National President's Notes

Your National President is currently taking a well earned break. Robert and Donna are riding their trusty Beemas "somewhere in the outback" and we wish them a great holiday. They both certainly deserve it as the contribution this couple make to clay target shooting is little short of extraordinary.

Following on from Robert's last National President's Notes the issue of the National Coaching Director has not been fully settled as the matter is subject to legal challenge. The issue was referred by the previous NCD's lawyers for arbitration to Fair Work Australia but hopefully resolution with an outcome that is fair to all parties will be achieved shortly. The Board and the Executive will be carefully considering all options with respect to the future of the NCD position including possible outside funding.

A Memorandum of Understanding has been negotiated with AISL. Your executive approved a version of the document at the June meeting but AISL subsequently requested some minor changes. At this stage we are awaiting advice as to whether the AISL Board has signed off on the revised document. Once that has occurred, the agreement will have formal effect. The MOU will formally delineate the respective responsibilities of both organisations. Of particular importance is the interface with respect to the development of shooters through the ranks and into the elite level within the AISL high performance squad. The document will be included in a future edition of CTSN for the information of members. Members will note that the MOU will be due for review by both ACTA and AISL in 12 months from the time of acceptance by both parties and then on a biennial basis from then on. Comments from members as usual will be most welcome.

Some applications to fill the two Board positions and also a sub-committee position have been received and the Executive will be considering those in due course. However the positions are still open as advertised on page 3 and I urge all those interested to apply. On behalf of ACTA I thank those who are showing such interest in the future of our sport.

As many are aware the ISSF Nationals in January 2012 will be held for the first time at Newcastle following a successful application by the club. For quite a few years the ISSF nationals have been restricted to one of three venues, Sydney, Brisbane and Perth, and it is great to see an extra one made available. Many shooters cannot afford either the time or expense to attend a national championship when it occurs interstate or far from their club. However with one more club now able to host this prestigious event more local shooters will have the opportunity at least once every four years to shoot alongside the country's best without having to travel long distances. Details of the program and application forms appear elsewhere in this edition of CTSN.

As we move toward the end of the year may I remind club secretaries that membership renewals are now due. Please check the new rates and membership categories and if there is any confusion please do not hesitate to check with the ACTA office.

Robert will be back next month as usual so I would like to take this opportunity to wish all members a happy and safe festive season.

Executive Officer's Report



This edition see's us moving quickly towards the end of 2011. All of the National Championships have been completed for the year with some excellent results. There is no doubt that the National Grounds provide a great opportunity for good scores. Despite the problems with weather, the grounds are in excellent condition. This is largely due to the work put in by Dave Jocelyn, the grounds man. We continue to improve

the grounds and are currently receiving quotes for the provision of additional powered camping sites. This will increase the availability of facilities on the grounds and will have new showers and toilets in place towards the western end of the layouts ready for next year's events. For next year's Nationals we have enclosed containers made to safely allow fires to be used in the camping area. These fire containers will be available to be used in a number of the areas near the camping sites. This will, however mean stricter enforcement of the no open fire policy. It should be remembered that on some occasions state fire restrictions can impact on this policy. It is hoped that these and other changes will lead to increased participation at the Nationals and improve things for the people who attend. You are reminded that next year's Trap Nationals will also host the Mackintosh reunion on the 75th year since they began. Details of the reunion will be advised separately.

We recently received tenders for the renewal of the Insurance Policies for the ACTA and its members. By the time you are reading this the new policies will be available on the web site as well as a copy of the certificate of currency. We are currently conducting tenders for the provision of targets for the National Grounds. This tender provides for exclusive use of the contract targets on the National Grounds and, more particularly, for use in the National Championships conducted here. The targets currently being used have received positive comments from all shooters this year however it is only fair that we trial the alternatives and try to obtain the best prices for shooters at the Nationals and on the National Grounds. The assessment will be based on a combination of price and performance.

It is interesting to see that the young winner of the High Gun and Overall winner of the Handicap event at the Griffith Casella Golden Wine Open Shoot, James Willett, was introduced to Clay Target shooting through a promotional display held at the Henty Field day two years ago. A further example of why we need to be proactive in finding new members for our clubs and Association.

involved, and if anyone has seen him in action, then you don't need any explanation as to his skill. It is gratifying to see a small, Central Queensland club with the vision needed to include ISSF in their training of our young (and not so young) competitors.

