National President's Notes

Hopefully all members have had a great Christmas with family and friends and are now looking forward to another year of competition. With the International Shooting Sports Federation (ISSF) Nationals in Brisbane in late January and the Trap Nationals in Perth in early April there is certainly plenty of high level competition to be had in the first few months of the year.

It is with sadness that I have to advise of the passing of Mr. Graeme Hull. Our thoughts must go to ACTA Patron Mrs. Kay Hull and family, whose husband and father, Graeme, passed away in December of last year. I represented the ACTA at the funeral along with the Executive Officer, Mr. Chris Gibson, and Mr. Peter Haley. The large attendance was testament to the level of respect the community hold for this family and the contribution they have made to society in this area.

I extend our heartfelt condolences to Kay and family.

The Association has been heavily committed to the development of the National Ground over the last ten years, with some further projects still on the drawing board. Most of the profit from this period has been re-invested in the grounds, with little being spent elsewhere. A request has been made by the Victorian Clay Target Association (VCTA) to assist with the purchase of the freehold property adjacent to the Echuca grounds. This is the venue for all VCTA State Trap titles. The extra property would secure the extra traps used for VCTA State titles and the associated safety area for the whole ground. I see this as a very worthy project and am pleased to report that the request was viewed favorably by the Executive, and an offer to loan VCTA \$100,000 at our current deposit rate for 5 years, secured by first mortgage over the property has been made by ACTA to VCTA.

To the best of my knowledge this is the first time the ACTA has taken a step like this, and we hope all can see the benefits of assisting with this purchase. A ground where one of our largest states (by membership numbers) regularly holds its State Championship needs to be permanently acquired and protected if at all possible. I commend the VCTA in taking the initiative in this matter and for being both prepared and financially able to fund the majority of the purchase price themselves.

The ACTA Boards newest member Alex Smith has been working on the ACTA presence in the Social Media arena. It is expected that we will have a presence on Twitter prior to the ISSF Nationals. Alex's expertise is in media and he intends to bring ACTA into the 21st Century, with the Association having a presence on most electronic media social sites as soon as possible

Your Association has a Member Protection Policy in place as required by law and of late we have had some enquiries in relation to this policy. The policy is shown on the ACTA website and most States now have some suitably qualified member Protection Officers. Complaints must be in writing and would then be investigated by an officer appointed by the ACTA for this purpose.

Once again I hope you are all looking forward to another years competition.

are aware of the pressures on prospective members and existing members from other pursuits. This includes other sports, family activities and social activities. One of the most important factors in encouraging members to re-sign is the feeling of being part of a group. This means encouraging and supporting new members to your Club. Remember we were all new to the sport once and helping the new member to learn more about the sport may well improve our retention as well as making it more enjoyable.

Members will notice that we have been able to place equipment reviews in the last few editions of the CTSN. This provides members with interesting articles to read as well as information on new equipment. The management of the Association is not promoting these specific items over other makes or brands but is trying to provide information on as wide a range of brands and styles to help members. It is very pleasing to find out that members have used this information to help them decide on new purchases. It is good for two reasons, firstly it makes it worthwhile to source the articles and secondly it helps the sport for industry to know that members read the magazine and use that information. If you buy a product and the magazine helped you make your decision please tell the supplier that it was the article in the CTSN which helped you make up your mind.

I have recently made some comments about insurance to provide a better understanding of the coverage for members and Clubs. A recent enquiry related to non-members crossing a Clubs grounds when not in use. The public Liability policy which is held, provides coverage for ACTA clubs on their registered grounds in the event of non-members entering on to the grounds when events are not occurring i.e. crossing the property after climbing a fence as well as visitors during club activities. It does not however include non-members shooting other than authorised visitors. Another scenario which has been raised is that of non ACTA members who may be shooting who cause injury or damage to ACTA members. An incident such as this could provide additional exposure to a club and the ACTA is currently investigating this situation with our Insurance Broker and will provide information to members and Clubs shortly. I am aware that some Clubs have taken additional insurance policies to cover these non ACTA members who shoot. A meeting in January will clarify this problem.

