National President's Notes

Firstly congratulations to Laetisha Scanlan for her recent World Cup win where another Australian, Catherine Skinner came second. It is a while since we have had two Australians on the podium in the same international ISSF event. Well done ladies. Congratulations to Darryn Nicholls for his High Gun win in Perth at the Trap Nationals with an all time record score. It may seem a bit late but we just couldn't fit anymore of Darren in the last magazine.

The Association recently bestowed Life Registered Shooter status on two former Executive members of long standing. Unfortunately neither was in attendance at the Hall of Fame dinner in Perth and so the awards

were presented to Past President Mr. John Mack, and former Chairman of Grounds, and Finance Mr. Dennis Harwood at the QCTA Hall of Fame dinner in front of a crowd numbering 170. The awards were made in recognition of the many years of voluntary service to your Association by these two gentlemen. Congratulations John and Dennis. Congratulations also to Mr. Robbie Smith this year's Presidential Medal recipient for his selfless contribution to our sport over many decades, including as an Executive member, and numerous other senior positions.

The Association hosted an ISSF forum at the Melbourne Gun Club on Sunday the 12th of May during the Victorian ISSF State titles. The forum was well attended and the ACTA was represented by Mr. Rob Fox, Mr. Ron Traill, Mrs. Elaine Forward and myself. The Chief Executive Officer of Australian International Shooting Limited (AISL) Mr. Damien Marangon, and the newly appointed High Performance Manager of AISL, Mr. Tim Mahon were also in attendance. Outcomes from the meeting included the election of Mr. Tom Turner, Ms Suzy Balogh, Mr. Eric Bullmore and Mr. Craig Henwood to a pool of shooters reps. These people are now available to ISSF shooters to discuss any ISSF matters they may wish to have raised with the ACTA International Shooting Committee(ISC). The ISC will now co-opt one of the four reps onto the committee as the shooters representative and also as the shooters rep to AISL. The ACTA is now preparing a submission to AISL on matters such as the AISL selection processes, Australia Cups, and self-funded spots to overseas competitions.

The ACTA was also represented at the AISL members forum on Saturday the 11th of May, by the same executive members.

A representative from the Australian Sports Commission gave a forceful and blunt presentation to all affiliates of AISL. This address included new mandatory requirements for transparency, financial reporting, conflict of interest, and government expectation of any National Sporting Organisation, such as AISL, regarding return on investment — put simply Gold medals at events that count. Events that count are described as events conducted in the Olympics. It appears the landscape is changing significantly, and likely not for the better. AISL has had its funding increased by \$100,000 this year, but this is now being reviewed annually.

I must thank AISL for changing the venue of its Board meeting to allow ACTA to host the ISSF forum and allowing their senior staff to attend. Thanks also to the Executive members who have so recently returned home from the Trap Nationals in Perth for making the time to attend both meetings. Some of them are now backing up at the end of the week to attend the Skeet Nationals and an ACTA Board meeting on the 23rd of May.

The success of the Trap Nationals in Perth has raised quite a few questions that I thought should be aired for members' consideration and comment. The total attendance, bolstered by almost 200 West Australians was larger than 5 of the last 10 Nationals at Wagga Wagga. This poses the question — Wagga Wagga was established as a National Ground because it was in the centre of the largest population of shooters in the country. However the events at Wagga Wagga are not well supported by this group, all within four hours travelling distance. Attendance at the Nationals at Wagga Wagga has not increased even though we have invested heavily on facilities in recent years. Why is this? Should this emerging trend affect our judgment on future investment on the grounds?

Campers were allowed for the first time in Perth for many years. This required much work on the part of the organisers to get the required approvals and provide adequate facilities. Many clubs facilities are now being overloaded with campers and in at least one instance recently the main power supply was fused totally and had to be repaired at the clubs cost of \$3500.00. Campers now have much larger and better equipped camps, vans etc, and are spending less time and money at the clubs bar and kitchens. Many clubs have been upgrading facilities for campers and this is great but it comes at a huge cost. Clubs seem frightened to ask for a camping fee at their larger events. We all need to consider this growing trend in light of the greatly increased costs associated with more campers and the reduction in income to clubs due to the campers' self- sufficiency.

The Double Barrel shoot-off was let run to its conclusion under normal Double Barrel rules and I accept full responsibility for that decision. Once the previous record was passed, the shooters were advised that presentations on Saturday night would be at 5-30 after which time we would be concluding the event under lights that evening. This did not eventuate as the event concluded prior

to the presentations. The way Adrian Cousens and Ron Traill ran the shoot-off did not inconvenience any other competitors, it allowed the existing record to be challenged and eventually broken, and provided a solution to finishing the event on the Saturday. Perhaps in the future we should plan to let the shoot-off continue giving competitors the opportunity to challenge the record, until the Saturday evening and then use either lights or distance to finalise the event. Many believe targets need to be set harder, with some saying that is the real issue. Others say when did the majority of shooters last break 50? So they are difficult enough for most, and its only one event a year.