Clubs that may have an interest in the machine should note that Inverell Clay Target Club, recently borrowed the mobile bunker to conduct the NSW ball trap championships. This was made possible by Steve Whitehead, from Auto-trench Australia delivering the mobile bunker to Inverell. During the event, some comment was made that the targets from the auto-trench were harder than from the other traps. Investigation revealed that the "other" traps were in fact throwing illegal targets and the club made immediate changes to correct this situation. Inverell now throw completely legal ball trap targets, but without the autotrench, this error could have remained undetected.

To see the results of these titles, refer to our website for confirmation from the club itself.

All auto-trench machines come with the ball trap function as standard, however additional speakers are required to enjoy this event. All other features; practice, single target selection, 9 programme selection, left, right and straightaway target selection from any of the nine programmes comes standard in the latest incarnation of the machine. To sum up, you get a full trench layout (condensed into one very simple to use machine) ball trap, practice mode, one or multi-person use, as standard features. This machine is simple to operate and with minimal training you basically load the machine, press some buttons at the consol located at the shooting station (press the wrong button - no problem, simply deselect everything and start again), then shoot till the hopper runs out of targets. Simply reload the hopper and continue.

So, how does it compare in cost to a full Trench layout??

Depending on the brand of traps you purchase plus the cost of the bunker and installation, a full layout will cost from \$130,000 - \$200,000.00. The Auto Trench could cost you less than \$40,000.00. However, the versatility of the Auto Trench surpasses anything that a full Trench layout can provide and as it delivers Ball trap at the touch of a button, you get two different disciplines in the one machine.

Canterbury Trap has a demonstration Auto Trench available to a club for a period of up to 6 months if they wish to install it and use it seriously. The only cost to the club will be installation, insurance and possibly transport to get the unit to the club. THE ACTA EXECUTIVE RESERVES THE RIGHT TO ALTER THE PROGRAMME

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY NATIONAL ISSF DISCIPLINE CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.

Note: A fee of \$20 will be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.

- 2. Targets to be shot in brackets of 25 for Olympic Trap and ISSF Skeet with squads of 6 shooters where possible. In Double Trap targets to be shot in brackets of 25 Pair (50 targets) with squads of 6 shooters where possible.
- 3. Pre Nominations to be received by close of business (Eastern Summer Time) Wednesday 4th January 2012. There is a maximum of 125 competitors for ISSF Trap. If pre nominations exceed this number a standby list of 20 will be created and used in case of withdrawals. If any vacancies exist in the program, it will be on a "first in" basis at an additional cost of \$25.00 per event to enter. Nominations at the championships close at 10.00am the day prior to the event if a vacancy exists.
- 4. Shooter will be squadded as per ISSF rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director. <u>Once squadding for an event has been completed, a shooter shall not be entitled to a refund if they withdraw.</u> Withdrawals after nominating and before squadding will be accepted in writing 48 hrs prior to the event.
- 5. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot the applicable event.
- 6. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will be penalised by the LOSS OF THREE TARGETS.
- 7. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 8. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each round. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest recorded.
- 9. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons designated to referee/score or line referee must fulfil their obligation to do so or have obtained the service of a suitable replacement that must be ready to take his place at the required time. In the event of the designated persons or their replacement not being ready to take their place at the required time, the person initially designated to fill the specific role may INCUR A PENALTY AS PERSCRIBED UNDER INTERNATIONAL RULES.
- 10. Setting and adjusting of traps is the sole responsibility of Shoot Management. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised up to **FIVE (5) TARGETS**.
- 11. All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- 12. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 13. When team selection is involved, shooters are eligible for section nominated. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.
- 14. High Gun awards are determined for each section. To be eligible for the High Gun recognition, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events for each respective High Gun.
- 15. Women shooters are eligible for their section only. Junior shooters are eligible for OA or their section and grade. Except in Double Trap.
- 16. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behaviour of card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 17. The ISSF Rules will be used to determine the OA placing in all events.
- 18. Juniors to be under the age of 21 in the year of competition.
- 19. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.
- 20. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors Tournament Director to adjudicate. As per ISSF Rules (clothing).
- 21. All competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws of the state. (When held in W.A a shooter must obtain a permit to bring a firearm into that state).



