National President's Notes

By the time this goes to print the Trap Nationals will have been done and dusted. The event, conducted in Perth, is off to a great start with record nominations in all events received to date. Many in the west have worked hard to host this event so it is great that it will be so well supported. Nominations are up about 100 on each event, from the 2005 numbers. There appears to be a much larger number of WA competitors registering and this could likely be due to both an attractive Pre-National program and the Nationals being shot as 50 target events. Major firearms dealers from the eastern coast will

be present to sell you a new gun or service existing firearms and we hope they are well patronized.

We welcome Mrs. Cheryl Arnol to her position as an Executive member. Cheryl, from Tasmania, comes with a wealth of experience in local government and sports management at the highest level. Cheryl will take up her position at the forthcoming AGM in Perth. Cheryl replaces Mr. Allan Kenny who has served as an Executive member and a Vice-President of the Association. We thank Allan for his years of service to the Association.

There has recently been concern expressed by some International Shooting Sport Federation (ISSF) shooters about the recently published selection process for the forthcoming Commonwealth Games. Without judging the merit of the concerns in any way, it has been decided to have an open forum at the Victorian State ISSF Titles to discuss the perceived problems. The meeting will be attended by representatives from Australian International Shooting Limited (AISL), members of the ACTA Board, who are meeting that same weekend, shooters representative Mr. Tom Turner, and High Performance Committee representative, Mrs. Elaine Forward. All interested shooters are welcome to attend. Venue date and times will be announced on our website and the social media.

Applications for the Executive Officer position have now closed and we have had twelve applicants. The Board is now in the process of shortlisting those we will interview. Interviews will not be held until after the Trap Nationals. It is expected that an announcement will be made in late April.

Clubs are advised that if you have photographs, footage or comment it can be posted to the ACTA Twitter link. We are keen to develop our presence in the social media so if you have any content please contact Alex Smith at ACTAsport@gmail.com. The ACTA needs to increase its exposure in the social media, but as in the CTSN it must be done responsibly, eg. the image we wish to promote does not include shooters in camo gear or singlets. We have rules about proper dress and even in this issue of the CTSN a photograph was edited because of the dress standard.

The Association has recently been contacted by parties from both West Australia and New South Wales requesting the ACTA step in and resolve problems in these areas. The ACTA now has a process in place whereby a request of this nature is considered in the first instance by our Legal and Governance Committee. The committee, comprising members with expertise of a legal and compliance nature, then advises the ACTA on a course of action to follow, and provide comment to the parties involved. What we all need to remember is that every state, zone and club has their own constitution, they all differ, and many of these have processes to follow after receiving a complaint. Complaints relative to financial and compliance matters involving incorporated bodies may also fall under the umbrella of each state jurisdictions corporate affairs office.

Whilst the ACTA will get involved if legally required to, many of these issues are covered within the States constitution, or based on a clash of personalities, and as such should not be subject to involvement by the ACTA.

The Association has now started a mailout of Long Service recognition badges to members who have been continuously registered for 25 and 50 years, respectively. These badges are just a small thank you to those that have made up the core of the ACTA for many decades, so please wear them with pride. There are 67 in the 50 year category at the moment and some 1400 in the 25 year category. There will inevitably be mistakes in this process as we are relying on data that is at least 25 and up to 50 years old, so if you feel you have been missed please contact the office. This process is being done in batches and will take some time so it would be appreciated if members hold off from ringing until after the end of June, by which time the mailout should be complete.

Executive Officer's Report



By the time you read this the DTL Nationals in Perth will have been completed. Nominations have been greater than for any Nationals held in Perth since records have been kept. An excellent result and one sure to test the organisation over there, however with the work done already, I am sure we will have a good event. One topic which has cropped up in regard to the Nationals is the number of Targets to be shot in each event with a number

of members suggesting the attendance would be affected by only having 50 target events. Fortunately this has not eventuated. After the 2011 DTL Nationals the National Executive decided to revert to 50 targets events in the DTL Nationals for three years to help reduce costs and to try to improve attendance. The matter will then be reviewed. Problems also occur at venues other than the National Ground with finishing events due to the smaller number of layouts.

