#### PRESIDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT 2013

The ACTA had a slight increase in membership during the year, however is actively researching initiatives to promote the association and attract new shooters. It has been identified that there are numerous juniors that haven't attended a National Championship, therefore another initiative that the Executive Committee

has initiated is free nominations for any junior attending any ACTA National Championship for the first time. This will hopefully encourage more junior competition and increase attendance in competition.

Jim undertakes this work voluntarily and all of the membership thank him immensely for this. I also thank anyone that may have assisted Jim with these.

I had the recent pleasure in attending several State carnivals and the ISSF carnival in Perth. All of these events were extremely successful and well conducted. I congratulate the committees, organisers, volunteers and members for making these a success — not only for their State, but also for the competitors that attended.

Recently I reported in the CTSN issues that have arisen with social media, including "Facebook", and at the time of writing this report there are still several unresolved incidents that are being investigated. 

# **ACTA NEWS**

#### **ACTA MEMBERSHIP**

Our constitution states that anyone shooting on an ACTA ground must be a member. That is, if they do not join prior to the 1st of January each year they are not members. This includes ACTA members not renewing their membership on time and continuing to shoot this puts other members at risk.

A non-member shooting "targets only" is introducing a new person to the sport and the club, however this is limited to 3 visits to an ACTA ground, this person could cost your club and officials a great deal if this is outside the guidelines. They DO NOT have insurance cover after shooting three times, or shooting a discipline other than those they are entitled to. Reciprocal membership only allows those people affiliated with F&G, FGFA, SSAA to shoot in 5 stand competition or 5 stand practice.

Members pay membership fees to be a part of the Club, to enjoy the benefits the Club has built up over many years of volunteer work and some Government grants to assist the Club grow. Those wishing to shoot at the club and enjoy its layouts, club and amenities should also contribute to the Club by being a member. This is how clubs survive, through the support of members.

#### SUZY BALOGH-NATIONAL COACHING DIRECTOR

The Australian Clay Target Association announces the appointment of three times Olympian, and gold medallist at the Athens 2004 Games, Suzy Balogh to the position of national coaching director. Suzy will commence with the Association in March 2014 and work with States to implement a national coaching and development strategy. Balogh's national and international experience will be the catalyst required to drive the development and coaching pathway.

A major component of Balogh's appointment is to increase the numbers and level of coaches in Australia. In 2014 an ACTA academy is set to be introduced to cater for the best young shooters identified in the four disciplines of the Australian Clay Target Association. This program will focus on Junior's reaching National level and progressing though to International level. Bridging the gap from national to international is an area Balogh has had a great deal of experience in. This will assist those wishing to represent Australia in Trap, Skeet, 5 Stand Sporting and ISSF Shooting.

#### **Suzy Balogh Profile:**

Events: Women's Trap and Women's Double Trap.

Three times Olympian, with a gold medal at the Athens 2004 Games.

Balogh won a bronze medal at the 2002 Manchester Commonwealth Games and a gold in the 2006 Melbourne Commonwealth Games. She is currently preparing to gain selection into a third Commonwealth Games in Glasgow

Four times gold medallist at the Oceania Continental Championship (Trap - Sydney 1999, Trap - Auckland 2003, Double Trap - Brisbane 2005, Trap - Sydney 2007).

Silver Medallist at the Oceania Continental Championship (Double Trap – Auckland 2001).

Bronze Medallist at the Oceania Continental Championship (Double Trap – Sydney 1999, Trap – Brisbane 2005).

Balogh has competed in:

3 Olympic Games, twelve World Championships, four World Cup Finals, 29 World Cups, nine Oceania Continental Championships and Two Commonwealth Games.

#### **DATA-BASE**

The building of the ACTA data-base and website is well underway with a request going out to clubs for critical information in relation to membership costs. The cost structures of clubs will be built in to allow making payment of fees easily calculated. The system will have club, zone, state and national fees. It will calculate and report on those areas of membership and distribution requirements, this will allow the ACTA to deposit funds directly to each organisations bank accounts.

The system will allow online membership renewals and joining. Instead of a cumbersome paper trail. All of this will be able to be done on line, by individuals and or by club secretaries as it is currently. The system will allow online entry to national championships and provide receipts for all transactions making joining, renewing and entry easy through the one online system. This will also allow for new memberships to be allocated to the nominated club for approval before being able to proceed.

