Facebook. Friend or foe? It is one of the great social media sites that if used correctly can keep us in touch with family and friends — not only in Australia but around the world. Instagram, Twitter, Pinterest, it doesn't matter what or which you use it can be your best friend or used incorrectly turn into an ugly, ugly foe.

Because of the incorrect use of these sites, police have now formed in every country (and State in Australia) crime units to deal with issues that are severe enough to attract penalties

within the justice system. Even clay target isn't insulated from the woes of Facebook.

The comments made by individuals may seem funny at the time of writing however can cause serious injuries to individuals that are targeted. Any humiliating, unwarranted or inaccurate information disseminated to another person can also attract civil litigation as well as criminal. Remember too that prospective employers troll these sites to view information posted by individuals. Anything that they see that is racist, demeaning, hateful or sexist may influence them in decisions that may affect your future. Before entering your next Facebook post, it may be worthwhile to think about your comment — how it will affect any other person — or you in the future.

This is not to say that opinions aren't warranted. Positive criticism is a useful tool in any organisation and our association and the Executive Committee respect and welcomes any information or suggestions that will improve the association for the benefit of all members.

Over the last month I have had the opportunity to attend the 2014 ISSF Carnival in Perth as well as the 2014 Tasmanian DTL Carnival in Launceston. Both of these events were exceptionally well coordinated and conducted and I thank everyone that volunteered their time and/or efforts to ensure their success.

One exceptional result was an 805 break at the Evandale Club at the Tasmanian Nationals by 14 year old Mitchell Iles. An incredible result of which I am sure is not the last.

At both of these events I spoke to numerous shooters and answered questions that they had relative to the future of the ACTA. I also had the opportunity to take questions of which I will provide answers direct to these persons in the near future.

At an informal shooters meeting and BBQ organised by the ACTA at the ISSF Nationals there were several suggestions made to the organisation for improvement along with the offer of assistance by individuals. This positive input will be provided to the Executive Committee at its next meeting for which I know they will be thankful for the support. There was also a formal meeting of shooters held on a later date. I have asked this meeting to provide the minutes for placement on the ACTA website for the information of all members. These minutes will also provide the names of several ISSF competitors that are interested in attending AISL meetings as an "Athletes Delegate" and the "International Shooting Committee" at Executive Committee meetings.

The ISSF Nationals are presently cost neutral to shooters — they pay for their targets and are provided badges and sashes only. I am sure that in all events conducted by the ACTA members would like to have payouts or prizes, however this requires sponsors. If you are aware of any that the ACTA can approach, please advise the Executive Officer who can make an approach as required.

The coming months will see the ACTA office gear up for the DTL and Skeet National Championships, both being held at the National Ground in Wagga Wagga. During the DTL Nationals the Executive Committee will meet to further the objectives of the association. A reminder to all members, the Executive Committee is there for all of you — if you have an issue that you believe is important to the ACTA please see your State Delegate.

All of these officials are shooters in their own right, however due to ISSF rules, cannot officiate and compete in the same event. They give up their time and their sport so others can compete. Thank you all.

The shooters were presented with very hot and mostly windy weather that added another dimension to the events.

Congratulations to all of those competing, a tough championship at the best of times so under the circumstances an exceptional performance to end up on the podium. Shooting Australia (AISL) were represented with High performance manager Tim Mahon and National shotgun coach Valeriy Timokhin in attendance to view those in contention for selection for the Commonwealth Games in 2014. A full wrap of results will be in the next magazine.

A very special result at the championships was Craig Trembath winning the Commonwealth and the National Double Trap events whilst brother Steven won the National Trap Championship, a great result for the Trembath family, three wins from four events, congratulations to you both. Does anyone know if is this a record of some description?

To continue to grow the ISSF discipline there is a commitment required from all of those involved. If every shooter who attended this year's event were to bring one new shooter with them in 2015 we would have capacity fields in some events. The National Coaching Director will be working with the States on "identified" events within disciplines to increase the number of competitors in those events, specifically those with low numbers.

We are now well into 2014, if you are aware of a member who has not joined, give them a reminder to get their membership to their Club immediately to retain the right to shoot and other member benefits. The National office is currently working with our provider APT Australasia in developing and refining the new membership data-base, we anticipate having the data-base and integrated web-site operational by the end of April.

