

## National President's Notes

The ACTA Board met recently and considered numerous items. Extra support for the World DTL team members was approved in light of the current cost of travel to England due to the Olympics. The Juniors received an extra \$600 each thanks to funds provided as part of the Perazzi sponsorship package, and other Team members have received an extra \$600 as part of the Casella Wines Overseas Team Sponsorship package. We thank Perazzi and Casella Wines for their ongoing and valued support. The balance of funding, being \$1400 per

team member, is now being paid upon the Teams return once all requirements of the Team agreement are met. I feel sure that this team intends to represent Australia both on and off the tracks to the best of their abilities and the ACTA is endeavoring to ensure this is the case.

The ACTA is hosting a meeting of Firearms Industry members to discuss ways of improving the promotion of our sport. It is hoped that their joint experience and knowledge may be able to provide us with some answers to questions such as attracting new members, retention of existing members and better ways to provide service to our membership. All ideas will be on the table.

The ACTA will be in attendance at the Sydney Shot Expo over the weekend of the 16th and 17th of June. The display will include the Dry Fire equipment, promotional videos, flyers etc and will be manned by members of the Marconi Club Sydney.

The ACTA has engaged a consultant to prepare the shotgun specific module for the new Coaching program. The consultant has previously prepared these on behalf of some other Australian International Shooting limited (AISL) affiliates.

A decision has been made to recommend to the Executive that the co-opted position on the Board for a person with financial expertise be changed to a person with a background in Marketing and Promotion (M & P). Despite numerous requests in the CTSN we have not been able to fill the position for a person with finance expertise and it was thought that in view of the profits over the last two years, and the current expertise in the office, we seem to be able to manage our finances effectively. However we have not set any records in either attracting new members nor in retention of existing members. Following executive approval the Board would then comprise the President, four elected executive members, one co-opt with Legal and one co-opt with M & P expertise.

AISL held an Extraordinary General meeting (EGM), on Saturday the 12th of May. Two notices of motion were adopted with ACTA support. The elections saw two new Board members appointed, Allan Smith, a well known Rifle shooter and, Bruce Scott, former Commonwealth Games Gold medallist. Two other Board members, who were elected in November at the Annual General Meeting are Russell Mark, Gold medal trap shooter and Catherine Fettell, former President of Pistol Australia. Catherine was elected president of AISL at the EGM. The result is that since early November we have a complete new Board (except for the shooters Rep) and a new President. The ACTA supported these changes because we wished for change within the organization in four key areas, and had to date had limited success at achieving this.

The areas we are trying to drive change in are:

- Team selection to be simplified, more transparent and more objective.
- AISL coaching To be better administered and provision of more access to AISL coaches by the member bodies.
- AISL competition AISL run Australia Cups are not to "compete" against our State title events, but are to compliment them or be shot in conjunction whenever possible.
- Consultation The ACTA has supported a move for "informal" gatherings of AISL member bodies with Board members to thrash out common problems perceived by the member bodies.

Basically I suppose recent happenings display a wish by the member bodies to take some control of what is after all, their sport at the highest levels, and for our part the ACTA make no apologies for this.

The ACTA take the matter of firearms safety very seriously. There has been many instances of late of a flagrant breach of the rules being the closing and pointing of firearms at other than the layout areas. The attendance of dealers at more events providing gunfit services is of course permissible in their controlled trading area under their control and where no ammunition is

present. However the closing or pointing of firearms outside the layout and traders area is strictly forbidden for obvious reasons. The other issue with this dangerous practice is that of public perception. Many grounds border public areas such as roads and a passerby or for that matter a visitor on the grounds who perceives that a closed firearm is pointing in his direction could quite easily make a complaint which could have dire consequences for our sport.

Therefore all be warned that this practice will not be tolerated and instances will be dealt with in accordance with the rules. You may be lucky and get a warning, but you also risk suspension.

We wish our Olympians and our World DTL shooters all the best in their forthcoming competitions.