MORE MENTAL TOUGHNESS

In every competition there is always a winner. However, even those who do not get to the number one position, can still reach a personal best, outperform a

usual adversary or just improve.

So what is the secret of winning? Well, if this was an easy question to answer, I'd either be the best or I'd be rich. So the answer has to be qualified with what attributes do you need to be a winner?

Firstly, you need to be mentally tough. That is you need to have the following skills and attributes

- a. **Competitive**. Being competitive and being in the competition are what counts. Whilst it's good to win, the process of being competitive means that if others want to win then they have to work hard at it.
- b. Confident. Being confident, means that you see yourself as the favourite, every time you walk out onto the tracks. This doesn't mean that you see yourself winning overall, but it may mean you see yourself winning your grade or section.

Being confident means that you never fall victim to self-defeating thoughts; to be confident you need a can do attitude, a belief that you can handle anything that comes along. If you do have thoughts whilst you're competing that chip away at your confidence: then acknowledge the thought (Thank you, mind) and then go back to focusing on the process.

- c. **Control**. To be a successful athlete you need to be able to control your emotions and behaviour; that is, focus on what you can control and don't allow the things that are beyond your control affect you. To be mentally tough you need to be able to maintain poise, concentration and emotional pressure under the greatest of pressures and challenging situations. If you have a thought or feeling that you feel cannot control, acknowledge it and say to yourself: It is only a thought. Will I be better off thinking like this? If the answer is no then change your thinking.
- d. **Committed**. Mentally tough athletes focus their time and energy on their goals and dreams. Have a vision and set realistic goals to achieve your vision. Be self-directed and motivated towards both the process and the outcomes of your goals and dreams. Goals are great and there is a need for all of us to have set goals on where we would like to be, however, once you have set your goals then you need to commit to an action plan that will help you achieve your goal. Too often, I am approached by people who say: I have set my goals but I can't seem to reach them. When we explore their goal setting it is noticeable that they left out the next and most vital step: committing to a workable plan to achieve these goals.
- e. **Composure**. To be mentally tough you need to be able to stay focused and deal with adversity. Missing a target isn't the worst thing that can ever happen. But if you dwell on it and get angry with yourself then you are changing the focus of your attention

and you will miss again and again. Composure is also about staying in the here and now. Being mindful of what is happening to you whilst you are shooting and staying focused on the process.

- f. **Courage**. Mentally tough athletes need to take risks. Peak performers only win because they're prepared to lose. If you stay with your comfort level you may never get to experience what happens when you are truly "in the zone." If you take a risk and it fails then don't get angry: identify that you have learnt something and be aware not to make that mistake again.
- g. **Consistency**. Mentally tough athletes possess an inner strength. They are mindful of what is happening around them, what their bodies are doing and feeling. Winners often play their best when they are feeling their worst, because they can and do focus on their bodies rather than the outcome of the competition.

Secondly, and tied in with mental toughness is mindfulness. You have to be mindful of what is happening to you. Being aware of how you are feeling, what you are seeing, hearing, smelling and touching. Shooters have a distinct advantage because we hear, see, smell, touch, feel hot and cold, balance and have to be aware of our body in relation to others, to be able to shoot well. All of these senses need to come into play to be able to perform well. These mindfulness cues are essential and integral in bring you back to the here and now when your mind wanders in the past (makes judgments) of the future (develops fear). Mindfulness keeps you in the present.

Finally, stay focused on the process. To be a winner you need to be task-orientated not goal- or ego-orientated. Even though we see a lot of winners that look goal orientated, the truth is they are doing all the mental skills in a subconscious way. They do not realize that they are doing all the right things. But for the majority of us, we need to stay in tune with what we are doing and if we stay focused on the process then the product (score, trophy, etc) will look after itself.

NSW Members and Dealers

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.