RICH RIVER CLASSIC

A full sixteen squads of shooters was a very pleasing roll-up for the Echuca Clay Target Club's annual Rich River Classic, held on the 27th of December. With over \$7000.00 value in trophies to be won, a lot of the shooters who attended were at the peak of their performance, ensuring some excellent competition for all. Weatherwise it could not have been any better, with a clear blue sky, a slight southerly breeze to keep the flies at bay, temperature finally reaching a shade over 30 degree's, scores were virtually guaranteed to be good for the entire very successful shoot.

The first event was a 25 target Classic Points Score Championship, and after a lengthy shoot off, Noorat Gun Club member, Phil Grainger put his hand up for the Overall Winners Sash, and the 1st in AA Grade trophy, with an unbeaten 228/228 score. Geoff Moore having dropped a target had to settle for 2nd in AA Grade with a very commendable score of 225/228. This event was sponsored by Midstate Credit Management, and the ECTC and all the competitors are very grateful for their sponsorship.

Event two, a 25 target Classic Single Barrel Championship, and eventually it came down to Cohuna member Greg Hipwell, and Frankston member Peter Mills shooting for the win, Peter dropped his 49th target and when Greg shot his it was all over with Greg Hipwell taking the Overall Winners Sash and the 1st in AA Grade trophy with a 49/49 score. The 2nd in AA Grade trophy picked up by Peter, who ended up with a 48/49 result. "SH Shooting" was the sponsors for this event, and the club and all competitors thank them for their effort.

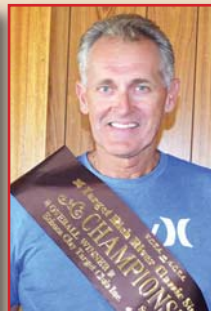
The 3rd event was a 25 target Classic Handicap, and this time it only needed 23 shoot off targets to decide the winner, and that was Echuca member Charlie Burns, Charlie shot an 48/48 score to put his hand out for the Overall Winners Sash, and the very handsome \$500.00 1st prize money, Hay NSW member, Dane Doyle, was the shooter pushing Charlie, and he ended up with a score of 47/48, earning him 2nd place in the Handicap, also a handy \$300.00 prize. William Preston a Melbourne Cricket CTSC member, shot a 37/38 score to earn him the 3rd place in the Handicap, and earning him \$150.00 in cash, Sebastopol member Graham Menhennet picked up \$100.00 being the 4th place prize after scoring a 38/39 result. Cohuna member, Chris Dalrymple, scored a 37/39 earning him the final and 5th place in the Handicap which gave him \$50.00 in hand. This Handicap was jointly sponsored by the Shire of Campaspe, and Commercial Helicopters Pty Ltd, and the club is very grateful for their help.

The 4th and final event was a 25 target Classic Double Barrel Championship, and with such good shooting conditions, there was a huge amount of shooters with full scores to shoot off. After a considerable time it became a battle between Peter Mills and Greg Hipwell, Greg managed to lose his 180th target, Peter made no such error, and he became the Overall Winner with a magnificent score of 180/180, Peter Mills the Overall Winner of the Classic Double Barrel Championship, also taking the 1st in AA Grade trophy, well shot Peter Mills! Greg Hipwell, taking out the 2nd in AA Grade trophy with his score of 179/180.

The Goulburn Murray Credit Union sponsored the Classic Double Barrel Championship and must be thanked for their help towards this very successful shooting Classic.

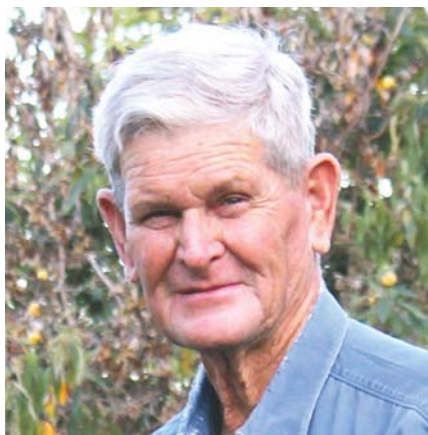

Douglas Wilkin Smith

06/01/37 to 07/12/13

It is with a heavy heart that I write this tribute to an outstanding shooter and good friend, Doug Smith, who passed away on 7/12/13 with complications from a hereditary liver condition diagnosed in 2004.