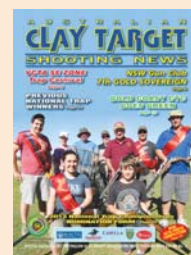

Three Southern Zone Championships

For the first time in the history of the Bega Gun Club, a shoot was held this year in November. This came about when our shooting colleagues from the Bega Rifle Club advised us that they no longer use the first Sunday in November for a shoot, freeing the date for our members.

The club celebrated with a full program, including three Southern Zone Championship events and the final round of the Fimac Engineering Handicap event. This annual event, shot over four rounds throughout the year, is one of our Club's feature events and regularly draws a crowd. Despite clashing with a major two day event in Canberra, five squads of shooters turned up for a very pleasant, if slightly windy day of competition. Much interest focussed on whether anyone could catch John Seide, winner last year and leader after three rounds.

Event One was the final 25 targets of the Fimac and another club veteran, Ray Kearns, showed the way, dropping only one target for a 24/25 and a win in the final round. Chris Rowlands and Geoff Mills went back for a further ten targets to decide second and third positions, with Chris collecting 33/35 for second from Geoff 32/35.

The final tally for the Fimac saw John Seide hold on to win again in 2012 by a one target margin. All members applauded the win and are looking to see if John can repeat the effort in 2013 to make it three for three.

The second event was the Southern Zone 25 target Double Barrel Continental Championship. Chris Rowlands showed his first event form was no fluke, taking the Championship with a 30/30 score. This left Morewell visitor, Robert Dinsdale and club President, Phil Body to sort out winner and runner up in AA Grade. With a final score of 33/35, Robert took the first place with Phil 32/35 in second.

A Grade was won by regular visitor, Peter Ewart, who scored a clean round 25/25, to be followed by Neville Teale in second, with a score of 30/32. B Grade featured two of our vets in the money. John Seide shot 24/25 to win from Ray Kearns 23/25. Certainly

winning 70/75 and Peter runner up with 69/75. In B Grade, Tony Grey shot 65/75 to win from John Seide 58/75. Dick McInnes continued to dominate C Grade for the day winning

with a score of 45/75 from Phillip Rumph 27/75.

Chris Rowlands celebrated his consistent effort all day, by taking out the High Gun with a score of 143/150. The shoot raffle had three draws for the day. Vice President Shane Platts shot twice for two meat trays and no cash and John Seide was also kind to the treasurer and took home a tray, all courtesy of our supporters Kydd's Bega Butchery.

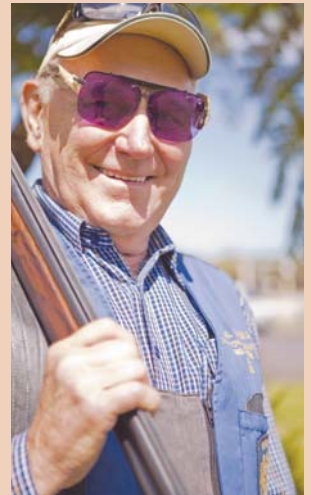
NSW Gun Club

Andrew Garvie wins Gold Sovereign

Well known field shooter Andrew Garvie from Singleton shot a 90/100 with a Grulla 216 SxS duck gun with double triggers to win The Stockade sponsored 7th Gold Sovereign at the NSW Gun Club on the 17th November. He was awarded a handsome gold sovereign, \$500 prize money and name on a perpetual trophy for winning the coveted event.

Eleven squads of shooters attended this year's Gold Sovereign, shot in overcast but fine weather. The event commenced with 50 sporting targets which included rabbits, teals, battues, caressers and skeet targets followed by 25 targets DTL off 15m and a final 25 targets continental off 18m.

Nick Xenon from NSWGC shot a solid 87/100 to win AA grade, Phil Craig from Bermagui a very creditable 89/100 to win A grade, Peter Romeo with a lovely 90 year old WW Greener from NSWGC on 83/100 to win B grade and passionate SxS competitor Allan Kentwell an excellent score of 86/100 to win C grade. The highest score by a NSWGC member was won by veteran Bob Clifton with an excellent 88/100.

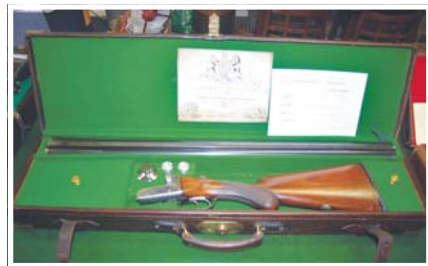

Gold Coast CTC goes green

We had groaned about our electricity bills at committee meetings for a few months before deciding we would have to get serious about an alternative.

