Executive Officer's Report

The National 5 Stand Sporting Championships are being conducted on the 30th/31st August at the National Ground. This year will see the selection of the National team to compete in the World Sporting Championships in South Africa in 2015. At this stage we have not been advised of the details however we will pass them on as soon as they are available. The Wagga GC is hosting the event for the ACTA with former National Coach David Coleman heading up the Organising Committee. David has assured me a very exciting program is in store for the event.

There have been numerous developments in all ACTA Committee portfolios, some have been detailed in the ACTA NEWS on the back page of the magazine.

We are on track to achieve the target of 15,000 members by 2015 with the number of members for 2014 already surpassing 2013. The new initiatives proposed by the Promotions Committee will hopefully further drive the membership push in 2015. Many clubs have conducted school events, field days and promotional days, come and try days as well as our involvement in conjunction with the Marconi Clay Target Club at the Shot Show. If you have a special event/promotion your club is conducting we would like to know about it. This will assist other clubs when planning events as well as highlighting in our magazine and online the positives surrounding the sport.

The ISSF National Championships will be conducted at the Newcastle Lake Macquarie Club from the 19th to the 24th January. Following on from the Commonwealth Games this year, the new year will bring more opportunities for shooters to enhance their reputations and vie for Australian selection for World Cup, World Championship and Invitational events in 2015.

The Australian Commonwealth Championships have received a welcome revamp commencing in 2015 with six events of 50 targets with substantial prize-money. The event will be \$100.00 to enter, have no grades or sections, however will pay 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th \oslash 5th in each event with sashes, medals and prizemoney for each event.

The development of the National Ground will continue with the 2018 World DTL looming large in the background. We will be addressing the drainage, shade covers for seating including scorers' stands as well as maintenance of the amenities blocks and the installation of ball traps on the ground. The ball traps are a joint decision of the Coaching Committee and the Grounds Committee to allow practice for ISSF as well as conducting ball trap competitions. The Association is also in the process of registering with the Australian Sports Foundation in the Sports Incentive Program which will go towards raising money to develop a new clubhouse/office/traders complex on the ground.

The Executive have further developed the Business Plan incorporating all of these decisions to cater for the future expansion and development of the Association.

The minutes of the meeting are now available on the ACTA website.

From the calls and enquiries received in the lead up to the State Trap Carnival we knew the shoot would be well attended but it was still a surprise to see so many shooters camped out at the Gemfields Gun Club. The first thing that strikes you is how orderly the grounds are with such ample space for trade sites and campers. For a club with only a relatively small membership visitors could be easily deceived into thinking Gemfields had a thousand members, the grounds were presented so beautifully with new layouts and excellent facilities, a real credit to the club and much appreciated by the shooters.

Without the Labor Day public holiday falling in May, the carnival began for the first time on Friday and extended over the weekend. This didn't seem to deter the many competitors who travelled from all over the country and more than 280 shooters nominated to contest the State championship events.

In usual sunny style the carnival opened with the 50T State Double Barrel Championship, sponsored once again by the Gold Coast Clay Target Club. 276 shooters contested the event and 64 possibles were shot, confirming the quality of the traps and targets. After an epic shoot off the Queensland silver badge, sash, trophy and cash prize went to Mitchell Iles from Victoria with a well earned 387/387. Mitch was also the recipient of the Ossie & Doug Smith silver medal, the last time this medal will be presented. Congratulations on a great effort Mitchell! Keeping the shoot off alive was Chinchilla shooter Dan Collins who finished with 386/387 to take 1st in AA, followed by Kevin Thompson 2nd in AA on 251/252 and Steve Haberman 3rd 241/242. Antony Ballarino from Port Denison was 1st in A grade with 143/143, Gold Coast's Garry

Gordon 2nd with 142/143 and 3rd went to Merv Phillips from Roma with 126/127. The ladies collected in B and C grade with Tori Powell from Springsure 1st in B with 71/71 and Clermont's Naomi Holmes 1st in C with a perfect 50/50. Lil Brandt won the Ladies sash shooting 76/76, top junior was Antony Ballarino with 184/185 while Adam Bylsma won the junior trophy 138/139 and Mitchell Iles won the Qld Police CTC sponsored prize as highest scoring junior for the event. Keith Simpson from Toowoomba took home the DB Veterans sash with 90/90.

