Chris excelled in the compliance and legal spheres of the ACTA operation, and steered us through the minefields of Fair Work Australia, a Civil action and Anti-discrimination hearings during his term. The Board met prior to the Trap Nationals and many issues were discussed. Recent correspondence received, and issues identified regarding non-ACTA members shooting regularly at affiliated clubs was discussed at length. A discussion paper has been put on the Executive Agenda for the June meetings which hopefully will address these issues.

A proposal to employ a media officer on a part time basis was also recommended to the Executive. This position would cover all aspects of our media presence both hard copy and electronic and will be advertised shortly.

A plan for a large traders building was previewed by the Board. Since then another proposal encompassing a Traders area and a two level office, convention hall and Hall of Fame is being looked at by co-opted Grounds Committee member Mr. Peter Haley.

We have received much positive comment about the 25 and 50 year membership badges. I have seen a lot of them around and this is great to see. Please wear them with pride.

The Executive meets in June and States are reminded that input to the agenda is required as soon as possible. The meetings this year are being held for an extended period with the presentation of proposals from two companies to replace our existing database, and replace all our operating systems and membership service and payment software. This is a large and expensive upgrade and long overdue, and it needs careful consideration. This means that most Executive members will be giving at least four days of their time, free of charge, to the sport. Please thank them if you get the chance.

The June executive meetings will conclude my third year as President of the association. I thank those that have supported me to date, especially the two association Vice Presidents, Ron Traill and Rob Fox. I hope we have made a positive difference during this time.

2013 National Trap Championships PERTH, WESTERN AUSTRALIA

The 8th of April saw the first of many sunny days for the opening of the 2013 DTL National Championships and the Shoulder to Shoulder State Teams events. This years' event saw a record number of entrants for the 50 target events. Over 500 shooters turned up during the week, 130 more than for any previous Nationals in Perth with WA contributing 190 of these. This meant that 150 more West Australians had the opportunity to shoot at a Nationals than is the case on the East Coast.

The event was well run and there were many complimentary comments from shooters. The Clubhouse was an amazing backdrop to the layouts as well as providing all the facilities needed to run the event. Many people commented that it would be nice to pick it up and move it to Wagga Wagga.

The week brought many highlights from 4 shooters breaking 1000 targets in the Double Barrel event to some fine performances by young shooters in James Willett, a part time skeet shooter, the Schillers, Kate and Matt, Mitchell Iles and Geoff Aston however all were overshadowed by Darryn Nicholls

who won the Champion of Champions, Double Rise, Double Barrel and Overall High. An incredible effort against high quality competition

The best dressed competition was won by the Queensland team. The winning team received the SACTA Perpetual Trophy and each team member received a gold ACTA medal. Just reward for their efforts.

The official party at the opening ceremony included Mr Frank Alban, MLA for Swan, Mr Councillor Charlie Zannino, Mayor of Swan Valley and Snr Sgt Carl Fisher, WAPolice Firearms. Councillor Zannino welcomed the shooters to the Swan Valley and officially opened the 2013 Trap Nationals.

The oldest shooter at the ground Mr. Ray Mc Donald then fired the opening shot and the Nationals were underway.



In the Open State Team Shoulder to Shoulder match, New South Wales were the winners with a score of 125/125. Team members were Tony Arvanitakis, Bryan Manns, Barry Skinner, Robert Thompson and Ross Walsh.


The Women's section was won by Victoria. Team members were Lisa Hawker, Amanda Holt and Tina White with a points winning score of 216/225.

The Junior Team, in a points decision, was won by Victoria with a score of 220/225. Making up this team were Mitchell Iles, Matt Downes and Isaiah Harris.

In the Veterans section Northern Territory, on count back, shot 217/225 to win. Members of the team were Dave Howe, Rob Fox and Glen Norris.

DAY 1 64th GRAND AUSTRALIAN HANDICAP

Immediately after the Shoulder to Shoulder Teams match was concluded and in perfect conditions, shooting commenced for the 64th Grand Australian Handicap.

A total of 450 shooters competed, made up of 53 Ladies, 34 Juniors, 15 Sub-juniors, 89 Veterans and 259 Open, for placings from 1st to 5th.

Twenty-nine possibles made up the red scores on the board and after another 50 targets, Barry Zimpel from Rockhampton, Queensland, using a Beretta 682 and shooting from a handicap mark of 21 metres, with a score of 100/100 was declared the winner. For his effort Barry received the Gordon Hall Perpetual Trophy, the Royal Blue Sash, Silver Australia Badge, and a choice of a magnificent Beretta Silver Pigeon I trap or sporter gun.

