Following the recent elections in Tasmania there has been some changes to the ACTA executive. Mr Allan Kenny has replaced Mr Brian Bailey.

We welcome Allan to the executive table. Brian had recently

been elected to both the Board and as a Vice President of the association. Therefore a ballot was required for both these positions. I congratulate Mr Dennis Harwood as the incoming Board member and Mr Rob Fox on his election as ACTA Vice President. Brian had also been the Chair of the Coaching Committee and I thank him for the effort he put into this position, which remains to be filled.

I feel I must comment on how disruptive it is to the Association to have continual changes. This is not a reflection on Tasmania but a broad comment regarding all states. The move, that I outlined last month, to second expertise outside of the State based structure is an attempt to get some expertise and continuity into our governing body.

The Association has been approached by representatives of Timor Leste who are keen to establish a club on the island. The military have made a Rifle and Pistol range available and following a visit to Darwin Gun Club, Colonel Falur of Timor Leste is also keen to establish a clay target facility. To help foster this process you will find a request for support elsewhere in the magazine.

The CTSN digitizing project is continuing with trial pages now active on the ACTA website. Click Downloads – CTSN Archives. This is a work in progress and will take some time before all copies and features are available.

The toilet block for the eastern end of the National Ground has been delivered and it is expected to be sited and fully operational by the end of October. Work will then begin on more powered sites in this area.

I struggle to understand, as I think most of us do, the recent tragedy in Norway, and our sympathy goes to them. Current statistics in Australia show the weapon of choice to now be the knife. Make no mistake though, our detractors will still use this opportunity to strengthen gun control in this country.

The next magazine will contain advice on many items to be finalised at the Board Meeting on the 6th & 7th August including the new membership categories, new subscription fees, and the format of the next DTL Nationals. Until next month

Executive Officer's Report



Welcome once again. The Premier of New South Wales recently raised the issue of shooting as a sport in High Schools. I am aware that legislation varies from State to State as well as policy within schools and this will effect opportunities to promote the sport and introduce new shooters to our ranks. This is a very contentious issue to some sectors of the community, however it is an issue that the sport should be

considering for a number of reasons. In Waqqa Waqqa, the Waqqa Gun Club has been running a program in conjunction with the *Riverina Anglican College for Year 10 students to participate in Clay* Target shooting as a sport. The students do shooting for one term and all students participate. The program has been running for ten years and started with 25 students and now has 125 undertaking the sport. The first benefit is that some of these students will continue to shoot and join a club. Secondly even those who do not join will have experience of the sport and be aware that the sport does not encourage or promote the more radical views and behaviour that some people associate with shooting generally. This can only help the reputation of the sport in the community. I would strongly encourage Clubs to investigate opportunities in their area for a program such as this. I am aware that some other Clubs are running courses or programs like this, or trying to start them and I would like to know of them. This information and news of their success would then be passed on to Members of Parliament to assist in their considerations.

The recent events in Norway have caused a reintroduction of calls by the Greens for more restrictive gun laws. We are aware that these types of people are generally not those who participate in our sport, however the sport always cops the backlash. All shooters must ensure that we behave responsibly and safely while enjoying our sport and that our firearms are kept securely and according to the law.

As I mentioned previously a Junior camp was held at the National Grounds during the New South Wales school holidays. It included young shooters from NSW, Victoria and Tasmania. This camp was very well run, produced good results and the behaviour of the shooters was excellent. I would like to take the opportunity to thank Brian Bailey, who organised and ran the Junior camp as well as the Youth Camp, Bill Iles for his assistance as shooting coach and all of the other volunteers who helped. A highlight was the meals provided by Brian's wife Heather who even went to the effort of peeling fruit for the fruit breaks. All shooters noticed an improvement in their shooting and will continue to benefit from the advice and assistance given. The camp covered a good mixture of subjects to assist performance including psychological preparation, physical preparation as well as set up and shooting hints. It is to be hoped that this assistance will result in improved shooting and we will see some of these young shooters mentioned in the results for the next Nationals. I would also like to thank Brian for his time as Chairman of the Coaching committee. He has been very active, particularly with organising camps for the young shooters and will be sorely missed in this role.



BEGA GUN CLUB Fantastic Crowd at July Shoot

ith a number of regular shooters otherwise engaged it was fabulous to see 44 shooters turn up for the Green Family Interclub Shield and the second round of the Fimac Engineering Shield. Bega once again turned on some perfect shooting weather, even if it was a crisp and frosty morning. Shooters came from Bermagui, Cooma and Bombala to join the locals.

