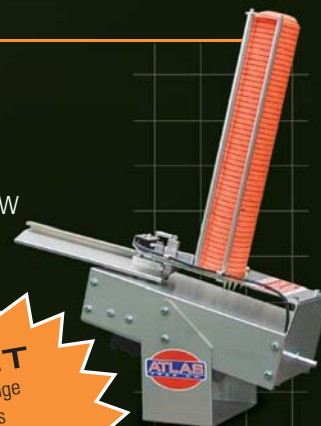

National President's Notes

"Allan — you can only jump 4 feet 11 inches."

These were the words that felt like a sledgehammer hitting me in the stomach. When I was younger (much younger) I attempted to gain selection into the Victorian State athletic development squad. Tryouts ascertained that I was suitable to compete in the heptathlon as I was built like a racing greyhound and measured six inches taller than any other competitor.

I had no problems in running the 100 metres, 200 metres, 800 metres, long jump in fact every discipline required. Except the high jump. In practice I could clear well over 5 feet (the

minimum requirement), however when it came to the tryouts I couldn't. Eventually the head coach looked me straight in the eyes and said those opening words. It was over.

Those were the rules. The policy said that if I didn't meet the minimum criteria in the time set, I wasn't to be considered for selection into the development squad. It wasn't even for a place on the State team!

We presently have a group of shooters that are going through a similar issue. There have been numerous emails circulating stating that the Australian International Shooting Limited (AISL) and the Australian Sports Commission (ASC) aren't looking after ISSF shooters. They are also asking that the ACTA break away from being an AISL member and become its own National Sporting Organisation (NSO) in its own right.

This raises several issues. The ASC is the Australian Government body that develops, supports and invests in all sports in Australia. In meetings with the ASC they have advised that they will not recognise any other body than that which represents all shooting disciplines. AISL. The ASC will not compromise on this requirement. AISL is recognised at the peak body for target shooting sports in Australia and is an organisation developed to promote and run competition to select athletes to compete in ISSF events at international level, including the World Cup, Commonwealth Games and Olympic Games.

AISL has developed policies and procedures that are made known to all athletes prior to competition. Every sport and organisation has rules (policies) and procedures to assist members to know what is required of them to achieve a particular level. Not being able to achieve that level can be disappointing however with determination, training, correct attitude and coaching this can be turned around. These policies and procedures are on the AISL website at www.auss shooting.org

The ACTA (as a member body) can break away from AISL however this would then mean that the Australian Sports Commission would not recognise our athletes for funding and athletes would not be considered for high level international competition. This is not fair to those that wish to compete and are working towards a World, Commonwealth or Olympic dream.

For clarification, at the time of writing this article, the member bodies of AISL are the Australian Clay Target Association, Field & Game Federation of Australia, the National Rifle Association of Australia, Pistol Australia and Target Rifle Australia with the ACTA having four representatives, one each on the Executive Board (Mr Russell Mark), high performance committee and technical committee (Mrs Elaine Forward), athletes committee (Mr Tom Turner) and coaches committee (Mr Dave Howe). Mr Russell Mark is standing down as a Board member in November and the ACTA has the opportunity to recommend to AISL a replacement. At this time it is not known who will be recommended.

The ACTA on behalf of the ISSF shooters has written to AISL making recommendations for the improvement for the selection of members to compete at an international level. As a result of these recommendations consideration was given to removing the position qualification score (PQS) and a multi-tiered athlete development program is to be incepted as replacement. This takes away the definitive point that must be reached (PQS) — a sticking point for ISSF athletes and now allows for a more subjective means of assessment. More on this will be provided in future CTSN articles to be provided by the ACTA International Shooting Committee.

The ACTA Executive supports the Australian International Shooting Limited and Australian Sports Commission and will continue working with both organisations for the benefit of ACTA members.

Onto other disciplines! The Executive is formulating a committee to commence the preparation for hosting the 2015 World Sporting Clays Championships, of which much of the planning will run into the 2018 World DTL Championships. Planning and work needs to be completed to host and conduct these events to deliver a professional event to the world. A team from Australia is attending the World DTL in New Zealand next year to see how they do it and learn from their successes! More of these events will be provided in coming months.

The ACTA in June 2013 inceptioned a social media and cyber bullying policy as a requirement for all sporting organisations. This is easy to locate on the ACTA website at www.claytarget.com.au and members are asked to look at it and consider the ramifications if you publish any offensive, provocative or hateful language or utilise social media to attack another person or organisation.

The penalty for a breach is a one year suspension from the ACTA.