For consecutive three month billing periods our account was in excess of \$1700, and with a low maintenance onsite caretaker we didn't think Kevy's all night discos and hot tub parties were responsible for the spike in the bills. While we could account for some of this additional power usage, with a full schedule of competition events, heavy corporate bookings and extra activities at the club, the charges still seemed excessive. We checked seals and monitored appliances, even updating our bar and kitchen refrigeration and replacing the old deep freeze. The electricity accounts seemed to level off at around \$1400 - \$1500 per quarter.

Being in the solar industry our Trap Captain Mike Swale had had the foresight to recommend submitting an application for a 15.0 Kw system for the club prior to the 9th July 2012 cut-off date. This allowed us to qualify for the maximum 44 cent feed in tariff before it was reduced to 8 cents through government regulation, and provided a 12 month period in which to install a system and still take advantage of the tariff at this rate.

On Mike's advice we decided to go for the largest possible system that our budget and roof space could support as the figures showed we would not only have the system paid for in a short period and would save an enormous amount on our bills, but also provided for a tidy investment for the club in the future.

We sought three quotations for the system we wanted and made the decision to proceed with the installation as soon as possible. We did seek funding through Jupiter's and the Gambling Fund and although

we were not successful with the initial application Mike's company Queensland State Solar came to the party by offering 'mate's rates' and ever so slightly delayed payment-after-installation terms. We offered to pay with bourbons but he was on to us and we failed miserably. Anyway the relaxed terms enabled us to go ahead without having to either wait for funding approval or run the bank account down.

Mike and the Queensland State Solar team allowed us to jump the job queue and the actual installation took only one and a half days with 66 panels going onto the clubhouse roof. There was no interruption to services and we were connected right away. We must have looked like a bunch of school kids standing around peering into the meter box and I never thought we would be so excited to watch the little silver thingy actually start to spin backwards! I think someone even said 'Ka-ching' which is what we were all thinking.

About four weeks later Energex replaced the old dial meters with the new poly phase smart meter and we were off and running, taking full advantage of the 44 cent feed in tariff.

Two weeks ago we received the first electricity bill since installing our solar system and we couldn't believe our eyes to see the Energex total: \$232 in credit. We also noted that the account did not quite cover the full three month period and also included our August Trap Carnival. This would represent quite a boost in power usage with additional events under lights, heavier kitchen usage and catering with dinner meals and entertainment, campers on site, increased practise sessions, etc. Our next account should show us even further in the black and our Treasurer can actually start looking forward to electricity bills now.

Having also installed a fifth trap layout during 2012 I admit to being a bit of a Nervous Nellie when it comes to supporting large ticket items, even though I realise the club and our members will see the returns. But qualifying for the 44 cent feed in tariff made the decision to install solar power a no brainer and there is every evidence the club will do very well out of our system in the future. Although this tariff rate no longer applies we would be happy to assist other clubs who may be considering taking this same option with any information.

Thank you to my innovative committee for recommending and supporting this move for our club. Thanks also to Mike Swale of course, who provided the expertise and did the actual work. During the first full day of the installation I didn't witness a single swear word, but then I wasn't there. And the great aerial photo was very kindly taken by my predecessor Shane Weeden. As an old school friend once said to me 'What's the use of having friends if you can't use 'em!'

At the Gold Coast Clay Target Club we will continue to strive to utilise environmentally friendly solutions where possible, and to keep our great sport and our club facilities as cost effective as possible for the enjoyment of all members and visitors.

Psychological Skills for Shooting



Michael Kruger-Davis PRE-SHOT ROUTINE

Several years ago I had the opportunity to sit with and interview Todd Bender. Todd is a household name in Europe and the US when it comes to shooting skeet. A great shot, world champion and teacher and coach, I

asked him what it was that allowed him to have the confidence to shoot so well and win so much.

His answer was: pre-shot routine. He then qualified this by also saying that for him his approach is to have a defined and ritualistic pre-shot routine, then execute the shot, and then use visualisation skills to relive the shot again so that he was satisfied with the result of the station.

