We are fast approaching what is the biggest, in terms of shooter numbers, of our National events, the Trap Championships. This event is to be conducted from the 26th of March to the 1st of April. Most members are well aware of the changes made to the competition in terms of cost and target numbers. These changes result from a decision made by the Executive which are designed to encourage more shooters to

attend, and to increase participation in, the National Championships. The reduction in entry fee, based on removal of the prize pool, was introduced to reduce the cost for the many shooters to whom the prize money is not relevant or their reason for attending. This has reduced the cost of most events by \$25.00. The reduction to 50 target events also provides the opportunity for a greater range of shooters to compete. National Championships are an opportunity for shooters from all over Australia to meet, compete and enjoy the company of many people who they may only see on rare occasions. While I believe

Dates have been listed on the ACTA website for the Junior Camps to be conducted this year. Camps are conducted during the School Holidays of the major States where possible and where they coincide. The camps will be for 12 shooters, both male and female, and preference for attendance will be given to the highest grades. The ACTA will request nominations from State bodies to assist in selection of the attendees. Content of training will include shooting skills, sports psychology, nutrition and fitness, and time management. The ACTA covers the cost of staff, accommodation, food and ammunition. This is one of the ways the Association works to improve the standards of shooting and to prepare young shooters for future national and International competition.

I look forward to seeing those of you who attend the National Championships and wish you all the best for your shooting in 2012.

ACTA Insurance Coverage

As members are aware the ACTA has a Broad range of insurance coverage for members and Clubs. This article will hopefully provide a better understanding of what is and isn't covered by our policies. Listed below are the policies which are held and effect Clubs and members.

Public Liability

The public and injury coverage covers members, voluntary workers, Coaches and Instructors, temporary members and visitors attending clubs and authorized activities and approved ACTA shoots.

Coverage does not include liability for injury or damage to drivers, passengers or motor vehicles being driven or operated if the driver does not hold a licence to operate that vehicle or they are not seated within the vehicle and wearing a seat belt or protective helmet on a motorcycle.

Corporate Travel

State and national Team Members are covered with a range of benefits in the event of accident when on approved travel representing the ACTA or the State to National events.

Group Personal/Voluntary Worker Personal Accident

This covers Members, voluntary workers, coaches and range staff whilst participating in events arranged by the insured (ACTA and Clubs and State Associations) including shooting, travelling to and from activities, and voluntary work for the clubs or associations.

It should be noted that there is an excess on some of these policies similar to your own insurance policies.

In the event of an incident which may result in a claim the club is to submit an incident report while the information is fresh in the mind. Details are on the ACTA website.

A question has been raised about liability in canteens with food poisoning. If the catering is outsourced the caterer should provide their own insurance. If the Club is catering they are covered but they would need to show that they the required Food preparation hygiene standards when making a claim.

As is to be expected these explanations of policies are not complete as the policies are detailed and cover a range of areas. Any specific questions should be raised with the ACTA for further clarification.

SHOTGUN SPECIAL REPRODUCED WITH PERMISSION FROM THE AUSTRALIAN SHOOTER



he name Browning is synonymous with one of the most famous of all firearms designers - John Moses Browning. Designs that were penned in the late 19th century are still being used today, as the brilliance of Browning was, in my opinion, unsurpassed. This is high accolade for a chap who had trouble getting recognition in his own country and needed to take his designs elsewhere!

The Browning Citoris shotguns are made in Japan and represent excellent engineering and finish. The materials are of exceptional quality and the finish, even on this entrance model Sporter on review, is very good. Upon unpacking, I was also impressed with the quality of character in the woodwork, for unlike many European manufacturers, who are disguising very basic woodwork with coatings that portray magnificent grain characteristics, Browning simply had a matte polythene finish on a better-than-average piece of wood. Much to my delight, I noted a recoil pad was fitted as standard. Maybe Browning has been listening to my concerns for the past 20 years.

The barrels

Measuring 30" in length and fitted with the Invector Plus interchangeable choke tube system, the Browning Citori Sporter was certainly well designed and ready for the challenge of Sporting Clays or a day out in the field on upland game such as rabbits, hares or quail. The long 30" barrels are preferred for Sporting Clays though, as the barrels maintain enough weight for a smooth swinging action.

