National President's Notes

Your national president is still away on holidays and your Vice Presidents have put together this month's notes.

Well that time of year has come around again when plastic Santas are trotted out and kids start ordering presents. (We have already written our letters to Santa hoping to each get a nice new trap gun under the tree but we fear disappointment.) Clubs are now counting down to their Christmas shoots and we wish them all the very best in running happy and enjoyable events.

However it is not all joy as we need to remind all members that annual subscriptions are now due. Unfortunately ACTA has been obliged to increase the fees but has minimised the increase to roughly that of the current CPI. All categories except Junior and New Start have been increased by only \$2 for 2013. Juniors increase by \$1 to \$36 and New Start remain the same as in 2012.

The Club Coach package is now complete and has been approved by the Coaching committee. It has been forwarded to AISL and copies sent to all State Coaching Co-ordinators. The Chair of this committee, Executive Member Dave Howe, is now reviewing the package for the Competition Coach. We thank Dave and the Coaching Committee for their hard work in this matter.

We need to put to rest a rumour that the ACTA Rules and Purposes (constitution) has been changed because the version on the ACTA website includes some blank pages. While we don't fully understand the technical details, it appears that the blank pages are merely the consequence of converting a Word document into a PDF and certainly not because of any subterfuge in changing the constitution.

While on the subject of the constitution, the Victorian Government has recently amended their Associations Act. As the ACTA is incorporated in Victoria a briefing was sought from the Legal and Governance Committee on implications for ACTA. It appears that ACTA does not have to do anything unless we decide to amend the constitution for some reason. In that event we would need to do a major review to ensure compliance with the new Act. At this stage we can assure you that the Executive have no plans to enter such a process.

The Brisbane ISSF Nationals to be held from January 21st to January 26th have their pre-nominations closing on Friday January 4th 2013. One major change this year from other years is your nomination fee will be lower than in previous years but will not include any prize money. This now brings ISSF Nationals into line with Trap and Skeet Nationals where the shooter is only paying \$40 plus targets to enter the event and will be awarded sashes and medals plus any sponsors prize.

We are aware of certain discussion around the traps regarding possible changes to the ISSF rules and why ACTA is not adopting them for the January nationals. The problem is all in the timing. While some rule changes have been approved such as the random A, B & C schemes for double trap and lengthening the distance for skeet targets to 68m +/- 1m we won't know what the total package of changes will be until after the meeting of the ISSF Administrative Council on 24 November. Unfortunately for a range of reasons, we have to finalise programs, advertising etc months in advance of any of our nationals.

It is worth noting that through negotiations by ACTA with AISL that more state ISSF championships will be accredited by AISL for PQS purposes thus making more opportunities available to our elite shooters.

The good news from WA is that limited camping will be allowed at WA Gun Club grounds during the Trap Nationals. For details see the Stop Press on the next page.

On behalf of the ACTA Executive and the staff of the ACTA office we wish all members and their families a happy and safe Christmas and a wonderful New Year.

Executive Officer's Report



I have recently become aware of an increasing number of Clubs who are allowing shooters who are not members of the ACTA to shoot DTL or Skeet on Club layouts. As has previously advised insurance coverage in terms of Public Liability covers non shooting visitors, volunteers and shooting visitors who may attend up to three times to determine whether they are interested in Clay Target shooting and likely to join a club. The insurance coverage does not include social

members of a club who are not ACTA members, members of other Associations shooting DTL or Skeet, previous members who are not current members or other licence holders wishing to shoot practice or targets only. This does not prevent Clubs having these people shoot but the Club must ensure they have separate insurance coverage for these shooters or the Club may be liable for any claims.

In the last issue I mentioned the 2013 ISSF Nationals and that they would be shot under existing rules not the proposed changes due to come into effect on the 1st of January. This has resulted in a number of queries and complaints from shooters. The decision to use the existing rules was made by the ACTA Championships Committee and the International Shooting Committee. The decision was made for the following reasons:

The rule changes would not be approved until approximately the 24th of November and the hardware modifications would not be generally available until after this time.

The changes to finals format is not confirmed and recent trials have indicated timing problems with the proposed format.

Whilst some shooters may be practicing with modified equipment, most clubs do not have the modifications and this creates an unfair situation. As the criteria for PQS for selection to the Commonwealth Games has not been finalised yet, and no International event or Australia Cup will be shot before February, the fact that shooters will be shooting on the current rules will not impact on selection for National teams.