At a Hunter Sports Academy coaching clinics and the Junior National Development Squad training camps, pre-shot routines have features as important skill that participants need to know and have well developed. The importance pre-shot routines can be seen at any club on any weekend. There will usually be a shooter somewhere who misses the first target out. It is likely that the shooter missed because he/she wasn't set up properly or just wasn't ready in their head. The other example is the shooter who is shooting beautifully and then just misses a target, for what appears to be no apparent reason. When asked later the shooter might say, "I put the gun up and although it didn't feel right, I called pull anyway."

What is a pre-shot routine you ask?

A pre shot routine is a series of technical and mental tasks that you do before each shot. These tasks are designed to set you up so that you hit the target. They have the further consequence of making you feel more confident, more composed and more competent. Remember the articles on mental toughness: composure, confidence and competence are all characteristics of mental toughness. Todd Bender was the epitome of mental toughness.

Golfers can and should use pre-shot routine just as shooters do. This also works for other sports such as bowls, ten-pin bowling, darts, athletics and many more.

What are the components of a pre-shot routine? Whilst pre-shot routines are easier to do in skeet, sporting and field and game, it can

and should be a component of trap shooting as well. The only difference with trap shooting is that you do not have any idea of the kill point, because the target direction is unknown.

- *Stance.* When you walk on to the pad, lane or cage. Where do you set your feet? Can you swing your body? You must be comfortable, relaxed but not too relaxed, upright
- *Think triggers!* I don't mean the triggers on your gun, but the triggers that make you aware of what you are about to do, make you alert, narrow your attention and focus. The trigger may be the call of the shooter before you or something else you have developed to bring you into focus.
- *Work out the hold and kill points.* Have in your mind the gun hold point, the target acquisition point, the kill point and the follow through.
- *Centreing.* If you are not sure what this is go back to some previous articles that looked at centreing. Basically it is breathing technique designed to help you relax and bring you into the present: the here and now. When you are in this stage, visualise seeing the target and shooting the target. Watch the target break in your mind's eye. (This is important because it tells your brain that you can do it and have already done it and self-doubt can be eliminated as a result).
- *Here and now.* Focus on the here and now. What can you hear, feel, smell, see, etc. let your senses keep you in touch with the present. Focus on your breathing.
- *Mount the gun.* Remain mindful of yourself, your position, the feel of the gun it's weight, etc.
- *Bring it together.* Bring these things together and call pull and smoke the target.
- *Relive the shot.* Before you leave the track or pad, watch yourself doing it all over again. This will reinforce positive and successful shooting within your brain.

This needs to be established and over learnt so that it is habitual and automatic.

Some other things to consider as part of managing the shot before you take it. Phil Coley, summer 2012 Edition of *Clay Shooting: Pre shot management* suggests the following:

Stand as you are about to shoot the target. Look at the target in terms of your positioning.

Be decisive as to where you will shoot the target: do not reconsider, stay decisive.

Be realistic as you approach your target. Some targets are easy, but think of them as a bank for your score. Shoot them just as decisive as the others, do not relax.

If you miss, let it go. Ignore the past. Focus on the present and when you shoot the next target focus on what you did right.

Develop a routine, then routinely follow it.

Train to compete, don't train to shoot. Competing lets you practice the mental skills in the heat of the competition.

Pay attention to detail. This leads to confidence and helps you focus and remain relaxed.

So next week, whether you are competing or practising, work through the process of setting up a pre-shot routine. Practise it and use it every time you address a target.

Beretta Silver Pigeon 1 Trap

Distributor: Beretta Australia Product Review by Matt Dwyer

Beretta Australia have release their Silver Pigeon 1 in a Trap version, which uses the proven design of the 686 action. The 686 is a boxlock under and over which uses a low profile design resulting in, amongst other things, better recoil management. As far as Beretta goes, this model is marketed at shooters wanting to

buy a good reliable gun without investing heavily into a sport which they may or may not maintain an interest in.

I chose not to use the words "budget" or "entry level" in this review, as this could be construed as the Silver Pigeon being of basic quality or features – which it is not.