## 2012 Southern Cross SKEET CARNIVAL

This carnival is to commemorate the loss of the Lady Southern Cross. The world's greatest aviator Sir Charles Kingsford Smith and co pilot John Thompson "Tommy" Pethybridge lost on 8th November 1935 off Aye Island in the Gulf of Martaban, Myanmar formally known as Burma. The Lady Southern Cross was a Lockheed Altair 8D Special 10 years ahead of its time and was built to Kingsford Smith's specifications.

Our best shoot in our short 5 year history, shooter numbers, weather, and targets. Weather was perfect, no wind and 23 degrees, targets were perfect thanks to Rodney Kneipp, David O'Sullivan and Julie Freeman who remeasured our skeet layouts, moved concrete pads and painted to their correct locations, moved the crossing point, boundary marks until all targets were flighting to regulation standards, and as the score board reflected with so many high scores shot, 50/50s 49/50s 48/50s.

I am passionate about Skeet and will do anything to promote and support this sport. It is important that we all plan ahead so I would like to make a suggestion that we all please look at carnival dates of other clubs so not to clash with other Skeet Carnivals and divide our limited and dedicated Skeet Shooters, just because you are holding a zone carnival does not necessarily give you priority. ## **National Development Camp**



Tuesday, April 10, was the start of the 2012 National Development Camp. All participants arrived just after lunch and were presented with their shirts. The head coach David Coleman gave them a short talk about what the camp was going to include in the coming days and what was expected of them.

A member and qualified sports psychologist, Michael Kruger-Davis gave the juniors a two hour talk on preparation and readiness to shoot, which got the camp off to a good start. With all the juniors keen to get started, we headed off to the pattern plate.

The pattern plate is used to see where all the guns were shooting and then check out gun fit and mount. Then it was off to ground five where everyone shot their first 25 targets.

One important training tool used at the camp is the use of video, which shows the juniors exactly how they approach each target. The coaches then show the juniors and instruct each of them how to improve their stance, hand and eye coordination, reaction and many other aspects of shooting. With this training tool the juniors were able to see and put into practice this knowledge which led to the improvement in the number of targets shot.

By the third day the juniors had now shot at 200 targets and their scores had improved from their first 100 targets.

The last day at camp the juniors wanted to shoot Double Rise. They shot 50 pair, and overall scores were good. We concluded after lunch with an open discussion outlining each participants acheivements.

The juniors enjoyed themselves and received information and new skills that they will be able to put into practice at each and every shoot they attend with more confidence.

A big thank you to the ACTA for making these camps possible and to the coaches and parents for their support.

Looking forward to the National Development Camp in July.

# 75th Mackintosh Reunion Dinner

On Saturday the 31st of March this year, during the Trap Nationals, the much anticipated first ever Mackintosh reunion was held. The venue was the Gumly Hall conveniently located about two kilometres east of the National Ground. Registration of guests and predinner drinks started around 7.00pm with the National Vice-President, Mr Ron Traill opened proceedings just after 7.30 by welcoming the 165 people in attendance and introducing the MC for the evening, our past Historian, Mr Mark McInnes.

Mark outlined the evening and then invited our National president, Mr Robert Nugent to address the guests. Robert then made a short speech regarding why he thought the whole Hall of Fame and Mackintosh Reunion concept was so important to the advancement of our sport and thanked Mark for his foresight and drive in establishing the Hall of Fame and organising the Mackintosh reunion. The first break was then taken for entrees.

Following this Mark introduced our acting Historian Mr Adrian Cousens who elaborated on the importance and prestige of the Mackintosh Team Shoot and the high regard in which gaining a place in it has been held over such a long period of time. He then assisted Mark in naming all those shooters who had participated in ten or more Mackintosh Teams and presented Silver commemorative badges to those who were present. The audience was

obviously impressed by the fact that 28 people had achieved this great feat and heartily applauded those who were able to come forward to receive their badges.

Mark then proceeded on to announce that during the history of the Mackintosh Team Shoot there were in fact four people who had made the team on twenty or more occasions and what a shame it was that none of those people could be in attendance. Newton Thomas and Sperry Marshall have both passed away and "Pud" Burgess and Doug Smith no longer attended the Nationals due to age and/or ill health.

