National President's Notes

Change. Some people embrace it, others loathe it. It is however inevitable. Many people over the years have resisted change for the sake of their own comfort zone — I am no different. However to progress as an organisation or the business of clay target we need to try different ideas. Some changes will work and others may not — but unless new initiatives are tried the organisation will stagnate. At the recent DTL Nationals several changes were tried and are now being assessed as to their effectiveness or otherwise. Those that were unsuccessful will be changed.

At the DTL Nationals I also had the opportunity to speak to numerous competitors, families, sponsors and traders. Their input is extremely

valuable and will be taken to the next Executive Committee meeting to discuss and incorporate where possible. I thank all of these people for their time and include some of the ideas below that were suggested.

I am not saying that these will automatically happen, or that any or all will occur however this forum is a starting point to progress members' ideas.

National Grounds:

Scorer, referee and spectator stands to be covered.

Laser level car park areas to increase drainage.

Better configuration of caravan sites including sizing.

Tables provided at each layout for competitor equipment.

More spectator seating.

Traders area to be covered.

National Championships:

DTL Common mark shooting to be 18 metres for National Carnivals.

All events at National Carnivals to be 100 targets all shot at the one layout. (5 minute break between 50's).

DTL competitors shoot in brackets of 5 targets at each stand.

Consideration to reducing grades at National Carnivals. Whether should only be open to AA and A grade shooters only.

Sponsorship for all overall prizes. (as example 'Team Highgun').

Double Barrel event to be continued into the evening on day of competition under lights.

General

Common mark shooting to be brought back to 18 metres for all ACTA events. Handicap to be returned to minimum mark 12 metres.

I reiterate, these are members' ideas and some have merit. If all members could discuss at club, zone and State level, and give your input to your State Delegates it would be greatly appreciated. Consideration needs to also include State legislative requirements relative to the handicap mark, layouts that have been developed on a smaller template and no marks laid forward of 15 metres at some clubs.

As always, there is no way that any National Championship can be conducted without the assistance of volunteers and staff. Thank you to everyone that assisted in any way for your commitment and valuable contribution. The office and ground staff in particular I single out for their professionalism and a thank you is extended from everyone that attended.

The next National Executive meeting will be conducted in June in Wagga Wagga being preceded by sub-committee planning meetings. These planning meetings will determine the course that the ACTA will take in 2015 and beyond.

The Annual General Meeting of the ACTA was conducted during the National DTL Carnival and I thank everyone that attended. A reminder also that all members are invited to attend. At this year's AGM a presentation was made by a member relative to the structure of the Executive Committee and as the President I thank the person that did so. The Executive Committee presently comprises two members from each State and Territory (the ACT presently is represented by the NSW Clay Target Association), making 14 members. There is also the President (Chairperson — currently myself). The presentation requested that the ACTA consider an elected or appointed "Board" to be the overarching organising committee with no more than 5 - 7 members. This Board would consist of professional executives, (as example), persons with legal, accounting, sponsorship, marketing, government or other required skill sets. As such there is merit in this structure as it would give an opportunity for sponsorship, marketing, grants, further progression of the organisation and increased revenue. The present Executive Committee would continue to be involved at the sub-committee level, representing the interests of member clubs. This will be discussed in June at length as it will take constitutional change that involves all members.

Executive Officer's Report

Firstly, congratulations to Laetisha Scanlan on her gold medal win at the World Championships in Arizona. What a fantastic achievement. On behalf of the ACTA I wish to pass on our congratulations. Catherine Skinner also produced another sterling performance in taking out the Bronze at the same event. The healthy rivalry between the girls in terms of results will ensure they drive each other to reach and maintain these lofty levels. I talked to Laetisha and Catherine in Perth at the Nationals and they have agreed to assist us in promoting the ACTA and Clay Target Shooting. We will be looking at developing further our promotional activities at the National Executive Meeting in June. Michael Diamond has again shown the form that has earned him six Olympic appearances and two gold medals by winning the silver medal in Arizona. The signs look very good for our athletes selected in the upcoming Commonwealth Games team.

