National President's Notes

I watched with interest the recent review of Swimming Australia after the last Summer Olympics. Australia was a feared nation in this sport winning more than its fair share (per population) medals at World, Commonwealth and Olympic Games. Since the 80's and 90's there has been a steady decline in the number won with the last Olympic Games producing only one gold medal. This is far different to the 'golden' days of swimming.

The appointment of a new Executive Officer, High Performance Manager and Mr John Bertrand (America's Cup winning skipper) to lead the review identified many areas requiring improvement. The main outcomes of the review identified the requirement for a new

High Performance (HP) model, the exit of athletes that systemically hinder training and performance (as per the 'Stilnox' issue at the last Olympics involving swimmers) and the requirement to set higher benchmarks for athletes to aspire to.

No longer are the days in swimming that, 'close enough is good enough'. The Australian Sports Commission identified that funding to the sport is aligned with required outcomes and no funding is to be spent on athletes or areas that do not meet benchmark criteria or have a genuine chance to produce the required ultimate outcome – gold medals.

The Swimming Australia review has many similarities to that which has been undertaken by the Australian International Shooting Limited, (AISL). A new HP Manager has been contracted, the selection criteria has been reviewed and the "Board" of AISL is presently working towards meeting the Australian Sports Commission (governments) targets.

I was asked recently why I was of the belief that there is still a PQS for ISSF shooting? In simple terms, call it what you like – there is still a benchmark score. However I have been advised that if a member reaches this score and wins the event at the nominated events, AISL will send that shooter to a World Cup.

Clay Target members that fulfil the required criteria for selection into squads are also invited to contract to AISL to perform in approximately five different areas, that include training, performance, availability etc. Gone are the days of the 1980's where the Manager selected people to go away on teams, there was ample money and 'first past the post' was the norm. Times have changed and not only in our sport.

I recently had the pleasure in attending in New Zealand for the World International Shooting Federation Clay Target DTL Championships. Whilst there, the Executive Officer, Robert Nugent (ICTSF Vice President) and I attended the International Clay Target Shooting Federation (ICTSF) Annual General Meeting and technical meeting. At the AGM I advised the Federation that the "core business" of the ACTA is Skeet, DTL, 5-Stand sporting clays and ISSF, and that 'walk through' sporting clays is not part of our core business. As such it was my belief that the ACTA had insufficient time to adequately prepare to host the 2015 World Sporting Championships. As a result of this submission the ACTA declined the 2015 event however was allocated the 2019 World Sporting Championships. This will provide the ACTA with sufficient 'lead time' to ensure a world class event, coming off the back of the 2018 World DTL Championships which we are still conducting.

Whilst at the AGM I was tasked — along with the England and New Zealand to produce a "Procedures Manual" for use by the ICTSF — which will include many different areas for consideration - however will provide consistency for future hosts (and shooters). At present there is confusion as to which rules are used for different events in different countries. This will also ensure competitors know what rules will be used for the setting of targets, standards required, etc.

I am also completing with England a "host agreement" – an administrative contract that identifies the responsibilities between the host country and the ICTSF. This will assist the ACTA at the 2018 and 2019 World Championships ensuring the administrative and financial responsibility that is required.

The Executive Officer and I also attended the Annual General Meeting (by invitation) of the Oceania Federation, as observers. This has assisted the ACTA in forging important relationships with other countries in our area when discussions commence for 2018 and beyond.

We also met independently with New Zealand, England and Ireland to discuss the future of the ICTSF and the progression of our sport within each country, eg how we can assist each into the future. The meeting with New Zealand included future discussions with a view to formulating administrative arrangements between our two countries to ensure administrative consistency, something which requires formalisation to ensure smooth transmission for our shooters attending in New Zealand, and vice versa.

Tony Turner, the Executive Officer is now also the "Secretariat" or Secretary of the ICTSF – this is a role that is shared by the countries with it now being Australia's turn. Tony was tied up for numerous hours in the handover and has had to get up to speed quickly – something he has taken on as a voluntary role to his own employment with the ACTA. I wish Tony well. Whilst at the World DTL Championships I also undertook the role of Team Manager with meetings precluding my attendance at all times. It was an interesting role, one which I have undertaken for large teams attending international events (World Police & Fire Games – 120 members and Australasian Games – 150 members) but not for a smaller team of 14 members. I did identify beforehand that there is no position description written in the ACTA for the Team Manager position and as such have now commenced writing one. Recommendation to the National Executive Committee will include that the Team Manager is a dedicated person who does not attend any other duties whilst away and should be available in cases of emergency. As athletes attending are required to be competent relative to the possession of firearms (at time with accompanying responsible persons re juniors) it is believed that they are competent to ensure attendance when required at nominated events, dress or demeanour when appropriate. Cases of emergency will be defined and are to include medical treatment, hospitalisation, lost firearms, travel restrictions, accommodation crisis, major catastrophe (earthquake) etc. How this position is to be funded as a 'dedicated' position is to be discussed within the Executive however is important insurance should the worst happen.