The opening day of the Trap Nationals with the Handicap in the evening is always a battle for time. It has been suggested that the Pre Nats could either start on

the Friday or be limited to one day and then host the Opening on the Sunday at around 10-00am, shoot the teams matches, followed by a free afternoon tea courtesy of ACTA and then have numerous traps open for practice that afternoon. This would make for a pleasant day with no pressure and time to catch up with people in a relaxed atmosphere. The Handicap would then start on the Monday morning at our normal event start time. Food for thought?

We welcome comment on any of the above.

The Executive meeting is to be held in mid-June and I am yet to decide if I will stand again as your President, and of course I might not get re-elected if I did anyway so this is possibly my last column as President. Thanks to all the great people I have met and for the support and help I have received over the last three years. Regards.

With the World Trap Championships proposed for the National Ground in 2018 there is a great deal of work to be done to ensure we present the ground and the Association in the best possible way on the world stage. We will be seeking volunteers to assist with many aspects of the event and lead-up to it. More details will be forthcoming on this subject in the near future.

The next CTSN issue will see an article in relation to insurance. This is an ongoing education process, however this is one of the most serious issues in sport today. We cannot afford to get it wrong. If in doubt about insurance issues please contact the National Office.

The NATIONAL EXECUTIVE — How it works and its importance.

The National Executive will meet from the 20th-22nd June. It is essential that Clubs, Zones and States, through appropriate channels, contact their delegates prior to the meetings to have items added to sub-committee agendas. This process is in place to assist delegates to the National Executive to be able to work

through the enormous amount of decision making necessary during those days. Sub-committees are: Finance/Board, Coaching, International Shooting Committee, National Championships, Promotion & Development, National Ground Complex, Rules Committee, Legal & Governance. These sub-committees meet prior to the full Executive meeting to discuss recommendations that have been put forward. Once agreed upon they are submitted to the National Executive as recommendations, before final approval, with amendments made as necessary.

The National Executive has a very important role to play in leading the ACTA. Whilst all members of the Executive are State based it is important to look at the big picture. All decisions of the Executive need to be carefully evaluated before changes are made. The last question before implementing items put forward should be IS IT IN THE BEST INTERESTS OF THE SPORT?

The structure of the National Executive is that of a management role through sub-committees. It is reliant on those sub-committee members to do some of the work required.

Sub-committee members will be determined at the June National Executive meeting for 2014. These positions require a dedication to the sport, not just in passion but in business acumen. These positions are very demanding and require enormous time dedication.

Election of the Board is determined by the members of the National Executive. This elected Board has delegated powers to conduct the business of the ACTA as per the Constitution.

Victorian 2013 State Skeet Carnival

MELBOURNE GUN CLUB, FEBRUARY 7 - 10



The 7th, 8th, 9th and 10th of February saw approximately 95 of the best shooters in Australia, the biggest attendance in 20 years, converge on the beautifully manicured Melbourne Gun Club to compete in the 2013 Victorian State Skeet Carnival. For the first time ever, the event was to run for 4 days and included the 28 Gauge State Title and the .410 State Title on the Thursday. With great weather predicted and much anticipation in the air, old and new friends were excited to get proceedings under wav.

Thursday the 7th of February was a hot day with little wind and ideal conditions for shooting. The 50 target 28 gauge State title kicked off in the morning and it was clear early that the competition was going to be fierce! Possibles were posted by Michael Buttigieg, Laurie Durham and Nick Aird. The shoot off for overall commenced with Nick dropping out early leaving Michael and Laurie to battle it out. Into the 2nd round of the shoot off, Laurie dropped high 6 in the doubles and Michael Buttigieg claimed the overall with a score of 93/93.

leaving Nick to step up and win the overall.

After the brilliant displays in the mini gauge titles, Friday the 8th promised to be another spectacu lar day of shooting. Conditions remained perfect for the first of the High Gun events and the 50

target 20 gauge State title was commenced early. 50's were posted on the board by Nigel Hughes, Hayden Mountjoy, Michael Buttigieg, Glenn Clarke, Peter Vella, Adrian Cousens and Steve Vaccaro. The shoot off promised to be a good one with such talent shooting possibles. The first round

saw Peter, Steve, Glenn and Nigel all bow out. At the 103 target mark, Adrian dropped high one and also left the battle. With just Hayden and Michael remaining.

the two showed amazing ability by smashing a 200 break. The eventual winner, shooting a phenomenal 208/208 was Hayden Mountjoy, a score which also makes him the current 20 gauge long break holder for 2013.