The National Skeet Championships are being conducted from Sunday the 18th — Saturday 24th May at the National Ground with the added incentive of selection to attend the NSSA World Skeet Championships in the USA later in the year.

The National office is very busy delivering a number of major projects to take the Association forward. The new data base and website is approaching completion with a great deal of time spent with the developers to ensure we have the right Customer Management System. This is a very detailed process and one that takes a great deal of time to develop. The implementation phase will consist of staff from the supplier APT attending the National Office to instruct the staff on the program.

This in itself will take days at a time to introduce this new system. Following on from our induction we will seek to bring State Secretaries in to the National Office to train them in the Management System. We will have a variety of reports to make everyone's life easier, they will include reports by club, zone, age, sex, discipline, membership years, junior, senior etc.

The ACTA has just completed a joint venture with a National organisation, the "Stone the Crows Festival" who took over the National ground for 5 days over Easter. So impressed with our facilities and our co-operation they are looking at securing a five year deal, initially with the potential to make the ACTA National ground their permanent home base.

The organisers will be back with the World Disc Bowls Championships in October. This new joint venture may also lead to enhanced funding opportunities in the future as we become a multi-purpose facility. We are all conscious that these extra activities do not interfere in any way with the core business of the Association, in fact the organisers have offered to have an introduction to clay target shooting as one of their activities in 2015.

The Annual Meeting of the National Executive will be conducted from 19th -21st of June at the National office. If you have issues you wish to bring to the attention of the Executive then these items need to be submitted through the appropriate channels, Club, Zone, State to State delegates.

The eight sub-committees will meet to set the platform for the future direction and development of the Association. This is a extremely important meeting with those on the Executive providing the direction for the future. Each sub-committee is responsible for setting their agenda, then at the meeting detail recommendations to the full Executive. The strategic and business direction is then detailed in the 2015 budget and beyond. Many aspects of the Association require medium term five year plans, with a ten year plan being a guide to where we need to be in the future. All plans need to be evaluated regularly and this then comes back to individual sub-committee Chairs to drive and evaluate performance in line with these agreed recommendations. This is a immensely important, part of the planning and delivery process.



2014 National Trap Championships



The 2014 Trap Nationals commenced with a great deal of rain around and more predicted. There were over 3100 entries for the week of National events, with even more from the Pre-Nationals and the Family Deauville Doubles.

The opening State Shoulder to Shoulder events were conducted under fair skies with the Oueensland Junior team of lackson Willmann, Adam Bylsma & Erin Stewart taking the event with 222/225. All of these Juniors went on to take significant prizes throughout the Championships. 

Day four, and we were again treated to rainy weather conditions. On what is traditionally the busiest day of the National Carnival, 514 shooters competed which included 74 Women, 32 Sub-juniors, 51 Juniors and 75 Veterans, the result was an amazing 170 possibles.

The grades for this event consisted of 298 AA, 111 A, 63 B and 42 C graders.

For the first time the shoot ran into the fourth day with the shoot-off finishing only after the completion of the Mackintosh Teams Events on Sunday afternoon with four shooters managing to shoot over 1000 targets straight. After this marathon shoot-off Darryn Nicholls from Broken Hill, with a score of 1031/1031, became the 2014 National Double Barrel champion. 





It is every member's responsibility to know the rules and regulations of the State when going to shoot at an event. One of the most important components of NSW Firearms requirements is to have to show your licence when attending a shoot, and having your licence on you at all times.

They were in the area on other business, however made an effort to get to the National event to introduce themselves. - Sites are for one van and annex or one tent. Multiple van/tent/ annex sites will be available for unpowered sites only.
- · Speed limit 10kph.
- Dogs are to be kept on a lead and all droppings are to be picked up and disposed of.
- No responsibility is taken by ACTA for personal injury, damage to, or loss of property.
- Children under 16 years of age are to be accompanied by an adult to the amenities and playground, as well as supervised at all times.
- No noise after 10pm.
- · Garbage must be wrapped and deposited in bins provided.
- No cooking or washing of eating utensils to be done in the bathroom.
- The management is at liberty to terminate occupancy without notice or refund.

