I am sure everyone knows of the quality ISSF facilities and the history of the Newcastle Lake Macquarie Clay Target Club in hosting National Championships in the past. We are looking forward to working with the Club to present another quality ISSF Event. On the back of the Gold medal success of Laetisha Scanlan, Laura Coles and Adam Vella at the Commonwealth games and Jack Wallace (Silver), Catherine Skinner (Bronze) and Emma Cox (Silver) at the World Championships in Spain this National event should be closely contested as we approach the next Olympics in 2016 in Rio. The emergence of two young men, James Willett with his 3rd placing in the Junior World Universal Trench Championships and Mitchell Iles with his win in the Overall and Junior ZZ World Championships shows the calibre of young shooters within the ranks of the Association. I am sure these two young men will put themselves forward over the next qualifying period for future World Cup and possibly Olympic selection. They will not have it their own way with

many of the current National Champions back to defend their titles.

The ACTA National Office has been dealing with some major internet issues over the past month including UDP Flooding (see google for a full description). Sufficient to say the flooding caused our internet to virtually shut down, overloaded to a point where it could not function. Our IT consultants along with Telstra took nearly four weeks to get on top of the issue. This flooding caused our data usage to soar whilst reducing our capacity to use on line services. In turn this has delayed our data base and new website implementation for many reasons.

Given the new data base is web based through our website, it was imperative we find a solution before launching. We are confident we are now on top of the situation and the roll out is well underway. In the next magazine we will have screen shots to assist people where required, although following the instructions on the website provides a very easy to follow guide to access the data base. Once in the data base you will end up in "My Page" where your details reside, you will be able to change your details and pay your membership through this system as at the 1st of November.

2014 ACTA National Sporting Clays Championships

ugust 30th and 31st saw the ACTA and the Wagga Gun Club present the 2014 National Sporting Clays Championships at the **ACTA National Complex in** Wagga Wagga. Shot over four fields and using a total of 28 traps, it was a credit to the organisers and the small dedicated group of Wagga Gun Club members who gave freely of their time for several days leading up to the event and who managed to present a great range of targets for the maximum field of 120 shooters.

As part of this years Championships an Australian team was to be selected for a trip to the World Sporting Clays Championships in South Africa in 2015. Perhaps this had an impact on competitor numbers and for the first time in several years the field was not only filled by the close of pre-nominations there was also an extended reserve list of shooters who were unable to compete.

The Australian Team was decided over the entire weekend by taking the top five high gun scores. All members needed to be registered with the ACTA prior to the competition.

Vivaz targets were used throughout the Championships. Thank you to Winchester Australia for providing the much appreciated ongoing sponsorship including cartridges and a Browning U/O shotgun.

Townsville Gun Club has been operating continuously since 1914, including the period through both World Wars. The Club has moved many times over the last 100 years, finally settling at its current grounds at Killymoon Creek. The unique mountain back drop and the bush like atmosphere of the grounds supports eight Trap layouts. The grounds and facilities are a fantastic legacy provided by the clubs ancestral members.

This Centenary celebration programme was designed to give shooters a sense that this is not just a normal weekend event. More of everything, more prizes, two state titles and a lot more targets. The organisers and promoters set a programme that was very ambitious, with a full nomination consisting of 320 targets, shot over 7x layouts. The programme included a 50 target state night shoot.

This special event marks 100 years of shooting in Townsville and was also an occasion for past and present members to reunite, get together for a chat and catch up on memories and exchange past stories. All prompted while viewing the memorable photos of yesteryears on a TV slide show.

Guests started to arrive during the preceding week and a significant number of early travellers had moved in giving an indication of the potential numbers. The steady flow of vans and campers increased on Thursday to volumes on Friday and the place started to look like a state carnival.

The committee was starting to have concerns about the size of the programme particularly the night shoot, thinking it could go very late into the night or early hours of Sunday morning.

Shooters travelled from all over Queensland, NSW, Victoria, South Australia and some Tasmanians from Spring Bay who just happened to be in the area.

As always our northern district neighbour's from Normanton, Atherton, Cooktown, Silkwood, Port Denison, Charters Towers and Mackay supported us well.