Interchangeable choke tubes offer options for varying shooting or hunting opportunities and I prefer them for sporting shotguns for this reason. The greater the versatility offered, the better the gun I say! The supplied choke key was quite basic, similar to what Browning used years ago, but I sometimes need to remind myself that the gun was an entry-level model. The solid side ribs contributed to the weight of the barrels and the gun's overall balance. I also find vented side ribs a nuisance to keep clean and so preferred the solid ribs.

Topped with a parallel rib typical of Browning design, with two sights fitted, one at the muzzle and another halfway down the rib, to effect correct barrel alignment, the gun pointed extremely well. I



appreciated the mid-sight, which always enables the shooter to ascertain whether they are 'canting' the gun (tipping the barrels off vertical), for the sights should align in a figure 8. A good way to check gunfit and barrel alignment is to mount the gun with your eyes closed. Then, when you open your eyes, if the sights are not aligned, stock adjustments may be required. The Citori Sporter mounted perfectly for my purposes and body build - I suppose that gave me no excuses for any missed targets during field testing!

The finish on the Citori Sporter was faultless. Browning uses a much darker blueing finish, almost black, compared to what can be found on European guns, but over the years, this has become a Browning characteristic. The finish appears to be very resilient, having passed the test of time; indeed, I have not known of any Citori barrels to suffer from surface rust.

The chamber end of the barrels was very interesting. In fact, I had to have a second look when I checked the chamber end, for the forcing cones had been significantly lengthened. Chambered for field shooting 3" shotshells, the barrel bores each measured 0.737", which is a little tighter than the 0.74 to 0.742" that I have found with other models. The bore differences are really inconsequential, although larger bores tend to provide less resistance to shot and wad charges, resulting in marginally faster velocities. This was proven by American Stan Baker.

My concerns with barrel bores are related to the relative differences in bore diameter to choke tube constriction, which determines choke. This was demonstrated when I measured what was labelled an improved cylinder Invector Plus choke tube

supplied with the gun to find it measured 0.736", which means the difference between the bore and choke constriction was only one-thousandth of an inch (or 'one point') and this actually represents a cylinder choke! Improved cylinder is usually around 10 points of constriction, which meant the respective choke tube should have measured 0.727". This was not such a concern for me, for knowing the relative differences meant that I could select the appropriate choke tube for my purposes. Perhaps Browning may have gone to lighter choke constrictions to compensate for the tighter patterning often resultant from lengthened forcing cones.

I recalled being entertained for several hours many years ago with a Browning gunsmith at the World UIT Championships held in Western Australia in the early 1990s. He explained that Browning did not advocate lengthened forcing cones at the



time, as such modifications interfered with pattern performance. It was interesting to note their change of direction with this model. I feel sure Browning would have well and truly done their research and development with this modification to ensure optimal pattern efficiency and terminal ballistic performance.

The tried and proven two-piece ejectors were fitted to the Citori Sporter and performed as to be expected - perfectly!

The receiver

The receiver was silver in color, which made the gun well suited to upland game, as well as Sporting Clays. Engraving about the receiver was sufficiently and tastefully completed, without being overdone. Remember, this is an entry-level model with the best Browning can offer for the minimal price.

All metal-to-metal surfaces and woodto-metal borders were finished well, to the point of being without fault. This is a great effort by Browning with their CNC machinery. Even many guns that I have seen from European makers are not so well finished, having noticeable gaps between metal surfaces, especially those selling for less than \$2000.

Browning utilises an underpinned jointing system by which the barrels are attached to the receiver. This concerned me a little, until I recently found a similar Citori GTS quite comfortable to shoot. While shooting lower profiled, bifurcated jointed guns for almost 20 years, I always found the higher profile from underpinned guns a little ungainly, as they have a higher centre of gravity and never seemed to point as well. Since returning to a Browning Citori for my own personal gun, I have noticed little difference in handling characteristics and can shoot just as well with my Browning

now, as I did with my previous Italian guns. Anyway, the Citori Sporter came up beautifully, swung smoothly and had me looking straight down the barrels, so I could not ask for much more.

The top lever of the gun was well adjusted and comfortable to use. It operated the bottom trapezoid wedge, which slides across the floor of the receiver to lock the gun. Its adjustment slightly to the right, which allows for some wear over time, is standard. Also located on the top tang was the barrel selector-cum-safety catch. These were well designed and positive in operation. Browning seems to take as much pride in the quality assurance and adjustment of its entry-level guns as its more expensive models, which is comforting to know.

