National President's Notes

I am currently overseas competing in Ireland and catching up with several organisations whilst here.

Over the last month the National Executive has been busy preparing for the 2013 National Sporting Clays competition to be held in Wagga in August along with the first Management Committee meeting. The office and the Championships Committee will ensure that both of these events will have run smoothly, as at the

time of writing this report preparations were well advanced.

The August Management Committee meeting will include the setting of the budget for 1 January to 31 December 2014. Each of the committees of the ACTA have some interesting and important issues and projects to complete for the whole of the membership. Details of each of these will be discussed in further reports.

Once the budget and each of the initiatives are ratified by the full Executive the details will be included in the ACTA "Business Plan". Each of the committees will have each initiative detailed in the plan along with the timeline, objective, costing and outcome. Review of the plan will take place at the June 2014 National Executive Meeting with committees required to report as to the deliverables. This will assist in ensuring the office, ground staff and Executive Members complete initiatives in a timely manner.

As of the June 2013 Executive Meeting, all State Secretaries have been provided with the minutes for the information of member clubs. These minutes are only provided once ratified (and in this case approximately two weeks after the meeting) and are now also on the ACTA website. If as a member you wish to raise any issue resulting from these minutes, please do so through your club, zone and State so it can be brought up before the Executive. Communication is vital to members and clubs and as such all future minutes will be provided in the same manner once ratified.

Presently the ACTA insurance policy provides public liability, director's and officers insurance for committees as well as other insurances to cover volunteers and members. Details of these have been made available to all clubs. It must be pointed out that there are several inclusions in the policy, one of which is that all clubs must have a current first aid kit provided for use at all times and also someone present that is currently qualified in the use of that kit. Failure to do so may place the member club at risk of litigation should an incident occur. If all club secretaries can please check their clubs first aid kit for currency and update any outdated supplies at the earliest opportunity.

The results of the 2013 Macintosh Team shoot have been announced and I am proud to announce that Australia came first in all four team shoots — Open, Junior, Ladies and Veteran's. The National Executive and I together with the membership of the ACTA congratulate team members on their success. I have already had the opportunity to boast of the success here in Ireland to the Chairman and Secretary of the Irish Clay Pidgeon Association who are looking forward to next year's challenge.

Good luck everyone in your shooting and I look forward to seeing members in the coming months.

Executive Officer's Report

At the recent meeting of the ACTA Executive, the following items discussed/developed will be of interest to members.

1. The National Executive is currently revising the ACTA constitution in line with changes to the Associations Act Victoria 2012. This re-write needs to be completed by November this year. There are a number of identified issues that we are required to address as part of this review to comply with the law. Our solicitors, Landers and Rogers, are currently working with us to ensure that we are legally covered and to formulate the best possible constitutional structure for the Association.
2. The National Executive has determined and implemented a Social Media Policy for all members of the Association. This Policy is available on the ACTA website. We as an association respect everyone's right to have an opinion. That opinion however should be well thought out and be specific to fact, not innuendo and vilification. The policy clearly sets out acceptable behaviour and what is considered unacceptable. The penalty for abuse is also clearly defined and will be enforced for the safety of our members.
3. The National Executive has agreed on a promotion that will see all juniors who have never attended a national

championship be given that opportunity in 2014. The Executive encourages all juniors to attend and compete at national championships and to experience elite competition at a national level. Therefore, any junior wishing to attend will need to nominate through the normal process, however nominations will be FREE.

The ACTA encourages all clubs to assist their juniors with support and assistance in any form, be that coaching or financial. Perhaps, as a suggestion, a one off "fundraiser" to assist juniors or a "practice night" with proceeds to a "grants" fund within the club. If you have any suggestions on how your club promotes your juniors, or promotes the club in general, please let us know, we will share it with all clubs through a feature in the CTSN and on the ACTA website.

Recently I met with AISL CEO Damien Marangon. In the next issue I will elaborate on that meeting and the opportunities this partnership with AISL has to offer.