Second place went to Matthew







Stokes of Port Augusta, SA, shooting from 24 metres, with a score of 99/100. Craig Fitzgerald from Echuca came in third on 95/96, shooting from 25 metres. Fourth place went to Daryl Remnant from New Zealand, shooting from 19 metres and fifth place was taken out by Jason Oliveri from the West Australia Gun Club, on 21 metres. Craig Fitzgerald was also the winner of the prestigious Mark McInnes - Arty Del-Ben 25 metre Perpetual Cup and Light Blue Sash.

DAY 2 NATIONAL CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS Sponsored by WINCHESTER AUSTRALIA

The 73rd National Champion of Champions commenced with 454 competitors participating.

Again perfect weather conditions prevailed all day and at the conclusion of the qualifying we had 12 possibles. The field was made up of 280 AA Grade shooters, 94 A Grade, 56 B Grade and 24 C Grade. Darryn Nicholls from the Broken Hill Gun Club, with a score of 325/325 was the overall winner,



Day four, and we were again treated to great weather conditions on what is traditionally the busiest day of the National Carnival. Four hundred and eighty-seven shooters competed which included 63 Women, 16 Sub-juniors, 36 Juniors and 67 Veterans, resulting in 150 possibles.

The grades for this event consisted of 295 AA, 104 A, 61 B and 27 C graders.

For the second consecutive year the shoot ran into the third day with 4 shooters shooting 1,000 targets straight. After the mara-



thon record-breaking shoot-off Darryn Nicholls from Broken Hill, with a score of 1038/1038, became the 2013 National Double Barrel champion. Day five, and the 50 target National Single Barrel started on time. Four hundred and sixty-two shooters competed including 58 Women, 14 Sub-juniors, 35 Juniors and 66 Veterans. The grades consisted of 291 in AA, 94 A, 55 B, 22 C.

As a matter of interest 82 were from New South Wales, 16 from Northern Territory, 71 from Queensland, 19 from South Australia, 25 from Tasmania, 70 from Victoria and 154 from Western Australia. To add to this total we also had 25 international shooters, namely New Zealanders. There were 28 possibles shot and after a 78 target shoot-off and

Psychological Skills for Shooting



THE WHEEL OF EXCELLENCE STILL ROLLING ON

Over the past two months, I have explored Orlick's concept of the 'Wheel of Excellence.' We have looked at commitment, focused attention, confidence, positive images and mental readiness as components integral to the wheel of excellence: Integral because

each component must work in a systematic way to achieve the desired outcomes. In short each component must be pulling together in the same direction.



In this article, I want to look at the last two components: distraction control and ongoing learning.

According to Orlick, distraction control refers to your skills at maintaining or regaining a positive, connected focus when faced with potential distractions, obstacles, negative input or setbacks. Distractions can be external, arising from people or circumstances in your environment or internal, arising from your own thinking or expectations. Distraction control skills are very important when performing in demanding situations. It is possible to use shoot-offs as an example of a demanding situation, but it is probably the qualifying rounds where you need to be able to demonstrate good distraction control. If we go back to the concept of the 'Wheel of Excellence' then distraction control, confidence, connected focus, mental readiness and positive images are all necessary to get us through the qualifying rounds.

Distractions that occur outside the competition, ie before the round, or between rounds, are best dealt with by using relaxation, visualisation or a technique such as The Black Box. During the competition distraction control is about staying in the moment, being able to regain a positive focus and the ability to shift from negative and unproductive thinking to positive and successful thinking. Developing skills for distraction

control will lead to maintaining a positive and effective focus in a variety of settings. Being able to regain your focus, before it causes you to think too much, develop self-doubt and lose the moment. You should be able to perform consistently at your desired level, get adequate rest and stay on your own best path for personal excellence.

The last component of the 'Wheel of Excellence' is *ongoing learning*. Ongoing learning, according to Orlick, centres on three important actions:

Firstly, reflecting on what went well and why it went well. For most of us it is easy to look at the one target we missed and concentrate on it. If only . . ., I shouldn't have stopped the gun, I should have stopped and started again because it didn't feel right, I should see the target before I move my gun, and so on and so on. However, what is important is being able focus on what we dis right for the other 24 or 99 targets. It is possible that if you are shooting well, then a miss could due to a lapse of concentration rather than poor shooting. If we stay focused on our achievements rather than our failures we are less likely to make the type of error which will lead us to change something: stance, gun, shells, speed, etc.

Secondly, ongoing learning allows us to target relevant areas for continued improvement. By reflecting on our performance we are able to review our skills: technical, physical and mental, and make necessary adjustments to improve. This is vital, as we are all getting older, losing muscle tone or slowing up on reaction time. Remaining mindful of the fact that we are changing will lesson the impact of the disappointment when we can no longer achieve what we were once capable of.

Finally, we are able to act on previous lessons learned. We can make judgements about what is similar and what is different from the vast experiences that we have recorded in our memory.