Now that spring is here and in southern States it means better weather conditions and favourable targets I hope you all have the opportunity to attend your club, zone or State shoot in the coming months. I look forward to seeing you around the grounds.

Executive Officer's Report

An extremely important issue for the ACTA is that of incorporation. Due to changes to the Incorporation Act in Victoria the ACTA needs to move to an incorporated body registered in NSW and in Australia, or to a company limited by guarantee. The National Executive is examining the options being provided by our solicitors, Landers and Rogers (who specialise in Incorporation and Constitutional Law). While we are required by law to make these changes to comply with different NSW State requirements, this also presents us an opportunity to review our constitution.

All recommendations will be put forward to members (Clubs) to vote on, as required under the constitution. At this stage we are still taking advice and having the options reviewed to ensure we propose the best possible outcome for the Association and for members whilst complying with corporate law. Further information will be forthcoming to clubs and individuals through various avenues including the ACTA website over the next few months. We will detail where we need to go (legally) and the options available with the pro's and con's of those options. I encourage all members to have an input into the changes. These changes will be in the best interests of the Association. Given that this change is a legal requirement it would be remiss of the National Executive not to review the constitution to ensure it clearly reflects good governance and the ideals of the sport. I look forward to reporting on those options and putting scenarios forward in the near future.

There have been numerous requests to the ACTA for support of funding applications. These have all consequently been provided and we will continue to provide letters of support for any worthwhile development to Clubs and States. To assist you and to provide a more streamlined response

we will also seek AISL support on your behalf for developments of ISSF related facilities.

The new membership year is just around the corner. November 1st is the start of the 2014 new member year, with 2014 memberships being accepted from that date forward. We remind all members that renewals are due by the 1st of January 2014. If you have not joined by that date you will be classed as a non-member. These rules and policies are to safeguard all our members. The Association has introduced the "Club Only" category for 2014 at a cost of \$50.00. This allows the shooter to shoot practice targets at their club. It comes with a Club card with details of their membership. The "New Start" membership at \$73.50 for first registered year only, allows members to shoot targets or competition at their club only. These initiatives are being implemented to support the ACTA requirement in relation to membership. If they are not a member, they are not to shoot. The only exception is for affiliated Sporting Associations shooting ACTA 5 stand shooting.

Our insurance has been tendered out for 2014 and the results of the tender will be made known once the process has been completed. We have explained our situation to all potential insurers (as a matter of disclosure) in relation to clubs having two insurance policies over their ground. We will be guided by our insurers and advise member clubs appropriately.

The National Executive continue to support and guide the association, we can only go forward with your support.

Insurance Questions Answered

There have been many questions in relation to insurance over the past few months. Most of these are in relation to non-members of the Association including those from "limited affiliated" associations including Field and Game and SSAA.

We need to be clear, this is about protecting our members:

Our constitution states that anyone shooting on an ACTA ground must be a member. That is, if they do not join prior to the 1st of January each year they are "technically" not members. This includes ACTA members not renewing their membership on time and continuing to shoot puts other members at risk.

It is our current insurers who have granted the grace period.

A non-member shooting "targets only" is introducing a new person to the sport and the club, however this is limited to 3 visits to an ACTA ground, this person could cost your club and officials a great deal if this is outside the guidelines. They DO NOT have insurance cover after shooting three times, or shooting a discipline other than those they are entitled to. Reciprocal membership only allows those people affiliated with F&G, SSAA etc to shoot in 5 stand competition or 5 stand practice.

As our insurance policy states, a person may attend 3 times before being required to become a member. This is not three times each year or three times per year at different clubs, it is three times. This is putting members, clubs, volunteers and office bearers in legal jeopardy should an accident occur, as our insurer would not cover the person or club operating outside the scope of cover.

Members pay membership fees to be a part of the Club to enjoy the benefits the Club has built up over many years of volunteer work and some Government grants to assist the Club grow. Those wishing

ATTENTION NON ACTA MEMBERS: By order of the ACTA

- Please sign and fill in details in Non Members book.
- Must join Club & ACTA after three practice shooting sessions.
- Field & game / SSAA members (Must provide proof of current membership.) are exempt from joining ONLY for 5 Stand Sporting Clays practice & 5 Stand competition shooting. If practicing skeet / DTL - MUST join club & ACTA after three visits to shoot skeet / DTL disciplines again.

Signage from one of the ACTA proactive clubs

to shoot at the club and enjoy its layouts, club and amenities should also contribute to the Club by being a member. This is how clubs survive, through the support of members.

The ACTA will be reintroducing the "Club only" and the "New Start" memberships in 2014. For a small fee this would alleviate (but not rid us) some of the issues we currently experience. I know Clubs have always supported and worked with the ACTA in a constructive manner to promote the sport, I trust these new measures will assist the Club and the ACTA to a mutually beneficial outcome.