The 25 Pair State Double Rise Championship was contested in the afternoon and was generously sponsored by QCTA Central Zone. 272 shooters competed with no possibles being recorded for Geoff Fett took the Veteran's sash as well as 2nd in A grade on 71/80 while Jeff Nash won the Veteran's trophy 70/80.

Saturday morning was scheduled for the Zone shoulder-to-shoulder teams' events and participants rolled up bright and early to represent their respective Zones. The Western Zone proved too strong in the open section with winning team members Clayton Cusack, lan Andrews, Jeremy Teece, Stephanie Mills, David Robb and Mike Stewart coming in only one target down on 124/125 for first place. Competition was close however with all minor places having to be decided on count back, all teams shooting 123/125. South East Zone finished 2nd, Central Zone 3rd and Northern Zone in 4th place. The successful Central Zone team of Zarah Powell, Lil Brandt

and Leaonie Hinsbey took first place in the Ladies section with a combined score of 71/75. Northern Zone ladies came in 2nd. Western Zone 3rd and South East Zone in 4th place. The Junior section was won by the South East Zone with team members Adam Bylsma, Jackson Willmann and David Musumeci winning with 72/75. The Central Zone juniors were 2nd and Western Zone 3rd. Great shooting by the Northern Zone Veterans Dave Guy, Noel Maltby and Bob Pack who took their team to victory with an impressive 74/75, with South East Zone in 2nd place, Western Zone 3rd and Central Zone 4th. It was great to see the teams events shared between all four Zones this year and thank you to the Zones for submitting teams for this event.



Victorian Coalition Government supports sporting shooters

Shooting clubs from around Victoria can upgrade their facilities thanks to a million dollar fund created by the Victorian Coalition Government

Speaking in Bendigo, Deputy Premier Peter Ryan and Minister for Sport and Recreation Damian Drum said the Shooting Sports Facilities Program would give shooting clubs the opportunity to apply for funding to upgrade their facilities, increasing participation and building the sport.

"Outdoor sports such as shooting are a vital part of the social fabric and these grants will encourage more people to get more active in an environment that promotes safe and responsible firearms ownership," Mr Ryan said.

"This fund will help clubs secure tenure at sites and host high level events across the different shooting disciplines, attracting shooters from across Victoria and beyond. This will bring social and economic benefits to the relevant communities.

"Minor projects will be able to receive up to \$100,000 from the fund, with the government offering \$2 for every \$1 put in by the club itself or another contributor, for example a local council, either by contributing direct funding or as in-kind support."

Mr Drum said the Shooting Sports Facilities Program would assist shooting clubs and associations to increase participation and help participants from grass roots to the elite level.

"The Coalition Government continues to work with local councils, clubs and communities to create a connected, active, healthy and safe Victoria through sport," Mr Drum said.

Victorians have a proud history of producing Commonwealth and Olympic Games medallists in shooting sports.

More than 20,000 Victorians participate in competitive shooting events each year.

"We're helping sports including shooting to develop better facilities, host big events and give more people the opportunity to be participants, coaches, and volunteers," Mr Drum said.

A report recently released by the Coalition Government showed expenditure by Victorian shooters and hunters has now grown to \$439 million a year, much of it in regional Victoria.

Expenditure on range improvements is vital so that shooters can practise and refine their gun handling skills and new shooters can be introduced to the sport in a safe, controlled manner.

An advisory committee, chaired by Mr David Hawker AO, will be established to assess project applications and provide specialist advice on the sport's specific and strategic needs. Details of the Program will be finalised following the establishment of the advisory committee.

Psychological Skills for Shooting

Michael Kruger-Davis



PRACTISE VERSUS COMPETITION

Most of us shoot well in practise. We can shoot long breaks, we smoke the targets and the whole process of shooting feels effortless. We often feel like we are in the zone.

Why then do we choke when we get into a competition? Missing targets that you have shot thousands of times before is due to self-

doubt. When self-doubt sets in, you tighten or freeze up, this means that your muscles are not able to move as fluidly as they should, and as a result you miss the target.