With the safety catch pushed forward, the gun was ready to fire. The barrel order of either 'U' for under barrel or 'O' for over barrel could not be selected until the gun's safety catch was returned to the 'safe' position. The firing mechanism was also based on an inertia cocking system, whereby once the firing mechanism is initially cocked by opening the barrels fully (breaking the action), the recoil from firing the first barrel selects the second barrel ready for firing. If you have a misfire in the first barrel, the second barrel cannot be discharged unless you manipulate the barrel selector very quickly. This is standard with all Browning Citori models and there are very few shotguns these days that offer mechanical trigger systems.

The triggerguard was generous and would accommodate shooters wearing thin leather shooting or golfing gloves. The triggerfoot was quite basic and non-adjustable, although it was comfortable to the feel. The trigger releases were well weighted and smooth in operation. I had no problems with 'freezing' on the trigger, which can sometimes happen when using unfamiliar guns. This indicated that the trigger adjustments for release were perfect!

The stock and fore-end

The stock and fore-end were of standard Sporter design and configuration. The foreend had a Schnabel tulip at the head and was well covered with chequering to afford a comfortable and firm grip. The chequering was quite precise at around 18 lines per inch and was obviously laser-cut by automated CNC machines. Inletting of the foreend latch was just as precisely completed as other inletting about the gun. Design of the fore-end latch was typical of Browning, with the same mechanics as their more expensive Citori guns.

The stock on the Citori Sporter had a factory-fitted recoil pad, which I will reiterate, delighted me to no end! I hope we have seen the end of plastic buttplates and Browning can now focus on fitting recoil pads to its guns, especially its Sporting Clays guns. Correct gun mount is essential and I have found over the past 30 years as a gun writer that a rubber recoil pad is essential, particularly for overhead shots where the gun is held almost vertically. The recoil from the first barrel used to dismount the guns fitted with the older plastic buttplates, but thankfully, this is no longer a concern. I have also found that the expense of having a stockmaker or gunsmith fit an aftermarket pad is one that is easily absorbed by the manufacturer, rather than the individual shooter getting left with a \$125-\$200 bill after you have acquired the gun.

Design of the stock was excellent. The dimensions of length of pull, drop at heel and drop at comb are all included in the accompanying Specifications table. I was very impressed with the newly designed pistol grip, which was a far cry from the semi-pistol grip found on earlier models, while the palmswell (for a right-handed shooter) was another pleasant surprise. The revamped design of the pistol grip with

palmswell is certainly a winner.

In the field

I took the Citori Sporter to my local gun club on Phillip Island for a couple of rounds of Sporting Clays and found it to be excellent. I fitted the half and three-quarter chokes (due to the differences in constriction of bore compared to chokes) and found that my scores continued to improve as I became more familiar with the gun, eventually shooting a 20/25 on my final round.

The balance of the gun was excellent. Its weight was more evenly distributed than my regular Browning GTS. This is a huge improvement, as my Browning GTS, more suited to game and target shooting, sold for around \$3700 when originally released, compared to around \$1900 for the Citori Sporter on test. I am almost tempted to sell one for the other, as I was so impressed with the new model!

The inclusion of interchangeable Invector Plus chokes is also a bonus and provides greater versatility. As mentioned earlier, the improved cylinder choke measured 0.001" of constriction, which equates to almost cylinder; the modified choke measured 0.009", which equates more to improved cylinder; and the improved modified choke measured 0.017", which equates to a light

modified choke. By installing the modified and improved modified choke, I was actually shooting quarter and half choke, which suited the ground well and even distant targets were evenly broken using the Winchester 28g Sporting loads supplied for testing with the gun.

One of the most noticeable features of the Citori Sporter was the huge reduction in recoil, which I am attributing to the lengthened forcing cones. As well as the supplied Winchester 28g loads, I also used some Winchester 325 Trap 32g loads and some heavier reloads. The gun handled the recoil exceptionally well, with the recoil on the 28g loads barely perceivable and the heavier loads well tamed.