The members of the Australian Team in New Zealand performed exceptionally and individual results will be published elsewhere. The membership of the ACTA should be proud that the Glenn Cup Team came home with the trophy and for the World DTL Championships; all four teams (open, juniors, veterans and ladies) came home with a silver medal. Congratulations to all members of the teams on behalf of the ACTA Executive and membership. The next World DTL Championships are to be held in Ireland in 2016. Start practicing!

ACTA NEWS

ICTSF MEETINGS

President Allan Vilcins and delegate Robert Nugent and EO Tony Turner attended meetings of the International Clay Target Shooting Federation (ICTSF) who are responsible for the allocation of the Championships and the conduct of the event. We attended the Annual Meeting in Hamilton, New Zealand, on Saturday morning, 8th, and the technical meeting on Sunday morning, 9th March. We then also attended a meeting of the ISSF Oceania group on Sunday afternoon, 9th March.

At the Annual meeting Australia agreed to take the responsibility for the provision of secretarial services to the ICTSF It is another selfless contribution by both Mr Vilcins and Mr Nugent who were both attending the worlds as shooters to take time out as administrators of the Association to attend those meetings. The ICTSF pay for one delegate from each National, so as both Mr Nugent and Mr Vilcins were already going we are able to claim one return airfare and expenses, therefore costing us for one person to attend.

Frank Auditore also attended at the request of the Executive Committee, Frank's innovation and constant support has the Association in a great position to conduct the World DTL in 2018. Frank has already made numerous changes to his program to cater specifically for the requirements of the World event. These decisions to send people to these events are allowing the ACTA to stay on top of World happening's and providing the opportunity to compete at International level.

I was disappointed to hear unjustified criticism of our administrators, I understand our Executive and Staff of the ACTA are under constant scrutiny, however I will say I have never worked with an executive or Staff member who does not wholeheartedly believe they are making decisions in the best interests of the Association.

Perhaps members with issues to discuss or questions to ask seek out an Executive member and ask to speak to them in a professional manner and environment. A right time and place would be a good start. If it is approached in the appropriate manner maybe we can get meaning-ful conversations and discussion that will assist the sport. Remember these people are volunteers doing a job for you, the members. Registered shooters through their member Clubs and States select these delegates, so afford them the respect they deserve and above all talk to them.

DATA BASE – WEB SITE DEVELOPMENT

I have received a number of enquires relating to the new data base, much of that enquiry relating to access for secretaries of Clubs, States and of course individual members. We are still in the process of building the date base and how it works within the web site, all of the details on how it works and of course access issues are being programmed in to meet the needs of the National Office and all of our clubs and States. This will include reports that can be generated by those organisations:

Reports on members including being able to identify the demographic by age, sex, shooting preference etc. Each person's file will contain their name, address, email, phone, referee and or coaching qualifications, National events attended and many other reports that will enable us to make informed decisions in relation to moving the Association forward.

Each member will be given a login and password to access their own personal data. As an individual you will be able to re-join your club

through the system. All new applications for membership will be directed to the Club Secretary for Club approval prior to the Secretary lodging the forms. This can all be done remotely or through the current system.

Once we have this up to a workable standard we will seek a small section of clubs and States to trial the system, noting any issues that need to modified or changed. We are confident the system will be up and running smoothly in time for renewals for 2015.

We reiterate, the ACTA is not taking any option away from Clubs, States or individuals, these are additional options.

In addition to the implementation of these initiatives we are also in the near future integrating the shoot results page into the system so clubs can run the shoot through a scoring system and then "send" the results through to the ACTA National Office and also have handicapping automatically processed. This will occur in the first two years of the implementation and development of the program.

There will be a "Phone app" also available for those tech savvy shooters so they have instant access to their own information and also to generic information on the site. Members will only be able to access their own records through the login & password system. Club Secretaries will be only able to access details from their Club. State Secretaries will be able to access information from their State. All member Clubs and States will be able to access certain information to conduct shoots. When a member nominates their shoot details will appear. ACTA number, Name, Club, (in the future handicap). Should the person not be financial, the system will "red flag" the person and their details will not appear.