Douglas Wilkin Smith (or Doug as we all knew him) was born on the 6th January 1937 in Brisbane, the only son of Ossie and Meg Smith. Doug spent his early years growing up with his two sisters at Elmina Station at Wyandra and then Gowrie Station near Charleville. Like all Queensland children who lived "in the bush" Doug was educated by the Queensland Correspondence School until at 10 years of age he left to attend The Southport School (TSS) as a boarder. It was here at the Gold Coast that Doug's sporting skills became evident to all, representing TSS in athletics, rowing, swimming, and rugby union football. He was a Senior School Champion in athletics, sculling and shooting. Doug was an inaugural member of the rowing 8 that represented TSS in the GPS 'Head of the River' in 1955. It became obvious at that time that an all-round sportsman was developing.

On finishing school Doug went jackerooing and then became overseer at Gowrie Station, before moving to Elmina as station manager. Doug met Mary Espie in 1955 and they married in 1959 and recently celebrated their 54th wedding anniversary which is indeed a special celebration. Three children were born to Mary and Doug – Jenny, Sue and David.

In 1966 the family moved to Brisbane where they operated a broiler chicken farm at Capalaba with close family living nearby, also in the same business. After 23 years of chicken dust Doug decided it was time to look further

afield and, with son David as a partner, they moved to a mixed farm (cattle and crops) Carbenia Park, at Bowenville on the Darling Downs (no chooks allowed!). Father and son developed a great working relationship. Doug and Mary loved having grandchildren growing up on the farm and also to visit. Doug was never far from the farm for long unless it was to attend a shoot, a clearing sale or when the local men's chapter of the "CWA" met at the Bowenville Post Office on a Sunday under the guise of collecting the newspaper!

As a boy Doug was always a keen shooter, often challenging himself to go and pop off 100 rabbits with 100 shots with his .22 rifle on the sand ridges at Gowrie. Doug started clay target shooting in his teens under the tutelage of his father and quickly became well known in the sport. Doug was setting long break records when he was still at school and much of this was done with an old Browning A5 auto.

As with many shooting families Mary and their children were often at the gun club and were very proud of Doug and his achievements. Many weekends were spent helping with the scoring and giving Mary a hand with the catering. The family tells of their great pride when Doug represented Australia and

when he was awarded the Australian Sports Medal in 2000 and inducted into the ACTA and QCTA Halls of Fame in 2004 and 2010 respectively. Known as one of Australia's best clay target shooters ever, Doug set many records in our sport that will take some time and considerable talent to surpass.

INTERNATIONAL

Doug represented Australia in the World Trench Championships in Melbourne in 1973 where he came 6th overall and the team won the bronze. He was also a member of the team that represented Australia at the Commonwealth Games in Christchurch, New Zealand in 1974 where he came 4th overall in the Olympic Trap. In 1985 he was one of the representatives in the Australian team at Stirling, Scotland for the British Open Championships. He was selected in shooting teams to go to USA on more than one occasion but was unable to go because of work commitments - farmers don't easily get time off!

NATIONAL

Competing at National Championships is where he shone:

- 21 National Titles
- Double Barrel - 5 times
- Single Barrel - 4 times
- Double Rise - Twice
- Champion of Champions - 3 times.
- O/All High Gun - 7 times.
- On 13 occasions he was a National Title runner-up!!

Doug's ability earned him selection a record 29 times in the Australian Trap Team (The Macintosh Team) where he excelled. He first qualified in 1957 and participated in his last team in 1995. He was the Team High Gun

winner on 7 of those occasions. As an aside, he won team selection 14 years in a row between 1960 & 1973 and another 9 times in succession between 1982 and 1990.

QUEENSLAND & QCTA STATE TITLES

28 State Titles

- Double Barrel - 7 times
- Single Barrel - 4 times
- Double Rise - 4 times
- O/All High Gun - 7 times
- Team High Gun - 5 times
- QCTA Representative Trap Teams - 3 times
- QCTA Open Trap Teams - 13 times.

And that's only part of his Queensland story as we have no formal records before 1981.