More travelled from Queensland's Western, Central and Southern clubs, Cloncurry, Central Burnett, Gympie, Tambo, Bundaberg and even Tarawera had representatives on the grounds, in all 170 shooters came from 34 clubs across Eastern Australia.

A cold climatic change of weather hit North Queensland on that Saturday morning with a strong, cold wind blowing straight across the

grounds. Cold for North Queenslanders as it plummeted to 9 degrees with a forecast of lower temperatures on Sunday morning.

The opening ceremony and welcome was conducted by TGC president Wayne Read and the formal opening of the shoot by club Patron Mark Stoneman. The first shots for the day were fired by an honour guard salute with representatives from Silkwood, Burdekin, Mt Isa, the club Patron and a Townsville life member.



Formalities over the shoot began: thanks to pre nominations the shoot marshals had the first 7 squads out and shooting just after 9.00am.

The first warm up event of 25 targets cash divide resulted in 34 shooters being in the money.

The second event: 50T Townsville Gun Club Championship resulted in two of the Burdekin's finest shooters, Ray Collinson and Joseph Rossato contesting the overall prize with a long shoot off on Saturday then finally deferring to complete on Sunday morning at 7.30am due to the requirement to keep the events moving.

Over the years the Burdekin Gun Club has produced many excellent shots including Newton Thomas when he was based in Home Hill during the building of the Burdekin Bridge project from 1948 to 1956.

Early on Sunday morning in the bitter cold the final outcome after 51 targets was Joseph Rossato overall with 206/206,1st AA Ray Collinson 205/206, 2nd AA Joe Caruso 144/145(Burdekin), 1st A Guiseppe Bonanno 116/117 (Burdekin), 2nd A Annette Vassalini 91/92 (Burdekin), 1st B Keith Green 56/57,2nd B Ron Snell (Port Denison), 1st C John Kinninmonth 57/58 (Burdekin), 2nd C Mark Stella 48/50, Ladies Michelle Evangeline 56/57 (Tvl), Junior Antony Ballarino (Port Denison), Veteran Graham Rudd 78/79.

It was during this 50 target event on Saturday that one of the trap control boxes burnt out and put one trap out of action. The organisers quickly utilised the practice trap (a recent purchase from Glen Innes) and continued with the shooting. Now with one trap out of action the programme seemed to be overwhelming. TGC doesn't hold a spare trap control box and the nearest available unit was in Ingham at the Herbert River Gun Club 1.5 hours to our north. Maria Bosworth kindly offered to travel back home to get one of their clubs control boxes. An all-round trip of 3 hours and in doing so sacrificing her position in the Ladies High Gun. This is just one indication of the support that the Townsville Gun Club received from our neighbouring clubs thank you Maria and the Herbert River Gun Club.

Due to the delays and a long shoot off, it was at this time that the shoot marshals had to make a change to the order of events. For fairness to all shooters the premier event of the day, the 25 target Tom Comerford handicap, had to be shot next. They advised the office that due to the large

that due to the large trees and shadows potentially being cast over the grounds later in the day and the disadvantage to the final squads, the handicap would be shot

before the medley.

This prestigious and greatly anticipated event honouring one of Townsville's Gun Clubs finest allround and longest serving members was finally underway. Any shooter would be proud to have his name on Tom's beautiful perpetual trophy that will last another 100 years; along with a good payout it brought out the best in many a fine shot.

Resulting in 10 shooters in the shoot off final results were \$1000 to Neville Sheehan 36/36 (Townsville), \$500 to Joe Davis 35/36 (Charters Towers), \$250 to Alan Bosworth 33/34 (Herbert River).

As the fourth event,

the 45T Medley sponsored by Fulton Hogan started, the shadows were getting very long stretching out over the trap houses making it very hard to see the emerging target. All 8 traps were now in operation but unfortunately the light faded quickly and the event was postponed to restart at 8.30 on Sunday morning. The organisers had to stop the shooting to allow the ladies in the kitchen to serve dinner and have everyone back out on the traps for the night shoot.