The ACTA is part funding an Open Team to shoot in the World Sporting Clay Championships in Canada in Jul/Aug. The level of support for overseas teams generally depends on the money available in the discipline Teams Levy Fund. The ACTA has also received support from sponsors such as Cassella Wines and

Perazzi to assist travelling teams, particularly juniors.

This year's Junior Development Camps will be held in Wagga Wagga at the National Grounds at the following times, 9-12 July and 24-27 September. Both of these dates co-incides with school holidays in most states. It is very rewarding to see shooters who have attended these camps shooting well in National Championships and overseas. Attendee's have the opportunity to shoot both DTL and Skeet at the camp however the skills and techniques taught will help them in all disciplines. Details, selection criteria and an expression of interest form will be placed on the web site. The training is conducted in a manner which allows a young shooter to attend a number of camps and achieve sustained improvement. The ACTA is extremely grateful to Winchester for their support in providing ammunition for the Junior Camps.

A reminder to all members who may wish to apply for new handicap books, you are required to go through your Club Secretary to have them provided. When your handicap/grade changes you should also ensure that your Club submits a handicap/grade change form. The information held on the ACTA database is only as good as the information provided to the office. Your renewal sticker has on it the handicap in our database so if it is wrong when you receive it that means we have not been advised of the change. Please contact your club so the appropriate paperwork can be forwarded to the National Office.

NSW State Deauxille Doubles Championship

The NSW State Deauville Double Championship was held at the Goulburn Clay Target Club over the weekend with 55 shooters traveling from throughout the state to test themselves. The weather was almost like it had been dialled in, hardly a breath of wind, clear skies and warm temperatures which made for an interesting spectacle as the state's best shooters produced some outstanding scores.

In the warm up to the main event (50 target double barrel) 14 perfect scores were posted and the ensuing shoot off was a battle of attrition. Competitors were marshaled across the three traps shooting 10 per trap till they were down to the final few, then to speed things up the shoot off was completed as Points Score, meaning those relying on the their

second barrel were out. Paul Watchorn who was extremely focused all day, was the eventual victor which was a very fitting result with 126/126.

The Handicap event followed a similar path to the first event, and with almost perfect targets, high scores were guaranteed. The subsequent shoot off, following 12 unblemished scores, quickly ejected any competitor without perfect timing and then there were three. Damien Webster was stuck in the middle of a family shoot off between Noel and Paul Watchorn, however Paul this time was the runner up along with Damien on equal 44/45 and the winner this time was Noel 45/45.

The main event, the affair everyone had travelled for, shaped up to be everything the spectators had come to see. Now late in the afternoon due to some lengthy shoot offs and with

a surprise appearance from two of Australia's cream of the crop, Matt Patmore and Marc Crimmins, the growing crowd was treated to some spectacular shooting. To explain, Deauville Doubles is a team event where pairs shoot at 2 targets (1 target each) from 22 metres and any missed target can be shot by their partner with the second barrel, this can present some heart stopping shots, sometimes just a few metres from hitting the ground, it is amazing that at around 70 metres a target can still be turned to smoke from a well placed shot.

6 teams accounted for the first 20 pair of targets, which meant yet another lengthy shoot off to decide the overall state champions. Forty pair where shot before cracks started to appear, one team out, then another. At around 50 pairs of targets the ring-ins (Patmore & Crimmins) left a target untouched and the crowed went quiet. Finally the Webster father and son team (Jeff and Damien) was to continue against Elton Chatcuti and Rob

Hill who had not met until that morning. At the 60th pair with the scorers just about to call a break to have a drink and gather more cartridges, one of the Webster's (no fingers pointed) lost concentration and a lonely target went sailing to the ground untouched. Elton and Rob stepped up, took their positions and called for their targets, one target was a puff of smoke and the other had just the smallest chip heading in right angles to the

rest of the target, it was enough to claim victory and stop what was an extremely long day.

Many thanks go out to all members who helped out in any way, the surprising volume of competitors may have halted less prepared clubs. The Goulburn Clay Target Club

BRISBANE GUN CLUB FEBRUARY 15th & 17th 2013 2013 Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix"



osting one of the most successful ISSF National Championship Carnivals in recent times, Brisbane Gun Club once again lined up on 15th February to host the 19th annual staging of the Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix" in **Olympic Trap and ISSF Skeet.**

Despite the ongoing effects of the atrocious weather experienced immediately following the National Championships, which ended in bad weather on Australia Day, 25th January, Brisbane Gun Club members and staff once again rallied to conduct what must surely be Australia's premier club hosted International ISSF shooting competition - The Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix".