Doug's last State team was in 2001 as he was being hampered by developing arthritis in a very "crackly shoulder" following 50+ years of shooting and recoil from some pretty big handicap loads at times. His last Nationals were in Wagga Wagga in 2004.

He had a box of medals that were the "special ones" and most of those I'm happy to say are on display in the QCTA Hall of Fame in Roma and the others are currently too numerous to display.

RECOGNITION

Doug never felt comfortable being recognised for his achievements and he hated speaking in front of a crowd of people; he would say "...I have always let my gun do the talking."

Nevertheless he received the following:

- Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II instituted a medal and certificate to commemorate Australian Sporting Achievements - Doug was recognised and awarded The Australian Sports Medal in 2000.
- He was honoured by being made the inaugural member of the National Clay Target Shooting Hall of Fame in Wagga Wagga in 2004.
- In 2005, the ACTA in consultation with Doug devised the prestigious and much sought after Doug Smith Medal to recognise the shooter with the best record of achievement in major competitions each year.
- In 2010 Doug was inducted into the Queensland Clay Target Shooting Hall of Fame at Roma.

Doug competed at clubs all over Queensland at their two-day carnivals and he won several hundred Championships. An event of interest happened in Toowoomba about 15 + years ago...the club put up a prize of \$10,000.00 for anyone who could shoot the two day programme clean. Doug had not missed a target and there was only one Handicap event left on Sunday afternoon. As Doug went out to shoot, a "heat storm" lashed the club - we all got drenched and he missed two targets from 25m. The insurers must have breathed a sigh of relief!

To my knowledge no club has ever repeated the challenge as Doug made it look too easy!!

Doug was a member of Clay Target clubs in Charleville, Brisbane and Dalby during his career. He gradually retired from the sport over the last 9 or 10 years as he experienced pain each time he pulled the trigger. Doug still loved going along to a shoot to say hello to his mates of 50 years.

Keen shooters have attempted to emulate Doug's style and ability, and possibly set their own records, as he has done, in our sport of shooting. His shooting style, just like the man himself, was straight up and down, no fuss, keeping it simple and achieving results.

The Smith family would like to thank the shooting fraternity for the support shown to Doug and themselves during Doug's illness and passing. With over 200 hundred people at his funeral to pay their respects, it shows that Doug will be remembered as the epitome of a sportsman, and his style and grace will be a yardstick for shooters now and into the future.

2014 ACTA MEMBERSHIP

Members are reminded that if they have not yet renewed their ACTA membership then it has lapsed. Those members are now unregistered and have no insurance cover through the ACTA.

Clubs should be aware that unregistered shooters are not able to compete in ACTA competitions or on ACTA grounds.

If you are one of these members then you need to register immediately to preserve your membership entitlements including CTSN subscription and continuity of membership for appropriate long service rewards.

RULE REMINDERS

Each month we will pick out rules or part of, from the new 2014 ACTA Rule Book to act as a talking point and also as a reminder to shooters of rules which may be obscure to some or overlooked by others.

This month the rule is 2.01(h).

- (h) It shall be the responsibility of a designated club official to enter individual event scores and progressively mark the shooter's card with his 15 metre results. After each 200 targets double barrel regrade the shooter if necessary. Double Barrel scores will be transposed for any better scores from the other events column of near equal target amounts. (this being a maximum difference of plus or minus 10 targets) ie Continental and Single Barrel. If the 200 targets fall during an event or shoot-off, regrading will not take place until the completion of that event. All targets to the end of that event and shoot-off targets are to be used in calculation of percentage. Once 200 or more targets have been shot at and recorded and after the substitution of any bad scores, the percentage shall be calculated. Regrading and re-handicapping shall not take effect until the end of a day's shooting.

The following rule 2.04(e) should also be noted in reference to the above rule

- (e) It is the shooters responsibility to ensure that all handicap and common mark scores have been entered correctly, and progressively totalled.

The above rules are quite concise, but as we often receive questions about their interpretation, below offers some clarification.

Rule 2.01(h)

It is definitely the clubs responsibility to provide a designated club official to enter scores on cards, progressively total, grade and handicap accordingly.

2. Rule 2.04(e)

The shooter has some responsibility, but this responsibility stops short of them entering and totalling scores. The shooter is responsible only for ensuring that the club has correctly entered, totalled and graded all scores appropriately.

