At the National Executive meeting held in June I was elected for a two year term to the position of National President. I am honoured that the executive elected me to this position and would like to thank each of them for their honesty and dedication to their positions. Each executive member holds numerous positions in the executive which I am confident they will all excel in.

At this time I would like to thank the immediate past President, Mr Robert Nugent for the work and time he has committed whilst in the position and I look forward to working with him in the future. Robert has remained as a seconded member to the grounds committee

and will be attending on your behalf at a meeting overseas as Vice President to the International Clay Target Shooting Federation.

For those that don't know me I will provide a small look into my past. I have been on the ACTA Executive since 2006 and have also been the South Australian Clay Target Association (SACTA) President since that time. My roles on the ACTA executive have included being the National Secretary and chair of the Legal and Governance committee. I am a serving (38 years) police officer and have qualifications in event management and tourism. I am presently a Director of the Australia & New Zealand Police Games Federation and have served on appointed Ministerial Boards relative to international major events. I also have a strong interest in administration practices.

At the National Executive meeting approval for a review of the ACTA constitution and bylaws was given, which will be undertaken by the Legal and Governance Committee in consultation with the Executive Officer and Landers & Rogers (ACTA solicitors) as soon as practical. Any constitutional changes will be referred to the full membership before inception as required by the current constitution.

The Management Committee for the next year was elected at the executive meeting and I can advise that the new committee consists of Mr Ron Traill (Victoria), Mr Robert Fox (Northern Territory), Mr Arty Del-Ben (New South Wales), Mr Garry Read (South Australia) and two seconded members, Mr Neil Haydon — legal (Victoria) and Mr Alex Smith — marketing and promotions (Queensland). This committee will be fully accountable to the National Executive for all constitutional matters and issues that impact the membership. The day to day running will be handled by the Management Committee with an "instrument in writing" being prepared to ensure the responsibilities and accountability of all committees is understood.

There are several new members on the executive and they are all listed inside the front cover of this Clay Target Shooting News (CTSN). Several new committee chairpersons are Mrs Cheryl Arnol (Tasmania) the chair of the "legal and governance" committee, Mr Arty Del-Ben (New South Wales), chair of the "championships" committee and Mr Garry Read (South Australia), chair of the "promotions and development" committee.

Cheryl brings a wealth of governance knowledge to the ACTA and will be a valuable asset in taking the association forward. Cheryl has also been elected to the position of Treasurer. Arty has represented the ACTA at numerous State, National and International events and is passionate about clay target competition, and will represent you all well in his portfolio. Garry is an active and progressive member of the executive and with the assistance of his committee will bring new initiatives to the association to progress membership and promotion of the sport.

The other committee chairpersons are Mrs Elaine Forward (Western Australia) – international shooting, Mr Ron Traill - rules, Mr Don Johnson (New South Wales) – grounds, Mr David Howe (Northern Territory) – coaching.

All of the present executive members come with a wealth of experience and will continue to lead the association into and beyond 2014.

The ACTA executive is there to progress and take the association forward into the "business" of clay target shooting. This association has to be run on a business model that will deliver each of the disciplines in the most efficient and financial manner. The next meeting of the Management Committee in August will consider the budget for the association for 2014. Mrs Cheryl Arnol as Treasurer has been invited to that meeting to assist in completing this on behalf of the association.

Once the Management Committee has met, minutes are typed and recommendations made, the full executive will meet by telephone to ratify (or not) all recommendations.

All members of the ACTA are reminded that if you have an issue that you believe should be discussed by the National Executive I remind everyone that each State has a process in place. In most States an issue is to be raised at the club level – then forwarded to the zone and finally to the State executive to ensure completeness. In most instances many issues can be (or have been) resolved before being referred to the ACTA. Utilising procedures already in place will lessen the workload on the ACTA office allowing them to complete other duties.

Executive Officer's Report

In this report I have decided to deal with two issues, sportsmanship \mathcal{O} membership. Clay target shooting is a sport and as such should be enjoyed by all and promoted by all as a great sport to be involved in. From an early age to later years in life male and female participants can enjoy clay target shooting. There appears to be a breakdown of sportsmanship in some sports these days and we do not want our sport to be one of them.