Whilst once again, inclement weather was widely predicted, the championship weekend commenced on time on Friday 15th February with the conducting of the ever popular 100 target Olympic Trap "Skins" Badge Match. With the field divided evenly into two groups consisting of AA/A and B/C grade competitors, it was obvious from early conversations that friendships would once again be put on hold in an effort to pick up some of the "Skins" on offer during the day.

After a leisurely start to the day, round one of the "Skins" Badge Match saw two of our regular supporters Dan Johnson of Warwick, and Frank Minici of Cecil Park, both record clean scores of 25/25 to share the AA/A grade section honours, while Brisbane shooter Klint Hope, who has recently been knocking on the door of an upgrade to A grade, came in with a grade snatching 24/25 to take the money in that section.

In round two, Dan Johnson once again recorded the top score of 24/25 but this time shared the spoils with Glenn Kable who along with Frank Minici had driven for 15 hours to attend the weekend competition. The B/C section in the second round went to another great supporter - Bob McNamara of Redcliffe with 21/25.

Round three, and things were hotting up on the trench layout. The AA/A section saw

5 shooters all record 24/25, which under the rules saw the cash prize money 'jackpot' to the next round, which would certainly cause the competition to hot-up. The B/C section in this round went to an extremely joyous Julian Yee of Cecil Park who says he normally doesn't look at the score board, but with 'skins' on during an event he has to make an exception. Julian recorded a handy 22/25.

> The final round for the day and the best that anyone could come in with in the AA/A section was 23/25 until local Brisbane Gun Club member, Scott Dobeli, disappointed the three 23s already in to record a 24/25 in the final squad of the day to pocket the jackpotted 'skins'. The B/C section winners were Hiroko Iida of Cecil Park and Klint Hope of Brisbane, who was once constantly being closely scrutin-

ised by the handicapper.

With the first day's shooting concluded and the scores added, the results again proved Brisbane Gun Club to be a venue for good scores to be recorded. After a good day's shooting in the Badge match, Friday's field was tripled in size for the weekend by the inclusion of the shooters representing the Japan Shotshell Top Gun Club who have been attending the Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix" competition for many years. The Top Gun Club from Japan come to Brisbane with the support of Winchester

Australia, whose ongoing sponsorship of our "Grand Prix" is so valuable to us to ensure the successful continuation of the event.

This year, 34 Japanese shooters attended the "Grand Prix" competition and as usual they took the opportunity, as soon as their feet touched the ground, to have a full day's shooting practice before the weekend's proceedings. Many of the Top Gun group have visited Brisbane before for previous "Grand Prix" competitions, and it is always a pleasure to welcome them back to Brisbane.

With eleven full squads of shooters entered for the Olympic Trap section of the Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix", an early start was scheduled for the commencement of Saturday's proceedings. As the weather forecast for the weekend was not very encouraging, the plan was to conduct the competition over the two covered Olympic Trap ranges, shooting 100 targets on Saturday and 50 targets plus an open final and a final for the Japanese shooters on Sunday. As Brisbane had recently upgraded the sequencers and electronics to enable the new 2013 ISSF rules to be adopted, the finals on Sunday were planned to be conducted under the new 2013 rules despite the fact that the general feeling was that they were not completely userfriendly and were very time consuming.

Although only a small field for the ISSF Skeet Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix" Championship, the qualification scores

would also be interesting, but not all important as the new ISSF finals system would also be used in the skeet competition.

It was so evident at the recent Olympic Discipline National Championships that as scores are no longer carried forward into the finals, it becomes anyone's event when it comes down to shooting the doubles from stations 3, 4 & 5 during the semi-final and medal finals.

In conjunction with the conducting of the Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix" Olympic Trap event, this year also saw the inclusion

of our ever popular "Skins" competition on the 4 rounds to be shot on Saturday. As is the usual practice, the "Skins" would be conducted in two groups AA/A grades combined and B/C grades combined. With good entries right across the field, the returns on Saturday would be very attractive \$150 per round in the AA/A group and a massive \$450 per round in the B/C section.