To ensure that our system works, clubs need to make sure that not only do they correctly fill in the shooters card, but that they then also notify the ACTA any changes made. Grading/Handicap Return Forms are supplied either as hard copy on request, or from the website.

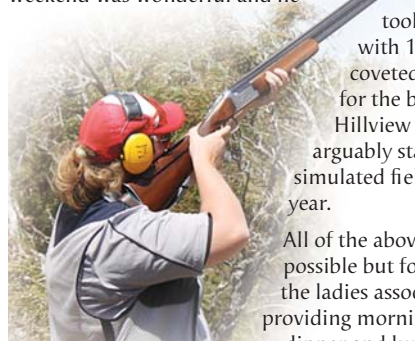

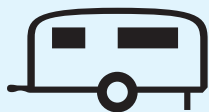

The 8th Annual Gold Sovereign Shoot was held at the NSW Gun Club Terrey Hills on the 23rd November, 2013 with 8 squads of shooters attending the Young Guns and Ammunition sponsored event.

As in past years, a display of fine guns were exhibited in the Clubhouse from 8.30 till 10.00am with John Newton winning the best restored gun with a beautifully presented and rare Cashmore Nitro circa 1900. The best most original gun was won by Charlie Strike from Koorngal with a lovely old cased 1906 Webley & Scott side lock.

The Gold Sovereign is a 100 target side by side competition comprising 50 sporting targets, 25 DTL targets off 15m and 25 continental targets off 18m. Competitors may use different 12g sxs guns including hammer guns in the competition. This year, cartridge loads were specifically limited to 28grams or 1 ounce.

A short display shooting deauville doubles with black powder commenced the day's competition at 10am. The Vettore Scapinello loaded black powder cartridges produced lots of blue smoke but oh my, the black powder is filthy stuff leaving the insides of the barrels jet black with residue. All 4 gun barrels required washing out with boiling water before being put away.

A 50 target sporting field set-up by director Don Jessop comprised a great mixture of targets and included rabbits, overheads, crossers and incomers. Competitor's scores varied from 22/50 to Andrew Shacklocks 48/50. At about lunch time, a massive thunderstorm descended upon Terrey Hills with thunder, lightning and torrential rain resulting in a cessation of shooting and causing the entire electrics on the range to shut down. National Skeet Long Run Record

Up until the late 1970s the National Skeet Break Record was only a word of mouth item and its history had already started to become a matter of conjecture. To prevent this information eventually becoming lost to posterity after all the good ol' boys had gone off to join the Big Gun Club in the Sky, I researched the subject pretty thoroughly and printed my findings in the CTSN. After they were not challenged I commissioned a suitable plaque and donated it to the ACTA. During my research I was unable to positively confirm any records below 100 and the earliest entry on the plaque was a break of 114 shot by Dr Graham Carroll at the old Australian Gun Club and generically dated 1967.

Filling in the Gaps

A couple of weeks ago the president of the Australian Skeet Shooters Association, Paul Johnson, advised me that Peter (the obscure one) McVicar had not only been able to establish the exact date of this feat as November 25th, but also validate the full details of the previous record that Dr Carroll broke. It had been set only two weeks previously on the 11th of November at the Melbourne Gun Club by Mr Bill Delaney with a break of 110. Paul has updated his records on the ASSA website and I will endeavour to have the ACTA plaque amended accordingly. The only other incomplete entries on the plaque are the next two occasions, two years later in 1969. First Bill Stevens bumped it up to 131 at Ipswich

and then Roy Fallshaw increased it to 149 at Geelong. If anyone could confirm actual dates for either of these breaks, it would be most helpful. Also, working backwards, has anyone got any idea what the record was that Bill Delaney broke.