The ACTA's number one priority is the safety of our member States, Clubs and shooters.

It is the Club's responsibility to ensure they are acting within the ACTA rules in relation to members, and the Law with regard to firearms licensing and where appropriate liquor licensing.

Normal membership status will apply to the level of membership taken under this offer. New Shooter Levy is included in the Complimentary Membership. These memberships can be used up to and including October 31 each year.

IF DATE OF BIRTH IS NOT SUPPLIED FOR VETERANS & JUNIORS THE CLUB WILL BE CHARGED THE FULL MEMBER RATE.

REGISTRATIONS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED UNLESS THEY ARE ON THE OFFICIAL ACTA REGISTRATION FORM WITH ALL REQUIRED DETAILS COMPLETED.

Each registered Member receives a Handicap label, which must be attached to the current Handicap Card and presented at all competition events. This Handicap label, as well as providing proof of membership, records each Member's official grade and handicap.

Every registered Member, with the exception of Partner members, Club Only, New Start and Juniors, will receive a monthly copy of the Clay Target Shooting News (CTSN) posted to their mailing address. Juniors who have no other family members receiving the CTSN may apply to the ACTA to receive the CTSN.

Psychological Skills for Shooting

JET LAG

Writing these articles over the years has led to a number of unintended consequences for me. It has bought me closer to the whole shooting community, not just the people who attend the same shoots as I do. As a result I have met and had the opportunity to work with some great people. I need to single out one such person. Bryan Summerhayes, is from Somerset county in England. I had met him at a couple of sporting clay shoots in Wagga

and Field and Game shoots in Ardlethan and Coolamon. I mentioned to him earlier this year that I was going to England in the summer, "we will have to catch up", he said. Well after a few emails, it was agreed that he and his wife Kaye would pick Barbara and I up in Bradford-on-Avon and they would show us some of the real British countryside. Bryan and Kaye run a bespoke tour company, called "Off the Beaten Track" tours. This is not a tour company where you bundle onto a bus and go and have a look at a church. The tours are for one couple only, and are personally designed. So if you are interested in looking at antiques they will design a tour to visit antiques shops, houses, etc. If you are a shooter then they will design it so you can visit gun shops or shooting grounds. If you are interested in archaeology and history then you can tour the Jurassic Coast, look for fossils or visit castles or Stonehenge. We didn't have any urgent desires so we went on a mystery tour. Our first stop was Avalon Guns and then we just toured some of south-west England. The highlight was the energy and care that was shown to us by Bryan and Kaye, the places of interest mixed with anecdotes and stories. We ate well, we laughed, we learnt things, we laughed some more and we just had a great time. We weren't on a tour bus and we saw part of the English country side that remains hidden unless you have your own private guide. One of the other bonuses of writing these articles is the research that I have to do to, and sometimes the research finds you. Travelling to Europe I didn't notice any signs of jet lag, but coming home I suffered something shocking. Having never travelled far before, I didn't really know what to expect, but after I spent a week getting up at 1.00am and then feeling ready to work but wanting to go to sleep at 10.30 am, I realised that things were not right. Jet Lag or Time Zone Circadian Rhythm Disorder, is due to disturbances to the circadian rhythm, our internal 24 hour clock, due to travelling through different time zones. Circadian rhythm disorder can also cause havoc for shift workers.

When we change time zones (an increment of 15 degrees of longitude from Greenwich, UK) our bodies need to take time to adjust to the new time zones. Until we are back to normal, our performance will suffer. Corporations and the military understand that performance can be affected by not having proper rest after a long haul flight. The proper rest time varies from individual to individual but age, flight duration, time-zone translocation, climate variations, noise, immobilization, low humidity, etc, all factors that will influence the severity and duration of jet lag. When I asked friends and colleagues how they dealt with jet lag they said "the only way to deal with it is when you arrive back in Sydney, book a motel room and sleep for 16- 20 hours. So armed with the discomfort of "being out of it," and my personal need to have some sort of scientific understanding of the problem and the solution, I decided to do some research into the problem. I found an old book, The Sleep Book by James Paupst who described the Buley rest formula for air travellers.

Back in the sixties, Dr L Buley developed a rest formula to determine how long a person had to rest following a flight.

The rest formula is relatively simple: It states that the sum of one-half flight duration (T) in hours, plus the number of time zones (z) crossed in excess of 4, plus two special coefficients representing departure times, equals the required period of rest expressed in tenths of a day.