Fifth event: Queensland State Title 50T Night Shoot, sponsored by Betta Hire. The predicted cold snap was certainly moving in on the grounds. Once the sun went down it became very chilly and unpleasant dropping to 6 degrees. With only 4 lighting towers available the shoot marshal had to push 98 shooters through the four available layouts. Most of the grades were sorted out very quickly during the 50 target event except for seven AA graders on 50/50 and two C graders 44/50 involved in a shoot off that ran until 11.30pm.

Day 2, Sunday 20th: After a good breakfast the pre-mentioned shoot off for the double barrel took place then straight into the second wave of the 45T Medley that had started the evening before. As the sun came up it warmed the grounds but it couldn't have been enough for some shooters, with only three possible scores shot, Greg Reeves, Colin Muller and Geoff Archer had to shoot off plus Ray Collinson and TGC President Wayne Read enjoyed a lengthy shoot off for AA.

COACHING NEWS

Monthly I'll be keeping CTSN readers up to date with what is happening with ACTA coach accreditation and ACTA athlete coaching (both juniors and adults). I'll let you know what I've been up to, give you a run down on any camps or courses we have had and keep you up to date with any events coming up.

I've been on the job now part time for 4 months – mostly reviewing coaching manuals, updating other documentation, working on pathways for athletes and coaches, looking at the coaching system in each State, a bit of planning and a bit more planning – basically getting a handle on what needs doing and how best to do it. I've attended a few meetings, and presented at a few coaching accreditation days and been involved in a few coaching

camps and clinics. Plans are to run some really productive athlete coaching camps and clinics for both juniors and adults, work with States and Zones in delivering coaching camps, work closely with ACTA Academy athletes and their personal coaches and generally get more coaches and assessors on the ground and the current ones reaccredited or upgraded. I really want coaches to know what opportunities there are for them and athletes (shooters) to know what opportunities they have too. I believe the better our coaches are the better and happier shooters we will produce and the more shooters we will retain.

The CTSN will be one portal for information from me along with the ACTA website coaching section which will present things in greater detail including calendars of when camps and accreditations are on and I also have a Facebook page (ACTA National Coaching Director) where I will update information about camps and clinics and accreditation days.

COACH ACCREDITATION

We currently have 288 coaches accredited in the ACTA. I have already seen a 5% increase in Coaches and hope to work on a 20% increase by the end of 2015. If you are interested in becoming a coach or upgrading your skills please register your interest with your State Coaching Director or State Secretary.

Russell Mark has decided it is time to retire from the international stage of shooting and will have attended his final world championship in Spain.

Russell commenced his remarkable shooting career at Sebastopol Gun Club in 1977, and competed at the international level for the first time in 1985.

Russell won a gold medal in Double Trap at the 1996 Olympic Games in Atlanta, and he won a silver medal at the 2000 Olympic Games in Sydney. He twice won the World Championship and was twice runner up. In 1991 he became the first Australian to win a Gold Medal at a World Cup. He was the first competitor on earth to win a gold medal at all four of the ISSF's major competitions.

In 2007 the ISSF named Russell Mark as one of their four greatest shotgun shooters of all time joining Kim Rhode, Susan Nattrass and Luciano Giovanetti.

In 1997 he was awarded the Order of Australia Medal (OAM) for his services to sport and in 2009 the Australian Clay Target Association inducted him into their Hall of Fame.

Russell will be missed by many shooters around the World, but no doubt will keep in touch with the friends he has made during the decades he has been shooting.

Hopefully Russell will be around the shooting sport for sometime to come with coaching juniors, as he has mentioned in some of his statements of late, and also shooting competition at the local clubs.

The VCTA wishes Russell Mark OAM, the very best in the future in whatever he takes on.