The reasons why a shooter fails in competitions could be due to following:

- You take things cautiously due to a subconscious fear of failure. Sometimes if you have shot well in the first 25, you subconsciously try to protect the score that you think you have. As a result you become too careful and you miss. You cannot win unless you are prepared to lose.
- Fear of disappointing a parent or coach and as a result you play it safe. Playing it safe means that you are unable to deal with anything that is out of the ordinary.
- You want to win too badly and you can't stand losing. Placing too
 much importance on winning means that you are product or outcome
 focused rather than process focused. This means that you are moving
 your thinking into the future: when you do this, your brain gives
 subconscious messages that turn into worries and fears. This leads to
 self-doubt and again your muscles tense up and you miss.
- You doubt your abilities, and distrust your skills when it is essential to blindly rely on your abilities.
- · Self-doubt leads to losing your confidence. This too leads to self-doubt.
- You expect to perform perfectly and you become frustrated when you cannot.
- Worry too much about your competitors. You feel intimidated by the level of competition
- You become too analytical about your performance. This will lead to making judgements about your ability and /or your performance the next time you compete.

Whilst these are some of the reasons why we fail, our brain then uses ego defence mechanisms such as intellectualising, or rationalising to limit the anxiety, embarrassment or shame.

- 1. We may blame our faulty technique. There may have been a range of reasons why we missed that may have nothing to do without technique. Blaming your technique and making hasty adjustments will only lead to you missing more targets.
- 2. We often blame the weather, the light, the clouds, the wind, the targets.
- 3. We often blame our equipment. The gun, the stock, our ammunition or the targets. Some shooters are search for the perfect gun: the one doesn't miss. If the gun fits then it should hit the target if the shooters technical skills are adequate. We miss because of self-doubt or lack of mental toughness. These things are inside us: in our head, they are a part of our thinking.
- 4. We often blamesothers for our inability. We blame our parents, coaches, partners, etc for putting us under too much pressure.

5. We blame others. The referee, other shooters, someone in the background.

From the above two lists there are a number of things that get in our way, but it ourselves and more specifically our brain that sabotages our ability to move from perfect in practice to dismal in the competition. We need to understand and accept that we get in our own way.

What can we do to take what we do in practise to the competition?

- Trust your physical skills. Make sure you are competent in what you are doing.
- Trust your ability and let go of the value judgements and worries. Let the competition happen. Have confidence in your ability.
- Stay focused in the here and now. Let go of how well you are performing and avoid over analysing targets you have missed. Focus on one shot at a time. Ignore past mistakes and avoid worrying about the future.
- Keep your performance simple. Focus on the process. Stay composed and relaxed.
- Commit to winning and don't worry about what it looks like. Avoid chasing the perfect performance.

Commitment, confidence, composure, competency and competitiveness are all feature of mental toughness. If you are able to cultivate these mental skills then you will be able to move effortlessly from high achieving practise to high achieving competitions.



Anyone who has run a shoot, particularly a carnival, will know how much hard work and effort it requires but the satisfaction of running a successful shoot, where everyone enjoys themselves is fortunately sufficient enough reward to ensure that these carnivals continue to happen in all states. The success of the CCTC Two Day Carnival is attributed to the volunteer help of so many people both prior to and during the event. Almost all shooters, including every junior, without exception offered their help at some point during the weekend ranging from filling traps, helping in the office, cooking, washing up and extra refereeing rounds where required - what a fabulous sport we are so lucky to be involved in.

The CCTC 2014 Carnival far exceeded expectations with capacity attendance for 300 targets and perfect conditions resulting in such high scores that two people shot their first ever 200 straight, one person set the new 2014 12g long run record at 323 and 3 people tied for High Gun on 296/300.

Friday saw a few competitors arrive to gain advantage by having a few practice rounds before start of the competition the following morning. The brave campers, Laurie & Marie, set up their camp site despite the warnings of an overnight frost.

By close of business Friday, all the traps had been checked, cleaned and were filled, tables and benches put in place on the layouts, trophies set up and the previous years' winners shown on the notice board. Just enough time for a good night's sleep before the serious business of having fun starts.

Saturday morning dawned to a crisp 7 or 8 degrees but within a couple of hours the temperatures were heading to the mid 20's with clear blue skies and perfect shooting conditions.