It must be remembered that the ACTA Nationals provide for all members of the Association who wish to compete and we try to ensure a level playing field.

The World Skeet Championships have been conducted and the ACTA supported a Team to the event. A report will be in the next magazine with the results of Australian shooters who made the trip as well as the team results.

Event Four was the 50 target, Commonwealth Double Barrel Championship, and the major sponsor for this event was Australian Sporting Arms/Bronze Wing. And proof that the selection of black targets by the committee was a good one was evident in the score needed to win, finally shot on the next morning by the last of these excellent shooters, and that was a 353/353. That shooter was Morwell Gun club member, Andrew Brady. Andrews's perfect score of 353 earned him the title of Overall Winner, and the Sash for proof, and also the Commonwealth engraved silver tray, donated jointly by the Tas-

The 50 target, Commonwealth Points Score Championship, was event five, and this needed a shoot off of 30 targets to finally decide an overall winner, and that shooter was Andrew Brady, shooting so well at this carnival, and in this points score event shooting a perfect 240/240 score to claim the Overall Winners Sash, and the Commonwealth engraved silver tray, donated by the Queensland Clay Target Association.

The Commonwealth Points Score Championship AA grade first place was collected by Terry Walls a Yarrawonga GC member and Terry shot a 237/240

MEMBERSHIP INITIATIVE

The ACTA executive has been investigating ways to help Clubs increase membership and to help boost the sport. Whilst membership has not fallen it has remained static. A number of initiatives are being looked at to help boost membership. The first initiative is outlined below.

It is proposed to offer an incentive to members to become pro-active in signing up new members.

The initiative is based on the policy of one year's free membership to a member who signs up two new members, that is, if a member introduces and signs up two new members of similar or higher levels, they will receive the next years membership free.

Some criteria are as follows:

This initiative is open to any current member who introduces two new members at their level or a higher level.

The form on the ACTA website must be completed and provided to the Club when renewing your membership. The form must be signed by the Club Secretary, include the names of the two new members and be sent to the ACTA office. If one of the new members joins a different club the form must indicate the club of both new members.

This incentive provides a direct benefit for members who are pro-active in building their Club and it will help to improve the sport.

TRADE PRACTICES ACT

The attention of advertisers is drawn to the Trade Practices Act 1974 and the provisions in the Act which apply to advertising. 

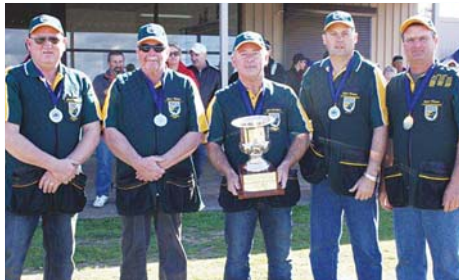

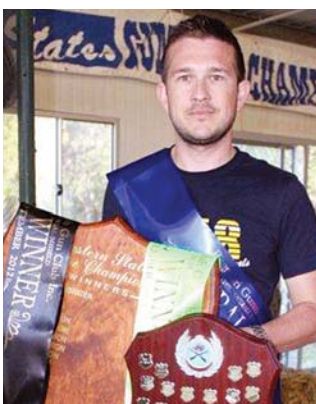

Blaser F3 Super Trap

Product Review by Matt Dwyer

It's interesting to watch the evolution, and ultimate success or failure, of new guns introduced into the marketplace. It's a competitive business to be in, and a large proportion of the "new" guns offered are modifications of old models or additions of minor changes to time proven designs. Sometimes it's a slightly modified stock design, a change of choke system but rarely is it a brand new design

with it before almost overtaking the gun itself. It was so much the case, and continues to be, that the only problem Mialls have had with the F3 is keeping supply up with demand. More on the reason why later.