We have detailed information on members and this new data base will allow us to collect further information such as national events, national awards, state events and awards. It will allow us to identify coaches and referees including re-accreditation and renewal details and will ensure we are able to capture much critical information that we currently do not have, particularly on the history of shooters and events.

The system is anticipated to be operational from the end of April 2014.

#### **RULE REMINDERS**

Continuing on with our Rule Reminders:

This month we look at Rule 4.10(j)

All competitors are required to dress in an appropriate manner with the wearing of singlets and thongs/scuffs or bare feet prohibited. Shoes must have a restraining strap or full support at the heel. This applies when competing and when they are to be presented with any prize or trophy.

Although most shooters and club officials are aware of the need for safety in their approach to footwear, sometimes we still hear of shooters being allowed by clubs to shoot in thongs, scuffs or bare feet. Club management should note that in the event of one of these people being involved in an accident, insurance cover will be an issue.

As to the other part of the rule relating to singlets, clubs are reminded that this rule is in place to ensure that our dress standards appropriately reflect the character and dignity of our sport.

Shooters should also note that the wearing of inappropriate footwear and the wearing of singlets also applies at presentations.

#### CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION

#### **Entry**

Entry into the 2014 Australian Skeet Championships is open to all shooters who are registered for 2014 with the Australian Clay Target Association. Temporary honorary membership will be offered to overseas visitors who can produce evidence that he or she is a current financial member of their home country's equivalent body to the Australian Clay Target Association. Australian competitors must produce their 2014 registered shooter record book prior to competing.

#### Divisions

The competition will be divided into separate divisions for, Womens, Juniors, Sub Juniors and Veterans, excepting the National Skeet Handicap where places shall be awarded from 1 to 5.

Any eligible competitor paying nominations are entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors, Sub-Junior or Veterans section; however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize. A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section before trophies are awarded.

When Australia/New Zealand Skeet Postal team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the Open team selection as well as section teams shall choose in which team they will compete. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams. To be eligible for selection or naming in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

#### **Age Qualifications**

Veterans - are those competitors who, will be over the age of 65 years at the time of competition.

Juniors - are those competitors who, will be under the age of 18 years at the time of competition.

Sub Juniors – are those competitors who, will be under the age of 15 years at the time of competition.

#### **Starting Time**

Each day's event shall commence at 8.30am.

Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination and will be re-squadded towards the end of the event. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event, he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.

#### Cartridges

For all events, excluding the National 20gauge Championship, load size is limited to 28gr struck measure shot size not larger than No.7. For the National 20gauge Championship load size is limited to 24gr struck measure shot size not larger that No.7.

Cartridges of the competitor's choice, including re-loads, may be used in all National Championships. Cartridges will be available for purchase at the National Championships. Random checks may be carried out.

#### **Target and Traps**

Targets through the program are to be as determined by the Management Committee. All targets thrown remain the property of the organisers. All throwing equipment will be electronically operated.

#### Classification

It is the responsibility of the competitor to see that their entry is correctly classified - and indication can be obtained from the daily scoreboard. This applies to skeet grades, Womens, Juniors, Sub Juniors and Veterans divisions.

Contestants are reminded that re-grading and re-handicapping will be carried out on a daily basis, where required by the rules.

#### **Major Sponsors**

The Association gratefully acknowledges the sponsorship received from sponsors.

#### **Practice**

Practice, subject to trap availability, will be available throughout the championships. Tokens may be purchased at the events office.

#### **Shoot-offs, Continuation of Events**

If, for any reason, the event cannot be completed on the day it commences, the management reserves the right to stop shooting at any time, if considered necessary. In such a case, the competition will recommence where it left off on the following day.

#### Nominations - All Events

All championship nominations shall be \$40 plus targets at \$5 per 25 and include a contribution to the discipline fund.

#### **Additional Team Events**

In addition to the Championships the following team events will be conducted in conjunction:

- ➤ Five Man Club Team
  - Team members must be registered through the club for which they are competing.



- The competition is open to teams of five shooters, registered through the same club.
- The nomination is \$25 per team.

*Trophies:* Each member of the winning team receives a gold medal. The winning team will be presented with the FITASC Perpetual Trophy. \$25 from each team entry will go into a prize pool for the winning team.

#### ➤ Two Man Team

- · The competition is open to teams of any two shooters.
- · The nomination is \$20 per team.

*Trophies:* Both members of the winning team receive a gold medal. The winning team will be presented with the Adrian Cousens Perpetual Trophy. \$20 from each team entry will go into a prize pool for the winning team.