Dog owners on the National Ground (NSW)

What are my responsibilities when my dog is in a public place at the National Ground (in NSW)?

- · A dog must be under the effective control of a competent person.
- Your dog must, unless it is exempt from this requirement, be under the effective control of a competent person at all times when in public. This means that it must be on a leash and under the control of someone capable of restraining it. A small child, for example,

may not be able to control a large dog. Under these circumstances, an adult capable of restraining the dog, should walk the dog.

- A dog is not considered to be under the effective control of a competent person if the person has more than 4 dogs under his or her control
- If you fail to comply with this requirement, you, or if you are not present, the person in control of your dog, if she is aged 16 or over, may be liable for a maximum penalty of \$1,100 or \$11,000 in the case of a restricted or declared dangerous dog.

Areas from which dogs are prohibited (excludes Police and Corrective Service dogs and genuine assistance dogs)

Dogs are banned from:

- · within 10 metres of a children's play area.
- \cdot within 10 metres of food preparation or consumption areas.
- · recreation areas where dogs are prohibited.
- · public bathing areas where dogs are prohibited.
- · school grounds.
- · childcare centres.
- · shopping centres where dogs are prohibited.

2014 Universal Trench Series gets underway at Melbourne Gun Club

Universal Trench has been the forgotten shooting discipline in Australia. Having been popular in the late 70's, 80's & early 90's it was shot on grounds in Australia that included Mildura. Colac & Cobar and had a good following of shooters. In 1986 Australia produced a World Champion in Domingo Diaz from Mansfield. Sadly in Australia the event was then caught in "no man's land" with the Australian affiliate to FITASC (Field & Game Federation Australia) the controlling body of Universal Trench not having any ranges with the facilities to hold events.

The event is very popular all through Europe & South America with events in Europe having up to 600 competitors entering. It is regarded as a great breeding ground for up and coming ISSF Trap shooters to learn the basic fundamentals.

Universal Trench uses five traps per layout set in a trench 8 metres long. The front of the trench is 15 metres from the front of the shooting positions. Looking from the shooting points the traps are numbered 1-5 from the left, with number 3 aligned with the centre (no 3) station. Existing ISSF Trench layouts can be used with little or no changes required!!

The traps must be spaced 1-1.25 metres apart. Five shooting positions, 1 metre square, are arranged in a straight line, with 1.5 metre spaces between them. The targets are set to different angles and trajectories according to official 'schemes' laid down by the governing body. The maximum height (measured 10 metres from the trap) is 3.5 metres, minimum 1.5 metres. In still air the targets should fly a distance of 60-75 metres. 28 gram loads are permitted in Universal Trench.

Traps 1 and 2 will always be set to throw targets angled to the right, while 4 and 5 throw to the left. The centre trap 3 throws a straight ahead target, plus or minus up to 10 degrees according to the scheme in use. The targets are thrown in random order but programmed so that in a round of 25 each shooter will have shot at all five traps from each shooting position, making it fair to all.

Enter 2014 and a lot has changed!!! Universal Trench (or UT, 5 Trap, Fossa Universale, Poor Man's Trench) is back!! With the support of Field & Game Federation Australia who are allowing us to conduct events on ACTA

layouts the event has been growing steadily and a series been put together to select a team to represent Australia at the World Championships in Lonato, Italy in August, 2014.

A selection criteria was drawn up by a group of dedicated shooters who wanted to give all who attended a fair and equitable chance for qualifying. As we compete in a sport that is relatively simple to determine a winner in that you break more targets you win, the criteria was drawn up exactly the same!!! 3 events of 200Tgts, whoever breaks the most targets out of 600 qualifies for the team to represent Australia at the World Championships with a portion of every shooters entry fee going towards a funding pool to help cover some of the costs for shooters selected. It can't get anymore simple of fairer than that!! The more shooters we have attend the events, the more funding we will have to send shooters.