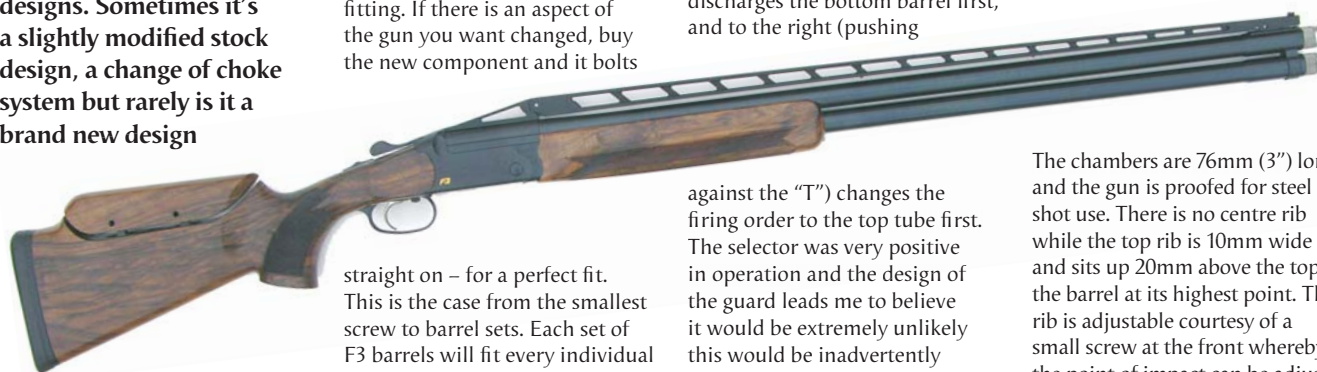
The Blaser engineers designed the F3 shotgun to be a completely modular gun offering TOTAL interchangeability. That is every part of every gun is interchangeable without the need for custom fitting. If there is an aspect of the gun you want changed, buy the new component and it bolts

distance between pistol grip and trigger blade. Blaser claim the F3 has the fastest lock time in the world, and the trigger pulls both broke like glass. Over an average of ten pulls they weighed 2.19kg (bottom) and 2.30kg (top) which is remarkable.

The gun comes with selectable barrels, changed courtesy of a switch in front of the trigger blade inside the trigger guard. To the left (pushing against the "B") discharges the bottom barrel first, and to the right (pushing

the test gun came with a black finish, with F3 embossed in gold on both sides. I like the look of the action. It's plain black, set off with the gold lettering and just reeks of sleek performance. No half baked machine made patterns or engraving, it is built for business.

The barrels on the gun are slightly overbored to 0.732" (18.6mm) with 5 degree tapered forcing cones some 45mm (1.75") long.



straight on – for a perfect fit. This is the case from the smallest screw to barrel sets. Each set of F3 barrels will fit every individual receiver. This is a demonstration of manufacturing savvy, and production quality of the highest order.

The Blaser F3 action is at the heart of the F3 revolution. The action is a low profile design with barrels pivoting on trunnions. This profile places the action close to the centreline of the stock to reduce felt recoil and increase shooter comfort, while placing the front hand closer to the centre of the barrels resulting in better "feel". The action is slightly longer in length than other makes, which produces less stress on the trunnions during firing. Internally, powerful coil springs operate the firing pins and associated sears all in a straight line, and inline hammers combine to produce a beautifully crisp and consistent set of mechanical triggers. The trigger has a unique "anti doubling system" to eliminate any possibility of a double discharge, and the trigger blade can be moved back or forward to adjust the

against the "T") changes the firing order to the top tube first. The selector was very positive in operation and the design of the guard leads me to believe it would be extremely unlikely this would be inadvertently changed. The gun is furnished with automatic ejectors, and there is innovation here too with the "Ejection Ball System" (EBS). Whereas other designs see the ejectors cocked on closing the barrels, the EBS does the cocking after the gun has been fired and the action is opened. This results in two things, a gun which is noticeably easier to close effort wise, and a gun which places zero stress on ejector springs during storage as once the trigger springs have been relieved (by dry firing with snap caps) the ejector springs remain disengaged. That's not it for the action though, for it is also designed with a removable faceplate on the breech facilitating easy replacement of any worn pins.

The chambers are 76mm (3") long and the gun is proofed for steel shot use. There is no centre rib while the top rib is 10mm wide and sits up 20mm above the top of the barrel at its highest point. The rib is adjustable courtesy of a small screw at the front whereby the point of impact can be adjusted to suit the shooters preference.