$T/2 + (z-4) + Cd + Ca = \text{rest period.}$

If z is < 4 it is eliminated.

Period of day (hrs)	Departure time co-efficient	Arrival time coefficient
0800-1159	0	4
1200-1759	1	2
1800-2159	3	0
2200-0059	4	1
0100-0759	3	3

The departure and arrival coefficients introduce gains and losses of time: the table follows:

For example, for a flight from London to Sydney, you travel across 10 time zones. If you depart at 20.00h on Monday you will arrive in Sydney on Wednesday at 05.00h with a four hour stop-over in Singapore. Therefore the equation would look like this:

$25/2 + (10-4) + 3 + 3 = \text{rest period, therefore for this example it would be:}$

$12 + 6 + 3 + 3 = 24$, divide 24 by 10 and this means that the required rest time is 2.4 days.

When using this formula, the following rules must be applied:

1. The answer in tenths of days should be rounded to the nearest day. However rest stops amounting to less than a day will not be given unless it is an overnight flight.
2. Travel hours are the number of hours of elapsed time required for the journey.
3. Time zones are computed as increments of 15 degrees of longitude from Greenwich, UK.
4. Departure and arrival times are local.

So according to Buley, you would need to rest for approximately 52 hours following a flight from London to Sydney. This is significantly different to my friends and colleagues unscientific approach of sleeping for 16 hours upon arrival. Paupst states this formula has been used since 1967 and has benefited many travellers – provided, of course, that they are willing to give in to the fact that their biological clocks exert a force that is stronger than they are, either physically or psychologically. This was the most significant sentence of the whole chapter in the book.

I now know that I cannot win over the biological clock. So, next time I travel (and that was the reason for the research) I will be resting as soon as I get off the plane. I may not calculate it to the hour but I will rest until I feel OK again. This has big implications for those of us who wish to travel overseas to compete.

The other intended consequence of these articles has been the comments from shooters at shoots or over the phone, who have enjoyed what they have read or have been interested in following up on a particular subject. In the short time since its arrival, I have had several favourable comments about the Holland & Holland story.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

NATIONAL ISSF DISCIPLINE CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. Any shooter wanting to compete at the ISSF Nationals must be a registered member of the ACTA for the current financial year that the championships are being held.
2. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the relevant Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.
Note: A fee of \$20 will be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.
3. The tournament shall be conducted in accordance with the ISSF Official Statutes, Rules and Regulations (ISSF Rules) and, where applicable, ACTA Shooting Rules (grading, teams etc). Targets to be shot in brackets of 25 for Olympic Trap and ISSF Skeet with squads of 6 shooters where possible. In Double Trap targets to be shot in brackets of **15 Pair (30 targets)** with squads of 6 shooters where possible.
4. Pre Nominations to be received by close of business (**Eastern Summer Time**) Friday 3rd January 2014. There is a maximum of 126 competitors for ISSF Trap. If pre nominations exceed this number a standby list of 20 will be created and used in case of withdrawals. If any vacancies exist in the program, it will be on a "first in" basis at an additional cost of \$10.00 per event to enter. Nominations at the championships close at 10.00am the day prior to the event if a vacancy exists. Nominations have been reduced, as there is no prize money awarded.
5. Shooters will be squadded as per the ISSF rules and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director. Once squadding for an event has been completed, a shooter shall not be entitled to a refund if they withdraw. Withdrawals after nominating and before squadding will be accepted in writing 48 hrs prior to the event.
6. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot the applicable round.
7. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will be penalised by the **LOSS OF THREE TARGETS.**
8. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
9. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each round. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the score recorded on the sheet.
10. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons designated to referee/score or line referee must fulfil their obligation to do so or have obtained the service of a suitable replacement that must be ready to take his place at the required time. In the event of the designated persons or their replacement not being ready to take their place at the required time, the person initially designated to fill the specific role may **INCUR A PENALTY AS PRESCRIBED UNDER ISSF RULES.**
11. Setting and adjusting of traps is the sole responsibility of Shoot Management. All shooters, coaches and team officials are prohibited from entering the trap pits after the Jury has examined and approved the trap settings.
12. All appeals must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit and lodged with the Tournament Director. The \$20 is refundable if the appeal is upheld by the appointed jury.
13. When team selection is involved, shooters are eligible for section nominated. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in both Commonwealth and National Championships.
14. High Gun awards are determined for each section. To be eligible for the High Gun recognition, competitors must have competed in both programmed events for each respective High Gun. Gold Australia High Gun badges are only awarded when there are 20 or more competitors in a section.
15. Women shooters are eligible for their section only in Double Traps. Junior shooters are eligible for OA or their grade where applicable.
16. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behaviour of card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.
17. The ISSF Rules will be used to determine the OA placing in all events. ACTA rules will be used to determine grade placing where applicable.
18. Juniors to be under the age of 21 in the year of competition.
19. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.
20. The standard of dress required for all competitors is that defined in the ISSF Rules (clothing).
21. **All competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws of the state. (When held in W.A a shooter must obtain a permit to bring a firearm into that state).**