With the amazing shooting of the 20 gauge concluded, the 50 target Handicap event was the next to be competed. The initial 50 was shot. 6 squads of shooters remained in the event and the shoot off commenced. After the first round, we were down to 3 squads, and after the second round 2 squads of shooters remained. The third round of shoot offs lost another squad, and at the start of the fourth round. just 6 shooters remained: Tom Laber (B3), Clyde Bennett (B3), Bruce Baker (B3), Danny Sajn (B2), Peter Vosper (AA0) and Lorraine Hughes (AA0). The first to go was Clyde, and the top 5 placings were left to be decided. Bruce was next to go in fifth place. The remaining 4 shooters finished the fourth round which took them to 150 targets and prepared for the fifth round. Tom was the first to go on high 2, and finished in fourth place. Next to

drop out was Danny, who let low 2 go and finished in third place. With just two shooters remaining, Peter and Lorraine, the battle continued until Lorraine dropped low

6, leaving Peter Vosper to take the overall. An exceptional effort from all shooters, but a special mention must be made to both Lorraine and Peter, who both went into the handican as AAO and shot the event clean.

The overall shoot off began, with Eddy the first to bow out on station 2, followed by Adrian on station 3. A repeat of the previous event, Lorraine and Peter were left to fight it out for the overall. Both shooters were clean to station 6, where Peter dropped the single low 6. But so did Lorraine! Peter stepped up to shoot his repeat and finish the station clean, but Lorraine let low 6 in the doubles go, which meant Peter claimed his second overall in a row

Sunday the 10th was a cooler day with a little wind but still great conditions for skeet. The 50 target Champion of Champions was the first event of the day. The Champ of Champs is shot 25 targets 12 gauge and 25 targets 20 gauge, with all shoot offs to be shot in 20 gauge. 6 possibles were

Attention all Rules Supervisors and Handicappers

Due to much confusion among secretaries, handicappers, rules supervisors and State Associations as to when regrading should take place and to have all handicappers using the same process the consensus is:

Once a shooter has shot 200 or more targets his card will be ruled off and his percentage calculated. This may happen during the course of the day.

Should his grade increase or decrease this will not take effect until the end of the days shooting. This means his grade will not change until the following day.

Below is Rule 2.01

HANDICAPPING/GRADING SECTION 2

2.01 COMMON MARK AND HANDICAP SHOOTING

- (a) All appropriate 15 metre scores (common mark) shall be recorded for percentage performance classification irrespective of how the event is run
 - Note: All targets that are shot under 15 metre (common mark) competition conditions to be entered on the ACTA shooters record card with the exception of Eye Openers (maximum of 10 targets), Double Rise, and those shot Targets Only.
- (b) (i) A graded event is a competition common mark shooting event in which all the competitors shoot from the same mark and prizes are allocated for various grades of competitor.
 - (ii) A graded meterage event is where a shooters grade is used to determine a mark from where all shooters in that grade shall compete, e.g. AA Grade may shoot from 21 metres; A grade from 19 metres, B grade from 17 metres and C grade from 15 metres. Scores shot in this event shall not be recorded on a shooters handicap card.
- (c) Shooters shall be graded into four grades by their percentage performance over all standard targets fired upon in 15 metre competition day or night, including shoot-off targets, with broken targets to count in Double Barrel and Pointscoring events. Results in events shot from other than 15 metres shall not be included. (Except as in sub-section 2.01(h)).
- (d) Clubs shall have the option of running all Championships other than State or Commonwealth Championships either as graded events or as one class events.
- (e) Grades shall be: AA 97% and over; A 94% and under 97%; B 87% and under 94%; C under 87%.
 - Note: Club Managements have the option of shooting D Grade under 80%.
- (f) Shooters failing to produce their ACTA Score Book at competition shoots shall pay a \$20.00 penalty fee to the club.
- (g) Club Managements have the option of running common mark events OA,AA,A,B,C; AA,A,B,C; First, Second, Third; or by combining, AA & A or A & B or B & C grades.
- (h) It shall be the responsibility of a designated club official to enter individual event scores and progressively mark the shooter's card with his 15 metre results. After each 200 targets double barrel regrade the shooter if necessary. Double Barrel scores will be transposed for any better scores from the other events column of near equal target amounts. (this being a maximum difference of plus or minus 10 targets) i.e. Continental and Single Barrel.

If the 200 targets fall during an event or shoot-off, regrading will not take place until the completion of that event. All targets to the end of that event and shoot-off targets are to be used in calculation of percentage.

Once 200 or more targets have been shot at and recorded and after the substitution of any bad scores, the percentage shall be calculated.