Sighting reference comes via a Hi Viz fibre optic front sight and silver centre bead. The anti glare pattern on the top rib is a departure from the "normal" lateral striations or cross hatching and is stippled on the outer edges of the rib while the centre has horizontal lines. Up the muzzle end the test gun came with Briley Spectrum extended chokes and a

altogether in an effort to keep pace with rival companies. I have kept a keen eye on doings of Blaser, and in particular the fate of its revolutionary F3 under and over shotgun. Australian distributor, Mialls Gunshop, sent me a Blaser F3 "Supertrap" to put through its paces and report my findings to you.

The design of the gun started in the late 1990's, however the F3 was introduced in 2004, and like Blaser's revolutionary switch barrelled rifles it is no less of a thoroughbred than its rifled brethren. It is the result of extensive research, development and significant investment into the tooling required to produce it. The F3 crashed its way into the marketplace with an entry that was by no means bashful. It hit the ground running, and an advertising campaign kept pace

Briley speed wrench is supplied. An interesting point here is F3 barrels of differing lengths can be ordered to the same weight so as not to upset the setup the shooter is used to. The manufacturing process utilises soft soldering to join the barrels. This process heats the barrels to only 220 degrees as opposed to silver soldering or copper brazing barrels which is the method of most other manufacturers and which takes 800 degrees to achieve. All sets of barrels are actually test fired during which the point of impact of both barrels is adjusted ensuring both patterns print at exactly the same place.

The stock on the test gun was European walnut and came with a 25mm (1") thick soft rubber kickeze recoil pad fitted and right hand palm swell. The length of pull is 370mm (14.6") and the comb is adjustable. The checkering was really well executed and very functional. The forend is a beaver-tail style and was quite hand filling. Fitment of the forend was, again, outstanding. No play whatsoever once in place and quite easy to remove or attach. Remember all forend's will attach to all barrels so this is quite astounding.

It is worth noting Mialls have a Blaser "try gun" where customers can be measured for fit using

the try gun, test fire it at their underground firing range then have the perfect stock fit on their own gun. This service extends to the customer returning after six months or so to have the fit double checked and adjusted if necessary due to changes in shooting style once they have become familiar with the gun and its handling.

The overall length of the gun was 1245mm (49"), and all up weight was 4.27kg (9.4lb) with the barrels weighing 1742gm. When it comes to the balance point, well there's more Blaser innovation here too. The F3 uses a "stock balancer" which is a method of perfectly adjusting the balance, and ultimately the handling of the gun. Blaser have made use of the stock retaining bolt for an additional purpose by threading the outside of it. The balance is simply adjusted by moving two separate weights fore or aft along this bolt to change the balance point! Once in the desired location they are locked in place by grub screws.

The F3 has a secondary balancing system, "barrel balancers", where weights can be added under forearm which assists with increasing weight and reducing recoil. The placement of these

weights mean the weight is closer to the hands rather than relying on increasing the weight of the barrel themselves. The placement also maintains the ability to manipulate the adjustable balancers inside the butt effectively.

The gun is so well balanced when adjusted to your personal preference its weight is hidden and the low profile action in combination with the overall weight, forcing cone design and slightly over bored barrels means it is a very comfortable gun to shoot from a recoil standpoint.

Now this gun is a competition gun pure and simple. It is designed and built in a configuration that is meant to give the best possible results shooting down the line. Patterning was one thing, and the gun performed most impressively during that process, but how did the F3 go in its domain? It was quite an easy gun to get used to, it was a comfortable gun to shoot with and it completely and emphatically destroyed down the line targets!

It's hard to make bold statements, because sooner or later you might just have to eat your words. Well, here is a bold statement – the Blaser F3 shotgun I tested is without doubt one of

the best shotguns I have every used. A number of tags have been bandied around regarding the Blaser F3 including "innovative", "state of the art" and "revolutionary". Those terms are befitting of this German gun, and are supported by the fact there are 8 different patents on the F3 action alone.

The build quality is outstanding and as I said earlier the only problem Mialls have encountered with the F3 is keeping supply up to demand. The reason for that is quite simple, for the Blaser F3 is THE most complete shotgun released into the marketplace for many decades. It is not a clone, modification or copy of anything else available but is a totally new gun engineered from the ground up. There have been no corners cut during any part of the F3 production, including quality control. The F3 comes in Game, Competition, Trap and Skeet versions and all of them will put the scores on the paper for you, all you have to do is your part. That is made much easier when you are confident you have state of the art equipment which is ultra reliable and built especially for busting clay targets, at any ground anywhere in the world.