The music was playing - "Another One Bites the Dust" of course. Laurie and Marie Rodden were witnessed dancing outside their tent but we were not quick enough to get them on video. A queue soon formed

at the nominations window and it was great to see friends, new and old, and those people who had travelled a long way to shoot the event and 3 shooters at their first ever skeet competition. Nominations were submitted for individual events, inter club teams and the hotly contested 2-person team.

The first three squads were on the layouts and shooting by 9.15am along with volunteer referees so we were off to a good start. The first event was a 50 target cash divide and the 50's soon started to roll in with Shane Bennett providing the first use of the red pen on the score board.

Event 2 is the 100 Target Annual CCTC Skeet Champion shot in two visits of 50 targets. A complaint was received in the office that a small white cloud had been sighted on the horizon but it turned out to be a false alarm and was simply a smudge on the person's sunglasses! More red pen was soon required and a thrilled Jaco Pieterse announced his first 100 straight and backed it up with the second 50 to make it 150 straight! Rick Nutt and Adam Corless both shot their first 25s straight too. The result was 3 x 100 straights from Harry Bader, Thomas Rhue and Jaco Pieterse. A shoot-off followed and after 5 stations of doubles, Harry emerged the Overall Winner with Thomas Rhue taking AA 1st and Jaco taking A 1st.

At the end of day one, the remains of an amazing 8000 targets littered the layouts and only Jaco Pieterse could claim no whole targets belonging to him as he was the leader on 150/150 but with a few people on his tail at 149/150 he had to keep a careful eye over his shoulder!

Some quick stats at the end of day showed that 54 x 25 straights had been shot out of a total 276 rounds that means that 1 in 5 rounds shot was a possible! Testament indeed to the targets and conditions. There was a total of 46 shooters in attendance including 6 ladies and 4 juniors great to see.

Special thanks for Peter Lynch and Barry McDonald for being "Chefs of The Day" on Saturday and providing a fabulous lunch followed by fresh strawberries and cream! Thank you also to Claire Smith for the very welcome supply of mouth-watering cakes.

Sunday morning and more perfect Qld weather saw a handful of extra shooters arrive to replace the 3 or 4 that could only shoot on the Saturday. A couple of squads were re-organised and we were off to a prompt start with first shots being fired at 8.30am for another 50 target

A fabulous and very popular lunch was cooked by Mathew Rhue with hot pork and gravy rolls that is the fastest I have ever seen a lunch disappear and I think he has earned himself a job for next year too!

Event 4 and the strategy starts to come into play with the much loved super handicap. Although this is technically a standard 12g handicap event, shooters have the option of shooting with a smaller gauge to gain additional 'lives'. However, only the 'shot' score counts towards High Gun places. One person was brave enough to nominate to shoot the 410g but we saw a larger number of shooters than usual shoot the 28g – which interestingly saw them all through to the shoot offs.

Great shooting conditions and perfect targets saw over half the field of shooters reach the first round of shoot-off. The standard of shooting was so high that we saw 8 rounds of shoot-offs in total. With two shooters about to reach their 200 straight and one person getting close to the 2014 record we were rapidly running out of day light hours and a very stressed shoot marshal (Lorraine) was cracking the whip and furiously re-organising squads and ushering non shoot-off shooters to the vacant layouts to start their 50 target doubles.

Special mentions go to Nick Aird who shot the whole event with 28g to finish on 248/250. Marie Carmody who shot almost 4 full rounds of shoot-off finishing on a score of 134/143. Jackie Richards in her first ever handicap shoot off, shooting 155/166.

With the handicap shoot off continuing between Harry Bader (AA) shooting 20g, Nick Aird (AA) shooting 28g, Thomas Rhue (AA), Craig O'Neill (AA), Theo Pieterse (B) all shooting 20g and light now starting to fade the doubles commenced with Shane Bennett providing the only red on the board with a perfect 50/50 to take out the overall prize. The spectators continued to be entertained by the long shoot off, helped by Claire Smith handing out lots of lollies and the children were watching a film in the club house

The handicap shoot off was still taking place at the time the last squads were about to start their doubles with very little daylight left (seeing the target emerge from the low house was now all but impossible without wearing night vision goggles). As the Australian 2014 long break had been broken, the final 4 AA grade shooters decided to finalise the event in conjunction with the doubles event with the final results as follows

Event 4 50 target handicap: 1st 249/250 Thomas Rhue, 2nd 248/250 Craig O'Neill, 3rd 248/250 Harry Bader, 4th 248/250 Nick Aird, 5th 167/175 Theo Pieterse.