- Regrading and re-handicapping shall not take effect until the end of a day's shooting
- (i) A shooter must shoot a minimum of three (3) consecutive groups of 200 targets, i.e. 600 targets, at a lower grade percentage to be downgraded. He can only be downgraded one grade at a time. All scores after the last grading must be carried forward onto a new record card. Other than in the authority vested in Rule 2.04(g).
- (j) Shooters awaiting the issue of a card after registering for the first time shall be allowed to enter in any competition. Scores shot during this period must be kept and entered on his card when received.
- (k) If a shooter has lost his card he shall be allowed to compete providing he is registered with the ACTA. He shall be allowed to compete in his grade in common mark events and shall be allowed to compete in handicap events from the mark he claims to be his correct handicap mark. Should he win prize money or trophies they must be retained by the club until such time as the shooter presents his card to the club for marking.
- (I) Should it be found that the shooter has claimed the wrong handicap mark or grade, the Club shall advise the State Association so that the matter may be investigated. If it is determined that the shooter deliberately misled the Club Management regarding his grade and/or his handicap, the shooter may be suspended for a period of up to three (3) months.
- (m) A shooter must not shoot in a grade higher than his best performance. Once having attained a grade he may elect to remain in that higher grade when due for regrading. If he so elects he must remain in that grade for the next three groups of 200 targets. If the shooter so elects his card must be marked to indicate such. E.g. Prefer A grade.
- (n) Managements conducting graded common mark events shall provide a minimum of one prize or trophy for each grade.
- (o) All wins shall be recorded with a OW (overall) or GW (grade) beside scores on handicap cards.
- (p) Any shooter re-registering after a period of non-registration shall be placed in the same grade and handicap as when he was last registered.
- (q) A shooter registering for the first time shall be graded on the first 50 double barrel targets. These 50 targets will then become part of the first 200 targets for grading purposes. Newly registered ACTA shooters with experience and grade classification in other shotgun codes (e.g. Field and Game) shall for the first 200 targets shoot at the highest grade attained in that code.
- (r) Upgrading of shooters after 200 targets is limited to one grade at a time.
- (s) No shooter will be regraded or re-handicapped until the completion of competition on that day.

25 Targets Continental followed the single barrel, warming up the competitors for the ball trap to follow. Once again, Phil Body cleaned up the lot for a 25/25 win





Psychological Skills for Shooting

CHOKING OR IN THE ZONE

For most of our normal life we refer to our selves as being in a conscious state. While we are awake we are able to be aware of what is happening to us, our thoughts our feelings and our reactions. Consciously, we think, act, concentrate, attend, and so on. We can enter an altered state of consciousness by using drugs, through meditation, experiencing

mental disturbances, or simply dreaming. In sport we can alter our state of consciousness by being in the zone or by choking.

What does an altered state of consciousness look like? What are the characteristics of an altered state of consciousness? According to Nideffer, 1992 they can be listed as:

- 1. *Alterations in thinking* leads to subjective disturbances in attention, memory and judgement.
- 2. *Disturbed time sense* leading to a speeding up of perceived time or timelessness: feeling like everything is in slow motion.
- 3. Loss of control, which we experience as losing a grip on reality.
- 4. *Change in emotional expression* as emotions become more or less intense than normal.
- 5. *Body image change:* this may lead to a feeling that we have left our body and are observing our performance as a passive observer.
- 6. *Perceptual distortions:* hypersensitivity to visual and kinaesthetic clues, for example hallucinations.
- 7. Changes in the meaning and significance of events, experiences and ideas.
- 8. Sense of ineffable which is an inability to adequately express what has happened.
- 9. Feelings of rejuvenation and hope, vigour and vitality.
- 10. *Hypersuggestibility:* increased response to suggestions. This is important if we are using hypnosis, self hypnosis, visualisation or guided imagery as tools for improving performance.

For the purpose of this article the two altered sates that I want to explore are choking and being in the zone.

Choking, according to Mack and Casstevens, in Mind Gym, is a normal human reaction, a physiological response to a perceived psychological threat. I have previously written that "fear is a mental response to a perceived danger or threat. It's a primitive response that allows us to fight, flee freeze as a response to a threat. This fear is manifested as self doubt and produces anxiety. This anxiety then tenses up our muscles and we are unable to carry out the tasks we need to do in order to be successful. Anxiety makes us feel uncomfortable and when we feel this way we become stressed. With stress there is a change in the way we are breathing and under this stress we become internally self -conscious instead of being externally task-conscious. So what do we need to do to perform under pressure? We need to breathe and focus. When we become anxious our breathing patterns change and without realising it we may even hold our breath. This has the effect of taking the focus away from what we are doing in the here and now: we lose sight of the present. So, if we are anxious, stressed and tense, how do we relax the muscles and clear the mind? By breathing; oxygen is energy. Oxygen also allows us to focus the process of what we are doing; which keeps us focused in the present. Staying in the present keeps our orientation of time in the right place: we can avoid thinking about the past (making judgments about past performances, other competitors, etc), and about the future (worrying about what might or might not happen). When we hold our breath, we are creating pressure and a nervous feeling. Athletes then choke because they become nervous about being nervous; worrying about being anxious. Because the pattern of breathing affects the pattern of your performance, then when you are under stress, deep breathing will help bring your mind and body back to the present. This simple technique of focusing on your breathing and taking a couple of deep breaths will help learn to be comfortable with the uncomfortable.