State Records

While we're on the subject of Skeet Break Records, another thing I would like to do is establish the Current Record in each State and Territory and advertise those results somewhere. Both the ACTA and ASSA websites would probably be a good start. Clearly the idea here is to provide one more incentive for people to raise their own

shooting standards and travel more to attend major Shoots. Anything we can do along these lines of promotion and development can only be good for our sport. Similar incentives provided by the Hall of Fame concept are clearly working. We already have over 100 entries for our upcoming State Skeet Carnival, a figure that was only dreamed of just a few years ago. Plus the history of these Records in each State would be a very interesting thing to compile

before they too are lost in the annals of time. If anyone can help with any of this information I would be most appreciative

January's Trivia Question

The two ACTA shooters who shot Trench for Australia at the 1956 Olympic Games in Melbourne were Jack Bryant and Clem Mudford, who put in a very creditable performance finishing 9th and 20th with scores of 176 and 164 respectively. These efforts were particularly noteworthy considering Trench shooting was virtually unknown in this country at that time and the only Trench layout in Australia was the one they built at the RAAF Base at Laverton especially for the event.

From Elimination to Destruction

Prior to the Olympics an elimination event was held at Laverton between all the members of that year's various Interstate Trap Teams to select our two representatives. Although Jack won his place convincingly, Clem had to shoot off against John Harris from Cunderdin in WA for his spot. Interestingly neither Jack nor Clem had to travel very far to participate at Laverton as coincidentally both were outer suburban Melbourne poultry farmers. Shortly after the Olympics the layout was bulldozed due to lack of interest and Trench shooting remained effectively dormant in this country for another decade and a half until Australia's selection to host the World Moving Targets Championships in 1973 rekindled our interest.

A Little Help from a Friend

The first correct answer drawn was submitted by Dexter Barnes from Chengdu in China. However I suspect that Dexter may have had some help from his wife, Shan, who is an Olympic Clay Target Shooting Gold Medalist in her own right. She shot a perfect 200x200 in the qualifying rounds to convincingly win the Olympic Skeet event in Barcelona in 1992. Sadly, the presiding authorities, who had obviously never heard of sexual discrimination, decided that the most appropriate

Psychological Skills for Shooting

DEHYDRATION

It is unfortunate that there is a significant time lag between me writing this article and you getting to read the article in the CTSN. This makes it difficult to deal with current issues because by the time the magazine is published these issues may be well and truly forgotten. For example, issues such as alcohol fuelled violence and

gun crime are important topics for the media when incidents happen but are easily dispensed with when something more topical emerges.

At the moment, as I write this, most of southern Australia is in the grip of a heat wave. Cast your mind back to the week of the Australian Open Tennis: 40+ degree days for a week on end. The forecast in Wagga tomorrow will be 42 degrees celsius with but this won't stop most of us attending the shoot, so it is important that we are aware of the effects of the heat on us and our thinking.

What effect does the heat have on performance?

Elevated body temperature, hyperthermia, can eventuate from three causes: high exercise intensity, high air temperatures and high relative humidity. According to Lawrence Armstrong, this is why an athlete, male or female, can experience performance-degrading hyperthermia if they push themselves too fast, for too long a time, in hot-humid conditions. He continues by stating that there are three ways in which such hyperthermia might degrade physical performance.

1. Hyperthermia reduces **muscular endurance**, the ability to sustain muscular contractions for several minutes to hours.
2. Hyperthermia shifts **metabolism** from primarily the aerobic (with oxygen) to the anaerobic (without oxygen) form. Unfortunately, this means that the body's stores of carbohydrate (e.g., glycogen) in skeletal muscles and liver will be consumed at a faster rate. Athletes 'hit the wall' faster.
3. Hyperthermia causes the dilation of blood vessels in the skin and pooling of blood in the limbs. This reduces the volume of blood that returns to the heart, reduces cardiac output, and increases circulatory strain. These effects are perceived as increased fatigue because the capacity to deliver oxygen to muscles is reduced.

The above facts about physical effects are relatively well known by most of us who participate in sport. In fact, Sports Medicine Australia has developed policies on sport in hot weather. These guidelines have been adopted by Government Departments, such as South Australian Sport and Recreation, to reduce the risk for athletes during very hot weather. State clay target associations should be making clubs aware of the guidelines and providing information that can maximize the enjoyment of sport in hot weather and reduce the risks. What are the effects of heat on the brain and how does this impact on our mental skills?