Round one of the trap competition saw the top performers from the previous day's competition continue on where they left off with Warwick's Dan Johnson taking the honours in the AA/A section with a 24/24 and Klint Hope of Brisbane cleaning up the B/C section with 23/25. A great start for both shooters, picking up the "Skins" in the first round and therefore recouping their weekend's nomination fees early in the day.

With the first round out of the way, the focus was now on the second opportunity to post a

good score and share in some of the \$2,500 "Skins" money which would be paid back during the course of the day. Local Brisbane shooter Fernando Cilli, who has been shooting

extremely well in recent times, was the one to beat in AA/A grade and although a number of 24s were recorded during the round, Fernando secured the spoils with a good 25/25 and pick up \$150 for his troubles. The B/C section saw Japanese Top Gun shooter Yuji Kobota record 24/25 to take the \$450 up for grabs in that group.

Half way through the first day and there were still plenty of shooters hanging their hopes on a good round to take some of the dollars on offer. The B/C section of the third round once again saw one of our Japanese visitors, Yasushi Tanaka, come in with 24/25 to card the top score in the section while Frank Minici recorded his second clean 25/25 for the weekend to take out the AA/A honours.

The final round for the day on Saturday and again a number of shooters who had not shared in the "Skins" over the weekend, still had their hopes up that this would be the one they had been waiting for. It turned out that this was certainly the case in the AA/A group with six shooters (Frank Minici, Fernando Cilli, Peter Tobin, Dan Johnson, Kevin Perkins

and Seiji Maki) all posting 24/25 to share the final AA/A "Skin". The B/C group was also shared in the 4th round by well-known Newcastle supporter Reno Cangiano and Brisbane member Sam Cannizzaro who both had 23/25.

With 100 targets completed after a long day which was interrupted on a number of occaand Brisbane B grader Klint Hope (130/150) making up the six positions.

After the conclusion of the qualifying rounds, all that was left to do was to conduct he finals in both disciplines using the new ISSF finals system. Under the new rules, the scores recorded in the qualifying rounds are no longer carried forward to the finals and all shooters now enter the final on a zero score.

The ISSF Skeet final firstly saw the conducting of the semi-final which was conducted shooting doubles and reverse doubles from stations 3–4–5–4, a total of 16 targets. Kenichi Ikenaga (Japan Top Gun) was first into

the Gold/Silver medal final followed by Justin Ehrenreich (Brisbane) who defeated Masaru Sekimukai (Japan Top Gun) in a shoot-off. The Bronze medal final was then contested between Masaru Sekimukai and Hiroshi Yamanaka, with Sekimukai taking the medal 12 to 10. The Gold medal final finally ended with Justin Ehrenreich taking the overall spoils after defeating Kenichi Ikenaga, in another shoot-off, 11 + 2 to 11 + 1.

The final of the Olympic Trap "Grand Prix", also conducted under the new ISSF finals system, also proved to be unpredictable at the start, with the opportunity there for anyone of the top 6 shooters to take the overall spoils.

At the conclusion of the semi-final, Glenn Kable and travelling companion Frank Minici, would contest the Gold/Silver final, and Fernando Cilli and Peter Tobin would contest an all-Brisbane Bronze medal final. Warwick's Dan Johnson and Klint Hope of Brisbane were eliminated after the semi-final.

AA grade and a handicap mark of 25 meters

AA grade with a minimum of 50 HOF points

Induction into their State or the National Trapshooting Hall of Fame

Upon attaining AA Elite classification shooters shall be:

- 1) Issued with a Handicap Card sticker indicating their Elite Grading
- 2) Added to a register of AA Elite Shooters maintained by the National Office and posted on the ACTA website.
- 3) Presented with a special lapel badge to indicate their achievement at the next Trapshooting Hall of Fame induction dinner.
- 4) Required to show their Handicap Card when nominating for events but the recording of scores shall be optional at the shooters discretion.
- 5) Required to shoot in AA grade and from 25 meters until an application to be removed from AA Elite status has been approved by the ACTA.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA - SKEET

ACTA shooters who meet certain criteria in relation to their grading and Hall of Fame Point accumulation may apply to the National Office to be elevated into a special grading level that reflects their achievement of an Elite level of performance.

