National President's Notes

The effort of our members that were successful in Glasgow has been hailed a success by the administrators of the Games and the Australian International Shooting Limited (AISL). This success I am sure will further assist in funding our sport into the future to earn further success at other Games and events. Congratulations again to all twelve of our members that attended.



There is discussion however on the Commonwealth Games front that the disciplines of women's skeet and women's

double trap may be removed due to the limited number of competing nations. I can assure members that I have already had a discussion with the President of Commonwealth Games Shooting expressing our association's desire to include these sports in the Games, and for no shooting disciplines to be removed. Further to this I have also lobbied AISL to speak on our members' behalf for these disciplines to continue. Members will be advised when further information comes available.

I have been asked by several members why I published in the CTSN an article regarding shooter infringements and the discussion regarding going to the police if members are aware of an illegal activity. The reason is that it is no longer acceptable for members to go to a club, zone, State or national executive member and 'download' about an illegal activity that they have become aware of. Then turn around and think to themselves, "I've done my bit – it's up to them now". Wrong. Taking the soft option is no longer acceptable and members are responsible for their own action or inaction. In some instances, by not taking immediate action which could have resulted in stopping an offence taking place, a person may also commit either a civil or criminal offence.

Same when a member believes on reasonable grounds that another member is suffering from a mental illness that may affect their ability to be in possession of a firearm(s). Mandatory reporting is now in place in all States and Territories for everyone that becomes aware of anyone that may cause danger to themselves or another with a firearm — the person MUST inform authorities of their belief and information and the last thing that anyone wants to see is someone hurt themselves or another.

The last is something that is going to affect all of us at some time. The ACTA has an aging population that participate in our sport. Some members have come to an age at which they may no longer be safe to be in possession of firearms on a clay target range. If a committee is of this belief it is better to take the person aside and/or place competition restrictions on them rather than have an accidental discharge, and have injury or worse occur to another competitor, spectator or official. A restriction on one shooter has occurred in one State and as a result everyone breathed a sigh of relief. I can hear the carpark discussion now — however it is something that needs to be brought into the open and members (and committees) shouldn't bury their heads in the sand. If one person is saved from injury (or worse) then this article is worth it.

As I have said numerous times before - everyone's a friend - until something goes wrong. That's when people dive for cover and unless you risk mitigate at all times you may be left out in the cold.

I hope everyone has had a great month competing or shooting!

The National Ground is being continually improved with engineers retained to provide a report on drainage required on the ground to channel water from the ground in low lying areas to the current drainage channels. The report is expected in time for works to commence in 2015. The ground will also have added three ball traps to facilitate ball trap competition as well as training facilities for ISSF on the National ground. These traps should be in by years end.

I can confirm that a Stakeholder Group will meet with NSW Firearms in Sydney on 17th September at the Sydney Police Centre. I will attend the meeting as the representative of the ACTA following an invitation from NSW Firearms. This meeting will provide feedback and recommendations to the branch whilst ultimately passing through to NSW Government Ministers. Having a voice in NSW is extremely important for the Association with the National Ground located in Wagga Wagga. We have in the past experienced some frustration at changes to legislation and clarification of legislation in what can be seen as very grey areas. The meeting will also allow first hand clarification of issues relevant to the industry, particularly in respect to ranges, licensing, arms fairs conditions etc. This will also give us a voice in relation to legislation on gun ownership and storage. Having a direct link will ensure our strong relationship with the NSW Firearms Branch will continue to develop for the betterment of the sport.



ACTA Data Base available in September

The much anticipated data base will be available mid-September. Go to our website and follow the link to the data base, login using your ACTA Number and use your Date of Birth as password. You should change your password for added security to something that suits you.

Individual members will then be able to access their personal page with their details on it. You can change your phone number, address, email etc without having to go back to your club secretary.

There will be a payment option as at the 1st November, you can tick the check box to confirm your details and immediately pay by credit card. Your payment will be processed directly to the ACTA. The National Office will then disburse all payments back to the Club, Zone and State (as applicable). You will be able to print a receipt showing your payment. Your grading card sticker will then be sent to you.

Each club secretary will be able to access the shooter's name, club and handicap of any ACTA member for shoot entry

purposes. The handicap section is still manual at this stage however, it has been developed to allow secretaries to enter handicap changes from events. Those scores in the future will be dealt with by the program updating grades as required. The shooter's book will be retained at this stage. The system has a "history", meaning each change is recorded on the system identifying who has made the change and date and time. Requests for changes through the ACTA will still be required through the club or State Secretary as is the current process.

State Secretaries will be able to see details of all state members. As with club secretaries they will only be able to access ACTA number, name, club & handicap.

The data base will be linked through the new website currently under construction. Until then you can only access it through going to the current ACTA website. As soon as the other website is available we will post a note to your personal page informing you of the development.