If you are mildly dehydrated, it is likely that you are unaware of it. Even though you may be drinking fluids, they may be the wrong type or it may just not be enough. In mild cases of dehydration you are likely to become anxious, fatigued or irritable. Anxiety can affect us

when we are shooting. We all worry about missing at some stage. We focus on the future and worry about our ability. When this happens we lose contact with the present and as a result we develop self-doubt and we miss the target. Fatigue also can have the effect eye dominance. It is thought that eye dominance can change: as we get older or even on a daily basis as we get fatigued. This will have a significant effect on your shooting if your non-dominant eye takes over because you are tired. Fatigue also affects muscle strength, muscle memory, reaction time and your ability to narrow your focus of attention. As a result, recoil will feel worse and you will be more prone to headaches.

If you are severely dehydrated, that is, you do not ingest fluids for long enough, confusion can set in. The symptoms of confusion are similar to the symptoms of dementia. This confusion can be manifested in reaction timing, understanding consequences and decision-making, inhibition, ability to shift thoughts. Memory will also be affected by dehydration. There can be disorientation and distortion of reality in the forms of auditory or visual hallucinations. For the shooter this level of confusion may mean that you anticipate where you think the target will be going and you start moving before you see the target.

Brain cells require the right amount of water and minerals in each cell. Cells will break with too much water and shrivel up with not enough. Brain dehydration, which is what happens in a hangover and dehydration, less water is available to the brain cells to use and the transport of fluid, minerals and other materials between cells is reduced and therefore their function is affected. If the dehydration is not treated or resolved there will be a deterioration of the brain cells.

Because we like our sport, and because in Australia it is difficult to avoid the heat, especially in the summer, we should be mindful of the impact of heat stress and dehydration and make sure that we take the simple steps to keep ourselves safe.

From a National and State association level, there should be an acceptance of the policies and guidelines as developed by organisations such as Sports Medicine Australia. All clubs should be made aware of the things they can do to limit the impact of heat and dehydration for those shooters who attend their clubs. This involves doing simple things such as having clean water available, sunscreen, shade for referees and scorers, using shade or shelters to the best advantage. For the individual shooters, make sure that you keep yourself hydrated with plenty of water or electrolytes and keep cool when you are not shooting.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY – NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. Any shooter wanting to compete at the Trap Nationals must be a registered member of the ACTA for the current financial year that the championships are being held.
2. **If a vacancy exists in any events at the Championships a person must nominate for all events they wish to shoot at the nomination window in one visit. To be eligible to shoot in any event the nomination must be received before 10.00am on the day of the event.**
3. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.
Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
4. Squads of up to 6 to shoot 50 targets/75 targets/100 targets in brackets of 25 targets or pairs, one or two visits only to the traps. National Handicap event to be 5 (five) person squads, 5 (five) targets per lane.
5. **Shooters will be Pre-squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director. Withdrawing from an event should (if possible) be done giving 48 hours notice in writing (if possible) prior to the event or by ringing the National Office and leaving a message after hours.**
6. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/75 targets/50 pairs. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets or pairs. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** may be incurred.
7. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at a designated trap at a time suitable to management
8. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
9. All shooters should sign the score sheet after each 25 targets/pairs. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
10. All competitors will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** will be incurred in the event concerned.
11. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised **FIVE (5) TARGETS**.
12. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
13. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
14. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
15. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall chose in which team they will be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
16. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize.
17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
18. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
19. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
20. **All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Trap Championships.**
21. Payment of the nomination fee only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not be eligible to any refund.

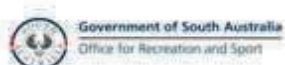

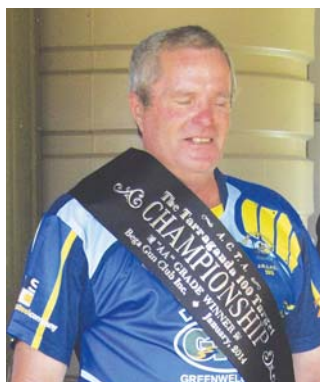


Tarraganda Winner Chris Davis

NSW Members and Dealers

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

(a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

Welcome to "The Back Page", I am glad to be back and hope you enjoy this month's articles.

From The Past:

Throughout the past 150 years of trapshooting in this country, shoot offs have intrigued and inspired us all. Often, it is the battle of wills that take place in great shoot offs that result in the shooters achieving more than could possibly have been done without the other shooters or the occasion.