A case for Change

Having attended the recent Trap Nationals and thoroughly enjoyed the weeks shooting, for which I thank and congratulate all those involved.

I would now like to comment on what I feel is a problem with our present system. Firstly however let me explain where I am coming from. Many years ago when the first D/B shotgun was made the reason was that two birds or game could be shot without reloading—NOT to fire both barrels at the same target.

This brings me to the question—Have we made the present targets TOO easy? – I believe the answer is YES we have.

When the angles were narrowed some years ago, it was intended that those narrowed targets be used only at Club level. This was referred to as the "Club Preferred Target" and the intention was that new shooters would find it easier to shoot more targets before progressing

on to the standard wider angles for Championship events. If the argument is we should be the same as other countries, then maybe we should delete D/B, as most other countries do not shot D/B events, however I would not support such a move, instead make D/B a greater challenge.

Having witnessed the D/B at the last two Nationals and the increase in S/B & Points Scores, I believe it is time to return to wider angles of at least 40 degrees each side of centre, for D/B at least. Most of our present traps would have to be modified, however this is not insurmountable.

If we do not address this problem of massive scores, then I believe we are in danger of shooting the sport of Trap Shooting to death. At present many shooters are moving away to other disciplines, particularly sporting, and the reason given to me is that trap shooting has become too expensive.

So now is the time to overhaul our rules, shoot more S/B & Pts. (most of the shooting world does this now) and perhaps on D/B needs to be changed.

Finally, on another subject, I was disappointed to see trophy winners appearing on the dais in THONGS. Rule 4.10j is clear enough for even those that do not care about our public image or their own.

I look forward to comment, on the above, from fellow shooters.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

NATIONAL ISSF DISCIPLINE CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.
Note: A fee of \$20 will be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.
2. Targets to be shot in brackets of 25 for Olympic Trap and ISSF Skeet with squads of 6 shooters where possible. In Double Trap targets to be shot in brackets of 25 Pair (50 targets) with squads of 6 shooters where possible.
3. Pre Nominations to be received by close of business (**Eastern Summer Time**) Friday 4th January 2013. There is a maximum of 126 competitors for ISSF Trap. If pre nominations exceed this number a standby list of 20 will be created and used in case of withdrawals. If any vacancies exist in the program, it will be on a "first in" basis at an additional cost of \$10.00 per event to enter. Nominations at the championships close at 10.00am the day prior to the event if a vacancy exists. Nominations have been reduced, as there is no prize money awarded.
4. Shooter will be squadded as per ISSF rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director. Once squadding for an event has been completed, a shooter shall not be entitled to a refund if they withdraw. Withdrawals after nominating and before squadding will be accepted in writing 48 hrs prior to the event.
5. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot the applicable event.
6. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will be penalised by the **LOSS OF THREE TARGETS**.
7. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
8. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each round. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest recorded.
9. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons designated to referee/score or line referee must fulfil their obligation to do so or have obtained the service of a suitable replacement that must be ready to take his place at the required time. In the event of the designated persons or their replacement not being ready to take their place at the required time, the person initially designated to fill the specific role may **INCUR A PENALTY AS PERSCRIBED UNDER INTERNATIONAL RULES**.
10. Setting and adjusting of traps is the sole responsibility of Shoot Management. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised up to **FIVE (5) TARGETS**.
11. All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
12. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
13. When team selection is involved, shooters are eligible for section nominated. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.
14. High Gun awards are determined for each section. To be eligible for the High Gun recognition, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events for each respective High Gun. Gold Australia High Gun badges are only awarded when there are 20 or more competitors in a section.
15. Women shooters are eligible for their section only. Junior shooters are eligible for OA or their section and grade. Except in Double Trap.
16. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behaviour of card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.
17. The ISSF Rules will be used to determine the OA placing in all events.
18. Juniors to be under the age of 21 in the year of competition.
19. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.
20. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors - Tournament Director to adjudicate. As per ISSF Rules (clothing).
21. All competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws of the state. (When held in W.A a shooter must obtain a permit to bring a firearm into that state).

Psychological Skills for Shooting

WHY DO PEOPLE CHEAT?