Robert Nugent is currently representing the ACTA at the ICTSF meeting in Canada. A full report on the outcomes of that meeting will be forthcoming in the next edition of the CTSN.

2013 Australian Skeet Nationals

National Ground – Wagga Wagga, May 19th – 25th

On the third week of May 2013, 147 skeet shooters converged on the National Ground in Wagga Wagga for the 2013 Australian Skeet Nationals. As always, the grounds looked immaculate and although cold, the weather promised to be reasonably good. Locals and visitors alike, coming from all over Australia and even from New Zealand, England and the USA, were all anticipating a fun and competitive week ahead and everyone was excited to get into the events.

Sunday the 19th of May was a Pre Nationals, made up of 3 events – the 50 target 28 Gauge Championship, the 50 target 410 Bore Championship and the 50 target All States Championship.

Event 1 was the 28 Gauge Championship. The overall winner, after a shoot off, was Glenn Clarke with a score of 58/58. Glenn won the Tri Colour sash.

After a brief shoot off, Mal came out on top to win the Casella Wines Perpetual Trophy, Royal Blue Sash and Silver Australia badge.

Hundreds were posted by Michael Buttigieg, Harry Bader, Kelvin Gutsell and Paul Johnston.

First to go was Harry Bader in the first round, while the other 3 cleaned up the first box. However, in the second round of the shoot off, Paul dropped a high 4, while Michael let low 6 go, leaving Kelvin to take the John Withers Memorial Trophy, Royal Blue Sash and Silver Australia badge.

The winning team from New South Wales, decided by count back, was made up of Anthony Annechini, Frank Marcellino and Reg Petts. They received the ACTA Shoulder to Shoulder badges.

With all of the team shoots completed, the opening ceremony was conducted and the Nationals officially opened. The Best Presented Team was also awarded, and this year was given to the Northern Territory, who received the A&M Denton Perpetual Trophy and gold ACTA medals.

The event for the day was the 14th National Skeet Handicap. After the first 50, there were a large number of shooters still remaining, so the shoot off proved to be a long one. When the field was down to just 3, Laurie Chelepy (AA0), Chris Hughes (B3) and Mark Corbett

(A1) and after 4 rounds of shoot off, the decision was made to come back the next day to finish the event as the light conditions were deemed too dark. The following morning, the 3 shooters came back to continue. Laurie was the first to drop out on low 4, shortly followed by Chris Hughes on low 5, leaving Mark Corbett to take the Colin Burt Memorial Trophy, Royal Blue Sash and Silver Australia badge.

Ben then let high 4 go, which made Harry Bader the winner of the A & E Pederson Perpetual Trophy, Royal Blue Sash and Silver Australia badge.

The final day of the 2013 Skeet Nationals was Saturday the 25th, the 27th National Skeet Doubles Championship. As is customary for doubles day at the Nationals, the wind came up a little bit but conditions were still fairly good. No possibles were shot but Eddy Elder, Michael Buttigieg and Benn Baker posted 98s on the score board and shot off for the overall. Michael was out after the second station, but Benn and Eddy both continued on for 8 stations until on the way back, Benn dropped one on station 4. On Friday the 24th of May 2013, the Skeet Hall of Fame dinner was held at the RSL club in Wagga Wagga. As per usual, the night was a tremendous success with a big list of awards, presentations and the induction of Mr. Laurie Chelepy into the Hall of Fame. Full credit goes to Glenn Clarke with all of the hard work he puts in every year as the designer and presenter, he once again made it a great night.

2012 ACHIEVEMENTS

The year in review started off the night, with Glenn covering who won which events at all the major shoots throughout the year. Congratulations to all the shooters who won State and National Titles.