On Saturday 29th & Sunday 30th of March the first round of the series was held at Melbourne Gun Club with 6 squads of shooters in attendance for the Victorian State Championship. Saturday morning kicked off with dull and overcast conditions making targets difficult to see early morning. A number of good scores came in over the first 50 tgts with 25's being recorded by Todd Malone, Nathan Cassells, Mark Boyce, Alistair Scott, Brett Dunstan & Steve Trembath. At the lunch break on Day 1 we had Steve Haberman leading the way with a great 48/50.

After the quick break for lunch it was back to the tracks and more 25's to come in the last 50 of day 1 from Craig Henwood, Danny DiPietro, Jeff Tonna, Jack Collicoat & Charlton Vella. The leaders after 100 tgts were Jeff Tonna, Jack Collicoat & Craig Henwood all on 95/100 with Todd Malone & Steve Haberman on 94 and Danny DiPietro & Mark Boyce on 93 it was still anyone's game with 100 tgts to go.

Day 2 dawned with a bit more sun and turned into another perfect day. Scores generally improved with everyone starting to get the taste for it. Jeff Tonna and Craig Henwood continued their over -night form both recording 49/50 in the first 2 rounds to set the pace. A total of 7 clean rounds were recorded for the day by Jeff Tonna, Craig Henwood, James Willett, Nathan Cassells, Mitch Iles, Andrew Brady & Steve Haberman.

All prizes for the events were sponsored by Perazzi Australia and after the 200 Tgts had all been added up we had an overall winner in Craig Henwood on a score of 191/200. Craig was fortunate enough to win a Sabbatti 22-250 rifle valued at \$950! The sections prizes also had ammunition prizes.

The ladies prize was a tight tussle until the last

few rounds where Kelly Coogan steam rolled home for a 4tgt victory from Laura Bullmore with a great score of 170/200. Juniors was won by a shooter who's name we will be hearing a lot more of in James Willett who like Kelly also had a great day 2 top scoring for the day in Open to come home with an excellent 188/200 and finishing 3rd overall!! Psychological Skills for Shooting

PFRSONALITY DISORDERS

In the last article I looked at the personality theories with specific reference to personality traits and I finished with the sentence that in this article I would examine personality disorders and how they differ from mental disorders.

Psychologists and psychiatrists use either one of two classification systems to deter-

mine if a mental disorder or personality disorder exists. The most well known classification system is DSM-5. This is the current revision of the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders. The DSM-5 was released in 2013 and is published by the American Psychiatric Association. The other system is the International Classification of Diseases- Tenth Edition: ICD-10, which is published by the World Health Organisation.

To compare and contrast mental disorders and personality disorders it is necessary to look at the definitions of each. DSM-5 defines a mental disorder as:

A syndrome characterised by clinically significant disturbance in an individual's cognition (thinking), emotional regulation, or behaviour that reflects a dysfunction in the psychological, biological or developmental processes underlying mental functioning. Mental disorders are usually associated with significant distress or disability in social, occupational, or other important activities. An acceptable or culturally approved response to a common stressor or loss, such as the death of a loved one, is not a mental disorder. Socially deviant behaviour (e.g. political, religious or sexual) and conflicts that are primarily between the individual and society are not mental disorders unless the deviance or conflict results from a dysfunction in the individual, as described above.

Mental disorders come in many forms: but according the to the Mental Health First Aid Manual it is a 'diagnosable illness that affects a person's thinking, emotional state and behaviour, and disrupts the person's ability to work, or carry out other daily activities and engage in satisfying personal relationships'. Basically, this is what the DSM-5 definition is, but it is in much easier to understand language.

Readers will recognise mental disorders such as anxiety or depression, bipolar disorder, psychotic disorders such as schizophrenia, eating disorders such as anorexia or bulimia, or substance abuse disorders. The impact of mental disorders can be mild, moderate and severe and it is the burden of the disease that is important as to the impact it will have on our lives, thinking and relationships. For example, we all feel down sometimes, but this does not necessarily mean we are depressed. In some cases such as during grief, being depressed is a normal response.

