PRESIDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT 2012



It gives me great pleasure on behalf of the Executive, as the President of the Australian Clay Target Association (ACTA) to report on the Association affairs for the 12 month period ending the 31st December 2012.

Membership for the period has increased from 12521 in 2011 to 12774 in 2012. Those with keen eyes will notice that the figure quoted here for 2011 (12,521) is different to the figure reported in last year's report. The association database has not been updated since the early 2000's and has quite a few glitches. We feel confident that the revised figures quoted above are accurate.

It is hoped that the IT upgrade we are planning currently will improve the reliability of the figures presented. It has become obvious that if clubs do not ensure that all their members are registered with the ACTA there will be no significant

growth in membership and the continual risk of exposure to uninsured legal claims will continue.

The Executive has ensured the Association, its member clubs, and registered shooters remain insured as comprehensively and economically as possible. The brokerage firm Pollards continue to source our insurance from underwriters the Australis Group – Lloyds of London.

The association again traded well during the year showing a profit of \$347,381 up from \$298,767 last year. Reasonable profits have allowed continual development at the National Ground, supported its ongoing purchase and allowed the loan recently authorized to the VCTA to be funded. This profit included approximately \$60,000 of interest received on investments and I thank the staff for the excellent management of ACTA surplus funds.

The National grounds continue to develop with the second ablution block now completed and used for the first time at the NSWCTA Trap carnival. The grounds now boast over 60 powered sites and two new dump points for caravan toilet waste. Development of ISSF facilities on site and a Traders Hall are on the drawing board for the future. The ISSF facility is dependent on Government funding but the Traders Hall can be constructed from surpluses held with some support from interested traders.

The ACTA has hosted two meetings with Traders this year in an attempt to better understand their needs. Offers of support for a permanent trade display area came forth from the last of these meetings. Representation from the first traders meeting resulted in an ACTA delegation to NSW Weapons Branch, to glean a better understanding of their requirements for both the ACTA and Traders on our grounds. These meetings are critical if we are to develop a facility that serves the traders requirements, provide cover against inclement weather, provide a comfortable gathering and eating area and meet the security requirements of the NSW police.

During the period, National Championships were conducted in all disciplines. The ISSF Nationals were hosted for the first time by Newcastle and our thanks go to them for the effort they put into the new facility and during the event. Venues of this size in the ISSF disciplines are not built very often and it is good for the ACTA to have another venue to choose from. Total entries over the ten events were 328 but unfortunately records from 2011 are not currently available for comparison. Thanks must go to the volunteer ISSF accredited officials without whom this event, and for that matter the Australian International Shooting Limited (AISL) Australia Cup series as well, could not be hosted.

The National Trap Championships were conducted at the National Grounds and everybody must feel for Tony A whose fantastic 900-900 record in the Double Barrel of 2011 only lasted one season to be surpassed by Glen Hayden with 995-995 in 2012. Congratulations Glen. The attendance over the six main events was 2648 as opposed to 2834 in 2011. Teams selected at this event represented Australia in Wales at the International Clay Target Shooting Federation (ICTSF) World DTL Championship. The team was exceptionally presented and filled many of the

podium spots. With Open and Veteran teams winning Gold and Ladies and juniors taking Silver it was certainly an Australian podium. In the individual categories, Matt Schiller took out the World Junior, Lisa Hawker, Silver in the Ladies, Greg Coleman, Bronze overall and John Maxwell Bronze in the Veterans. A great team result and great ambassadors for the ACTA, our sport and our country. Congratulations to all team members.

The National Skeet Championship was conducted at the National Grounds with entries of 831 over the 8 events against 787 last year. This was almost a full field. The team selected to travel to the USA from those Nationals came back a very credible second place in the 12 Gauge teams event. Congratulations to Shane O'Brien, Paul Johnston, David O'Sullivan, Craig O'Neil and Glenn Clarke.