In 2012, the ACTA also sent an Australian team to the World Shoot. There were some fantastic results both from the team and other Australian shooters who attended. Achievements included:

- 200 x 20 Gauge Shane O'Brien
- 200 x 200 Mini World Dave O'Sullivan (12G and 28G)
- Glenn Walker and Dave O'Sullivan 150 x 150 12 Gauge (only 20 x 150s shot overall)
- Lorraine Hughes 149 x 150 12 Gauge
- Australian Team (David O'Sullivan, Paul Johnston, Glenn Clarke, Craig O'Neill and Shane O'Brien): 2nd overall
- 100s from Paul Johnston (12G); Nigel Hughes and Shane O'Brien (20G); Harry Bader and Dave O'Sullivan (28G).

LONG BREAKS

Each year, long break awards are offered in the 12G, 20G and doubles. In 2012, Paul Johnston achieved the 12 Gauge long break for the year with a score of 305, shot at the NSW State Titles. The World Championships in San Antonio was the epicentre for the 20G and the doubles. Shane O'Brien shot a great 100/100 in the Mini World 20 Gauge, followed by another 100 in the main event to give him 200 straight in the 20 Gauge. Lorraine Hughes missed very early on in the doubles of the Mini World, but ran the last 94 to achieve the 2012 doubles long break.

GRAND SLAM

The Grand Slam Award is only presented when a person has achieved 200 x 12 Gauge, 100 x 20 Gauge and 100 Doubles. Two and a half years ago, Michael Buttigieg showed his face on the Skeet field with much enthusiasm. In February 2012, Mike broke 239 in the 12 Gauge and 207 in the 20 Gauge at the Victorian State Titles. In March, he shot a 103 break in doubles at the Bairnsdale 400 Shoot, which was only the 5th 100 shot in doubles by an Australian on home soil. This meant that within a period of 2 months, and with only a couple of years experience,

Mike achieved what many shooters have been trying to do for decades. Congratulations Mike.

ADRIAN COUSENS MEDAL

The Brownlow of skeet shooting was next with the Adrian Cousens medal, a highly competitive and sought after award. The finalists at the end of the year were Glenn Clarke, Craig O'Neill, Nigel Hughes and David O'Sullivan. The year started as a Craig and Dave battle, going from one state to another and seeing each other in many shoot offs; a particular highlight was the 11 round shoot off at the WA State Titles where Craig was victorious. Glenn Clarke thought he would kick into gear late in October, winning 3 of the 4 events at the Tasmanian State Titles. Under the radar all year was Nigel Hughes, who won the Doubles at the Australian Nationals and the New Zealand Nationals High Gun. When the last shot was fired in New Zealand in November, we had a winner for the Adrian Cousens medal with no more shoots left. The winner was David O'Sullivan from Bairnsdale with 2 National Titles and 8 State Title wins for the year, accruing 100 HOF points ahead of Nigel on 70, Craig on 50, and Glenn bringing up the rear on 30 points. David had his eye set on winning this Medal for a few years and it finally came to fruition and was presented by Adrian Cousens himself.

AA ELITE

The past year saw eight more people added to the prestigious list of Skeet AA Elite shooters. These were: Shane Bennett, Nigel Hughes, Martin Perry, Jacqui Durham (First Woman inducted), Peter Vosper, Peter Vella, Gil Farish and Edward Elder (First Junior inducted). Congratulations to each on your achievement.

HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE

The main part of the night saw the induction of the very deserving shooter, Laurie Chelepy, into the Skeet Hall of Fame. Laurie's shooting began in the early 1970s, when he joined the Rockhampton Gun Club and enjoyed shooting with his brother, Dave. In 1984, Laurie and wife Candy lost all their possessions in a devastating house fire, and ended up living at the Rockhampton Gun Club for three months. The extra practice that this allowed Laurie paid off the following year when he won the Queensland State High Gun, as a C Grade shooter, over Adrian Cousens. Needless to say, this was the end of Laurie's C Grade victories, moving straight up to AA grade where he remains today. This was also the start of Laurie's devotion to the Queensland State Skeet Shoots, attending 18 years in a row and only missing the 19th for his daughter's 21st birthday.

In 1986, Laurie attended his first national competition, where he won the Commonwealth Skeet Championship. Laurie's skeet success continued as he made the Australian team to travel to New Zealand in 1993. Another particularly memorable moment came for Laurie in 2000, when his son, Michael, won the Sub-Junior National High Gun and Laurie won the National 12 Gauge Championship.