Psychological Skills for Shooting

CONFIDENCE

I am currently involved in an Organisational Psychology coaching course for leaders and managers. I have recently started a new job that is a serious promotion on what I have been doing in the past. I no longer have a clinical role and I am now more focused on developing leaders in schools and developing teacher capacity to cope with learning difficulties, behavioural disorders, disabilities, etc.

The basics of sport psychology grew out of work in the organisation psychology field, so there is a logical extension from one area to the other. I have to give a presentation to the Southern Sports Academy next week and the focus will be on recognising and developing self-confidence.

Over the years of writing these articles, I have examined the idea of mental toughness, which is defined as the set of behaviours and beliefs about yourself, your work, your sport, and how you interact. I outlined seven characteristics of mental toughness; being competitive, confident, in control, committed, composed, courageous and consistent.

Within the workplace the characteristics of mental toughness are also important. In this article I want to revisit the concept of confidence.

So what is self-confidence? Patrick Cohn from Peaksports defines selfconfidence as how firmly you believe in your ability to execute a physical skill or perform a task. Confidence, according to Cohn, comes from a baseline assessment of past performances, training, and preparation. As your competency or skill mastery grows, your confidence becomes proportionally stronger, which is strengthened more with successful training and quality practice.

The following is a list of sources of self confidence. Rank the following from 1 to 10 (adding others if I have missed an important aspect of your own).

- · Past successes in your sport
- · An effective training program
- Immediate performance
- Positive comments from others
- · Supportive people in your life
- · Training or quality practice
- · Quality coaching
- Optimistic coaching
- Belief in your physical talent
- · Your own method or technique
- The quality of your equipment
- Level of your competition
- · Warm up routine
- · Comfort with the environment
- Mental preparation
- Performance review
- · Mental game coaching
- Coping well under pressure
- · Good teamwork
- · Positive rapport with teammates
- · Positive rapport with coach
- Trust in teammates
- · Sports diet, hydration, etc
- Fitness level or conditioning
- Other sports you have played
- Weather
- Game plan or strategies

On a separate piece of paper, write down the top 5 sources of confidence that are under your control. Focus on what you can control to boost your confidence. Remember that what people say about your performance is not under your control.

Now that you are able to recognize the sources of confidence then it is also important to be able to recognize when confidence is dwindling. The biggest factor limiting confidence is self-doubt. I have written several articles over the years on self-doubt, and if readers need to revise, then go back over old issues or read "The Inner Game of Golf" by Tim Gallwey, which puts the whole idea of self doubt into perspective. Self-doubt is the opposite of self-confidence and it kills momentum, and stops athletes performing well because they are scared they will fail.

Self-doubt can be developed by a set of unhealthy and irrational beliefs about yourself and life in general. These beliefs include the following:

- 1. Strict expectations: "I can't make any mistakes if I want to win." What happens here is, is that you try to hard and tense up. You become less fluid and your unable to move and swing the way you should.
- 2. Negative self labels: "I'm a poor finisher." This focuses you mind on negative judgements about past performances and takes you away from the here and now.
- 3. Over-generalisations: "I don't do well on this course." Again you are focusing on the past and ignoring what you should be focusing on, which is the present.
- Perfectionism: I need to be perfect. This is impossible and will lead to the following behaviours that will further undermine your self-confidence:
 - · Setting unrealistic goals and strict expectations
 - · Dwelling on shortcomings and failures
 - Worrying about past mistakes
 - Being too self-critical
 - · Comparing yourself to others
 - Overanalyzing your performance
 - Viewing your performance as either good or bad
 - Measuring your self worth against your sporting success
 - · Focusing on future gains instead of playing in the present.

Now that you can recognize the sources of self-confidence and you can identify those irrational beliefs that get in the way and produce self-doubt. There are five steps to seeing yourself as a winner:

Firstly, write down three positive self-labels that positively describe you in your sport, which you can truly believe.

Secondly, post these descriptions on your mirror, fridge, desktop, etc where you can see them every day.

Thirdly, Strive to identify and discard any negative labels that others have given you or that you have made up yourself. Write them on a piece of paper, crumple the paper, and throw it away with authority.

Next, When speaking to others about yourself or your abilities, use the positive self labels you have formulated with confidence. (Avoid deliberate outward displays of cockiness because people who lack confidence will view it as arrogance.)

Finally Goal: feel cocky on the inside while appearing humble on the inside.

By using the previous five steps, identifying the sources of your confidence and recognizing the negatives that get in the way, you will be on the way to being more self-confident which is an important aspect of mental toughness.

In my last couple of columns I have elaborated upon a number of the things that occurred at this year's Trap Nationals These included the practical problems we have encountered with the Double Barrel shoot-off over the last few years. As I am deeply concerned that the National Executive may eventually come up with a solution that hindsight might not necessarily view as appropriate or astute (read Handicap Event), I offered my thoughts on what I thought was the best way to move forward with this pivotal event without destroying the historical integrity of it. This month I want to follow that up from other perspectives.

