The thoughts and sympathy of all clay target members is extended to Doug's family and friends.

There has been some misinformation disseminated regarding the new clothing rule that has come out of the ISSF meeting in Germany. The rundown re the rule is in this CTSN however in short, there is a dress standard required when competing at events that are qualifiers for overseas competition, as example, State, National or international ISSF events. This does not mean that at local club competition, competitors are required to comply fully with the ISSF clothing policy. The status quo remains for those competitions, however for the major events competitors are required to comply.

It would be remiss not to remind all members that there is an expected dress code as well for all disciplines. Please contact your club secretary if you are unsure.

The ACTA Coaching Committee, chaired by Mr Dave Howe (Northern Territory) is presently assessing applications that were submitted for the National Coaching Director. Unfortunately at this time I and the Executive Committee haven't had a recommendation made as to whether there is a successful or suitable candidate; however the membership will be made aware in the next CTSN.

The Executive Committee has also been busy preparing for 2014 to complete their requirements in the ACTA 2014 Business Plan. Some committees are well into tasks allotted to them and I thank each Executive Member on behalf of the membership. As provided to you before, this plan is incorporated into the ACTA budget and allows for a clear financial and methodical approach to complete ACTA business requirements.

Taking the association even further into the future is the work conducted by the Executive Officer, (Tony Turner), ACTA office staff and ACTA member Mr Frank Auditore. These people have been working tirelessly to improve and incept a new ACTA database relative to member information, membership renewals and other computer orientated functions. It is time, the membership steps into the 21st Century. We are already a tenth of the way through and we still have a manual membership renewal system! This new system, to be implemented in 2014, will be an exciting advancement for the association and I wait eagerly for it to commence. Some club secretaries and members may oppose the change from the old manual system that operates today, however the ACTA needs to progress. This is a great start.

Another issue that I reported on previously is the provision of club articles for the CTSN. Some club secretaries or media officers are still providing hand written or typed copy to the ACTA office. The office now has the approval of the Executive Committee to return these to the authors for provision to the ACTA in electronic format. Staff presently spend numerous hours retyping club and State reports and by making this change, their time can be allocated to other functions.

Finally, I thank all members for their constructive feedback as to the conduct of the association in 2013. This has helped the Executive Committee and myself immensely. I look forward to speaking to you and as many other members as I can in 2014, commencing with the National ISSF Carnival at Whiteman Park in Perth in January.

At the time of writing we are fast approaching the Christmas and New Year break. I hope that you and your family had a great holiday (if you had one) and see you next year!

Executive Officer's Report

It is now 2014, all memberships were due and payable by the 1st of January. Please ensure you have a receipt from your club for your payment as you will be required to show proof of membership if you do not have your 2014 ACTA Membership sticker. For the safety of all members please ensure your membership is paid prior to shooting.

The ACTA Executive has decided on a number of important initiatives to ensure the Association moves forward. The first is the implementation of a new data base and website, which will be developed jointly and launched in April 2014. This new data base will replace the access data base provided to the Association by long-time supporter John Coleman. I would like to take the opportunity to thank John for his valued contribution to the Association over many years. John also developed the shoot scoring system "Clay 2000" that was used at many National events in the mid to late 2000's. That data base however is now thirteen years old and we require new software to enable us to capture more information, thus enabling us to meet the expectation of our members.

The new data base and website combination will allow each individual member to access their own personal information and change personal details such as address, phone etc. and join/renew and pay on line. There will be numerous levels of administration rights that will allow secretaries of clubs to access their own member information as will Zone and State Secretaries. Designated Club officials will be able to access basic information such as ACTA number, Address, Club for entering shooters in events. The information will also disclose if the member is currently financial.

Being web based the information will be easily available to members with internet access.

The Executive Committee also voted to retain current and long time insurer Pollards Insurance. John Le Brasse and his staff have been excellent to deal with over many years with claims (very few I must add) and have dealt with them efficiently. The Associations excellent record on safety has ensured the premiums we pay are kept to a minimum.

The target tenders and independent target testing results were provided to the Championships Committee. The Championships Committee recommendation was presented and accepted with VIVAZ targets given the National Trap Championship contract and White Flyer the Skeet contract. We look forward to the support of both Target suppliers in 2014.