Annual 4 Day Shoot

The Darwin Clay Target Club held its Annual 4 Day Shoot for 2014 from Thursday 24th to Sunday 27th of July. The shoot was well attended with half of the 68 shooters in attendance travelling from interstate, some from as far away as Hobart. This will enable members to shoot either DTL or Skeet at night with lighting to rival the best shooting grounds in Australia. So, with great excitement, Day 1 concluded with the 50 Target Double Barrel NT Night State Title sponsored by Wildman Land Management, the first event to be shot under the

new lights. Almost everyone agreed that the lighting was as good as anywhere so congratulations to those involved with the new installation, truly a job well done. Craig Patten was the eventual Overall Winner with a score of 69/69 after a shoot off that began with 5 shooters. Nicholas Ferteklis won AA Grade with 63/64 from Stuart Browning, 62/63. Marcus Karlsson took out the A Grade with 70/71 from Phil Scott on 69/71 and got bumped up to AA Grade in the process. John Ward

Psychological Skills for Shooting

Michael Kruger-Davis



COACHING THE COACH

Last month I was invited by the National Coaching Director, Suzie Balogh to run a session for coaches on the psychological skills as a component of their coaching accreditation. As a teacher, I always tried to be well prepared, unfortunately, in this

instance, things just didn't happen the way they should have, and I was unable to show any of the slides or videos and instead had to resort to a lecture session. So for the coaches benefit and everyone else reading this, I will go through some of the presentation, in this article.

Goal setting: This is probably the most important and the most poorly done section of coaching. Having a vision of what you want to achieve and goals to achieve that vision, will provide the foundations of success. However, the goals have to be SMART. Specific, Measurable, Achievable, Realistic and Time focused. If your goals fit into these categories, then you can set your goals to drive the motivation you need to reach the outcomes you want. It also allows you to gauge your performance against an external and measurable set of criteria. Goal setting is not just about achieving your 'best' but can also be used for minute and specific things such as a practise session, returning from injury or a coaching session. You may set a goal to improve one aspect of your shooting, or learn a new technique.

Skills audit; A coach should be able to assist the athlete in completing a skills audit. It is important that when we enter into a coaching program we (the athlete and the coach) have a clear idea of what the shooter can do well, what shooter needs to improve and what the shooter needs to learn. This skills audit needs to be generalised across physical, technical and mental skills. The following list is a guide only and individuals need to determine what their specific needs are.

Motivation

Having a vision of what you want to achieve, the goals and specific skills to achieve that vision it is important to now look at your motivation. Motivation is the step of putting the individual components, skills, and knowledge together to achieve the outcome.

When you have achieved your vision, change it and work towards something greater, or re-evaluate and set more achievable or realistic steps, and start the process again.

Vision	Goals	Skills	Plan	Evaluation
What you want to achieve	The steps to help you achieve your vision	The physical, technical and mental skills	will achieve your vision	How you will know you have achieve your vision or met your goals

It is here that the coach needs to stress to the shooter that what you are now doing is a process. This will also guide your motivation. To improve in your skills and abilities you need to be focused on the process and not the product. If you are process or task orientated you will grow, improve and see shooting as a sport you enjoy and are happy to do, regardless of the outcome. If you are product or ego orientated you will be focusing on what you can win, earn, or the prestige.

Shooting in the past / present / future.

To perform well at any sport and especially shooting, it is essential you stay focused in the present. If you think of the past you will:

- think of past failures
- · thinks of mistakes
- · make judgements about previous performances
- · make judgements about yourself based on past performances
- · develop beliefs that you are a failure
- If you move your thinking to the future, ie winning the event, the high gun, how much money you will win, etc, you will
- · develop anxieties about uncertainty
- · develop fear about failing
- · develop worries about letting yourself and other down
- · lose focus of the task and the process
- · worry about the outcome

To stay focused on the present and keep your thinking in the here and now,

- · breathe and focus on your breathing
- · focus on something happening to you at the moment
- · focus on the process not the product

World Universal Trench Championships LONATO, ITALY

A total of 10 individual shooters from Australia made the long haul with some support crew (parents, grandparents, coaches, friends, wives) to Lonato in Italy to compete in the 32nd FITASC World Championships in Universal Trench Shooting. Shooters to make the journey representing Field & Game Federation Australia (the Australian affiliate to FITASC) were: Jeff Tonna, Mitch Iles (with grandfather Bill), Craig Henwood, Taylah-Jane Turner, Kelly Coogan, Lachlan Holdsworth (with Mum Jenny & Dad Andrew), James Willett (with coach Graeme), Steve Trembath (with wife Megan) & Colin and Clint Kneebone.