The National Sporting Clays Championships were conducted at the National Grounds with entries of 165 in total over the two events compared to 216 in 2011. This attendance was very disappointing especially as a team was selected to attend the ICTSF World sporting in Canada in July of 2013. Congratulations to Peter Hall, Robert Hall, John Younger, Andrew Garvie, and Kevin Raymond. This team is yet to represent. An informal meeting was held at the Sporting Clays shoot and a clash with some major events in NSW was identified as the major reason for the poor attendance. A decision was made to leave the selection of the 2013 dates until other associations had published their major competition dates for 2013. We need to remember that we share many members with the other associations that shoot sporting clay type disciplines and they are much larger than us in this area. Thanks must go to the Wagga club who run the Sporting event for the association each year. Their assistance is greatly appreciated.

The National Office was very stable over the period with no staff changes. The same could not be said of the grounds staff with three trainee ground persons being employed at various times during the period. Our thanks go to Chris, Maureen, Sue, Judy, Jenny, and Dave for the effort they have made during the period.

The Executive changes throughout the year saw Mr. Bob Blake replaced by Mr. Michael Kruger-Davis. Our thanks to Bob for his efforts on behalf of the membership.

The CTSN continues as one of our largest cost areas, but we feel the content and presentation is much better than three or four years ago. Emphasis will move from the CTSN to electronic media as time goes on. The digitization project was finally completed in the period and our history is now protected for the future.

The legal claim against the Association by our former Coaching Director was settled by our insurers during the period. The settlement includes confidentiality clauses that prohibit any disclosure outside of the Executive.

It was hoped that AISL would be part funding a new coaching position with the ACTA in an attempt to fill the gap between the AISL High Performance coaches and our coaches i.e.: act as our Coaching Director. To date this has not happened and with the results achieved in London by shooting generally it is not likely that funds will now be available for that purpose. We will need therefore to consider advertising the position in our own right.

Association Sponsors have again provided exceptional support. Support was received during the period from Casella Wines, Beretta Australia, Perazzi Australia, Winchester Australia, Spartan Global, Highland Sports, Eley Australia, Horsley Park Gunshop, Cooper Tyres, Sonora Sports, Bang on Target, Bronze Wing Targets and Outdoor Sporting Agencies. I encourage members to support our sponsors whenever possible.

During the period some well-known and respected people associated with our sport passed away. It would be remiss of me not to mention Mr. Graeme Hull, husband of the Association patron, Mrs. Kay Hull. Shooter and Sponsor Mr. George Sckaf, and Mrs. Thelma Meadows. Our thoughts are with their families and the families of all others who have suffered loss recently.

Looking forward, the Association now has a firm financial base to work from, its assets and members are properly protected with adequate insurance, and we have a fairly stable membership. We are however continually threatened by the Anti-Gun lobby, possible oppressive legislation and poor press following any firearm related incident.

However the issue that I believe is having the biggest detrimental effect on the Association is from within. We have embraced the other association members by allowing them to shoot sporting at our clubs at all levels. Some see this as an open invitation to flaunt the constitution of the ACTA and weaken our Association in the process, by allowing non-registered shooters to shoot trap and skeet at ACTA clubs. This ongoing issue of some clubs ignoring our pleas to have all their members registered with the ACTA is a problem that we will be dealing with early in the forthcoming year.

The Association legally cannot retain member clubs who flagrantly breach the constitution of the ACTA, bringing risk to all other properly registered members.

I take this opportunity to thank my fellow Executive members, Board members, and Committee Chairpersons for the support, time and effort they have given so freely during the period. A special thanks to my two Vice Presidents, Rob Fox and Ron Traill.

1 Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

(a) General information

This concise financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standard AASB 134: Interim Financial Reporting including the Australian Accounting Interpretations and other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board.

Executive Officer's Report



Membership renewals have kept the office busy over the last few months and we now have over 10,000 members renewed. A reminder for those others that if you are not renewed before the end of February you are not regarded as a financial member which can impact on entry to events or insurance coverage. This response is better than last year and makes the job easier for both Clubs and the Association.