The Wheel of Excellence can serve as a personal guide for improving anything that is important in your life. When I look at goal setting with the junior development squad, I get them to look at there goals in the following areas: sport, career, education, health, finance and relationships. The wheel of excellence can be used for every aspect of sport or life: just write the goal you want to achieve in the centre of the wheel and look at each component and make sure you are doing the things needed to achieve ach component. Then develop a plan. Most self-help and sport psychology books stop here but what is essential is that once you have made a plan, you look make a commitment to make achieving the plan possible.

But then it was back to reality with a couple of days of tidying up and packing and getting ready to head off to Melbourne and fly to Perth for the Trap Nationals. Karien didn't come this year as she was tied up with grandmotherly duties, but she assures me she will be right to help me drive the golf cart at the Skeet nationals next month.

Pre-Nationals

My work started two days early due to a phone call from Elaine Forward of WAGC inviting me to be their Shoot Marshall as well. Clearly both WAGC and WACTA had been toiling long and hard with their preparations as the grounds, traps and infrastructure were excellent. We had two great days with the highlight probably being young Kate Schiller winning the Mini

Champion of Champions outright after a mammoth shoot-off. I thought what a shame she peaked a couple of days too early, but little did I know the best was yet to come.

Trap Nationals

Getting over 500 shooters through each day on only ten traps kept me pretty busy but it was all worthwhile when we continued to break records and make history nearly every day. I don't ever remember calling seven squads of

possibles for the Points Score shoot-off or five squads for the Single Barrel or two full squads for the Champion of Champions. I have never seen so many 25 metre shooters in the Handicap shoot-off and I can't ever remember anyone shooting a possible in the Double Rise without winning the event.

On behalf of nearly every shooter I spoke to, I would like to thank the National Executive for agreeing to defer the decision to turn the Double Barrel shoot-off into a handicap event. Although I agree with the proposal in principle in order to provide an escape clause if it ever became unavoidable, I firmly believe that the Shoot Marshall should be allowed to exhaust every other conceivable viable alternative before we destroy the history of our premier event. The net result was another record score and a very large appreciative crowd applauding the four shooters who broke the magic 1000 barrier.

But at the end of the week it was all Darryn Nichols. First off he equaled the record for the most overall wins by a single shooter

Annual Long Run Breaks

Each year at the respective Hall of Fame Dinners, one of the first awards presented is the Annual Long Run winners for the previous calendar year. In Trap the three awards are for the highest breaks off both 15 and 25 meters and the best Double Rise break. In Skeet they are for the highest breaks with both the 12 and 20 gauge and the best Skeet Doubles break. Originally each of these six areas was constantly monitored all year long by the ACTA Historian who then collated the results and advised the

National Office early the following year as to the various recipients and their respective scores.

No-one really thought too much about it and it all seemed to happen like magic as if it was done by the fairies at the bottom of the garden. It was only after Mark McInnes relinquished the Historian's position that the enormity of the task dawned upon the rest of us. This and several other similarly difficult tasks is probably the main reason that I was eventually appointed as Interim Historian. After initially struggling with the complexity of the task and only being saved by Mark coming out of retirement temporarily to assist me, it occurred to me that this project could and should be self generating.

Live Website Updates

After discussing the matter with Paul Johnston of the Skeet Shooters Association a progressive results table was set up on their website so that anyone who shot a respectable break in any of the Skeet events could immediately access the current position via their laptop or smartphone and then procure the required verification if required before leaving the Gun Club so that a claim via email or

fax on Monday morning would immediately update the relevant section. Over the next few months this system was advertised at all the major Skeet shoots and thus began to work smoothly. To finalise the Skeet project a parallel information section was set up on the ACTA website and Sue Vesperman simply updates it periodically from the ASSA website.

Trap Shooting Long Breaks

The next step was to get a similar system working for Trapshooting, but as we currently have no Trapshooters Association assisting the Office with these types of activities, Sue has set up an identical area in the Trap section on the ACTA website and until such time as a dedicated and passionate group of Trapshooters step forward to assist us, Sue and I will operate it ourselves. So if you shoot any sort of reasonable Trap break in any of the three sections, jump onto our website, click on the Hall of Fame tab and follow it to Long Breaks and Trap.

There you will find the criteria for establishing an eligible Long Break and a list of the current Long Breaks that we are aware of. If your break is greater than our listing, then simply obtain the necessary verification and contact either Sue or myself at your earliest convenience. This "real time" checking will make it much easier to verify your score as it can be done on the spot before you leave the Gun Club rather than over the phone at a later time. Plus the earlier you submit a claim, the more current and relevant our records are. And don't forget the cut off date for claiming any award is the last day in January of the following year.





The general consensus was that 40 targets would be almost unob-





As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

- (a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or
- (b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the

following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms

- (a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the indi vidual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

This year both our Skeet and Trap Carnival have undertaken a facelift. We have eliminated the Sub-Junior section this is due to limited entries in this section.


All shooters under the age of 18 years will shoot together under the section of JUNIOR.