#### ➤ Mixed Pairs Team

- The competition is open to teams of one male and one female shooter.
- · The nomination is \$20 per team.

*Trophies:* Both members of the winning team receive a gold medal. The winning team will be presented with the C & J Burt Mixed Pairs Perpetual Trophy. \$20 from each team entry will go into a prize pool for the winning team.

#### ➤ Two Women Team

- The competition is open to teams of two female shooters.

#### Authority



# Psychological Skills for Shooting

#### TYPE A PERSONALITY

Stress is usually described as an excess of demands over resources and most of think that the pressures that cause stress are external: that is, they come from the outside. These outside pressures or stressors can be divided into different groups: physical, environmental, cultural and social. The internal stressors, those from within are

harder to quantify as they come from our beliefs, attitudes and expectations about the world and ourselves, our habits, behaviour and our personality.

A couple of months ago, I touched on the concept of personality in the article on ego. This month I want to go further and look at personality type as a cause of stress.

We are all affected by life events: the positive, neutral and negative things that happen to us, our family and friends and the society in general. It is how we view these events that will determine if they become stressors. If we see the things that happen to us as threats then we will become scared, fearful, worry and stress over what we might think will happen. If we see the event as something that is neutral, that is, has no importance to us, or impact on our lives, we will be likely to ignore it and move on to the next thing in our lives. Some events we might see as opportunities. These events are the ones we learn from and will have a positive impact on our lives.

Some people are stress prone. Researchers have divided people into type A and type B behaviour patterns. The researchers, American cardiologists, Friedman and Roseman, hypothesised in the 1950's that type A behaviour people are more likely to experience various illnesses, such as heart attacks as a result of their stereotyped behaviours.

To determine if their patients were type A they asked the following questions.

- · Do you feel rushed?
- · Do you walk fast?
- · Are you competitive?
- · Are you impatient?
- · Do you go all out?
- · Do you have no or only few interests outside work?
- · Do you hide your feelings?
- · Do you talk fast?
- · Do you try to do more than one thing at a time?
- · Are you hard driving?
- · Do you anticipate others (e.g interrupt, finish sentences, etc)?
- · Are you empathic in speech?
- · Do you want recognition from others?
- · Do you eat quickly?
- · Are you ambitious?
- Do you look ahead to the next task?

I have deliberately left out the scoring criteria, because I do not want readers diagnosing themselves as type A behaviour pattern. Some of the things listed we will all do from time to time and make up normal behaviour.

There is nothing wrong about being a type A personality. It usually

means you are a high achiever, driven, competitive, focused, etc. These are all favourable characteristics: it only becomes problematic when you are no longer able to care for yourself and the behaviours have a negative impact on your health, your relationships and your ability to work.

#### What are the features of type A behaviour people?

Firstly, they feel they under the pressure all of time. Having to rush, working to deadline after deadline, trying to hurry others along, doing more than one thing at a time, etc.

Habitually working long hours, rushing to meet deadlines, will mean that we become tired, sluggish, lethargic, irritable and we will not be able to concentrate. We will then make mistakes, lose motivation, and become less productive. Now I know that I am describing what will happen to us at work but the same effects will occur when we are at play. Our performance on the golf course, shooting range, etc will also be affected. We will often blame the targets, the gun, the weather, when we should be looking inwards and examining if it has something to do with our life style.

Secondly, type A people are typically egocentric. They focus on their own needs. They have little time for other people and have no patience if things are not going their way. Righteousness is a big factor in their thinking and that although they are quick to apportion blame or criticise, they are wounded when it happens to them. They have an inability to see their own shortcomings and they will often ignore others or the environment because they are preoccupied with themselves.

The next factor is competitiveness. They are happy when they are locked into a battle over something and they are driven to win as this is seen as a hallmark of success. In sport competition is a good thing, but in the workplace, the family or the social group, it can lead to bullying and focusing on the individual rather than the issue. This can lead to a power struggle or a power imbalance where the type A individual losses sight of their goals and beating the other person becomes the goal.

The fourth factor is ambition. Ambition in it's own right is not a bad thing but it can be negative if relaxing (an effective way of reducing stress) is seen as unproductive and doing nothing makes you feel guilty. Ambition has the ability to make us lose sight of the things and the people around us. We neglect our family and friends. Because you are focused on the future (meeting your goals) you lose sight of what is important: the present.