But Laurie's success has never interfered with his skeet shenanigans, with the 2011 New Zealand National Titles a particularly good example. Todd Bender spoke of Laurie's larrikin nature following the first event when Laurie proudly announced to Todd that it was Chelepy 1-Bender 0. After Chelepy 2-Bender 0, Laurie presented Todd with 'the rock', a lucky totem (picked up from the gun club parking lot a few moments earlier) that would aid Todd's performance. Todd won the next three events and has since carried the rock with him. As a token towards Laurie's skeet achievements, induction into the Hall of Fame, and in appreciation of his friendly character, Todd presented Laurie with his World Championship watch.

Overall, Laurie's shooting achievements include 3 National Titles, 6 National Runner-Ups, 14 State Titles, 13 All Australian Teams, 6 Australian / New Zealand Trans Tasman teams, and 1 Macintosh Team. He was the first person to be inducted into AA Elite and is the 6th to now be inducted into the Skeet Hall of Fame. Congratulations Laurie on such outstanding achievements, we all look forward to seeing your future successes add to your remarkable shooting career.

Hall of Fame Awards

Back in my column in the June issue of the CTSN, I detailed and elaborated on one of the many awards we present annually at the Hall of Fame Dinners. Those awards are for the longest breaks achieved in specified events during the previous calendar year. This month I want to continue in that vein and explain another related set of awards that we hope to be able to present each year. They are the Grand Slam awards

Grand Slam Awards

First off a Grand Slam award is actually the end product of achieving a full set of three

other individual specified achievements. Those three achievements in Trap Shooting are a 400 target break off 15 metres, a 50 target break off 25 metres and a 50 target break in Double Rise. Similarly in Skeet Shooting the requirement is for a 200

target break in a 12 gauge event, a 100 target break in a 20 gauge event and a 100 target break in a Skeet Doubles event.

Time criteria

The next point to keep in mind is that a Grand Slam award is a lifetime achievement. There is no time limitation on how long you are allowed to take to accumulate the three individual legs of the criteria. In theory you could start your shooting career and achieve one of the legs after three or four years and then struggle along for another ten years before achieving another one. Then for some reason you might quit shooting altogether with an incomplete set and no intention to return. But another ten years later you could make a come-back and then eventually shoot the missing link and thus become eligible to receive an award at the next Hall of Fame function.

Multiple awards

And the flip side of that aspect is the fact that the award is only a one time occurrence. Once you have been presented with a Grand Slam award there is no point in setting out to accumulate a carbon copy of the criteria because there are no second or third awards. To quote an old mate of mine who had a unique ability to be able to express himself in a concise and picturesque manner "You either have one or you don't".

Listing of breaks

Likewise there is no benefit, award wise, in accumulating multiple reoccurrences of any one individual leg. Your name will only appear once on any of the three lists and once it has been added to that list, it's there forever. The only partial exception to that rule occurs due to the fact that the lists specify the date and venue where the break occurred and the earliest occurrence is always given precedence. Sometimes past breaks are unable to be substantiated at the time and so later a more current break is listed, but if the earlier break can eventually be verified then it will be listed instead.

Verification

Which brings us to the matter

of verification. Current breaks are often quite easy to verify. Sometimes you needn't do anything at all on the day of the break. If you are after a 400 target break off 15 metres and you win a double barrel event with a score in excess of 400 then you can simply wait until those shoot results are printed in the CTSN and photocopy that particular page and enclose it with your application.

Complicated verification

However if the break occurs over more than one event you may need to get a photocopy of the relevant scoresheets to support your application. Sometimes the trail of events may be long and complicated and include both shoot-off targets and team shoots. Then you may need a letter of explanation from the shoot secretary to accompany the scoresheets, detailing the order in which all the targets were broken.