Summary

Overall, I found the new Browning Citori Sporter to be well made. Specifically prepared for the needs of the Sporting

The walnut stock wood looked great for an entry-model gun, while the matte polyvrethane finish protects the woodwork. Chequering was faultlessly completed at around 18 lines per inch and the full pistol grip was a winner.

Clays shooter, it represented excellent value for money as an entry-level gun from Browning. There were three choke tubes supplied with the gun, along with a wrench, extensive instruction book and warranty card from Winchester all packed in an ABS case.

Whether it is a strengthening Australian dollar or better pricing from Browning, the Australian distributors, Winchester Australia, certainly appear to have a winner in the Citori Sporter. At around \$1895 and with a 12-month warranty from Winchester Australia, the review gun is exceptionally well priced and I believe there is no better value in a such a quality shotgun.



MYTHS ABOUT HAPPINESS

In the last article, I explored the concept of happiness and basically reviewed the opening chapter of Russ Harris' *The Happiness Trap: Stop Struggling, Start Living.*

Happiness could be defined as either a sense of pleasure, gladness or gratification, or living a rich, full and meaningful life. Both of these definitions presuppose that we are enjoying our life at the moment: that it is the present or the "here and now" that is important. Over the years I have talked often about the past, present and the future as being important in improving performance: the same goes for everyday living and happiness. Briefly, if we focus on the past we make judgements about our previous performances and/or judgements about ourselves based on those performances. If we focus on the future, we develop anxieties and worries about what might happen. Both these judgements and worries get in the way of our staying focused on the present.

How do we set the Happiness Trap? Popular culture doesn't help. In fairy tales and movies: "... they lived happily ever after." Feel good endings, where love conquers all, good triumphs over evil and the hero wins reinforce a romantic notion of how life should be: all joy, fun, peace, contentment, and everlasting happiness. But is this everyone's experience of what life is really like?

What are the four myths that make up The Happiness Trap. According to Harris, they are:

Myth 1: Happiness is a natural state for all human beings.

If we believe this myth, we run the risk of thinking that everyone else is happy all the time. But look at the statistics: one in ten will attempt suicide, one in five will suffer from depression, and others will suffer from significant psychiatric disorders. But even if you don't have a psychiatric illness there are still misery causing problems such as loneliness, divorce, domestic violence, social isolation, bullying, prejudice, low selfesteem, anger, grief, lack of meaning or purpose in life, that still makes us feel unhappy. Life is full of peaks and troughs and most of us move up and down regularly: what makes us happy is that pleasurable experience that we are enjoying at the moment.

Myth 2: If you're not happy, you're defective.

This logically follows from Myth 1, that is, we in the west, believe that mental illness is abnormal. Your unhappiness is therefore seen as a weakness or illness. The label: being depressed, or anxious, doesn't really help because in describing the symptoms it presupposes that the symptoms are 'You', rather than just describing how you are behaving. As a therapist, 1 often have clients who come to therapy due to grief. When a love one dies, we can be confronted by feelings, thoughts and reactions that we have not experienced before: anger, depression, denial, etc. What clients find interesting is that what they are going through is normal. For them these thoughts and feeling are out of left field and that when they learn they are normal, you can see a great weight lift from their shoulders.

Myth 3: To create a better life, we must get rid of negative feelings.

Living in our feel good society we are constantly being told that to find happiness we must eliminate negative feelings and accumulate positive ones to put in their place. It makes sense because who wants to be unhappy and have negative thoughts. The irony is that what we long for often brings with it both pleasant and unpleasant feelings. When we

Myth 4: You should be able to control what you think and feel.

If only life was this easy. We believe that we have ability to control what we think, where in fact we have very little control over our thoughts. We do have control over the way we act and behave. Most self-help programs, according to Harris, subscribe to this myth. That is, we are told to identify negative or inappropriate thoughts and replace them with positive or appropriate ones. The argument here is that if we replace the negative and unhelpful with the positive and helpful, then we find happiness. If this were true, I would be out of a job. As a shooter, try to change your thinking from negative thoughts to positive ones: and you will still miss. This is because thinking is much more than either good or bad. It involves tense: past, present and future, as well as internalising the thoughts as beliefs: about our ability, about our self and about our worth. The other factor affecting our ability to remove negative thoughts is the level of stress: the more distressed we become the harder it is to get rid of the negative thoughts. If you are upset, angry, annoyed, scared, etc it will be even harder to get rid of these thoughts. Because this belief is widely believed, it is easy for us to feel inadequate if our attempts to control our thoughts and feelings fail.