One Saturday afternoon in 1982 I was sitting around the Melbourne Gun Club playing cards with some of the greatest Skeet shooters this country has ever seen. The likes of Ian "Chrome Dome" Hale, John "Bigfoot" Woolley, Johnnie "No Go" Summers, Graham "Gerry Gee" Guy and Alex "Tree Cat" Crikis, just to name a few. In those days almost everyone seemed to have a nickname and no-one seemed to have a lawyer. In fact your eminence in the sport seemed to be in some way linked to the degree to which your nickname was discriminatory and/or defamatory.

A Lifelong Connection

During the day our group was joined by a stranger who I found out later had recently relocated to Melbourne from inland NSW due to a change in his work situation. As he proved to be an amiable sort of bloke as well as a handy card player and a tidy Skeet shooter, we soon struck up an acquaintance. His name turned out to be Mark McInnes and as we both attended Melbourne Gun Club regularly I soon found out that we had a couple of things in common. A tremendous passion for Clay Target Shooting combined with an inordinate determination to succeed at it. These two qualities became the catalyst for our many in-depth discussions about the technicalities of our sport and the nucleus for a close friendship that continues to this day.

Two Steps Forward . . .

It was a terrible shame that he later gravitated to the "Dark Side" and decided to specialize in Trap shooting. Much as I hate to admit it, I'm sure that this was another reflection of the trade-off involved in splitting the National Skeet Championship off the Trap Nationals around that time and making it the focus of a stand alone tournament. Although it provided serious Skeet shooters with "light at the end of the tunnel" and allowed Skeet shooting to progress and grow, rather than simply being a novelty event that you did on Saturday mornings before the real shooting started, it obviously had downsides that included greater segregation of the disciplines. A bit like winning an argument with your wife when you're clearly right. You know it's technically correct but you also know there will be repercussions further down the track.

A Thirst for Knowledge

Anyway, as I got to know Mark better, what really struck me about him was his insatiable appetite for anything related to the history and records of our sport. At the 1984 Victorian Trap Carnival in Geelong we watched Vin Ryan, who was in the twilight of an illustrious career stretching back

over twenty years, win his last major title, the State Points Score. After all the hubbub had died down Mark went over to extend his congratulations to this great man. What should have been a ten second exchange of pleasantries turned into a two hour marathon history lesson as Vin recounted a multitude of experiences from what many consider to be the Golden Era of the ACTA.

Changing Times

I'm sure that encounter was not just a turning point in Mark's own shooting career but also a pivotal point in the historic aspect of the ACTA. From that point in time Mark actively sought out all the "good ol' boys" and absorbed and collated whatever gems from bygone days that they could offer. People like Allan Blease and Merv Whitelaw were never lonely when Mark was around and when his

old mate Kevin Constable gave him his vast collection of old ACTA magazines, Mark was like a dog with two tails. Later he aligned himself closely with George Biggs who was just starting to record our history officially on behalf of the ACTA. After George

passed away Mark took up that baton with gusto and turned George's early preliminary work into an exacting science.

The Big Picture

Around that time everyone was talking about the promotion and development of our sport but I don't think anyone had a clear perception of how to go about it. Mark was the first person to see a connection between that concept and our history. I believe that his vision for a Hall of Fame and it's various offshoots like Grand Slam awards, the Doug Smith Medal and annual Long Break awards have achieved more in the promotional and development arena than all other attempts put together. The increase in the quantity and quality of Double Rise shooting in this country along with increased attendances at our State Carnivals are just two good examples of his far reaching ideas coming to fruition.

Worthwhile Prizes

During his research Mark found out that back in the Live Bird days, shooting competitions for very large sums of money were prevalent, with some purses equaling the annual wages of many of the participants and/or spectators. Even after the demise of Live Birds and the evolution of Clay Target shooting to the stage where it was economically viable for working class people, there were still some "Big Money Shoots" conducted so that the needs of a wide spectrum of shooters were catered for. The so called "Car Shoots" were a good example of this, where handicap events with a sizeable entry fee and a motor car as a prize were very popular with shooters and spectators alike.