Being *in the zone*, on the other hand can be identified by eight mental and physical conditions that characterise being in the zone or at the level of peak performance.

- 1. Being mentally relaxed or in a state of inner calm. Sometimes this can be described as the sense of time being slowed down and having a high degree of concentration.
- 2. Being physically relaxed so that muscles feel loose and fluid.
- Confident /optimistic; feelings of self-confidence, being optimistic and positive about our own performance. This is very important during challenging times within the competition.
- 4. Focused on the present. Shooting is a here and now sport and we feel a sense of harmony when the body and mind is able to work as one unit. In order for the body to perform well, our minds must also be in the here and now. This means shooting this target and not the one missed (in the past) or not the ones in the shoot off (in the future). By controlling the thoughts about the future and the past, the body can perform automatically without conscious or deliberate mental effort.
- 5. Highly energised. A high-energy state is frequently described as feelings of joy, ecstasy, intensity or being 'hot'.
- 6. Extraordinary awareness: A state of mind that allows the athlete to be acutely aware of their own bodies and of those around them.
- In control. The body and mind seem to do automatically what is right without the need to exert or impose control.
- In the cocoon. This involves feelings of detachment from the external environment and any potential distractions, where the athlete has complete access to one's powers and skills.

The eight qualities listed above are those that are evident when athletes reach peak performance. But there is a difference between being a very good club competitor and being a national champion. Williams (1993) continues and describes a psychological construct referred to as flow. Flow was is defined by Csikszentmilhalyi when the challenge equals skill level, when one knows what to do, one has clear goals, deep concentration, a sense of being in control, and a sense of loss of time; and the activity becomes autotelic.

The difference between choking and being in the zone is the emphasis that we place on our breathing and being in the here and now. Being mindful of your breathing and what is happening to you at this very moment will help you into the zone. Forgetting about your breathing, and focusing on the future or the past will lead to you choking.

Bairnsdale 400

Wow it's hard to even contemplate shooting a 100 straight in American Skeet doubles. The conditions and concentration required to perform such a feat is immense. Coupled with the fact that the only 100 target Skeet Doubles event in the Australian Skeet shooting Calender is at the Skeet Nationals and only 50 target events at the state shoots (and shoot-offs at stations 3, 4 and 5) means that all of the ducks have to line up on one day every year for the feat to be attempted. So much so that there has only been 4 shooters to actually shoot a 100/100 Skeet doubles on Australian soil despite the Skeet Doubles being in the National program for 26 years.

It is recognised that the shooters needed more opportunity to shoot more doubles and it had been socially discussed for several years now around the traps that we should have a doubles only shoot somewhere and sometime but nothing was ever done about it. So it was decided that a 400 target Skeet Doubles only shoot was in order to give the shooters the opportunity to shoot more doubles and hopefully get longer continuous breaks. Next it was where and when and after many discussions we found that the Bairnsdale club could host the event in March 2013. The only issue with that was that Bairnsdale only has a single skeet field so getting shooters through 400 targets in one weekend was going to be a challenge as the single field could only handle 4 squads. And also what to call it and the answer was of course the Bairnsdale 400!

We all arrived on the Friday afternoon and some were shooting some practise targets in preparation for the weekend. We also put on fresh Skeet gloves, practised our high fives, bottom slaps and knuckle taps to make sure we had all bases covered and ready for the weekend ahead!

We had a World Champion, a Commonwealth and Olympic Champion and three members of the current Australian Skeet team in attendance so the sprits were high and we knew that the competition was going to be fierce!

Saturday morning there were some bleary eyes and sore heads but the weather was stunning approximately 30 degrees, blue skies and very little wind. Perfect conditions for Skeet shooters so the ducks were starting to line up! The situation of the skeet field at Bairnsdale is not sunshine friendly early in the morning so the first squad didn't go on until 10 am as the sun glare was pretty intense.

After event three had concluded we had to celebrate with Michael Buttigieg as he had managed to put together a break of 103 by combining results in Event 2 and Event 3 so this was a fantastic result. With this break Michael had also completed the last leg of the Skeet Grand slam of 200 x 12 Gauge 100 x 20 Gauge and 100 x 100 in Skeet Doubles all in the space of two months as he had shot the long breaks in the Vic State Titles in February and Michael is now the 6th person in Australia to achieve the Grand Slam in Australian Skeet shooting.