As I write this it is impossible to read a newspaper, watch TV news and current affairs programs or listen to the radio and not hear some discussion or commentary about Lance Armstrong and his alleged abuse with

performance enhancing drugs. Listeners and commentators alike are asking the question, "Why do sportsmen and women cheat?"

It is easy to answer the question in terms of the money, glory and fame, but what are the drives and motivations behind cheating.

Cheating refers to the immoral way of achieving a goal, which generally means breaking then rules or conventions of the game to gain an advantage over other competitors. In other words, cheating is getting a reward for ability by dishonest means. It is not that easy to cheat in shooting but it can involve claiming to see a chip or taking advantage of poor refereeing or a scoring error.

To answer why sportspeople cheat lies with the motivation behind why we participate in sport. There are three main theories underlying motivation in sport.

- Need Achievement Theory
- Attribution Theory
- Achievement Goal Theory

Need Achievement Theory is an interactional view that considers both personal and situational factors as important predictors of behaviour. Two components of this theory are:

1. Personality factors: the need to achieve success and/or to avoid failure.
2. Situational factors: Probability of success (this depends who you are competing against) and the incentive value of success (beating a novice or an expert) These factors lead to the development of high and low achievers. The most important contribution of need achievement theory is its task preference and performance predictions.

The basic principle of *attribution theory* as it applies to motivation is that a person's own perceptions or attributions for success or failure determine the amount of effort the person will expend on that activity in the future. There are four factors related to attribution theory that influence motivation in education: ability, task difficulty, effort, and luck. An important assumption of attribution theory is that people will interpret their environment in such a way as to maintain a positive self-image. That is, they

will attribute their successes or failures to factors that will enable them to feel as good as possible about themselves.

Achievement Goal theory suggests two major goal perspectives operate in an achievement context such as sport: task orientation and ego orientation. Task orientation (or process orientation) implies that one participates in an activity for its own intrinsic properties or value. The enjoyment of the game, the way we feel when we smoke the target, catch a great wave or sink a tricky putt. There is a great inner sense of satisfaction when we do well or achieve our best. The shooter gets satisfaction from the process, the enjoyment of shooting. Task orientation is what drives us to practise, visualise, concentrate and do any of the numerous physical, technical and mental tasks that enable us to perform well. Ego orientation (or outcome goal orientation) has participants striving to demonstrate superior ability compared to everyone else or avoiding the demonstration of incompetence or poor performance. The need for some athletes and coaches to use performance enhancing drugs would fit into this area as the athletes want to be the best at all costs or at least they do not want to look poor compared to others. Ego orientation occurs when we focus on comparing our performance against the personal standards of others. Ego orientation can get in the way of sportsmanship dimensions of "respect for social conventions", "respect for the rules and officials", "respect for one's full commitment" and "respect for our opponent".

Most people do not cheat. Most shooters will own up to a score that they feel is wrong. This is due to moral autonomy: that is, having an understanding of ethical behaviour and choosing to behave that way. Most of us behave ethically because we have been brought up that way: to be honest, play fair and have integrity. It has been interesting in this debate about doping in cycling, given that those accused have stated that they did not do it and that they would not do it. However, the reasons they give are due to losing the prestige or losing sponsorship money and goods, all aspects of ego orientation: being more concerned about the product rather than the process.

For those that do cheat: the end justifies the means in most cases, and once they have achieved the rewards they will be more likely to do it again. But what will they really achieve? Not much, just a hollow victory, and is the fear of being found out, shamed and maybe ridiculed, really worth it.

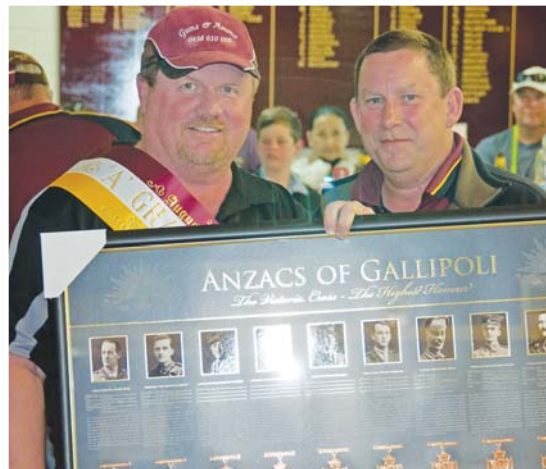
while Dean Pooley took the B grade prize with 38/50 and Angela Gordon finished 1st in C grade with 35/50.