Pre Nominations for the 2013 DTL National Championships in Perth are going well and it is shaping up to be a good event.

I was recently approached by AISL about identifying two shooters to go to Tahiti for an inaugural 3 day DTL shoot. Tahiti is the most recent member of the Oceania Federation. The request was for a Junior and Senior shooter. Based on recent performances and international results the shooters selected were Matt Schiller, the current World Junior Champion who is now a senior and John Duryea. Both shooters fly to Tahiti on the 25th of March and return in time for the Nationals in Perth. It is hoped more of this cooperation with AISL results in ACTA members having the opportunity to compete in International events in all disciplines to improve their skills.

Currently the ACTA is holding discussions with IT developers to improve the IT system. The end result is to reduce the work load for Clubs, provide greater access to information for Clubs and shooters and to provide a more efficient system. The current web site now has more information available to members and competitors will be able to see their squadding on line for the DTL Nationals. We will also have press releases and hopefully more YouTube videos relating to the event for those not there.

As I indicated earlier the membership renewals are going well and members are reminded of the initiative of free membership for the next year if you introduce two new members this year.

A topic which has been raised by a number of Clubs and been discussed in this column recently has been insurance and the effect and coverage of non ACTA members. I recently had a meeting with our insurer to discuss this issue and they re-confirmed that Non ACTA shooters who are not covered by the definition of visitor or FGA, SSAA or FGF members competing in Sporting Clay events are not covered and any damage caused as a result of them shooting is their own responsibility. The visitor definition has been explained previously and is a person who visits the club for up to three times to experience shooting and to see if they are interested in the sport. To return three times each year or to go to 4 clubs three times does not meet this definition.

I hope this helps Clubs in their operations. I am always happy to respond to specific queries.

CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION

Entry

Entry into the 2013 Australian Skeet Championships is open to all shooters who are registered for 2013 with the Australian Clay Target Association. Temporary honorary membership will be offered to overseas visitors who can produce evidence that he or she is a current financial member of their home country's equivalent body to the Australian Clay Target Association. Australian competitors must produce their 2013 registered shooter record book prior to competing.

Divisions

The competition will be divided into separate divisions for, Womens, Juniors, Sub Juniors and Veterans, excepting the National Skeet Handicap where places shall be awarded from 1 to 10.

Any eligible competitor paying nominations are entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors, Sub-Junior or Veterans section; however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize. A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section before trophies are awarded.

When Australia/New Zealand Skeet Postal team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the Open team selection as well as section teams shall choose in which team they will compete. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams. To be eligible for selection or naming in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

Age Qualifications

Veterans - are those competitors who, will be over the age of 65 years at the time of competition.

Juniors - are those competitors who, will be under the age of 18 years at the time of competition.

Sub Juniors - are those competitors who, will be under the age of 15 years at the time of competition.

Starting Time

Each day's event shall commence at 8.30am.

Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination and will be re-squadded towards the end of the event. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event, he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.

Cartridges

For all events, excluding the National 20gauge Championship, load size is limited to 28gr struck measure shot size not larger than No.7. For the National 20gauge Championship load size is limited to 24gr struck measure shot size not larger than No.7.

Cartridges of the competitor's choice, including re-loads, may be used in all National Championships. Cartridges will be available for purchase at the National Championships. Random checks may be carried out.

Target and Traps

Targets through the program are to be as determined by the Management Committee. All targets thrown remain the property of the organisers. All throwing equipment will be electronically operated.

Classification

It is the responsibility of the competitor to see that their entry is correctly classified - and indication can be obtained from the daily scoreboard. This applies to skeet grades, Womens, Juniors, Sub Juniors and Veterans divisions.

Contestants are reminded that re-grading and re-handicapping will be carried out on a daily basis, where required by the rules.

Major Sponsors

The Association gratefully acknowledges the sponsorship received from sponsors.

Practice

Practice, subject to trap availability, will be available throughout the championships. Tokens may be purchased at the events office.