One such shoot off took place in Melbourne in 1974, when Warren Charlton and Vin Ryan clashed for the Australian Double Barrel championship. The previous record for this event was 370/370, set in 1970 when Jim Ellis defeated John Harris and this was the only time that the event had gone more than 300 targets.

When John Winter from New Zealand missed his 308th target to take third place, no one expected the battle that was about to take place. Vin and Warren shot another 312 targets before the shoot off was finalised. In the process first Warren then Vin passed the magical 600 straight mark, a feat that many doubted would ever be achieved and Warren set a new trap break record of 664 straight.

Of course the history books show that Warren Charlton won this epic shoot off when he hit his 620th target after Vin Ryan had missed his but they don't tell us that it was this shoot off that changed our sport for the next 25 years.

The ACTA executive committee at the time were looking to change our rules from

imperial to metric and were also convinced that Olympic trap was the future. So, when Warren and Vin managed to shoot more than 600 straight at Melbourne it seemed logical to them that our sport had become too easy.

So in 1975 our targets were sped up to travel 50 metres instead of 50 yards and the common mark moved from 16 yards to 16 metres. In making these changes the executive of the time ignored the fact that the rest of the trap shooting world would stay with the old rules and subsequently we found ourselves out of kilter with the rest of the world for the next 25 years.

For the Record:

Our break records are restricted to targets broken at a single shoot, elsewhere in the world they also record break records which carry on from shoot to shoot until the shooter misses a target. They generally call these type of breaks "long runs".

There have been some very impressive "long runs" shot by Australians but undoubtedly the biggest long run ever shot by an Australian was by Bill Iles in 1994 when he shot more than 3,000 targets straight.

Another great "long run" was shot by Ian Merrick in 1995-6 when he shot more than 1700 straight, Ian has been lost to trap shooting as a result of a serious injury which occurred whilst at work in the late 1990's and our sport lost one of its best.

From now on, I will be recording long runs of more than 1000 targets. Please call me if you shoot a long run of more than 1,000 so that I can confirm and record it.

Did you Know?

We have sent teams to every world championship since 1972 as well as the Paris Olympics of 1900 and the Melbourne Olympics of 1956. Undoubtedly, the two best Olympic discipline shooters to represent Australia are Michael Diamond and Russell Mark. Their records are testament to the talent and dedication of both these great shooters.

the world championships.

Our only other top 10 performances have come in 1973 when both Doug Smith and Peter Wray finished in the top 10.

In My Opinion:

In my opinion we should change the way we shoot "continental". I believe that we should speed the targets up to 60 metres and shoot it double barrel so as to provide a link between trap and olympic trap. By doing this we would be providing a low cost method of simulating the types of targets that are present in olympic trap shooting and hopefully provide our young shooters with olympic aspirations a discipline that will help prepare them for olympic trap competition without leaving our clubs with the huge expense of installing olympic trap layouts.

The continental disciplines have been discontinued in most countries throughout the world and subsequently we would not be affecting our international commitments in any way whatsoever by making this change.

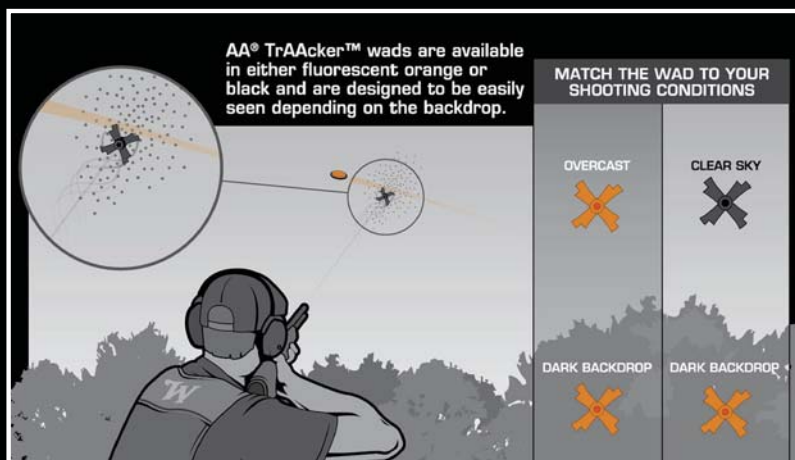