Historic verification

Which brings us back to the difficulties that are often encountered when attempting to substantiate old breaks. Like current ones, the clear cut ones may well prove very easy by virtue of advertised results, but the more complicated ones may be extremely difficult or even impossible to ever verify. Even if old shoot record books can be accessed, the necessary supporting scoresheets may well have become part of the landfill a long time ago.

Break badges – Skeet

When all else fails, break badges can sometimes be of assistance in supporting old claims, particularly in Skeet Shooting. For instance a 200 target 12 gauge skeet break may be accepted if accompanied by a photocopy of the shoot program from one issue of the CTSN, plus photocopies of break badge lists and shoot results from later issues and a letter of explanation detailing the chain of events. Due to the way that shoot programs are usually structured, break badges for 20 Gauge or Skeet Doubles achievements will generally prove to be of much greater assistance and far simpler when used to support a break claim. However break badges in isolation will not substantiate any claim as some have definitely been issued in error and they are occasionally available on e-bay.

Break badges – Trap

Likewise in Trap Shooting, break badges for Double Rise and 25 metre (or 27 yard) Handicap will generally be of great assistance for the purposes we are examining. Unfortunately, the break badge avenue is even more complicated and less helpful when trying to use it to substantiate a 15 metre break, due to some technical differences in the Trap section of the Rule Book. Trap break badges are issued for all single targets shot from 15 metres and beyond off an oscillating trap.

Rules differences

First this means that they also include Single Barrel targets. Now although this in itself does

not create a technical problem for the matter at hand, it has certainly become a major bone of contention recently at the Trap Nationals where a lot of big Double Barrel breaks have been interrupted and terminated by the necessity to shoot the Single Barrel event in the middle of them. However that is a matter for the Rules Committee to debate and I mention it here in passing purely as a point of interest. What is relevant is that ACTA Trap break badges may include Handicap targets shot from behind 15 metres or Championship targets shot from 18 metres, which although clearly more difficult, technically do not comply. So although break badges may assist your cause, they are not the "be all and end all" that they may initially appear.

Finalisation

So, how do you reach the point where this whole exercise comes to fruition and you are invited to a Hall of Fame dinner to receive a Grand Slam award? Initially you need to achieve each of the three breaks. Then each of those achievements needs to be able to be verified in some acceptable way. And finally the hall of fame committee needs to become aware that they have occurred. The first part is self explanatory and the second is detailed above. Although the Hall of Fame Committee may do some historical research and list some achievements automatically, there is no guarantee or intention that this will happen.

Application

Once you have achieved one of the breaks and secured the necessary verification, the best way to ensure that your name gets added to that particular list is to submit an official application to the ACTA Head Office. This is best done either in writing by mail with photocopies of

proof stapled to your letter, or conversely by e-mail with your scanned verification documents as an attachment. Please mark all applications to the attention of Sue Vesperman, as she collates all the information for the Hall of Fame Committee.

Substantiation

To view a list of all known break holders, go to the ACTA website and follow the links through either the Trap or Skeet sections under the Hall of Fame tab. Above the various lists you will also find the official criteria set out including the fact that the onus is not on the ACTA to disprove any claims, but instead on the claimant to provide proof of any such claims being made. For Skeet Breaks this information is also available on the ASSA website at www.myassa.com.au due to a data sharing arrangement with that organisation. Good luck with your efforts to achieve a Grand Slam award and I look forward to the pleasure of handing out many more over the coming years.

July's Trivia Question

I am not sure who was the youngest winner of an Overall National Championship in either Trap or Skeet prior to 1980, although I would be interested to hear from anyone with any ideas on it. However what I am fairly sure of is that when Russell Mark was awarded the win in the Double Barrel that year, he took over the record. Russell had just turned sixteen the week before he left to go to the Nationals.

Seven years later at the 1987 Trap Nationals in Brisbane, Michael Diamond won his first National Title and took over that record for the youngest winner when he beat the great Doug Smith to also win the National Double

Barrel. At that time Michael was still about six weeks short of his fifteenth birthday. This means that Michael has held that record now for over twenty six years and as Mitchell Iles will turn fifteen just before next years Trap Nationals, I'm starting to think that Michael may well get to hold it for another quarter of a century. The first correct answer came from Helen Devlin of Albury. Congratulations.