Crystal Ball

For a start I am not absolutely convinced that the "problem" is here to stay. Just because we have seen this event run to around a thousand targets for each of the last three years does not necessarily mean that this will now automatically become the norm. Admittedly we now have a handful of people who look as though they may be able to do this from time to time, but there is no guarantee that all the necessary pieces of the puzzle will continue to defy the odds and all fall into place at the same particular time and point in space. The fact that Murphy's Law has been thwarted thus far does not mean that the rubber band currently restraining it will continue to stretch forever.

Lessons from history

I'm sure that some famous ancient philosopher is credited with devising the correct answer to the age old question of "Why do we study history?" And that answer is "To try to prevent us from repeating our mistakes." The history of ACTA trapshooting is not exempt from this concept. Prior to 1974 the National Double Barrel had ticked along with an average annual winning score of somewhere around 200 and a record high of 370. However that year saw a unique clash of the Titans when the battle between Warren Charlton and Vin Ryan was not settled until 620 targets had been shot. This was possibly due to the fact that both men were by then firmly established as "top shots" and thus calm under pressure and that both had previously won this most prestigious event. Twice before in Warren's case.

Timing is everything

Following this an outcry ensued that Double Barrel shooting had become too easy and the timing of this could not possibly have been worse. Australia had been allocated the World Moving Targets Championships in 1973 and so Olympic Trap shooting had recently become the flavour of the month. A vocal minority were already advocating the demise of Trap Shooting in its historically established form and converting it into a breeding ground for Olympic Trapshooting by merging the rules.

Where angels fear to tread

This eventually culminated in our rules going into a gradual downward spiral and gravitating towards ISSF standards, a travesty which was not corrected until relatively recent times. However the very next year, in 1975, Jimmy



In a scathing report that he wrote in the CTSN, then ACTA Executive Director Noel Southey understatedly described Russell Mark as "perplexed" as Doug Smith is delivered the bad news, effectively ending one of the greatest Double Barrel shoot-offs of all time

Ellis only needed to shoot 74 targets to win the National Double Barrel. And even the median figure of 200 was not exceeded for another five years until 1980 when the infamous "malfunctioning factory shell" debacle involving Doug Smith and Russell Mark ended at 349. The moral of the story? Knee jerk reactions hardly ever shine under the light of hindsight!

Don't forget the weather

As the National Shoot Marshall. I have obviously had an excellent vantage point for scrutinising this shoot-off over the last few years. And I can assure you that each and every one of the eventual finalists has gotten away with some very scratchy seconds on each occasion. A few extremely minor dimensional shifts could have easily seen us wind up each of these events a long way earlier than we eventually did. And we haven't had a windy day thrown into the mix lately! It would only need some blustery conditions on qualifying day and we could easily get a situation where none of the "usual suspects" even make the cut and the winner could still have some handy loose change left out of his first case of shells.

A similar solution?

Skeet shoot-offs have run into similar problems in recent times and we have had to devise ways to attain more expedient outcomes in certain circumstances. However we have been fortunate in that common sense has prevailed and the implementation of format changes has not been regimentally mandated. A degree of flexibility has been allowed to not just the administrators but even to the competitors themselves who can initiate format changes. This can even occur mid round, by mutual consent if they believe that such changes are not only in everyone's best interests. but also do not detrimentally affect either the equity of that particular event or the historical integrity of the sport in general.

Don't forget equity

In this way we avoid the undesirable situation where a shoot-off containing two seasoned AA shooters and a B grader having a "day

out" are forced to shoot doubles at 3, 4 & 5, which would effectively see the grade shooter "hung out to dry". I remain hopeful that any similar format changes that our sport's governing body may envisage for our premier event are implemented in a similarly common sense oriented and flexible manner so that our heritage incurs the least amount of damage in order to attain the required practical objectives. I have always said that the job of the Executive is to provide the Tournament Director and the Shoot Marshall with the necessary "tools" and then allow them to use those tools when and as they may be required for each individual situation on its merits

Depends how you look at it

Looking at it from a different perspective, is the "problem" really a problem? Personally I don't think so. Quite the opposite actually! Clearly at your local Gun Club on a Saturday afternoon an extended Double Barrel shoot-off can have numerous disadvantages, including the financial wellbeing of the club. Creative and expedient solutions are clearly appropriate here. But does the National Double Barrel really need to be finalised on day one before a second slab of bullets is torn open?

Free entertainment

What's the matter with the shoot-off spilling over to the second or even a third day? Provided Shoot Management has the necessary "tools" to precipitate a result before dark on the third day, I see it as a wonderful annual opportunity. A chance for the "Big Guns" to not only show how good they really are, but to also provide us with a fantastic spectacle in the process. And for those who disagree I say "Don't Look Ethel". Go and play

cards or go shopping or just plain "go away" and stop raining on our parade.