The Fimac Engineering Shield, sponsored by Shane Platts of Fimac Engineering, Bega is shot over four rounds throughout the year, with the highest cumulative score providing the winner. A twenty-five target handicap event, it recognises the shooter who is most consistent across the four rounds.

MARYBOROUGH GUN CLUB June 2011 33rd Central Victorian Grand Prix

aryborough Gun Club, like many other clubs, relies heavily on the few members able to give their time to prepare for an event of this size but nevertheless. those that were able to assist had the grounds and traps well prepared and even the fog which enveloped the ground in the early morning was unable to dampen the atmosphere of a great day's shooting that followed.

It was once again a pleasant surprise on Saturday morning to see cars filled with shooters and their families driving into the grounds. The Maryborough Gun Club's "Central Victorian Grand Prix" is one of the longest running and most prestigious events on the Victorian Clay Target Shooting calendar and many competitors return year after year to enjoy the atmosphere, the fare and the competition.

This was the 33rd time that the event had been held and although numbers were down on the last couple of years, perhaps due to another major event being held on the same day and the fact that it was the last weekend of a very bountiful quail season, 110 shooters entered the day's events to compete for prizes that totalled in excess of \$8,000. This year we had visitors from many Victorian clubs as well as shooters from NSW. Old. SA and WA.

The morning fog slowly cleared and with little to no wind the 1st event, the 25 target

Highland Home Construction Single Barrel Championship got under way shortly after 9:30am.

The overall winner of the Single Barrel Championship was Sam Rundell, from the Myamyn Gun Club, with a score of 47/47. 2nd in AA went to Nathan McDonnell of the Werribee Clay Target Club. A Grade was taken out by Mitchell Iles-Crevatin from the Hay club on 35/36 and 2nd place went to Greg James (Callawadda-Stawell). The B Grade winner was Wade Canny from Castlemaine Gun Club 31/32 with Wayne Whitehead (Bendigo) running into 2nd place. In C Grade Brian Case (Mt Gambier) won with a score of 23/25 from Jack Flintoff (Beaufort).

In the major event, the 33rd Annual Central Victorian Double Barrel Grand Prix, 33 shooters shot the possible and it looked like we were in for a long shoot-off. However after 125 targets only two shooters remained, Steve Haberman and Nathan

McDonnell who at this point decided to split first place, effectively taking out between them Overall and first in AA. The combined prizes for Nathan and Steve included the major overall prize, a Sabatti rifle valued at \$1200, a Marlin 17HMR rifle valued at \$650 and the appropriate sashes. This is the seventh time that Steve has either shared or won the Grand Prix.

First place in each of the grades was a Marlin 17HMR rifle. An Armed Model 6 Air rifle was the trophy for 2nd prize in each grade and 500 premium GB Prius shotshells were presented as the trophy for 3rd place.

AA Grade 2nd was won by James Buchholz from the Noorat Gun Club (99/100) and 3rd place in AA went to John Hawker from the Bordertown Gun Club. IT'S YOUR CALL by Bill McCarthy

You are a Referee in a Double Rise event where a shooter fires and breaks (say), the right hand target with his first barrel. He then swings on to the left hand target and has malfunction of his gun and or cartridge. You carry out your usual check and determine that he has had an allowable malfunction. You then declare "No Target on the second barrel."

You instruct him that he is to shoot a "**Proof Pair**" to determine the result of the second shot.

He reloads and shoots deliberately at the **left hand target** which he breaks. What do you Rule?

It's Your Call!

If you rule "Won" for the first target and "Lost" for the second target you would be quite correct.

There has been some cases where a shooter has argued that he was entitled to score with his next shot and that breaking the left hand target satisfied the provisions of **Rule 1.07(f)**. **NOT SO!** A Proof Pair is just that ... a "Pair".

Hence, he is required fire again at a "pair of targets" in the same order as he did initially to determine the result of his second shot only. Clearly, it does not give the shooter the right to claim a positive result if he shoots only at

the second target without any reference to the first target Irrespective of which barrel he used in so doing. In any case, should he use both barrels at the second target then both targets will be declared "Lost" under **Rule 1.07(e). even though he has already broken the first target**.