How the last squads of doubles managed to shoot such good scores in that light amazes me but the final doubles result was as follows:

Event 5 50 target doubles: Overall 50/50 Shane Bennett, AA 1st equal 49/50 Lorraine Hughes, Sam Smith, Sarah Bennett & Craig O'Neill. A 1st 45/50 Vaughan McInnis, A 2nd 41/50 Barry McDonald. B 1st 48/50 Marie Carmody, B 2nd equal 43/50 Bob Robinson, Pat Plumridge. C 1st 45/50 Ray Mahoney, C 2nd 42/50 Adam Corless.

It was fabulous to see such huge scores being shot but the downside was the loss of daylight meaning that doubles grade placings could not be shot off and nor could the overall high gun place which was agreed to be

shared between Craig O'Niell, Harry Bader and Lorraine Hughes. It was no surprise to see Jaco Pieterse win A grade High Gun and regrade to AA. A great weekend for the Pieterses' with Theo winning B grade High Gun. Jackie Richards, a new and upcoming lady shooter was thrilled to win her first carnival High Gun with C grade on 265/300 (definitely one to watch!)

Worthy ladies winner was Sarah Bennett winning the Coffee Club sponsored prize which would probably be very welcome on their long drive home. Kel Madsen made it a back to back veterans win and Thomas Rhue won the junior High Gun on a very credible 294/300. Other notable mentions were Thomas Rhue's long run of 225 (light stopped play), Nigel Hughes with a 219 long run both of which now add to their Grand Slam.

The overall and graded High Gun prizes all received a unique brazier/ hot box look out for some of those proudly burning at next year's nationals.

Overall High Guns: Overall equal 296/300 Lorraine Hughes, Craig O'Neil, Harry Bader, A 293/300 Jaco Pieterse, B 280/300 Theo Pieterse, C 265/300 Jackie Richards, Ladies 285/300 Sarah Bennett, Veteran 278/300 Kel Madsen, Junior 294/300 Thomas Rhue.

The two person team was a hotly contested event with Nigel Hughes and Shane Bennett determined to make it their 4th win in a row. However, an equally determined Craig O'Neill and Lorraine Hughes were the winners on 592/600.

The 3 person club team was very strategically played with a 3 person C grade team being played by Brisbane Gun club as handicap allowances are added to the team scores to encourage the inclusive of lower grades in the teams. The Frank Cooper trophy left Caboolture Clay Target Club for the first time with worthy Brisbane Gun Club winners of Jackie Richards, Adam Corless and Rick Nutt.

The prize giving was completed with the much loved 'walk up table' sponsored by both Barry McDonald and Peter Lynch where all shooters present at prize giving were invited to the prize table to choose their multiple prizes in the order in which they shot however there was some concern when Harry Bader chose an axe! With the prize-giving now complete, shooters said their good-byes and stumbled through the dark Queensland sky to find their cars and head home feeling tired but happy and looking forward to returning next year.

So "what makes a good skeet competition?"

Well surely it is a combination of things: perfect targets of course, perfect conditions help, organisation, preparation and generous sponsors are also important and if you have all of these then you would hope that everyone shoots well and that indeed seems to be the case at this carnival.

Out of a massive 17,000 targets shot over the two days a staggering 136 perfect rounds (excluding doubles) were shot and this was across all grades, ages and sexes and if it wasn't for the failing light there could well of been even more! So let's say "Roll on 2015" and let's set if we can break some more records!



In my last column I elaborated upon a number of the things that had occurred at this year's Trap Nationals. However one of the issues I did not address was the large number of records that were broken this year and the fact that this situation largely flew under the radar. This was almost certainly because the one "Big Record" that was on everyone's mind remained intact and this tended to overshadow and camouflage the fact that there were probably more records broken this year than at any previous Nationals. Another contributing factor was that most of the record breaking was done after the "Big One" got away and by this time most people had taken their eye off the ball.