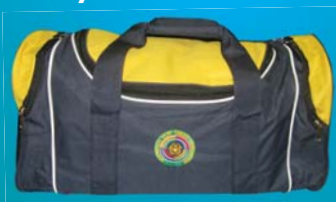

NSW Members and Dealers

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

(a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

Pre State Trap Carnival Shoot at Echuca

Sunday the 14th of October saw seven squads of shooters arrive at the Echuca Clay Target Club from a wide area of locations, to compete at what was mainly a program to assist shooters practice for the upcoming 2012 State Trap Carnival being held at the Echuca Club. And if it was possible to order the weather and conditions for the shoot, it would not have been possible to improve, with a clear sunny sky, virtually no wind, mild temperature, and a good contrast between the black targets and the clear sky; it virtually guaranteed good scores for the entire shoot.

Echuca's Craig Fitzgerald and Cohuna's Casey Fletcher both on the same score in event one, the 25 pair Double Rise Championship had to shoot a 5 pair decider, and that was won by Craig Fitzgerald ending up with a score of 59/60. Craig collected the Overall Winners Sash and the 1st in AA grade trophy for his persistently good shooting. With a 58/60 result Casey had to settle for the 2nd in AA grade trophy. A further testament to Craig Fitzgerald's performance on the day was that out of a total of 250 points for the entire shoot, Craig lost just two points, earning him the Overall High Gun Sash for scoring an excellent 248/250 result.

A 50 target Points Score Championship was next on the program, and Maryborough member Stewart Forbes demonstrated how it's done, shooting a perfect 150/150 score, and that earned him the Overall Winners Sash and the 1st in AA grade trophy, and after a 13 target shoot off for 2nd place in AA grade, Cohuna member Kelvin Simmonds claimed the trophy with a very good score of 188/189.

In event three, a 50 target Double Barrel Championship, ending up with two full squads of shooters with possible scores to shoot off, it finally ended up a battle between two Cohuna members, Ray Peatling and Kelvin Simmonds, and when both had hit their 250th target without a hint that either could possibly miss a target, and that was even after they had been moved back to the 21 metre mark, they decided to toss a coin to select the Overall Winner, and that turned out to be Kelvin Simmonds, scoring a 250/250 result, also taking out the 1st in AA grade place. Ray Peatling picked up the 2nd in AA grade trophy, registering the same 250/250 score.

A very smooth running shoot that eventually got through all 150 targets at a reasonably early time, even with some lengthy shoot off's, and with such good shooting conditions high scores did prevail on the day. Full results are as follows.

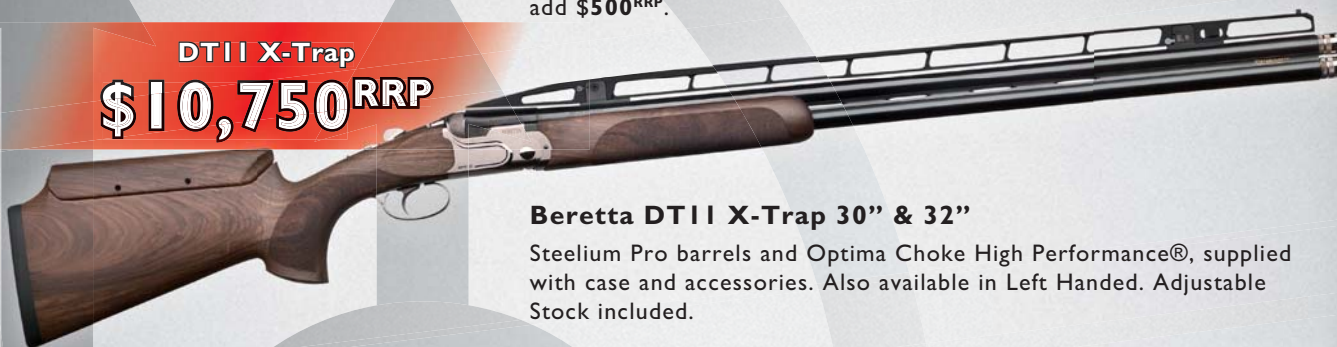