After the events had been done it was time for the shoot offs and everyone gathered behind the field to watch the action.

Determination was the key to success for this day, you had to dismiss the omnipresence of the wind and dig deep and just focus on the targets. It was tough going as the splits between the targets were unpredictable and was very hard to get the rhythm going from station to station that you need for doubles shooting. On the plus side there were many cheers as shooters smashed targets that were either way up in the air or skimmed the grass which made for lots of fun and as a by-product split the competition wide open so you couldn't put your money on anyone for a win.

Kolar Trap Max TA

Distributor: On Target

standing and tradition. Successive generations of family members born into the industry and taking over the reins as their natural progression evolves. One company which certainly doesn't fit that mould is that of Kolar Arms, which has only been around since 1996. For Kolar it all happens at 1925 Roosevelt Avenue. Racine, Wisconsin 53406 in the USA. I guess that makes two unusual facets to Kolar the fact it is a relative newcomer and the fact it is an American made double shotgun. In their own words, they set out to "produce the highest quality, ultimately reliable target shotgun that money can buy".

The Kolar line includes trap, skeet and sporting gun configurations, with choices of fixed or adjustable ribs, fixed or interchangeable choke tubes (designated CT's), "carrier barrels" and full length sub gauge tube sets, fixed or adjustable combs and a wide variety of forend styles, wood grades and levels of engraving. The gun sent for testing was the "Trap Max TA".

decoration excepting a border pattern and company logo on the underside. The barrels pivot on trunnions, and bifurcated lugs on the interior of the action walls provide lockup and action strength. The top lever is of generous proportions and knurled on the left hand side to suit a right handed shooters thumb with grip. The shape and size of the lever meant the gun was quite easy to open. The top tang also houses the safety, and the selectable barrels are chose for firing order via the selector located behind the trigger within the trigger guard. This selector is marked B for bottom and T for top, and is quite easily changed. Being behind the trigger I don't believe it should be inadvertently bumped. The removable trigger group is mechanical in operation, and in order to remove it a small Allen screw behind the trigger guard is removed and the whole unit simply pivots out.

The triggers were tested over ten pulls per barrel, as is my usual procedure, and they averaged 2.07kg/4.5lb (bottom) and 2.04kg/ 4.5lb (top) with no sign whatsoever of any creep, rough spots or glitches. In a word they were extraordinary. The position of the trigger blade is adjustable fore and aft, the springs are the coil

charging.

The beautifully matte finished barrels on the test gun were 81cm (32") in length, came with five screw in chokes and weighed 1844gm when fitted with Modified and Improved Modified chokes. Overboring is becoming increasingly popular with a number of gun makers these days - as are longer forcing cones. The bores on the test gun are 0.750", as opposed to a standard 12ga bore of 0.729", and measuring the bores showed ultra consistent dimensions and the forcing cones are 70mm (2.75") in length. Looking up the bores showed a brilliantly smooth polished finish. The chokes are 73mm (3") in length and marked with their constriction measurements for identification (5 is skeet. 10 is IC. 15 is LM. 20 is M. 25 is IM, 30 is LF, 35 is F and 40 is Extra Full). They were smooth to install or remove and this was easily achieved by combination of spanner and fingers assisted by knurling on the tube ends.

There are no side ribs at all on the barrels which will greatly assist with heat dissipation, and a hangar at the muzzles keeps the barrels together at that end. The test gun came fitted with the "high rib", which is in fact adjustable for point of impact from 65/35 to 100/0, via a small wheel at the muzzle end. I patterned the gun with various POI setting and it came in almost perfect with all settings. The "ramp tapered" rib is manufactured of aluminium to ensure it isn't "top heavy" and it sits up 28mm (1.1") from the top of the barrels. It had a silver mid bead with white Bradley front bead surrounded by an anti glare knurled pattern on both sides. Automatic ejectors were well timed and certainly dispensed with fired hulls emphatically.

The woodwork on the Kolar is English walnut which showed nice grain and a gloss finish. There is a 6 way adjustable comb in place, as well as an adjustable butt pad and thick soft rubber gel type recoil pad. The pistol grip and forend are hand checkered on both sides with a borderless pattern and a ribbon curling through the centre. There is a slight palm swell on the pistol grip and all checkering is executed to a pleasing standard. The length of pull was set at 374mm (14.7"), and trigger blade position is adjustable fore and aft. The drop at both the front and rear comb was 37mm (1.46") and at the heel 65mm (2.5") with the comb set in its lowest position. The design












of the rib. and stock dimensions. promote a "heads up" shooting position, which allows for quicker target acquisition and which allows a full and uninterrupted view of the target in flight. This is becoming the way of many gun designs now. The forend is about 260mm (10.5") long, of good dimensions and raked back at the tip. It employs the popular latch method of attachment and snaps into place perfectly on either set of barrels. There is no movement evident whatsoever once it is in place and I found it provided good control and "feel".