A slow start

The week started out fairly quietly. The Pre-Nationals did not provide any spectacular results and day one with the Opening Ceremony and the State Team Shoots ran smoothly and well but again did not provide anything earth shattering. Day two and the Grand Australian Handicap ran similarly. Twelve possibles provided an interesting shoot-off that saw my old mate Sox Pilipasidis put in a tremendous effort to shoot 110 targets from 25 metres before eventually succumbing to the inevitable and taking the last spot on the dais. Edward Hutchins ended up winning with 115 from 16 metres and I'm sure he was happy that he did not have to break Jason Jolly's 20 year old record of 170.

Warming up

Day three and the Champion of Champions was another very eniovable day that did not require us to erase any entries in the record books. Nine possibles saw Wayde Hawkins eventually win when Glenn Kable let one land. However things were starting to warm up because Wayde's winning score of 250 would have been a new

record if Darryn Nicholls had not been forced to shoot 325 by James Willett the previous year. Going into day four, the record for the National Double Rise was somewhat complicated by recent changes in the number of qualifying targets.

Changing times

Prior to 2007 this event had been qualified over 50 targets for more than forty years. Although nine separate people had managed to break all 50 during that time, no two people had ever done it in the same year and so only one of those people had ever been forced to shoot off, but that's another story for another day. Starting in 2008 the event changed to 100 targets. During that first year of the expanded format, in absolutely atrocious conditions, the great Stephen James Atkins proved that if push came to shove he could actually walk on water. On that day he laid down a benchmark score of 99 and won the event outright by four whole targets. Which is another record within itself! This year Brian Doyle, Darryn Nicholls and Clayton Cusack all tried hard to steal "The Rat's" thunder, but eventually could only equal him.

Reverting Back

And here's an interesting afterthought. Last year the Trap Nationals were held in Perth. This is due to an agreement to have an "away year" every five years which rotates between Roma and Perth. Personal perspective: I think it's a great idea! However, due to the limitations imposed by the availability of only ten traps at Whiteman Park, the National Double Rise reverted back to a 50 target event, just for that one year. This in itself provided a rare opportunity for some old records to be revisited and they certainly were. Initially the old "no multiple 50s" record was shattered when no less than four people recorded perfect scores. This in turn provided a springboard to attack the old "most targets shot at by the winner" mark under that format, which was held by Gavin Searle from New Zealand who broke 83 of the 90 targets that Tommy Turner forced him to shoot back in 2004. This record is now owned by Darryn Nicholls who broke all bar one of the 110 targets that Colin Waghorn forced him to shoot at.

Day 5 - The big question

Three years ago Tony "A" had to shoot 900 to win the National Double Barrel. Two years ago Glen Hayden had to add another 95 to that score before he gained the title. Last year the "four minute mile" of Trapshooting was finally broken when four separate shooters passed the magic1000 mark. Surprisingly, after only another thirty odd targets, they all collapsed like a house of cards and within the space of only four targets, three of them missed leaving Darryn Nicholls all alone on 1038. Leading up to this year's Carnival the question everyone pondered was: Could it be done again? Was 1000 repeatable?

Put up or shut up

For a number of reasons, including a change in the target supplier, many people thought that it probably wasn't. I must admit that I had my doubts and would have bet against it. Anyway this obviously created tremendous interest and speculation leading up to the event. And enormous pressure on the last four shooters who walked back out onto the shoot-off field on 975 at 9.30pm on Saturday night. As the results show, all four made the grade, exceeding 1000 broken targets before we reached the 10pm curfew and had to turn the lights out and go home. I'm sure that Tommy Turner was devastated to miss the very last (1025th) target that night, but hopefully his admission into the "magic thousand club" along with some very nice "fringe benefits" that came with it this year, helped ease the pain.

House of cards revisited

When the shoot-off resumed the following day, with Darryn Nicholls' record score of 1038 from last year only half a box of shells away, his chances of retaining that record looked precarious at best. I'm sure no-one was prepared for the domino effect that played out over the next few minutes. When Matty Stokes failed to put a pellet on his third one it hushed the crowd, but when Steve Atkins cut loose with an unsuccessful second another three targets later, the crowd looked like a UFO had just landed. However, although the much anticipated fourth consecutive breaking of the record score had withered on the vine, Darryn Nicholls was all smiles. He had not only won our premier event two years running, but in the process had eclipsed Steve Atkins' previous record of 1776 consecutive hits in this event and bumped it up to 2069 and counting, because unless he misses his first target next year he will continue adding to that record.