The final factor is self-worth. If your self-worth is dependent upon success, that is, you have an irrational belief that you are only worth-while when I win, then you will be setting yourself up for failure because you cannot win all the time or forever. Type A people will have a distorted 'locus of control'. That is, they will accept the credit when things are going well and they are winning, but will not accept that their loss might be their fault. They will externalise the loss and blame whatever (or whoever) they can think of to avoid accepting responsibility for their own actions.

There is a problem with trying to categorise people into one camp or another. At anyone time those of us who are type A will behave more like type B (relaxed and easy going) and those of us who are type B will behave in a way that resembles a type A behaviour pattern. What we must remember is that we all deal with stressors differently and it is whether we see them as an opportunity or a threat that makes the difference.

# **CONDITIONS OF ENTRY – National Skeet Championships**

- 1. Any shooter wanting to compete at the Skeet Nationals must be a registered member of the ACTA for the current financial year that the championships are being held.
- 2. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.
  - Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
- 3. Shooters will be Pre Squadded and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
- 4. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/100 targets. A time limit of one minute will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets. Should the one-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET may be incurred.
- 5. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at a designated trap at a time suitable to management
- 6. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 7. All shooters should sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
- 8. All competitors will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET will be incurred in the event concerned.
- 9. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised **FIVE (5) TARGETS**.
- 10. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- 11. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 12. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall choose in which team they will be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
- 13. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize.
- 14. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
- 15. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behaviour of the card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 16. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final. The ACTA reserves the right to alter the program.
- 17. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 18. All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Championships.
- 19. Squads of 5/6 to shoot 50 targets in one visit only to the traps. Squads of 5/6 to shoot 100 targets in one or two visits to the traps or as designated by the Tournament Director.
- 20. Payment of the nomination fee only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not be eligible for any refund.





The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

- (a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the indi-

vidual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

Welcome to "The Back Page", I hope you enjoy this month's articles and invite you to call me to discuss our history, records, personalities or other points of interest.

### From The Past:

The greatest trap shoot off that has ever occurred took place in Hamilton, New Zealand in March 1994 between two Australians. The two best Australian trap shooters of the last 30 years clashed in an epic battle which took three days of shooting off to settle.

In the end it was Bill Iles who triumphed when he defeated Michael Diamond after Michael missed his 1727th target and in doing so he established a world record that is never likely to be broken.

It was the greatest shoot off in trap shooting history anywhere in the world, never before or since has a shoot off reached such epic proportions.

The shoot off made news throughout the

world and of course the two shooters involved have gone on to become "legends" of our sport, since that time Michael has gone on to win 6 Olympic Trap world championships and Bill established himself as the most successful shooter in Australian trapshooting history.

### For The Record:

Since the inception of the "Mackintosh" teams event, trap shooters have strived to achieve the best possible scores for their country, Australia has had many outstanding performances in this event but none better than the following:

### **Did You Know:**

Our trap shooting rules originated in the USA. When Ligowski invented the clay target and trap shooters started to shoot clays instead of live targets a new set of rules had to be developed for competition to take place. Over a period of 20 years the basic rules of trap shooting were developed in the USA and by 1900 they had spread from the USA to England.

The English essentially adopted the same rules but decided to stick with their double barrel shotguns rather than switch to single barrel as they had done in the USA. The English rules then spread to Australia in the early 1900's and were adopted by the Gun Clubs Association for the early clay target competitions.

When the ACPTSA was formed in 1936 they also adopted the English rules and subsequently double barrel shooting was entrenched in Australia. Most of the fundamentals of the original trap shooting rules still exist today with the major differences between rules of the various associations occurring in disciplines, administration, grading and handicapping.

The rules pertaining to layout dimensions, trap dimensions and target flight are still essentially the same as they were prior to 1900. The original rules included target distance of 50 yards and a target height of 9 feet at 10 yards. The original layout rules included 5 lanes which were to be 3 yards apart at 16 yards.

### In My Opinion:

In my opinion clubs should include all five disciplines in their open shoot programmes. That is, Handicap, Double Barrel, Single Barrel, Points Score and Double Rise. It's the variety of disciplines that ensures that the programmes are not boring and that the shoots are not dominated by any one shooter.


I also believe that by having handicap included in every programme we are giving the novice or lower grade shooters the opportunity to win an overall prize, this opportunity is not provided for in common mark shooting .