The gun weighs 4.57kg (10lb), and there is no other way to describe it but as a heavy gun. Having said that, it balances right on the trunnions making it a neutral handing gun, the characteristics of which belie its physical weight. The gun swings beautifully, and the guns weight combine with the overbored barrels and long forcing cones to make it a very soft shooting machine indeed. In fact I can assure you I have never fired a softer shooting double barrel 12ga gun. The beauty about muscles is that they respond to physical





activity, and the more shooting done with a heavy gun will result in muscles growing to provide the capacity to lift and move the gun more easily. A bit of practice with this gun results in the weight being less of an issue, while the recoil reduction benefit will still stand which comes to the fore in longer shoot-offs.

I did plenty of pattern evaluation with the test gun and there were no disappointments to be had in this area. Good dense patterns without large voids were the norm and it was easy to see why targets were so completely and emphatically inked. I have never seen a shotgun cause so much damage to clay targets. It was quite incredible that something which is so tame to shoot can be so vicious when they hit those clay birds! The targets were absolutely pulverised more often than not, and more consistently than with any other gun I have used. To say I was shocked and thoroughly impressed would be an understatement.

Kolar guns come in an "Americase" aluminium fitted case, considered as the best security for all firearms



with regard to preventing damage during travel. I have tested some of the finest guns in production over the past couple of years and the Kolar doesn't give ground to any of them. The triggers are THE best shotgun triggers I have used with regard to consistency. The wood to metal fit is flawless in every respect. The handling of the shotgun is deliberate and its behaviour under recoil is the benchmark for soft shooting shotguns. I am reliably informed the aftermarket sales and service by the folks at Kolar is beyond reproach.

Some of the best clay target shooters in the world have gone to Kolar. Skeet shooters Wavne Mayes and Paul Giambrone III use these guns exclusively. Successes achieved by top shooters, and a good advertising campaign in the US, continues to see demand for the product flourish there. There are quite a number of Kolar's in Australia at the moment and demand continues to steadily increase for them here.

When I read about these guns in dispatches from friends in the US I thought the popularity there



would be due to the patriotism displayed by the Americans for this homemade product. After testing the gun I am convinced that probably accounts for a small percentage of the demand for Kolar products. I am more convinced the demand for them stems from the fact they are an extremely well made shotgun, with magnificent triggers and the ultimate in sheer shooting comfort. The build quality is outstanding. the reliability unquestionable and the all round performance is spectacular. The clay target disciplines have been dominated by Italian guns for the most part, but I can see that changing not so far down the track. Keep an eye out for Kolar shotguns, accept any offer to try one, and if you are prepared to invest your money in what may well be the best competition shotgun on the market then buy one. Kolar have a 3 year warranty and are distributed in Australia by On Target phone 07 3289 2689 or visit www.650straightskeet.com. The Trap Max TA has a RRP of \$12,800 and comes fully cased.



Mr Ludwig Kohler L K Precision Engineering (Gemini Traps) 9/6/1941-25/4/2013 (Peacefully in his Sleep)

I first met Ludwig at Sydney Clay Target Club in early 1993, what a gruff, cranky full of himself box headed German or so I

thought at our first meeting.



How wrong I was, as the time past and we became very good friends I often thought to myself what I would have missed out on if I had not endured those first few meetings with Ludwig.

He was a very tough man to argue with, because Ludwig only argued if he knew he was right other than that he would not waste his time arguing.

Love him or hate him he changed our sport forever with his invention of his beloved "Gemini traps" one flick of a switch from Singles to Doubles, He was the consummate engineer always thinking and perfecting his craft.

Others will argue that there are better Traps on the Market but that is their opinion not mine. (Opinions are like bum-holes we all have one).

Prior to designing and manufacturing the Gemini Trap Ludwig was very much sought after by Hearing-Aid and Pacemaker companies for his design in their manufacture, that's how good an engineer he was.

Ludwig was a man that loved speed, in his younger days he raced Motor Bikes, Go-Karts and Boats and was an accomplished Pilot, he owned several planes along the way one being an old DC3, which Ludwig hired out to the TV comedy show of "Norman Gunston" fame, Gunston used to get flown from State to State in Ludwig's DC3.

I remember one day I made the fateful mistake of asking Ludwig for help with the trigger in my Krieghoff, sure mate come over to the Factory tonight after work and we will fix it right away.

I arrived at 6.30pm and left his factory at 4am next morning, near enough, 95% was good enough I told him, bullshit was his response 100% is the only way it will leave my factory.

We attended our First Grand American Trap shoot together (Vandalia Ohio. August 1996) along with Geoff and Janenne Kidd (The Lawson Motel Wagga Wagga), we did nothing but laugh and have the time of our lives, you had to really know and understand Ludwig to appreciate his sense of humor.