Shooters may apply once they attain either of the following levels:

- 1) AA grade with a minimum of 50 HOF points
- 2) Induction into their State or the National Skeet Shooting Hall of Fame

Upon attaining AA Elite classification shooters shall be:

- 1) Issued with a Handicap Card sticker indicating their Elite Grading
- 2) Added to a register of AA Elite Shooters maintained by the National Office and posted on the ACTA website.
- 3) Presented with a special lapel badge to indicate their achievement at the next Skeet Shooting Hall of Fame induction dinner.
- 4) Required to show their Handicap Card when nominating for events but the recording of scores shall be optional at the shooters discretion.
- 5) Required to shoot in AA grade with a handicap of 0 until an application to be removed from AA Elite status has been approved by the ACTA.







However, during my last shooting sabbatical from 2003 to 2009, I needed something to keep me off the streets and as exotic cars is one of my other passions, I became involved with the Phillip Island Historic Event and the Australian Formula One Grand Prix and as they usually butt together on the second and third weekends in March, so March has become my motor racing month.

Motor racing! What do I know about motor racing? Not much actually except that I love to watch it, especially if it involves historic cars. If I ever win Tattslotto, I will build a very large garage and then fill it with exotic historic cars, starting with a D type Jaguar. So where do I fit in at these two major events? Skeet Team Clarification

OK, back to business. The creation of the ACTA Hall of Fame about ten years ago has spawned a number of associated offshoots, all of which were basically designed to promote and advance our sport, particularly in the area of greater participation at our major shoots. They include such things as Annual Awards for the most accomplished shooter and for the highest breaks shot in the various disciplines during any calendar year, the lifetime accumulation of certain levels of achievement in different events to culminate in Grand Slam Awards and most importantly the accumulation of sufficient points for eventual induction into the Hall of Fame.

Although a few people could possibly quote the various criteria word for word, most shooters probably have only a sketchy and perhaps confused perception of how this all works and some of our newer members may have no idea of what is actually attainable for those people who strive to reach the upper echelon of our sport. For that reason I have been asked by our National President to try to provide an explanation of each of these various issues over the course of the next few months. However, as an important addition to our Skeet Team array has occurred recently and the full ramifications of it's selection criteria are due to come into effect at the end of this month, I think this would be an opportune time to clarify Skeet Teams in general.

State Postal Skeet Teams

At the various State Skeet Carnivals the two most important teams selected are the Postal Team and the Shoulder to Shoulder Team. The Postal Team is usually selected over the highest possible number of standard 12 gauge targets and comprises the fifteen highest aggregate scorers for the Open Team and the six highest in the three Sections: Ladies, Juniors and Veterans. Ties for the last placings are supposed to be broken by shoot-offs. After the match the ten best Open scores and the five highest scores in each Section are submitted to the ACTA for final evaluation at the end of the year and the winners are published in the CTSN early the following year.

Shoulder to Shoulder Teams

The Shoulder to Shoulder team is then established by adding each person's qualifying and match scores together to find the five best scores for the Open Team and the three highest for each Section. Again ties are required to be broken by shoot-off. Over the years different States have had different procedures regarding shooters who qualify for multiple teams and this has caused much heartache initially in Postal Team selection but then even worse when trying to sort out the Shoulder Teams.

If a young boy qualifies for and elects to shoot in the Open Postal Team where he then misses the cut for the Shoulder Team, can he revert back to the Junior Shoulder Team and displace the final qualifier there. And imagine if this scenario involved a young girl! Nowadays to alleviate this, multiple representation has been sanctioned, provided scores are not transposed. Thus if a young girl or an elderly lady shoots well enough, she could potentially shoot in three teams at her State shoot and then represent her State three times at the Nationals.

National Skeet Teams – Glenn Trophy

Prior to the advent of the Skeet Nationals in 1983, an International Shoulder to Shoulder Teams Match against New Zealand had been contested since about 1970. The end result is to have the winning country's name engraved on a small silver jug called the Glenn Trophy. A similar event occurs in Trapshooting and their prize is the Glenn Cup. Ties originally stood and were recorded as such, but after a request from New Zealand this was amended and now ties are shot off. During even numbered years the match is shot in Australia and the five highest Australian finishers in the National Skeet Championship constitute our team. That selection system still exists to this day. It works OK and is probably steeped in too much history to even contemplate any change.