These four myths together with thousands of years of evolution have established the framework for the happiness trap. According to Harris, these myths and evolution set us up for a struggle that we can never win: the struggle against our own human nature.

As humans we have an enormous advantage over the other animals because of our ability to plan, analyse problems, share knowledge, learn from past experiences and conceptualise the future. Normally we can control the things that happen to us in our external world: if we are confronted by danger, we avoid it or deal with it. In our internal world, those dealing with memories, thoughts, emotions, urges, etc, we are unable to control, remove or avoid those things that are unpleasant.

As an experiment, to show our inability to control thoughts, spend a minute thinking about a camel. Picture a camel in your mind, the size, smell, feel, the look of the camel. Now forget about the camel. For one minute don't think about a camel.

How did you do? It is hard to stop thinking about the camel.

Try one more experiment: stare at the shape below and see if you can stop thinking for 60 seconds. For one minutes, stop thinking about anything, do not let any thoughts whatsoever enter your mind, especially any thoughts about this shape.

Hopefully, your now getting the point that thoughts, feelings, physical sensations, and memories are hard to control. It is not that you have no control, it is just that you have a lot less than you thought.

Rather then try to control thoughts and feelings you should enjoy the experience. Focus on the here and now, what is happening to you at the present moment. It is the enjoyment of the experience, what is happening to you now that is the essence of being happy.



Withdrawing from an event should (if possible) be done giving 48 hours notice in writing (if possible) prior to the event or by ringing the National Office and leaving a message after hours.
- 5. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/75 targets/50 pairs. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets or pairs. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET may be incurred.
- 6. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at a designated trap at a time suitable to management
- 7. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 8. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
- 9. All competitors will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons'designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET will be incurred in the event concerned.
- 10. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised **FIVE (5) TARGETS**.
- 11. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- 12. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 13. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
- 14. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall chose in which team they will be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
- 15. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade and section prize.
- 16. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
- 17. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
- 18. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 19. All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Trap Championships.
- 20. Payment of the nomination fee only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not be eligible to any refund.





There are many shooters involved in the sport today who are there solely because 'Poppa' George encouraged, supported and coached them, and as an individual would be easily recognised as one of the most significant contributors to the advancement of clay target shooting in Queensland. Most importantly George always gave from the heart and those who benefited from his advice were fortunate to experience this special brand of generosity.

The back of George's car was always a gathering point at club shoots, dispensing guns, ammo, advice and conviviality. There was nothing that George didn't know about firearms and it pleased him to be able to share his knowledge with others. As a competitor George could be unbeatable and has an impressive list of achievements to his name.

George won a number of Queensland State titles during his shooting career, including the State Handicap event in Brisbane, the State Double Rise championship in Toowoomba in 1995 and the coveted State Double Barrel title in Townsville in 2000 which he won with a score of 225/225. George was also a member of the Queensland Open Trap team in 2000, and the Mackintosh team in 2001.

In a change of discipline and to prove to himself that he could do it, George not only earned a place in the Queensland Open Skeet team in 2008, but qualified as team captain with a top score of 199/200 shooting the carnival gun down! He rounded out the competition by taking the title of Queensland Skeet Champion 2008.

To those who knew him George was larger than life. A warm-hearted, sensitive and loyal friend, his generosity was second to none. George could not abide meanness or intolerance in others and in his compassionate way felt that people should simply be kinder to each other - a lesson we could all learn from George. An honest, genuinely caring man we will miss George's unique wisdom, his sense of humour, his companionship and his huge capacity for understanding. His loss will

be profoundly felt throughout the shooting community.

Along with Mirna and their children, George leaves his brother Nadim and his wife Gretta and family, and his loving mother Nellie. A successful businessman, George also gave selflessly to his church and his community. A big man with an even bigger heart, George leaves big shoes to fill in the shooting world. It will be hard to imagine our lives without him.

NSW Members and Dealers

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

IT'S YOUR CALL by Bill McCarthy

You are the appointed Referee for a 30 target event which is to be shot over three traps. Eg. 10 targets on trap 1, 10 targets on trap 2 and 10 targets on trap 3.

This is the second event of the day for each shooter, so no eye opener is involved.