Shoot-offs, Continuation of Events

If, for any reason, the event cannot be completed on the day it commences, the management reserves the right to stop shooting at any time, if considered necessary. In such a case, the competition will recommence where it left off on the following day.

Nominations - All Events

All championship nominations shall be \$40 plus targets at \$5 per 25 and include a contribution to the discipline fund.

Additional Team Events

In addition to the Championships the following team events will be conducted in conjunction:

► Five Man Club Team

- Team members must be registered through the club for which they are competing.
- The competition is open to teams of five shooters, registered through the same club.
- The nomination is \$25 per team.

Albury Two-Day Skeet Shoot

Hot! But January is the middle of summer I suppose and at least it wasn't windy so that was a bonus. Great country hospitality. Reese Ehlers met all the campers on the road in and catered to their every need. Lovely meal on the Saturday night followed by Ian "the magic spanner" McGeoch doing his usual

Probably the sparkle in Jacqui Durham's eyes when she won both the A grade and Ladies High Guns and assured me she was right on the verge of breaking into AA.

South Australian Trap Carnival

I don't usually attend Trap Carnivals but when Desiree (Wakefield-Baynes) rang me late last year to ask if I would give her a hand, it was a "walk up start". Cuzzo and the Wakefields go back way too far. I first ran into them in 1974 at the Nationals in Melbourne. Desiree was the little blonde girl running around terrorizing all the other kids and leading her little sister Christine astray. (Incidentally she shot

And that didn't change two years later in Perth when he almost repeated the feat. When the shoot-off that year got down to the last two, it really got interesting. No-one had ever won the event twice, but as Gordon and Ken Lowry were both previous winners, that was all about to change.

Unfortunately Gordon missed a high four in the third round of the shoot-off that day to give Ken Lowry his second (of eventually three) National Skeet Championship. Forgetting his skeet shooting prowess for just a moment, Gordon Wakefield is undoubtedly one of the loveliest gentlemen you would ever want to meet and I consider it an honour to call him my friend. And his wife Valerie initially seems to be struck from the same mould. That is until you are invited around for afternoon tea and bite into one of her infamous sponge-rubber lamingtons! That's when you find out where Desiree gets her adventurous nature and wicked sense of humour from. Anyway,

as Laurie Connors and the Mildura Gun Club used to hold a great two-day Skeet Shoot every year and even hosted the State Skeet Carnival in about 1980, I had the pleasure of becoming one of the Wakefield household's regular guests.

But back to the State Trap Carnival. Great shoot! Three days of ideal weather and that always helps. Good background. Bronte Evans made sure the target presentation was first class, particularly in the Double Rise. Young Mitchell Iles shot very well once again, finishing second overall in both the Single and the Double Barrel, pulling one second in the Points Score and finishing only two points off the overall High Gun. I hope he doesn't take up Skeet shooting any time soon! Frank Auditore came over from Sydney and did his usual magic on the computer which helped the office to run like a Swiss watch. Highlight of the shoot? Well I think my vote goes to Darryn Nicholls. And not for winning the Overall High Gun but instead for finishing sixth in the Handicap. Why? Because to do that he had to shoot 52 consecutive targets off 25 meters, which also tidied up his last remaining leg of the Grand Slam trifecta. Top job!

Victorian Skeet Carnival

Almost 100 shooters from five states. Best attendance for over twenty years. The talk all weekend was about who would snare the fifty Hall of Fame points on offer. Now try and tell me that Mark McInnes doesn't know how to promote and advance clay target shooting! The two small guns on Thursday attracted over 50 shooters with Michael "Buttercup" Buttigieg needing to shoot almost 100 to win the 28 gauge. The 410 shoot-off, although short and sharp, was an all Queensland affair with that evergreen small gauge shooter, Nicky Aird coming out on top. Two squads of 50s started the 20 gauge shoot-off, settling down to a three-way contest by 100, giving two of them another leg of their Grand Slam. Shortly after that I ran out of ability and was left to watch "Buttercup" and Hayden Mountjoy shoot another 100 plus, qualifying both of them for a 20 gauge Masters Award before Hayden eventually prevailed. And then to top it all off, on the last evening, after winning both the State Doubles and the Overall High Gun, Eddie Elder decided he was ready to throw away his handicap book and applied to become the first ever junior to join the AA Elite ranks.