We have initiated some changes in the CTSN with States now being provided the opportunity to inform members of valuable Association information in the same way that the ACTA do through the Presidents column and the ACTA News area. We believe this initiative will keep all members informed from State to National level. To facilitate these new changes it is important to note all information and material for the CTSN is supplied electronically. The ACTA AGM will see a number of changes proposed to the existing Constitution in line with requirements from the department of Justice in Victoria. These proposed changes will be mandatory to retain our incorporation. I will detail these proposed changes/additions in future editions of the CTSN.

Ladies American Skeet World Champion

The home of American skeet shooting is the World Shooting complex at San Antonio in Texas, USA where every September contestants arrive from all over the world to compete for success over an intense 8 days of fierce competition.

This year saw the entries close at a massive 880 competitors including 20 or so Australians and a similar number of New Zealanders.

Australians Lorraine and Nigel Hughes from Caboolture Clay Target Club in Brisbane were competing for both individual titles as well as for the coveted husband and wife honours.

On only the second day of the main competition Lorraine won the 12 gauge Ladies World Champion for 2013, becoming the first Australian lady to ever do so and the pinnacle of her shooting career so far.

Lorraine was amongst those competitors to shoot a qualifying score of 149/150 to secure her place alongside the world's best in the shoot-off, these were held in the evening under lights and it is



here that Lorraine went into battle against the world's best and most experienced lady skeet shooters.

Without showing a glimmer of nerves her steely determination saw her hit pair after pair of targets with her fellow finalists falling along the way as one after another they missed.

On what was to become the final pair of the event Lorraine convincingly demolished both her targets with ease leaving only one competitor to shoot her own pair to draw level, this final competitor hit her first target but missed her second one immediately making Lorraine the first ever

Australian lady to win a world championship for American skeet much to the vocal delight of the supporting Australian and New Zealanders in the crowd.

This is Lorraine's highest achievement to date and adds the title of 'World Champion' to her growing list of skeet shooting awards including being the first lady to qualify for the Glenn trophy team who recently successfully represented Australia in the New Zealand Nationals recently held in Christchurch.

Christchurch, New Zealand

2013 was the travelling year for the Australian Skeet team who headed to Christchurch, New Zealand to shoot for the auspicious Glenn Trophy.

The team consisted of Adrian Cousens, Ben Garraway, Glenn Clarke, David O'Sullivan and Lorraine Hughes. We believe Lorraine is the first female member of the travelling international Glenn Trophy Team. The New Zealand team was made up of Steven Cooper, Tony Truss, Jamie Peryer-Fursdon, Dean Everett and Kelvin Gutsell.

The competition was held after the Kilwell event. Low light and a little wind did not dampen Aussie hopes, with Adrian and Glenn shooting 50/50, and Dave, Lorraine and Ben all shooting 49/50. These results put us in great stead with an overall 247/250.

For the 3rd year in a row, the Glenn Trophy will remain in Australia with New Zealand falling two targets short on 245/250.

Big congratulations to all Australian members, and let's make it four in a row in 2014.

ACTA NEWS

ISSF DRESS CODE

It has been brought to our notice that officials have not been checking athletes regarding the ISSF Dress Code. From January 2014 all athletes and officials will be expected to adhere to the relevant Dress Code. Penalties will apply if this is not done.

The Dress Code will apply to all Events where AISL PQS/ Ranking/Selection events. (This includes Aus Cups, ACTA Nationals and ACTA State Titles.)

Prohibited clothing items include blue jeans, jeans or similar trousers in non-sporting colours, camouflage clothing, sleeveless T-shirts, shorts that are too short, (see Rules 6.7.6.1 not more than 15cm above the centre of the knee), ragged cut-off shorts, all types of sandals, trousers with patches or holes as well as shirts or trousers with non-sporting or inappropriate messages. (no propaganda). Non-sporting colours that should be avoided are camouflage, plaids, khaki, olive or brown (military colours).

ISSF juries will issue a written warning with a request to correct clothing violations for the first violation. Athletes who do not correct clothing violations (change clothing) will be disqualified. Juries may allow an athlete to complete a pre-event training series or stage before changing if sufficient time to change is not available. No athlete will be permitted to participate in a Qualification or Final round competition or in an award ceremony, while wearing inappropriate or prohibited clothing.

As we now have social media, websites that show athletes and officials in action, receiving awards etc. we are seen all over the world. Not complying with the Dress Code Rules can cause our shooters and officials disciplinary action.

This will ensure those who require the books can easily acquire them. We will have a back-up print done for further distribution on demand. The books have some pages allocated to take any changes that may occur over the next three years.