No 3 shooter prepares for his first shot and has an apparent malfunction. You examine his gun and determine that the safety catch was on. You quite correctly rule "**No Target**" under **Rule 1.06(viii)**.

You complete that set of 10 targets and move to the next two traps in turn to complete the full 30 targets. However, No 3 shooter has repeated his indiscretion in that at each of the two traps he subsequently visited, you find that his safety catch had been applied for the first of his shots at each of the next two traps.

What do you rule in each case?

event, the rule is quite clear as it is printed.

It's Your Call

If you ruled "No target" on each occasion you would be quite correct. Rule 1.06(viii) says that "No target shall be allowed for the first target of any visit to a trap if a safety catch is engaged. While many may argue that the intent of this rule is to apply to only the start of the

FINED FOR SUNDAY GUN CLUB SHOOT

Police evidence was given that following a complaint by the Chief Secretary's Department, officers visited the Gun Club, where a clay pigeon shoot was being held.

The charges were a result of their investigations.

Jorgensen told the court he considered he had not committed an offence as one could shoot at gun clubs close to Melbourne on any Sunday without police interference.

Champion Marksman Downs Mad Bull With One Shot

Champion shot and well-known game hunter, Mr R. Jorgensen, claimed another bull's-eye at 5 a.m. yesterday morning – he killed a mad bull wih a single shot at 50 yards at Clifton Springs.

The bull, which had been running wild around the Portartlington-Drysdale-Clifton Springs district for seven days, knocking down fences and chasing people, had over 20 bullets in its skull and hide.

Last Sunday the bull chased a man up a tree and the man fired several .22 bullets at it, but the bullets only went a quarter of an inch into the animal's thick skull.

Aggravated

Mr Jorgensen thinks that those bullets, and others found in his hide, aggravated the animal even more.

At about 4.30 a.m. yesterday morning a local farmer and another man called on Mr Jorgensen's Portarlington home and asked him to assist them in tracking and killing the wild bull.

Hunters Out

Touring the district in a truck, the hunters found the animal about a quarter of a mile from the Clifton Springs Hotel.

Before Mr Jorgensen could get a bead on the animal with his specially imported 12-bore shot-gun – which fires slugs, capable of killing an elephant – the wild beast knocked down two fences.

50 Yards

Then from 50 yards Mr Jorgensen shot the bull through the eye, killing it instantly.

Mr Jorgensen said afterwards: "The bull had about 20 .22 and .44 bullets in its skull and several more in its hide.

Winch Used

"I doubt whether those bullets really hurt him, but they certainly must have aggravated the animal.

"After I had shot it, we used a winch to put the body into the back of the truck.

"It was a massive animal, and it did a lot of damage around the district – it could have even killed someone."

(1961) VALUABLE GUN AND DANGEROUS CARTRIDGES STOLEN

A well-planned theft has robbed one of Australia's leading shooters of his prize-winning shotgun and hundreds of valuable and unique cartridges... and he has appealed to the thieves to return his invaluable shotgun.

The champion shot, Mr R. Jorgensen of Portarlington, said that he was not so much concerned about the cartridges – although some of them were museum pieces – but the shotgun valued at about £150, could not be replaced.

The shooting equipment was stolen from his house and storeroom at Portarlington between May 3 and 6, but the theft was not discovered until 48 hours ago when Mr Jorgensen returned from a rabbittrapping trip.

Detective John Barrow, who is in charge of the investigations, said that the thieves got away with more than 3000 cartridges and the shotgun.

"They stole only the cartridges and gun, leaving behind valuable trophies and other articles which were in the house," he said.

Knew What They Wanted

Detective Barrow said that the theft looked like a well-planned job, the thieves knowing exactly what they wanted.

The properly was valued in all at about £300.

Mr Jorgensen said that his gun,

a Browning repeater, was altered to his own specifications and that it had won him hundreds of prizes.

"There is not another gun like it in the world", he said.

Dangerous

Some of the cartridges which were stolen, were rare and highly dangerous, including big game cartidges and Boer War relics which were first used for experiments.

"Some are collectors' items", Detective Barrow added.

All gun dealers, pawn shops and gun clubs have been warned to be on the lookout for the stolen property and any information regarding the equipment should be forwarded to Detective Barrow, Geelong C.I.B.