Acute Amateurism

However the introduction of Olympic style shooting in this country in the early 1970s and the strict "amateur" status required of potential competitors at that time sent a shock wave through the entire ACTA from which we have never really recovered. The whole situation was a very grey area which initially hardly anyone seemed to really understand, but which nearly everyone tended to err on the conservative side of, often to the point of quite ridiculous. I remember a case where a novice shooter asked if winning \$5 in the sweeps of the local Double Barrel event would make him ineligible for selection to the Olympic Training Squad and no-one was prepared to give a definitive answer.

A Veritable Treasure Trove

Reading through the various 1970 issues of the CTSN you will find numerous advertisements for Big Money Shoots. These included the Hay Gun Club's big Easter Shoot where they shot for a Holden Torana. The week before the Wagga Gun Club held a big event where the handed out seven shotguns including a C grade Browning for the winner. And you couldn't miss Illawarra's advertisement because they had a picture of the Ford Falcon

Sedan they were giving away as the major prize for their big shoot on the Queen's Birthday weekend in June. 1971 started out in the same vein with Big Money Shoots for guns, cars and cash advertised all over the country.

The Crunch Comes

However rumours and rumblings were already afoot with Clubs and shooters alike all getting nervous. And then it all came to a grinding halt! The December issue of the CTSN contained an explanation of the IOC's Amateur Rules and, more importantly, a declaration form to be submitted with your 1972 Annual Subscription. Accepting prizes greater than \$10 in any event or \$40 in any week revoked your "amateur" status. Although the situation eventually sorted itself out, in the process it effectively put paid to any and all semblance of "professional" shooting in this country.

Where To From Here?

From the discussions I have had with Mark over the years I believe he has always thought there was still a market for professional shooting within the ranks of ACTA members. Whether or not this is an area that the ACTA should "officially" revisit is still a matter of some conjecture and only time will tell. In the interim, Mark and a number of his friends, myself included, have decided to try to resurrect the concept of Big Money Shoots

within the framework of the ACTA. We intend to do this by forming a body which we hope the ACTA will accept as another Supporting Association, similar to the Australian Skeet Shooters Association. In this way we believe that another minority of the ACTA's members can have their own particular interests overseen and guided by a separate body that is made up of only those individuals who have a keen interest in and a good understanding of that particular area. See this space for future updates.

September's Trivia Question

The National Double Barrel and the National Single Barrel have been won by the same person in the same year on four occasions but only by three people. That's because the great Doug Smith did it twice. First in 1967 and then again 21 years later in 1988. The first

to do it was Newton Thomas in 1959 and the other "culprit" was our first great Olympic Trench shooter, Jimmy Ellis from Canberra, who swept all before him in 1970. CONDITIONS OF ENTRY NATIONAL ISSF DISCIPLINE CHAMPIONSHIPS

- 1. Any shooter wanting to compete at the ISSF Nationals must be a registered member of the ACTA for the current financial year that the championships are being held.
- 2. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the relevant Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.

Note: A fee of \$20 will be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.