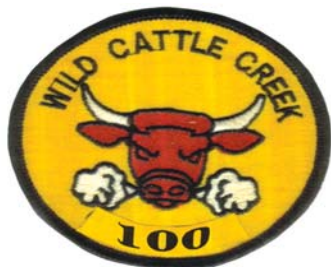

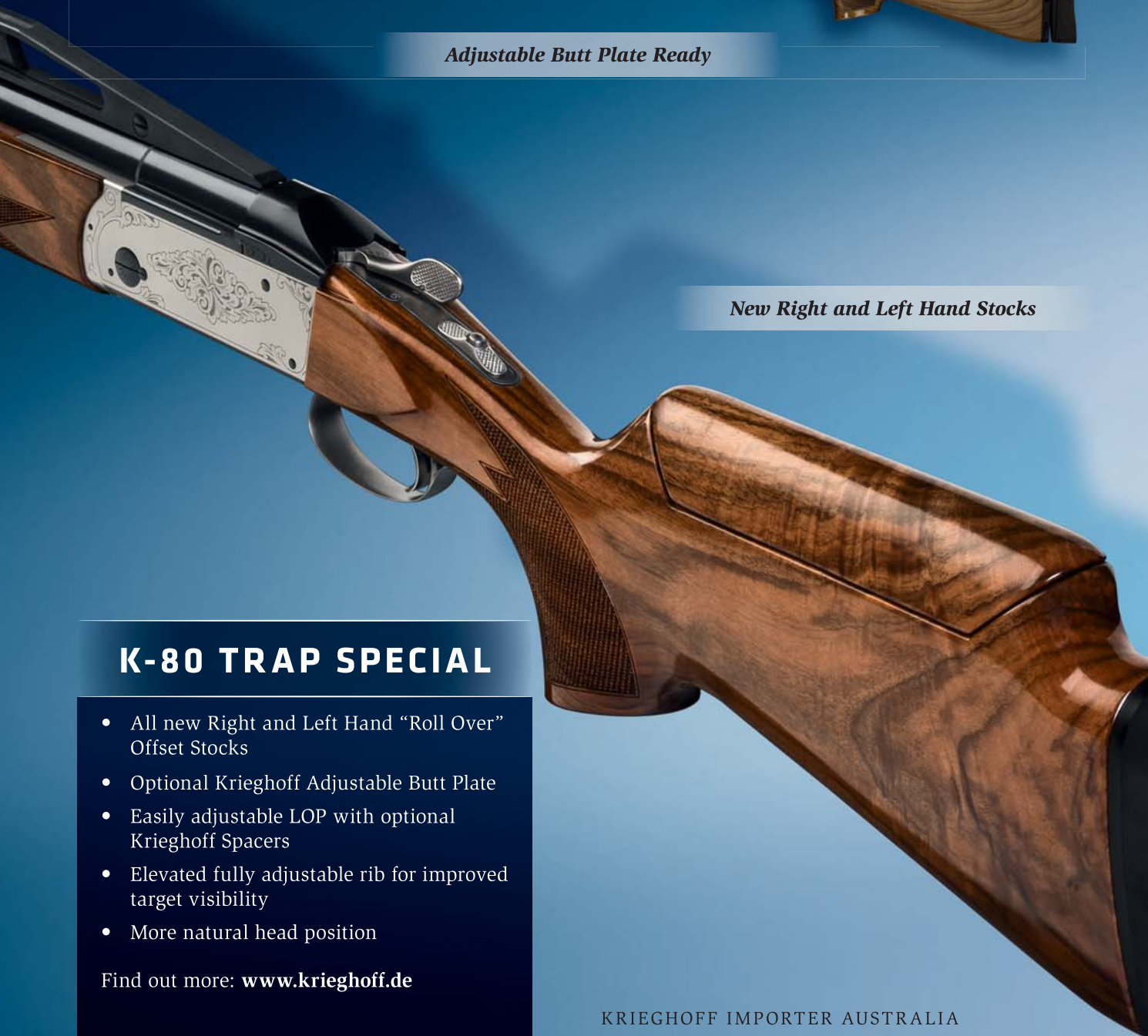

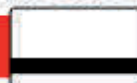

- (b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

- (a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.