JUNIOR PROMOTION INITIATIVE

In an initiative to encourage Juniors to the Nationals the National Executive has chosen to provide free nominations to Juniors who have not attended a National Championships since becoming a member. The Juniors will be given free nominations to their chosen event in 2014. That is the ISSF, Trap, Skeet or Sporting Nationals (All Championship events, One Championship only).

This will allow Juniors who have not competed at a Nationals to nominate the program they wish to shoot at the Championship they wish to attend.

Juniors will need to nominate using the available nomination form, however will not be required to pay the nomination fee. The free entry will still enable the Junior to win prizes.

Father Joe shot extremely well and took out second place for his grade in the Points Score event but it was his 2 sons that held the flag high and at 12 and 15 they both have long elite sporting careers ahead of them. Cooper is not a new comer to the winners circle, on the other hand his

younger brother William only became old enough to compete earlier this year. The thing with clay target shooting is that age or sex does not really matter, a keen eye, mental discipline and obviously a little bit of raw talent are all that counts.

Whilst we all would like to think there is something magical in the breakfast porridge in the Mooney household, I think the hard work and training that goes on behind the scenes might be the real answer. Cooper Mooney beat many men and women 2 and 3 times his age (because of his ability he now competes in the open class) in 2 out of the 3 events run on the day, he was overall winner in the 30 target single barrel event with 50/50 after a shoot off and overall winner in the 30 target Points Score event, again after a lengthy shoot-off scoring 141/141. This overall consistency saw Cooper take out the AA grade High Gun for the day, winning himself a few championship sashes, a rifle and some cash for his efforts. Congratulations to Cooper, your efforts and training are now starting to pay off. William was no slouch on the day taking out High Gun for his grade on the day with an

overall score of 133/150, something tells me this won't be the last we will hear of William.

Other highlights were overall High Gun Barry Skinner from Canberra with 160/160 and also from Canberra Dan Power was overall winner for the first event of the day with 128/128 double barrel. See full results below.

Great shooting by Caboolture's Jaco Pieterse saw him take overall in the 28 Gauge event with a perfect 50/50, closely followed by club mate Thomas Rhue who won AA with 48/50. 1st in A grade was Neal Dimmick with an impressive 49/50, 1st in B once again was Jim Storch from Blackwater with 46/50, and C grade winner was Peter Ballarino shooting 45/50.

In the 410 event Jaco Pieterse set the pace again winning overall with 45/50. First place getters were Adrian Cousens 47/58 in AA, John Rodden 45/52 in A, Jim Storch 44/54 in B, and Byron Hewitt shooting 41/50 to win C grade. Rounding out the Multigauge championships was the 12 Gauge event which was contested on Friday morning of the carnival. Well done to Antony Ballarino winning overall with 62/62 after a shoot off with Michael Buttigieg who took 1st in AA with 61/62. Neal Dimmick was 1st in A shooting 52/54, Dennis Savage won B grade with 48/50 and C grade winner was Brad Bird with 47/52.

Perfect conditions greeted shooters on Saturday morning for the 100 target State Skeet Championship and the final team qualification event. 72 shooters nominated for this event with 3 possibles recorded. Michael Buttigieg emerged victorious after a shoot off with 108/108 to take the title, silver Queensland badge, sash and cash prize, one up on fellow club member Glenn Clarke who finished with 107/108 to win 1st in AA, with Craig O'Neill 2nd on 106/107. A grade was won by Antony Ballarino from Port Denison with 103/104 with Pioneer's Tim Dodd 2nd with 102/104. 2014 National Trap Championships 6th April – 13th April 2014 OFFICIAL PROGRAM

To be staged at the National Ground,
Wagga Wagga, by the Australian Clay
Target Association.

CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION

Entry

Entry into the 2014 Australian Trap Championships is open to all shooters who are registered for 2014 with the Australian Clay Target Association. Temporary honorary membership will be offered to overseas visitors who can produce evidence that he or she is a current financial member of their home country's equivalent body to the Australian Clay Target Association. Australian competitors must produce their 2014 registered shooter record book and produce a current firearms licence before competing.

Divisions

The competition will be divided into separate divisions for Women, Juniors, Sub Juniors and Veterans, except the Grand Australian Handicap where places shall be awarded from 1 to 5.

Any eligible competitor paying nominations are entitled to receive awards in the Open Section, Women's, Juniors, Sub Junior or Veterans section; however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize. A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section before trophies are awarded.

