewide Radio about new years resolutions; or more importantly why, they are so hard to keep. Whilst researching what I might say, it became apparent that new-year's resolutions are nothing more than goals we are setting for ourselves, in the hope that we will perform better or improve at something.

Why are new-year's resolutions so hard to keep? Basically, because of following;

Firstly, new-year's resolutions are made without giving thought to the importance of goal setting. I will explore goals and goal setting later in this article.

Secondly, new years resolutions usually focus on giving something up. Because people see their resolution as having a loss, they will be less inclined to make it happen, and they will be less concerned about relapsing. For example, if you have a resolution that states: I will give up cakes and chocolates, then you will feel resentful when you go to the next shoot and everyone else is enjoying a great afternoon tea. If on the other hand, you reframe your resolution to read; I will lose some weight and be healthier, you will be more likely to succeed because the resolution has a built in 'gain', and therefore you might limit what cakes and chocolates you eat or do a bit more exercise.

Thirdly, there are rarely any inbuilt rewards. If you want your resolutions to succeed then you should earn something for your achievements.

Because most people are reading this January, it seemed a good opportunity to revisit goal setting; just to make sure those who wish to, are on track.

The basic rules for goal setting are:

- 1. You must like your goals.
- 2. Your goals must bring to life some aspect of your vision. Your vision is the picture of yourself that you are striving for what you want to be. Your goals need to make your vision real.
- 3. There needs to be a connection between this goal and other goals. If goals are too widespread then they will be too difficult to achieve.

- 4. You should be able to express your personal potential through achieving your goal. Goals should be more than just winning: they should connect you with some particular quality within yourself.
- 5. The goal should help you gain recognition.
- 6. The goal is unique, innovative and creative so that life is more than just hard work.
- 7. You need to be committed to making it happen.
- 8. It must be fun.

The next most important aspect of goal setting is to keep them SMART: specific, measurable, achievable, realistic and in a time frame. These five features will ensure that the goals you set are appropriate and have the best opportunity for success.

How do you go about setting goals? This is the goal setting exercise that I use when teaching others about goals:

Take 4 sheets of paper.

On the top of the first page write LIFETIME and under the following headings: career, sport, finance, relationships, health, education, etc. Make the goals long term, make them big and be adventurous. Write three or four for each heading.

Turn over the page and do not look at it again.

On the top of the second page write FIVE YEAR GOALS and set specific, intermediate goals under the same headings. What do you want to achieve within the next five years.

Turn over the page and do not look at it again.

On the top of the third page write YEARLY GOALS and set specific, intermediate goals under the same headings. What do you want to achieve this year.

Turn over the page and do not look at it again.

On the top of the page write MONTHLY GOALS and set things to achieve now, under the same headings. Remember from last month that these specific monthly goals can be process goals focusing on how you are shooting.

The secret is; is what you're doing this month, at your local club shoot helping you achieve your lifetime goals? Will it help you achieve your yearly goals? Will your yearly goals help you achieve your lifetime goals?

Next day, revisit the lists of goals on the pages (starting with monthly and going to lifetime) and pick three goals for each heading and prioritise them, A, B and C. For each of the A's workout what action steps are needed to happen to achieve your goals. For the B's choose one thing you need to do to achieve the next step and for the C's look at what you are doing and what you need to change, if anything.

The other important aspect of goal setting is to look at what your base skills are and what you need to do to improve. In shooting there are a range of physical, technical and mental skills that need to be applied and developed if you are to perform well. Physical skills might involve weight loss, muscle development, stamina building, perseverance, hydration, etc. Technical skills might involve feet placement, gun hold, seeing the target before you move, etc, and mental skills involve the relaxation, concentration, goal setting, visualization, arousal control, etc.

So, as we go into the new-year, it may be timely to do a skills audit: what physical, technical and mental skills do I already have? What skills do I need to improve on? What strategies do I need to learn to establish these skills? Once you know what you need to improve on or learn: set some goals to achieve the results.



by Labor member for Northern Victoria Kaye Darveniza will be used entirely to establish a permanent state of the art 5 Stand Sporting Clays layout at the club.

In total, over \$41,000 was funded. This amount included the grant from the Labor State Govt., and Wangaratta Rural City's contribution of \$3,000. The total cost of the project has been calculated at just over \$57,000 and the balance will be made up with a cash contribution from the clubs funds and in kind voluntary support

and labour from members and volunteers. The club hopes to get this major new improve-

The club hopes to get this major new improvement project under way shortly. The establishment of a permanent multi trap facility to cater for the increased demand in sporting clays shooting will now be available in the N.E. Vic. region. This will result in much less work for our volunteers by not having to set up and put away various traps and the associated infrastructure to provide this discipline for our members.

Combined with the clubs existing portable 5 stand traps on the other two grounds this will now enable the Wangaratta Club to cater for more significant events, for eg Zone & State carnivals. The club also looks forward to much greater participation, particularly on a regional level, in 5 Stand shooting as a result of this generous grant.

Saturday morning started bright and sunny to greet the 40 shooters and campers ready for a full two days of shooting of the 250 target program.

The eye opening 25 target cash divide saw 11 perfect rounds and was a good indication of the high level of shooting and excellently presented targets that were typical of the whole weekend.

The second event of the day and the main event of the carnival was the 100 Target Skeet

Championship which was sponsored by Dining Out Magazine Brisbane and Gold Coast Shooting Supplies. This event saw 43 perfect rounds of 25 being shot with Craig O'Neill and Alan Mills being the two shooters who managed to string 4 x 25s together to shoot that often elusive 100 straight. The 100 straight was a first for Alan Mills and he never stopped smiling all weekend and is apparently still talking about it but on the day, experience won out in the end, with Craig O'Neill taking the overall prize. Thanks for the sponsorship of Frank and Sherrill Cooper a new inter-club challenge event was introduced and the perpetual trophy was hotly fought over with a lot of strategic planning going into teams with the format being extra 'points' awarded for lower grade shooters according to the handicap system to encourage a broad range of entrants. There were 7 club teams that entered in total with the winners being a Caboolture Team consisting of Craig O'Neill, Nigel Hughes and Thomas Rhue with a total score of 294/300. A very popular event and one that will be hotly fought over again next year.

Harry Bader and Craig O'Neill shot off for AA High Gun with Harry Bader making his trip from Sydney worthwhile emerging the winner with 258/264.