Nationals Badges

Most years a special badge is struck to commemorate each of the Trap and Skeet Nationals. Recently I was handballed a formidable mission. Locate one particular badge from bygone days. The Skeet Nationals were held in Perth in 1987 for the first time and that's the missing item. CONDITIONS OF ENTRY NATIONAL ISSF DISCIPLINE CHAMPIONSHIPS

- 1. Any shooter wanting to compete at the ISSF Nationals must be a registered member of the ACTA for the current financial year that the championships are being held.
- 2. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the relevant Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.

Note: A fee of \$20 will be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.

- 3. The Tournament shall be conducted in accordance with the ISSF Official Statutes, Rules and Regulations (ISSF Rules) and where applicable, ACTA Shooting Rules (grading, teams etc). Targets to be shot in brackets of 25 for Olympic Trap and ISSF Skeet with squads of 6 shooters where possible. In Double Trap targets to be shot in brackets of 15 Pair (30 targets) with squads of 6 shooters where possible.
- 4. Pre Nominations to be received by close of business (Eastern Summer Time) Monday 5th January 2015. There is a maximum of 126 competitors for ISSF Trap. If pre nominations exceed this number a standby list of 20 will be created and used in case of withdrawals. If any vacancies exist in the program, it will be on a "first in" basis at an additional cost of \$10.00 per event to enter. Nominations at the championships close at 10.00am the day prior to the event if a vacancy exists. Nominations have been reduced, as there is no prize money awarded.
- Shooters will be squadded as per the ISSF rules and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director. <u>Once squadding for an event has been completed, a shooter shall not be entitled to a</u> <u>refund if they withdraw.</u> Withdrawals after nominating and before squadding will be accepted in writing 48 hrs prior to the event.
- 6. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot the applicable round.
- 7. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will be penalised by the LOSS OF THREE TARGETS.
- 8. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- All shooters must sign the score sheet after each round. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has
 accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the score recorded on the sheet.
- 10. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons designated to referee/score or line referee must fulfil their obligation to do so or have obtained the service of a suitable replacement that must be ready to take his place at the required time. In the event of the designated persons or their replacement not being ready to take their place at the required time, the person initially designated to fill the specific role may **INCUR A PENALTY AS PRESCRIBED UNDER ISSF RULES**.
- 11. Setting and adjusting of traps is the sole responsibility of Shoot Management. All shooters, coaches and team officials are prohibited from entering the trap pits after the jury has examined and approved the trap settings.
- 12. All appeals must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit and lodged with the Tournament Director. The \$20 is refundable if the appeal is upheld by the appointed jury.
- 13. When team selection is involved, shooters are eligible for section nominated. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in both Commonwealth and National Championships.
- 14. High Gun awards are determined for each section. To be eligible for the High Gun recognition, competitors must have competed in both programmed events for each respective High Gun. Gold Australia High Gun badges are only awarded when there are 20 or more competitors in a section.
- 15. Women shooters are eligible for their section only except Double Trap. Junior shooters are eligible for OA or their grade where applicable.
- 16. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behaviour of card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 17. IThe ISSF Rules will be used to determine the OA placing in all events. ACTA rules will be used to determine grade placing where applicable.
- 18. Juniors to be under the age of 21 in the year of competition.
- 19. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.
- 20. The standard of dress required for all competitors is that defined in the ISSF Rules (clothing).
- 21. All competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws of the state. (When held in W.A a shooter must obtain a permit to bring a firearm into that state).





ACTA ACADEMY SELECTION

The ACTA Academy is a structured program for our elite junior shooters. The ultimate aim is to further develop these athletes in a range of areas so they may achieve at the pinnacle of their chosen discipline.

When selecting talented athletes for further development there are two ways of doing this; taking those athletes that have already risen to the top and identifying those athletes with potential to rise to the top. The ACTA Academy will select athletes in 2014 both ways through achieving automatic qualification from the National Championships and then for the remaining positions through application to the National Coaching Director.

The ACTA Academy will also have a Pathway for athletes striving to join the ACTA Academy in future years.

The ACTA Academy will be announced in October each year after all of the National Events have been completed. Each athlete will need to accept the ACTA Academy terms and conditions prior to announcement.

The ACTA Academy will consist of 12-15 athletes each year, these athletes need to meet their discipline World Championship requirements as a junior the following year – so that they may see out at least one year as a junior e.g. in the year of competition (2015) be under 21 years hence <20 years 31st Dec 2014.

For the 2014/2015 ACTA Academy squad automatic qualification is by being the athlete with the highest National High Gun Score from their chosen discipline and meeting the age and the grade perquisites as outlined below.