However this disappointment was short lived when one of the highlights of the evening was unveiled. When Mark announced that just a few hours earlier that day another great shooter had reached this momentous milestone, he had the audience's undivided attention. So it was to a standing ovation that Roger Duthie came forward to be presented with the first ever Gold Mackintosh Achievement Badge. Whilst presenting the award Adrian stated what a shame it was that Roger was receiving this award on such short notice as he was sure that with more warning Roger would have "tidied his act up with a haircut".

Returning back after the main course, Mark announced that the Champion Mackintosh Team of all time had been a photo finish between 1969 and 1994, with the earlier team just taking the honours. All 30 members of that team were named and it was wonderful to see that even though 43 years had elapsed since the event, three of the original members of that great team were still able to attend. Ivan Halbert,

Tim Catling and Bill Stevens all came forward to receive their mementos and Ivan graciously responded on behalf of the team.

Following another break for dessert and coffee, Mark formally concluded

# Perth SIZZLES at Pre-Nats 500

On March 10-11, the West Australian Gun Club Inc. (WAGC) hosted the annual PreNats 500 DTL competition with in-excess of \$6,000 in prizes being offered. Solely sponsored by Neill McWhirter of Mining and Drilling Services, this is the fourth year that this event has taken place. WAGC is most grateful for Neill's support and the shooting fraternity thanks him for his generous sponsorship.

As many would know, Neill is an elite shooter who has won many championships and values the opportunity for those shooters attending the National DTL Championships to be competition hardened prior to arrival, in order to give them the best chance of national's success.

This year the numbers were slightly down on previous years (46 competitors), due mainly to the extreme weather conditions being experienced in Perth. Two days of 40+ degrees certainly deterred some from attending and tested the "metal" and concentration of those that battled the elements. Despite this, excellent scores were posted and "soot-balls" were frequent and many.

Event one was the 100 target DB championship and was split, shooting 50 targets first up over both days. After the first 50

targets, fourteen shooters could still shoot the 100 targets. By the morning of the second day only four (4) shooters managed to post a clean score, being Peter Pierre, Tony Burnard, Giovanni Quaranta and "man in form" Josh Fleay. Surprisingly, after only 17 targets Tony was pronounced the 100DB PreNats Champion from Josh, Giovanni, and Peter. Martin Perry took out A grade with 99, Chris Fitzgerald B grade with 98 and Justin Hale C grade with 91. Both Martin and Justin would feature heavily in all events over the weekend and both earned promotion to AA and B grade respectively.

Event 2 on the Saturday was the 100SB championship which again is not everyone favourite event. No shooter was clean after 50 targets but there were a number of 49's posted. Following the next bracket of 50 targets, Jim Hamilton stood

alone on 98/100 and was crowned the 2012 100SB PreNats Champion. In what could only described as stifling conditions, Jimmy held his concentration and shot the last 50 clean, a great shooting effort under trying conditions. There were a couple 97's by Josh Fleay and Wayne Kuser and 3 others on 96 who all went to shoot-off. Wayne took out 1st in AA, Josh 2nd and Lars Bager 3rd. Martin Perry again took out A grade with 92, Rocco Priolo took out B grade with a very respectable 93 and Justin Hale C grade with 85/100. A free BBQ cooked by chef's Giovanni and Rocco, concluded what was a difficult and testing day of shooting.

## **RULE REQUESTS**

Over recent times I have received many requests for a number of different rule interpretations. One I have had on numerous occasions is that of when downgrading occurs what should happen to the shooters handicap mark as these marks are tied to grades.

When a shooter is entitled to be downgraded, i.e. has shot three consecutive brackets of 200 targets at a lower grade percentage that shooter should not be automatically downgraded but asked if he wishes to be downgraded as downgrading is not compulsory. If he chooses to be downgraded his handicap will not automatically return to the minimum handicap for that grade but will remain on the highest handicap earned.