I would not put another person at risk in my sport, yet we have people associated with clay target shooting who would. An ACTA member not renewing their membership on time and continuing to shoot puts other members at risk. A non-member shooting "targets only" may seem to be a quick dollar for the club, however this person could cost you a great deal, as they are not entitled to shoot, nor do they have insurance cover. As our policy states, a person may attend 3 times before being required to become a member. This is not three times each year or three times per year at different clubs, it is 3 times. How many people in your club pay late membership, are you one of them? Are you aware that by exceeding the 28th February deadline, you and others on the ground are not insured should you cause an accident? This is putting members, clubs, volunteers and office bearers in legal jeopardy should an accident occur, as our insurer would not cover the person or club operating outside the scope of cover. This falls under both categories of membership and sportsmanship.

Sportsmanship is another interesting area and I will go back to when my father was a shooter many years ago. He talked often about the camaraderie and fellowship, about the tradition and history, about the honesty when shooting and refereeing. Our sport was built around integrity and honour within the sport. I hear of instances lately where this may have changed, I hope these are isolated instances. We have a Member Protection Policy in place to ensure people are aware of their rights. I would say to those in the ACTA, make a conscious effort to treat other members with respect and integrity. We have a positive future and need leaders to show the way, these leaders need not be the older generation. We all have a role to play in the promotion and development of the sport. As a member protection officer your role is to advise people where to take their complaint, not to solve the issue.

The National Executive have met during June, the results of the sub-committee meetings and the National Executive meeting will be made clear in the coming months when the ACTA will forward those recommendations and decisions on to the general membership. These executive members representing you, the shooters, do this job for no remuneration and at a great deal of cost in terms of money and time. They represent you and your States, and most importantly the National Body. They have a vision for the Association which will take us through to the World DTL Titles in Wagga Wagga in 2018. The decisions of the National Executive in planning for this event are critical in terms of the timing of Nationals and for further development of the National ground. Representation to various funding bodies has already commenced with the view of presenting the National ground as a world class shooting and entertainment venue.

On behalf of the National Executive I seek your support as a member of the Association in going forward. The National Executive and the staff of the ACTA are continuing to drive the Association forward, and there are many new initiatives to be introduced, all with one thing in mind, "Is it in the best interests of the Sport?" Answer: YES

This writing period included the Skeet Nationals, then a couple of weeks travelling to Alice Springs for the NT State Trap/Skeet Shoot and then another week travelling to Darwin for our winter holidays.

Sub Gauge Championships

The Pre Nationals were held on Sunday May 19th and comprised three events. The first two were the ACTA 28 gauge and 410 bore Championships and the last was the All States Skeet Championship. The most frequently asked questions that day were: 1. Why aren't the 28 and 410 National Titles? 2. When are they likely to be? And then 3. When will they be included in the Overall High Gun?

As these are pretty much the same questions that were posed when we first started to shoot the 20 gauge, I think the answers will also be very similar. In order they are: 1. Because not enough people shoot these events yet to make National Championships meaningful and relevant. 2. When a clear majority of the attendees at the Nationals participate. Probably at least two thirds, which would be about 100 as we currently get about 150 entrants. And 3. When at least 90% of the total entrants shoot these events.

Pre Nationals

This year the numbers in the two small gauge events were about the same as last year. Twelve squads, which is about 60 shooters. The All States 12 gauge event expanded out to sixteen squads or about 80 entrants. Shoot-offs for all three events were conducted as doubles at three, four and five in order to make sure they were finalised before dark as well as to gradually introduce this shoot-off format to

Psychological Skills for Shooting

WHEN I MISS, IS IT SELF DOUBT?

Over the next two months I will be in Europe, so I have reworked the original article that was written and published in September 1999. The main reason for this is that I am aware that there are lots of shooters and readers our there who were not members of the ACTA or shooting in 1999. So for those newer shooters and as a form of

revision for those who were around in 1999, here is the first article that was published.

The scene is any competition.

You are shooting well. You are clean.

Whilst you are waiting to shoot you start to hear instructions, in your head, on what to do next, thinking about the outcome of the next shot, adding up your score, working out how many targets are left, thinking of what you might win, etc. With these thoughts dominating your mind; you miss.