When Mackintosh team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the Open team selection as well as section teams shall choose in which team they may be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams. To be eligible for selection or naming in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

Age Qualifications

Competitors must be over the age of 12 (NSW Firearms)

Veterans – are those competitors who, will be over the age of 65 years at the time of competition. (Over 60 for Mackintosh)

Juniors – are those competitors who, will be under the age of 18 years at the time of competition. (Under 21 for Mackintosh)

Sub Juniors – are those who, will be under the age of 15 years at the time of competition.

Starting Time

Each day's event shall commence at 8.30am.

Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at the practice trap at a time suitable to management. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event, they may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.

Cartridges

For all events, excluding the Grand Australian Handicap, load size for all National Title events is limited to 28gr struck measure shot size not larger than No.6. For the Grand Australian Handicap load size is limited to 32gr struck measure shot size not larger than No.6.

Cartridges of the competitor's choice, including re-loads, may be used in all National Championships. Cartridges will be available for purchase at the National Championships. Random checks may be carried out.

Target and Traps

Targets through the program are to be as determined by the Championships Sub-Committee. All targets thrown remain the property of the organisers. All throwing equipment will be electronically operated.

Classification

It is the responsibility of the competitor to see that their entry is correctly classified – an indication can be obtained from the daily score-board or their Shooter ID Card. This applies to trap grades, Womens, Juniors, Sub-Junior and Veterans divisions.

Contestants are reminded that re-grading and re-handicapping will be carried out on a daily basis, where required by the rules.

Major Sponsors

The Association gratefully acknowledges the generous support received from sponsors.

Practice

Practice will be available throughout the championships.

Shoot-offs, Continuation of Events

Where more than one squad participates in a shoot-off, they may commence shooting together on different traps providing management deems that situation equitable.

The shoot offs will continue under the event format until a winner has been determined or at the discretion of the Tournament Director a different format is required to finalise the event. Where necessary, shoot offs may be conducted under lights until a winner has been determined or until such time as the Tournament director decides. In such a case the competition will recommence where it left off on the following day.

Nominations – All Events

All championship nominations (excluding Deauville Doubles) shall be \$40 plus targets at \$5 per 25 and include a contribution to the discipline fund.

Authority

This program shall control the 2014 Australian Trap Championships. The shooting rules of the Australian Clay Target Association will govern all points not otherwise provided for.

The Association's Executive Committee, reserves the right to, at its discretion at any time prior to the commencement of any event on the 2014 National Trap Championships program, to change or modify the program in any way.

Gambling is not permitted on events staged by the Australian Clay Target Association.

Appeals

All appeals subject to Jury Rule 4.16 (a) & (b)

Services and Facilities

Catering:

Arrangements have been made for meal services to be available with an extensive but practical menu.

Trade Displays:

Commercial organisations have supported the tournament by estab-

lishing displays of products. These displays will be located in an area specifically designated for trade exhibits. Competitors and visitors to the ground are encouraged to support these trade displays as, in this way, exhibitors can be encouraged to maintain their support for clay target shooting and our sponsors of this event.

Details: The Mackintosh International Teams Match is conducted under the direction of the Australian Clay Target Association, and competition countries include England, Scotland, Ireland, Northern Ireland, South Africa, Wales, Canada, New Zealand and Australia. Teams consist of 25 members, with the 20 highest scores to count.

Each member shall be an official Australian citizen (Rule 3.01a). The 25 shooters having the highest aggregate score from the Australian Double Barrel Championship, Australian Single Barrel Championship and the Australia/New Zealand Trap Championship (points score) will comprise the team.

In the event of a tie, a shoot off will be arranged under the terms and conditions directed by the organising committee, to determine places in the team. If a qualifier cannot take his place in the team, another shooter agreed upon by the organising committee will fill his place.

The shooter with the highest score in the International Teams Match (points score applies) will be presented with the J.M. Bauman International High Gun Cup, ACTA Silver Australia Badge, The Perazzi Trophy and the International High Gun Sash. Ties to be broken.

The Womens International Teams Match, The Junior International Team Match and The Veterans International Team Match, will consist of the five women, five juniors under the age of 21 and the five veterans 60 and over (Juniors & Veterans to check Mackintosh Listing after Double Barrel Event to ensure inclusion). Having the highest aggregate scores for the respective Double Barrel Championship, Single Barrel Championship and the Australia/New Zealand Trap Championship (points score) events. In the event of a tie for places in the teams, a shoot-off will be arranged under the terms and conditions directed by the organising committee, to determine places in the teams.