On uneven numbered years the match is shot in New Zealand and for many years our team was self organised by those Australians present. When I first started to play in the late 70s, Billy Stevens from Queensland always attended the NZ Nationals and we all looked upon him as our "Elder Statesman". His team selection criteria was basic and effective. As he pretty much knew everyone and their experience and ability, he simply named whoever he thought was our best team and that was that. It worked well too. He put our name on the jug more times than not. Well done Billy. Some time after the inception of the Skeet Nationals we started selecting our Team over nominated events at the Nationals and then fully

or partly funding a designated travelling team. That system also still currently exists.

Trans Tasman Postal Team

The Macintosh International Trap Team has been one of the main events every year at the Trap Nationals for a very long time and will undoubtedly remain so. Some years ago someone had a bright idea that we should start a similar event at the Skeet Nationals. Obviously not a lot of thought went into it because although I'm told there is more NSSA Skeet shot in England than English Skeet, the organisation that organises the Macintosh event controls the latter.

The uneven playing field this created, along with a general lack of interest from the other participating countries caused the concept to self destruct fairly quickly. However, because the basic concept was sound, New Zealand came back to us after a while and suggested a scaled down Australasian version. And so was born the Trans Tasman International Postal Match. A similar selection criteria to the Glenn Trophy travelling team provides us a twelve person team with the best ten scores to count and the winner is announced every year after the New Zealand Skeet Nationals in November.

All Australian Skeet Team

With the advent of the Skeet Nationals we were clearly looking to mimic what NSSA call their All American Team each year. Without all their infrastructure and computerisation available to us, we took the only viable option available to us and named our team as the ten highest scorers in the Overall High Gun at the Nationals. It has worked well for many years but now with the advent of the Hall of Fame point system, it would probably be more relevant to name the highest accumulators each year under that system instead. Food for thought!

World Skeet Championships Team

1983 will forever be the watershed year of Skeet Shooting. The first ever Skeet Nationals with all it entailed would have been enough to ensure that, even without the selection of the first ever five person fully funded official Australian Team to represent us at the World Skeet Championships in San Antonio Texas the following year. The team comprised the five highest scorers in the Overall High Gun. To paraphrase Neil Armstrong it was "One Giant Leap". It seemed almost too good to be true. And it probably was! After the second team was selected in '85 to travel '86, I don't think anyone was surprised when it got put into the "financially unsustainable" basket.

Since that time World Championship Skeet Teams have occurred in fits and starts. I think the next one was a three person team in about 1991. Then a junior development team in 2000, followed by an Open Team the following year. I don't recall any other official happenings on the NSSA front until a proposal from the ASSA was favorably considered by the National Executive early last year. The idea was to continue to partially fund a team to New Zealand every second year, but to add a new partially funded team to the United States on the alternate year and to continue this pattern on an ongoing basis.

This proposal also suggested a new and much more extensive selection criteria which was designed to achieve two important objectives. The first was to try to promote and expand the State Skeet Carnivals in every state of Australia and the second was to try to select the strongest possible team to represent our country in the global arena. Our team would be entered in the Zone Teams Match at the World Championships and our initial goal is to be the highest finishing Non-American team, after which why shouldn't we reach for the stars. It's been done before!

NEW SELECTION CRITERIA

Now to the punch line. The new selection criteria will be similar to that for the Glenn Trophy travelling team but will include all 450 regular targets shot at the Nationals, plus the addition of ANY two 100 target State Skeet Championship scores recorded during the preceding twelve months. ie Shoot as many State Skeet Championship events as you like during the year and then submit your best two scores. In order to assist in this venture. ALL States and Territories now conduct their State event over 100 targets. This system will come into effect after this year's Nationals and culminate in the selection of the Team at the 2014 Nationals to travel to the World Championships later that year.