The gun sent for review came with 760mm (30") barrels which weighed 1485gm. The Optima bores are 18.6mm (0.732") and the internal finish of the barrels was very good. The bores cleaned up quite easily after testing with wad residue removing easily with a bore snake. The barrels were fitted with flush fitting interchangeable Optima chokes and five came included with the gun in Cylinder, Improved Cylinder, Modified, Improved Modified and Full. The chokes are easily identified for constriction courtesy of end notches, printed lettering and also stars. They were easy to install or remove with the spanner supplied and they patterned well with good coverage across the pattern paper

at 36m (40yd) with both 24gm and 28gm loads. The gun features 76mm (3") chambers.

The top rib tapered from 10mm to 8mm and had only a white front bead for sighting reference. The top surface of the rib was checkered to assist with reduction of glare on bright sunny days. The centre rib was solid

for 460mm (18") from the muzzle, at which point there was no rib back to the monobloc. The section of barrels without the centre rib is hidden under the forend. There was a special inscription on the centre rib at the muzzles which reads "DTL Special Edition AUS". The barrels were blued to a pleasing deep finish.

The action itself has a durable silver nitride finish with considerable scroll engraving for ornamentation. The barrels pivot on replaceable trunnions, and the gun balanced about 12mm (1/2") in front of those trunnions. The ejectors were well timed and threw fired hulls well clear. The barrels are selectable via a sliding selector contained within the safety catch on the top tang. With one visible red dot the bottom barrel fires first, and with two dots showing the top tube fires first. There

is a small locking screw within this selector to prevent it being accidentally bumped – this is a great feature and this has been a problem when I have used some guns in the past. I am pleased this feature has been included. The sliding safety is non automatic which is a must

on a competition gun. The top lever is nicely proportioned and made opening of the barrels an easy enough task.

The trigger blade is gold plated and trigger pulls were measured over an average of ten pulls and averaged 2.39kg (5.26lb) for the bottom and 2.34kg (5.15lb) for the top. The triggers showed little sign of creep or binding and functioned reliably during testing.

The walnut used for the stock showed nice grain and was oil finished. Panels of checkering were present on the pistol grip which was of very useable dimensions and which had a very slight right hand palm swell. The checkering was well executed and had twin

borders, although the borders were superfluous as no over runs were evident within the pattern. The 250mm (10") long forend was a beavertail shape and was also of nice dimensions and well checkered. A solid

black rubber recoil pad, some 23mm thick was fitted and provided for comfortable shooting. The length of pull measured 378mm (14.9"), the

drop at the comb was 35mm (1.4") and at the toe was 45mm (1.8"). The overall length of the Silver Pigeon 1 Trap was 1213mm (47.75") and it weighed in at 3.64kg (8lb).

I ran a few different brands of cartridges through the gun over the pattern paper and then shot 100 DTL targets for practice. The gun performed well on the clays, and it didn't take long to adjust to it. It swings well, and is well balanced enough that

shooters shouldn't run the risk of fatigue during a day's competition.

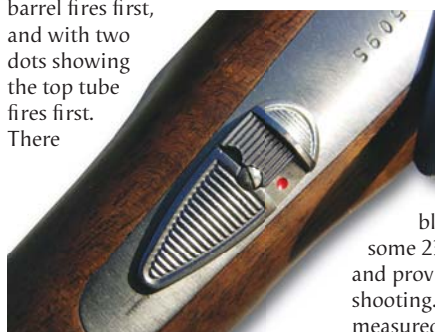
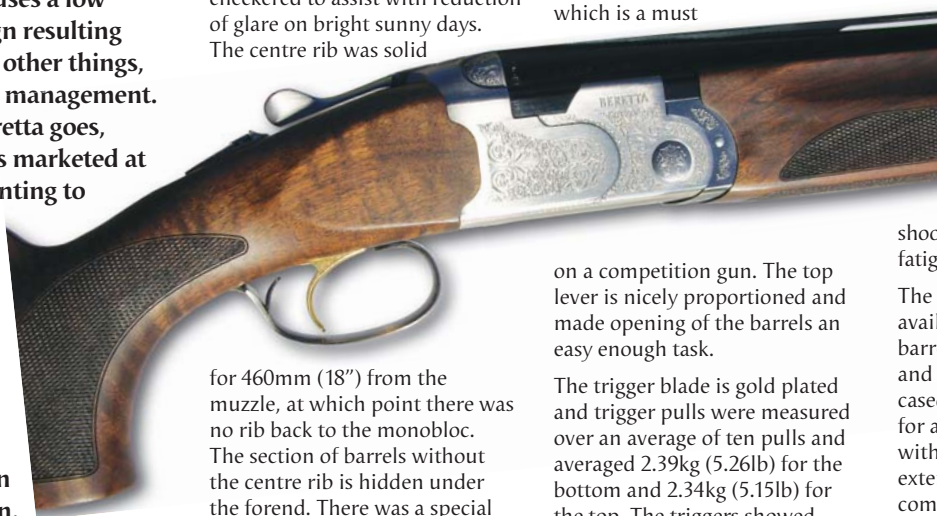
The Silver Pigeon 1 Trap is available with either 30" or 32" barrels and comes in both right and left handed versions. Fully cased with five chokes it retails for around \$2450. It also comes with a one year warranty which is extended to three years with the completion and submission of the warranty registration card.