A personality disorder is defined in DSM-5 as:

An enduring pattern of inner experience and behaviour that deviates markedly from the expectations of the individual's culture, is pervasive and inflexible, has an onset in adolescence or early adulthood, is stable over time, and leads to distress and impairment.

According to DSM-5 personality disorders can be grouped into three clusters. Cluster A includes paranoid, schizoid, and schizotypal: individuals with these disorders often appear odd or eccentric. Cluster B includes antisocial, borderline, histrionic, and narcissistic personality disorders. These individuals often appear erratic, dramatic or emotional. The final Cluster C includes avoidant, dependent and obsessive-compulsive personality disorders. Individuals with these personality disorders

often appear anxious and fearful. It is difficult with the limited space to fully examine each of the personality disorders, so I will focus on Narcissistic Personality Disorder as an example as there has been considerable discussion in newspapers and magazines regarding the narcissistic nature of individuals to look after themselves at the expense of others. Gen Y and Gen X can often be labelled as having narcissistic personalities.

The diagnostic criteria for Narcissistic Personality Disorder is a pervasive pattern of grandiosity (in fantasy or behaviour), need for admiration, and lack of empathy. It needs to start in early adulthood and is present in a variety of contexts. Five of the following criteria must be present:

- Has a grandiose sense of importance (often exaggerates achievements and talents and expects to recognised as superior without achieving)
- Is preoccupied with fantasies of unlimited success, power, brilliance, etc.
- Believes that he/she is 'special' and only can be understood or should associate with other special or high-status people.
- · Requires excessive admiration.
- · Has a sense of entitlement.
- Is interpersonally exploitative (will use others to achieve his/her own ends).
- Lacks empathy: is unwilling to recognise or identify with feelings and needs of others.
- · Is often envious of others or believes others are envious of him/her.
- Shows arrogant, haughty behaviours or attitudes.

It is unusual for people to seek therapy for Nacissistic Personality Disorder. This is partly due to the Nacissistic Personality Disorder sufferers not believing they have a problem. Most, if not all, are unable to see the destructive damage they are causing to themselves and to others and usually only seek treatment at the insistence of relatives and friends. Anger, rage, impulsivity and impatience can be worked on with skill training. Anxiety disorders are also prevalent but the most common would be depression.

Research shows group therapy does hold value for patients because it lets them explore boundaries, develop trust, increase self-awareness, and accept feedback. Relationship therapy stresses the importance of learning and applying four basic interpersonal skills: ". . . effective expression, empathy, discussion and problem solving/conflict resolution."

Mental disorders are often treated with cognitive-behaviour therapy, medication and or psycho-education. Changing the way a person thinks can often make them change the way they behave: this is the basic tenet of cognitive behavioral therapy, that is, it is not the things in life that affect us but how we think of these things.

What is apparent is that mental disorders are treatable with medication and cognitive behaviour therapy: personality disorders on the other hand, are more difficult to treat because there is a resistance on the part of the individual with a personality disorder to accept a problem exists. Acceptance of the problem, effective cognitive behavioural therapy and social skills training can lead to limiting the burden of the disorder for the individual, and his/her family and friends.

Floyd Johnson from Normanton took out first in B grade with a well shot 96/100. He was followed closely by Cloncurry shooter


from McKinlay Colin Muller with 94/100. This was enough to send Colin from B to A grade for the first time.




SB, 2nd A Grade 50T BT

Victorians Laetisha Scanlan (Berwick, Vic) and Catherine Skinner (Mansfield, Vic) have again made history after winning gold and bronze in the women's trap in an Olympic class field at the 2014 World Cup in Tucson, USA.

This follows on from the 2013 World Cup in Al Ain, UAE, where they became the first Australian women to win the gold and silver medals in the same event.