He often joked that the Krieghoff trigger was made up of 32 moving parts, being a typical German engineer why would they only use 16 parts when they can use 32. (His way of joking about German engineering).

Some year's back Ludwig used to write the odd article on an American Trapshooting website called "Trapshooters.com" there was an article



written called "Target Flight" written by a then committee member of the ATA. (American Trapshooters Association, Mr. Neil Winston, he later went on to become the President of the ATA.) Well Ludwig did not agree with Neil's theory.

He then set about to disprove it by building a wind tunnel and testing as many different types/makes of targets to prove Ludwig to be correct, many an aerodynamically mathematical equation was done by Ludwig to add to his proof, but let's say after many months and much money spent by Ludwig that the Yanks agreed to disagree.

3 Years later I was fortunate enough to meet Mr Winston at the 2008 Grand American Trapshoot and reminded him of the discussion that went on for many months regarding "Target Flight" he said to me then that he had the utmost respect for Mr. Kohler and his "Pearls of Wisdom" as he put it, apparently at the time it was the longest running thread ever featured on Trapshooters.com.

Ludwig had a way of falling out with his fellow Trap shooters; he often called it as he saw it and you were left knowing in no uncertain terms where you stood with him.

He was on Sydney CTC committee for some 6-7 years from mid 90's to the early 2000's, he was a stickler for the rules of Trapshooting, he always argued that all we have to work with are the rules as they were laid down, not what each and every individual thought, he found himself in many arguments along the way but not once did he deviate from the "ACTA RULES".

Ludwig's proudest shooting moment was back in early 2000 when he and Michael Diamond were the only two possibles in a Points Score Championship at the Illawarra Gun Club, you would not believe it Michael pulled a second on his first target, Ludwig shot his albeit very nervously and the rest is history as they say.

In the last 6-7 years his health had not been good, eye and heart problems were constantly with him, he had not shot for that time but still remained a member of Sydney CTC.

At the 2002 Nationals at Wagga-Wagga he had a Gemini Trap display with a sign on a post beside his display reading "Lift this flap to find out what causes you to miss targets" time and time again passersby would lift the flap only to be greeted by their own image in a mirror, such was his humor that only you can control "Hits or Misses".

My wife Karen and Ludwig had a special understanding if he got too much she would just say "Shut-up Ludwig" and he knew it was time to back off, she will miss him greatly.

Luddy as he was affectionately known to all his close friends will be missed by them and especially his Family, wife Fulla and daughter Christina, next time you shoot over a "Gemini" think of the little German box-head that designed and built it, we all owe him a debt of gratitude.

It's tough when we lose loved ones and its especially tough when you lose a good mate, Ludwig used to often phone me at work just to talk (he used to get lonely working in his factory by himself), there were plenty of times I wished him further as I was very busy running my own business at the time, always give your family/friends/mates the time they deserve you never know when that time will run out.

He rang me the morning before he passed away and I thank God I took time to talk to him, I would never have forgiven myself if I had not.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

NATIONAL SPORTING CLAYS CHAMPIONSHIPS

- 1. Proof of association membership must be shown. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded. Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
- 2. Squads of 5 shooters to shoot 100 targets in four rounds of 25.
- 3. The Organising Committee will decide the order of shooting.
- 4. Skeet or Trap targets will be thrown, as well as mini, midi battue, rockett rabbit or flash or any other sporting clay target approved by the Association. Target type for any stand will be at the discretion of the shoot official, but shall number five (5) in total.
- 5. Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
- 6. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 25 targets
- 7. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may be re-squadded towards the end of the event, but this is not guaranteed and non-participation is a possibility.
- 8. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 9. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
- 10. Any competitor will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfill their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score may incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET.
- 11. Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first round of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility may be penalised one target. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for they're failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.
- 12. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap may be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.
- 13. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- 14. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 15. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any section prize.
- 16. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
- 17. Nominations will be by pre-nomination, and only if nominations do not reach the maximum entry of 120 will nominations be taken on the day. Nomination if taken on the day of the event will incur a extra fee of \$25.00. Nominations will close daily at 10 .00am.
- 18. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
- 19. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 20. Reduced Nominations: These shall apply to juniors and the second family members entering into the same event, they being wives and husbands. Shooters paying reduced noms are eligible for Open as well as section prizes.
- 21. All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Trap Championships.
- 22. Competitors to be eligible for A.C.T.A. team selection must be fully paid up members of the A.C.T.A. and Australian citizens prior to the competition.
- 23. Upon application to the ACTA office, refunds less a \$5.00 administration fee will be available. Refunds will not be available for competitors not complying with this condition of entry.





- (b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

- (a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.