With regard to those shooting three times the system will allow these people to be entered as "potential" members. They will be allocated a number, when the person shoots at a club they will give details as currently required. Upon entering that number to register the potential member it will show how many times and where the person has shot. Once they have reached three times the system will identify them as "being required to join" this will be accessible at every club.

There will be a help system attached and a "help desk" to assist everyone during the implementation. It will contain a user guide that may be printed as well.

The system is one of the best I have seen, particularly in the area of ease of use. The system is based on the KIS theory KEEP IT SIMPLE. I look forward to updating everyone on the progress and implementation over the next few months.

MULTI PURPOSE FACILITY, THE NATIONAL GROUND

We have just finished negotiating the hire of the ground for two festivals to be conducted in Wagga Wagga. The first is at Easter, the Stone the Crows festival. This is a like minded group targeting the grey nomad community. It will commence Wednesday the 16th through to Monday the 22nd April. This will be followed later in the year by the World Disc Bowls Championships on the ground from the 22nd of October.

Using the ground for other activities should increase our opportunities for funding by putting us in the "Multi Purpose" category. Hiring the venue will bring some "new money" into the Association, something we need to continue to foster. It also opens up to those people attending, the sport of Clay Target shooting.

WAGGA GUN CLUB



There was nothing unlucky about the running of the 13th Australian Veterans Games organised by Wagga Gun Club on the National Grounds between March 4th and 8th inclusive, which was one of the most successful & enjoyable in the history of the event.

The Veterans Games followed their usual annual format with 75 targets 5 Stand Sporting being held on day 1, March 4th, 75 targets Skeet on Day 2, 75 targets Double Barrel DTL on Day 3, 75 targets Points Score on Day 4 and 75 targets Champion of Champions on Day 5.

Over the 5 days, 100 competitors from far North Queensland, NSW and Victoria competed in a very enjoyable combination of events and with the unique relaxed and friendly atmosphere for which the Veterans Games has become famous.

Competitors were split into age groups, being 45 to 55, 56 to 60, 61 to 65, 66 to 70, 71 to 75 and 76 plus and the only complaint that 1 heard was a request by the older shooters to add a category for the 76 to 80 age group and then make the upper group 81 plus. 



Australia's longest running Olympic Discipline clay target shooting event, the Australasian-Pacific Grand Prix. was conducted for the 20th time at the Brisbane Gun Club, on 14th 15th and 16th February 2014. As is generally the case, the club grounds were well presented, despite the recent heat and dry conditions, and the club's overall appearance and ambience were improved by the presentation of the grounds and clubhouse, and the colour-

ful addition of the various state and national flags.

First conducted in 1995, the Australasian-Pacific Grand Prix competition was originally designed to allow shooters from throughout Australia to compete under international conditions amongst shooters from visiting countries. This has certainly been the case on each occasion the event has been conducted, and although we have had only a sprinkling of international competitors in recent times, this year we once again welcomed the 40 strong Japanese contingent representing the Japan Top Gun

Club to again fulfil that role.

As recent times have seen a marked decrease in the numbers of Australia shooters competing in the ISSF Skeet discipline, a decision was made, with the QCTA's approval, to make a change this year and conduct an Australian Skeet competition in conjunction with the Olympic Trap event. This proved reasonably successful in that four squads of skeet shooters participated during the weekend, which was considerably more that would have been the case if the ISSF Skeet events were conducted.

The competition program for the 3 days of shooting once again

included a 100 target Olympic Trap 'Skins' Badge Match and a 150 target Grand Prix in Olympic Trap and this year for the first time, a 100 target 'Skins' Badge match and a 100 target Grand Prix event in Australian Skeet.

In keeping with the usual competition program, the weekend's proceedings kicked off with the conducting of the Olympic Trap 'Skins' Badge match which has become extremely popular with all in attendance over many years. The established procedures were once again in place and shooters were again divided into two groups AA and A Grades combined and B and C grades com-

bined, with \$10 of each shooter's nomination fee pooled for each of the four rounds of the event. The established rules are that the highest score in the group wins the prize money for that round, and if two or three shooters have the same score in the round, the prize money is shared.

If however, four or more shooters shoot the equal highest score, the prize money is held over and 'jackpots' to the next round.