Records tumble

However, as I said earlier, this was actually the turning point where record breaking started in earnest. The next day Mark Crimmins' record National Single Barrel score of 164 in Roma in 2009 fell to Darryn Nicholls when he ran out of opposition at 216. Just a small increase of two whole boxes plus change! And the following day it was Darryn's turn to "run out of ability" and have to pull a second on his 241st target in the Points Score, thus allowing Bruce Powell to win the event with 723 points, which eclipsed John Dureya's previous best effort of 624 points from two years ago.

National High Gun Record

For many years the National High Gun Record was held by Billy Iles on seven points down (468/475), which he set in Wagga in 1984. Glenn Castellaro gave it a fair old crack in 2000 but was only able to equal it with another 468. Johnnie Sleightholme had a red hot go in 2012 and although he was also only able to equal seven points down, it was a very commendable effort because it included an extra 25 pair of Double Rise and thus a final tally of 518/525. Enter Darryn Nicholls! In 2011 he gave a hint of things to come when he won the relatively new "100 target" format with a very respectable nine points down (716/725) thereby equaling Neil McWhirter's great effort in 2005.

So much for Seven

However when Perth's aforementioned 10 trap layouts restricted us to the traditional 50 target format last year, Darryn saw this as a golden opportunity, which he seized with both hands and proceeded to decimate the old record with a breathtaking TWO points down for a total of 473/475. And the really scary part is that the next best score was five points down, more than twice that deficit! This year, after winning the NZ National Trap High Gun as a warm-up, he took up where he left off and blitzed the rest of the field over the expanded format with THREE points down for a total of 722/725. Next best was seven points down, again more than twice the deficit.

Is it a bird ... or a plane?

No, it's just Darryn Nicholls without a red cape! Prior to this year, only three people have ever won both the National Double Barrel

and the National Single Barrel in the same year. And they were three of the greatest Trapshooters this country has ever produced (see below). Now you can add Darryn Nicholls to that list. And for basically the same reason! Plus, up until very recent times, qualifying for the Macintosh Team on zero points down was a very rare occurrence. It only happened about once every ten years. Recently, for a number of reasons it has become much more prevalent, but this year, due to the expanded program format, it was a considerably more difficult proposition and only one person managed to accomplish it. No points for guessing who it was. The capeless crusader from Broken Hill of course!

National Long Break

In 1992 at the Tamworth Gun Club, during their annual Trap Carnival, Russell Mark established a new National Long Break record of 1177 targets straight. It was a momentous effort and as that mark (pun intended) has stood for 22 years, people were starting to wonder if it would ever be broken. Wonder no more! Mrs. Nicholls' little boy added almost another 400 targets to that total during the week. Starting off with the last round and a half from the Champion of Champions, plus 216 in the Single Barrel and 241 in the Points Score, added to all but the last half dozen of 1031 in the Double Barrel and another round and a half in the Macintosh Team Shoot before he finally let one land, he amassed a grand total of 1553 consecutive hits. If he ever takes up Skeet shooting, I'm moving to Coffs Harbour to play Lawn Bowls with Ken Lowry!

Angie Dent helped by Sue and Kate Turner looked after the canteen and there were any number of helpers to keep the fire buckets going.



CHAMPIONSHIPS INITIATIVES

All Championships in 2015 will provide a continuation of free nominations for Juniors who attend their first National event. Any Junior who has not attended a National event (in any discipline) will be entitled to enter the Nationals of their choice. The offer covers individual National events, not Pre-Nationals or Deauville Doubles events. JUNIORS MUST TICK THE BOX ON THE NOMINATION FORM INDICATING THEY ARE AT THEIR FIRST NATIONALS. DO NOT SEND MONEY. NO RETROSPECTIVE APPLICATION FOR A REFUND WILL BE CON-SIDERED. ALL OTHER JUNIORS ENTERING WILL RECEIVE A DISCOUNT OF \$10.00 PER NATIONAL EVENT (not Pre-Nationals or Deauville Doubles events)

The Skeet Nationals now have two new National events, 28 Gauge and 410 gauge were awarded National status at the Executive meeting in June.