Trivia Question

My current mission as Historian remains unchanged from last month. The accumulation of a full set of National and State ISSF winners from 1973 to now, so this month's Trivia Question will stay aligned with that task. Five years after the inaugural National Trench Championship, we conducted the first National ISU Skeet Championship in 1978. Give me not just the winner, who amassed 20 Hall of Fame points for his effort, but also the runner-up who opened his account with 10 points. IT'S YOUR CALL by Bill McCarthy

At the **conclusion** of a simple double barrel event, you ask the shooters to " unload their guns and check their scores".

On this occasion you have a shooter challenge his score, claiming that his target recorded as " lost" was in fact broken by him.

You seek advice from other shooters who claim to have no opinion either way. The scorer can't remember and the discussion now becomes animated.

Under pressure now from the shooter you agree to give the shooter the benefit of the doubt and you alter the score.

Was the Referee Correct?

It's Your Call

If you ruled NO, you ruled correctly. Unless of course it this was the shooter's last target or a baulk had been claimed on that target. Rule 1.09(d)

While **Rule 4.22(d)** provides for a shooter to challange his score, there is no provision for a Referee to alter that score after the event has been completed. Although correction of scores at the end of an event seems to have become an accepted practice our rules do not provide for this circumstance. It seems we have only a challenge of the correct totalling and NOT whether a target was hit or not or even recorded properly. This, of course, now highlights a need for Referees to pay particular attention to calling the results of each shot loudly and clearly, thus allowing a shooter to challenge the Referees call at the time of the incident. **Rule 4.18(e) is quite specific on this point.**

So there we have it! As a Referee you must make sure your call is clear enought to enable a shooter to challenge your decision AT THE TIME OF THE SHOT as he cannot do it afterwards.

As referees, "Qualified" or not, we are often placed in unenviable and indeed unpleasant situations whilst doing our duty out on the tracks. We are all conscious of situations which occur from time to time where we, as contemporaries of those we are judging, have to implement rules which may be distasteful to our brother competitors. Indeed, there is a very small minority of shooters who consider some rules to be minor or "pinpricking". It becomes increasingly difficult for us to apply these rules where some of our more temperamental shooters take offence. However, these rules have been well thought out and investigated thoroughly over many years by very experienced and knowledge shooters. They are there for our safety and our competitive equity.

Let's face it: Not one of us likes to be placed in this position of embarrassment to the extent where we ignore the implementation of the rules to avoid conflict.

By far the most common situation (but OF THE MOST

IMPORTANCE) is in the area of **safety**. This is an area in which we should not make compromises. We as referees have a vicarious liability and responsibility to our fellow shooters, our sport, and to our public status in the community in regards to the retention of our firearms privileges and licences. Hence, any accident, however small will bring us unfavourably to the notice of a multiplicity of government and non-government organisations, the media and the general public. **Moreover, we must be aware of our vulnerability in a situation where we failed as a person in charge, to ensure we have complied with the simple precautionary safety rules laid down by our Association.**

Our most common exposure is at the start of each event where we as Referees are required under **GRTS 1** to have shooters check their barrels to ensure there are no obstructions in them. So many referees seem reluctant to implement this rule. The reasons are doubtless many and varied but the referee who fails to apply with this rule may be in some difficulty in the event of an accident. Your Rules Committee has put this rule there for this purpose.

So, as the Referee of a squad at the start of an event you ask the shooters to check their barrels to ensure they are not obstructed. One shooter has already placed cartridges in his gun: he doesn't remove them and says "I checked my barrels before I came on the tracks".

It's Your Call

If you started the event you would be quite correct. There is nothing contained in our rules that requires us not to proceed. Once having warned the shooters we appear to have shifted the responsibility back to the shooter concerned. Current firearms' rules state that firearms safety is the responsibility of everyone at the shoot and not specifically the Referee/Range Officer/ Shoot Marshal etc. There is however, a very clear responsibility on behalf of the Referee to make sure guns are unloaded at the appearance of a red flag at the trap house and when someone is going forward of the firing marks and tracks. In these cases the rule is specific in its requirement of the Referee. The Referee is also required to instruct shooters to "unload their quns and check their scores" at the end of each visit to a trap. It is absolutely unnecessary for you to accept a responsibility for someone else's indiscretions or accidents. Your Association has done its best to give you the facilities to monitor and regulate safety issues to prevent potentially dangerous incidents from occurring. By bringing GRTS 1 to the attention of shooters you are creating the first step in safety awareness. It is incumbent on all shooters to know this rule and abide by it. It is there for our protection both in the sense of our own liability and safety and the safety of our contemporaries. We should not take offence when asked by a Referee to perform this task.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY – National Skeet Championships