At the commencement of the day on Friday, conditions were still and the targets were set without any wind, however it appeared that the heat and hazy conditions would make for a testing day for all ready to enjoy the weekend's proceedings.

The first of the five squads entered for the Olympic Trap 'Skins' event kicked off the morning with a leisurely 10.00a.m. start, and it was obvious as usual that the competition for the 'Skins' prize

Speaking of young boys

When I was a little boy entertainment was way more limited than it is today. No iPads, no computers, no internet, no smart phones, no DVDs; there wasn't even any TV. Television didn't come to Australia till 1956, just in time for the Melbourne Olympics. And as a single parent blue collar family we couldn't afford one for a long time after that anyway. So our home entertainment was via radio programs and comic strips in the newspapers. Of the latter, my two favourites were "The Phantom"



and "Mandrake the Magician". So when my old mate Kevin Weatherall from Tamworth phoned me recently to tell me he had happened upon a very enlightening episode of Mandrake in a January 1954 edition of the Australian Woman's Weekly magazine and that Mandrake apparently was a Skeet shooter, I was interested enough to ask him to send it on to me.

Mandrake the magician

Upon receiving it, I was initially only personally interested due to the nostalgic connection between my childhood and my later sporting interests. However upon closer examination I noticed a very interesting and yet obscure historical point, which is why I decided to share it in my column this month. During my time working for NSSA in San Antonio as Chief Instructor (their version of National Coaching Director) I was fortunate enough to have the time and opportunity to research the history of Skeet shooting fairly extensively. In fact the prelude to the Instruction Manual that I wrote for them was an expanded version of that topic.

From humble origins

Skeet shooting evolved on a small farm in rural Massachusetts around 1920. And by the time it began to take hold across North America a few years later, many of the early glitches had already been resolved. For instance the full circle had already been reduced to a half circle and the radius of that circle had been reduced from 25 yards back to 20 yards. However the target flight was still directly over Stations eight and seven, which was a carry over from it's full circle origins. This was not amended until the sports escalating popularity necessitated gun clubs building multiple layouts.

A work in progress

Immediately the impracticality of building them as isolated entities with a twenty yard buffer between them to prevent numerous problems including targets and fragments landing in the middle of adjoining fields was realised. To solve all theses problems and allow the shared house adjoining field system that we enjoy today, the target crossing point was moved six yards out from station eight. However this required all the shooting points to be relocated from their original positions on a half circle with a twenty yard radius, to new positions on a semi circle

with a twenty one yard radius.

The good news

Skeet shooters of the modern era would immediately appreciate the enormity of the infrastructure problems this should have created. The three feet square concrete pads on stations two through six would have to be broken up and new ones surveyed, excavated, boxed and poured on every layout across the country. Not so! And this is the very point highlighted by our old mate Mandrake. Shooting stations designated by one yard square concrete pads are a far more modern development. Back then the various shooting positions were called Posts or Stands, not Stations. Once the field was surveyed a small wooden post about three feet high was driven into the ground at each point and the shooters simply stood behind each post to shoot.

Gentlemen, take your positions

For convenience an edged wooden tray about a foot square was usually affixed to the top of each post. This was a particularly handy addition as photos of Skeet shooting competitions from this era will indicate. Shorts, tee-shirts, sneakers and baseball caps were conspicuous by their absence, as were vests and pouches. People in general and clay target shooters in particular tended to dress a lot more formally for recreational activities in those days. So when it was your turn to shoot and you walked up to the Stand in your suit, collar and tie, complete with polished shoes and felt hat, the tray was the perfect place to put your box of shells while you shot your targets. And so it was the post and tray from bygone days as depicted with Mandrake in this nostalgic time capsule that led us down memory lane to a golden era when even Hollywood film stars took time out to become World Skeet Champions.

Still in the dark

Somewhat embarrassingly my own home State of Victoria is still the one with the most recent gaps in my State Skeet Champions file. Back in my January column I thanked all those people who had assisted me with various results from the two "mystery" years of 2005 and 2007. At that time I was only missing the Doubles winner from 2005 and the 20ga winner from 2007. Following that Chris Rockliff was kind enough to phone and advise me that the 2005 Doubles ribbon happily resides in his trophy cabinet on the "Apple Isle". Along with his NINETEEN other State Skeet ribbons I might add! However the 20 Gauge winner from 2007 still continues to elude me, so I think it's time I threw out a challenge and turned this enigma into a Holy Crusade. And here it is! If anyone can tell me who won the Victorian 20 Gauge Skeet Championship in 2007 before this year's Skeet Nationals, I will supply them will all the shells they can shoot in both the qualification and the shoot-off in the 2014 National Skeet Handicap. And I promise not to start sooking until the shoot-off passes 200.