SHOOT-OFFS, CONTINUATION OF EVENTS

Where more than one squad participates in a shoot-off, they may commence shooting together on different traps providing management deems that situation equitable.

The shoot offs will continue under the event format until a winner has been determined or at the discretion of the Tournament Director a different format is required to finalise the event. Where necessary, shoot offs will be conducted until a winner has been determined or until such time as the Tournament Director decides. In such a case the competition will recommence where it left off on the followin day.

WOMEN'S DOUBLE TRAP

The ISSF Nationals will continue to conduct women's double trap events at the 2015 National Championships. The events are no longer in the Olympic Games however, are included in the 2014 Commonwealth Games. The events future will depend on the number of nominations for the events

POOLS

The Executive approved a scheme for Graded pools at the National Trap Championships. Each Grade in all National events will start with \$500.00 in the pool. That is \$500 for each grade in each event. To be eligible to win the pool, individuals must enter the pool. The pool entry will be \$10.00 per event for the Graded pools. This would provide a pool of at least \$510.00 per grade in each event at the National Trap Championships (Pre-Nationals and Deauville events excluded). This ensures the placegetters receive cash for their wins as long as they enter the pools.

Overall pool on the Handicap to have a starting pool of \$2000, this pool is \$20 to enter, this pool to pay out $1\,\text{-}5$

40% 25% 15% 12.5% 7.5%

Overall pool on the other events is \$20 to enter no starting amount. Graded High score pool is \$10 to enter no starting amount.

FIELD SHOOTING

The Executive Committee amended the wording relating to SSAA, F&G, FGF participating in "Field events". The wording previously stated these organisation members could only shoot "5 Stand Sporting". This has now been amended to "Sporting" thus allowing these members to shoot "walk through" or novelty sporting events. This still does not allow them to shoot Trap, Skeet or ISSF.

MILITARY STYLED SHOTGUNS

A new rule was introduced under 4.08 (d), 8.08 (d) and 11.02 (h)."The use and carriage of military style shotguns are prohibited on ACTA grounds at all times". The new rule takes immediate effect.

CLAY TARGET SHOOTING NEWS

If you read and access the Clay Target Shooting News on line you can opt out of having the magazine delivered to your address. In this environment this would save on paper therefore contributing to protecting the fragile environment. This would also stop you having to deal with a publication you don't need. The CTSN is available on line in a timely manner, mostly before your normal postal delivery. Just call the National Office, or drop an email to ctsn@claytarget.com.au and we will cancel your delivery. You can open the magazine and save it on your hard drive or Tablet, so you can still accumulate all of the magazines, or you can go to our website where we have them all available for you to read and download.

HAT THROWING

The ACTA Executive discussed a new event, that of hat throwing, a habit in the USA. The executive have ruled hat throwing is not to be conducted at any ACTA events. The practice was in contravention of Rule 501 regarding safety and as such is not to be conducted at any ACTA event.

MEMBERSHIP

Any member who re-joins through the new WEBSITE linked to our database will be eligible to go into a draw for FREE membership the following year. To re-join you will need to confirm all of your details are correct and add an email address if there is not one already in the data-base, go to the pay section and complete the transaction. 20 Winners per Month (October – December) will receive a membership equal to the category they are currently registered for the following year. All new members to the Association prior to the end of March 2015 will also go into the draw for one of 20 free memberships the next year.

ACTA LOGO

The ACTA will conduct a competition to have a new logo produced. Those with an artistic flair or graphic design capabilities will vie for \$3000 in cash if their design is selected. The competition will close in December 2014 with a decision by the National Executive shortly after. Designs will be showcased in the CTSN for comment.

Nominations are now open for the 2014 A.C.T.A. Presidential Medal

Nominations for this prestigious award are now open and should be forwarded to the Executive Officer no later than October 31, 2014. Nominations received will be placed before the Board for their consideration and decision. The nomination should address in detail the outstanding

contribution of the nominee to the sport from Club to National level. Supporting documentation from the persons Club, Zone and State should detail their contribution at that level. No correspondence will be entered into regarding any nomination received.