#### E.g.


1. A grade 19 metre shooter regraded to AA 21 metres (21 is not earned metres) and then returns to A grade will now be 19 metres as he has no earned metres above 19.

- 2. A grade 20 metre shooter regraded to AA 21 metres (21 is not earned metres) and then returns to A grade will now be 20 metres as he still has earned metres above the minimum for that grade.
- 3. A grade 19 metre shooter regraded to AA 21 metres and wins handicap event is now AA 21.5 metres and then returns to A grade will remain on 21.5 metres as these are earned metres above the minimum for that grade.

If the shooters current handicap card does not show his earned meterage the club official should ask the shooter what his earned meterage is and record it on his handicap card.

Should it be found that the shooter has claimed a wrong handicap mark he may be given a suspension for a period of up to three months. (Refer to Rule 2.01 (l)



# Psychological Skills for Shooting

### Generation gap: Understanding Gen Y

This month I want to continue with the generation gap focus and look at the difference between how Gen Y think compared to the rest of us (builders, boomers and even

gen X). To do this I want to explore what McQueen calls paradigm rifts: the established generational lens that we (builders, boomers and gen X) use compared to the Generation Y lens. There are nine areas of paradigm rifts

- The concept of truth. Our generational lens sees truth as absolute: black or white. The modernist (builders, boomers and gen X) mindset focuses on truth through knowledge. We need to be persuaded and convinced. For the modernist we will be told how we should behave, what we should believe, what we should say and how we should act.
  - For Gen Y truth is relative not absolute. In this post modernist way of thinking both world-view can be true. What we believe will depend on our upbringing, experiences, education, etc. This world-view allows for greater acceptance and tolerance of individual differences and questions the notion of absolute truth.
- 2. Respect. For the builders, boomers and even gen X, respect is bestowed on a person, position or an institution. Respect for authority, teachers, police, parents, elders, priests, etc, was given on the basis of their role. Through the Gen Y lens, according to McQueen, respect must be a two-way deal. McQueen gives an example of the signs on the beach at Manly. The council has a list of do's and don'ts. At the bottom of the notice is the sentence that says: We respect you, you respect us. Basically the council is saying: We respect your rights as a young person to have a good time. However we ask for your respect in return. Here is a list of ways by which you can show that respect.
- 3. *Patience*. To the older generations patience is a virtue. We understand delayed gratification. Before credit cards, people lay-buyed goods. We knew and were told that life wasn't meant to be easy, so we had to work hard and wait for the things we wanted.
  - We understood that career development took time and we were willing to work our way up the ladder and wait for opportunities. Through the Gen Y lens, patience isn't a virtue it is a waste of time. Patience is pointless, frustrating and unacceptable. Fast food, micro waves, pre-prepared meals are a indicator of Gen Y's expecting everything straight away. The other day at work a young Gen Y teacher was complaining that the computer was dreadfully slow. From boot up to when she could use was all of 35 seconds. For a group that wants everything immediately, what happens when life doesn't go the way they want. Gen Y's either believe that there must be something wrong with my goal, or something wrong with me. As well as believing that life should be easy, gen Y also believe that life should be exciting. The banal and mundane just doesn't cut it.
- 4. Communication. This is the easiest way to tell the generations apart. Boomers bought a mobile phone as a convenient tool: what if I break down and need help. Gen X's like the ease and convenience of SMS. But for Gen Y it's about the phone; the bling, the apps: it is a fashion accessory. For the older generation it is about function, but for the Gen Y's it is about form. This group wants to stay connected to each other: phone, SMS, Facebook, email, MSN, etc. This is the