March's Trivia Question

I would have thought that somewhere around ten or a dozen consecutive appearances in the State Skeet Postal Team would have been about as many as anyone could rack up, before one of those two infamous laws (Murphy's and Averages) caught up with you. Sooner or later, no matter how much shooting ability you had, a birthday or a wedding or an accident or an illness or any one of a bunch of other similar diversions would intervene and bring such a run to an end. As an example, Laurie Chelepy, who is one of the most dedicated Skeet Shooters I know, once told me that he would have had twenty four consecutive attendances in the Queensland State Skeet Team if his daughter Tracey's twenty first birthday party hadn't dug a divot out of the middle of that fairway.

Enter the Guinness Book

Thus I figured that around fifteen would be pushing the edge of the envelope and anything beyond twenty pretty much impossible. So you can imagine my astonishment when I was reading the write up from the 2008 South Australian Skeet Carnval and found that Ray Kimber's failure to make the Open State Postal Team that vear ended a run of thirty eight consecutive appearances. Thirty Eight! That's every single year since 1970! I've known Ray Kimber for a very long time. I knew he was a lovely bloke and a great

shot. What I didn't know was that he must also be related to Mandrake the Magician! Great job Ray, I am very impressed! Psychological Skills for Shooting

PERSONALITY TRAITS

A large part of my regular, nine to five job, involves training provisionally registered psychologists in core competencies to meet the requirements of the psychologists registration board. One of the core competencies is the area of personality theories and personality assessment. Because the l ast article explored Type A personality as a

factor involved with stress and stress management, it seemed a natural follow-on would be examining personality more fully.

We all know what personality is. We often define people by using the word: "He has a great personality." "She has no personality at all" Personality is something that we recognise in ourselves and other people: but what is it really?

Personality is defined 'as the sum total of all typical ways of acting, feeling, and thinking that makes a person different from all others.' In the 1950's, psychologists researched personality and by examining individuals and therefore it was argued that, "an individual's personality, is his unique pattern of traits." Therefore to understand this definition means we have to define and understand what a trait is. A trait is 'any distinguishable, relatively enduring way in which one individual differs from others."

Defining personality can be hard to understand, but basically three factors need to be considered:

- 1. Individuals are unique.
- 2. Individuals behave differently in different situations.
- 3. Although individuals are unique and behave inconsistently across situations, there is considerable commonality in human behaviour.

Therefore, two theoretical approaches to looking at personality either by type theory (people can be sorted into categories) or trait theory (people differ based on stable attributes, called traits).

When a psychologist examines or assesses personality, what are they looking for? If the psychologist is using a trait theory type test then they will be examining the client's responses to questions that group together to make the following domains:

Neuroticism, Extraversion, Openness, Agreeableness and Concientiousness.

These domains can then be broken down further to individual facets, for example.

Neuroticism (the unhappy person), may identify facets such as anxiety,

anger/hostility, depression, self-consciousness, impulsiveness and vulnerability. It is easy to recognise that these facets will lead to unhappiness.

Extraversion (the happy person), may identify facets such as warmth, gregariousness, assertiveness, activity, excitement-seeking and positive emotions.

Openness (the Intellectual), may identify the following facets: fantasy, aesthetics, feelings, actions, ideas and values.

Agreeableness (the nice person), may identify with facets such as trust, straight-forwardness, altruism, compliance, modesty and tender-mindedness.

Conscientiousness (the high achiever), may identify with facets such as competence, order, dutifulness, achievement-striving and self-discipline.

Each of these domains lists a range of facet that can be used to define personality traits of individuals. But it must be remembered, and realised, that we can experience and demonstrate a number of these different traits. This means rather than being described as 'neurotic', we may have some of the neurotic facets, some of the openness facets, agreeableness facets and so on. It is the combination of these traits that make up our individual personality and defines who we are.

Like all psychological constructs there are also other ways to describe personality other than either type or traits. The article on Ego outlined a basic psychoanalytic approach and there were several breakaway approaches to Freud's theory. These can be attributed to Jung, Adler, Horney, Erikson for example.

Bandura argued that Social Learning Theory was responsible for the sum total of all ways one acts, thinks and feels. He stated that people play an active role in selecting behaviour. That thinking (cognition) is important in personality. That personality is learned behaviour and that behaviour influences future learning experiences.