GENERAL

- In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded. Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
- 2. Shooters will be Pre Squadded and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
- Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/100 targets. A time limit of one minute will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets. Should the one-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET may be incurred.
- 4. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at a designated trap at a time suitable to management
- 5. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 6. All shooters should sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
- 7. All competitors will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET will be incurred in the event concerned.
- 8. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.
- 9. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- 10. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 11. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall choose in which team they will be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
- 12. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section.
- 13. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
- 14. Pre-Nominations will close at 5pm on Friday 19th April 2013.
- 15. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behaviour of the card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 16. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
- 17. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 18. All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Championships.
- 19. Squads of 5/6 to shoot 50 targets in one visit only to the traps. Squads of 5/6 to shoot 100 targets in one or two visits to the traps or as designated by the Tournament Director.
- 20. Payment of the nomination fee only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not be eligible for any refund.




Psychological Skills for Shooting

THE WHEEL OF EXCELLENCE ROLLS ON

Last month I explored commitment and focused connection as components of Orlick's Wheel of Excellence. The wheel involves a number of key components that have to be present and work in harmony for you to be able to reach your full potential.



In this article I will explore look at three more components: confidence, positive images and mental readiness.

The third element of the Wheel of Excellence is confidence. This can also be translated into trust or belief in your own ability and potential, your capacity to overcome obstacles, your choices and your focus. It can also involve your level of readiness and preparation and can provide meaningfulness to your mission.

According to Orlick, where you have an unwavering belief in your capacity to carry out your mission and you are in absolute connection with your performance, then anything is possible. This is what people often refer to as being in the zone. If however, you let negative thoughts or experiences interfere with this confidence, you will develop self-doubt: your performance suffers because you doubt your ability to do even the simple tasks. Tim Gallwey, in The Inner Game of Golf, provides the advice: Trust and let go. Regular readers of these articles will be aware of the damage self-doubt can cause and the need to trust in our own ability (have confidence) and let go of past judgements and future worries. How can we strengthen our

confidence? Firstly, remember that someone believes in you. Then, think in positive ways about your capacity and capabilities. Thirdly, engage in high-quality, technical, physical and mental preparation. Next, recall successes form previous performances or practice sessions. Then, look for positive aspects of all performances and experiences. Finally, continually look for lessons that can be learnt from all experiences.

It is hard to read a book on sport psychology and not read about visualisation. The next element in the Wheel of Excellence, Positive Images, involves using your imagination in positive and productive ways. These positive and productive ways can involve creating an inspiration and positive vision, targeting specific daily goals, preparing yourself to follow a game plan or perform to your capacity. You can also use your imagination to enhance your confidence, speed up the learning process and helping you to act and react in more positive ways. According to Orlick, the overall benefit of thinking, planning and guiding your imagination in positive ways is to set a positive mindset for living and performing. He continues by stating that this mental process serves to enhance your confidence, focus and performance.

The fifth element is mental readiness. This is about your ability and readiness to create a positive learning opportunity, take advantage of performance opportunities and plan, prepare and evaluate effectively. You need to be mental ready to develop essential mental, technical and physical skills necessary to excel in your chosen sport. Mental readiness will also help you follow a path that brings out personal best performances and keeps you relaxed and focused.

Personal excellence requires that you get the most out of yourself and your experiences. You need to be committed to make the most out of every experience and each opportunity. Orlick states that to be mentally ready you need to consistently enter a positive and focused state for learning, performing and interacting. Excellence emerges when you are mentally ready to act in positive ways.

Take a glance back at the diagram of the Wheel of Excellence. While all these components: confidence, focused connection, commitment, positive images, ongoing learning, mental readiness and distraction control appear on the rim of the wheel, the hub which holds these components together is YOU.

Next month's article will explore the final two components: distraction control and ongoing learning and how you can make the wheel work for you. Because it is a wheel: all the components must work together and move in a unified and agreed direction.



NSW Members and Dealers

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

(a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.