It is important that we remember that this is a Double Rise event and should be treated as such. Therefore, you, as the referee should clearly instruct the shooter to shot a proof pair by firing his first barrel in the direction of the first target of the restored pair before firing at the second target to determine the result of his second shot.





SHOOTING LESSONS

The past month has been an interesting time for me. I have been involved in the ACTA junior development camp, a junior coaching camp with the Far Western Academy of Sport/ Western Zone NSWCTA and a personal development day for the Squads

Southern Sports Academy Squads.

The emphasis for the Southern Sports Academy personal development day was to provide a presentation to the boys in the squads looking at their behaviour both on and off the field and the consequences of the decisions they make for their futures. Other presentations on the day involved drugs in sport and the use of social networking media (Facebook, You tube, etc.) Readers may recall an article in the CTSN several years ago called "The Teen Brain", where I explored the development of the adolescent brain and the changes individuals undergo during adolescents.

On Sunday, July 17, The Sun-Herald a Fairfax publication out of Sydney had the headline "Push for Guns in Schools". If you are like me you cringe, every time you read headlines like this or hear similar reports on the radio or TV. Now I do not want to get into a political debate: in a nutshell, the reason for the article in the paper was to report that the Shooters and Fishers Party in NSW were trying to do deals with the O'Farrell Coalition Government to relax the gun laws to allow shooting as a sport in schools and allow juniors under twelve to have access to air pistols and rifles so that can participate in the sport along with family members. Basically as a family, you can all go tenpin bowling and even those under 12 can play, if your chosen sport is target shooting then those family members are forced to watch because legislation prohibits their involvement. At least this is inequitable.

I stated earlier that I do not wish to be involved in a political debate but as a gun owner and shooter it is possible that this will happen from time to time. I do however, want to give you, the reader, ammunition (no pun intended) based on child development theories, psychological theories and processes and recent neuroscience developments, so that you can counter the arguments in your local areas.

My personal history is that I was a teacher and principal before becoming a school counsellor. I worked 10 years as a school counsellor and specialist counsellor (Trauma) and then was promoted to senior school psychologist and have been doing this job for 16 years. I do not believe that any child should be allowed to have a gun, of any type, without adequate and responsible supervision.

Firstly, the press and the anti-gun coalition seem to believe that children under twelve must not have access to guns. Jean Piaget, formulated a theory of child cognitive development. Basically, children between the age of 5 and 12 are in the concrete stage of development. It is in this stage that children are able to learn skills, routines and processes that are concrete. For example, learning simple board games that involve decision making and turn taking, and motor skills such as swimming and bike riding. During this stage it would be easy to teach range safety and gun safety because these are concrete things that can be seen and done, the same way you would teach a child to use a hammer or a rake. I was careful not to let my own children have toy guns: why, because children point toy guns at each other and I didn't want my boys to learn that it was OK to point a gun at people. I didn't give them toy tools either, instead I gave them real tools (hammers, screwdrivers, drills) and taught them how to use them properly and safely. After the age of twelve children enter the formal operations stage of development. In this stage the child's thinking moves from the concrete to the abstract. They begin to understand inferential things rather than literal thing. They can conceptualise and understand abstract constructs such as liberty, justice, love, permission, forgiveness, etc. As well as stages of cognitive development Piaget formulated a theory of moral development. According to Crain (1985), "Piaget studied many aspects of moral judgment, but most of his findings fit into a two-stage theory. Children younger than 10 or 11 years think about moral dilemmas one way; older children consider them differently. As we have seen, younger children regard rules as fixed and absolute. They believe that rules are handed down by adults or by God and that one cannot change them. The older child's view is more relativistic. He or she understands that it is permissible to change rules if everyone agrees. Rules are not sacred and absolute but are devices which humans use to get along cooperatively. At approximately the same time--10 or 11 years--children's moral thinking undergoes other shifts. In particular, younger children base their moral judgments more on consequences, whereas older children base their judgments on intentions. When, for example, the young child hears about one boy who broke 15 cups trying to help his mother and another boy who broke only one cup trying to steal cookies, the young child thinks that the first boy did worse. The child primarily considers the amount of damage--the consequences--whereas the older child is more likely to judge wrongness in terms of the motives underlying the act.

Piaget's theories were then studied and elaborated on by Lawrence Kolhberg. A Google search will provide the reader with some good background material.