Sparrow became involved in clay target shooting in the mid 70's with the Esperance Bay Gun Club and then became a big part of the Salmon Gums Gun Club. He loved his shooting and valued the camaraderie and friendship he made over the years from many of the clubs. He took great delight in encouraging others and was instrumental in bringing new shooters to the sport.

In 1987 Sparrow took out the C Grade High Gun Overall in the Nationals held in Perth, it was a good year for him. He continued winning events along the way to be still competing as an A Grade shooter in 2013. He was a highly valued member of Salmon Gums holding a number of positions over the years and contributing to such a great little Gun Club. In May the "Mallee Ton" was held at the Salmon Gums Gun Club a 100 target shoot, a shoot that Sparrow had dreamed up the previous year. This would be the last shoot that Sparrow completed in. He shot well. Sparrow and Sue were totally unaware of the behind the scenes work that had transpired to make the day such a memorable one. A combination of the surrounding clubs, being Esperance, Kalgoorlie, Leonora, Hopetoun and Salmon Gums came to Salmon Gums that day, exceeding all expectations of numbers, a total of 40 shooters to show wonderful support to Sparrow. The generosity that was shown was overwhelming and Sparrow was greatly humbled and touched. It was a great day and such a privilege to see such a wonderful spirit of love and compassion shown towards a good man.

After being diagnosed with cancer in 2011, Sparrow put up a courageous fight for 2 years before contracting pneumonia and meeting his Lord in July 2013.

From The Past:

Trap shooting has a long history in Australia, the Metropolitan Gun club in Sydney was conducting events as early as 1850 and it is thought that the sport was flourishing even earlier in Melbourne. Information prior to 1900 is extremely difficult to find, however, with the formation of the Gun Clubs Association in 1900 and then the ACPTSA in 1936 more information is available.

The following is a list of the most successful trap shooters from 1900 to 2010 listed in the decades of their best performances. The list includes both live target and clay target champions.

For The Record:

Arthur Turner has set a remarkable new record, he has now won state titles in each of the past 5 decades. His first state title was the NSW Points Score Championship in 1978 and his last title was the Victor-

ian Double Rise Championship in 2013.

In between he has amassed 35 state titles and became the most successful NSW shooter ever.



Sox Pilipasidis

Sox Pilipasidis shot his way into the record books at the 2014 National championships by becoming the first 25 metre shooter to break 100 targets in the National handicap. This record has been a long time coming.

Don Scowcroft was the first back marker to

break 50 targets at the Nationals way back in 1967.

Bruce Powell became only the fourth shooter to win all three major 15 metre events at the Nationals when he won the 2014 National Points Score Championship at Wagga Wagga. He joins Warren Charlton, Newton Thomas and Jim Ellis as the only shooters to achieve this feat.

Did You Know:

Skeet shooting commenced in Australia in the early 1930's and has been conducted since the very beginning of the ACTA. For the first 30 years it was shot "English" style with only 7 stations and a round comprising 20 targets. Single targets were shot from all stations and doubles from stations 2, 4 and 6. There were also shortened versions that reduced the number of targets shot per round.

In the early 1960's American skeet was adopted by the ACTA and the 8 station 25 target format was introduced.

State and National Skeet championships have been held every year since 1936 except the war years. Prior to 1970, the National Skeet Championship was called the Commonwealth Skeet Championship and was conducted as a stand alone event. From 1970 to 1982 the National Skeet championship was held in conjunction with the National Trap Championships and in 1983 the first National Skeet Championships were held.

When the National Skeet Championships were established a National Skeet High Gun was introduced and since that time Skeet Doubles, Skeet handicap and 20 Gauge Skeet have all been added to the championships shot at the Skeet Nationals.

There has also been an Australian team selected at the National Skeet Championships every year since 1983. There is a lot of information available from 1960 onwards but very little is available for the first 30 years of skeet shooting in Australia.

In My Opinion: Our national cham-

pionships should be 100 target events. so that all competitors are entertained in both the morning and afternoons of each day. I also believe that we should develop our National Trap Championships into a trade show as well as a shoot. This idea was applied in the USA and they dramatically increased their attendance.