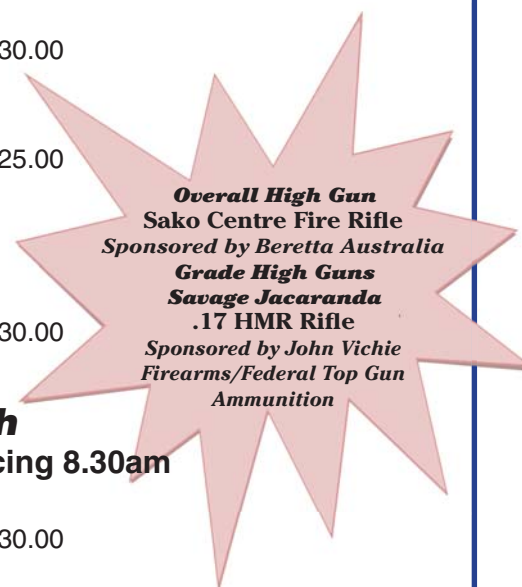

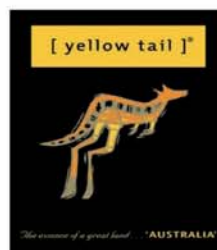

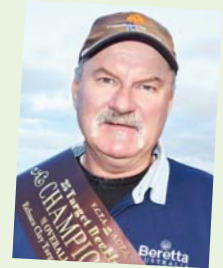

Psychological Skills for Shooting

Michael Kruger-Davis



GUNFIT

There are many factors involved with successful shooting: physical skills, technical skills, mental skills and most of all enjoyment. Good scores come together when all these components are aligned and working together. Picture gunfit like a cog, with physical skills, mental skills, technical skills and enjoyment as teeth of an opposing cog

meshing and working in unison to achieve results. Gunfit is probably the most significant non-mental factor affecting peak performance.

How can this be? I hear you ask. Well, think about what is important in gunfit.

To illustrate this point, I need to quote Michael Yardley, author of *Gunfitting: The Quest for Perfection for Shotguns and Rifles*, "The primary aim when gunfitting should be to produce a gun that flows with the hands and eye – an extension of the body that is not perceived as being apart from it. The well-fitted gun controls recoil. It promotes consistency and economy of movement. It encourages good style and helps to turn the act of shooting into a graceful, flowing motion. Anything that impedes that flow or disrupts the relationship between the eye and the target is an indication of poor fit."

So, if the gun fits well, it is an extension of the body and therefore can impact on all of the factors that go together to produce successful shooting.

Physical factors: The gun will be well balanced: usually at or just behind the hinge pins. The balance will affect the ability to move and swing the gun. Secondly, recoil will be minimised and tolerable. Because of Newton's Third Law of Motion: That every force has an equal and opposite reaction, recoil can never be eliminated, but it can be reduced to an acceptable level. Thirdly, the shooter's dominant eye will be in line with the rib on the barrels. Next, the gun will be of acceptable weight: light enough to be able to used over and over again and heavy enough to absorb some of the recoil.

Technical Factors: Firstly, the hands and eyes must work together: to hold the gun, to point the gun, to swing and move the gun. The gun barrels must be extensions of the arms and eyes. The shooter needs to be able to track the line of the target, acquire the target and either lock on to the target or using some form of lead move past the target and shoot where the target will be. This sounds easy, but the brain takes a fair deal of persuading that to hit the target you have to pull the trigger when you are pointing at the sky. This is why it is difficult for beginners to master some stations on a skeet layout or shoot some crossers, battues or rabbits on a sporting or field and game range. Secondly, the muscles have to remember what they have done before and do it again. Clay target shooting, in all its disciplines, is a muscle memory sport. The repetitive action of the muscle movements set up a template for doing it over and over again. The mind learns when to pull the trigger based on overlearning. Thirdly, it is important to know where the gun is pointing. Both the point of impact (POI) and point of aim (POA) are important. A well-fitted gun will take in consideration both the POA and the POI. Having an adjustable stock, and/or an adjustable rib, will give the shooter the necessary options to change the gun's configuration to meet his/her needs. Whilst Length of pull, drop at the comb, drop at the heel are important factors to consider, it is important that pitch is not overlooked. Both the pattern plate and an Arrow Laser Shot are useful in working out the POI and POA.