ISSF Hall of Fame

Mark McInnes' original vision for the ACTA Hall of Fame was a three tiered ten year project. The first step, after many years of research, was to start the Trap Hall of Fame in 2003. The second phase was to spend the next five years improving that one and researching the Skeet one so it could be kicked off in 2008. CONDITIONS OF ENTRY – National Skeet Championships

GENERAL

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.
Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
2. Shooters will be Pre Squadded and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
3. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/100 targets. A time limit of one minute will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets. Should the one-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** may be incurred.
4. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at a designated trap at a time suitable to management
5. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
6. All shooters should sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
7. All competitors will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** will be incurred in the event concerned.
8. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised **FIVE (5) TARGETS**.
9. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
10. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
11. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall choose in which team they will be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
12. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section.
13. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
14. Pre-Nominations will close at 5pm on Friday 19th April 2013.
15. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behaviour of the card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.
16. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
17. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
18. ***All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Championships.***
19. Squads of 5/6 to shoot 50 targets in one visit only to the traps. Squads of 5/6 to shoot 100 targets in one or two visits to the traps or as designated by the Tournament Director.
20. Payment of the nomination fee only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not be eligible for any refund.



With these advantages I cannot see why this would not work and it is cost affective to both the ACTA and clubs.

EDITOR'S REPLY

Mr Quick. Thanks for your query in relation to New Start memberships. As you are aware New Start memberships are designed to help a member who wishes to learn at his Club and get used to shooting without shooting competitively. It is a cheaper form of membership to the shooting sport.

When a shooter starts to get serious and compete and travel to other Clubs he or she is generally traveling for competition therefore full membership, handicap and handicap card is required. Therefore the member is using more of the resources of the Association and the Club than a New Start member with no handicap and book.

The comment you make about having to pay full membership for possibly only three months is a valid comment when new full members can join after June and pay the half yearly rate. This will be considered by the Board to possibly remove an anomaly.

STRATEGIC DISCUSSION PAPER –

DTL COMPETITION SHOOTING (AUSTRALIA)

The prospect of long shoot-offs in DTL competitions has created concerns for shoot organizers. The storm that continues to brew is influenced by the following factors:

- Since the flight of targets has been changed to 22 degrees (+/- 5 degrees) either side of the centerline from "inside a 45 degree angle on either side" [page 5, Clay Target Shooting – Newton Thomas, Director of Coaching, ACTA], higher general competition scores and gradings are evident;
- Shooting is a participation rather than a spectator sport;
- Competitors who travel large distances want serious shooting programs and 125 target / 150 target days are becoming normal;
- The number of competitors attending Club shoots and Carnivals in active areas is increasing;

- It is imperative for the enjoyment of the sport that multi-day Carnivals conducted by Clubs, Zones, States and at National level are managed so that they finish well within daylight on the last day of the Carnival to allow shooters and their families to return home and to their other duties;
- Very long shoot-offs, particularly in double barrel events can have a serious flow-on effect when those shooters are not available to shoot subsequent events as:
 - each subsequent event cannot be completed without knowing the composition of shoot-off groups which are likely to include participants engaged in early shoot-offs;
 - it will be impossible to know Carnival High Gun scores;
 - participants become unhappy when their shooting is delayed or moved into deteriorating light conditions;
 - participants start leaving the shooting grounds when it becomes apparent that the Carnival will not finish at a reasonable time;
 - shoot-offs are of high interest to the shoot-off participants and their families and are of moderate to high interest to others for a short time (depending on the participants);
 - long delays to shooters expecting to compete leads to significant discontent;
 - Management can have a (very) serious problem if Carnival trophies cannot be presented by sponsors at the nominated time of a trophy presentation ceremony which is often attended by media and local dignitaries; and
 - It will be an organizational disaster if the finalization of a Carnival has to fall-over to a future date.
- Management and Carnival organizers who provide high volume target programs to satisfy the expectations of shooters cannot afford to allow very long shoot-offs to occur and derail the running and finalization of a Carnival "on-time";
- The process of limiting shoot-offs by conducting them in a manner which markedly departs from the nature of the event has caused considerable disquiet e.g. a double barrel 15m event being shot-off using a handicap formula that moves shooters progressively back from the 15m mark;
- All competitors look forward to the prospect of shooting well and participating in shoot-offs;
- The enthusiasm of participants in long shoot-offs which is generally the realm of our elite shooters is not shared by management and other shooters when those shoot-offs substantially interfere with the Carnival program;
- A very small percentage of registered Australian shooters are in the elite class and the success of Carnivals from Club to National level is dependent on average Club shooters attending and enjoying the experience.