You regain your composure and after a few more targets you start thinking about the target you missed and it's possible, if you're not careful, you'll miss again.

Shooting, like all sports, involves two games: the outer game and the inner game. The outer game involves the sport itself: shooting the target. The outer game involves physical fitness, well fitting gun, reliable ammunition, correct stance and gun hold and all of the variables that are outside the shooter. The inner game involves mental fitness and requires the shooter to trust in his or her own ability to do what is required. Inner game strategies involve concentration, mental rehearsal, awareness, attention, relaxation, goal setting, etc.

The problem with either trap or skeet shooting is that an error will usually cost you the game or the match. There are rarely, second chances. In tennis, you can be down forty - love and still win the game; one or two poor strokes in Golf doesn't put you out. However, depending on the day, 24/25 or 49/50 may not be good enough. If a person can do something as difficult and as complicated as shoot a small moving object 49 times out of 50, then the problem is not with their technique, equipment or ability. The problem is most likely involves the inner game. We miss because we doubt our own ability.

To understand self doubt it is necessary to look at how the brain functions. Basically and for the purposes of this discussion, the brain is divided into two halves: the right side and the left side. These different sides play an important role in our ability to shoot, play golf, tennis, etc. The right side of the brain is responsible for muscle movement and co-ordination. In shooting this involves seeing the target, identifying it, tracking it, moving the body, holding the gun correctly, pulling the trigger and following through. The right side of the brain does and can continue to do these functions effortlessly and continuously. All that it required is that the muscles need to be relaxed.

The left side of the brain however, houses our language, analytical and judgmental skills. The left side also believes that our right side is incapable of doing what is necessary and therefore provides it with a barrage of instructions and "coaching tips" so that it can do it properly. In his book, *The Inner Game of Golf*, Tim Gallwey identifies these two sides of the brain as ego states and calls them Self 1 for the left side and self 2

for the right side of the brain. Gallwey found that when he was involved in a competition he would have to continually listen to a range of selfinstructional thoughts. On closer analysis of these thoughts he determined that it was self 1 doing the talking, it thought he knew how to play and was supervising self 2, the one who had to hit the ball or hit the clay target in respect to shooting. Self 1 did not only give self 2 instructions but criticised self 2 for past errors, warned self 2 about probable future ones, and harangued him whenever he makes a mistake. These instructions and judgments lead to an increase in tension, which in turn tightens the muscles; the result, is that we are no longer fluid or relaxed and therefore we cannot perform to our potential.

To summarise self 1 - the talking, thought producing self - is a lousy boss when it comes to control the body's muscle system. When self 2 - the body itself - is allowed control, the quality of performance , the level of enjoyment and the rate of learning are all improved. Self 2 is the total human organism, the natural entity. Self 1 does not have a physical existance; it is a phenomenon of mental self-interference who can and does interfere with our ability to perform.

For the brain to function closer to its potential the interference needs to minimised. This means that the basic premise of the inner game is; Performance = Self 2 (potential) minus Self 1 (interference). The object of inner game is to limit the interference of self 1 and trust in self 2 to perform and achieve.

Inner game techniques involve applying mental training skills that enable the shooter to maintain concentration, optimise performance and achieve results. These skills are not just the province of elite sportspeople; they can be learnt, so we can increase our performance, enjoyment and fun involved in competition.

Every time we compete, we make judgments as to our performance. When we are winning, we enjoy the handshakes, pats on the back and as a result we see ourselves, andour performance, as good. However, when we lose a competition or miss a shot, it is just as easy for us to judge what we did as bad. This value judgment of our performance has wide reaching implications. For example, for a right handed shooter, missing a hard right hand swinger from lane five. It is possible that self 1 will say something like: "... you missed again, you always miss those right hand swingers, you're really no good at these." If left unchecked and you miss that shot again, self 1 will increase the criticisms and begin to make it personal; for example, "... you missed it again. You're just no good at all." We now see ourselves as the problem not just the fact that for some reason or other we missed that target.

The first step to inner game success is to **let go** of the judgments. It is important that we see our performance as simply that: how we performed today. We must let go of the need to base our self-image/esteem on what we have achieved or what we think others will think about us as a result of our performance.