This gun should be welcomed by shooters entering into the sport who want reliability without having to invest into the highest price bracket for a competition shotgun. Similarly, parents with

youngsters commencing their shooting career could do a lot worse than get them a Beretta such as this gun. It is not too precious that the stock can't be shortened to suit smaller people, and the Silver Pigeon 1 should provide a great competition gun without damaging mum or dad's wallet too badly.

At the end of the day it is backed by the best after sales service and warranty in the country so it comes with peace of mind as well.

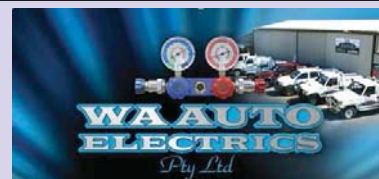

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY – NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. **If a vacancy exists in any events at the Championships a person must nominate for all events they wish to shoot at the nomination window in one visit. To be eligible to shoot in any event the nomination must be received before 10.00am on the day of the event.**
2. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.
Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
3. Squads of up to 6 to shoot 50 targets/75 targets in brackets of 25 targets or pairs, one visit only to the traps. National Handicap event to be 5 (five) person squads, 5 (five) targets per lane.
4. **Shooters will be Pre- squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director. Withdrawing from an event should (if possible) be done giving 48 hours notice in writing (if possible) prior to the event or by ringing the National Office and leaving a message after hours.**
5. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/75 targets/25 pairs. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets or pairs. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** may be incurred.
6. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at a designated trap at a time suitable to management
7. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
8. All shooters should sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
9. All competitors will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** will be incurred in the event concerned.
10. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised **FIVE (5) TARGETS**.
11. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
12. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
13. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
14. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall chose in which team they will be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
15. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize.
16. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
17. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
18. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
19. **All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Trap Championships.**
20. Payment of the nomination fee only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not be eligible to any refund.
21. Squadding details will be available on the ACTA website, ten (10) days prior to the event. If an email address is provided on your nomination form, you will receive notification via email.

Presidential Medal

Preamble

The NSW Clay Target Association President will be awarding medals for outstanding achievement in coaching, administration, or contribution to, the sport of clay target shooting.

The following is a guideline for the assessment of individual nominations for the award of Presidential Medals outlining both the process and assessment criteria.

Process

- A call will be made to all NSW clubs by advertisement in the *Clay Target Shooting News* January to March of each year.
- The nominations to be forwarded to the NSW State Secretary by the closing date stipulated in the advertisement. The letters shall be marked "CONFIDENTIAL" on the outside of the envelope and shall only be opened by the State Secretary.
- The State Secretary will treat the nominations as confidential and shall only release them to the NSWCTA President.
- The President will request advice from the Executive Committee on a confidential basis and will carefully consider such advice.
- Executive members will keep all details of the nominations and any relevant discussions confidential.
- The President shall make the final decision on the award of the Presidential Medal(s).
- The formal announcement and presentation of the medal(s) will occur during the Annual State Trap or Skeet Championships.

Criteria

- Outstanding contribution to the sport from Club to State level.
- Generally only one medal to be granted per year but the President may, if the situation is warranted, grant a maximum of two medals in a year.

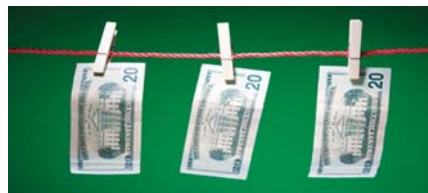

- (b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

- (a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.