Each team member will receive the ACTA International Team Badge. The Junior High Gun will be presented with the Carlisle & District Gun Club Perpetual Trophy, The Perazzi Trophy and medal. The Womens High Gun will receive the Perazzi Trophy and an ACTA medal and the Veterans High Gun will receive the Perazzi Trophy and an ACTA medal.

108 entrants; Two events over 300 break; New club long break record of 366!; A possible NATIONAL NIGHT RECORD of 305 Straight Continental Double Barrel; A red NSW sash and badge for the Night State Continental Double Barrel Championship and 11 Guns given away!

All the above wrapped into one weekend – the 2013 Majura Park Holcim Shoot on the first weekend in November. With conditions varying from perfect to a little testing at times, the shoot was again a great success. Shooters travelled from as far away as Melbourne and Narrabri to contest the events.

The Majura Park 2 day is becoming an event renowned for being a great shoot with great prizes, and judging by all in attendance this year it continues to build and will only get better. Shooting White Flyer targets on Canterbury Traps, with great camping area and amenities it is fast becoming a highlight of the shooting calendar.

Majura Park offer 1st, 2nd and 3rd prizes in each AA, A, B and C grades of its Championship events, as well as allowing all double barrel events to continue under lights until completion.

One special feature of the Holcim Shoot is the Perazzi Australia Surprise draw – where a number is drawn out of a barrel and if your Points Score event score finishes with that number- you are in a shoot off for one of 3 guns- with the top prize valued at around \$3000!

Event 1 was the 50 target Falcon Cartridges Points Score Championship – Falcon are always great supporters of Majura Park especially with sponsorship of junior coaching clinics.

First event up and it wasn't long before the wind was up testing the metal of shooters early on Saturday. Only 2 possibles shot – one being Bill Iles from Little River Game Ranch, one of the greatest ever, and the other was youngster Brody Walters from Cooma. Experience prevailed with Bill coming out on top with a great score of 168/168.

First in AA grade in the points went to Brody Walters with 167/168. Frazer Roberts who took runner up with 176/177 following a shoot off with Tony Arvanitakis, who took third with 175/177.



A Grade was won by Trevor Coutts with a great 149/150, with Ben Murphy hot on his heels with 148/150. A shoot off between Anthony Gray and Gary Kennerson sorted out 3rd in A, with Garry getting home 155/159.

C grade went to young gun Max Green after a shoot off with 143/153, his first event at his first big competition and a great display of shooting. Josh Wilson followed him in with 141/153 to take 2nd and then 3rd with 136/150 was Tim Shorrock.

Ladies went to Karen Berry 159/165, Juniors was won by Jessy Ciappara 148/150 and Veterans went to Alan Jones with 148/150.

Event 2 was the Blue ribbon event at most major shoots- the 50 target Double Barrel sponsored by Perazzi Australia. With tribute to great targets and excellent competitor skill, 108 entrants of all grades contested the Double Barrel event with a club record of 27 shooting the possible under great conditions after lunch on Saturday. The shoot off would go well into the night as with no curfew and great lights, it was going to be fought out long and hard.

As per usual the transition period between daylight and the night lighting taking effect proved to be the game changer. A special mention must go to event sponsor Fil Petriella, shooting over 250 straight with his 20 gauge sporter! Great display!

B grade was a 4-way shoot off, all on 49/50, and another great display from Frank Bartolo saw him take it with 67/68, Brian Frost second with 66/68 and 3rd was Chris Weekes with 57/59.

Opening it up for all shooters, a number is drawn out of a barrel between zero and 9. If your Points Score total ended in that number, grab your gun, you're in a Points Score shoot off from your handicap for one of 3 guns!

This year the number 1 was drawn, and 9 shooters were entered in the shoot off, from 15 to 21.5 metreage. It took just 10 targets, and new shooter and C grader Josh Wilson was the proud winner of the high grade Sabatti Trap Gun. Great work Josh! Runner Up was another new shooter youngster Max Green winning a High Grade Beeman Airgun, and Third went to one of the statesman of Majura Park Gun Club – "Gorgeous" George Kasprzak winning another Beeman Air Rifle.



Brad Hooper's 25/25 in the last event secured the OA HG, with Robert Clarke only two points behind. The other grades too were fairly close, however, the final results are below.