- 3. The Tournament shall be conducted in accordance with the ISSF Official Statutes, Rules and Regulations (ISSF Rules) and where applicable, ACTA Shooting Rules (grading, teams etc). Targets to be shot in brackets of 25 for Olympic Trap and ISSF Skeet with squads of 6 shooters where possible. In Double Trap targets to be shot in brackets of 15 Pair (30 targets) with squads of 6 shooters where possible.
- 4. Pre Nominations to be received by close of business (**Eastern Summer Time**) Monday 5th January 2015. There is a maximum of 126 competitors for ISSF Trap. If pre nominations exceed this number a standby list of 20 will be created and used in case of withdrawals. If any vacancies exist in the program, it will be on a "first in" basis at an additional cost of \$10.00 per event to enter. Nominations at the championships close at 10.00am the day prior to the event if a vacancy exists. Nominations have been reduced, as there is no prize money awarded.
- 5. Shooters will be squadded as per the ISSF rules and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director. Once squadding for an event has been completed, a shooter shall not be entitled to a refund if they withdraw. Withdrawals after nominating and before squadding will be accepted in writing 48 hrs prior to the event.
- 6. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot the applicable round.
- 7. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will be penalised by the LOSS OF THREE TARGETS.
- 8. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 9. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each round. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the score recorded on the sheet.
- 10. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons designated to referee/score or line referee must fulfil their obligation to do so or have obtained the service of a suitable replacement that must be ready to take his place at the required time. In the event of the designated persons or their replacement not being ready to take their place at the required time, the person initially designated to fill the specific role may INCUR A PENALTY AS PRESCRIBED UNDER ISSF RULES.
- 11. Setting and adjusting of traps is the sole responsibility of Shoot Management. All shooters, coaches and team officials are prohibited from entering the trap pits after the jury has examined and approved the trap settings.
- 12. All appeals must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit and lodged with the Tournament Director. The \$20 is refundable if the appeal is upheld by the appointed jury.
- 13. When team selection is involved, shooters are eligible for section nominated. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in both Commonwealth and National Championships.
- 14. High Gun awards are determined for each section. To be eligible for the High Gun recognition, competitors must have competed in both programmed events for each respective High Gun. Gold Australia High Gun badges are only awarded when there are 20 or more competitors in a section.
- 15. Women shooters are eligible for their section only except Double Trap. Junior shooters are eligible for OA or their grade where applicable.
- 16. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behaviour of card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 17. IThe ISSF Rules will be used to determine the OA placing in all events. ACTA rules will be used to determine grade placing where applicable.
- 18. Juniors to be under the age of 21 in the year of competition.
- 19. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.
- 20. The standard of dress required for all competitors is that defined in the ISSF Rules (clothing).
- 21. All competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws of the state. (When held in W.A. a shooter must obtain a permit to bring a firearm into that state).



- (a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

51ST INTERNATIONAL SHOOTING SPORT FEDERATION (ISSF) WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP, GRANADA. SPAIN

Jack Wallace

17-year-old Lilydale High School student Jack Wallace (Yering, Vic) has won the silver medal for Australia in the Junior Men's Trap event at the International Shooting Sport Federation (ISSF) World Championship in Granada, Spain.

Wallace stormed through the qualification rounds spread over three days, recording the second highest score of 121/125 targets, and equaling the scores shot by experienced high profile Trap shooters Adam Vella (Keilor, Vic) and Michael Diamond (Fingal Bay, NSW), earlier in the day.

Emma Cox

Education student Emma Cox (Mooroopna, Vic) has stormed through the final moments of her double trap event to finish with a very respectable silver medal at the International Shooting Sport Federation (ISSF) World Championship in Granada, Spain.

The 22-year-old La Trobe University student recorded strings of 24-22-26-25 to hit a total of 97 targets, forcing a sudden-death shoot-off against Great Britain's Rachel Parish to determine second and third

place. Emma shot first and hit both targets, proving too strong for Parish, who missed a target in her double.

Emma had gone into the fourth round in fifth place, two targets from the Bronze medal.

While more experienced shooters cracked under pressure in the final round, Cox dug deep and finished in equal second, displaying an amazing surge of confidence. Earlier this year, at the Glasgow Commonwealth Games, Parish had won the bronze medal in women's double trap, while Cox had finished in sixth place.

Catherine Skinner

24-year-old chemical engineering student Catherine Skinner (East Melbourne, Vic) has claimed a bronze medal in Women's Trap at the 51st International Shooting Sport Federation (ISSF) World Championship in Granada, Spain.

Amidst a tightly contested quality field of 76 internationally acclaimed shooters, including World Champions and Olympic and Commonwealth title holders, Skinner held her nerve to shoot a strong 72/75 targets in the Qualification Round.

She then duelled with three other competitors who were on equal 72, in a nail-biting shoot-off for a spot in the six-person Semi Final, at which stage she shot-off again to edge out Italy's highly decorated Deborah Gelisio, qualifying for a well-earned spot in the bronze medal match.

Skinner proved too strong for Germany's Jana Beckmann, 31, winning the bronze by 13 to 10 targets