Secondly the anti-gun lobby and the press, appear scared and obsessed with anti-social adolescent behaviour. There is a belief that adolescents cannot be trusted. Legislators have made laws to prevent adolescents from drinking, voting, driving carrying knives, assembling in groups, etc. Popular opinion would have us believe that teenagers are full of wild hormones and that none of us are safe to walk the street. Actually, only two percent of the population would fit the criteria for antisocial and delinquent behaviour. The rest just do dumb things without weighing up the consequences. Modern neuroscience, would argue that it is not the hormones that are the problem but the immature pre-frontal cortex of the brain. The prefrontal cortex is the last part of the brain to develop (usually at about 25 years) and is responsible for executive function. Executive function involves decision making, planning, inhibition, organisation, weighing up consequences, working memory and behavioural regulation. This immaturity of the pre-frontal cortex often leads to risk taking behaviour. With adequate supervision and proper instruction you can teach appropriate behaviour: this is vital with things such as tools, medicines, guns, cars, machinery, motor bikes. Before juniors can obtain a junior permit they need to pass a firearm safety awareness test but there is no test for letting an 8 year old ride a mini-bike, or a 16 year old use a chainsaw.

Thirdly, gun laws have worked in our favour. Yes, they might appear drastic and draconian but no-one can argue the need for safe storage. And we should continually pointing out that a gun licence is not only a certificate of competency but it is a certificate that you are socially responsible: society trusts you to own and carry a firearm. I like to ask those in the anti-gun lobby if they can show me their certificate that proves they can be trusted in society. And because of this licence we make sure that we behave in a socially responsible manner because we know the consequences will be greater for us if we stuff up. If we are involved in an assault, or domestic violence or some other crime we will loos our opportunity to play our chosen sport. There is no restriction for the tenpin bowler or golfer to restrict their sporting pursuits. Is this unfair? Yes. Can we do anything about it? Probably not. By making your adolescent son or daughter understand this will more likely help them make better decisions because they will be more acutely aware of the consequences.

I said at the beginning it had been an interesting month, why? Because, I spent a great deal of time with adolescents and firearms, who all behaved

in a responsible and safe manner. I saw no fights or arguments, no-one disregarding safety procedures, no drugs, alcohol or tobacco. All of the participants were very keen to learn. They learnt shooting skills, they learnt physical skills and did strengthening and endurance exercises and they learnt mental skills such as goal setting, motivation, visualisation, relaxation, concentration and attention. My only regret is that the press did not see or experience joy of seeing teenagers having fun and learning some essential life skills whilst doing a sport that required a gun.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY NSWCTA TRAP CARNIVAL 2011

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the Carnival. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.

Note: A fee of \$20 will be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.

- 2. Squads of 5 or 6 to shoot 50 targets/75 targets in brackets of 25, one visit only to the traps.
- 3. Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
- 4. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/75 targets. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** may be incurred.
- 5. A COMPETITOR MUST BE AT THE FIRING POINT WITHIN 2 MINUTES OF BEING CALLED. Failing this he may be disqualified, penalised with loss of targets, or be re-squadded at the discretion of the club. Rule 1.02 (a)
- 6. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 7. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest recorded.
- 8. Any competitor will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the

penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** will be incurred in the event concerned.

- 9. Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first round of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility will be penalised **ONE TARGET**. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for they're failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.
- 10. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised **FIVE (5) TARGETS**.
- 11. All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- 12. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 13. Any eligible competitor is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the Overall Winner cannot take any grade and section prize. The Grade Winner may also win their nominated section.
- 14. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall choose in which team they will be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
- 15. Nominations will be as per Pre-nom form by the closing date advertised.
- 16. Any interpretation of the program and Conditions of Entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the NSWCTA Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.
- An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 18. Free Nominations: These shall apply to Juniors and Sub-Juniors only.
- 19. All competitors must comply with Firearm Licensing Laws in their State of residence.
- 20. Club Teams Event 3 competitors affiliated through the same club entry fee \$15 per team all monies returned to prize pool split if tied.
- 21. State Team Selection 15 open, 6 each Ladies, Juniors & Veterans selected over D/B, S/B and P/S. Shoulder to Shoulder team then selected from aggregate including D/B, S/B, P/S and Team scores.
- 22. Management reserve the right to conduct shoot-offs under lights.

NSW Members and Dealers

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

(a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.


Side by Side Medley