Some Clubs are acutely aware of the risks to their high volume target Carnivals and have weighted their programs in favour of Points events rather than Double Barrel events to limit shoot-offs. There is also a resurgence of Handicap events in some Clubs, but since the reduction of target angles, and the ease at which targets can be shot, double barrel Handicap events can lead to long shoot-offs.

Suggested Solutions:

1. Return to the target angles and settings which were previously prescribed by ACTA;
2. Allow Clubs to either adopt those angles and settings or continue using the current settings until 30 June, 2014 (or some other date), by which the changed settings must be in place. The date nominated would allow a reasonable time for Clubs to make necessary equipment and possibly infrastructure changes;
3. Have relevant Associations announce that all Championships will be shot using the changed settings from 30 June, 2014 (or some other date) to encourage Clubs to effect early changes to allow shooters to experience the more challenging conditions;
4. For elite shooters who wish to have the opportunity to participate in a long shoot-off which follows the nature and format of a double barrel event (without progressive handicapping), establish an

Psychological Skills for Shooting




WHEEL OF EXCELLENCE

Over the years I have been writing the articles I have in some form or another addressed the following aspects of sport psychology: positive images, commitment, mental readiness, distraction control, confidence, focused connection, ongoing learning. But recently while doing some

research I came across a book, *In Pursuit of Excellence: How to win in sport and life through mental training* by Terry Orlick.

The approach Orlick uses in this book is to integrate the elements to provide a vehicle to facilitate excellence and success. He calls it the 'Wheel of Excellence'. All the elements on the rim of the wheel have an equal level of importance. Even though each of the elements are stand alone psychological constructs, when integrated into a system



they can move an athlete to achieve success and excellence.

Human excellence, according to Orlick begins when we discover a pursuit that gives you a sense of meaning, happiness or passion. Orlick continues by stating that when you find something within a pursuit, or within yourself that you are truly committed to develop, everything else can grow. This growth fosters human excellence. The good news is that each of these elements are within your potential control.

Over the next few months I will explore all the elements of Orlick's 'Wheel of Excellence' and finally look at how to integrate each of the elements to achieve success or excellence.

The first element of excellence is your *commitment* to set goals and aspire to achieve them. To have a passion and a vision to attain the goals is essential to achieve excellence and success. Pursue your dream, be the best you can, develop the mental physical and technical skills for success, continue to learn and persist through the obstacles are the steps that will foster commitment. Different sources that drive commitment include pure enjoyment or passion for the activity, the desire to feel confident, valued, needed, important, special or successful. It could also be the joy of learning, or pride in the creation or performance.

The second element in the pursuit of excellence is *focused connection*. This means that for the duration of the task, performance or interaction you are totally focused on the process, and connected with what you are feeling and thinking about doing the task. This focused connection keeps you in the moment, puts you in the zone, drives you on autopilot to achieving the results or the product of your performance.