Behaviouralists, such as Skinner argued against the idea of traits, suggesting that behaviour was determined by situations: that is, people behave in ways to suit their situations. One situation can influence people in different ways.

Finally, the Humanists such as Rogers and Maslow argued that there is an innate internal force pushing for growth: self-concept in Roger's model and self-actualisation in Maslow's model.

In recent years there has been a significant increase in awareness of mental health issues and disorders in the society. Most people can recognise depression, bi-polar, anxiety and obsessive-compulsive disorder. There is even a better understanding in the community of thought disorders such as schizophrenia and other psychotic illnesses. These mental illnesses have lots of press and there is always some awareness raising happening in the community somewhere. Personality disorders on the other hand

The main purpose of the different personality theories is to underpin the therapeutic interventions for dealing with personality disorders. A personality disorder is an enduring pattern of inner experience and behaviour that deviates markedly from the expectations of the individual's culture, is pervasive and inflexible, has an onset in adolescence or early adulthood, is stable over time, and leads to distress and impairment.

In the next article I will examine personality disorders and how they differ from mental disorders.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY – National Skeet Championships

- 1. Any shooter wanting to compete at the Skeet Nationals must be a registered member of the ACTA for the current financial year that the championships are being held.
- 2. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.

Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.

- 3. Shooters will be Pre Squadded and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
- 4. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/100 targets. A time limit of one minute will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets. Should the one-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET may be incurred.
- 5. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at a designated trap at a time suitable to management
- 6. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 7. All shooters should sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
- 8. All competitors will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET will be incurred in the event concerned.
- 9. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised **FIVE (5) TARGETS**.
- 10. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- 11. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 12. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall choose in which team they will be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
- 13. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize.
- 14. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
- 15. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behaviour of the card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 16. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final. The ACTA reserves the right to alter the program.
- 17. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 18. All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Championships.
- 19. Squads of 5/6 to shoot 50 targets in one visit only to the traps. Squads of 5/6 to shoot 100 targets in one or two visits to the traps or as designated by the Tournament Director.
- 20. Payment of the nomination fee only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not be eligible for any refund.

It is a deletion or mutation of the 22nd chromosome. This has affected Chase in every aspect of his life. Since birth he has constantly had trouble learning new skills and remembering old ones. This is due to the syndrome impacting on his gene linked to learning and memory causing him to have Global Development Delay. Sadly, this means that Chase may never learn to talk, use cutlery or even the toilet. He will be heavily dependent on the care and support of others his entire life. In his short life so far, Chase has already experienced many medical issues related to this condition, such as a complete heart block, asthma and breathing difficulties, trouble regulating his body temperature and severely decreased muscle tone.

Our aim is to help Chase and his family. As this is a recently discov-

ered syndrome, there is little information available with regard to treatment, specific strategies and supports available for families. There is however a foundation based in America that runs conferences relating to this condition once every two years. These conferences feature both educational talks and 'round table' sessions including Basic Research, Emerging Communication, Adult/Older Child Transition and Wills, Trusts and Guardianship and much more. Attending this conference would not only assist with planning for Chase's future, but would also allow his family to make lifelong connections with other families affected by Phelan McDermid Syndrome, vastly increasing their support network.



Welcome to "The Back Page", I hope you enjoy this month's articles and invite you to call me to discuss our history, records, personalities or other points of interest.

From The Past:

The two best trap shooters in Australia in the mid 1950's, Newton Thomas and Fred Burns were not allowed to represent Australia in the 1956 Melbourne Olympics because they were deemed to be professionals.

This caused such an upset in the sport that the ACTA decided not to support the Olympic diciplines for the next 16 years. It wasn't until the World Championships were held in Australia in 1972 that the ACTA decided to embrace the Olympic disciplines.

The downside of embracing the Olympic disciplines was that the ACTA had to discontinue its promotion of so called professional events. In the 1950's the ACTA introduced handicap shooting which was to be our professional discipline and in the 1950's and 1960's big money handicap events were held throughout Australia.

In the years since, the Olympic disciplines have had the amateur restrictions removed and subsequently there are no longer any restrictions on our association holding professional events.

Did You Know:

The most difficult feat in trapshooting in this country is to win all six (6) major National events or State events in your home state. In fact this feat has only been accomplished twice in our history. Warren Charlton has accomplished the feat at National level and Craig Bentley has achieved the feat in South Australia. As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

(a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.