- first group in history that can have 24 hour connection with each other. The have even invented a language: SMS speak. Gen Y's run the risk of the overarching potential for miscommunication, erosion of empathy, changes in physiology, sleep deprivation and shrinking vocabulary. There has also been a explosion of cyber-bullying and sexting; unfortunately the consequences of these activities are rarely thought through.
- 5. Affirmation. The older generations understand and are happy with intrinsic affirmation of a job well done. For this group when someone notices, or rewards, or encourages, it is icing on the cake. The same too with criticism, The older generations do not see constructive feedback as a personal attack but as an opportunity to learn and develop. Gen Y's on the other hand, crave external affirmation for their performance or effort. With a heavy reliance on external praise and feedback it is likely that Gen Y's will argue 'if no-one is going to notice, then why bother trying at all'. Gen Y's have a reputation for being narcissistic and when thing don't go their way they fall in a heap. This is an interesting fact given that they were raised in the era of self-esteem.
- 6. The future. For the older generations the future was a linear progression, especially when it came to careers. Get a good education, a safe, secure job or specialize in one job, or at least one industry and retire at 65. For the gen Y's a 'career' is one long resume-building process. For Gen Y's goal setting is really about being prepared. Rather than set a goal to go out on the weekend, they will wait until they get invites via SMS or Facebook and decide then.
- 7. Loyalty. For the older generations, loyalty was an inherent part of the job contract. Being loyal meant that you felt part of the 'family' or team and you held an allegiance to the firm. It is not surprising that for Gen Y this is not the same. Rather than a career, it is merely a job. The reason for this is likely to be because Gen Y have grown up in an era of unparalleled economic prosperity, or they have not had loyalty modelled to them or loyalty not longer seems necessary for career advancement.
- 8. Work Ethic. Builders, Boomers and Gen X saw staying with the one employer showed persistence, commitment and character. But today HR divisions are seeing Gen Y view experience as a curse. This is also leading to the casualization of the workforce: part-time instead of full-time jobs, casual instead of permanent, contracted instead of award. Gen Y's might appear 'lazy' because they only do what they are asked and nothing more. Why is this happening? Well, probably because they do not want the stroke or heart attack that they have seen members of the older generations have because they have put the job before lifestyle.
- 9. Learning. This is the final paradigm rift. In the past learning was about having a thirst for knowledge. Facts, figures, words, processes and outcomes were important. For Gen Y, learning is about getting a qualification. Cut out the fun stuff, the creative aspects, just teach them what they need to know to get qualified for a job. NAPLAN testing in schools today reinforce this notion.

If you are from the older generations, I hope this has been an insightful way of looking at the next generation. If you are one of Gen Y I hope this gives you some understanding as to why the older generations can find engaging with you difficult.

#### **CONDITIONS OF ENTRY**

#### NATIONAL SPORTING CLAYS CHAMPIONSHIPS

- 1. Proof of association membership must be shown. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded. Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
- 2. Squads of 5 shooters to shoot 100 targets in four rounds of 25.
- 3. The Organising Committee will decide the order of shooting.
- 4. Skeet or Trap targets will be thrown, as well as mini, midi battue, rockett rabbit or flash or any other sporting clay target approved by the Association. Target type for any stand will be at the discretion of the shoot official, but shall number five (5) in total.
- 5. Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
- 6. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 25 targets
- 7. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may be re-squadded towards the end of the event, but this is not guaranteed and non-participation is a possibility.
- 8. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 9. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
- 10. Any competitor will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfill their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score may incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET.
- 11. Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first round of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility may be penalised one target. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for they're failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.
- 12. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap may be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.
- 13. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- 14. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 15. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any section prize.
- 16. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
- 17. Nominations will be by pre-nomination, and only if nominations do not reach the maximum entry of 120 will nominations be taken on the day. Nomination if taken on the day of the event will incur a extra fee of \$25.00. Nominations will close daily at 10.00am.
- 18. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
- 19. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 20. Reduced Nominations: These shall apply to juniors and the second family members entering into the same event, they being wives and husbands. Shooters paying reduced noms are eligible for Open as well as section prizes.
- 21. All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Trap Championships.
- 22. Competitors to be eligible for A.C.T.A. team selection must be fully paid up members of the A.C.T.A. and Australian citizens prior to the competition.
- 23. Upon application to the ACTA office, refunds less a \$5.00 administration fee will be available. Refunds will not be available for competitors not complying with this condition of entry.