Being focused is skill derived from an ancient drive: stone-age man had to focus on staying alive in the wild and getting food. A fully connected focus allows you to ignore the irrelevant distractions and information and makes you attend to totally to your experience or performance. What is important is the ability to find a level of focus that allows you to perform your best because you are able to control the intensity, direction duration and consistency of your actions and reactions. Connected focus allows you to enter the zone. To re-enter the zone on a consistent basis you need to learn to trust and let go. You have to let go your judgements of the past: judgements about your performances, failures and self-image. You also have to ignore the expectations, worries and fears about the future. Worrying about what might not happen will only lead to self-doubt, failure or defeat. To stay in the zone: stay in the present, stay in the here and now but gradually increase the consistency, duration quality and duration of your focus. Focused connection frees you to continue to learn, experiment, create, enjoy and perform to you individual capacity.

Orlick looks at focus being the leader. Where your focus goes, everything else follows. The secret is to let it lead you wisely and in the right direction: towards meeting the goals to achieve your mission and fulfil your passion.

There are still five elements of 'wheel of Excellence'. Next month I will explore confidence, positive images and maybe mental readiness.

elite Annual Australian Carnival with the following qualification requirement:

- In the year of the Carnival, each State Zone would nominate a venue and day for a 100 target double barrel event, which could be held in conjunction with any program;
- There would be no limit to the number of those 100 target events which could be shot throughout Australia by a shooter;
- A score of 100/100 would be a nomination requirement.

By giving elite shooters the opportunity to shoot record scores in an environment that should attract International and Olympic standard competitors with high profile media coverage, Australia may establish an event which satisfies those who believe that record scores are no longer achievable at the Australian National Championships.

Failure to address the issue will only enhance the problem and defer the task of dealing with it to the next management group.

In later years, when Dick was trying to save money to purchase a home for his wife Rachel and young family he decided to sell his prized guns. In later years Dick unsuccessfully tried to buy back his prized L.C. Smith, such was his affection for this American made gun.

Dick was an avid field and duck shooter and also a very keen fisherman in our local rivers. Wild duck, freshly caught Murray cod and Redfin would often be on the menu at the English residence

at mealtime. Dick also enjoyed lawn bowls and tennis, however his real interest lay in shotgunning. His wife Rachel said that this was his first and last love and he always came back to shooting after venturing out to try other sports.

Dick actively participated in both DTL and Skeet competitions. He was a backmarker in DTL for many years. He shot locally with club legends, the late George Walker, Claude Dean and Roy Grossman. His most prized sash was for his win in 1978 when teamed up with former club President Tony Penney, winning the Victorian Deauville doubles championship. Dick also competed in New Zealand in 1976/77 and won the double championship shoot at Cambridge Gun Club in 1977. Dick succeeded in taking out the very first Claude Dean Mem. Single Barrel championship in 1980, in honor of a local member that held the highest break in this event nationally for many years.

Dick English used a Browning U/O and was also fond of high grade SKB's, both in U/O and semi auto models.

One story related to me by another local member, Rob Steel was about Rob's purchase of an electrically operated reloader from Dick some years ago. Dick had a stuffed wild duck in a glass case in his reloading room on display and Rob Steel noticed that the duck looked very dilapidated. After Rob questioned Dick about the ducks appearance, Rob was told that Dick was reloading some shells one day when his reloader ignited some powder due to his machine not being earthed. The resulting explosion caused the ducks very poor appearance when its feathers were damaged as a result. Perhaps this is the reason that Dick finally encased this specimen in a glass box for protection against any further mishaps.

Dick's presence at the Wangaratta Clay Target club is sadly missed by the many members and visitors that knew him. Every club has members like Dick- knowledgeable, experienced, pleasant, reliable and most of all totally dedicated to our sport of clay target shooting.

Our club would like to extend our sincere sympathy on the passing of our esteemed member Dick English to his wife Rachel and their family. Rachel also spent many hours working tirelessly as a volunteer with our club in the kitchen and other important roles that have contributed greatly to the success and high standing reputation of the Wangaratta Clay Target Club.

Once again the Zone thanks Berretta Australia, for their ongoing support of the Zone and its shooters.