The second step is to **trust** self 2's ability and to stop trying. When we give ourselves the instruction to try harder, what we are really doing is tensing and tightening our muscles. In short: trying fails. Once we can let go of our judgments and trust in self 2 we can go onto to quieting the mind.

In subsequent articles, I will look at concentration, mental rehearsal, visualisation, etc as techniques that can be used to quieten the mind and limit the interference of self 1.

I read with great relief the "Rule Amendments, interpretations and proposed changes" as laid out on Page 6 of the October 2012 CTSN. In particular I found the proposed changes were finally being printed out for ALL shooters, in particular the lower grades, to read and give serious thought to. I fully support these proposed changes as detailed by Mr Traill, Chairman of the National Rules Committee, and therefore was anticipating a positive result from a majority of the States & Territories.

Unfortunately, that was not to be, and only a couple of States agreed with the Proposed Rule Changes.

My message to all the other States and Territories who saw fit to reject Mr Traill's proposed changes is quite Clear, Concise and To the Point!

This situation has to be addressed, and NOT swept under the carpet by people in positions of power/authority who are still thinking in a manner consistent with the "living in the past" attitudes of 1913 or even 1813. This current year is, for those who may not be aware of it is, 2013!

The real factors behind these proposed changes put forward by *Mr* Traill are extremely obvious, even to the "Village Idiot", yet State Associations just don't get it. These proposed changes are even explained in the last paragraph situated in the bottom right hand corner of Page 6 of the October 2012 CTSN.

However, there is one factor that affects ALL of us, and it is



quite simply put – it's called AGING – or is that getting older?

For all those members of the various State/Territory Associations you should try and remember one thing.

As we get older, we get slower in both our physical and mental reaction times, our eyesight degenerates and of our course we also become slower in our physical movements, which in turn can, but not always, result in one being "puffed out" or "tired" much sooner.

The end result of all this is that many, but not all, shooters simply cannot shoot the scores they might have done some 20, 30, 40 or even 50 years ago, and therefore, as a result, are no longer competitive in their grade, and are most likely over handicapped to buggery. I know, as I am one of many thousands in that very situation.

Finally, there is one very important reason for rapid reconsideration by the various States/Territories.

We need to keep more members than we are at this point in time!

There is no real incentive for the average novice to improve themselves, and unless they are really talented, with plenty of cash or access to plenty of cash. They will just shoot for the fun of it, and when the fun disappears, so will they, especially when they see that they have to climb from 87% up to 94%, just to go up a grade.

Added to this, and in part, is the fact that Club's suffer when shooters simply don't enter events because they know they are NOT competitive, and can't/won't be handicapped/graded fairly based on their ability.

I look forward to reading feedback on this matter in future issues of the CTSN.





Ross was a long serving member of the New South Wales Gun Club, where over a period of almost 30 years he held at different times, the positions of Senior and Junior Vice President, Club Captain Director, Shoot Marshall, Firearms Safety Officer, Trophy purchaser, Club Photographer, Licensee and like the other members of the Board at that time, worked behind the Bar or on the BBQ or where ever else he was required.

Ross joined the Club's Board in the '70's at a time when the Club was facing financial difficulties; membership had declined to less than 50 members. The Club inability to deal with the NSW Labour Government's new legislation dealing with Lead and Noise Pollution didn't assist with its viability to continue, it only further encumbered the Club's ability to survive.

Ross did not for a moment shirk away from his duty as a member and as an officer of the Club. He rose to meet the challenge with his fellow directors of bringing the Club back. He worked tirelessly with his fellow directors in making the Club what it is today.

Ross was an AA grade Trap shooter, who represented the Club as a member of the New South Wales Gun Club Team. He won the Club's Champion of Champions competition and as testimony his name is permanently on the Club's honour board. He also competed as a skeet, field

Ross in his private life was a successful business man, being the Rolex Agent for NSW for most of his working life and to most of us, he was Mr Rolex.

Ross enjoyed fishing, sailing and hunting when away from the Club. In recent years he found time to travel abroad, and enjoyed cruising with his wife ludy.

He will be missed by those who held him close to their hearts and by his mates from the New South Wales Gun Club.

NSW Members and Dealers

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

(a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.