Mental Factors: The prime mental factor is confidence. Confidence or self-confidence is defined as how firmly you believe in your ability to execute a physical skill or perform a task. If we feel confident in our equipment: our gun, our ammunition and how the gun fits, then we will perform well. A lack of confidence leads to self-doubt. Self-doubt leads to the muscles tightening up, losing fluidity and then missing or choking. Confidence, comes from a baseline assessment of past performances, training, and preparation. As competency or skill mastery grows, your confidence becomes proportionally stronger, which is strengthened more with successful training, quality practice and peak performance. Having a well fitting gun, allows us to become a more competent shooter and as stated above this level of competency reinforces our level of confidence. Next, as we become more competent and confident we become more consistent, more competitive, more committed, more composed and more in control. These factors lead to us being more competitive. These factors mesh together to produce mental toughness.

In the quest for perfection as a clay target shooter, gunfit is a significant factor that is within our control. It won't make you a perfect shot on its own, but it will influence the physical, technical and mental skills required for peak performance. If we use an ill-fitting gun, our mind will teach our body how to fit to the gun, our scores might be OK but they will never be consistently outstanding. So if you have a gun off the rack, or you are just missing targets for what appears no reason, then it might be worthwhile to find a gunfitter or reputable coach, to look at how well your gun fits.

Peter Marcoionni 1934-2013



The International Gun Club was founded in 1964 by a group of friends on the Patrilli Wines property at McClaren Vale in South Australia, with very humble beginnings of a one hand loaded trap that was behind a steel framed shield built by one of the members the club has grown to the State's prime clay target shooting park with two trench layouts and several skeet and DTL grounds.

In the late 1960's the committee were looking for a new ground to expand the club and Peter Marcoionni was a shooter who had recently joined the club and offered his property at Virginia at no rental cost. The committee met with Peter and on a hand shake the club had it's new ground, the club bought it's first electric trap for this new ground but back then still needed a trapper boy to place each clay target on the arm, from here the club grew to having several traps and then establishing the first trench layout in South Australia. Peter played a key role in the team

to physically build many parts of the club, the shoots at Peter's property are the most memorable as many of us had young families with wives and children enjoying the outdoors and many family days together in the sport we love. At Peter's property we ran the first Trench Nationals in South Australia with just the one layout.

In the early 1980's the State Shooting Park became available to the club, the State Shooting Park had a well established Pistol Club but no clay target facilities, basically a salt bush paddock was offered for development. Peter worked hard to establish the first grounds and his efforts formed the start of the premier clay target shooting ground of today. Peter was inducted as a life member of the SACTA in 2011 as an acknowledgement of his contribution to the development of clay target shooting in the state.

Over the 50 years of the club's existence Peter has held positions for almost all those years either as a committee member or as club president and together with his family worked extensively for all the clay target shooters in the state. Peter was always supported and assisted by his wife Camilla, son Robbie and daughter Anna and together brought many happy days to the extended clay target shooting fraternity.

The International Gun Club Committee, club members and all clay target shooters want to thank Peter for all his years of hard work and passion for the club, he will be sadly missed and we offer our sincere sympathy to his family and thank them for all their support over many years.

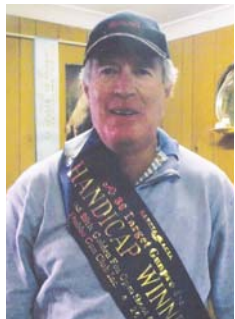

- the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

- the licence or permit number of the seller,
- the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.