Michael Buttigieg and Ben Garraway. Plus on the Blue Riband Day we managed a "white-wash" by capturing not only the National Skeet Championship, but the Two-Man and Five-Man Teams events as well. Combine this with the fact that we successfully defended the Glenn Trophy and brought it back to Australia and I think it's fair to say that they knew we were there.

50 Years on – Who shot JFK?

By the time this issue of the CTSN arrives in your letterbox the Victorian Skeet Carnival will be only a couple of weeks away. Recently there has been much speculation about the date of this event, including some intriguing conspiracy theories. Unfortunately, the real story is far less exciting. Last year we conducted our Carnival on the second full weekend in February and probably would have done the same this year if all things had remained equal. However, the South

Australian Trap Carnival, which is usually held a week prior to this on the first full weekend of February, is a three day shoot encompassing the preceding Friday. people and can clearly see the need to find a "date fixing" method which would provide some predictability of major events and hopefully avoid similar reoccurrences. As I believe the ACTA is currently installing a new and improved computer program and website, maybe such a system is realisable in the near future.

Fixed Dates

As most people who know me well are aware, I am historically one of the most outspoken proponents of the advantages of fixed dates for major events. Back in the November 1998 issue of the CTSN I even wrote a 2000 word article extolling the virtues of that very concept, so nothing would give me greater pleasure than to find a permanent home on the calendar for our Skeet Carnival. Much has also been said recently about our "sacred" use of the second weekend in February. As with most urban myths, although there is a grain of truth in it, it's actually more fantasy than fact. Victorian Skeet Carnivals started in the late 1970s and were usually held in October or November. The advent of the Skeet Nationals in 1983, which was intended to be fixed to the third weekend in November, put paid to that plan.

Evicted again

Initially we moved to the second weekend of March but the proximity to the New Zealand Nationals probably killed that off. Then we wandered aimlessly around the calendar for a while before eventually gravitating to the first weekend in May. And to give credit where it's due, we only secured that date because South Australia surrendered it to us and moved their own Carnival back a couple of weeks, but that's another long and complicated story for another day. Anyway that seemed to be working just fine until the ill-advised shift of the Skeet Nationals from November to May in 2008, which forced both South Australia and Victoria to have to relocate time-wise once again. In the six years since then, although the month of February seems to be a "given", we've used the fourth weekend once, the second weekend twice and the first weekend three times, or four if you count this year. Personally I fancy the second weekend and if I can get some moral support for that one, I would be happy to pursue another of my infamous "crusades" to make that happen.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY – NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. Any shooter wanting to compete at the Trap Nationals must be a registered member of the ACTA for the current financial year that the championships are being held.
2. **If a vacancy exists in any events at the Championships a person must nominate for all events they wish to shoot at the nomination window in one visit. To be eligible to shoot in any event the nomination must be received before 10.00am on the day of the event.**
3. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.
Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
4. Squads of up to 6 to shoot 50 targets/75 targets/100 targets in brackets of 25 targets or pairs, one or two visits only to the traps. National Handicap event to be 5 (five) person squads, 5 (five) targets per lane.
5. **Shooters will be Pre-squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director. Withdrawing from an event should (if possible) be done giving 48 hours notice in writing (if possible) prior to the event or by ringing the National Office and leaving a message after hours.**
6. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/75 targets/50 pairs. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets or pairs. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** may be incurred.
7. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at a designated trap at a time suitable to management
8. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
9. All shooters should sign the score sheet after each 25 targets/pairs. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
10. All competitors will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** will be incurred in the event concerned.
11. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised **FIVE (5) TARGETS**.
12. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
13. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
14. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
15. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall chose in which team they will be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
16. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize.
17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
18. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
19. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
20. **All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Trap Championships.**
21. Payment of the nomination fee only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not be eligible to any refund.
22. Squadding details will be available on the ACTA website, ten (10) days prior to the event. If an email address is provided on your nomination form, you will receive notification via email.





Psychological Skills for Shooting

MENTALS SKILLS FOR THE NOVICE SHOOTER

In November 2103, I was invited to run a mental skills training workshop and coaching clinic at Mt Gambier Gun Club. The workshop ran for three hours on the Friday night and covered topics such as how the brain works, goal setting, motivation,

concentration, attention, mental rehearsal, dealing with distractions and relaxation. There were 40 participants, mostly shooters but some cyclists, archers and martial arts athletes. The next day, with the help of Gary Haydn, most of the participants returned and we looked at gun fit and had some coaching.

One of the people involved asked me if I would look at writing an article for the novice shooter.

On the face of it, this seemed a simple question, but on reflection several factors became apparent.

Firstly, shooting is a muscle memory sport. By that I mean it has to be done over and over again, thousands of times before it becomes automatic. That is, before we can even start to explore the psychological fundamentals involved we need to have the physical skills learned and developed.

Secondly, it is necessary to have a firm grasp of the technical skills involved. We need to know how to address the target, ie. where and how to stand, how to swing and follow through, what type of and amount lead is required and how to be safe.

Thirdly, our gun must fit. Too often novice shooters fit themselves to the gun they have purchased rather than have the gun made to fit them. In researching this article, I went through a couple of old booklets especially designed to answer the above question.

The first booklet was produced by the ACTA. *An Introduction to Clay Target Shooting: Trap and Skeet*, produced by the Coaching Council of the ACTA. No date of publication was listed. For those who remember this booklet, it has an orange coloured cover and was about 20 pages in length. It provided a comprehensive introduction to the new shooter with sections on The National Coaching structure, Safety and Shooting Etiquette, and then sections on DTL, Skeet, ISSF Trap, ISSF Skeet, Vision, Basic Mental Approach, shooting methods and Equipment.

The basic mental approach section was just that: basic. It described that mental approach to shooting could be described in two words: concentration and single-mindedness. It describes concentrations for the task at hand, which is being ready for the target when the command pull is given and completing the shot correctly.

Single-mindedness on shooting the targets you call for one at a time for

as many times as required and, letting the score and the other shooters look after themselves.

In a very basic fashion this booklet was trying to say the following:

“Narrow your focus of attention as you call pull, stay in the present and shoot this target. Forget about the product (score) and focus on the process (shooting) and the product (score) will look after itself.” This was a central theme of the mental skills workshop.

The second ACTA booklet was a little pink coloured book called *The Quick Checklist for Down the Line Trap Shooters*, written by Peter Quire, National Director Coaching, ACTA. Again there is no date of publication listed. This was a simple but very effective little book. It provides four sections. Firstly, before you shoot which examined aspects such as stance, gun hold, gun shoulder relationship. Secondly, when you shoot which examines shooting method, don't move until you see the target and don't lift your head. Next, at all times which is the mental skills section and looks at concentration. What is listed in this section is good, simple advice. It reads:

The shooters task is to hit the next target. Targets that have already been hit or missed bear no relevance to that task.

DON'T Count your targets.

DON'T Worry about the state of the competition.

DO hit your next target.

The final section deals with equipment and safety.

The final piece of research for this article was a booklet by IMI Australia Ltd. Again it has no date by the title was *An Introduction to Clay Target Shooting: Hints for the Novice Shooter* by Newton Thomas. Obviously, a commercial publication, this booklet provided the novice shooter with a wealth of information. With headings such as The sport of Clay Target Shooting, types of shooting, equipment, Shooting stance (This has some great pictures of Newton Thomas shooting and clear diagrams of feet placement), Aiming (or gun hold positions), safety and finally, correct mental approach. The advice offered by Newton Thomas reads:

In trapshooting (both clay target and skeet) the correct mental approach to the sport is essential. This mental approach can be described in several ways, concentration and single-mindedness being two words that most clearly show the requirement.

The next target that the shooter is going to shoot at should be the focal point of his or her concentration. The fact that a shooter has missed on or three or any number of targets, or has shot them all, should not have any bearing on the next shot.

Many shooters when nearing the end of a run of birds that if shot will give them a possible, tend to count the targets and as they reach the last few, put an increasing value on each target shot. Through this they they often tend to do one of two things.

- (1) *Either stab at the target, shooting too early because of nervous tension, or*
- (2) *Holding their shot trying to make sure of it and consequently shooting too late.*

GOOD ADVICE: *Concentrate fully on your own targets and let the score and other shooters look after themselves.*

For the club coach coaching the novice shooter, make sure the technical skills are taught, get the gun to fit as best as possible, practice over and over again, and for the mental skills keep it simple. Focus your attention in the present by shooting this target, and focus on the process (shooting) and the product (score) will look after itself. The whole idea of helping the novice is to set them up for success: breaking targets. Finally make sure you are having fun.



NSW Members and Dealers

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

(a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.


2013 Mathoura Champion, Tim Maher
